SPONSOR SPOT

Tonight's 'Sponsor Spot' falls on one of Wrexham's largest and busiest printing firms — Jones and Williams (Printers) Ltd., of Rhosddu, Wrexham the firm who in fact printed this 'Match Magazine'.

The firm was founded in 1926 when printers Messrs. W. O. Jones and Emlyn Williams left Principality Press, the company they worked for in Caxton Place, formed their own firm and set up shop down the road in Regent Street.

Mr. Williams took over the running of the firm when Mr. Jones died. It became a Limited Company in 1961 and when Mr. Williams died in 1962 his son Merwyn took over as managing director.

Today, he still heads the firm that prints anything from business cards to specialist magazine work.

The firm has a small but highly-skilled team of crafts persons. **Jose Williams** runs the reception area with **Mr. Williams**. **Mr. Fred Lovett**, the Monotype operator is the man who puts words into metal. Compositor **Ron Battison** puts the metal into page form and ready for the machine managers, **Don Evans** and **Gerald Griffiths** to print.

On the first floor **Eileen Evans**, **Margaret Williams**, **Linda Bate**, **Margaret Jones** and **Dilys Jones** make up the finishing department. Completing the workforce is **Berwyn Roberts**, he runs the lithography department which reproduces photographs and art work into negative form for printing.

Jones and Williams have been associated with Wrexham F.C. since 1947. Today they print all the club's tickets, stationery and also carry out the printing of the international tickets and programmes for the F.A. of Wales.

"Most of the staff follow the fortunes of Wrexham and we are pleased to be involved in sponsorship with the club whether it is in advertising form, kit or match ball donations," said Mr. Merwyn Williams.



YOUNGSTERS STORM TO YOUTH CUP FINAL VICTORY

A second half hat-trick by lanky striker Alan Ricketts took Wrexham's talented side to a convincing Welsh Youth Cup Final victory at Llanidloes on Saturday.

Afan had been the shock side in the competition having eliminated both Newport County and holders Cardiff City on their way to the final. But they had little chance against a strong and powerful Wrexham side who were without their injured star midfield player Simon Hunt.

Sixteen-year-old Rob Hughes who took his place also had a memorable game — he laid on one goal, scored the sixth and had another disallowed.

Kevin Pritchard put Wrexham ahead in the 15th minute coming around the back to hit home a Gavin Foulkes corner. Another set-piece five minutes later saw Steve Jones put away a Chris Taylor corner to make it 2-0. Wrexham were in complete control and hit the Afan woodwork four times before half-time.

By mid-way through the second half Ricketts had completed his hat-trick in style and the scoreline was more in keeping with the play. Hughes made it 6-0 before the South Wales side scored a consolation goal right near the end.

Chief Coach Ken Roberts said "Our lads were in the right frame of mind. They were obviously too good for the opposition but it was still a commendable result."

Skipper Neil Salathiel was presented with the trophy and both sides attended a reception laid on by Mid-Wales side Llanidloes F.C.

RACECOURSE ROUND UP

Pride and Passion — that's the magic formula of Wales' success says the national side boss, Mike England.

Bubbling after his side's great 1-0 victory in Turkey that now puts Wales on course for the World Cup Finals in Spain in 1982. Mike said: "Don't think we have not got skill but the difference between say England and Wales' players is that when a Welshman pulls on the red of his country it means something to him. It's the highest honour any sportsman can achieve and the Welsh seem to respond that much more than other nationals."

Tonight Wrexham fans will get the chance of seeing one of last week's stars in Turkey, Paul Price the 24-year-old Luton skipper. "This lad is vastly underrated. He was an unsung hero for us against Turkey. He did a marvellous job and very soon people are going to take a lot of notice of this lad."

Mike was full of praise too for Peter Nicholas, Ian Walsh and young Kevin Ratcliffe. "I'm really excited about Wales' future because we have so many youngsters coming through and we have such great experienced professionals such as Brian Flynn (always the first name on my team-sheet), Dai Davies (playing the best stuff of his career and made two saves against Turkey that kept us in the game) along with players like Joey Jones who never gave his winger a kick and Leighton Phillips — all lads who come in and do a great job. Make no mistake the side that beats us will have to play out of their skins because we play a system that makes it very difficult for the opposition."

● Mike is looking to the North Wales fans to fill the Racecourse on May 30th when Russia are the visitors — a game that if Wales win they can start making hotel reservations in Spain, a year in advance!

● DAI DAVIES' appearance for Wales in Turkey took him to 41 caps, equalling the previous best goalkeeping tally held by Arsenal's JACK KELSEY.

● Wrexham fan ALAN SUTTON found his trip to Bristol City well worth the energy. Alan, a 20-year-old student at Cambridge, set off for the Ashton Gate Stadium on his... BICYCLE. He got within 20 miles of Bristol and realised he would not get to the ground on time — so he dumped his bike and made the rest of the journey on a service bus, arriving 15 minutes after kick-off — but in plenty of time for Wrexham's goals!

● Newcastle's BOBBY SHINTON, recovering from a leg operation was at the Wrexham — Rangers game on Saturday. He's been staying a couple of days with his former Wrexham clubmate LES CARTWRIGHT.

