

I THINK that Preston North End has got the best bunch of supporters in the country!

For after our 3-0 drubbing by Queens Park Rangers I wouldn't have been surprised if we had received a bit of heckling in our game at Burnley the following week.

But no, they were chanting and cheering and really got behind the team.

Fans like that are a credit to the club and I would like to say "thanks for supporting us" to them - and "keep up the good work".

To forget about the Queens Park Rangers game was about the best advice, because we just didn't play well at all and it is no good dwelling on games that have gone.

We played much better in our game at Burnley though with Mick Baxter, Danny Cameron,

Paul McGee and Eric Potts coming back into the side to give it a more experienced look.

Willie Naughton and Graham Houston could not have had two more difficult games than against Sunderland and Queens Park Rangers to have been blooded, but they will have gained a lot from the experience.

I was very pleased with our attitude in the Burnley game, especially the way we approached the game. We applied ourselves well, creating chances and really were unlucky only to come away with a point.

That is the sort of attitude that we have got to strive to maintain, because it is only by being consistent that we will ever make any headway in the Second Division.

Our opponents this weekend are Luton Town, who only 12 months ago were in a similar situation to what we are in now.

Division Two Scene

Magpies slip as Blues get into gear

LONDON clubs are currently figuring prominently in the relegation struggle, Charlton's goalless draw with Watford last month leaving them with the unenviable record of failing to score in four successive home matches. Watford too have yet to make themselves safe despite their FA Cup run and up to the time of writing have not won at home since the beginning of December. Their win here is also their only away win in Division Two up to the time of writing and in fact the only occasion on which they have scored as many as three goals in an away match this season was in their fifth round F.A. Cup win at Wolverhampton.

Fulham fans haven't had much to cheer lately either, their 1-1 draw against Bristol Rovers last week leaving them without a win of any kind since beating Shrewsbury on December 8.

Shrewsbury meanwhile are proving to be the most improved side in the division and after looking like an immediate return to Division Three they have been playing more like a promotion outfit recently with successive wins over Chelsea, Charlton and Newcastle, scoring 10 goals in the process.

Wrexham meanwhile seem to be slipping out of the promotion race because of their indifferent away form. Their draw at Notts County last week brought them only their third point in their last 12 away games though during the same period they won eight successive league and cup games.

They recently beat Newcastle United, who are in danger of losing touch with the top three after five away defeats recently and another home point dropped to the steadily-improving Birmingham side, who are now looking distinct possibilities for an

immediate return to Division One.

In fact fellow North Easterners Sunderland could yet pip BILL McGARRY's boys. They did themselves a power of good recently by chalking up their fourth home win in a row, 1-0 against Luton, another promotion outfit.

Another promotion four-pointer recently was the one in which West Ham beat Leicester 3-1, thus chalking up their sixth league and cup win in a row. It could be that the experience of seasoned strikers like STUART PEARSON and DAVID CROSS will prove decisive in the final run-in where-as Leicester for all their promise have a very young side and will depend much on skipper EDDIE KELLY to hold them together as the pressure comes on.

Another team putting their faith in youth, as so often in the past, are Burnley but the shadow of a first-ever spell in Division Three is again hanging over Turf Moor after their recent run of three successive defeats though it is only fair to point out that they had the bad luck to come up against Sunderland and West Ham, two teams in the promotion race.

CLIVE ALLEN'S goal in Q.P.R.'s recent 3-0 win here was his 26th of the season and left him easily the highest scorer in the Football League this season. No player has made a more prolific start to his league career in recent seasons for it was not until last April that he played his first full league game and yet by the end of the season he had chalked up his first hat-trick and in four full games and six substitute appearances he had become the club's third top scorer.

Mike set for PNE return?

FRANTIC behind scene negotiations have been taking place in a bid to tempt former North End forward and club captain Mike Elwiss back to Deepdale.

Manager Nobby Stiles is keen to see the left sided striker back with Preston in a bid to boost their flagging goal and points tally.

But at the time of going to press no new had been received from Crystal Palace manager Terry Venables as to whether he was willing for Elwiss to return to North End or whether the player himself wants to return to Preston.

Mike Elwiss was a prolific scorer for Doncaster Rovers when he was signed by Preston for £86,000 and he continued in the same vein here at Deepdale taking part in our successful campaign for promotion into the Second Division.

He was a favourite with the Deepdale fans and players alike, being appointed team captain and "player of the year" in 1977/78.

Preston transferred him to Crystal Palace for £200,000 where he helped them in their successful bid for Division One status - and scoring a goal against his old colleagues in the process.

Since then he has had problems with a knee injury, which at one stage threatened to end his career, but he has fought his way back to fitness and played several times for Palace reserves.

