



'What team has players 12 feet tall, ugly warts, snarl like demented aliens, iron shoulders and play like all-American grid-iron footballers?

You've guessed it, of course, Wimbledon. The question was easy if you read certain newspaper stories and David Pleat's remarks last weekend.

We beat Spurs in a typical hard fought English game and yet you would have thought we had just started and finished World War Three; raping and pillaging along the way for good measure.

There was a lot of hypocrisy spoken last weekend and I'm glad none of it came from this camp. Judging by some remarks you must have thought Graham Roberts just left the side of Sister Theresa of Calcutta only to be cut down by "wicked" — David Pleat's word — Lawrie Sanchez.

'Sanch' knows he was in the wrong for retaliating and will be fined for being sent off, but to call him "wicked" is surely losing control.

Both Steve Galliers and Corkie have desperate leg wounds inflicted by Roberts but did you hear them bleat? Of course not. Did you see them remonstrate? Of course not.

Yet every time certain Spurs players were bowled over they went howling to the referee making incidents look worse and inflaming passion throughout the terraces. Sadly, we have built a reputation and sadly certain players/clubs/part of the media are not

going to let us forget it. I suppose it's like people being described as tall, dark and wiry but the fact they are totally opposite doesn't matter. It's been written, in the files and that's it.

So immediately people are given pre-conceived ideas by the supposedly anti-long ball brigade (many of you remember that letter recently by The Times sports editor). Our style is direct, but certainly not all 'long ball' as many no doubt witnessed against Spurs last Saturday. But that doesn't matter to some, and I'm certainly not going to change just to please them.

In every story I read we are described "tall", yet at Spurs we had two of the smallest men in the league in Stevie Galliers and Andy Clement, and I wouldn't exactly call Nigel Winterburn and Kevin Gage six foot giants. Yet tall it is, so tall it must stay.

Sadly, the bleating in the South has got worse. This jealousy is one of the reasons top London clubs fail in the championship race. Everton and Liverpool have both played here and the matches were no less committed than that at Spurs. Yet did you hear Howard Kendall or Kenny Dalglish blast off? True professionals in every sense of the word. Kenny said: "Wimbledon don't criticise me so why should I criticise them." No wonder the title seems to live at Anfield.

Even when Gary Stevens dislocated and broke a shoulder blade it was put down to us, and in particular John Fashanu, who usually seems to get

blamed for every mass murder. The fact that Stevens was bowled over by his own keeper, Ray Clement, and 'Flash' was lucky not to get his head knocked off didn't matter. It's Wimbledon. Blame them. However, 48 hours after the event David Pleat exonerated Flash from the incident.

Beating Spurs was an historic win for us. There was some lovely moments of quality football and there is no doubt it was rightly deserved, a fact I'm glad to report was respected by the majority of the media. Corkie's goal was a dream, chesting down a free kick, turning and striking beautifully into the net. And Andy Clement, just 18, can be proud of his debut, showing skill and control far beyond his years. He kept his head while many senior, top professionals, and internationals, seem happy to lose theirs. It was a debut he could be proud of and I hope he forces me to ensure it is the first game of many for Wimbledon. Final word on the Spurs match: There was a lot of confusion when 'Sanch' was sent off, the crowd howling for his blood. Many didn't realise Roberts was also being sent off, too. It would have made many people think twice about the abuse Lawrie received.

It occurred to me that the old red or yellow card system would have, perhaps, taken some of the heat from the game. It would let the fans and players know what is happening. We are the only country in Europe to have thrown this idea away. I personally would like it back.

I recently won the Thames Television 'Special Merit Award' while at the same dinner Essex cricket club collected the team award. I don't want to sound ungracious to marvellous hosts but I think the judges got it wrong on both counts. As I sat there watching winners collect their trophies I realised there was only one winner of both awards — the entire Wimbledon first team squad.

What they have achieved is nothing less than remarkable; in years to come they will take pride of place in many soccer historians reflections, how their laughter belied true and dedicated professionalism. I was proud to collect the award on their behalf. I'm even prouder being their manager. Take care. Enjoy the game.

DONS DIARY

Saturday's 2-1 win at Tottenham was a famous Wimbledon victory. In two previous Cup tie visits to White Hart Lane the Dons had not only lost but failed to score: crashing out of the League Cup 4-0 in 1977 and losing 12 months ago in the Milk Cup 2nd Round.

After topping the table for a fortnight in early September the Dons slumped to 5 defeats from 6 games and collected only one point from a possible 18: a run that saw them drop from 1st to 16th. Successive wins over Norwich and Tottenham have lifted Wimbledon to 10th position.

