Manager's Notes

Tonight we entertain Luton in a re-arranged fixture. The game was originally planned for January 18th, but owing to a bad overnight frost the game had to be postponed. Luton are riding high at the top of the Division and are a fine, open attacking side. This was demonstrated most emphatically when we were the visitors to Kenilworth Road earlier this season. Our 5-0 defeat was the heaviest inflicted on us since I have been at the Club and we shall be looking for some sort of revenge tonight.

Last Friday's match against Birmingham was a disappointment to all of us. It was always going to be a tight affair and I suppose that Birmingham could feel that they were well worth the two points. However, from my own point of view, the match was yet another example of us not taking full advantage of our chances. Too often this season we have been our own worst enemies and Friday night we kicked ourselves in the teeth yet again.

The first half was played at a fast pace and both defences held firm, but a missed penalty right on half time was, for me, the turning point. It was a bad psychological moment for a miss of that kind and, had we come in 1-0 in



front, I am convinced that we certainly would not have lost the game. In all probability we would have won. This type of thing has happened to us more times than I care to remember this season. I should say here that I don't consider it bad luck, but I must admit to having had more frustrations this season than at any time during my career. From a managers point of view there is always the danger of over-reacting when something like this happens, and to me it doesn't matter how long and hard you analyse Friday's match - good saves, missed chances, the general run of play, I would sum it up in one sentence. If you can't score penalties you don't deserve to win matches. I realise players don't do these things deliberately, but the team we play tonight offers an interesting contrast. I wonder where Luton would be if David Moss had missed a third of the penalty kicks given to him? He hasn't, and that's one of the reasons why Luton are challenging for promotion.

There are a couple of matches in the Welsh Cup this evening and the results are, of course, of special interest to us. Along with Shrewsbury, we have progressed to the semi-finals and will be joined by the winners of the Wrexham - Newport tie and also the winners of the Merthyr v Chester match. European football is the prize awaiting the Cup winners and it is important that we do everything possible to keep our season going right up until the middle of May.



In Opposition Today

From the moment this season started, Luton Town have been sounding out their promotion ambitions. They have led the table on several occasions; never been outside the cluster of leading clubs; possess an impressive goalscoring record home and away.

What they need now to really line that return to the First Division following their relegation in the 1974-75 season is the kind of consistency they produced last autumn.

Then they went from the end of August to the end of November with just one defeat - at Cardiff City when two Ray Bishop goals edged them out of a draw. That run took them into the top spot but it came to an end with a home 2-3 defeat by Birmingham - their one set-back at Kenilworth Road before last weekend's important clash against West Ham.

Since then, of course, Luton have lost rarely but, equally, they have been unable to break clear of the promotion-hunting pack.

The Swans have a straightforward motivation this evening: their heaviest defeat of the season came at Kenilworth

WAYNE TURNER (Defender/Midfield)



Development of local talent is one of the priorities at Kenilworth Road and Turner, who plays midfield or defence, is now on the fringe of making the complete journey from schoolboy soccer to league duty with his home town club. Signed as an apprentice in 1977, he was skipper of Luton's reserve side within two years and made his League debut in the final Second Division match of last season.

Road last September when they crashed 0-5. The lively David Moss scored twice and the other goals came from Bob Hatton, Alan West and Ricky Hill.

Moss has not stopped scoring all season. His tally before last weekend had reached 21 League goals and his marksmanship from the penalty spot (eight of them so far) has proved deadly. Bob Hatton, who has scored goals all his career for a variety of clubs is now on 12.

Both men have scored hat-tricks. Hatton achieved it by cracking in all three goals against Bristol Rovers in October and Moss followed up earlier this month by netting three of the four that destroyed luckless Fulham. Brian Stein was the other scorer in that game and his six from midfield make him third highest scorer.

Luton's away record is highly impressive. They have won at Leicester, Fulham, West Ham, Cambridge, Shrewsbury and Watford and picked up a point each time from games at Notts County, Burnley and Orient.

Brisk, forceful manager David Pleat has shaken up Luton in no uncertain terms following last season's near miss from relegation . . . and come up with the answers.