Stiles is keen to have Elwiss on loan for a period so that he can judge for himself his fitness, but he believes

that he is a very good player who could be of great benefit if he is alright.

One reason Stiles is keen to see him back at Deepdale is that Preston have suffered a lot of injuries among their forwards this season and although the Preston boss will not use it as an excuse it has obviously had an effect.

Mike Elwiss arrived at Deepdale to watch Preston's match against Queens Park Rangers and obviously has a soft spot for the club being engaged to North End director Keith Leeming's daughter Olive, and will not doubt give serious considerations to Preston's request.

But Stiles is not only relying on the arrival of Elwiss back at Deepdale in his bid to strengthen the team but is looking at several other players throughout England as he looks to the future.

No movement has yet been made on the transfer of Sean Haslegrave, Harry Wilson, Eric Potts, Ian Cochrane and Steve Uzelac who have all been listed, although several enquiries have been received.

Bumper crowd expected for International

THE U-15 international match at Deepdale on March 15 (don't miss the early 2.30 kick-off!), between England and N Ireland Schoolboys, is NOT the first schoolboy's international to be played in Preston. Not by 71 years, it isn't!

"We all thought it was" said Mr Dave Simpson, who is Preston School's publicity manager for the big match next month. "Then our chairman, Fr. Spencer, went digging around in the ESFA (English School's FA) archives, and found that Preston Schools were, in fact, among the early pioneers in international schoolboy football - and staged one of the first matches back in 1909."

The first schoolboys' international - in the world! - was played at Walsall in 1907, England v Wales; the second was in Wales, at Aberdare, in 1908; and the third was here in Preston in 1909.

On Easter Monday, April 12th, 1909, a crowd of over 9,000 - mostly Prestonians, mostly young, but with a goodly gathering of adults - packed into the Deepdale ground in the afternoon for what was the third schoolboy international match of all time, and only the second on English soil.

The enthusiasm of the 9,000 was well rewarded. The heavy morning rain gave way to brilliant sunshine, and the old Lancashire Daily Post reported that the England boys played brilliant football in their 3-1 win over Wales.

And none more so than Preston's first schoolboy cap, young W Taylor from St Andrews, Ashton, who captained the side.

Playing at outside-right he laid on all three England goals with his perfect crosses from the line - real Tom Finney stuff, back in 1909!

Question: whatever happened to young Taylor, from St Andrews, Ashton? Perhaps there's a North Ender reading this right now - someone getting on a

bit! - who was as a youngster at that 1909 match, and who can remember something of the drama and excitement of it all?

Nine thousand in 1909 for a schoolboys' match! This was a bumper crowd even for North End in those far-off days. On the Good Friday previous, it was reported that around 10,000 turned up at Deepdale to see North End outplay Bradford City, then also in the First Division - in a 0-0 draw!

The very next day, Easter Saturday, North End were away to Aston Villa, and hammered them 4-2 in a real classic of a match. At the end of that season, Preston finished comfortably 10th in a league of 20 clubs. Only 10th? Yes - but ahead of the likes of ... Man. Utd, Nottm. Forest, Liverpool and Man. City!

Will this bumper gate of 9,000 be 'beaten' on March

15th, when Preston welcome the England and N Ireland boys to Deepdale? There will, of course, be 'pay at the gate' on the day of the match, but ticket applications are coming in from all over the country (it is the only schoolboys' international in the whole of the North West this season), and a large crowd is expected - so it would be best to get your tickets now.

They are on sale from the P.N.E. office (normal hours) and from Mercer's office on the bus station (stand 53). They can also be ordered from any of the local schools, where the P.E. staff are making their bookings with the match secretary, Mr Jack May, 37 Cromwell Road, Penwortham (Tel. 744802).

Prices: 50p (juveniles/OAPs) and 70p (adults) for the paddocks and terrace; £1.00 (West) and £1.50 (pavilion) for stands, all classes.

Steve was soon hitting the headlines with his performances and he went on from winning several youth caps for Wales to be included in their 21's side.

CURRENTLY going well for promotion, Luton Town after three seasons of consolidation look far better equipped to cope with the challenges of Division One than when they last went up in 1974 and did not survive their first season there.

It was in 1897 that Luton made their Football League bow as members of Division Two, but after just three seasons they failed to secure re-election and it was not until 1920 that they appeared again on the Football League scene as founder-members of the new Division Three (South).

There they stayed until 1937 when they embarked on their most successful spell, climbing to Division Two and then in 1955 reaching Division One for the first time. In 1959 they reached the FA Cup final for the one and only time, going down 2-1 to Nottingham Forest and this was really the start of a period of recession in the 60s.

1960 saw them back in Division Two, by 1963 they were in Division Three and in 1965 they became only the second side (Brentford were the first) to have slipped all the way from Division One to Division Four.

