




Several of this team are still of youth age, and would have been playing in the Youth Cup tie last Tuesday against QPR.

Once again, our players have been out and about helping charities and visiting youth clubs. I have never been involved with such a willing and responsible group of players. They are a credit to the club. In one week recently, players and staff presented awards at the American base at Chicksands and the Luton Irish Boxing Championships, lectured at Taddington Youth FC, presented cups at the Harpenden Scouts, football finals, and went fund raising for U.N.I.C.E.F.

One of the most cheerful of characters, physio John Sheridan, has been particularly pleased lately. His 'star' patient, Lil Fuccillo, has been given the all-clear to recommence light bodywork. He has had his plaster removed and John can now use his expertise to advise and encourage him on his physical development so he will soon be playing again.

JOHN'S JOTTINGS



Saturday, November 30, 1946, is a date which will always be printed in my memory. I remember well rushing back from St. Albans after playing for the county in the morning, and being part of the 25,410 crowd at Kenilworth Road in the afternoon to watch what was probably the most exciting game seen at Luton. Newcastle came here as League leaders and ten minutes before the kick-off, the gates were closed on police instructions.

Our visitors played some delightful football, and went in at half time 3-0 up. Their scorers were Roy Bentley after 12 minutes, Charlie Wayman after 26 minutes and Len Shackleton after 28 minutes.

I don't think anyone in the ground would have forecast what was to follow. Luton came out for the second half with their sleeves rolled up and set about their opponents as if their lives depended upon it. Billy Waugh pulled one back after 54 minutes, and Mel Daniels and Hugh Billington levelled the scores after 56 and 60 minutes respectively. The crowd then went wild when Alan Driver scored the winner after the Newcastle keeper had parried a shot from Dally Duncan.

For those supporters who like to keep the records, the teams that day were: Luton Town: Bywater, Cooke, Beach, Soo, Gager, Gardiner, Waugh, Daniel, Billington, Driver, Duncan.

Newcastle United: Swinburne, Craig, Graham, Harvey, Smith, Wright, Milburn, Bentley, Wayman, Shackleton, Pearson.

Newcastle were formed in 1892 and, in the following year, were elected to the 'Second Division. Their roll of honour is something most other clubs envy; Football League champions four times. FA Cup finalists 11 times — which is still a record; FA Cup winners six times. They have also been winners of the Inter Cities Fairs Cup, Anglo-Italian Cup, Texaco Cup and numerous reserve competitions. Their record League victory was on October 2, 1946, then they gave Newport County a 13-0 thrashing.

The first meeting between our two clubs was on February 19, 1898, when we won 3-1. In the return match on March 12, the same year our visitors won 4-1.

Many famous centre forwards have worn the black and white stripes — Hughie Gallagher, Albert Stubbins, Jackie Milburn, Charlie Wayman, Roy Bentley and, more recently Malcolm Macdonald.

Other names, such as Harvey Brennan, Fairbrother, Allchurch, Stokoe, Keith, the Robledo brothers, were all stars in their own right. Our last meeting in the League was in February, 1975, at Kenilworth Road, when Ron Futcher scored the only goal of the match watched by a crowd of 18,019, taking revenge on a 1-0 defeat at St. James's Park back in November.

Games between the two clubs have usually gone in favour of the home side, but we caused a surprise in February, 1973, by winning 2-0 in an FA Cup fourth round match at St. James's Park with John Aston getting two goals before half time to give us a victory. The crowd was 42,276.



It had to happen . . . we have received many complaints from supporters following our method of distribution of tickets for our game at Watford on Boxing Day. These go on sale at Kenilworth Road tomorrow morning between 10 a.m. and 11.30 and, unfortunately, our allocation of seating tickets provided by Watford is nowhere near enough to satisfy even our season ticket holders.

