GEOFF BANTON

Previously with Bolton and Plymouth where he made about six first team appearances.

TERRY BULLIVANT

Plays in midfield, signed as an apprentice in 1972 and graduated through the youth and reserve teams. Made 38 appearances last season scoring one goal.

GORDON BOYD

Scottish schoolboy international. Signed from Glasgow Rangers with whom he had played for four seasons.

GORDON DAVIES

A striker, Gordon was signed from Merthyr early in 1978. Looked very sharp in his few first team outings last season and seems set for a promising career. Made five appearances and scored one goal.

CLIVE DAY

Represented Essex at schoolboy and youth level. Comes from South Ockendon in Essex and signed as apprentice in July 1977.

PERRY DIGWEED

Has been with Fulham since his schoolboy days. Perry is from London and signed professional in July 1977, but he had the honour of appearing in the first team in 1976 against Bolton when he was too young to sign professional.

VINCE DURCAN

Comes from Edgware. Performed with distinction in our youth and combination teams last season. A former Gaelic player.

TONY GALE

Product of the youth scheme, Tony has been with Fulham since he was 13 years of age. Equally capable in defence or midfield. Made his first team debut when only 16 and has made many appearances for England Youth team which he captained in the Little World Cup. Last season made 41 appearances and scored 8 goals.

STEVE HATTER

Another of Fulham's home produced players. Defender Steve made his debut against Stoke in December 1977. He made a further five appearances before injury kept him out for the rest of the season.

KEVIN LOCK

Signed from West Ham in the close season for a substantial fee. Kevin is an experienced defender who played for West Ham in the 1975 Cup Final against Fulham and has also gained representative honours.

TONY MAHONEY

Tony, from East London, has been with the club since he was 13. A striker, he made his debut in November 1976 since when he has made a total of 19 appearances scoring three goals.

JOHN MARGERRISON

A midfield player, John was previously with Tottenham and was signed by Fulham when released by them. He made his debut in the last game of season 1975-76. Made 40 appearances and scored three goals in 1977/78.

TOMMY MASON

Another one of our young players, Tommy is a full-back and performed very creditably in his only first team appearance, away to Division 2 Champions Bolton in the last game of the season.

RICHARD MONEY

Signed from Scunthorpe for £50,000, Richard can play in either midfield or defence. Since joining Fulham Richard has been selected for the England under-21 squad on several occasions. Scored two goals from 23 appearances last season.

GERRY PEYTON

Goalkeeper, signed from Burnley, and Fulham's only 'ever present' of last season. A very capable keeper, Gerry has gained international honours with Eire.

STEVE SCRIVENS

Born in London, Steve came through the youth scheme. A very promising young player who was unfortunately beset by a leg injury for most of last season.

LES STRONG

Fulham's longest serving player, Les was previously with Crystal Palace as a junior. Began his career as a winger but has since been converted to full-back. Missed only one League match last season, scored one goal.

CHRIS GUTHRIE

Signed from Swindon for £65,000. Previously with Newcastle United for whom he made 3 appearances, Southend where he made 107 appearances scoring 35 goals and Swindon Town for whom he made over 40 appearances scoring 16 goals. Chris is 6'2" and comes from Dilston on Tyne. He is married with two children.

JOHN BECK

Signed as an apprentice with Queens Park Rangers and made his debut for them against Orient in 1972. It wasn't until the 1974-75 season that his big breakthrough came, playing in 29 of the 42 League games. In June 1976 he moved to Coventry City, immediately won a first team place and scored 5 goals in 70 appearances for the Midland Club. Signed for Fulham earlier this season.

PETER KITCHEN

Peter was born in Mexborough and joined Doncaster Rovers straight from school. He made his League debut for Rovers against Exeter City in the early part of the 1971/72 season. During his career with Doncaster he made 240 appearances scoring 106 goals. He moved on to Orient during the summer of 1977 making 86 appearances and scoring 38 goals, until he was signed by Fulham for £150,000. Peter is married and has two sons and lives in Essex.

WELCOME

FOR our last home game of this season, we have the pleasure of extending a warm welcome to the Officials, Players and supporters of Fulham. Though at the time of writing Fulham have won only one of their last fourteen games, they are still in the top half of Division Two with an average of a point a game. All of which indicates that they could well have been in the promotion hunt if they had won just a few of their fourteen drawn games and turned just a few of their six defeats into draws. It could well be that they end up in a similar position to last season when they were tenth in the final reckoning after being in the relegation zone early in the season.

