Today is the day of "Welcome Back" from all of us who write columns for this programme.

Can I assure you that despite the repetition of that phrase, the sentiment is deeply felt by us all.

We all know that without your support football cannot live, and the opening day of a new Season, with its air of optimism throughout the country, truly does make us in the game only too pleased to welcome back the true supporters of the sport.

Of course, there is a small minority of attenders who we equally sincerely wish would never darken our doors again. Regrettfully, they attract a share of publicity far above their worth, and I can assure them that, together with the police and security forces, we shall be trying ever harder to weaken their influence as the months progress.

Our visitors today, Luton Town, have taken the brave step of entirely banning visiting support from their ground at Kenilworth Road.

I must say, and Luton know of my views, that I do not agree with their decision as I think it is an example of letting the baddies triumph over the goodies. Football should be a spectator sport open to all, and if the Leicester supporter wishes to watch his team play at Liverpool, Manchester United, Arsenal — or Luton — in theory I see no reason why he should not, provided of course, he behaves himself at those towns or cities.

However, I accept that this is not a perfect world, and I do understand Luton's theory that if they exclude visiting support some or most of their problems will disappear and their genuine home support will increase.

I, like most in football, will watch with interest.

Looking at Leicester City this summer, not a lot has happened at the ground in an obvious manner.

However, we are in the throes of two important improvements which I believe is in keeping with soccer's caring image.

Scheduled for operation today is our new sound system, being installed by British Telecom at a cost to us of around £20,000.

We have known for a few years that our old system had seen its best days, and the complaints, especially from the Members Stand, seemed to be growing last Season week by week.

Hopefully, the new system will answer all those complaints, although, like any new sound system, balance can only be achieved after practical trials before live audiences.

As we can hardly bring in crowds of ten, fifteen or twenty thousand to help us with sound system trials, we have to use the first few games to get things right. I am sure you understand.

Secondly, we are updating and increasing the ladies toilets in the Members Stand.

We are determined to continue to fight for the family audience, and know that our facilities for the ladies have not been up to the mark.

The placing of the order was delayed while our application for Grant Aid was being considered by the Football Grounds Improvement Trust — if you start work before the decision you lose any right to Grant Aid. Fortunately the answer was in our favour and by the middle of October our ladies should have nothing to complain of in that direction!

We are also pleased to be able to make available the facility of the Fosse Bar, to be renamed, the Lifeline Bar, for Season Ticket Holders and Lifeline Members before and after matches. Unfortunately, the Leicester City Magistrates still will not grant us extended hours, so on Saturday matches the sale of alcoholic drinks there will cease at 2.30 pm.

Finally, most of you will note our new Shirt advertisement of John Bull. Our old friends, Ind Coope, are still very much with us — and are indeed sponsoring our next two matches — but they decided to promote their popular brand of Bitter, John Bull, rather than the Company name. Cheers!

And, of course, to Bryan Hamilton and the players, all the best for a new Season that is as vital as ever. Football is still at make or break — and we're determined to make it.




It was delighted therefore when the Club's Chairman Terry Shipman invited me to become the Chairman of the new Lifeline society.

LUTON TOWN

An attractive side with a reputation for playing open, attacking football, Luton Town finished last term in a creditable 9th place, and coupled with some exciting Cup runs, their days of struggling seemed to be over.

However, the summer departure of popular manager David Pleat to Tottenham must have been a serious blow, as was the fact that Pleat tempted talented young full-back Mitchell Thomas to follow him to White Hart Lane, with the fee set by tribunal at £250,000.

The deal upset new manager John Moore who was promoted to replace Pleat, 21 years after playing for The Hatters as a left-half, but he still must have been pleased to fight off summer bids for defender Mal Donaghy and top striker Mick Harford, who misses today's game with a knee injury.

In goal Luton rely on former Coventry man **Les Sealey**, while Thomas' departure has increased competition for the full back slots between tough tackling **Ashley Grimes**, Under 21 international **Tim Breacker** and local lad **Rob Johnson**.

In the middle of defence is the inspirational, head-banded figure of skipper **Steve Foster** who has

bloomed after an unhappy spell with Aston Villa, and Northern Ireland star **Mal Donaghy**, a close season target for Chelsea.

In midfield Luton have the impressive talents of **Ricky Hill**, back to his best last season, coupled with the penetrating talents of Welsh international **Peter Nicholas** and busy little **David Preece**, a £150,000 buy from Walsall.

With Harford injured, Luton will rely on the subtle skills of loyal striker **Brian Stein** who may well be partnered by his younger brother **Mark Stein** for today's match.

Also up front will be England Under 21 striker **Mike Newell** who following his signing from Wigan, deputized so well for the injured Harford last season that the youngster won a place on merit.

Luton can also call on the powerful and unpredictable skills of Nigerian **Emeka Nwajiobi** — a player who says much about the Luton style of play.

Certainly, the fresh season looks sure to provide quite a challenge for manager John Moore and his new coach Ray Harford.

Although there have been plenty of goals scored in cup-ties between the two teams, oddly enough high scoring league games have been something of a rarity. Our best performance came as Leicester Fosse in 1898-99 with a 6-1 success at Dunstable Road, previous home of today's visitors. Since then only once have we recorded four goals — a 4-1 victory at Filbert Street on Easter Tuesday 1958 with Arthur Rowley netting twice. The Hatters first four goal haul

came at Kenilworth Road the following season, bringing them success by the odd goal in seven, and their biggest win over us came on the final day of the 1984-85 campaign — a reflection of Luton's superiority over us in recent seasons.

Undoubtedly the finest encounters between the two clubs have come in the F.A. Cup. The clashes in the Fifth Round in 1949, part of City's trail to Wembley, were epics recalled with relish by old time supporters. The first game at Luton was see-saw affair with Jack Lee netting four times for City, including an equaliser 30 seconds from the end of extra time.

Almost 39,000 fans packed Filbert Street for the replay the following Saturday, and the excitement was almost as intense. Jack Lee and Mal Griffiths each netted a brace and City went through 5-3. More recently, City's journey to the 1974 Semi-Final included an outstanding Fifth Round performance at Kenilworth Road.

Steve Earle scored twice in our 4-0 win but the goal best remembered was a dazzling individual effort by Keith Weller. The list of players who have had connections with both clubs is fairly small. In the Fosse era there was Jimmy Blessington, Edwin Daw and "Jaime" Durrant; between the wars came Tony Carroll; since World War II there has been Max Dougan, Billy McDermott, Barry Reed, Peter Small, Frank Soo, and more recently, the popular Rodney Fern.






