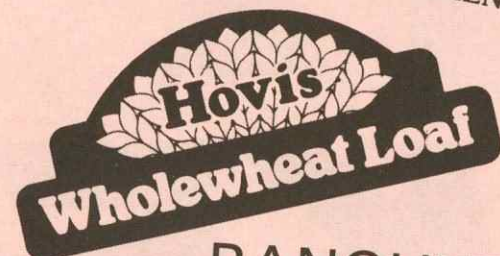

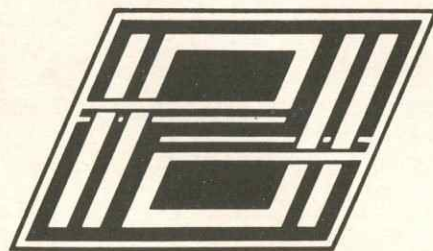

MY VIEW



'I was pleased for our many travelling supporters'

After giving Paul Dyson an early morning fitness test, and having a good look at the Luton pitch, I decided on a team talk at the hotel, allowing the lads to have plenty of time to decide on footwear, as the surface was going to be very difficult. Selecting the right team is obviously open to debate, but Huddy and Ian Painter had shown enough in the Reserves to merit coming back, and I decided to move Maskery into the left-back position, leaving Steve Parkin in midfield — so we were ready to go!

WE SETTLED QUICKLY

There was a bubbly atmosphere in the dressing room, and I felt, as at Coventry, we started well, forcing a couple of corners; one leading to a fine flick on by Brendan and Keith Bertschin just stabbing wide. We had settled quickly with Hudson, Parkin and McIlroy getting hold and making us play. At the back O'Callaghan and Dyson were defending tremendously in front of a more confident Roberts, and the full-backs Maskery and Bould were always willing to get forward. The front players worked hard with Sealey coming out to foil Painter, while at the other end Roberts saved from Harford, and Moss and Hill missed the target with efforts.

IN THE LEAD

After the break they put us under real pressure for the first time and the lads responded well, matching them where it mattered — in our box. Harford went close with a header, and Dyson cleared magnificently from Stein with Roberts beaten. However, we were determined not to just sit back, and a fine ball by Painter gave Sammy McIlroy an opportunity, and Bertschin had a header saved as we showed good character and came more into the game. Young Ian Painter burst through, but his shot was well saved by Sealey. However, with 12 minutes remaining he clinically finished off a Maskery, Chamberlain move to give us the lead. Unfortunately, big Bren had been stretchered off concussed minutes before, and I feel it disrupted the shape of our back four. With minutes remaining fine work by Stein led to Foster driving the equaliser into the roof of the net. The thrills were still not over, and with seconds remaining, Huddy headed off the line following a Luton corner, and gave us the chance to go into 'the hat'.

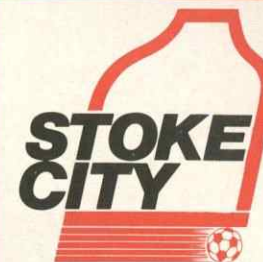
WELCOME TO LUTON

20 Stoke invite two internationals from Denmark and Iceland for trials after their contracts expire in New Year.

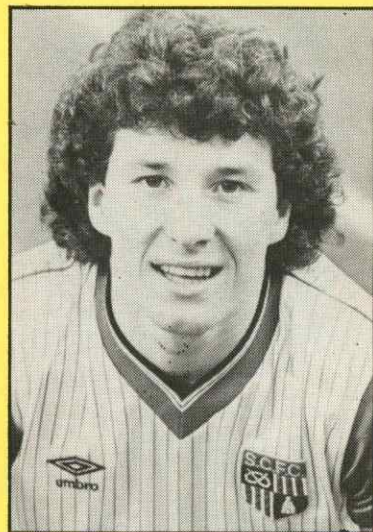
21 Carl Saunders gets a recall at left-back against Sheffield Wednesday tomorrow but Ian Painter is ruled out.

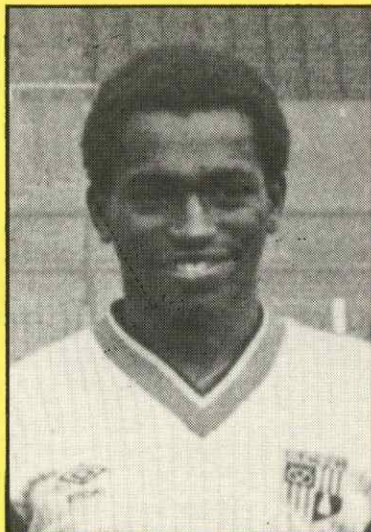
23 Sunday call for players in a free-for-all discussion.

