

# GIRL TALK



No punks, please!

In a radio interview George Graham talked about the type of boy he'd consider taking as an apprentice professional. He ruled out punks on the grounds that good footballers are essentially conformist and respectable and said that a punk would be unlikely to have the character to make the grade. His statement set me wondering. Is it true all players are conformist and respectable?

Generally, perhaps, but few would have described George Best in those terms, and Arsenal themselves in Charlie George and Charlie Nicholas have had players one might not immediately think of as the epitome of conformists. I got to thinking, too, that the players whose off-the-pitch dress or behaviour is a little flamboyant are often those whose playing style excites the crowd!

Flair

Perhaps George Graham's views are universally

held within the game. If they are, that might explain why we tend not to produce players of the flair of, say, the Brazilians.

It's a team sport after all, and if the eleven men aren't playing together then the risk of losing is increased - and teams cannot afford to lose.

Not simply do the players forfeit their win bonuses, but the clubs themselves suffer, as fans abandon a losing side. It is understandable that fear of losing induces caution. Teams too often play to hide their weaknesses and not to show their strengths.

I think that is why British players don't play with the skill and flair seen abroad. It's not that we can't play that way - take Brian Stein's goal against Leicester - it's that we don't. Obviously, no-one wants to lose week after week, but our teams could risk a little more.

# 1st Team ACTION

MIKE NEWELL scored twice and Brian Stein once as the Town won their first away win of the season and rose to seventh in the First Division at Stamford Bridge last Saturday. But on a day when Chelsea were only a shadow of the title-challenging team of last season, it was a routine collection of three easy points rather than an exciting triumph to mark John Moore's first away victory as the Hatters' Manager.

Chelsea were ahead in half an hour from a Dixon header, but Newell equalised with a deflected 20-yard drive just before the interval. And in the second half, once Chelsea captain Colin Pates had been carried off to reduce them to ten men, the Town cruised to victory.

Newell hit the second when he ran on to a Grimes through ball and evaded Pates – who was injured in collision with Millar – and Stein the third with a typically precise piece of finishing eight minutes from time.

Taking a long ball from the right, Stein cut in from the left, beat Woods and slipped the ball past Tony Godden for his fourth goal of the season and third in successive away matches.

# VIEWS from the BENCH

## Jim Ryan



Reserve team coach Jim Ryan was born in Stirling, Scotland in May, 1945. He joined Manchester United as a junior, progressed to the first team squad and made appearances in Europe as a talented winger. He came to Luton in 1970 and enjoyed seven happy years before leaving to play in America with Dallas Tornado. He rejoined the club in the close season. Today, Jim looks at the changes at Kenilworth Road and in football since he came to the Town 16 years ago.

### Progressive attitudes

"The ground, obviously, has changed a lot. And progressively. Everything has a look for the future about it now. But when I look back, it seems the club has always had that sort of attitude. I remember the 1970's when I was here and our season in the First Division. It was a great time really.

"Looking across at the Bobbers' – or what was the Bobbers' stand – really makes the point. I think the new boxes are perfect. They give a great view. Just the right height for watching football, I think. The cover on the Kenilworth Road end is great too.

### Superior pitch

"And the pitch? I've played on some Astroturf pitches in the States and I think this pitch is vastly superior to anything else I've seen or played on. I know there are critics, but they should remember what it was like to play down the Oak Road end in the middle of the winter when it was nearly impossible to play any football at all.

"You can always do that on this pitch. I think it is great. When I was here as a player the club always had talent coming through from the youth and reserve teams – players like Andy King, Lil Fucillo and Paul Price. It was good on

the playing side and still is.

"I haven't had many chances to see the first team play or train, but I can say I think there is a lot of talent among the youngsters. I have had a chance to examine them closely and I am pleased. It is good for the club.

### Philosophy of variety

"In my day, we tried to attack as much as we could under Harry Haslam and his attitude forms part of my football philosophy. In a word, I would say it was 'variety' – plenty of long passing, short passing, dribbling and different skills mixed up together. Like the Danes or the Russians in the World Cup. Like Brazil have always played.

"I think that is partly why we were good at scoring goals away from home when I was here. It's all to do with keeping the game simple. Matt Busby believed in that – play the ball and move. Keep the ball moving. Like Liverpool today. I think we are doing that here too.

"Luton believe in continuity, the long-term view. That is one reason I was attracted back to join my old team-mates John Moore and John Faulkner. Now, I could not want to be anywhere else."



# CLUB COMMENT

**John Smith, Executive Director.**

There is a special magic about a Cup-tie and we want to make sure you are able to share it. Our first of the season is in the newly-named Littlewoods Cup, formerly the Milk Cup. Cardiff City are due to visit us for the first leg of the tie on September 23.

In the interests of preventing hooliganism, we attempted to enlist the co-operation of the Football League and Cardiff City to let our membership scheme continue as normal. Unfortunately we were unable to obtain their agreement, and we are now obeying the letter of the law.

The rules are quite clear. Visiting clubs are entitled only to 25 per cent of tickets sold or reserved in advance for their supporters—not a quarter of all tickets.

As a result, we have decided that apart from season tickets, no tickets will be reserved or sold in advance.

This also means that, apart from season ticket-holders, our membership card-holders will have to buy their tickets as they enter the ground. No guest tickets will be available.

I trust that you will accept the inconvenience as a small price to pay for seeing a Cup-tie at Kenilworth Road and for maintaining our membership policy which is keeping hooliganism away from Kenilworth Road.