We have enough stand tickets to serve approximately one season ticket holder in every eight and that is why we have decided to restrict each season ticket holder to only one ticket on production of their books which will be stamped. Season ticket holders have until Friday 14th December, to claim their tickets before they go on sale to the general public — if there are any left. Tickets on sale tomorrow will be issued on a first come—first served basis.

Our allocation of standing tickets also go on sale tomorrow when supporters will be restricted to two tickets each. We appreciate that some season ticket holders will be unable to buy a ticket, but are sure supporters will appreciate our problems. There are no reduced junior or senior citizens' admission for this match.



HERE THIS AFTERNOON

NEWCASTLE UNITED



Newcastle United can be set alongside the Aston Villa's and Arsenal's as one of soccer's most illustrious clubs. Throughout football history, the name of Newcastle United features prominently and, in short, their history starts back in the days when Custer was fighting the Indians at Little Big Horn.

United have had their fair share of the glory days with three FA Cup victories in the fifties, and in the next decade, Newcastle went on to appear several times in the old Fairs Cup and once won the trophy.

But manager Bill McGarry's first priority is to lead Newcastle out of the Second Division. Last season was their first in Division Two for 13 years — and that was a bitter pill to swallow for the soccer mad Geordie fans who were weaned on names like Robledo, Scoular, Harvey, Shackleton, Milburn and Macdonald.

North Eastern soccer fans make no secret of the fact that they want Division One status again, and McGarry intends to see they get it.

Although he has invested heavily in the transfer market, two of the players who have hit the highlights this season at St. James's Park cost next to nothing.

Alan Shoulder arrived last season from non-League soccer with Blyth Spartans and has continued his scoring exploits. Peter Cartwright

was also a product of junior football when McGarry paid North Shields a paltry £1,000 for his transfer during the summer.

McGarry sold Irvine Nattrass to Middlesbrough for over £300,000 and then spent £140,000 of that on central defender Stuart Boam, and gave Norwich a £175,000 cheque for Wales Under-21 full back Ian Davies.

McGarry looked to the legendary Chesterfield goalkeeper nursery school when he signed Steve Hardwick in 1977 and, at first, the youngster found it hard to break into the first team. A loan spell with American club Detroit Express gave him additional confidence and, at the start of last season, he replaced Mike Mahoney before losing his place to Kevin Carr. But Hardwick has battled hard and has regained his place.

McGarry also has the benefit of John Brownlie's grit at full back. A Scot, Brownlie is playing with confidence and is an ideal partner for Davies. Dave Barton and John Bird are battling for the central defender's position with Barton currently holding that spot.

Midfield positions are occupied with the consistency of Terry Hibbitt, Mick Martin and Tommy Cassidy. Hibbitt has returned to Newcastle for his second spell after leaving for Birmingham where he has made 110 appearances and scored 11 goals.

Newcastle secured his return to St. James's Park in a double deal

which took Stewart Barrowclough to Birmingham. But Cassidy is the player with most experience. He has been at Newcastle for nine years after signing from Coleraine for £25,000 and recently won a re-call to the Northern Ireland team.

Martin, an Eire international, began his playing career at Old Trafford with Manchester United before moving on to link with West Brom. He moved to Newcastle, his third club, in 1978.

Up front, McGarry persuaded Brian Clough to part with Peter Withe who made 74 appearances at the City Ground and scored 28 goals. Yet young Withe is one of the game's most travelled players because Newcastle is his seventh club.

Withe knocked 14 goals past opponents' keepers last season — a record which helped United to finish in eighth place and McGarry sees the £200,000 he paid Clough for the transfer as money well spent.

McGarry recently paid Wolves £150,000 to secure the transfer of Billy Rafferty — a player Luton were reputed to be interested in — and he scored his first goal for his new club in the victory at Swansea two weeks ago.

With a front line of Withe, Shoulder and Rafferty, McGarry perhaps has some justification for thinking this could be Newcastle's promotion year.

DOWN MEMORY LANE




