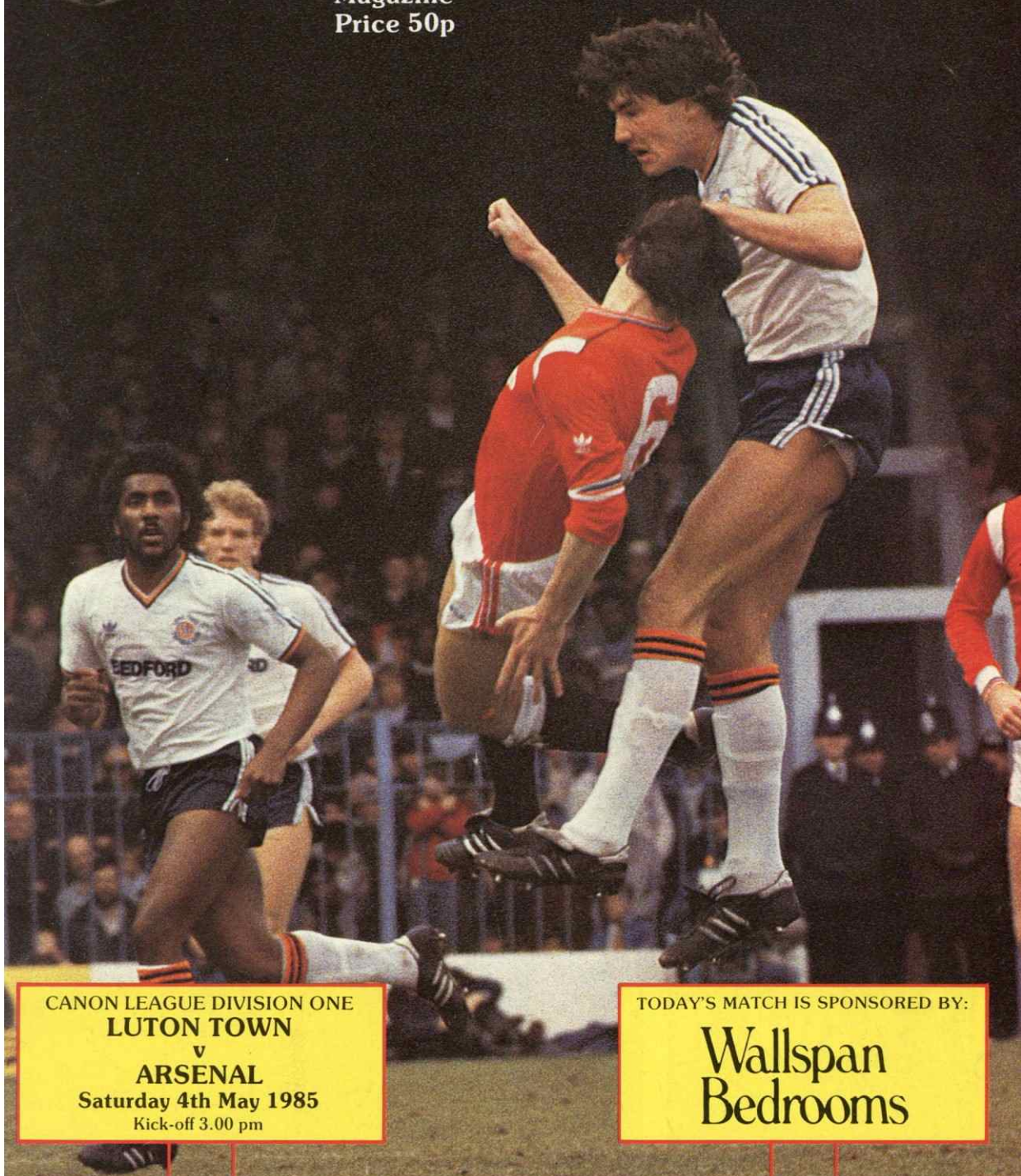

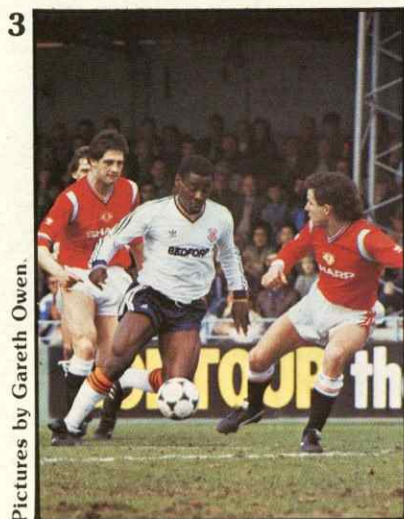

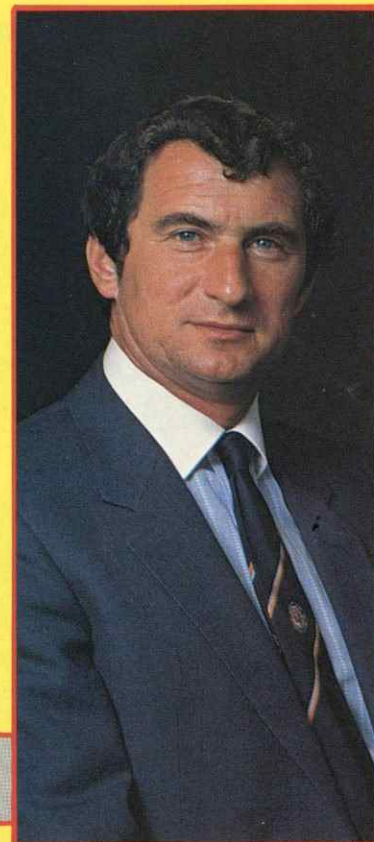

A second-half equaliser by Pat Nevin was the outstanding moment of a drab London derby. Spurs who seem happier playing away from home went into the lead after 10 minutes when Tony Galvin put them in front and nearly went further in front when a delightful chip from Glen Hoddle struck the bar.

Everton ended Norwich's impressive record at Goodison Park by winning 3-0 and now need just one more victory to clinch the Championship. Norwich were unbeaten on Merseyside since 1977 and they frustrated the Champions elect until Derek Mountfield gave Everton the lead just before half-time. Trevor Stevens made it two, just three minutes in the second-half and Paul Bracewell punished a Steve Bruce mistake to make it three, eight minutes later.

Luton had goalkeeper Les Sealey to thank for their point against West Ham at Upton Park, pulling off a string of great saves. Tony Cottee of West Ham and Luton's Brian Stein both could have won the points for their clubs but it was a match which was obviously a strain for both clubs badly needing the points was never a great spectacle.

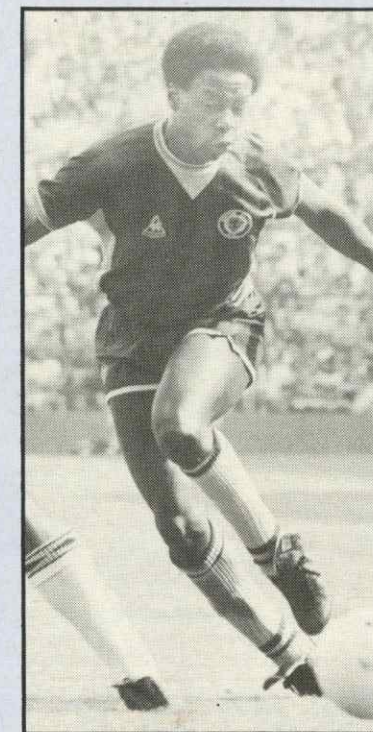
Ipswich survive to take a point off Liverpool at Portman Road but could have been made to suffer. Ronnie Whelan missed Liverpool's best chance out of the large number they had, missing the goal completely with only Cooper to beat.

