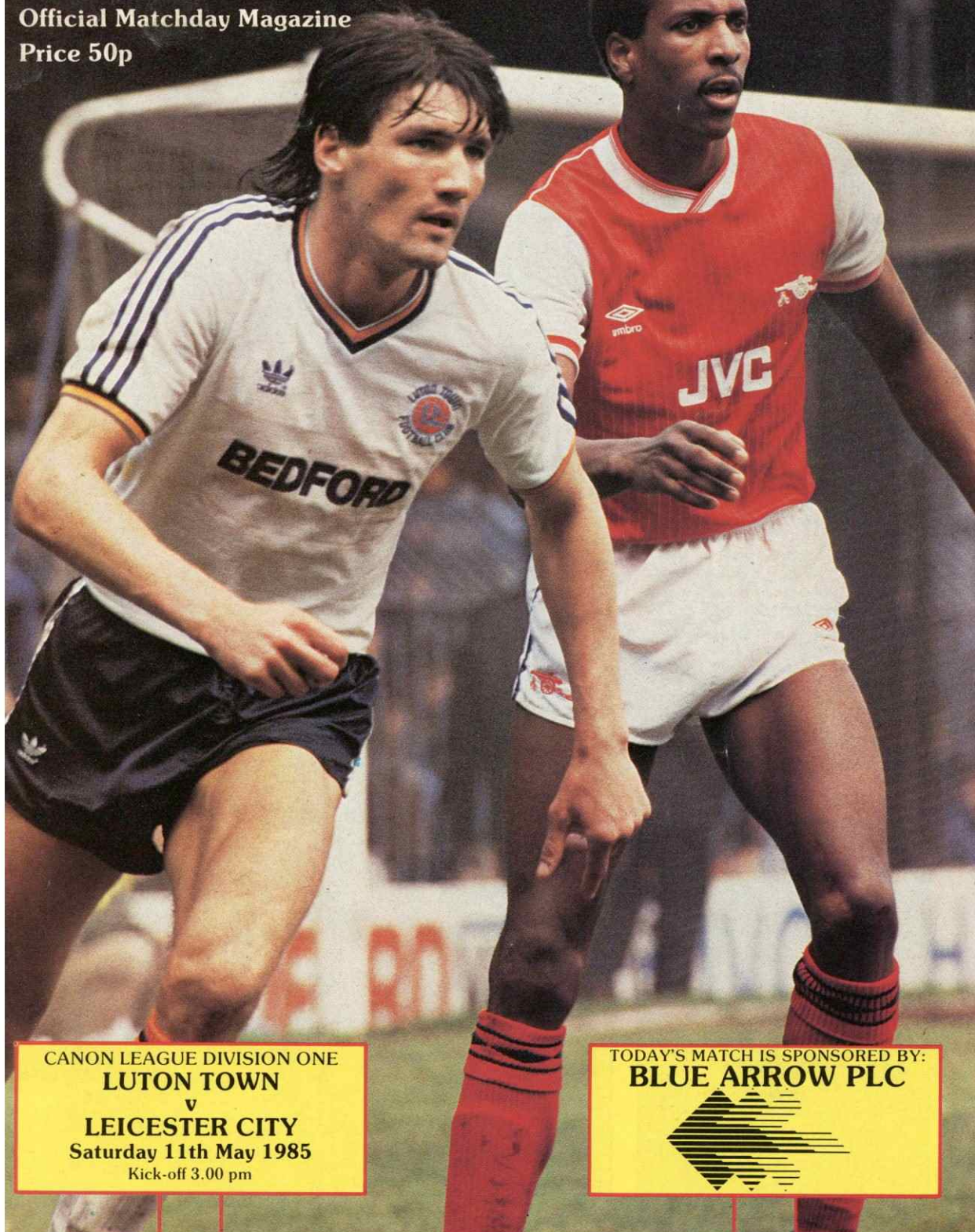

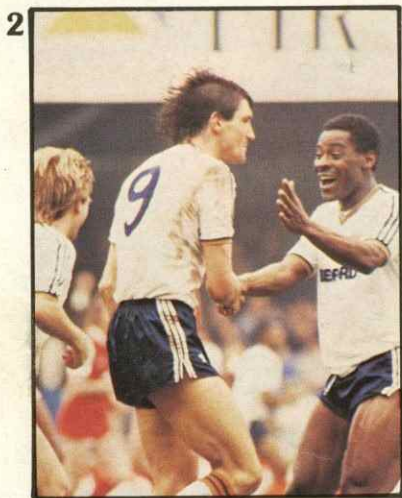

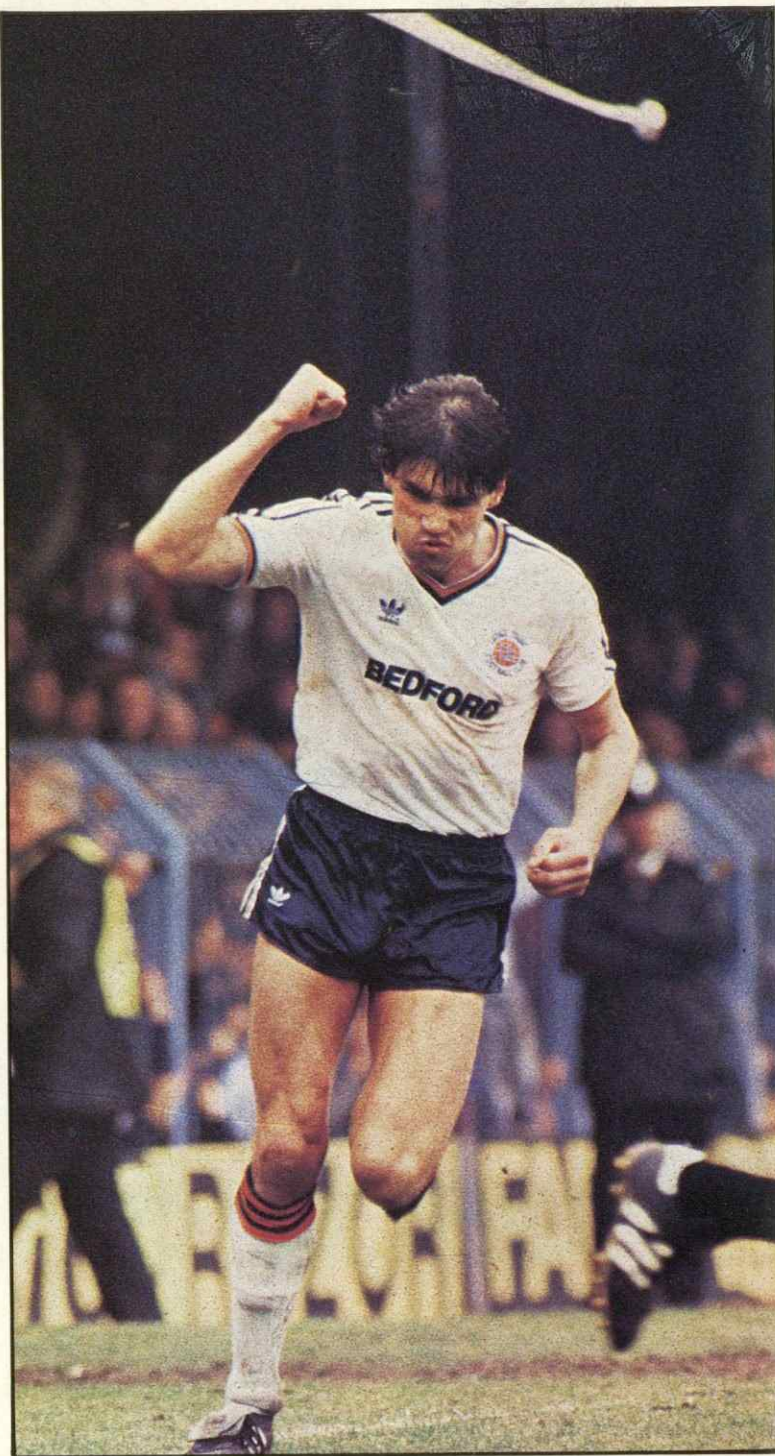


## HATTERS 3 GUNNERS 1

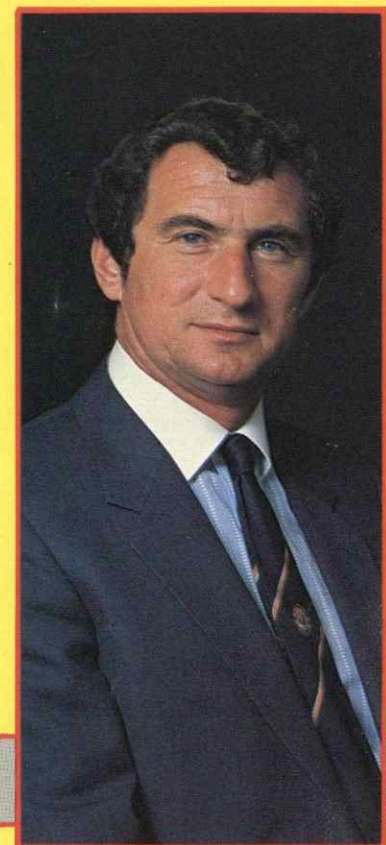
It is a time to remember and record the achievements of some of our players both past and present this season. We still have two outstanding games at Coventry and at home to Everton who we congratulate on the League Championship.

It could be that Peter Shreeves the Tottenham manager will be signing the Denmark captain Morten Olsen for next season. When questioned on the subject he replied 'There are a few things to be sorted out yet and I put the chances of signing him as 50-50.' Olsen himself was reported to have said in Brussels last week 'I am 99.9 per cent certain to sign for Tottenham. My main concern is that I am happy playing as a sweeper and I hope to play in that role for Tottenham.' If he does sign then it could mean a white Hart Lane upheaval to make room for the Anderlecht star player. We will have to wait with baited breath for the outcome.

With Mick Mills leaving Southampton next season it looks certain that England goalkeeper Peter Shilton will take over the captain's role. Manager Lawrie McMenemy is full of admiration for his goalkeeper and says 'If I had a short list Peter would be on it, but I will leave making the decision on the captaincy until the start of the new season not at the end of an old one.'

Arsenal are the latest club to show interest in Fulham's brilliant England Under-21 defender Paul Parker. Manager Don Howe has watched Parker in recent weeks and Fulham manager Ray Harford admits 'The big boys are lining up. Paul will be the hottest property of the summer and I could struggle to keep him.' Other clubs interested are said to include Liverpool, Tottenham and Queens Park Rangers. Sunderland are another club who have a star defender in great demand. Nick Pickering had a good match recently in Romania and now the Rokerites are relegated, they will be hard pressed to keep him.

Gary Mills who has broken both legs in two years has been offered a new three-year contract by Nottingham Forest after proving his fitness with three goals in recent matches.