26 Holiday training stints pay off as Stoke hit back to beat United 2-1 with Carl Saunders emerging as the Boxing Day hero having one shot handled for a penalty that Ian Painter hammers home and another scorches into the top corner for the 75th minute winner. 'The greatest moment of my life,' says Carl, who stood in for Bould at right-back. Joe Corrigan bids farewell at end of his two month's loan spell as he returns to Brighton.

27 Apprentice 'keeper Stuart Roberts recalled from his holiday break to prepare for Saturday's game with Queens Park Rangers after Mr Asprey's efforts to loan Mervyn Day (Aston Villa) and Jim Arnold (Everton) are rejected.

29 Goals by Robbie James and Mike Fillery in opening half hour place QPR firmly on top in 2-0 success as Stoke fail to continue Christmas form. Manager Bill Asprey said: 'We had more of the ball in wide positions but we never produced the type of crosses we needed. But we are going to claw, hack and scrape our way out of trouble and anyone who wants to throw in the towel will be shown the door quickly.'

31 Manager Asprey arrives early but complains of chest pains and is advised to see his doctor after being driven home. Medical verdict is 'Mental and physical exhaustion.' Peter Fox gets go-ahead to resume training in gradual build-up.

JANUARY

1 Tony Lacey takes charge of first team affairs but Stoke go down 4-0 to Coventry City at Highfield Road in a disappointing game. Mr Lacey says: 'You must always be optimistic especially with three points at stake each match. I am confident we can improve in certain areas but the first two goals shattered the side after a fairly bright start.'

2 George Berry gets two-match ban. Mr Asprey improves but is advised to cut down on his work load.

3 Trialist goalkeeper Paul McCullough, who has played in America and Sweden, impresses in Central League test against Sheffield Wednesday.