DAVID MOSS (Forward)



Having given sterling service to Swindon in the Third Division for nine years, flying winger Moss proved that he was more than capable of upsetting Second Division defence after his £110,000 move to Luton in the summer of 1978. His pace and accuracy, allied with the ability to cross the ball at speed, give the Luton attack strength on either flank and he is always likely to pop up with a goal

RICKY HILL (Midfield)



Has made over 100 appearances since becoming a Luton apprentice upon leaving school. Was capped at youth level for England gained a first team place while still only 17. He is now 21.

ALAN JUDGE (Goalkeeper)



Hertfordshire schools produced, who joined Luton Town as an apprentice in the summer of 1976. Became junior professional within a year.

GARY SISMAN (Defender)



Signed while still a schoolboy in Hertfordshire, Sisman was soon marked out as a top young defender - he was capped six times by England at schoolboy level in the 1975/6 season and joined Luton as an apprentice at the end of that campaign.

PASQUALE FUCCILLO (Midfield)



Son of Italian parents who settled at Bedford and known as "Lil" by his friends and the Luton fans, Fuccillo is another Luton player who has come up through the ranks. A skilful, hard-tackling midfielder with a liking for joining the attack and scoring goals, he became a regular Second Division player in 1976 when he was 19. Broke a leg in a League game at Brighton and was out of action for six months. Lonely hours of training through the close season put him on the road back to full recovery.

MAL DONAGHY (Defender)



A Belfast-born Northern Ireland under-21 international who joined Luton from Irish League club Larne in the summer of 1978 for £15,000. Has played over 50 first team games - 40 of them since last season.

JAKE FINDLAY (Goalkeeper)



Has recently completed his first year's service with Luton whom he joined from Aston Villa for £100,000. Since gaining further League experience - he had but 14 senior outings at Villa - has come to be looked upon as a potential Scottish international.

PAUL PRICE (Defender)



Luton's longest-serving player, full-back Price was spotted by a club scout as a schoolboy in Hertfordshire. He became an apprentice at Kenilworth Road in 1971 and had to fight harder than most to break through into the league side - he broke a leg, recovered, then broke it again less than a year later. The second come-back was permanent and he has been a regular member of Luton's league team for the past 4 years.

KIRK STEPHENS (Defender)



One of the best deals Luton ever done took Stephens to Luton in the summer of 1978. He was signed from Nuneaton Borough where Luton boss David Pleat had once been manager, and made a remarkable transition from part-time to full-time soccer. He went straight into Luton's side at right back and became so effective and popular that his first season ended with him being elected "Player of the Year" by the Luton supporters.

MICK SAXBY (Defender)



Luton paid their Club record fee to lure central defender Saxby from Third Division Mansfield in the summer of 1979. Saxby's qualities made him a target for several top clubs. He has the qualities to become a big name in football.

GRAHAM JONES (Defender/Midfield)



Picked up from schools football in Manchester at the age of 16 in 1975, Jones made rapid strides through Luton's junior ranks to make his league debut at 17. He can play in defence or midfield and is one of the younger men who keep up the pressure for places in Luton's Second Division team.

BOB HATTON (Forward)



This Hull-born striker is currently with his seventh League club, having previously played for Wolves, Bolton, Northampton, Carlisle, Birmingham and Blackpool. His regular goals for Luton this season now take his career League aggregate to over 140.

F.A.W. TAKES A STAND

by 'Outsider'

The Football Association of Wales is showing a sturdy independence these days. There was a time when it drifted along making few decisions of consequence and stepping backwards swiftly at the slight hint of controversy; now it sets a vigorous example of leadership.

In recent days that alert and forceful secretary, Trevor Morris, has publicly snubbed the Sports Council for Wales and has also indicated that the F.A.W. are prepared to take on the Football League.

It is rarely to the benefit of anyone when various administrations are at loggerheads - but it has to be said that Mr. Morris is acting firmly and very much in the interests of Welsh football in his two current stands.

Take the first flashpoint: advertising for a national team manager-director of coaching to succeed Mike Smith. That produced a Sports Council statement to the effect that grant aid would be withheld unless the responsibilities were split. In other words, the Sports Council will not contribute towards the professional side of the appointment which is managing the national teams.