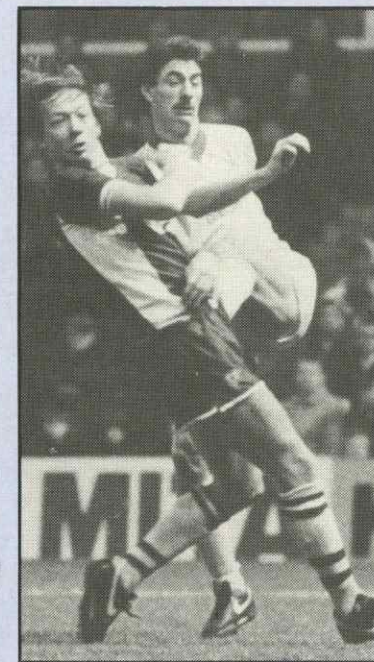
Newcastle's England ace Chris Waddle looks like leaving St James' Park at the end of the season. He has turned down a five-figure sum to stay but Waddle said 'I have given Newcastle five good years and I think good value but I believe that now is the right time to move on.' Tottenham are favourites to sign the brilliant 24-year-old forward having already lodged a £500,000 bid with the North East club.

Russell Osman, Ipswich's former England central-defender, has been told that he can leave Portman Road. He has shouldered his fair share of criticism this season and he believes that a move could resurrect his career elsewhere. Osman said 'I have been here for 10 years and feel a change will do me

good.' Manager Bobby Ferguson said 'Russell has been a good servant to us. He has made nearly 400 appearances but has been unsettled for some time as Ian Cranson and Irvin Gernon have pushed for a first team place.' Nottingham Forest are reported to be keeping an eye on the situation.

Another solid display from League leaders Everton ensured the Championship as they extended their unbeaten run to 26 games thanks to a goal from Andy Gray. They were only the second team to win at Hillsborough this season.

Kevin Moran pushed Norwich City deeper into the relegation area with a goal for Manchester United in the 34th minute at Carrow Road. Although the Canaries battled bravely they couldn't break down a United defence in which Paul McGrath was outstanding. Ian Rush hit his 23rd goal of the season as Liverpool overcame Chelsea by four goals to three.

The Reds were two goals up after 11 minutes thanks to a Ronnie Whelan header and an angled drive from Steve Nichol. Nigel Spackman pulled a goal back from the penalty spot but Nichol struck again 10 minutes later. Kerry Dixon made it 3-2 just after the interval before Rush got his goal. Davies set up a thrilling finish with Chelsea's third goal in the 70th minute.

Tottenham scored a victory in front of their own supporters for the first time in five games after Coventry had battled back to level terms after being two down. Goals from Falco in the 20th minute and Glen Hoddle in the 54th minute looked to have put Spurs firmly in control but a 61st minute penalty by Pearce gave the City new heart and former Spurs player Terry Gibson equalised but the home side hit back with a classic curling shot from Hughton and a second from Falco in the final minute.

Nottingham Forest and Watford shared the points at the City ground and a goal from Brian Clough's son Nigel kept their hopes alive of playing in Europe next season. His goal came five minutes from the end. Watford went in front in the 28th minute through new signing Colin West.

Luton Town did themselves a power of good in their efforts to climb away from the danger zone with a fine win over Arsenal at Kenilworth Road. Mick Harford was again on form scoring twice. His first came in the opening minute of the game and when Arsenal goalkeeper John Lukic fouled Brian Stein he put the penalty kick away with ease. Emeka Nwajobi scored the Town's other goal with Charlie Nicholas netting for the Gunners from the penalty spot.

Goals galore at Loftus Road where Queens Park Rangers beat Leicester City four goals to three whilst at the Dell, Southampton added to Ipswich's troubles by winning by three goals without reply. Stoke City's run of bad luck continued as an own goal from O'Callaghan saw them go down again at home this time to Newcastle United.

Not such good news for the other Georgie side Sunderland as Aston Villa gave them a four goals to nil thrashing at Roker Park, and at the Hawthorns West Bromwich Albion put West Ham United deep in trouble with a five one home victory.

