



The Canon League sponsorship has got off to a great start. Despite the talk of even more rigorous refereeing directives, there have been fewer early season bookings, and a better spirit amongst players. These incentives were rewards not only for gaining silverware but for scoring goals and being clubs that encouraged families to watch in comfort. Luton Town, incidentally, received £12,000 which was the basic figure. We are hoping that a run in the Milk Cup will enable us to improve that figure considerably this season.



This week it was announced that Manchester United are set to reveal profits for last season of well over £1m. Shareholders will be told at November's annual meeting that profits are more than double last season's record of £636,000.

Only two years ago United had a record loss of £2.3m chairman Martin Edwards said 'In 1982 I said it would take three years to recoup the big outlay on players but we have done it in two.'

More good news for United fans is that their Irish international striker Frank Stapleton is back in training after a knee operation.

Stoke City manager Bill Asprey has failed in his bid to sign United striker Alan Davies on a months loan but had more success in persuading West Bromwich Albion full-back Wayne Ebanks to join him for the same period.

Television's first live coverage of a Canon League fixture this season happened last week when the cameras were at Stamford Bridge to watch Chelsea's match against Everton. The only goal of the game was scored by Everton's Kevin Richardson in the second-half. The match itself was not one of the best for the armchair supporter. The attendance of 17,734 was very disappointing for what Chelsea would consider one of their attractive fixtures and must now consider a claim for compensation from the League's funds. West Ham United are having the Leeds United and former England international Peter Barnes training with them this week. Barnes, who is valued by his club at £100,000, could become a West Ham player if he does well during this trial period.

Newcastle United are the surprise leaders of the Division after beating Aston Villa last Saturday. This result means that they are the only top flight side to have a 100 per cent record and it is the best start that the Geordies have had for 61 years. Chris Waddle,

who manager Jack Charlton rates as England class, with two goals and Peter Beardsley was the other goal scoring hero.

Charlie Nicholas inspired Arsenal to a thrilling 4-3 victory over Watford by scoring two of the goals. Peter Davenport hit the first hat-trick of the season in the Division as Nottingham Forest beat Sunderland 3-1.

Southampton, last season's runners-up, are not finding the going as easy so far this season. West Ham, who themselves have injury problems, beat them on their own ground 3-2 while at Anfield a late Ronnie Whelan goal earned the Reds a point against Queens Park Rangers. Wayne Fereday putting the Rangers in front in the second minute of the second-half. A quote from manager Alan Mullery said that the match was a great advert for British football. Alan Sunderland came off the substitute bench to give Ipswich a home point against Manchester United and Tottenham had a convincing home win against Norwich City. Shortly after this match Tottenham manager Peter Shreeve flew off to Portugal to watch Sporting Braga there UEFA Cup opponents. Crowd disturbance at Coventry did not stop the home side from taking three points from near neighbours Leicester City. Bob Latchford and Dave Bennett were the scorers. Latchford's goal was his 210th in League football. The old argument of all-seater stadiums came to the front here as Coventry chairman John Poynton said 'I want to remove some of the seats and restore terracing. It's balmy that our capacity is only 23,000 when we could get far bigger gates for top games.'

Gordon Milne, the Leicester manager, afterwards said, 'The bold steps taken when I was manager at Coventry to go all-seater have failed.'

The highest attendance last Saturday was at Liverpool with 33,932 inside Anfield, closely followed at Newcastle with 31,497.

We fielded only two players above 16 years of age who performed creditably against a vigorous Swindon side to earn a point.



SOUTHAMPTON



Southampton completed the most successful League season in their history last May when they finished as runners-up to Liverpool.

Yet the Saints' success in coming within four points of the League title was largely unheralded outside Hampshire. One of the reasons was that the Saints crept into second place at the death of the season when most attention was being focused on the FA Cup Final and Liverpool's challenge for the European Cup.

It was an outstanding achievement nevertheless for a side that also reached the last four in the FA Cup. But a new season has brought new targets down at the Dell and that means winning some silverware by next spring.

'Last season was a good one for us because we finished well and showed tremendous character to pick ourselves up after the Cup semi-final defeat by Everton,' says David Armstrong, Southampton's key figure in midfield.

'But we still did not win a trophy and that has to be our ambition this year.'

Most pundits believe that Lawrie McMenemy's side is well equipped to do just that. He has virtually the same squad of players to select from as 12 months ago with one important change. Frank Worthington moved down the coast during the summer to Brighton and was replaced just before the season kicked off by Joe Jordan, back in the English game after a spell in Italy.