This made Morris see red. "They have no right to dictate job designation or anything else. Whatever title we choose is our business, not their's," he snapped.

Certainly the terms of an F.A.W. appointment are the F.A.W.'s business and it has to be said that, under Smith's dual capacity role, Welsh football prospered. It does not seem far-fetched to adopt a proven policy for a second time.

On the broader issue of coaching in general, it must be hoped that the F.A.W. and the Sports Council are on the same wavelength. The F.A.W. as well as seeking a successor to Smith are also advertising for a Coach and Development Officer: this, presumably, is in line with the laid down policy of the Sports Council.

Morris points out that Soccer is "Wales most popular sport in terms of the number of people taking part" and the role of the Coaching and Development Officer is to encourage more and more people to play the game ... and to play it at a higher level of accomplishment.

The factual statement by the F.A.W.'s secretary may well surprise a great many people because the widely held common belief is that Rugby is the Welsh national game and, undoubtedly, a case can be made out on this score. Yet it is also true that more Welsh people play Soccer than Rugby: it is equally correct that one code is concentrated in the South while the other is played coast to coast.

These arguments, however, should be no more than the subject of a sports forum debate. In the real world - one in which the pleasure and enjoyment of participants is concerned - both sports merit equal treatment, equal encouragement and equal opportunity.

The second front of the F.A.W.'s war is in pursuing a place for a Welsh club in the U.E.F.A. Cup. The four Football League clubs within Wales are meeting with the F.A.W. to decide the next step in a, so far, frustrated campaign.

The sticking point in the bid to launch a qualifying tournament between Swansea City, Cardiff City, Wrexham and Newport County is the League's insistence that no member club can engage in a competition without the sanction of the management committee.

This means, in effect, that the four clubs cannot engage each other within the borders of Wales unless the League's hierarchy gives its clearance. This stand from League headquarters in St. Annes has upset the F.A.W. and particularly Mr. Morris who mooted the scheme as a boost for Welsh football.

Undoubtedly the League has good reasons for its policy and one may well be its concern about the amount of football now being played. Welsh football already has one more competition than English clubs with the Welsh Cup:

now the U.E.F.A. Cup qualifying tournament (which would be played on a 'league' basis) would mean three more matches for the four clubs.

If this is the obstacle, then one answer could be a pre-season competition. There is an understandable reluctance by the managers of the Welsh Clubs to become involved in fierce domestic rivalry before the season starts in earnest and it is generally thought that October might be more acceptable.

There was - and still is - great merit in this idea from Trevor Morris. It is basically unfair that Wales should have one-third of the representation in European club football of nations like Malta, Ireland and Iceland: if the Welsh clubs themselves are prepared to find the space in a crowded season, there is surely room for a compromise.







Terry Medwin

There is no need to remind supporters about the shocking luck that Phil Boersma has experienced since he joined this club: what is less well known, perhaps, is the way that he has kept up his spirits by working as hard as anyone behind the scenes.

Phil, of course, is still a player - working hard to get back to first team squad fitness. But he has an 'extra' to keep his interest going: helping out at training sessions. He also takes his place alongside me on the bench on match days... and he's not there for

the ride, believe me!

With John Toshack now so heavily involved as a player, the emergence of Phil as unofficial member of our 'backroom' staff could not have been better timed. In the daily training sessions, we split the players into groups and Phil often helps with one of them.

As well as helping to organise and run the training, he goes as far as he can himself on the ankle he broke almost a year ago to keep himself fit. There is nothing worse for a player in his position to hang his head... because then everything goes. By staying part of the scene, Phil keeps his interest alive and his fitness at a reasonable standard.

His knowledge is particularly useful on match days. It is always best to have two minds concentrating on the game from the bench and, because he has achieved so much himself, Phil looks at games realistically and knowing exactly what is wanted.

Before the kick-off and during the interval, he will have a quiet word with certain players on points he thinks can help them. When a man has played First Division football for Liverpool and Middlesbrough, he obviously has a great deal to offer.

Knowing that Phil is in partnership with me during matches, takes the pressure off John - whose importance to us as a player is needed even more in the Second Division than in the Fourth and Third because he possesses so much experience at the highest levels.