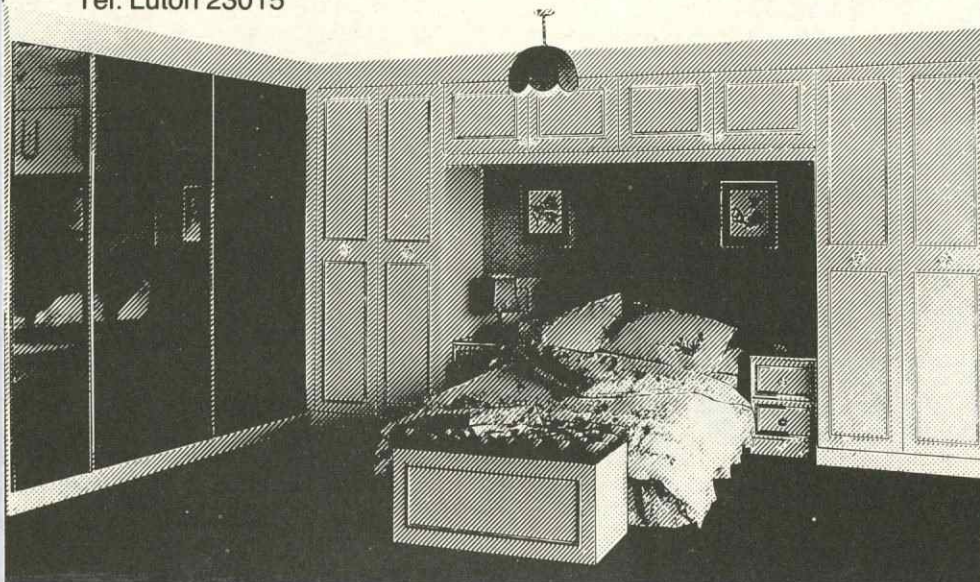

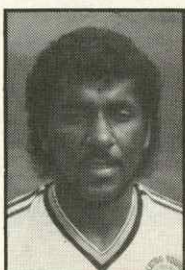

## OBITUARIES

Mr B. G. (Bert) England, a well known local personality and successful business man who had been associated with Luton Town Football Club for many years died suddenly on the 23rd April whilst on holiday in France.

He was 86 years-of-age, and had been a shareholder of the Football Club since 1962. He was a Director of the club from 1964 to 1968 and became an Honorary Vice-President in 1976 in recognition of his past services. He was a keen supporter and regularly attended both the First and Reserves team games. The last match he witnessed was the Town's FA Challenge Cup semi-final v Everton at Villa Park. His elder brother, Fred, was a former Chairman of Luton Town FC.

With the passing of Bert England the Hatters have lost a loyal friend and long serving supporter.

We regret to announce the death of one of our most staunch supporters, John Brent, who died in Belgium aged 79.

John lived in Luton for many years before moving to Brussels, where he had business interests, after the last war. A former director of Belgian club Royal Crossing, John was instrumental in negotiating the early stages of the transfer which took Peter Anderson to the Continental club.

John's interest in Luton Town FC never waned and he frequently made trips to England to watch us play. When we were involved in games on the Continent, John had a wealth of friends within the game and had a tremendous knowledge of every player's record in all four divisions of the Football League.

He was a very good friend of the club and we will miss his association with us.

For this game at Cheshunt we introduced two trialists, David Dance, a left-back from Perranporth and David Spark, a right-winger from Newquay. We started very uncertainly in defence, our back-four allowing themselves to be strung out on a very big pitch. However, we took the lead when Kingsley Black, over on the right, curled a left foot centre into the six-yard box. Sean Farrell couldn't reach it but wrong footed the goalkeeper and the ball carried on into the far side-netting.

Almost immediately John Wright made a brilliant save from a penalty awarded when Duncan Berry floored a Spurs forward in full flight for goal. John made another equally fine save soon afterwards and gradually we began to take control. Almost on half-time Sean Farrell capped some fine approach play with a bullet like header from Kingsley Black's fiercely struck inswinging corner. So we went in at half-time with a somewhat fortunate two goal lead. The game started at a hot pace on a very sandy Ipswich pitch, which had been played on the previous evening.

