

"However, they do try to be helpful and it is usually 30 minutes after the start of the game when they are able to enter the ground to watch the match themselves.

"Please try and remember that they provide their labour on a voluntary basis. We appreciate you are entitled to complain but, if you write to me with your complaint, I will do my utmost to deal with your enquiries and you will always receive the courtesy of a reply. Help us to help you."

One fan took the trouble to write to Bill and thank him for his letter after complaining about admission facilities for one recent match. He wrote: "Dear Mr. Butler, thank you for your letter. I am pleased to say that, against Notts County, I was able to gain admission to the ground without difficulty.

"I am pleased I support a club which obviously takes the grievances of its supporters seriously. I would like to thank you personally."

So now you know. Show a little patience and we'll do our best to help you.

DAVID'S DIARY

Last season we probably gave our best performance in the home game against Swansea when we whacked them 5-0. In the return game in Wales we suffered our worst defeat when we lost. We shall be determined tonight to provide not only good football but the right result. The game as we know it is suffering a traumatic time with dwindling gates affecting all clubs' finances. It is at times like this that clubs must be handled correctly from the top. All areas of over-trading must be looked at and trimmed if possible. Most important, clubs must move mountains to resist offers for their best players. Once the quality players go, it can take years trying to raise the team standards. Clubs have to realise that the team is the business. Commercial returns and other aspects can only function successfully if the team stands up. It is interesting to see our visitors with a Yugoslav full back. I know the disadvantages and advantages of a quality player from abroad. Patience is required by both player and the club if the move is to be successful. They have to adjust, move home, learn the language and, above all, understand their role and responsibility to the team. It is no use one player playing his way or 'free' while the others are conforming to the team discipline and pattern. Raddi Antic has mingled very well since his move from Spain but has been recently disappointed when he was left out of the side. Like any other player, he has to earn his place. Last week, Paul Price, Mal Donaghy and Tony Grealish played in World Cup games. We are the only club in the Second Division with three current internationals and it is a magnificent achievement — the first time in 35 years this has happened at Luton Town. However, as I continually point out, we must improve our results, and remember we are all only as good as our last performance or else individuals will lose international places. Also potential internationals will fail to get fair recognition. It is noticeable that Ron Greenwood is not looking at the Second Division and Jock Stein just loves Scottish League goalkeepers. It certainly is an interesting game, and gives you plenty to talk about. Let's hope tonight's game does just that. Support the lads.



THE ALLENS

Paul Allen, the West Ham mid-field man with the looks of a choir-boy and ambitions that dwarf any church steeple, has already made history. He's the youngest player ever to win an F.A. Cup medal at Wembley.

But the young man who should set an all-time record for winning England Youth Caps—beating that other legendary Hammer, Bobby Moore, in the process—is far from satisfied with his Soccer achievements so far.

"Every footballer worth his salt in this country, wants to play in the First Division," says the cherubic Allen.

"I'm no exception. And that has nothing to do with the fact that my cousin Clive is already there.

"I'm not jealous of Clive. I'm glad for him," Paul told me earnestly. "Now that's where I want to be. And everyone at West Ham feels the same way.

"Winning the Cup against Arsenal at Wembley was smashing. But promotion would have been better still.

"Everyone at West Ham was choked when we missed out on promotion last season. That's got to be our target this term."

INJURIES

Young Paul has had problems this season with injuries. Even so, the Hammers have put themselves in a challenging position in what promises to be one of the most exciting promotion battles for years.

But the intriguing aspects of the Allen cousins is that they could well pass each other on the way.

For while Hammers have every chance of promotion, Clive's history-making transfer from Arsenal to Crystal Palace—his second million-pound move of the summer—could easily end with Palace's relegation.

The Eagles of Selhurst Park—tipped freely as the Team of the 80's made a start to this term that can be described in a word: **DISASTROUS**.

It would be nice to think that the season will end for the cousins Allen under the same title: **The Great Escape**.

West Ham rightly believe they are too good for the Second Division. Palace, equally rightly, feel they are perfectly good enough for the First Division.

