

With most of our Welsh players bound for Yugoslavia next week with both the senior and Under-21 Welsh teams, the respite from midweek action will have been nothing more than a temporary break.

Slowly but surely our long casualty list has been shrinking which means we can at last look forward to the rare luxury of a fully fit squad at the start of the month which brings several more thrilling challenges.

Luton Town, runaway champions of the Second Division last season, are the first and in welcoming their players, officials and supporters to the Vetch we trust they will understand our desire to improve upon our last two League results.

Arsenal's winner two minutes from time brought our last home match to a controversial end a fortnight ago, a cruel finish to a match we had been capable of winning after Bob Latchford's excellent second half goal.

There wasn't much luck to be found at Ipswich last Saturday and so Luton return to pay us their first visit since that tremendous Second Division match here late in the 1980-81 season. The result that night helped us on our way to promotion and kept our opponents waiting another twelve months but they've made it to the top, winning friends along the way with an attractive brand of football.

Needless to say this afternoon's is another 'first' - the first First Division fixture between the clubs, quite something when you remember that it wasn't all that long ago when the very same fixture was cropping up under the banner of the Fourth Division . . . 1967-68 to be precise.

Another 'FIRST'

After the hectic events of the last few months, it makes quite a change to be back to the normal routine of one match a week, if only briefly before the traditionally heavy programme over Christmas and the New

This afternoon our opponents are Luton and we extend a warm welcome to David Pleat and his players. The 'Hatters' are always attractive opposition and if today's game is anything like the one played here eighteen months ago, then you will certainly get your money's worth! We shared four goals on that occasion and then went on to win at Preston and clinch promotion. A crowd of over twenty thousand saw Tommy Craig and Leighton James give us a two goal lead but we were hanging on at the finish after allowing Luton back into the game.

They have figured in some high scoring matches to date and have drawn half of their sixteen First Division games. For our own part, we have recently been beaten by Arsenal and Ipswich, two quality sides, and are in need of a win today.

The Arsenal result was particularly disappointing because it could quite easily have gone in our favour. Bob Latchford scored a fine solo goal to put us in front, but Arsenal kept going and scored twice late in the game. I think we deserved something from that one. Last Saturday at Ipswich though, we were beaten by three goals to one and I don't think that any of us could complain at the final outcome. Indiscipline at two set pieces cost us a result and in spite of the fact that we opened well enough, we were a well beaten side at the finish.

Next midweek we begin our defence of the Welsh Cup and already, last year's runners-up, Cardiff City, are out of the competition. The draw was not a very kind one for the 'Bluebirds' pairing them with Newport

County at Somerton Park. Surely the Welsh FA must consider omitting the Football League clubs until a later stage next season. I was an interested spectator at the game and felt that Cardiff were a little unlucky to be beaten. It was very much a game of two halves, with Cardiff dominating the early stages but Newport coming back strongly at the finish to win by a goal to nil. The turning point was, in my opinion, the enforced change at the centre of the Cardiff defence. Phil Dwyer had to leave the field and after that they were always vulnerable at the back. Still, I enjoyed the cup tie which was played in a good spirit in front of enthusiastic supporters.

Newport, along with Shrewsbury and Wrexham now pose the biggest threat to us retaining the Welsh Cup and having already gone out of one competition this season against Third Division opposition, we have got to see to it that lightning doesn't strike twice!



On the Other side - LUTON TOWN

Luton Town began their third spell in the First Division this season and no club has been involved in quite as many high-scoring matches over the last three months than the Hatters from Kenilworth Road.

Their eight away matches, for example, have produced a total of 37 goals. During September Luton excelled themselves by being involved in a flood of 32 goals from just five matches.

They went to Anfield and drew 3-3 with Liverpool, leaving the champions happy to settle for a point. A fortnight later they figured in another thrill-a-minute match, drawing 4-4 with Stoke City at the Victoria Ground.

Last Saturday was no exception, a 3-3 draw at home to Southampton, but the fact remains that David Pleat's team have not won a League game since their visit to Birmingham on October the 9th.

Even so their impact on the First Division in terms of entertainment has made Luton among the most attractive opposition with the result that more and more of their players are gaining international recognition.

Mal Donaghy has been a Northern Ireland regular since Luton's Second Division days but Ricky Hill's midfield talents have been rewarded with an England cap. Paul Walsh is in the England Under 21 team and in First Division matches this season nobody, not even Ian Rush, has outscored Brian Stein.

