



Evidently, they had the dubious distinction of gaining a verbal lashing from their manager after mauling Burnley 7-0. Perhaps Tommy Docherty was thinking the Press wouldn't believe him, but I'm sure his players did! We have an opportunity today to put our game together after the disappointing performance against Preston, who had already taken points away from our visitors, QPR and also Newcastle and Sunderland, and the quality of their football was refreshing. However, had we not played below par we would have been capable of taking both points. I thought our supporters got behind the side well, but perhaps they could have done better too. Success brings different pressures which we shall all have to cope with.

# DAVID'S DIARY

When a side is losing, the odd victory is greeted with pleasure and the gloom can be lifted. When a side is on a winning run and they get a bad result, there is a tendency to be over critical. When you're winning, you are expected to win; when you are losing, no one expects anything.

I have said often this season that we have not yet met a side we are inferior to, but I had no hesitation after the last home game in admitting that Preston had played well, Luton, by our own high standards, had played poorly and a draw was a good result for us. Likewise, we shall remain realistic and honest in everything we do. One of the problems which success brings is the tremendous demands which are made on the players, and our staff, to attend functions, charities, to give talks or coach. It is something Ken Gutteridge and I will have to carefully control because there is great danger that we can all become 24-hour a day personalities, and 'do gooders'. Our only ambition is to produce a team worthy of promotion to the First Division, and anything we do must help that aim.

Too many distractions, which are physically and mentally demanding, will have to be curbed a little, and I hope people will understand.

To our many supporters, who have wished Lil Fuccillo good luck, we thank you. He is in reasonably good spirits and is 'kicking' every ball from his wheelchair position at all our home games. I am sure this experience will make Lil even more determined to bounce back as a vital player at our club.

It is good to hear that the young reserve side are stabilising their League position.

They are only too aware that we have a small squad and that opportunities will arrive for them, when it does, they must grasp their chance.

We took the first team to Nuneaton in a testimonial game for their trainer. The application against the non-Leaguers was first class, and three apprentices — Neil Madden, Frank Bunn and Robert Walker — all did well. The players showed a first class attitude and the Nuneaton public were delighted with the brilliant football we played.

Finally, I would ask you to support our pools fund raising as much as possible. If we want to sign players to strengthen our squad, we need as much financial backing as we can muster. Eleven thousand people through the turnstiles is fine, but it will not help too much if we are to achieve our aim and maintain the position.

My mathematics tell me that, if 11,000 extra people invest in a 25p ticket each week, we would soon be accumulating nearly £10,000 per month more. Last year, Mike Hardwicke's team of workers enabled this club to receive almost £100,000, and this year they have already beaten this figure. Like us on the field they are doing quite well, but can improve further with your support.

## JOHN'S JOTTINGS



Our visitors today were formed in 1885 as St. Jude's Institute, and their colours were half Oxford and half Cambridge blue. I think they hold the record for changing grounds because, no fewer than eleven times since they were formed, they have moved.

Their most ambitious move was to the White City Stadium but it didn't work out and they returned to Loftus Road.

After winning the Championship of the old Southern League in 1908, they resigned, hoping to be elected to the Second Division of the Football League, but they failed with their application and suddenly found themselves without a league to compete in.

However, the officials of the Southern League relented and extended the division to include Rangers on condition they played all their home matches in mid-week for one season — a far cry from today's organisation!

The first Division Two fixture between the two clubs was on 21st August, 1948, at Kenilworth Road when both sides played out a 0-0 draw. For those people interested, the Town team that day was: Streten, Cooke, Lindsay, Gardiner, Hall, Gripton, Nelson, Brennan, Arnison, Burtenshaw, Waugh. Billy Waugh is featured in 'Down Memory Lane' elsewhere in this afternoon's programme.

The return fixture was on December 18th, 1948, at Loftus Road, when we won 3-0. The Town team was Streten, Wilson, Cooke, Morton, Hall, Gardiner, Brennan, Kiernan, Arnison, Watkins and Waugh. Scorers were Arnison (2) and Brennan.

Games between us have rarely resulted in high scoring matches, but one exception was Friday 6th November, 1964, when we were given a 7-1 hiding at Loftus Road. Incidentally, manager David Pleat, was in the Town side that day and scored our only goal. To put the match right in the return fixture, we won 2-0, with David and Ted Phillips getting the goals.

Turning to more current times, Don Shanks, who could play today was a Town player during the early 70's and made about 89 League appearances for us before being transferred to the Rangers for £30,000 in November, 1974. Surely the quickest goal must go to Mike Keen who, playing against his old club at Loftus Road, scored after 88 seconds to give us a 1-0 victory on 29th September, 1970.

Included in the Town side that day was Don Givens who joined QPR from Luton in July, 1972. Relations between our two clubs were not confined to the playing side, because Alec Stock became our manager after being with Rangers for many seasons and succeeded in getting us out of the Third Division.

Our Chief Executive, John Smith, also had about four years as secretary there.

Phillip Hough has spent the last week with me. Phillip is assistant secretary of Poole Town, the Southern League club. His ambition is to move into the administration side of the game, with a Football League club, and I was only too pleased to let him see what goes on behind the scenes here. I hope he has enjoyed his week with us, and that he can put into practice some of the ideas we have given him.

