Welcome to White Hart Lane

THIS afternoon we extend a warm welcome to our friends from Luton Town.

After successive League defeats at home to Leicester City and at Southampton last Saturday — before the midweek Milk Cup victory over Wimbledon — our players will be keen to start climbing the First Division table again today. And they will be encouraged by our track record against the Hertfordshire club to date.

Derby atmosphere

Because of the close proximity between the two grounds — assisted by the continually-extending motorway links — our games with Luton usually produce something of a local "derby" atmosphere and hopefully that ambience will be repeated today.

The history books show that we have not been defeated by the Hatters in the League since 1959 when we lost 1-0 at Kenilworth Road. Indeed, in 32 encounters in Division One and Two we have only lost five times to Luton, and always by the odd goal.

We maintained that consistency last season with a 4-2 victory at White Hart Lane in September followed by an incredible 2-2 draw in the return in February.

Dogged resistance

That home win enabled us to retain pole position at the top of the First Division table but we needed a second-half revival to overcome Town's dogged resistance. Indeed, Luton took the lead in the third minute through David Moss and although Mick

Hazard equalised with a superb drive, Frank Bunn restored the visitor's advantage.

By half-time Steve Perryman levelled but we had to wait until the 76th minute before Mark Falco gave us the lead for the first time in the game. A late penalty by Graham Roberts — awarded when Mal Donaghy fouled John Chiedozie — completed the scoring.

The clash at Luton was even more dramatic with an amazing finish. Luton, who dominated the first half, were ahead in the 48th minute thanks to Brian Stein. Then came that rousing close when Mark Falco, Emeka Nwajobi and Graham Roberts all scored in the last five minutes!

On Wednesday night we continued our progress in the Milk Cup with a 2-0 win over Second Division promotion hopefuls Wimbledon in the third round.

Both sides created chances in a lively first half but we had to wait until the 56th minute before Gary Mabbutt gave us the lead when he forced his way through a packed penalty area to head Glenn Hoddle's free-kick home.

Substitute Dave Leworthy, who replaced Richard Cooke midway through the second half, quickly added a second from close range to set us up for a fourth round encounter with Second Division leaders Portsmouth at White Hart Lane on Wednesday, November 20.

SPURS SPOTLIGHT

Graham Roberts

"The Graham Roberts of old." That's how manager Peter Shreeve summed up the performance of his powerhouse central defender following our impressive Milk Cup second round recovery against Orient at White Hart Lane.

And now Graham is determined to maintain that form consistently in an all-out effort to boost Tottenham's performances and, when that's achieved, win back his England place.

BEST PERFORMANCE

Graham has been overlooked by international manager Bobby Robson since he suffered appendicitis on England's South American tour two summers ago and had to be sent home following an operation. But looking at the central defenders in England's latest squad, Graham knows that he can be better than any of them — but only when he hits top form.

"That Orient game was my best performance of the season," says Graham who scored the crucial opening two goals to level the tie on aggregate. "It's a fact of football that players hit bad patches and everybody goes through them. But thankfully the manager has stuck by me and now I'm out to re-produce my best form every week.

"I was doing that consistently for the past two years and it's that standard of performance that I want to get back to. But I'm prepared for a battle with myself because I know that I've got to work twice as hard if I'm to be successful."

Accepting the fact that you are not on song is often half the battle and Robbo has never been one to avoid reality — no matter how harsh it may appear. And, as Orient manager Frank Clark, a tough defender himself in his playing days, admits, Graham takes some stopping.


FORMIDABLE SIGHT

"It's OK for me because I don't have to tackle him — but Graham's a formidable sight when he is going for the ball on a 50-50," smiles Frank.

Graham is convinced that it was our European experience that allowed us to overcome that two goal deficit and win 4-0 on the night. Now he wants to see the side show that solid Euro style more on the domestic scene. And, having proved himself against some of the best attackers on the Continent in the past, he is convinced that he could do it for England in the World Cup Finals in Mexico.


"I want to pull on that England shirt again but I know that the route back can only be made on the strength of consistent solid performances at home. I have to ensure that I cannot be overlooked and nobody else can do that for me.

"My priority must always be Spurs but a trip to Mexico at the end of the season would be a marvellous bonus."





Names & Games

It was not until season 1937-38 that Spurs and Luton met in Football League competition for the first time. Prior to the first clash that season, the two clubs had only played each other for points in the Southern League.

It is a point of interest that two days after Spurs won the F.A. Cup for the first time by beating Sheffield United at Bolton in April, 1901, the team lined up at Luton for a Southern League fixture they won 4-2.

That season was Luton's first back in the Southern League after spending three seasons in the Second Division of the Football League and from that time they were in opposition to Spurs regularly each season until the latter left the Southern League to seek election to the Football League in 1908.