Such a pattern of quick changes of fortune is very much part of Fulham's history. It was in 1907 that the Cottagers were elected to Division Two and 43 of the ensuing 61 seasons have been spent in this Division with two spells each in Division One and Division Three. Their last spell in Division One ended in 1968 and then after falling to Division Three in the space of two seasons they bounced back again in 1971. It was only the fact that just two teams were relegated in those days that saved them tumbling straight back into Division Three, but despite their mediocre league positions in the ensuing years they reached the F.A. Cup Final for the first time in 1974/75 when going down 2-0 to West Ham.

They put up a great fight in this season's fourth round tie against Manchester United before going down at Old Trafford in a replay and these tussles brought back memories of 1957/8 when they took the post-Munich United to a semi-final replay. By contrast with these F.A. Cup glories they went out of the League Cup this season to Fourth Division Darlington. Such is the inconsistency of a team, whose ranks over the years have included such illustrious names as Johnny Haynes, Jimmy Hill, Alan Mullery, Bobby Moore and George Best.

It is perhaps typical of Fulham that their three away wins this season include those at promotion-seeking West Ham and Crystal Palace, though they have picked up five

points on their travels since winning at Selhurst Park in October. Three of our last five games against Fulham here have ended in 1-0 wins for us, while we went down by that same score at Craven Cottage in December, but there could well be more goals here today. Fulham will be hoping for this season's newcomers Chris Cuthrie (ex Sheffield United, Southend and Swindon) and Peter Kitchen (ex Orient and Doncaster) to be on the mark. They have scored most of Fulham's recent goals though Gordon Davies, who was with Merthyr last season, has also snatched a few. From midfield too John Margerrison, a former Spurs junior, now in his second full season, has also surprised a few clubs with his opportunism. He is likely to be linking up today with John Beck, a former Q.P.R. man who has returned to Fulham this season after a spell with Coventry. Tall home-grown product Tony Gale completes the midfield operators while in defence Eire international Gerry Peyton (virtually an ever-present since moving from Burnley over two years ago) has two more big men in front of him in central defenders Dick Money (from Scunthorpe last season) and Kevin Lock, now near the end of his first season at Craven Cottage after several years at West Ham.

Kevin was sent off at Newcastle a fortnight ago and if he is suspended there could be a reshuffle, but regular flank defenders this season have been Les Strong (over 200 games since moving from Crystal Palace) and Ray Evans, now in his third season after spells with Spurs and Millwall.

FROM JOHN WILKINSON'S DESK
AS this is the last programme of the season I would like to take this opportunity of thanking all those people who help us behind the scenes, making sure that everything goes smoothly on match days. The gatekeepers, stewards, car-park attendants, bar and tea staff. These people work very hard for the club and are inclined to be forgotten. It is only when they are not there that you realise just how much work they do. John Buttle is only a voice to many

people, but to Luton Town he is a vital part of our organisation giving out information, half-time and full-time scores. The hospital broadcasting teams, without them the local hospitals would not get a commentary. I haven't the space to mention everyone individually, but rest assured we really appreciate your efforts and hope very much that you will continue the good work for many seasons to come. To you the supporters, I say thank you for your support. We haven't had the best of seasons but you have been behind the team at all times and we can't ask for more than that. To the regular 'away' fans we say that it's great to see you, especially on the long journeys, waiting for the team to arrive at the grounds. I would like to know just how many miles they travel in the course of a season.

Have a good break and we hope to see you all back at Kenilworth Rd. next August. Enjoy the match.



CONGRATULATIONS to Kenny Dalglish of Liverpool — the Football Writers' Association choice as Player of the Year.

Though we live in a sporting world full of awards, the Football Writers has always been No. 1 and Dalglish is surely the right choice.

He polled 60 per cent of the votes — and why not. For Dalglish has scored at the extraordinary rate of a goal every other game since coming over the border from Celtic.

As my Evening News colleague Patrick Collins observed: "The greatest compliment one can pay him is the reflection that Keegan, the European Footballer of the Year, has scarcely been missed in the Liverpool front line."