Luton first won promotion to Division one in 1955, staying there for five seasons during which time they reached their only F.A. Cup final, losing to Nottingham Forest in 1959. Their second spell at the top, in the mid-Seventies, lasted only one season but this time the Hatters are determined to make their stay a much longer one.

JAKE FINDLAY (Goalkeeper) Born Blairgowrie. Made his League debut with Aston Villa but established himself as a consistent goalkeeper after moving to Kenilworth Road. Turned professional with Villa in 1972 he moved to Luton for £100,000 in 1978.

KIRK STEPHENS (Defender) Born Coventry. Hasn't looked back since breaking into League football five seasons ago, proving a real bargain buy from Nuneaton Borough.

RICHARD MONEY (Defender) Born Lowestoft. Kicked off at Scunthorpe nine years ago. Fulham signed him for £50,000 in 1977 and three years later his value had appreciated some 700 per cent. Despite his £350,000 price tag, he played only a dozen or so games for Liverpool, Luton signing him last season.

MAL DONAGHY (Defender) Born Belfast. An outstanding member of Northern Ireland's World Cup team in Spain last summer, he has been with the club since leaving Larne in the Irish League four years ago for £20,000. Now automatic choice, he has played nearly 20 times for his country.

CLIVE GOODYEAR (Defender) Born Lincoln. Made his big break through after the Welsh captain Paul Price had been sold to Spurs the season before last. Graduated through the youth ranks, playing in all but ten of last season's League games.

BRIAN HORTON (Midfield) Born Hednesford. Began modestly with Port Vale in 1970, he has been going up ever since. Transferred to Brighton in 1976, he played an



important part in their rise to the First Division, then did a similar job for Luton. Has played more than 500 League matches.

RADDY ANTIC (Midfield) Born Yugoslavia. A full international who arrived in the Football League from the Spanish club Real Zaragoza two years ago. Spent much of last season as substitute.

WAYNE TURNER (Midfield) Born Luton. Joined the club after leaving school, he scored his first First Division goal in the big win over Brighton a couple of months ago. Had a spell on loan to Lincoln City last season but regained his place towards the end of the Second Division championship run.

DAVID MOSS (Striker) Born Witney. Has given excellent value for money since joining the club from Swindon for £90,000 in 1978. One of the League's leading penalty takers, he scored twelve times from the spot last season but to date this term only one of his seven goals has been a penalty.

BRIAN STEIN (Striker) Born South Africa. Top scorer for the last two seasons, he is out in front again this season with eleven goals. Previously with Edgware Town, he made his League debut five seasons ago.

PAUL WALSH (Striker) Born London. Signed from Charlton Athletic during the close season for a fee of £330,000, a club record. An England Under 21 international, he scored a hat-trick in his third match in the First Division and is regarded as one of the most exciting young strikers in the game.

RICKY HILL (Midfield) Born London. Joined Luton as a schoolboy in 1975, making his League debut 12 months later. A member of this season's England squad, he has made nearly 300 appearances for the club.

BILLY KELLOCK (Midfield) Born Glasgow. First appeared in League Football with Cardiff City after starting his career with Aston Villa. Has travelled far and wide since leaving Ninian Park, playing for Norwich, Millwall, Chelmsford, Kettering and Peterborough.



Observations on a Super League - by The Chairman

The great myth of our footballing times must surely be the proposal being put forward by some of my fellow Chairmen that the formation of a so-called Super League will solve the financial problems of our Football League Clubs. The fact is, of course, that in the First Division we already have a Super League and those who want to make changes seem less than united as to what those changes should be. There are some who say that a Super League should have a European base. This proposal makes many assumptions, for example, that there are enough other countries who are interested in the concept - that the considerable additional costs will be more than compensated by increased gates, and that there will be overall increased revenue from, presumably, a smaller number of games. Further, could it be that the commitments of the various National Associations could be dove-tailed to fit into a European situation? Significantly no-one has even begun to come up with detailed answers to these and other questions. Indeed, there are some Chairmen who even advocate pulling out of Europe. What appears to constitute a Super League in some Chairmen's minds is a reduction of the number of Clubs competing in the First Division. I find it difficult to understand the proposition that by playing less matches, we are going to increase the revenue, be it in the First Division or otherwise.