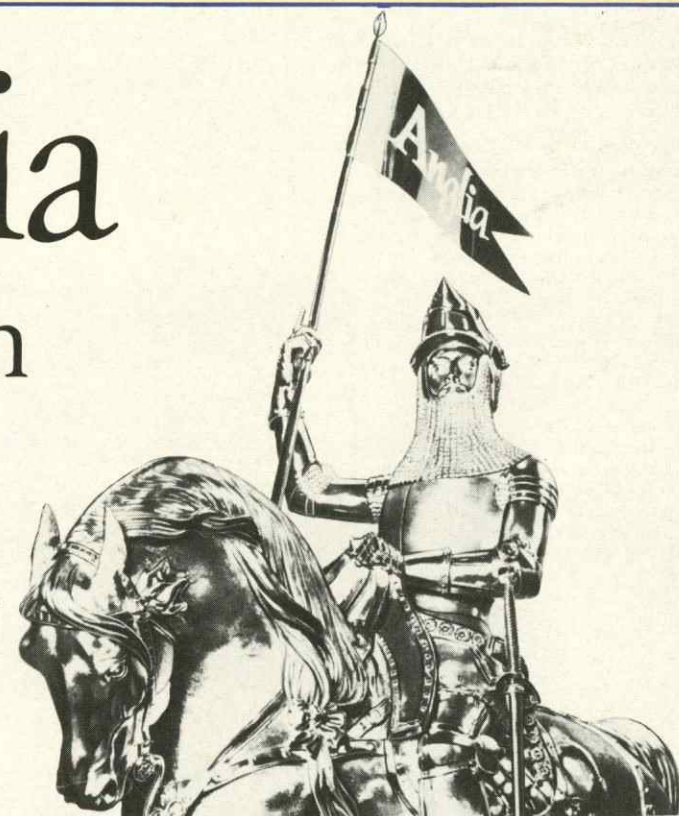

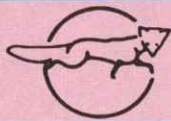




# OUR VISITORS



## LEICESTER CITY



At one stage this season Leicester had their eyes focused on a possible place in Europe for next season. But that all changed when the Filbert Street club lost five games in a row to slump on to the fringe of the relegation zone.

Wins at Norwich and at home to Forest recently have improved City's position but that run of defeats, including home losses against Liverpool and Tottenham Hotspur around Easter time, underlined the inconsistency of Gordon Milne's team.

Leicester were in action at Kenilworth Road earlier in the season in the Milk Cup and although they went out of that competition, they had high hopes of a good run in the FA Cup after wins against non-League Burton and then Carlisle took them into the fifth round without too many problems.

They crashed out of the fifth round at Millwall though and seemed content on settling for a mid-table position, with Europe a slim possibility before that slump last month.

Manager Milne will no doubt be hoping that City can find more consistency next season and that star England striker Gary Lineker will still be on the Filbert Street scene.

Lineker has emerged in the last few seasons as one of the game's top young strikers, winning his first cap as sub against Scotland last season and making a scoring full debut against Eire a couple of months ago.

His contract runs out this season and there's been a good deal of speculation about his future with Tottenham and both Merseyside

giants reported to be watching developments with more than a passing interest.

The player himself has said publicly that he has not yet decided his future but his value to City was underlined recently when a group of supporters started their own 'Don't move Gary' campaign.

Although Lineker has claimed most of the publicity at Filbert Street over the past season, another big success has been the form of goalkeeper Ian Andrews, an England Youth cap who was second choice behind long-serving Mark Wallington at the start of the campaign.