Coventry City survived a score at home to West Bromwich Albion to hit back and take the three points. Steve MacKenzie's 25 yarder put Albion in front before Peter Barnes levelled against his old club. Kenny

Hibbitt kept City's hopes of survival open with the winner.

Southampton's bid for a place in Europe was hit at St James' Park where George Reilly and Kenny Wharton netted after Jimmy Case had put the Saints into the lead.

A superb goal from Gary Lineker, his 25th of the season was enough to give Leicester City the points at home to Nottingham Forest.

Arsenal had Paul Mariner to thank for keeping them on course for Europe with the only goal at Highbury against Sheffield Wednesday. The 88th minute winner was just reward for the Gunners.

Aston Villa coming strongly at the end of the season walloped Queens Park Rangers 5-2 with Paul Rideout and Peter Withe getting two goals each. Withe's opening goal was his first for the club in 24 games. Mark Walters made it five while the Rangers' goals came from Gary Bannister.

Watford made it yet another miserable day for doomed Stoke City at Vicarage Road by winning by 2-0. In a scrappy game Luther Blissett put the home side in front from the penalty spot and Kenny Jackett hit the second.

Sunderland who are fighting for First Division survival earned themselves a precious point at Old Trafford. The Cup Finalist went a goal up after five minutes when Brian Robson scored but Nick Pickering equalised 10 minutes later. Norman Whiteside missed a penalty for United when his shot hit the post before Clive Walker put the Wearsiders in front only for Kevin Moran to level the score with just 15 minutes of the match left.