SOCCER SURPRISES No. 4

Following the Reading F.A. Cup match here at the Vetch earlier in the season, Jimmy Scoular was commenting on our 'Surprises' feature. As is fairly well known, Jimmy is the only player ever to have turned out for two different teams in the F.A. Cup during the same season (apart from any special dispensation cases). He played for Gosport in an early round and then for Portsmouth in the January of the same season. However, Jimmy added to that tale for us, for he was taken to the Pompey match 'under escort'. That's it, he was doing 'Jankers' for taking a working party to a football match instead of to a work detail. As far as I know that is the only case of a player appearing for a League club while technically being under arrest. Or is it? Anyone know any better?

Another Vetch Field personality to chip in with a 'Surprise' tale is ex-Ref. John Gow. (why is it, by the way, that we are not allowed to have Welsh refs. while English clubs have an official from England for all their games? I think that we have a case for the E.E.C. Courts, don't you?)

John had been in charge of a Leeds v Chelsea match which was shown on the 'box'. U.K. fans may not know that our games are shown 'live' in Sweden. Thus there are many Scandinavian fans of British clubs. On this occasion John arrived home just in time to go to bed. At 2 a.m. the phone rang (that's it, downstairs). It was an irate (Swedish) Leeds fan complaining about a decision which had been given against his team during the game. Poor old John couldn't even show him the red card. You wouldn't wish that even on a Grammar School boy, would you (gerrof, John).

☆ But back to our usual style. Who was the only soccer player to wear a rugby style

scrum-cap regularly? No kidding! His name was Tom Priestley, an inside forward with Chelsea in the Thirties. Tom had lost his hair as a result of a childhood illness.

☆ Ex Welsh Chief, Mike Smith, will be hoping that he can turn the clock back at Hull City as regards crowds. During the 1948-49 season in the Third Division (North), Hull's home crowd **averaged** more than 37,000.

☆ How's this for a surprise? A goal direct from a THROW-IN. Bokas, a half-back with Barnsley, threw the ball in straight at goal in a game against Manchester United. The United goalkeeper was so surprised that he pushed the ball into his own net in an attempt to keep it out.

☆ In November, 1938, the Maine Road programme for a match against 'Spurs' showed Bert Sprotson as the visitor's right back. However, since he was transferred to Manchester City the day before the game was played, he actually turned out for them instead.

☆ How about the fastest sending-off? Inside one minute is the answer. The player was called Ambrose Brown of Wrexham. He was sent off on Christmas Day, of all times, in 1936 against Hull City.

☆ But that's not as bad as a player called Jimmy Turnbull. He was a centre-forward with Manchester United in 1909. On October 16th of that year he was sent off in a match against Aston Villa. One week later in a game against Sheffield Utd. he had his 'marching orders' again. As far as I can tell, this is the only case of a League player being sent off in two successive matches.

Despite a fine display at Upton Park a fortnight ago, it is nevertheless West Ham and not Swansea City who stand a mere two games away from a visit to the twin towers of Wembley on 10th May. Although we now have no more than a passing interest in the destiny of the F.A. Cup, it is difficult to ignore the possibilities offered by the quarter-final draw.

The 'plum' tie of the round must be Spurs against Liverpool. There have been times this season when Liverpool have looked almost unbeatable, but in Hoddle, Vila and Ardiles, Tottenham have players good enough to cause problems for any team. Terry Yorath has added a competitive edge to the midfield and little Steve Perryman rarely has a bad game. Perryman apart, however, they look somewhat brittle at the back and Dalglish and company should be good enough to take Liverpool one step nearer another trophy.

Our conquerors, West Ham, have an intriguing tie against in-form Aston Villa, although Villa were made to battle all the way by Third Division Blackburn Rovers in the last round. Villa's board-room wrangles during the early part of the season seemed to affect their playing performances, but they seem to have sorted themselves out, both on and off the field and look a good bet to make the semi-final.

Watford's resounding 3-0 win at Wolves has been rewarded with a home game against cup holders Arsenal. Watford's league form would suggest an easy passage for the Gunners, but Terry Neill will be under no illusions about the size of the task facing his men at Vicarage Road. Graham Taylor has been very active in the transfer market during recent months in an attempt to ensure Second Division survival and I am sure he would gladly swap a place in the semi-final for a safe League position. Arsenal have developed something of a Wembley habit in the last couple of years and they must surely take another step towards a third consecutive appearance.