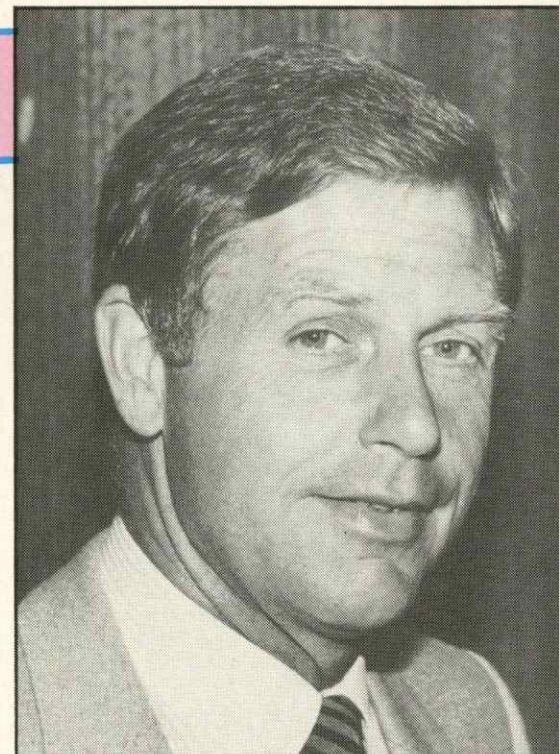
Andrews has become a permanent fixture in the City side since taking over from Wallington and seems set to maintain the club's reputation for producing outstanding goalkeepers.

The sale of Kevin MacDonald to Liverpool midway through the season provided City with a welcome cash influx and gave Ian Banks the chance to return to the side in midfield. Banks, signed from Barnsley before the start of last season, had asked for a move after being left out of the team and was on the point of joining Sheffield United. But that move fell through at the last minute and Banks returned to the City side until recently when he lost his place again to Andy Peake as Milne tried to end that losing run.

Northern Ireland cap Paul Ramsey has been a regular in midfield for Leicester this season and there's been a return to this role in recent weeks for Bobby Smith who had a long run at full-back last year.

Wearing two and three for City this season have been Andy Feeley a former Hereford apprentice and Scotsman Ian Wilson who has now played more than 200 games for the club since moving south from Highland League football during Jock Wallace's reign as manager at Filbert Street.

Tommy Williams, Scottish born but brought up in the Leicester area regained the number five role after battling back from serious injuries and that's left ex-Wolves and QPR pivot Bob Hazell on the sidelines for most of the season.

And sharing the central defensive duties with Williams is John O'Neill, another Northern Ireland cap and team skipper.

With players like Lineker, co-striker Alan Smith and winger Steve Lynex around, Leicester rarely go short of goals. Smith has been a reasonably consistent marksman all season and has a good understanding with the exciting Lineker while Lynex, a former West Bromwich apprentice who moved to Filbert Street from Birmingham City four years ago, is always capable of scoring goals and is well into double figures this season.

Mark Bright, signed from Fourth Division Port Vale last summer has had to wait for his chance to establish a regular first team place but is one of a number of youngsters who have pressed their claims in City's successful Central League side over the past nine months.

City switched their second team from the Football Combination to the newly formed Second Division of the Central League for this season and have had promotion in the bag now for several weeks.

Uncertainty about the future of Lineker and that alarming slump a month ago have caused City a few worries over the final weeks of the season and they'll be hoping to round off the campaign on a high note today and that Lineker will decide to stay with the club when his contract runs out in a few weeks time.