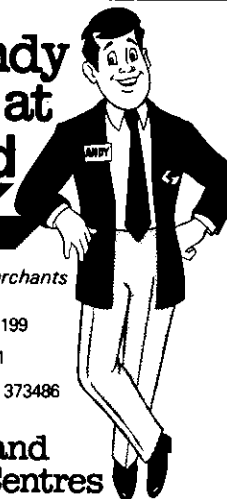

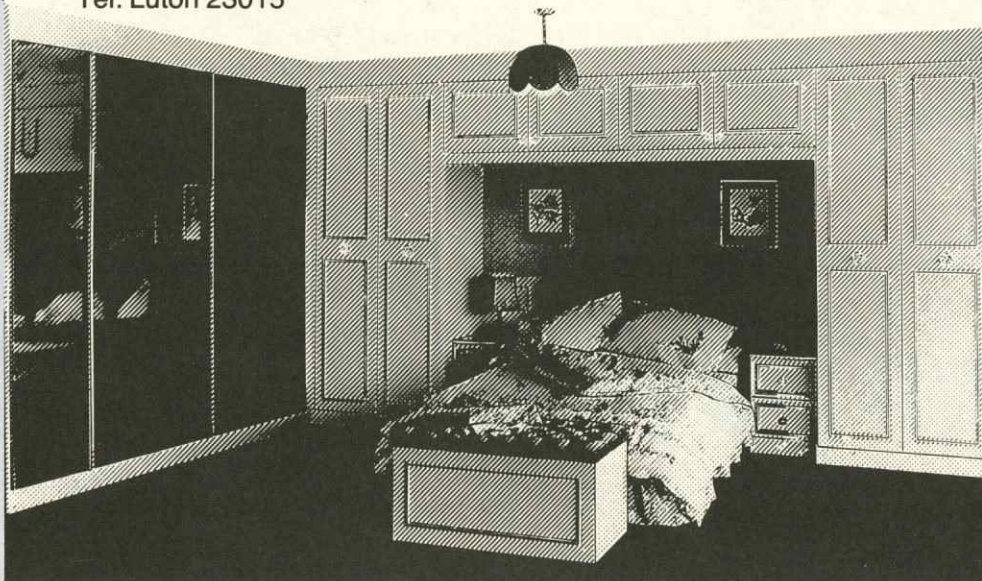

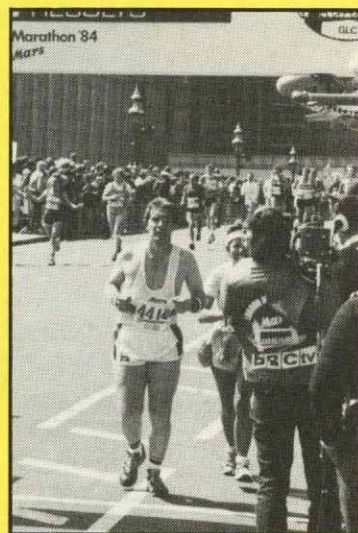

By their own high standards, Arsenal are coming to the end of a disappointing season. Although they still have hopes of a place in next season's UEFA Cup, the Gunners' challenge for the title faded in mid-campaign and their FA Cup hopes crashed in the last minute of a fourth round tie at York.

So manager Don Howe, nearing the end of his first full season in charge at Highbury, will have plenty of reflection during the summer.

The Gunners were many people's tip for the title a few months ago and their form over the early weeks suggested they had the potential to lift the League crown.

Arsenal topped the table in October after winning eight of their first 11 games but then came a bad spell, three defeats in a week and heavy defeats too at West Ham and Manchester United plus a Milk Cup exit at Oxford.

Since then the side has never quite recaptured its early season form although an away win in the North London derby at Tottenham a few weeks ago went some way to making up for the disappointing slide down the table from title challengers to UEFA Cup hopefuls.

In the New Year manager Howe tried to arrest the slump by signing England midfielder player Steve Williams from Southampton for a fee reported to be in excess of £500,000. That makes the Gunners current representation of England

players five and such is the strength of the squad on paper that Arsenal can put out an all international line up of some description from England Under-21 keeper John Lukic, now first choice over Pat Jennings, through to Scotland's Charlie Nicholas at 11.

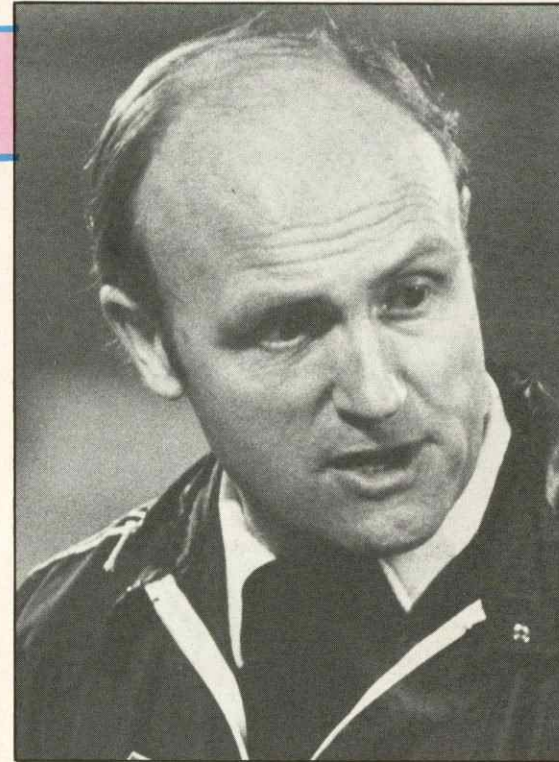
Lukic, signed from Leeds two seasons ago, got a regular place in the team back in December and is highly rated by Howe who got to know the Chesterfield-born youngster when he was on the Elland Road coaching staff a few years ago.

