
I am still confident we can only improve with fourteen games to go — much can happen.

Ossie Ardiles returned to the side after a long absence through injury and celebrated his return by scoring in the 39th minute. Wallace equalised for Southampton three minutes into the second half but the home fans were not silenced for long. Glenn Hoddle restored the lead with a twenty yards shot and further goals from Falco, Crooks and Brooke saw Spurs into second place in the League table.

Leaders Everton took three deserved points by beating Arsenal at Goodison Park and took another step towards their treble ambitions. Andy Gray returned to the side and scored after 27 minutes. Neville Southall, one of the key men in their tremendous season, made two fine saves to preserve their lead and in the dying seconds Graham

Sharpe made the points safe.

Gary Lineker broke the deadlock just seven minutes from time to send West Ham nearer the relegation zone. The Leicester striker had earlier missed three good chances but his header from an Alan Smith cross gave Leicester the points they deserved. However, despite City having most of the possession it could have been a different story had not Ian Andrews made great saves from Tony Cottee and Paul Allen.

Mick Harford's aerial power brought three precious points for Luton over Queens Park Rangers in their battle to retain First Division status. His first came after 27 minutes when he rounded off Emeka Nwajiobi's skilful run with a downward header which gave Peter Hucker no chance. Then in the sixty-second minute he rose majestically to head home a David Preece corner. Although Rangers battled throughout the game they were never a match for a Luton side in the determined mood.

Liverpool handed out a warning to the top clubs not to rule them out of the Championship race. Steve Nicol started the scoring after only six minutes, then Kenny Dalglish added the second eleven minutes into the second half. The match then became the John Wark show. The former Ipswich mid-fielder scored his third hat-trick for the Reds with strikes in the 64th, 70th and 82nd minutes. West Bromwich goalkeeper Tony Godden made many fine saves but as Liverpool manager Joe Fagan said after the match: 'I just let my team do the talking'.

Aston Villa felt the backlash of Manchester United's UEFA Cup exit with Mark Hughes their chief tormentor. The Welsh striker kept his promise to make up for his costly penalty miss in Hungary but scoring a magnificent hat-trick. Norman Whiteside relishing

his new midfield role moved forward in the 53rd minute to score United's fourth.

Ipswich were grateful for a point in the end but really needed all three against Newcastle whose form of late has been erratic. An injury to Chris Waddle meant a chance for Neil McDonald in the Geordies attack and he took it by putting the visitors ahead in the 54th minute. Then with only three minutes to go Eric Gates scored his first goal since New Year's Day to earn the East Anglian side a point.

Struggling Stoke paid for a 40th minute penalty miss which would have sent them in on level terms at half time. They went ahead with their first League goal of the year after 10 minutes when midfielder Steve Parkin turned in Bertschin's cross. Forest responded with headed goals from Hodge (27) and Hart (37). After Painter's miss from the penalty spot, Brian Clough's men took full advantage with further goals from Riley and Davenport.

Coventry manager Don Mackay missed the game with flu but this result will have made him feel better. Terry Gibson opened the scoring in the eighth minute and added his seventeenth goal of the season after 32 minutes. Watford could hardly believe their bad luck after making all the running, and there was more misery to come as Micky Adams added a third just three minutes from half time. Kenny Jackett had a goal disallowed in the second half and Luther Blissett scored the consolation goal for the Hornets just four minutes from the end.

IPSWICH TOWN



So near . . . yet so far. That could well sum up Ipswich Town's season to date. Twice within a whisker of Wembley but now facing a battle to preserve their First Division status in the League.

It's been very much a tale of fighting for points in the League while advancing to the semi-finals of the Milk Cup and the quarter-final stages of the FA Cup. Norwich in the former and Everton in a sixth round FA Cup replay put paid to Town's Cup hopes and left Bobby Ferguson and his side knowing exactly where the priorities lie over the remaining weeks of the season as they strive for First Division survival.

If Ipswich need any inspiration then they can look back to the same stage 12 months ago when from a position of almost certain relegation, Town reeled off an eight match unbeaten run to eventually climb well clear of the drop.

In fact that run, that included a win at Manchester United and a draw at Liverpool, finally took Ipswich to 12th in the table — nearer a place in Europe than relegation. But how the Suffolk side must be hoping for a repeat between now and the early part of May.

A draw against Newcastle at Portman Road last Saturday left Town second from bottom, two points behind Luton and today's Kenilworth Road meeting obviously has an important significance for both teams.

Ipswich have tended to struggle all season away from home, only one away success so far and just eight goals put into the opposition net on their travels.

Yet playing away held no worries for the team in the Cup. In the Milk Cup Ipswich won replays at Newcastle and

Queens Park Rangers in convincing style while in the FA competition they led Cup holders Everton at Goodison Park for a long spell before conceding a late equaliser and then bowing out to a penalty in the replay.

Their one League success away from Portman Road so far was a 2-0 win at Stoke. That apart, their only points from 14 games have come from four draws.

Problems started to pile up for the club towards the end of 1984 when they lost eight of their last nine League games in the year and failed to score in any of the eight defeats.

Manager Ferguson looked for a remedy by signing Derby County striker Kevin Wilson for a reported £150,000 fee. Wilson, originally spotted by Derby playing in non-League football, had scored 13 times in 15 games for the Baseball Ground club before a broken arm kept him on the sidelines.


It's still early days yet but Wilson came up with a couple of goals in Town's FA Cup run and seems to be fitting the bill alongside South African born Mitch D'Avray.

Town's leading scorer so far though is the experienced Eric Gates, who started the season with a burst of goals . . . eight in his first 11 games. There's more proven scoring potential provided by Alan Sunderland who made a permanent move to East Anglia last summer after a spell on loan from Arsenal while ex-West Bromwich midfielder Romeo Zondervan has also found the net on a regular basis in recent months although to date, four of his five scores have been in the Cups.

Apart from Gates, Scottish full-back George Burley and England defender Terry Butcher, the only remaining link

with the side Bobby Robson built into one of the best in the League not too long ago, is goalkeeper Paul Cooper.

He has been with Ipswich for more than 10 years now and remains first choice in goal although when he was forced to miss the recent Everton replay because of injury, former Albion and Leicester 'keeper Mark Grew deputised.

The reliable Burley at right-back with Steve McCall at three is Town's normal full-back pairing although skipper Butcher has also worn the left-back shirt on occasions this season. He's better known though as one of the best central defenders in the business, and an automatic choice in the England side.

Another England back-four man, Russell Osman has not been first choice in recent weeks. He has a challenger in England Under-21 player Ian Cranson while there's plenty of youngsters pushing for midfield berths alongside Zondervan including Trevor Putney, Mark Brennan and McCall who can play further forward when Butcher slots into the left-back role.

Wilson, D'Avray and Gates with Sunderland switching between midfield and attack provide the power up front and a player tipped for big things in the future is Jason Dozzell, an England Youth striker who broke into the first team reckoning around Christmas.

Easter could have an important bearing on deciding the relegation issue but today's game has all the makings of a 'six pointer' with Ipswich, no doubt, hoping that they'll soon start to put together a run like the one that took them clear of trouble last season.