High-flying Ipswich, fresh from their creditable draw at Anfield last week, travel to Merseyside once more to take on Everton whose League position is precarious to say the least. Gordon Lee has rarely been able to field a settled side and he certainly has enough good players to get the club out of trouble, given freedom from injury. The Cup is obviously Everton's only chance of a trophy and for that reason alone I think they may have the beating of Ipswich — despite that 4-0 drubbing in the League three weeks ago.

Last four? How about Liverpool, Aston Villa, Arsenal and Everton.

HATS OFF TO THE HATTERS

Luton Town are old adversaries of the Swans. Like us they were founder members of Division 3 (although they had been elected to Division 2 in 1900). Thus our first matches in opposition were during that season. We lost 0-3 at Kenilworth Road and drew 0-0 here. All in all we have played each other 38 times including those games and only eight have been drawn. That augurs well for this evening's match.

Our biggest victory over the Hatters was in the 1952-53 season, when we won 4-2 here at the Vetch. Terry Medwin will remember that game, for he and Harry Griffiths each scored twice to win the game for us. Harry played outside-right on that occasion with Cyril Beech on the other wing.

Luton's most memorable day was thirty years before that, when they took us apart to win 1-6 on their own ground. Len Thompson scored the Swans only goal.

A game of more recent memory saw us win 3-1 here at the Vetch in April 1961; the Swan's team on that


occasion was: *Dwyer, Sanders, Griffiths; Davies P, Nurse and Saunders; Jones (B), Davies (R), Reynolds, Webster and Williams (G).* Barry Jones, Peter Davies and an own goal won the match for us.

For visiting supporters, a team to recall was that which trounced us 1-5 at Luton in the following season. This was: *Baynham; McNally, Bramwell; McGuffie, Kelly, and Pacey; Walden, McKechnie, Turner, Lowndes and Fleming.*

Of course, when it comes to scoring goals, Luton had the king of them all ... at least as regards goals scored in one game. In April 1936 Joe Payne scored ten goals against Bristol Rovers. Not surprisingly it still stands as a record individual score in a Football League match.

Looking at the records it would appear that whenever Luton have had a field day with us at Kenilworth Road, the return match at the Vetch has been tight. Usually we have won by the odd goal. I think we will keep that record going today.

Meet ... DAVE STEWART



Dave Stewart is the Swans latest signing — and glad to be here after playing “too long” in the reserves at West Bromwich. He has certainly made a flying start: a draw at Leicester in one of the toughest away matches of the season and then the first away victory for four months at Fulham.

“I've really enjoyed the experience. You are only passing the time playing in the reserves,” says Dave. Born in Glasgow, he first came into professional football with Ayr United — initially as a part-timer.

Surprisingly, Dave never played schoolboy football. “I was a late starter,” he says. “I started playing regularly at about 17 for a local youth side. Then I was spotted by Ayr after playing junior football for Kilsyth (roughly the same as Welsh League standard) and joined them as a part-timer.

“After six years there, including a Scottish Under-23 international against Wales at Aberdeen when we drew 1-1, I transferred to Leeds in October, 1973.”

“It was a congested club for goalkeepers. David Harvey had just taken over from Gary Sprake who was still at the club. There was also Glan Letheren on his way

up!”

Nevertheless, Dave played 55 games for Leeds including a successful European Cup semi-final against Barcelona — when, of course, Leeds emerged victorious and went on to face Bayern Munich in the final.

He then moved to West Bromwich in November 1978 but, incredibly, never played a first team match after going to the Hawthorns for £75,000 and an immediate past background of a full senior international cap against East Germany in Berlin.

“I saved a penalty in that game but we lost 0-1,” he recalls. “Now it's marvellous to be back in first team football again. And — who knows — maybe I'll get another international chance. But the main thing now is to keep my first team place with the Swans.”

Dave and his wife Anne hope to be moving down soon from Birmingham and his other sporting interest is certainly an appropriate one for a goalkeeper — he is a crack shot at clay pigeon shooting!