Andy Clement got a 19th birthday present 11 days early with his Dons debut at Tottenham. Andy 18 years and 353 days came into the side when an ankle injury ruled out Glyn Hodges. Andy has already won an under 18 international cap for Wales and summered in Sweden. He is not the youngest Don to pull on a shirt for his League debut: that record is still held by Kevin Gage who made his bow at the age of 17 years and 15 days.

Brian Gayle scored his first ever League goal for the Dons when he netted against Norwich. His only other goal was in the Milk Cup devastation of Blackburn 5-0 in September 1985.

The Dons have only met Norwich three times and won the lot! Last season Wimbledon did the double with a 2-1 scoreline each time.



John Kay made his first full appearance since the opening day of the season when he pulled on the No. 2 shirt against Norwich. He kept his place at Tottenham.



Luton have been holding their own in a comfortable mid-table position but manager John Moore knows that, if the Hatters could improve upon their away results, they could shoot up among the leaders. Last Saturday's 1-0 home win over Q.P.R. moved them up to sixth place and within striking distance of the top club.

Their only away victory was achieved at Chelsea (3-1) in September. Luton drew at Leicester (1-1) and Tottenham (0-0) but were beaten at Aston Villa (1-2), West Ham (0-2) and Manchester United (0-1).

The Hatters' marvellous 4-1 defeat of Liverpool at Kenilworth Road a fortnight ago underlines the contrast in home and away form.

Mike Newell scored a hat-trick that day and, with Brian Stein back in the side, the attack looks full of goals in spite of the fact that they have been without the injured Mick Harford, last season's leading scorer, all season.

John Moore, succeeded David Pleat as Luton's manager in the summer.



League eleven, Ashley was transferred to Coventry for £200,000 in 1983 and Luton signed him a year later.

TIM BREACKER (Defender) Tim is a former Luton apprentice who got his chance in their First Division side in 1984. He had been holding a regular place at full-back for two years until recently suffering an injury.

PETER NICHOLAS (Midfield) Peter is a hard-tackling midfield ball-winner who has played for Wales on 46 occasions. He started his career with Crystal Palace and, after four years in their senior side, he was transferred to Arsenal for £500,000 in 1981. He held his place in the Gunners' side for two years before returning to Palace. Luton signed him for £150,000 two seasons ago.

RICKY HILL (Midfield) Ricky rose from the apprenticeship ranks to make his League debut in 1976. It took him a couple of years to earn a regular place but he now looks back on well over 350 League appearances for the Hatters. Ricky was capped by England on three occasions.

ROBERT WILSON (Midfield) Robert is enjoying his first spell of First Division football following his recent transfer from Millwall. He developed in Fulham's junior teams and made more than 150 League appearances for the Cottagers before joining Millwall in the summer of 1985.

MARK NORTH (Midfield) Mark completed his apprenticeship at Kenilworth Road but first tasted League football as a Lincoln player, whilst on loan to the Red Imps, two seasons ago. He was introduced to Luton's senior team last season.

BRIAN STEIN (Forward) Brian made his League debut for the Hatters against Mansfield in 1977 and has on two occasions been their leading scorer. 

ASHLEY GRIMES (Defender) Ashley used to play in midfield in his Manchester United days but he has settled in well at left-back for the Hatters this season. United signed him from Bohemians twice. On the second occasion he cost £35,000 but he soon won international recognition and he now has 15 Republic of Ireland caps. After making 90 appearances in United's

DARREN McDONOUGH (Forward/Midfield) Darren served his apprenticeship with Oldham and made his first League appearances during 1980/81. Luton signed him for £85,000 a few weeks ago.





Personally Speaking



Saint and Greavsie have got it right with the title of their new book "Football is a Funny Game". There are times when you wonder, after a depressing run, where the next point is going to come from, but the old saying you are only as good or as bad as your last result still rings true. Consider some of the form-book upsets this season. Charlton winning at Manchester United only to be beaten at home by our own Dons four days later. Tottenham win at Anfield, blast Birmingham 5-0 in the Littlewoods and then are overturned 2-1 at White Hart Lane by Wimbledon.

Charlton stop West Ham in their tracks with a 3-1 win at Upton Park and four days later the Hammers knock Watford out of the Littlewoods at Vicarage Road. Cambridge United, who we hardly need reminding put the Dons out of the Littlewoods on away goals, collected another famous scalp when they disposed of Ipswich in the 3rd Round — to earn a money spinning home tie with Tottenham — and then crashed 3-0 at home to Crewe in a 4th Division game.