A number of clubs were reported to be interested in bringing Jordan back to domestic football including Manchester City and Celtic. But McMenemy maintained his reputation as one of the swiftest dealers on the transfer front by landing Jordan from Verona in time for the Scottish striker to be registered to play in the opening round of this month's UEFA Cup.

'We spent very little to get him in comparison with fees paid for other strikers during the summer,' said McMenemy.

'We needed more experience up front and Joe fits the bill perfectly. He will increase competition and keep other players on their toes.'

Apart from signing Jordan, Southampton's only other newcomer this season is Bristol Rovers' goalkeeper Phil Kite, pulled out of the Third Division as understudy for Peter Shilton.

The remaining names on Southampton's squad list are very much as before, revealing a nice blend of experience and youth, a combination that has served the club so well in recent seasons.

It was hardly the best of starts to the new campaign for the Saints though. They were well beaten at Sunderland in their first match and opened their account with a point from a goalless draw with Manchester United at the Dell last week.

Looking at the Saints' line-up likely to be on duty at Kenilworth Road this afternoon, the side is literally spread with internationals from Peter Shilton in goal through to new man Jordan up front.

Shilton has missed only three League outings in two seasons since moving to the Dell from Nottingham Forest. He conceded an average of only one goal a game away from home last season . . . the First Division's best defensive record apart from Liverpool's.

Shilton's former England teammate Mick Mills, signed from Ipswich in November 1982, has a big influence on the side and the Saints' most recent international is central-

defender Mark Wright who played for England against Wales last season.

Mark Dennis, an England Under-21 cap while at Birmingham City, operates on the left-hand side of the back four and Southampton tend to play with a sweeper. Reuben Agboola usually takes on this role although the experienced Nick Holmes, the club's last remaining playing link with their 1976 Cup-winning side, has also been used in this position.


Holmes had to miss the Sunderland game a fortnight ago because of injury and youngster Mark Whitlock was drafted into the Saints back four with David Armstrong and Steve Williams, both England choices last season, in midfield. The Yugoslav Ivan Golac returned to the club last season to provide cover at full-back.

Jordan's presence up front should help Steve Moran cause problems for defences in the coming months. At 5ft 8in, Moran is on the small side for a First Division attacker but he makes up in pace what he may lack in physique and he was Saints' top scorer last season with 21 League goals.

Also into double figures were Armstrong with 15 and Danny Wallace who found the net 11 times and emerged as one of the best young players around. He is a youngster with the speed and skill to take players on and his goal tally shows he knows how to finish.



McMenemy added Swansea's Welsh international Alan Curtis to his squad midway through last season when young forward David Puckett was almost on permanent duty as substitute, making 11 appearances in the number 12 shirt.

Southampton's 3-1 defeat by Town was one of seven reversals the Saints suffered in the League away from the Dell but they also won that many away games. At home Southampton put together the Division's best record, winning 15 times and losing only twice, picking up more points than even Champions Liverpool on their own park.

When the Town party arrived at the Hawthorns they were met by the former Town players Tony Grealish and goalkeeper Tony Godden who had a loan spell at Luton the season before last.

Two minutes after the start the Town could have gone ahead when from an Ashley Grimes free-kick Brian Stein headed on and Frank Bunn just failed to connect at the far post. That was the Town's only worthwhile effort of the first-half as West Brom dominated the game from then on. Albion full-back Clive Whitehead turned raider and on three occasions set up Albion goals in a power-packed display.

Steve Hunt scored the first after 24 minutes with a header from a corner and England centre-forward Cyrille Regis got the second goal after 42 minutes.

The Town's defensive cover was pulled apart as a Whitehead inspired Albion piled on the second-half pressure. Nicky Cross substituting for the injured Regis hit the crossbar within 10 seconds of the re-start and was on hand to knock in number three after 66 minutes. Gary Thompson made it four shortly afterwards but the score could have been more but for the performance of Andy Dibble in the Town's goal.

After Albion's fourth goal the Town came back strongly and at times looked capable of pulling something back. Nwajobi was brought on to replace Tim Breacker and played the 4-2-4 formation that was successful at Ipswich, but apart from a couple of efforts from Brian Stein little was seen of Town's attack.

For West Brom it was one of those days where everything went right and in full-back Clive Whitehead they had the Man of the Match.

After match quote from Albion manager Johnny Giles said 'The fans want to see attacking football and that is what was provided.'