This policy is working. We were angry at some irresponsible press reports which suggested as many as 2,000 Newcastle United supporters were planning to

challenge the system a fortnight ago. We estimate that this scare deterred at least 500 Luton supporters from attending.

In fact, a mere eight Newcastle fans were turned away from the ground and a similar number at the railway station. This is a tribute to the good sense and responsibility of the Newcastle supporters who, though they may disagree with our policy, accepted our decision.

Our thanks go to those fans as well as to their supporters' club, Newcastle United, and their local media for helping us to put the message across.

While north London is obviously much closer than Newcastle, I trust the Arsenal supporters will also have resisted the temptation to make the journey.

It is too soon to make judgements about the success of our membership policy. But two things offer grounds for optimism. Firstly, without visiting fans the atmosphere outside the ground is much less threatening, and our neighbours are able to go about their normal business without fear of confrontation.

Secondly, we have experienced an even friendlier atmosphere inside, with applause for the skills of both sides. Thirty years ago, away sides were just as successful as they are today, without the benefit of travelling supporters. What they did have were much larger crowds of home supporters to cheer them on.

Players likely to be on duty today:


**John Lukic** - John took over from Pat Jennings two seasons ago and has since settled down to become the established first-choice goalkeeper at Highbury. He joined Arsenal from Leeds United in the summer of 1983. Born Chesterfield.

**Viv Anderson** - Joined Arsenal in 1984 after developing into an England full-back with Nottingham Forest under Brian Clough. One of the most reliable and dangerous men in the Gunners' squad, he was in Mexico with England last summer.

**Kenny Sansom** - One of the finest attacking left-backs in the First Division, Kenny is the Arsenal captain and proved his position among the world's leading defenders with his England performances during the World Cup finals.



## Newell at the double

**Mike Newell** broke his scoring duck for the new season and gained a share of media attention following our 3-1 win at Stamford Bridge last week. Here is a selection of the press comments last Sunday:

*Sunday Telegraph*: "... Nothing should detract from Luton's win. They made the most of the chances they created. By contrast, Chelsea hit the bar, after Dixon had given them the lead, with a header from McLaughlin's flick-on and had at least two other opportunities in front of goal.

Luton's equaliser rather typified the misplaced shots and passing of the first half... Newell's weak 20-yard drive was deflected in by Miller... Luton's second goal was more impressive. In the 63rd minute, Newell ran onto a long ball by Grimés, shrugged off Pates' challenge, and slid his shot in.

Nineteen minutes later Newell created the third goal, crossing from the right to Stein who tapped in his fourth goal in five games as Godden remained transfixed in his goal."

# LUTON TOWN GOLDEN OLDIES

## THE THROW-IN EXPERT WHO COST THE HATTERS FIVE SHILLINGS A GAME

Due to the fact that we played Arsenal five times last season many Luton supporters could be forgiven if they thought that games against the Gunners were regular occurrences. This is not true, however, despite meetings going back to our earliest times, writes club statistician Roger Wash.

But there have been many players transferred between the clubs.

Shortly after adopting professionalism in 1891, we signed Arthur Julian from Woolwich Arsenal on the princely sum of 5/- (25p) a game. This was regarded as a big transfer "coup" at the time and as Arsenal had gone "pro" by the time of the signing one can imagine the press having a field day arguing for the first time over the rights and wrongs of footballers moving clubs for more money. Times do not change!

Julian spent his time at Luton as club captain, centre-half and the taker of all throw-ins and free kicks, thus justifying his mammoth wages. If we got our money's worth from Julian then another signing from Arsenal, Ray Whittaker must have been an absolute bargain.

### Direct Winger

Signed by Bill Harvey in March 1964, he went straight into the first team at Southend and made an immediate impact in a 1-0 win. Whittaker retained his place as the Town slipped to the bottom places in Division Three following two defeats and a draw in the next three games, but it was apparent that this fast, direct winger was forging a good understanding with young striker John O'Rourke.

It appeared though that this partnership was not going to be able to flourish in anything other than the bottom division as the situation looked hopeless. The turning point, however, came on 28th March 1964 when Whittaker laid on a hat-trick for O'Rourke in a 4-2 home win over Bristol Rovers which set up a sequence of six wins and two draws from the final eight games to avoid relegation at the death.

High hopes for this partnership in the following season were effectively dashed in the first game when O'Rourke was injured in a 2-3 draw at Brentford. He spent several months in and out of the

side as the Town slipped to Division Four.

### Promotion

O'Rourke was fully fit for 1965/66 and he and Whittaker hit 47 goals between them as the Town narrowly missed out on a promotion that eventually came two years later.

The promotion season of 1967/68 was Whittaker's "swansong" as he was edged out of the side by Mike Harrison the following year before signing for Colchester in July 1969.

Twelve months later, Alec Stock went to Arsenal to sign David Court, a midfield player of considerable First Division experience, for £35,000. Although playing 52 games in two seasons for Luton, Court never really stamped his authority in games and despite having a fair goalscoring record for Arsenal did not manage a single goal at Kenilworth Road although it must be said the woodwork prevented

him on several occasions.

Harry Haslam then made two trips to Highbury to firstly sign Peter Cruse, an England amateur international, who was unfortunate enough to make his debut on the opening day of the 1973/74 season, when the Town lost 4-0 at Nottingham Forest. Cruse lost his place in the ensuing team shake-up and Luton

went on to win promotion!

Haslam's second foray brought the cultured Brian Chambers to Kenilworth Road in 1974. He enjoyed some fine games for Luton and scored a few memorable goals, one of which was provided by Ricky Hill with his first touch of the ball after coming on as substitute against Bristol Rovers in 1976.