It was therefore a stretch of 36 years before Spurs and Luton again faced each other for points in a Second Division match in September 1937.

Spurs won that first game at Luton by 4-2, and completed the double by winning 3-0 in the first-ever League appearance of the Hatters on this ground in the following January. Luton, captained by centre-half JOHN NELSON, were a well-beaten team that day.

A goal by centre-forward JOHNNY MORRISON was sandwiched between two from left-winger COLIN LYMAN on a day when Luton also had their scoring chances.

1ST DIVISION

It was not until season 1955-56 that Spurs and Luton met in the First Division. It was then a question of honours even, the home team winning 2-1 on each occasion.

Spurs were at Luton at the end of August and with the home team newly-promoted to Division 1, the scenes of enthusiasm when they scored the winning goal 90 seconds from time can be imagined.

Spurs, in fact, led at half-time by a goal scored by JOHNNY GAVIN, the Irish international outside-right, who headed in from a cross by TONY MARCHI.

Luton were level ten minutes after the break with a goal from inside-left GEORGE CUMMINS and the late winner was from a good shot by inside-right GORDON TURNER. A highlight of that game was a tremendous free-kick to Spurs taken by ALF STOKES in the first half. It crashed against the angle of bar and post and rebounded about 30 yards into play.



LEN DUQUEMIN

As Christmas Eve fell on a Saturday for the return game that season, the match was played in the morning and the gate figure was 41,168. By that time Luton were sixth in the League and Spurs were 21st!

The 2-1 win was therefore invaluable to Spurs, whose goals were both scored in the first half. LEN DUQUEMIN put Spurs in front and JOHNNY BROOKS netted the second, Turner narrowing the gap for Luton in the second half.

LAST SEASON

When Luton were here in the League last season, Spurs won 4-2 in a game in which scoring chances came thick and fast.

DAVID MOSS scored first for Luton and after MICK HAZARD had equalised with an 18-yarder, FRANKIE BUNN regained the lead for the visitors. Then, before half-time STEVE PERRYMAN scored from close range for Spurs.

The second half belonged to Spurs. MARK FALCO put Spurs in front for the first time and GRAHAM ROBERTS rounded things off with a fourth from the penalty spot for an infringement against John Chiedozie.

SURVIVAL!

One of the most dramatic games between Spurs and Luton was played here in April, 1975. Both clubs were fighting against relegation and a 2-1 win came as a great relief to Spurs.

Luton, who failed to avoid the drop that season, were level until the closing minutes, when ALFIE CONN scored the winning goal. JOHN DUNCAN had given Spurs the lead in the first half but ALAN WEST was quick to equalise.

With so much at stake it was a tense and at times ragged game. Spurs survived in the First Division and Chelsea and Carlisle accompanied Luton into Division 2.

DRAWN SEMI-FINAL

When Luton reached the F.A. Cup Final in 1959, their semi-final tie with Norwich City was staged here at White Hart Lane.

The gate figure for that match was 63,397 and the game ended in a 1-1 draw. Norwich, who had knocked Spurs out of the Cup in the fifth round that season, were lucky to get away with a draw.

ALLAN BROWN, the Luton inside-right who later returned to manage the club, gave his team the lead in the first half, but left-winger BOBBY BRENNAN equalised in the 65th minute, and only some great goalkeeping by SANDY KENNON kept the Hatters out.

The replay was on Birmingham City's ground and Luton won 1-0 but lost 2-1 in the final to Nottingham Forest. On the day the semi-final was played here, Spurs lost a First Division match 3-1 away to Leeds United.

FROM LUTON

It was from Luton that Spurs signed inside-right SAMMY BELL back in March, 1935.

Spurs were struggling against the relegation that finally overtook the Club, and it was a heavy responsibility that Bell, together with inside-left ANDY DUNCAN, who was signed from Hull City, shouldered in those vital closing matches of that season.

Both were new to the First Division. Luton were in the old Third Division (South) and Hull were then a mid-table Second Division club. Nevertheless, both Bell and Duncan were in good form and their joint signing was a commendable attempt to spark off some kind of revival.

At the time of their signing, Spurs had not won a League match since Boxing Day and the turn of the tide came on Good Friday, when Blackburn Rovers were beaten here by the only goal of the match, scored by Bell.

The former Luton player stayed with Spurs until the summer of 1937, when he signed for Southend United. Duncan stayed with Spurs until his retirement during the war.

At the time of Bell's signing from Luton, wing-half DAVE COLQUHOUN made the reverse move to the Hatters. He had joined Spurs from St. Mirren in 1931.







It was in January, 1978 that DAVID PLEAT took over as manager of Luton Town and in the comparatively brief span of time that has since passed, he has established himself as one of the leading managers in the game.