## COMMERCIAL CORNER

### TICKET OFFICE NEWS

After the Sunderland game, we received numerous complaints about the number of 85p OAP tickets available. One letter, regarding this subject was published in the Sports Final on Saturday, 20th October, but this was replied to by a Mr. Fox very adequately in the following week's issue so we will not go over that ground again.

The facts about the number of tickets made available is as follows: The highest number of OAP seats sold during this season's home games, until the Sunderland match, was 78. Each game, we issue 100 tickets and, with Sunderland being a popular fixture, the tickets were sold quite early. There was no question, as has been suggested, that because of the popularity of the Sunderland game the number of OAP tickets were cut down and extra tickets were sold at the higher price.

There are always 100 tickets available to start with and, as we go to press, 100 tickets reserved for OAP's for today's game have been put aside already. We can assure you we could have sold these at the full price many times.

While on the subject of ticket sales it would greatly help the ticket office staff if supporters wishing to purchase tickets for future games would do so before 2.15 p.m., or immediately after the Saturday game. Our main aim is to ensure supporters get into the game in time for the kick-off on that particular day.

### TICKETS FOR AWAY GAMES

When there is sufficient demand, we try to obtain tickets for away games. However, there is not a liability on the home team to provide an allocation of tickets for Football League games and, consequently, at grounds where the available seating accommodation is limited, it is very difficult to obtain sufficient tickets.

One such game was last Saturday's match against Cambridge. We could have sold those we received ten times over but, as anyone knowing the Cambridge ground is aware there are just not the seats available. Therefore, supporters requiring tickets for away games should make their applications at least two weeks before the match in question.

### NOT ALL TICKET

Our home match with Chelsea on New Year's Day will kick-off at 11 a.m., but will **not** be all ticket. We hope our fans who normally stand on the open terrace at the Kenilworth Road end of the ground will assist us by using either the enclosure or Oak Road end.

This will help not only ourselves, but the police to make the necessary arrangements needed for the control of visiting supporters.

# QUEENS PARK RANGERS



Controversial Tommy Docherty has certainly seen the soccer world. Manager of six Football League clubs in addition to Porto FC, the Doc has had his fair share of the newspaper headlines.

Formerly manager of Chelsea, Rotherham, Aston Villa, Manchester United and Derby, Docherty left the Baseball Ground last season to link with QPR.

One of his favourite occupations is playing the transfer market and, at Derby, 30 players came and went during 20 months in transfer deals valued at £2½m. When the Doc arrived in London, the dust had hardly settled at Loftus Road before three players were on the move.

Ex-England skipper Gerry Francis crossed London to join Crystal Palace for £465,000 and John Hollins decided to throw in his lot with Arsenal instead of Luton for a £75,000 fee. The trio was completed with Dave Clements who joined Bolton for £165,000.

But Docherty was also extremely active in bringing players to the club. Tony Currie arrived for £400,000 just before the Doc signed David McCreery from Manchester United. Docherty tried several times to take him to the Baseball Ground before he joined Rangers for £200,000. But perhaps Docherty's biggest coup was the signing of Nottingham

Forest's keeper Chris Woods, an England Under-23 international. Woods earned his national reputation when, almost single handed, he denied Liverpool in the League Cup Final to earn Forest a replay they won in 1978.

Forest's brilliant England keeper Peter Shilton restricted young Wood to a handful of first team games at the County Ground and, when he joined Rangers for £250,000 in the summer, he had still to make his League debut.

Winger Steve Burke is another ex-Forest player who had limited chances under Brian Clough, and Docherty secured his transfer for a cheque worth £120,000.

Docherty's ability to jolt the transfer market received a double boost on the day he signed Burke because he made another signing when he paid Wolves £250,000 for their unsettled defender Bob Hazell.

That didn't signal the end of the big deals at Loftus Road because Docherty followed those by spending £300,000 on former Chelsea defender Steve Wicks who joined Rangers from Derby County.

Under Docherty's leadership, Rangers have quietly climbed into one of the promotion places. Much of their success has been due to the scoring exploits of Paul Goddard and Clive Allen who both have the benefit of speed and lethal finishing.

Allen, only 18, made a fine start in Rangers' first team when he scored a hat-trick against Coventry last season in his debut.

Docherty's signings have made the fight for first team places obviously competitive. But full back Ian Gillard has played consistently during his 11 seasons with Rangers. An England international, he has made over 600 appearances for the club.

Luton fans will not need reminding about another Rangers full back Don Shanks. He spent some time at Kenilworth Road before joining the London club and is competing for a first team place with Karl Elsey.

There is a touch of class in all positions at Loftus Road and one player who emphasises this is Glenn Roeder, a £250,000 signing from Orient just over a year ago.

Any news on Rangers would not be complete without a mention of Stan Bowles. He was in the news recently for controversial remarks he made after Rangers won 2-1 at Watford. Bowles is currently playing in a very competitive midfield department with McCreery and Currie.

Rachid Harkouk, formerly with Palace, and ex-Linfield player Billie Hamilton, who cost Rangers only £40,000, are also battling for those elusive first team places.