Other Chairmen not only advocate the reduction in the number of Clubs in the First Division but also, irrespective of current League position, a re-organisation so as to permit all the big City Clubs to be competing in a new League - a Super League. All I can say to that one is that one finds it generally advocated by those Clubs who are languishing in the lower divisions

and whom appear to be wanting to use this concept for promotion off the field that they are, apparently, unable to achieve on it. This can hardly be a fair basis upon which to proceed. We surely cannot allow the situation to arise where the deciding principle is not one of merit and of results achieved on the field of play, as otherwise the whole idea of a League structure becomes a pointless irrelevance. It would be convenient, for example, for Crystal Palace to be able to play in a Super League and lose 6-0 every week in the comforting knowledge that they cannot be relegated, or if it is proposed that they can, what is the point of this creation in the first place? Notwithstanding some rather foolhardy noises being made by a few Clubs, I am confident that a Super League in the format envisaged by any of the above methods will not get off the ground. That is not to say, however, that the Football League is not in need of some considerable re-structuring. It is an economic fact of life that 17 - 20 million spectators can no longer support 92 Professional League Clubs. Contemporaneously with the re-structuring, we have to bring more finance into football. Notwithstanding all that has been written and said by the media, about the problems of football, it remains the number one spectator sport in this country and will, most certainly, recoup many lost spectators when the recession begins to recede. It must be said that if the Football League had, in years past, run its business properly, we would not have the incongruous situation of it being the most popular spectator sport in the country, yet desperately short of money. There are many ways in which more finance can, and must, be brought into football and I cite just a few examples. More money must be forthcoming from the contract with the Pools Association. Where

would the Pools be without Football Clubs and where would the Government be without the Pools Association, from whom they cream off millions of pounds in tax. Fortunately, this Season is the last Season of the existing television contract and no new contract must be signed unless much more realistic financial terms can be obtained and shirt advertising is permitted. Football is, virtually, the only major sport which is excluded by the television authorities from shirt advertising and their attempts to distinguish between say motor racing and horse jumping as against football are as hypocritical as they are flagrantly dishonest. There are, of course, many other possibilities such as bulk buying by the Football League, more Sponsorship and contracts with Cable television. Quite frankly, for too long, the Football League has permitted too many to make too much money on the backs of our National game. As for the re-structuring, I go back to the premise that 92 Football Clubs can no longer support an attendance which has declined by about 50% from its peak. The only logical conclusion is that the third and fourth divisions must go part time. The revenue available to football should be distributed only between the first and second division Clubs, apart from the Pools revenue, which should be continued to be distributed to all four divisions based on a pro-rata basis, whereby the first and second divisions get the same amount and the third and fourth a lesser amount. Promotion and relegation from all four divisions should continue, but those Clubs relegated from the second division to the third division should be allowed, for one further Season whilst in the third, to receive the same financial increments as if they were still in the second division. This will enable Clubs who are relegated into a part-time League to have a Season to adjust to their new situation, from a financial point of view. All contracts made by Clubs with players



would have to take full account of the financial implications arising from this re-structuring.

By insisting upon more money being brought into the game and by ensuring its distribution amongst 44 Clubs rather than 92, the first and second divisions would become a strong viable Football League entity, while still giving the third and fourth division Clubs the opportunity to achieve first or second division status. For example, the re-structuring coupled with an improved television contract could produce up to £200,000 per season, per Club, for each of the Clubs in the first and second divisions instead of the present laughable sum of £25,000.

I would be the first to concede that the problems are easy to identify and the solutions less easy to find. This is a vast subject and, given more time and space, there is much more to be said, but of one thing I am certain and it is that we will not help ourselves by pandering to the media by romanticising about a Super League. I am not saying that the proposals I have put forward comprise the only remedy, but I would be very surprised if, at the end of the day, the ultimate answer is not found at least along similar lines to the views I have expressed, for I consider they have the merit of common sense, in that, they are achievable, practicable and effective.

Memory Lane - BARRIE JONES

Barrie Jones played for Swansea Town, Plymouth Argyle and Cardiff City before serious injury brought his career to a sudden end. Capped 15 times by Wales, he still lives in Bishopston and has now started a thriving new career as a squash coach. He has two children, Belinda (15) and Christian, 14 next month.

Barrie Jones has a small confession to make about how he prepared for his League debut. An injury to Len Allchurch resulted in the 17-year-old right winger being drafted into the Swans team for the Second Division match against Portsmouth at Fratton Park in 1958.

Barrie remembers it well - "We stayed at an hotel in Southsea and on the Saturday morning my room mate, Peter Davies, suggested we go for a stroll along the pier."