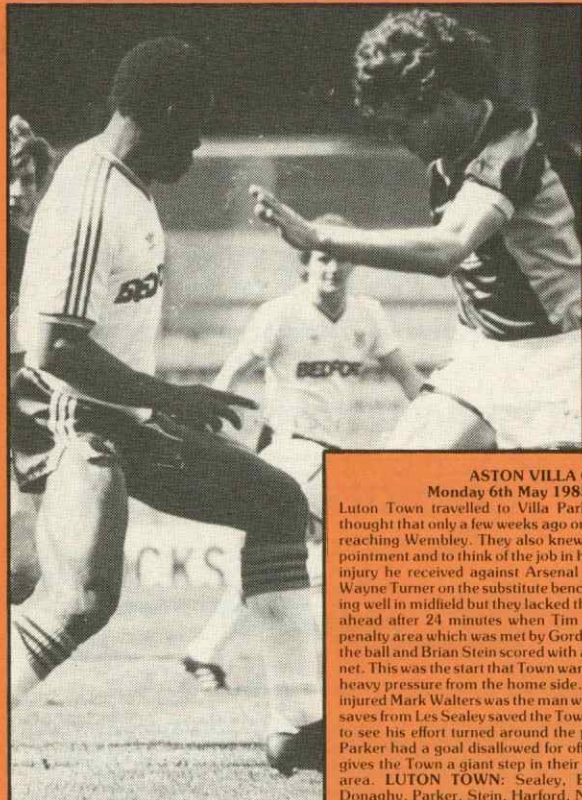

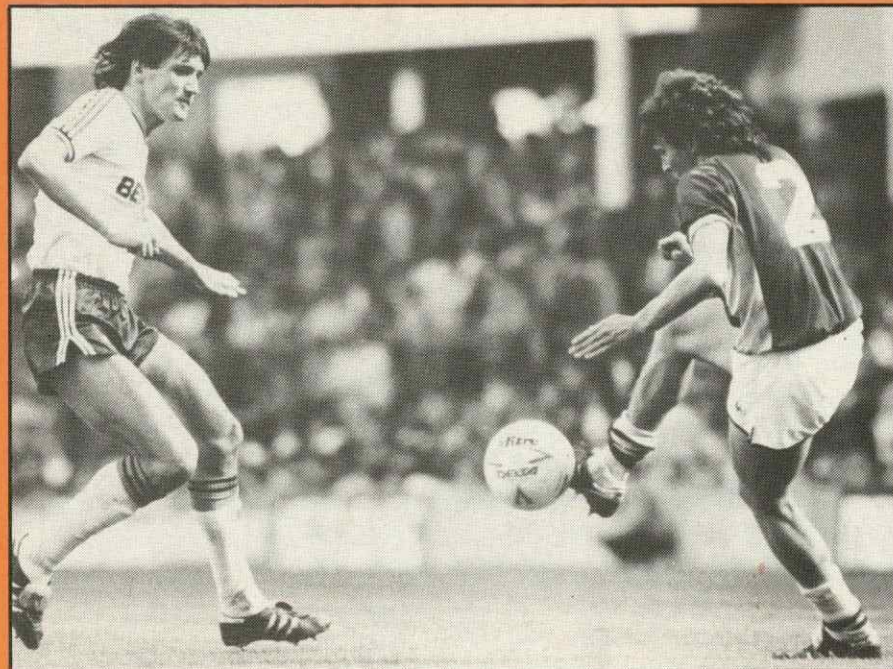

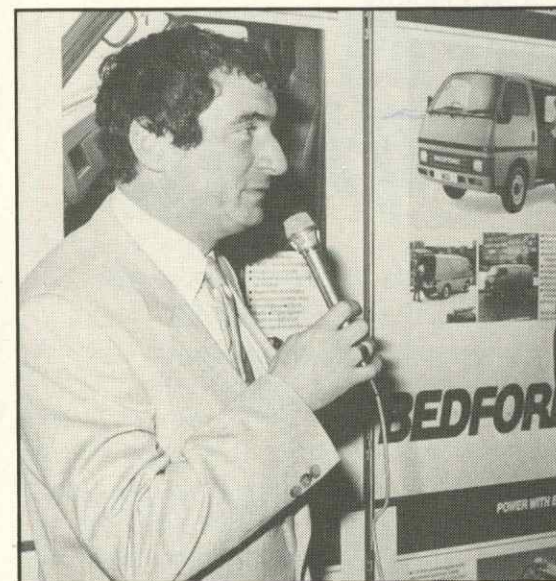