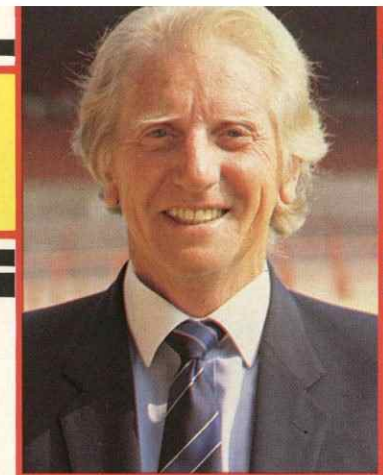

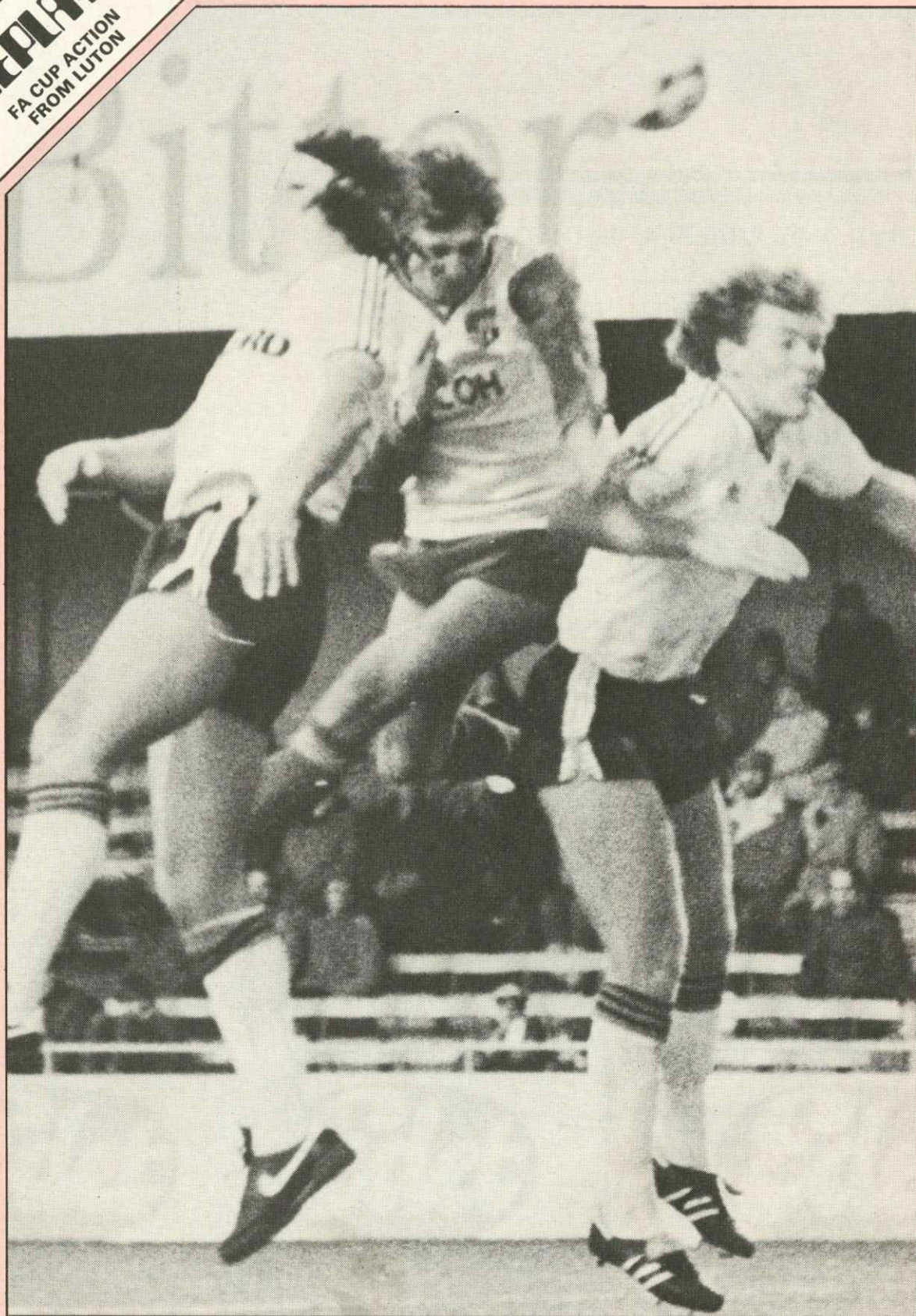

One of the few promising features of the club in these troubled weeks has been the nearing full fitness of our midfield maestro, last season's bargain buy Alan Hudson.

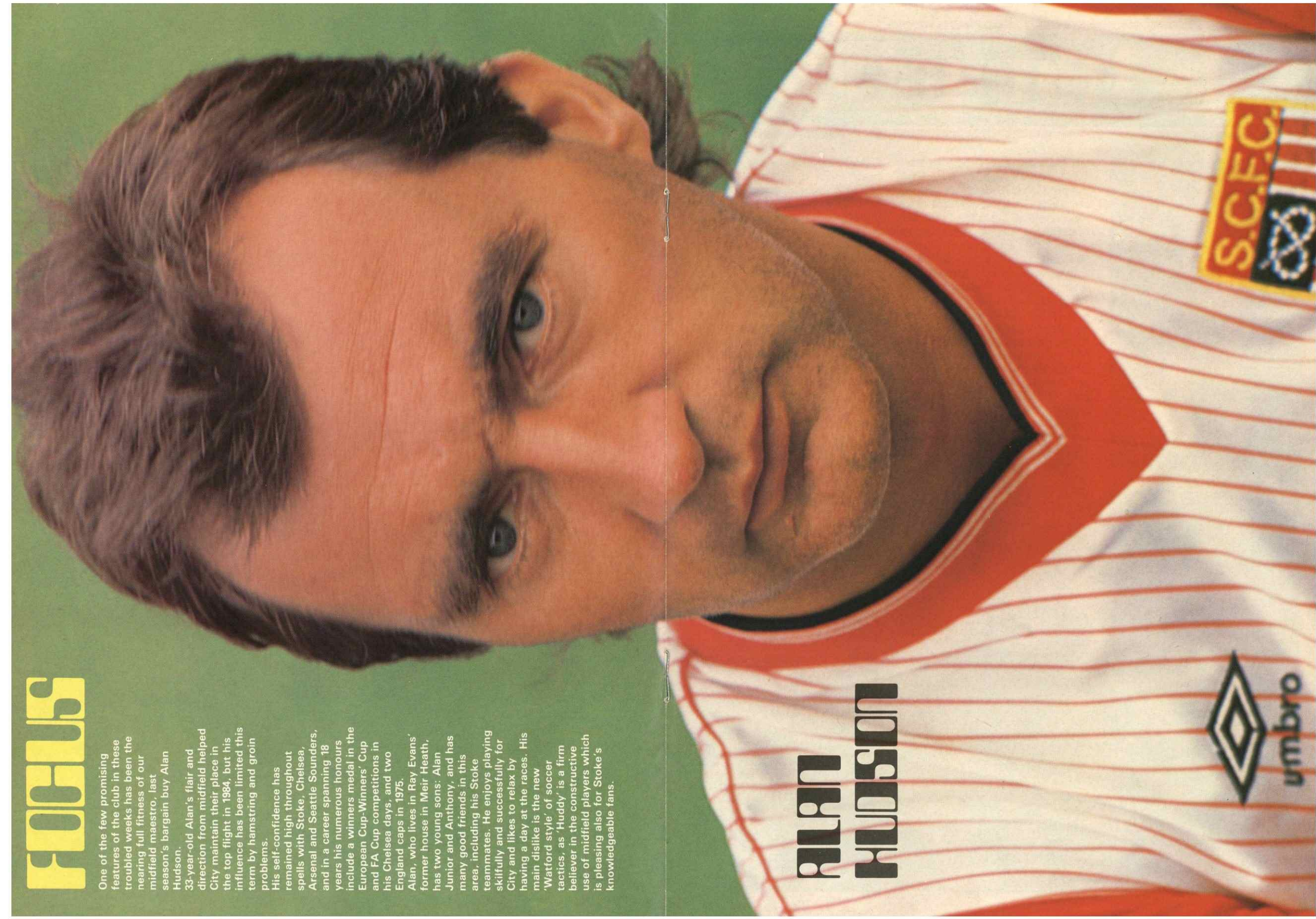
33-year-old Alan's flair and direction from midfield helped City maintain their place in the top flight in 1984, but his influence has been limited this term by hamstring and groin problems.

