Nobby's notes

CHANGES DON'T ALWAYS HELP FORM

ALTHOUGH the result of the game against Newcastle isn't known at the time of going to press, we will have to have played a lot better than in the match at Orient, where we gave our worst performance of the season to lose 4-0.

The score could even have been higher; John Chiedozie gave a brilliant display for Orient on the wing, and we were lucky to get away with the scoreline as it was. I've got to criticise myself for the performance because it's up to me, as the manager, to get things right. I've made changes in the team, which don't always help form, but

you can't have a settled side when games aren't going well.

I left Simon Westwell out against Orient because although he's done tremendously well in the three matches he's played in, I didn't think it would help him to continue in the team while we're going through a bad patch. Graham Bell was also rested but he shouldn't be out of the team for long; he's been working hard but things haven't been going right for him, so a short rest would probably do some good.

That's one of the reasons why our crowd figures are only around the 6,000 mark.

As I've said before, we've got to work harder at our

game, but that doesn't mean just running. It's no good being long-distance runners if we're not doing anything with the ball when we've got it. Orient probably did less actual running than us last week but they played a whole lot better.

Confidence counts for a lot; if we'd stuck away chances in our earlier games it would have made the situation a lot easier, but I don't want to make excuses. We're looking up the table at teams who we know we're as good as.

Today's game against Luton should prove an entertaining one. They have always been a fluent attractive side and they score a lot of goals. Their manager David Pleat has done a very good job for them and they only just missed out on promotion last year so they should provide good opposition.







GEOFF ALLMAN PUTS THE SPOTLIGHT ON **Luton Town**

THOUGH they have not quite maintained the promise of their opening game when they shocked F.A. Cup winners West Ham by beating them 2-1 at Upton Park, Luton Town are still a very useful side and they could well end up amongst the top half dozen teams in Division Two for the second successive season.

Founded in 1885, Luton had a 3-season spell in the old Division Two between 1897 and 1900, but they did not come back to the Football League to stay until 1920 when they were founder-members of Division Three (South).

SUCCESS There they stayed until 1937 when they embarked on the most successful period in their history, climbing to Division Two in that year and then reaching Division One for the first time in 1955. 1959 saw them

reaching the F.A. Cup final in which they went down 2-1 to Nottingham Forest.

DECLINE

Then came decline. They fell back to Division Two in 1960, to Division Three in 1963 and then in 1965 they became only the second side (Brentford were the first) to have slipped from Division One all the way to Division Four.

ATTRACTIVE

To their credit they continued to battle away and by 1974 they were back in Division One though they stayed there for only one season.

At this stage they had severe financial problems, which they bravely weathered and in the last five fluctuating seasons they can take pride in the fact that they have often been amongst the most attractive Second Division outfits, as they have finished successively seventh, sixth, thirteenth, eighteenth and

sixth.

They have in recent seasons tended to fall away after the turn of the year and it was a spell of seven games in a row without a win in February and March last season that ultimately cost them promotion as they were just four points short at the end.

THIS SEASON

Apart from their opening-day win at West Ham, Luton have picked up a point at Grimsby this season and have also beaten Watford and Orient at Kenilworth Road.

They have, however, lost at home to Derby, crashed 3-0 at Blackburn and have gone out of the League Cup to Manchester City after knocking out Reading.

10 YEARS AGO

WE suffered a setback in our efforts to stay amongst the Third Division front-runners when going down 1-0 at Halifax on October 17, 1970. Former Aston Villa man BILL ATKINS got the goal in the first half for a team just below us in the table, the lineups being:

HALIFAX: Smith, Burgin, Buxton, Robertson, Pickering, Wallace, Chadwick, Atkins, Brierley, Lennard, McCarthy.

PRESTON: Kelly, Ross, McMahon, Spark, Hawkins, Spavin, Wilson, Irvine, Ingram, Heppolette (Lee), Hughes. Attendance 5,922

Torquay were now challenging Fulham at the top of our Division having beaten Brighton by dint of a FREDDIE GOODWIN own goal on the previous evening.

Leeds dropped a home point to Manchester United at the top of Division One, both JACKIE CHARLTON and BOBBY CHARLTON finding the net. In Division Two Hull stayed ahead of Leicester by dint of a 2-0 win over Swindon and TED McDougall helped Bournemouth stay top of Division Four by getting the goal that earned a point against Aldershot.







His 20 goals in 1977/8 included another hat-trick against Oxford and then in May 1978 came his 6-figure move to Luton. This landed him back in Division Two and in an explosive debut he netted twice in the 6-1 win over Oldham on the opening day of the season. Late in that first season he scored his first goal against us to earn the 'Hatters' a 2-2 draw here and he followed up by converting a penalty against us at Kenilworth Road last October.

In his most successful season to date he totalled 24 goals last season and at one stage seemed likely to be shooting his side to promotion. Nowadays he usually plays a wide role up front and his tally of well over a hundred league and cup goals in just over 300 games makes him a man to keep an eye on today.







CLOUGHIE GETS SHIRTY



IN the Daily Mail on Friday 3rd October, Notts Forest Manager Brian Clough was quoted :-

"I'm fed up to the eyeballs with Television. They upset me because I don't want them telling me what I can and can't wear on my shirts. I'm not saying which game I'm taking the decision for, but one day, whether the cameras are coming or not, we'll be wearing the name of our sponsor. And if they don't want to transmit, they can get their vans off our car park".

Cloughie has, as usual, put his finger on one of the games most controversial disputes - Shirt Sponsorship.

Preston North End, of course, were the third Football League Club in the country to negotiate a Shirt Sponsorship deal last year when Pontins agreed a two year package.

Liverpool and Everton being first and second.

Since then Forest, Derby, Brighton, Blackpool and others have followed the trend.

It seems ludicrous to me that both Television Companies still refuse to allow Clubs to appear before the cameras with their Sponsors name on their shirts.

To Clubs like Liverpool and Forest who are on one channel or the other almost every week, it means their Sponsors name won't appear too often!

Also it's obvious that a Club could certainly demand higher Sponsorship fees if they could display their Sponsors names on their shirts

I applaud Brian Clough's statement and if other Clubs follow his lead the matter will, I'm sure, be resolved pretty quickly to the benefit of Football League Clubs.

CONTINUING the theme of the third team in football i.e. the referee and his linesmen, let us look at some aspects of running the line. Remembering that the linesmen operate to instructions.

The most important point I have to make is that the linesman does not make decisions. He only indicates to the referee. The referee makes all decisions.

100% concentration is the hallmark of a good linesman. He can't run around and approach problem areas on the field, as the referee does. He must stay on the line and help to keep control from there. When I say there he is in fact more restricted because if the play is in the other half of the field a position on the half-way line is taken up. If play is approaching his half, a position in line with the second rearmost defender is taken up. The reason being to detect attacking team

players interfering with play or opponents, when in offside positions.

This is where concentration comes in. He must keep in line with this second-most rear defender and yet watch for the ball going out of play for a throw-in, corner-kick and goal-kick. He must also look out for unfair play in his vicinity. Notice the words his vicinity, not the referee's. The point is he has got to have what I call 90° vision, i.e. to look across the field panning round to looking down his own touch line. All this at the same time. I can assure you that if he is running down the line it's an almost impossible

task to keep everything in view. The best place to see everything is sitting in the stand, up there you have panoramic view of most of the field of play and also you are sat still. The poor old linesman is moving and has this limited vision because of the nature of his job.

Get up with play linesman, come on linesman you saw that, get your flag up linesman etc are the comments made by you spectators, but really you don't know what is going on and besides you are biased whether you like it or not.

Linesmen take up positions because they are told to and they must not wander or be pulled out of position. If the referee is in the vicinity of play the linesman must not interfere unless something happens on the blindside of the referee.

Basically the linesman operates and indicates for incidents that happen in his quarter of the field and then only if the referee has not seen the incident. More often than not they have, no matter where incidents happen on the field of play. The real art in running the line is to run it for the referee, indicate when he would want you to. Try and be on the same wavelength as him and give him all the co-operation without interference as you can.

To sum up the linesmen's duties are:

a) Look out for players in offside positions who are interfering with play or an opponent, or who are seeking to gain an advantage by being in an offside position.

b) To watch for the ball travelling out of play, who played it last, and how it is to be returned i.e. throw-in, goal-kick or corner-kick.

c) Assist the referee by indicating incidents of unfair play or misconduct in his vicinity on the field of play.



Jack, an avid P.N.E. supporter, has been driving the team around the country for the last seven years since his firm Mercer's have had the contract.


Although he is a lifelong follower of the club, driving on Saturdays meant that he was not always able to go to home matches. When the contract came up, then, Jack jumped at the chance.

Burden, Williams, Iggleton, Dudley, Moss, Hughes. Attendance 32,000