It is to their great credit that it took them only nine seasons to climb all the way back to Division One, even though they stayed there for only one season in 1974/5. At this stage they were under considerable financial pressure, but they have maintained their policy of playing good football, win or lose, and their league positions of seventh, sixth, thirteenth and eighteenth reflect the fact that results have not always reflected their ability.

In fact in both of the last two seasons

they have been in the promotion race at one time or other, but have slipped up in the last few weeks and last season they won only two of their last thirteen games.

It is to avoid such an alarming decline that manager DAVID PLEAT (who took over from HARRY HASLAM in January 1978) will be particularly anxious to avoid. Although they went out of both cup competitions to Third Division teams, Luton have lost only one home game in Division Two this season (to Birmingham) and

on their travels they have chalked up six wins, their victims including promotion rivals West Ham and Leicester. We brought a point back from Kenilworth Road in October when their leading scorer DAVID MOSS got their goal from a penalty.

Dave is likely to link up with BOB HATTON, in his second season with his seventh league club. South African BRIAN STEIN adds an extra dimension to the attack and coming through from midfield RICKY HILL and former Burnley man ALAN

WEST are amongst the most exciting players in Division Two when on song.

Eire international TONY GREALISH, signed from Orient this season, completes the engine room department while in defence MIKE SAXBY from Mansfield has this season linked up with KIRK STEPHENS and PAUL PRICE, two home grown products and MAL DONAGHY who came from the Irish club Larne last season. In goal JAKE FINDLAY has made the position his own since moving from Aston Villa 15 months ago.

Buy Bob heads for 200 goal target

10 Second Division games in his first season in Wolves first team Bob was rather surprisingly allowed to leave at the end of the season for Bolton and neither there nor at Northampton, his next club, did he quite fulfil his early promise.

His next move was to Carlisle in 1969 and it was there that he can really be said to have 'arrived', cracking 24 home league and cup goals in

1970/1, including four in one game against Portsmouth. By October 1971 he was on the move again, this time to Birmingham and the fee of £80,000 proved to be money well spent.

He got 17 goals in his first season as the Midlanders went up from Division Two and then two seasons later in Division One he raised his tally to 20. He got 16 more in 1974/5 and then when it seemed that his prolific scor-

ing habits were on the wane he linked up with Blackpool in time for the 1976/7 season.

It was in the summer of 1978 that he moved to Luton for the bargain price of £50,000 and in his first season netted 13 goals, a tally he has already equalled in the present campaign, his most spectacular game being the one against Bristol Rovers when he netted a hat-trick.

Football memories

A LIVELY and interesting book detailing the history and achievements of the Preston and District Amateur Football League has been produced by league officials to celebrate their 75th anniversary.

The architect of the book is executive member Peter Davis of Garstang Road, Fulwood, Preston who toiled for many hours to collate the information included in the book and to get it into print.

He was helped in his efforts by Vice President Fred Southern of Manor Lane, Penwortham who spent many hours researching the contents of the book at the Lancashire Football Association's headquarters in Blackburn and in Preston's reference library.

"This is a unique publication with a limited number of issues and each booklet is officially numbered and recorded in the history

books of the league," said Peter Davies in his conclusion to the book.

The book tells us that although records show organised football has been played in Preston since 1871 the Preston and District League were not admitted as members of the Lancashire Football Association until 1904 - 75 years ago.

Also included in the book are photographs of some of the early teams and snippets of information about what went on behind the scenes to give colour to the facts and figures included.

The book records the fact that during the years towards the end of the war one of the outstanding teams was Greenbank who fielded such players as

Jimmy Porter and Kevin Baron who both played for Liverpool for many seasons, and in matches played against Greenbank

at Haslam Park there were always several hundred spectators.

In more recent times the book records the fact that during the 1972 Preston Guild of all the functions being held in the town the Rt Hon Mr Harold Wilson, who was then leader of the opposition, specifically requested to attend a local amateur football match.

A special trophy had been presented to the league by the Borough Council for a competition to mark the Guild and Sir Harold attended the final between Springfields and Heskin at Shawes Arms with the former winning 1-0.

"I recall his arrival at the Farm Yard in a chauffeur driven limousine accompanied by police motor cyclist outriders," recalls Mr Southern. "It was a dreadful night and poured down continuously and at half time Mr Wilson in-

sisted on having a "mug" of tea with the Frenchwood lads.

"After the game, at a private reception, a presentation was made to Mr Wilson and he was invited to become an Hon Vice President of the League which he kindly accepted."

The book is a must for all local soccer fans who are interested in the development of the game in the Preston area and all those involved in its production must be congratulated for a marvellous final product.