His self-confidence has remained high throughout spells with Stoke, Chelsea, Arsenal and Seattle Sounders, and in a career spanning 18 years his numerous honours include a winners medal in the European Cup-Winners' Cup and FA Cup competitions in his Chelsea days, and two England caps in 1975.

Alan, who lives in Ray Evans' former house in Meir Heath, has two young sons: Alan Junior and Anthony, and has many good friends in this area, including his Stoke teammates. He enjoys playing skilfully and successfully for City and likes to relax by having a day at the races. His main dislike is the new

'Watford style' of soccer tactics, as 'Huddy' is a firm believer in the constructive use of midfield players which is pleasing also for Stoke's knowledgeable fans.

Introducing....

Luton pay us their first-ever FA Cup visit at a time when they have joined us in the relegation zone after a recent run of seven defeats in eight away games. They are, however, an attractive and talented side who win or lose tend to provide the sort of entertainment that fans delight in.

Founded in 1885 the 'Hatters' became the first team in the south of England to turn professional when they did so in 1890. They had a short spell in Division Two from 1897 to 1900 before returning to the Southern League and waiting for the foundation of Division Three in 1920 before returning to the Football League.

They climbed into Division Two in 1937 and then in 1955 reached Division One for the first time ever. Four years later they reached the FA Cup Final for their one and only time, going down 2-0 to Nottingham Forest at Wembley, but decline set in almost immediately afterwards. They slipped to Division Two in 1960, to Division Three in 1963 and to Division Four in 1965 to become only the second team (Brentford were the first) to slip all the way from Division One to Division Four.

To their credit they climbed back up to Division One by 1974, but stayed up for only one season in the midst of severe

financial problems. Again they weathered the storm and in 1981-82 they topped Division Two by a clear eight points, losing only four games all season.

In their first season back in Division One they held on to their place after a rare old scramble, finally getting clear of danger when winning 1-0 at Maine Road in their very last game to send Manchester City down. Then last season they were as high as third at Christmas, having won 4-2 here in the midst of a good run, but then came only three wins in their last 23 games and a final position of 16th. A feature of their season was their seven away wins so that 25 of their 51

points were picked up away from home.

THIS SEASON

This season they picked up only two points from their next seven League games after the opening day win over us, but then came a win at QPR and a Milk Cup success over Leicester to add to a home win over Watford. After a spate of drawn games at Kenilworth Road they have recently beaten Aston Villa and Coventry and South African BRIAN STEIN (over 100 League and Cup goals for the club) has been in good scoring form recently.

Midlander FRANKIE BUNN,

who netted against us on the opening day, is also likely to be up front today together with long-serving former Swindon man DAVID MOSS. New signings MICK HARFORD from Birmingham up front and DAVID PREECE from Walsall in midfield are others to look out for today together with young midfielder RAY DANIEL, who recently netted against Coventry.

RICKY HILL has of course been capped by England in mid-field while in defence TIM BREACKER and WAYNE TURNER are local lads on the flanks with new man STEVE FOSTER (ex-Brighton and Aston Villa) and Northern Ireland cap MAL DONAGHY in the centre and ex-Coventry man LES SEALEY in his second season in goal.

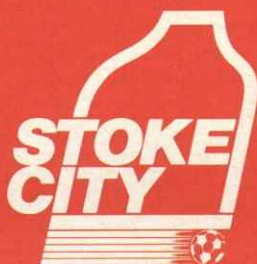