HISTORY MAKERS

So these friendly cousins, still in their teens but both history makers in their own right, have plenty to play for in the coming months.

The pair are so different in looks. In styles of play. In their off-field behavior.

Yet they share a healthy respect for each other's undisputed Soccer talents. And they have a habit, each Saturday, of enquiring earnestly how the other's side has got on.

Clive, less than a year older than Paul, reached the First Division before his cousin. It seems only a matter of time till Paul gets there, too.

And wouldn't it be something to savour if the League Computer, when working out the fixtures for the opening Saturday of season 1981-2, came up with Crystal Palace v. West Ham.

IN THE FIRST DIVISION, OF COURSE!

Surely the football family led by Clive's dad Les—the former Chelsea, Spurs and QPR favourite - would half-fill the ground on their own.

With the amazing football family Allen, that match is no impossibility.

SWANSEA CITY

The premier club in Wales — that is the claim of Swansea City after finishing higher in the Second Division table last season than Wrexham and Cardiff — but there was a bitter disappointment for John Toshack's team who failed to qualify for European soccer via the Cup Winners' Cup when they were unable to book a place in the Welsh Cup Final.

But that is all forgotten this evening as Toshack brings his Swansea team to Luton looking for additional points to further their push toward the First Division.

Toshack has spent heavily in his attempts to strengthen the team and has signed cheques valued at almost £900,000. He collected a club record of £400,000 when he sold Alan Curtis to Leeds United, but his most recent investment brought Yugoslavian international Dzemaj Hadziabdic to Vetch Field for £160,000.

This was after Toshack spent £50,000 for keeper Glan Letheran, a Welsh Under-21 international. Letheran was with Leeds earlier in his career but, since arriving at Swansea, has lost his first team place to David Stewart, a keeper with vast experience. He signed for Leeds in 1973 when he moved from Ayr for a modest £30,000 and, in his stay with the First Division club, won a European Cup runners-up medal and was also capped by Scotland.

After playing for his country, in 1978, he moved on to West Brom for

£70,000 before moving to Wales last February when Toshack paid £60,000 for his transfer.

Toshack's side is liberally sprinkled with Welsh internationals, but two young defenders, Chris Marustik and Nigel Stevenson, cost Swansea nothing and have since gone on to play in the first team after serving their apprenticeship.

Leighton Phillips enjoyed the distinction of winning his 50th international cap when he played for Wales in the World Cup victory over Iceland this summer. This former Cardiff player cost Aston Villa £100,000 in 1974 before helping them into the First Division. He won a League Cup winners medal before he joined Swansea for £70,000 two years ago.

The Independent Tribunal were called in to settle the fee for Dave Rushbury after he arrived from Sheffield Wednesday. Formerly with West Brom, he made only 28 League appearances with them before electing to sign for Wednesday after a two-month loan period. He cost Swansea £60,000.

Toshack paid £70,000 for Neil Robinson last October when he persuaded Everton to part with him. Another £70,000 was spent on David Giles, who served his apprenticeship with Cardiff City before he moved to North Wales with Wrexham for £30,000 two years ago. Twelve months later, he moved back to the south to join his third Welsh club where he has won four full caps.

Mention the name Charles in Wales and it immediately reminds you of a famous soccer family. Jeremy is the son of Mel, and a nephew of John and has been at Swansea, his only club, since 1976.

Leighton James' total transfer fees amount to about £800,000. He played in every match when Burnley won the Second Division championship back in 1973 but, two years later, joined Derby for £300,000. A further move to QPR and another spell with Burnley gave him more experience before joining Swansea last May.

John Mahoney started his career with Crewe. But Stoke City paid £20,000 for his transfer and he played in 292 matches for them before another move, this time to Middlesbrough, for £90,000. He cost Toshack £100,000 last year.

Tommy Craig has the distinction of being Swansea's record buy when he arrived from Aston Villa for £175,000 after spells with Newcastle, Sheffield United and Aberdeen.