"Being a young lad about to play my first match I was feeling a bit nervous. So I stopped along the way and had two glasses of lager to settle my nerves."

"Maybe it wasn't the done thing but looking back the result of the match justified it. We won 3-1 and I had a good game."

It was the start of an eleven-year career which made Barrie Jones one of the most admired Welsh players of his time, a career which came to a tragic end with a badly broken leg.

Barrie was at peak performance in the autumn of 1969, a regular member of the Wales team and one of the most consistent players in a Cardiff City side then among the best in the Second Division.

He wasn't to know it, of course, but that match at Bloomfield Road was to be his last in League football. John Toshack had scored twice to give Cardiff hope of snatching a draw and Barrie was doing his best to find an equaliser when an injury-time tackle left him with his leg broken in two places.

Finished with League football at the age of 28, Barrie played briefly in the Southern League for Yeovil,

Worcester and, finally, Merthyr before hanging up his boots for good.

He played 166 League matches for the Swans between leaving Townhill Secondary Modern School and joining Plymouth Argyle in March 1964 for a transfer fee of £45,000 - then the highest for a winger.

Argyle manager Malcolm Allison clinched the deal immediately after the Swans had been knocked out of the semi-finals of the FA Cup by Preston North End. Barrie's move to Home Park was to prove only a temporary departure from his native land.

In 1966 Cardiff brought him home, a move which revived his international career. Barrie had won his first cap for Wales against Scotland at Hampden in 1962, playing alongside a whole host of Swansea lads in Cliff Jones, Ivor Allchurch, Mel Charles and, of course, Big John.

Dropped after the World Cup defeat in Denmark in 1964, it took him five years to regain his place, returning for a friendly against West Germany in Frankfurt in March 1969 and proceeded to play some of the best football of his career.

"The broken leg cut short my career but I have no regrets," he says, "I had a marvellous run and I'm very glad I decided to take a chance on football as a profession. Before I joined the Swans I was toying with the idea of taking a job at BP Llandarcy."

"The Swans in those days were a good Second Division side at the Vetch but our away record was such that people used to say: 'We'll post you the points.' I was lucky to be brought up with players like Ivor and Len Allchurch, Reggie Davies and Harry Griffiths who all helped me so much."

"What 'Tosh' has achieved for the club is absolutely fantastic. I'm only sorry that the gates aren't better."

Meanwhile another Jones boy is on the way... Barrie's 13-year-old son Christian plays for the Cygnets and Dad is following his progress with keen interest.

The first encounter between the Towns of Swansea and Luton, as they were then, took place before the First World War in the Second Division of the Southern League. This afternoon we meet in the First Division of the Football League for the first time.

It means we have met at every level within the Football League with the obvious exception of the old Third Division (North) and over the years there have been many fine matches between the clubs.

One of the earliest took place here at the Vetch during our promotion season of 1924-25 when we beat 'The Hatters' 4-1. Until then we had never managed to beat them by more than one goal but Jack Fowler changed all that with one of the many hat-tricks he scored during his career here.

Outside left 'Spotty' Spottiswood scored the other goal, Reid replied for Luton and the teams that afternoon almost sixty years ago, lined up as follows:

Swans: Denoon; Morley; Milne; McPherson; Sykes; Bellamy; Miller; Deacon; Fowler; Thompson; Spottiswood.

Luton: Brookes; Anderson; Graham; Mills; Jennings; Miller; Hoar; Butcher; Reid; Dennis; Brown.

Brookes, the Luton goalie in that match, had been transferred from the Swans the previous summer and Jimmy Miller, the Swans' right winger, joined Luton the following season, the club obviously deciding that there wasn't room for Miller and Billy Hole.

Two much more recent transfers have taken place between the clubs. Goalkeeper Keith Barber left Kenilworth Road for the Vetch a few years ago followed by Phil Boersma, whose playing career was brought to a sudden end by injury.

The last Swans v Luton match must rank as the best of all. It took place on April 27th, 1981 at a time when the promotion race was at a crucial stage. Luton needed to win to go up and it's history now that our point that night and the win at Preston the following Saturday clinched our elevation to the First Division.

Nearly 22,000 people saw a thrilling 2-2 draw. Tommy Craig and Leighton James fired us two goals ahead but Luton recovered in splendid style, Ricky Hill scoring both their goals. The teams that evening lined up as follows:






