What a fortnight it has been since our last home game at the Dell, after the disappointment of dropping 2 home points to Sunderland we went to Blackburn in the F.A. Cup, and as thousands saw, produced a tremendous team performance to overcome a difficult away tie. The lads showed the application that is needed for those sort of cup-ties and with the wonderful vocal backing from the Saints supporters it made the long trip to Blackburn a night to remember. However the following Monday brought the disappointment of another away draw, this time to one of the Second Division promotion favourites Sheffield Wednesday, having travelled in all three rounds so far and with our current improved form away from home we still feel there is no reason not to feel confident of gaining a semi-final place. It would have been nice for both players and fans to have played at home, Lawrie McMenemy and the players would like to thank all those who travelled to Blackburn and urge as many as possible of you that can go, to make the trip to Sheffield, as it will be a real help to the players. On Tuesday we returned to League action with the visit to Ipswich and produced one of our best displays of the season, especially in the first half when we fully deserved our three goal lead. Lets hope today we can produce the same kind of entertainment so that we can capitalise on those three points gained at Ipswich and not only maintain the five point gap between us and the teams below us, but also make up ground on Liverpool at the top of the table. With three home League games in a row including the visit of Liverpool on Friday the 16th of March, we must be looking to pick up maximum points to keep our European hopes alive.

Last Monday also brought the news that five members of the playing staff had been selected for the full and U-21 England squads for the games against France to add to Alan Curtis's Welsh selection for the match against Scotland next week.

While congratulating them it is also a tribute to the manager and coaching staff at the Dell that three of them, Danny Wallace, Steve Moran and Steve Williams have come up through the youth sides to the first team and international selection and we hope that even if not selected this time they will win many international caps in the future.

Today we give a very warm welcome to David Pleat and his Luton side who over the past couple of seasons have produced a tremendous amount of entertainment and if today's game produces the goals and entertainment as last season, then you can be assured you will go home at 4.40 having seen football at its best.

With fourteen goals in our last three games as well as two of the top young strikers in the game there is plenty to look forward to. Thankyou for your support and we hope to see you all again next Saturday for the visit of Norwich City.

Luton Town play football the way the fans like to see it. They go into every match, at home or away, looking for a win and, though they sometimes concede a few goals, they also score quite a lot.

Their live televised game against Manchester United a fortnight ago was typical of the Hatters' approach. The record books show it as a 0-5 defeat, but it really wasn't like that.

He lost an injured defender when he was 0-2 down, but manager David Pleat still opted to go for a win, pushing men forward. Unluckily for Luton, the gamble didn't pay off but it did maintain the entertainment level of the game when many managers might have pulled everyone back. Luton's two chief strikers are Paul Walsh and Brian Stein.

Walsh's rapid progress was recognised when Bobby Robson took him on last summer's England tour of Australia. Paul, a former youth and under-21 international, played in all three full internationals down under and scored one of only two goals. Paul joined the Hatters from Charlton during the 1982 close-season in a player-plus-cash deal that valued him at £330,000. His goal tally of 15 last season included hat-tricks against Notts County and West Ham. Paul made his first League appearance for Charlton in 1979 and led their scoring list with 13 goals in his last season at The Valley. Paul has scored 12 times this season, grabbing a hat-trick at Stoke.

Stein was blooded in Luton's first-team in 1977 and led their scoring list for the first time in 1980/81 with 19 goals. The following term, when they won promotion, he led the way again with 21. He netted 15 times in only 26 appearances last season and has eight to his credit this term.

Trevor Aylott is now Luton's third forward. Trevor, who made a couple of dozen League appearances for Chelsea, joined Barnsley for £50,000 in 1980 and moved to Millwall for £150,000 in 1982. Luton managed to sign him for £55,000 towards the end of last season. He has scored seven times so far.

Until hit by injury David Moss was the man who raided so effectively down the left flank for the Hatters. David earned his reputation as a goal-scoring winger with Swindon and, once he had established himself in their League

eleven, it was rare for him to fail to reach double figures. In his last season at The County Ground in 1977/78, he scored 22 goals. Luton signed him for £90,000 in 1978 and he was their top scorer in his first two seasons with 13 and 24. Last season, after relinquishing the responsibility for taking penalties, he scored 10 times. Ricky Hill, Brian Horton and Frankie Bunn have been filling the midfield for most of the season but Garry Parker has deputised a few times for Hill and Raddy Antic now seems to have become their regular substitute.

Hill joined the Hatters as a schoolboy and has been a first-team regular for six years. Last season his performances were rewarded by a call up to the England squad and he won full caps against Denmark and West Germany.

Horton is an all-action player of tremendous experience, dating back to his League debut for Port Vale in 1970. He moved on to Brighton for £30,000 in 1976 and helped the Sussex club gain First Division status for the first time before joining Luton for £100,000 in 1981.

Bunn served his apprenticeship at Kenilworth Road and first played in their League eleven in 1980/81. But he was only an occasional first-teamer prior to this season. Parker is another former Luton apprentice. He got his First Division baptism at Manchester United towards the end of last season. Antic, a Yugoslav international, often found himself on the substitute's bench last season. But it was as the number 12 that he scored the vital goal at Manchester City to save the club's First Division life in May. Raddy

joined Luton from the Spanish club Zaragoza in 1980.

Paul Elliott and Mal Donaghy play in the middle of the defence. Elliott, who established himself in the Charlton team in 1981/82 was transferred to Luton last March for an initial fee of £95,000 with more to pay when he has completed 60 First Division appearances.

Donaghy, signed from Larne for £20,000 in 1978, is now a regular member of the N. Ireland team with 27 caps.

Right-back Kirk Stephens was signed from Nuneaton for £5,000 in 1978 and has been the regular number two for five years now. Mitchell Thomas and Wayne Turner have both filled the left-back spot. Both completed their apprenticeship with the club. Turner, who also plays in midfield, made his League debut in

1978/79 and two seasons ago went to Lincoln on loan. He returned to win a regular place at Kenilworth Road last season. Thomas made his first few appearances last season.

Following their heavy defeat by Manchester United, Luton drafted in an extra defender for last Saturday's home clash with Champions Liverpool. Clive Goodyear, who was a regular first-teamer until Elliott's arrival, was recalled and helped the Hatters to draw 0-0. Clive made his League debut for Luton in 1980.

Goalkeeper Les Sealey, signed from Coventry for £120,000 last summer, developed in Coventry's junior teams and made his League debut for the Sky Blues at Q.P.R. in April 1977. For the past five seasons he was their regular First Division goalkeeper, making well over 150 League appearances for the club.


Luton, who are now chasing a place in next season's UEFA Cup, have won seven away games in the First Division — at Leicester (3-0), Everton (1-0), Q.P.R. (1-0), Watford (2-1), Stoke (4-2), Notts. County (3-0) and Wolves (2-1). The Hatters drew at Aston Villa (0-0) but were beaten at Arsenal (1-2), Manchester United (0-2), Nottingham Forest (0-1), Liverpool (0-6) and Sunderland (0-2). It's significant to note, though, that their reverse at Sunderland on New Year's Eve is the Hatters' only away defeat in their last seven away League games.

Luton went out at the first stage of both cups, losing 3-4 on aggregate to Rotherham in the Milk Cup and going down 3-4 at Watford in the F.A. Cup, following a 2-2 draw at Kenilworth Road.

Luton's return to Division One in 1982 completed a recovery unique in the history of the Football League. In the five years between 1960 and 1965 they plummeted from the First Division way down into the Fourth.

No other club has ever bounced back from such a fall to regain its First Division status.

PLAYED FOR BOTH

RON DAVIES was probably the best-known of all the players who wore the shirts of both Luton and Southampton. He was making a name for himself in the Fourth Division with Chester when the Hatters signed him in October 1962. Though he led their scoring list with 21 goals that season, Luton were relegated to the Third Division and in September of the following season he was transferred to Norwich City.

It was while with the Canaries that he won the first of his 29 Welsh caps and he came to The Dell during the 1966 close-season, ready to help us make our debut in the First Division. Ron scored 37 goals in his first campaign in Division One and 28 the following season. In his seven seasons at The Dell, Ron became one of the most successful, and popular, strikers to play for the club.

He was beginning to slow down when he moved on to Portsmouth in 1973. He later had a brief spell with Man-



chester United and then completed his League playing days with Millwall.

CHRIS NICHOLL was rejected by Burnley but, after a spell with non-League Witton Albion, he got his chance in League football with Halifax. Within a year of making his bow, he was snapped up by Luton in August 1969. Chris made about 100 first-team appearances for the Hatters and was transferred to Aston Villa in March 1972. Whilst with Villa, he became a N. Ireland international and he came to The Dell in June 1977.

He gave the Saints fine service, appearing in more than 250 senior games for the club. He moved on to Grimsby Town last summer but is still a member of the N. Ireland squad, picking up his 51st cap this season.

TOMMY HARE was a full-back who made 13 League appearances for the Saints during the 1965/66 campaign. He moved on to Luton in July 1967 and made a few appearances in their first team before signing for Workington.

LES HARFIELD followed England schoolboy honours by winning England youth caps during his early days at The Dell. But he didn't really fulfil his potential and made only two League appearances, scoring one goal, for the Saints. Luton signed him in September 1972 but he made only one substitute appearance for the Hatters.

LEAGUE MEETINGS

When the Hatters came to The Dell last April they were desperate for points to take them clear of the relegation zone so the point they won here was invaluable — they ultimately escaped by two points. Luton got off to a flying start when centre-back Paul Elliott put them in front after only five minutes. Coincidentally, it was one of the Saints' central defenders, Mark Wright, who levelled the scores about a quarter-of-an-hour later. David Armstrong then put the Saints in front but his effort was nullified within three minutes by Raddy Antic. The score was 2-2 at half-time and there was no addition.

Luton's previous League visit was in December 1977 when we were in the Second Division and a goal from Ron Fletcher fifteen minutes from the end gave them full points.

Our last League victory over Luton here at The Dell was in April 1977 when the issue was decided by an early Alan Ball goal. Though Nick Holmes and Steve Williams remain of the Saints' side on that occasion, all the Luton players have now dispersed. The Saints' biggest wins of the series were all by a three-goal margin — two of them in the same season. In September 1961 George O'Brien scored a hat-trick at Kenilworth Road with Harry Penk adding another before Gordon Turner scored a consolation for Luton close to the end.

When Luton came to The Dell in the February, O'Brien scored again and efforts from Derek Reeves and Tommy Mulgrew made it 3-0 to The Saints.

We equalled those victories when we went to Kenilworth Road in October 1976. A penalty from David Peach set us up for a win and the same player scored again to make it 2-0 by the interval. Brian Chambers pulled one back for Luton but Ted MacDougall and Nick Holmes both scored in the later stages of the game to make it 4-1.

Luton scored their best two wins over us in the same season, winning 6-2 at Kenilworth Road and 4-0 at The Dell in the final season prior to the last war. We went down 1-3 at Kenilworth Road this season. Trevor Aylott scored two first-half goals for the Hatters and Brian Stein eased them further in front in the 64th minute. David Armstrong scored for the Saints four minutes later.

Last Season's game at Luton was a real thriller. Goals from Danny Wallace and Keith Cassells gave us a 2-0 interval advantage but Ricky Hill and Brian Stein hit back swiftly to level things up by the 69th minute. We seemed to have claimed the full points when David Armstrong put us ahead with only six minutes to play. But Clive Goodyear scored a last-gasp equaliser for the Hatters.

INTERNATIONALS

No fewer than eight of the players, likely to be in action at The Dell this afternoon, have been chosen for the England squads to play France at full and under-21 levels next week.

Peter Shilton, Mark Wright and Steve Williams, of the Saints, plus Brian Stein and Paul Walsh will be travelling to Paris for next Wednesday's friendly international against France.

...at the Dell

Danny Wallace and Steve Moran are being joined by Paul Elliott in the under-21 squad to face France at Hillsborough on Tuesday in the first-leg of the UEFA Under-21 tournament quarter-final. Shilton seems certain to win his 56th cap and there might just be a chance that Mark Wright could win his first full cap, following four appearances in the under-21s. England manager Bobby Robson has selected three recognised central defenders and, as this is a friendly game, he may well try out new players in several departments.

Terry Butcher, capped on 22 occasions, will certainly play but Bobby Robson then has the choice between Graham Roberts (Spurs) and Mark Wright for the second place.



The England manager has picked his recognised midfield players in Sammy Lee, Bryan Robson, Glenn Hoddle and Ray Wilkins. Steve Williams, who won two full caps in Australia last summer, and John Gregory (Q.P.R.) make up the selection in this department.

There would seem to be a chance of Steve getting a run, at least as substitute.

A look at the England squad reflects the changing fortunes of some of our clubs. Whilst Southampton have three players, Liverpool have only two named. Manchester United and Arsenal have also got three men in the group but Luton have two whereas Nottingham Forest have only one.

This afternoon we could see two future England centre-backs in action. Whilst Mark Wright will be hoping to get his chance in the senior side, Luton's Paul Elliott is awaiting his chance to make his debut in the under-21 side at Hillsborough. Steve Moran is one of the two permitted over-age

players in the under-21 side. It's a welcome second chance for Steve to make his breakthrough. Soon after making his previous under-21 appearance, as substitute against Norway in 1981, he suffered the injury that kept him out of the side for so long.




Danny Wallace has played in four previous under-21 games, including both this season. England are, of course, the holders of the UEFA Under-21 championship, having defeated West Germany 5-4 on aggregate in the final of 1982. We qualified for this year's quarter final by winning five of our six qualifying matches. England defeated Denmark twice, by 4-1 on each occasion. Brian Stein and Paul Walsh each scored twice in this season's home leg.

The full international in France gives Bobby Robson the chance to prepare for next season's World Cup qualifying matches, following our elimination by Denmark from the European Football Championships. Since that shock 0-1 defeat by Denmark at Wembley last September, England have given two fine performances to win 3-0 in Hungary and 4-0 in Luxembourg.


Bobby Robson, then, is likely to make a few experiments. Peter Shilton now finds himself with a new challenger for the goalkeeping position. Ray Clemence asked not to be picked again after playing understudy for so long but, instead of Gary Bailey being called up, Bobby Robson made a slightly surprising choice in Norwich City's Chris Woods.

The fact that eight of the players due in international action next Wednesday are playing at The Dell today is a compliment to the progress made by the Saints and Luton — two clubs who, until quite recently, had provided only the occasional player for England.





Right: Danny Wallace is tripped in the penalty area, from which Steve Moran scored his 10th goal in eight games




Below more action from our last home game against Sunderland which ended in a 1-1 draw.



PAUL WALSH..



Luton's Paul Walsh comes to The Dell looking for the hat-trick that would take him to the 50 mark in Football League goals!

So far Paul has scored five hat-tricks in four seasons of top-class football, the most recent being at Stoke City in December.

There was never much doubt that Paul would play for England, right from the time he first joined Charlton as a youngster. He won England youth honours during his early days at The Valley and it was during the 1979/80 season that he was eased into the first-team.

He made his League debut when coming on as substitute in a Second Division match at Watford in September 1979 but he wasn't rushed. He spent most of that season in the reserves, being encouraged to develop his close ball skills and his running at defenders.

It was during the early weeks of the following season that Paul first hit the headlines, though. He scored his first goal at home to Brentford in a Milk Cup tie but Charlton lost the leg by 1-3. Paul really turned it on in the return game to score his first hat-trick as Charlton won 5-0.

He scored another two match winners in the next round against Carlisle and Paul Walsh, the goalscorer extraordinary was on his way. He held his place in the Charlton side for the whole of that season, ending up with a total of 18 goals, which is still his best personal tally for a season.

One day when he paraded his skills to an appreciative audience was at Highbury on the opening day of this season. A crowd of almost 40,000 had gathered to watch the great Charlie Nicholas make his Arsenal debut. But, whilst patient Gunners' fans waited for their new hero to produce something special, it was Paul Walsh who gave them the sort of football treat they wanted.

It was after Paul had produced his skills for a second successive season for Charlton, topping their scoring list with 13 goals in 1981/82, that he became the target for bigger clubs.

Luton had just won promotion to the First Division and manager, David Pleat was looking for a player who would fit in so well with their attacking style of play.

Though Charlton fixed a £330,000 price tag for Paul, who had played only two full seasons and had never played in the First Division, David Pleat was happy enough to pay. Steve White, another striker who had not quite made it at Luton, went as part of the deal, with Luton agreeing to pay the balance of £250,000 in cash.

Paul needed only a couple of games to acclimatise to First Division play. He got off the mark with a hat-trick against Notts County in only his third game, and immediately struck up a productive partnership with Brian Stein.

.... Match winner!

Though both were new to First Division football, they played with the assurance of veteran professionals and both ended up with 15 goals.

Paul hit another hat-trick at West Ham, giving Luton a 3-2 victory, and also scored three times in a 3-1 win over Swansea towards the end of the season.

Paul now has the chance to beat his previous best tally of 18 goals in a season. He has netted 12 so far in League and Cups so, with 15 matches to go, he stands a sporting chance of making it.

He is the sort of player who has inspired days and, when he is in that sort of mood, he is almost impossible to control. No doubt he will be making a special effort this afternoon, in the hope that his performance might just clinch a place in the England side.

Paul has scored three goals in six games for the England under-21s and was one of the few players to shine on the ill-fated trip to Australia last summer. He played in all three games and scored one of only two goals on the tour.

Now he's anxious to play for England against some of the established footballing nations and to show that he is every bit as capable of scoring against them.

A CHRONOLOGICAL HISTORY OF SOUTHAMPTON FOOTBALL CLUB

1980 ~ 81

This turned out to be our most successful season in the First Division and, by finishing sixth, we qualified again for the UEFA Cup. But excitement reached a peak at The Dell even before the season started! Manager Lawrie McMenemy pulled off a real coup when signing England captain Kevin Keegan. His name had been linked with many of the leading clubs in the world but, amid high secrecy, the Saints' boss completed the transfer from SV Hamburger, the West German club, and then introduced his new signing to the world's press in a remote New Forest hotel.

Another new arrival that season was left-back Mike McCartney, a signing from Carlisle, but he didn't really settle here and, at the end of the season, moved on to Plymouth for a similar fee.

A crowd of 23,230 saw Keegan make his debut against Manchester City at The Dell. We won 2-0 and, by dropping only one point from our opening five games, we were level top of the First Division.

A losing run in September proved a setback but as the season progressed the team settled down nicely and an unbeaten run of 12 games saw us very well placed by the end of February.

Though we had drifted ten points behind the then leaders Ipswich, and appeared to have lost our chance of landing the Championship, we had a great chance of going back into Europe.

With four games to play, we were fourth in the table. Dropped Easter points, in drawn games at Leicester and at home to Spurs, changed the situation a little and defeat at Coventry in our penultimate match threatened our European hopes. We went into our final game at Ipswich needing a win to put us above Nottingham Forest on goal-average. A 3-2 victory did the trick.

Towards the end of the season, Phil Boyer was transferred to Manchester City for and Charlie George joined Hong Kong club Bulova for.

During the course of this season Saints' fans saw the first of Danny Wallace and Reuben Agboola in our First Division side. Alan Ball, who had not met with his, hoped for success as player-manager at Blackpool, returned to The Dell during the closing weeks of the season.