Strange, that the players themselves could not even find a place for Dalglish in their top six.

CRYSTAL PALACE are ready to build an all-seater stand at Selhurst Park over the next three years if, as now looks likely, they climb into the First Division.

And chairman Ray Blyoe promises there will be money for manager Terry Venables to spend on the team.

"Palace have cut their £1 million plus overdraft to £280,000 and chairman Blyoe says: We act like a big business at Palace and we are fully aware that the team would need bringing up to strength if we make the First Division.

"We have many young players still to emerge but you need hardened professionals in the First Division.

"It's taken a lot of hard work to get this far. If we make it to the First we aim to stay there."

How Chelsea must wish they had spent on their team before it was too late...

BRIAN CLOUGH faces surely the toughest decision of the year when he picks his team for the European Cup Final against Malmö on May 30.

Does he bring in his £1 million striker Trevor Francis, who has previously been ineligible?

CloUGH gave a clue by playing Francis against Liverpool three days after Forest's semi-final triumph in Cologne — and dropping Ian Bowyer, the man who scored Forest's winner in that game.

Explained CloUGH simply: "Ian has been left out and Trevor Francis plays. It was hard but I honestly don't know how Ian feels."

"We don't ask questions here — we just put up team sheets." That's CloUGH, I guess — but I sometimes cannot help feeling that he is in danger of being bigger than the club he manages.

That's sad. And just one of the reasons why I think CloUGH will never get his greatest wish and become manager of England.

Palace's Terry Venables is my top selection to take over when Ron Greenwood eventually steps aside.

WIMBLEDON are cracking home the goals as they step up their Fourth Division promotion bid.

And they are now favourites to pip West Ham in the Evening News champagne-for-goals competition.

My newspaper is giving magnums of champagne to each first team squad member of the London club scoring most goals in 42 League games this season.

It's a two-horse race now with my money on Dario Gradi's Dons.

SAD story from Spurs, whose manager Keith Burkinshaw has transfer-listed goalkeeper Mark Kendall after a row because "he wanted fantastic money."

Burkinshaw was reported as saying: "It was a ridiculous demand and nowhere near my valuation of what he is worth to the club."

Kendall, dropped for the recent game against Ipswich, had a transfer request granted by Burkinshaw who went on: "I had just offered him a good rise on his existing contract and I had no need to do that."

"He thought he was worth a lot more. I get disappointed with players' attitudes all the time and this has been a never-ending saga with Kendall."

Charlton must also be disappointed with Mike Flanagan's attitude as they battle to stay out of the Third Division.

A look back at Luton Town a decade ago.

THE SEASON ended with a bang ten years ago this week as the Town chased a slim hope of winning promotion from the Third Division just a year after taking the Fourth Division championship.

The old enemy came down the motorway for a vital midweek match — Watford visited Kenilworth Road as league leaders, needing just one point to clinch the Third Division crown.

The Town had to take both points and then hope for rivals to slip up to give them runners-up place — only the top two teams were promoted in those days.

It was a game to remember, though not entirely for the right reasons. The gates had to be closed early with 25,223 packed in the ground, the biggest gate for ten years, and never since bettered.

There was fighting in the crowd, with a couple of dozen arrests and scores thrown out, and some of the action on the pitch was a bit strong too, with three men sent off by referee Ken Burns.

Ian Buxton, playing his last game for the Town before taking up full-time cricket with Derbyshire, celebrated in

style, scoring his first league goal of the season in the 28th minute.

Five minutes after the break, Alan Slough and Barry Endean got involved in a wrestling episode and pandemonium broke out when both were sent off.

In the 69th minute Keith Allen headed the Town's second goal from a cross by Brian Lewis and we thought that would be the end of the excitement.

Watford's Tom Valley apparently disagreed — he was sent off in the 84th minute for a foul on Lewis, and a minute later Stewart Scullion scored for the nine men after a weak back pass by Max Dougan.

Alas, Swindon and Watford still pipped the Town for promotion, ending the season on 64 points, with the Town three points adrift in third place.

Leeds won the First Division title, six points clear of Liverpool, with Derby and Crystal Palace taking the two top places in the Second Division.

Today's visitors had a miserable season — they were relegated with Bury to the Third Division.




