



It is a sad reflection on our national game that Cambridge United, whom we travel to meet a week today at the Abbey Stadium, are reluctant to send us any tickets for seats in the main stand.

They have suffered from terrible problems caused by visiting supporters — not Luton Town's, we hasten to add — and have advised our fans to apply direct to their ticket office.

Vandalism caused to their stand seating has left Cambridge with little alternative but to take this action with visiting supporters and it seems we are victims of the actions of so-called 'fans' from other clubs.

- Stand tickets for our game against Swansea City at Kenilworth Road on Tuesday evening (7.45) are now on sale at the reduced price of £3.

- Postal applications for the majority of our seat tickets for our home game against West Ham United on November 15 have already been received and, any of our fans still requiring tickets, are advised to apply immediately, by post, although there is no guarantee we will be able to meet the full demand.

At the time of going to press, there are only a few Bobbers Stand and Wing Tickets left for sale. Postal applications on a first come, first served basis, will be accepted. Prices are £4 and all applications should be accompanied by the correct remittance and an SAE. Telephone applications will NOT be accepted.

**TODAY'S PRE-MATCH ENTERTAINMENT**

Our pre-match entertainment this afternoon involves members of the Abbey Middle School Gymnastic Display Group.

Although a Middle School Display Group, the title is not one hundred per cent accurate as five of the girls taking part actually left the school in

July this year and are now at local comprehensives. However, as they had been in the group for three years it was decided to invite them back for what is certainly the largest display the group has put on. So, in fact, the ages of the fourteen girls range from eight to 13.

At school, the girls learn and practice their gymnastics during their lunch hour and sometimes after school. Although a number of the girls do belong to the local Bletchley Girls Gymnastics Club where, as well as display work, they enter competitions. Among their numbers today is the Buckinghamshire under 10 champion and runner-up.

At school, the emphasis is more on display work and enjoying gymnastics, and the girls also have an opportunity to take their B.A.G.A. awards, starting with Award 4 and progress to Award 1.

The display today, practice for which started only this term, is divided into two parts. The first starts with a short warm-up practice and is followed by a demonstration of a number of gymnastic moves. These moves gradually increase in their difficulty and some are very newly mastered by some of the girls.

The second part of our display shows the use of these moves in a gymnastic interpretation of Art Garfunkel's 'Bright Eyes'.

Finally, we hope you enjoy watching the display as much as the girls, Julie Carder, Lisa Fiddes, Samantha Fiddes, Samantha Flegg, Deana Flegg, Hayley Fisher, Charlotte Gammond, Peta Holt, Sonia Kirkum, Paula Merrifield, Denise Parker, Melanie Reid and Shirley Worsfold have enjoyed producing it.

When I took over as manager, we had a handful of away support. Now we have an enthusiastic band we are proud of. Their enthusiasm, loyalty and vocal backing in recent away games is recognised and is nothing short of magnificent. While others in the club may comment on our support, only I am able to judge the affect this has on our players. If we are to be successful, I and the staff have to overcome everyday football difficulties, but we need this backing. We crave success — it is what the game is all about. We have some excellent players desperate to get to the top. We want success for you, the fans. So get behind us — for 90 minutes — and our chances of reaching our goal together will be that much brighter.

A word about the younger element at the club. They are showing some positive signs of making significant contributions to the future. We now have not only a young reserve team but quality players who have already made first team debuts such as Judge, Goodyear, Madden, Bunn and Heath. All these players who have come through the youth ranks with good coaching guidance and this is where the future of the club must be. Our first season in the South East Counties League is proving to be a better basis than the Chiltern Youth League or the Wallspan. Our scouts are out regularly looking for outstanding young talent but I am sure there may be people on the terraces who have seen someone whom they believe might make it. Don't be embarrassed — write to me and we can follow any leads.

Meanwhile enjoy today's game. I sincerely hope it will be of a quality to make sure you return on Tuesday for our attractive game with Swansea.





# STEVE

Steve Archibald, Tottenham's expensive signing from Aberdeen, has already won his spurs with White Hart Lane fans.

Cries of "Come on Steve" now echo twice as loud around North London as they once did. And it's no throw-back to the days when Steve Donoghue was booting home Derby winners.

The two Steves of Tottenham are Archibald and Spurs' evergreen skipper, Steve Perryman, everyone's model professional.

But while Perryman's only real regret in a marvellous Spurs career must be that an England cap is still missing from his collection of honours, Archibald is still defiantly proud of being Scots!

The Scotland World Cup striker's switch from Northerly Aberdeen to the bustling South of England has been accomplished smoothly.

But "his kin folk" up there in "Bonnie Scotia" should not feel Archibald has been permanently lost

to them.

### SCOTTISH FOOTBALL

Within weeks of arriving in England, he was defending Scottish football and footballers in a manner that would have done Wallace and Bruce proud.

"People in England seem to think the Scottish League is a Mickey Mouse affair. It's not!

"There are a lot of good players up there," he says stoutly.

"I think English fans would be surprised by the general standard in Scotland."

One of the players Archibald is obviously referring to is his former Aberdeen team-mate Gordon Strachan, the red-headed midfield dynamo who is constantly compared to Alan Ball.

Alan, one of England's true post-war Soccer greats, is ironically a staunch admirer of Strachan.

Ball, now doing such a marvellous managerial job at Blackpool—the club who launched him as a world-

renowned football name—played against Strachan a few years ago, when Ball was with Arsenal and Strachan at Dundee.

### STAR

Strachan was then a mere 17-year old. Yet he was one of the stars in a surprise Dundee victory over the mighty Gunners before a wildly-enthusiastic Dens Park crowd.

It is reported that after that match Ball was enthusing over young Strachan well into the Saturday night.

Ball, of course, bounced on to Southampton and then to Blackpool. Strachan moved from Dundee to Aberdeen, and has become a permanent fixture in the Scottish side.

But it seems only a matter of time until he, like Steve Archibald, will take the road South.

Other recent arrivals, like Ray Stewart of West Ham and Gordon Smith of Brighton, emphasise Archibald's view. There are still plenty of good players in Scotland.

Shrewsbury arrive at Kenilworth Road this afternoon as a club with First Division ambitions. And that is currently manager Graham Turner's biggest priority.

Turner hopes to steer the market town team towards a new era after waiting 28 years for Second Division status following their election to the Football League in 1950.

The Third Division Championship arrived at Gay Meadow in 1978-79 and, although the following season proved to be a period of settling in, Turner has gradually assembled a nucleus of players who seem capable of playing in the higher sphere.

Turner is the 10th manager of the club since the war following in the footsteps of Sam Crooks, Harry Potts, Arthur Rowley, Harry Gregg, Alan Durban and Richie Barker.

In fact, Turner started with Shrewsbury as a player following a £30,000 transfer from Chester in 1973 and, earlier this season, was responsible for negotiating an attractive deal which took his winger, Paul McGuire to Stoke City in exchange for a £250,000 cheque.

Turner wasn't keen to part with one of his biggest assets, but will undoubtedly use the fee to strengthen his squad for that gigantic push to the First Division.

After finishing in 13th place last season, Turner signed three players during the close season. Paul Petts, only 19, arrived from Bristol Rovers

after making nine appearances in their first team while still on apprentice professional forms.

As far as reserve cover for the keeper's position is concerned, Turner also looked towards Rovers and took Glyn Jones from them.

The third signing, Ross MacLaren, arrived during the summer from Glasgow Rangers on a free transfer after failing to make their first team in his two-year stay there.

But it wasn't only players Turner was interested in. Graham Hawkins linked with Shrewsbury as coach after a spell with Stoke City where he was responsible for coaching the youth team.

Not many of our supporters will forget the tremendous display at Kenilworth Road last season of keeper Bob Wardle. He thwarted the Town on several frustrating occasions. He also played in Bristol — for City — where he started his career and played in the FA Youth Cup final. He spent two years at Ashton Gate and, after serving his apprenticeship, joined Shrewsbury six years ago.

Hard working midfielder player David Tong won the club's Player of the Year award last season after a £25,000 transfer from Blackpool took him to Gay Meadow where he was an ever-present last term. John Keay was another Shrewsbury player who didn't miss a game last season after being released by Glasgow Celtic three years ago.

Full-back Jake King has been a

regular member of the team for the last seven seasons and looks equally happy in midfield. His partner, Carleton Leonard is also a regular in Turner's team and is a product of the club's youth policy.

Centre-half Colin Griffin started his football with Derby County and joined Shrewsbury in 1976 for a five-figure fee. He can also adapt to the left-back position. Jimmy Lindsay had seen service with four clubs before arriving at Shrewsbury. Formerly with West Ham United, Colchester, Hereford, and Watford, he won international caps for Scotland at youth level.

Front-runner John Dungworth was the subject of protracted transfer negotiations between Turner and Aldershot before he was finally signed in 1979 and scored seven times last season.

Stephen Biggins cost Shrewsbury a small fee when they signed him from Hedgesford Town. He hit the headlines with seven goals in his first nine games.