Viv Anderson and Kenny Sansom are both England full-backs who are important members of Bobby Robson's World Cup squad with Eire choice David O'Leary partnering ex-Manchester City defender Tommy Caton at the centre of the defence.

There's been a place in the side though this season for 18-year-old England Youth defender Tony Adams who was named in England's Under-21 squad recently.

Williams' arrival at Highbury has threatened Brian Talbot's midfield berth, although the former Ipswich man and present PFA chairman is still an important member of the Highbury set up and has lost none of the energy and enthusiasm that won him six full caps while at Portman Road.

The enigmatic Nicholas is coming to the end of his second season in London after his highly publicised move from

Celtic and it's a sign of Arsenal's strength that they also have England Under-21 man Stewart Robson and Graham Rix in contention for midfield places although Rix has spent a long spell out with injury in the last few months.

Paul Davis, too, has won England Under-21 honours and up front they don't come much more experienced at League or international level than Tony Woodcock and Paul Mariner.

Both are still very much a part of Bobby Robson's planning and recently there's been a suggestion of a new role for Mariner, as a centre-half.

One of the brightest aspects of Arsenal's season has been the emergence of Ian Allinson on the First Division scene. He was a free transfer signing from Colchester United last summer because of an administration slip by the Fourth Division club and he has done well when given his first team chance and scored seven goals in a nine match spell earlier in the season.

Former Highbury apprentice Raphael Meade is another youngster who has shown he is capable of scoring goals at the highest level while Pat Jennings, although overshadowed by Lukic in recent months, remains Northern Ireland's automatic choice in goal and was due to have added to his 100 plus caps in midweek in the World Cup qualifier with Turkey.

Arsenal completed a League double over Luton last season, Sansom and Woodcock scoring their goals here in a 2-1 win. The Gunners would no doubt settle for a similar outcome this afternoon in their bid to return to Europe next season.

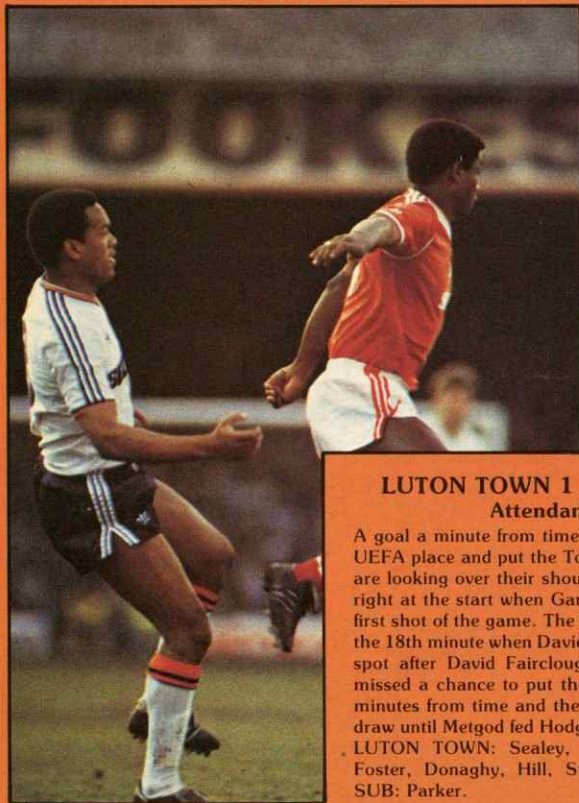

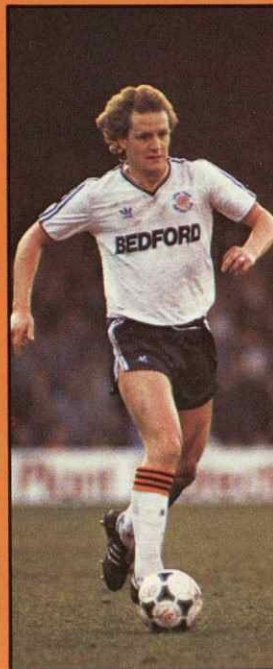