David was a winger in his playing days. A youth and schoolboy international, he was born in Nottingham and started his career with the Nottingham Forest club. From the Forest he moved to Luton and after a spell of service with the club he now manages, he moved to Shrewsbury Town.

The next stop for David was at Exeter and later he played for Peterborough United. As an Exeter player he appeared at outside-left against Spurs here in the third round of the League Cup in September, 1968.

Prior to his present appointment, he was on Luton's coaching staff and previously he had had a spell as manager of Nuneaton Borough.

LES SEALEY (Goalkeeper). Joined Luton from Coventry City in August, 1983. A Londoner from Bethnal Green, he is a cousin of Alan Sealey, the former West Ham United winger. Developed through the apprentice ranks at Coventry and made his League debut away to Queens Park Rangers in April, 1977. Played six League matches on loan to Plymouth Argyle from Luton last season.

TIM BREACKER (Defender). Born at Bicester and developed through Luton's apprentice ranks to become a full professional in August, 1982. Made his League debut away to Ipswich Town in March, 1984, and has since established himself as a senior player. Made 35 League appearances last season.

STEVE FOSTER (Defender). Signed from Aston Villa towards the end of last November. Born at Portsmouth, he developed through the apprentice ranks of the Portsmouth club to full professional status, and later joined Brighton and Hove Albion. Attained full international status as a Brighton player, making three appearances for England, and was in Brighton's F.A. Cup final team with Gary Stevens in 1983. Left Brighton for Villa in March, 1984.

MAL DONAGHY (Defender). An established Northern Ireland international who was born in Belfast and joined Luton from Larne, the Irish League club, in June, 1978. Made his first appearance in Luton's home match with Oldham Athletic on the opening day of the following season. His full first name is Malachy. Was in the Northern Ireland team against Rumania last month.

MITCHELL THOMAS (Defender). A local Luton discovery who developed through the apprentice ranks at Kenilworth Road and made his League debut in the No. 3 shirt

away to West Ham three seasons ago. Has been a full professional since August, 1982. Made 36 League appearances last season.

PAUL ELLIOTT (Defender). An England Under-21 player who was in the team that beat Turkey at Ashton Gate last month. Born in London and started his career with Charlton Athletic. First joined Charlton on Associated Schoolboy forms and rose to England Youth rank. Made 63 League appearances for Charlton before moving to Luton in March, 1983. Wore the No. 5 shirt in the League match here last season.

RICKY HILL (Midfield). A full English international. Born in London and developed through Luton's apprentice ranks to achieve full professional status in May, 1976. At that time he had already made his League debut as a substitute in a home match with Bristol Rovers in the preceding month. He celebrated that debut with a goal in a 3-1 win.

PETER NICHOLAS (Midfield). Transferred to Luton from Crystal Palace last January, and made his debut for the Hatters against Spurs at Kenilworth Road the same week. A full Welsh international, he was in the team against Hungary last month, and is also a former Youth international. Developed through the apprentice ranks of Palace and returned to the Selhurst club after a spell with Arsenal. Was contemporary with Clive Allen as a Palace

DAVID PREECE (Midfield). Born at Bridgnorth and established himself as a League player with Walsall. Developed through the apprentice ranks at Walsall, making 111 League appearances for the Staffordshire club before moving to Luton in December, 1984. Built on the small side but atones for it with skill and effort.

RAY DANIEL (Midfield). A local discovery who was born in Luton and developed through the apprentice ranks at Kenilworth Road. Made his League debut as substitute at home to Sunderland in March, 1983. Made five League appearances on loan to Gillingham early in season 1983-84.

ASHLEY GRIMES (Midfield). A full Eire international who

was born in Dublin and made his name with Manchester United. Had previously played for Bohemians, who transferred him to United in March, 1977. Left United for Coventry City in August, 1983 and made the further move to Luton in August, 1984.

BRIAN STEIN (Forward). Attained full English international status two seasons ago. Born in South Africa and joined Luton as a full contract professional in October, 1977, having previously played for Edgware Town. Made his League debut for Luton as substitute away to Mansfield Town in the Second Division in November, 1977.

MICK HARFORD (Forward). Transferred to Luton from Birmingham City in December,

1984. Had joined Birmingham from Bristol City in an unusual "three-club" deal just before the transfer deadline in March, 1982. Had signed for the Bristol club from Newcastle in August, 1981 and it was necessary for him to be registered again with the Tynesiders before the transfer to Birmingham could be completed. Born in Sunderland and started his League career with Lincoln City.

EMEKA NWAJOBI (Forward). Born in Nigeria and played for Dulwich Hamlet before signing for Luton in December, 1983. Adapted quickly to the First Division scene, making his League debut in the following month at home to Nottingham Forest and scoring a goal. His full first name is Chukwuemeka.