● MICK VINTER goes back to face his old club Notts County on Sunday — but has no regrets about moving from a club that now look set for promotion to the First Division. "I left because I thought they weren't going anywhere but I think they'll go up now. County had a bad spell around Christmas going three months without a win, but they didn't slip down the table, they just lost the points lead they had. Eddie Kelly I think has made the difference along with a couple of more fresh faces such as the other signing from Leicester City, Mark Goodwin."

● If you are travelling to Notts County by car on Sunday (kick-off 3 p.m.) the best route is via Holt Road, to Nantwich, Newcastle-under-Lyme, Uttoxeter, to Derby then take the road signposted Nottingham.

● Queens Park Rangers' manager Terry Venables was disappointed in dropping a point at the Racecourse on Saturday. "We had to win this game and frankly I thought we did enough to have done so. We were third from bottom of the table at one stage this season but put together a run that has given us an outside chance of promotion but we just could not afford to lose games but you have a side like Chelsea who have had an horrific run yet they are still in with a chance."

Luton Town just missed out on promotion last season—and when this season kicked-off they were many fans bet to do it this time. But The Hatters had a poor start to the season—no doubt due to illness to their brilliant striker David Moss.

Luton are the only side to have done the double over West Ham. They won 2-1 at Upton Park on the opening day of the season and beat West Ham 3-2 at Kenilworth Road.

Despite their poor start to the season Luton have clawed their way back up the table and with the fight at the top being so close they have only to string a couple of right results together and they could be one of the sides to accompany West Ham into the top flight.

Although Moss is the player who springs to mind when Luton's name is mentioned they are by no means a one-man outfit. Brian Stein's goal-scoring has been one of the reasons for his side's successes and defender Kirk Stephens was in the Second Division side picked by the P.F.A. Add to that the side's internationals—Mal Donaghy (Northern Ireland), Tony Grealish (Ireland) and Paul Price (Wales) the club skipper, it is little wonder that manager David Pleat must believe that if his side does get to the First Division this season—they'll stay there.

REMEMBER LAST SEASON? WREXHAM 3 LUTON 1

SATURDAY, DECEMBER 15th, 1979 Attendance 9,145

Frank Carrodus made his debut in what was one of Wrexham's best league performances of the season. It took Wrexham only sixteen minutes to take the lead, through Dixie McNeil, but they could add no more in an exciting first half. Early in the second half Steve Fox scored with a brilliant 'chip' and Ian Edwards added a third. Bob Hatton pulled one back for Luton eight minutes from time.

Goalkeeper: **JAKE FINDLAY:** Luton's highest ever fee for a keeper was the price Luton paid Villa when he left Villa Park in November, 1978 for £100,000. Scottish born, Jake had been in the Villa reserves for almost nine years. Now recognised as one of the best keepers in Division Two.

Defenders: **KIRK STEPHENS:** joined Luton in the summer of 1978 from Nuneaton where Mr. Pleat was once a manager. Quick in the tackle and ever willing to raid the flanks, Kirk is highly respected as a classy full-back.

MAL DONAGHY: Luton paid Larne (N. Ireland) £20,000 for this elegant, versatile defender. Still only 20, he has quickly settled in the Second Division and has made such good progress at Luton that he is now a Northern Ireland international.

MICK SAXBY: Luton's record fee of £200,000 persuaded Mansfield to part with their centre-half in 1979 and he has repaid that transfer fee since his move with a consistently high level of performances. Only 23, he looks well set for a long career as a defensive kingpin.

PAUL PRICE: club captain and Luton's longest-serving player. Luton moved swiftly to sign him as an apprentice but since then his career has been full of ups and downs. He has broken his leg twice but he has been a regular for the past five years and is a current Welsh international.

Midfield: **TONY GREALISH:** Luton bought Tony from Orient during the summer of 1979 for a fee of £150,000. He is an Ireland international and is rated as one of the best midfield players in this Division.

ALAN WEST: one of Luton's most experienced players, has now made over 250 league appearances for The Hatters. Began his career with Burnley to whom Luton paid £100,000 in 1973. Has been unlucky with injuries.

RICKY HILL: Luton beat West Ham in the race to sign Ricky when as a schoolboy in north London, scouts flocked to watch him. Made his league debut in 1976 when only 17. He scored on his debut and has regularly been on target ever since.

RADDY ANTIC: Luton's first trip into the European transfer market brought Antic to England, he has 5 Yugoslav caps. He had been playing for Zaragoza in Spain. Luton paid only a small fee for him only weeks after he had been chosen "Foreign Player of the Year" by the Spanish Press.

Forwards: **BRIAN STEIN:** an inspired move for an unknown player transformed the life of a 20-year-old striker in October, 1977. He was a local authority clerk playing non-league football with Edgware when Luton signed him. One of the league's top scorers this season.

STEVE WHITE: made a name for himself as a scorer with Bristol Rovers and Luton paid £175,000 to bring him to Kenilworth Road last season. A direct, front-running striker, a good future is predicted for him.

DAVID MOSS: Moss spent nine years in the Third Division with Swindon before Luton paid £110,000 in 1978. A quicksilver winger, he quickly made his mark with Luton. He was their leading scorer in each of his first two seasons with them and he has now notched over 100 league goals in his career.