Perhaps that was as predictable a result as you can get in a marvellously unpredictable game. Teams so often raise their game for the big occasion (look at 4th Div. Wrexham, total cost of side £32,000, who went to Spain and drew 0-0 with mighty Real Zaragoza in the UEFA Cup Winners Cup) but find it hard when they come back to bread and butter fixtures.

It is a sobering thought that when we played Cambridge in the Littlewoods they were unbeaten and flirting in the top four of Division 4.

Since that night when the 2-2 result at Plough Lane was enough to take them through they have lost 4 League games in succession and dropped to 18th. Because of our short League history we, perhaps more than most, remember our roots. After all it was as recently as 1983 that we were competing in Division Four. Imagine then the anguish this season in the lower regions of the Fourth for it is cold fact that the club that finishes bottom will be relegated to the G.M. Vauxhall Conference and replaced by the champion of that League provided the club meets the Football League financial and stadium criteria.

It is not that long ago that Wimbledon regarded a match against Stockport County as a big occasion. Today County are facing a long hard winter slog to avoid making history of the unpalatable kind — the first Division 4 club to go out of the League by the relegation process. By last weekend Stockport were already 6 points adrift of all but those perennial strugglers Hartlepool and even then County are 4 points behind the North Easterners whose greatest claim to fame is introducing Brian Clough to management. In an effort to halt the slide towards non-League Stockport have recently recruited ex-Don Wayne Entwistle.

These are early days but there is already a fierce contest boiling up in the Conference. Just 6 points separate the top ten teams. Maidstone United, twice spurned by the old F.L. voting system, and strengthened by ex-Dons Phil Handford and Steve Hatter lead on goal difference from arguably the best known of all present non-league sides Altrincham, Barnet, Telford, Enfield and Cheltenham are all in hot pursuit. Whoever suffers the fate of leaving the League they at least have the consolation of knowing there is a way back. Unlike the days when Barrow, Gateshead and Workington were kicked into obscurity. It will be tough on the club relegated but automatic promotion and relegation between the Conference and the 4th Division has got to be good for the game. It was a long overdue move.

Steve Foster started out in soccer determined to win fame as a top goalscorer. But he switched roles at a fairly early stage of his career and went on to play for England as a central defender.

He played his first game for Portsmouth in August 1975 and during the course of that season made a total of 11 appearances in attack and as substitute. But Portsmouth finished bottom of the Second Division and faced a future of further uncertainty.


Steve could scarcely look back on his first season with satisfaction. That he looked unhappy in a striker's role was not entirely his fault. The service provided from midfield did not make life easy for any Pompey forward of that time.

So Steve decided to try his hand as a central defender and, after a few games as substitute the following season, he returned to the Portsmouth side in the number five shirt in November 1976 — and hasn't really looked back since then.

Brighton paid £130,000 for him during the summer of 1979 and that move gave Steve what is believed to be one of football's off-beat records. During a period of just three years and five months, he played in all four divisions of the Football League.

After winning under-21 honours, Steve won his first full England cap against N. Ireland in February 1982. He won a total of three caps. Steve played for Brighton against Manchester United in the replay of the 1983 F.A. Cup final.

Brighton were relegated shortly after that and Steve was transferred to Aston Villa for £200,000 the following season. Luton signed him in 1984 and now he is skipper of this season's very successful team.

NEWS ON ONE

Champions Liverpool are back on song! Norwich suffered the backlash of the Reds 4-1 humbling at Luton with a 6-2 Anfield blast. Paul Walsh, making his first full appearance at home for a year, hit a superb hat-trick and Ian Rush bagged two substitute goals to take his season tally to 18. Liverpool were already 5-1 up when player-manager Kenny Dalglish came on from the substitute bench to chalk up his 500th appearance for the club. Nottingham Forest are two points clear at the top and a 3-2 win over Sheffield Wednesday meant they are unbeaten at the City Ground with 5 wins and 2 draws. Arsenal have gunned into second place with five successive victories over Everton, Watford, Newcastle, Chelsea and Charlton. Saturday's 2-0 success at Selhurst halted Charlton's 4 League wins in a row run that earned manager Lennie Lawrence the Bells Manager of the Month Award for October. The crowd of 19,614 was Charlton's biggest for 7 years. Today's visitors Luton Town climbed from 10th to 7th thanks to a Warren Neil own goal in the 1-0 win over Q.P.R., but such is the mid-table congestion that only 4 points separate Luton and Aston Villa who have hoisted themselves to 16th by taking 13 points from 6 games since Billy McNeill took over. West Ham moved from 8th to 4th with Sunday's televised 1-0 win over Everton. New manager Jimmy Frizell is ringing the changes at Manchester City and since bringing in Imre Varadi, Tony Grealish and John Gidman City have gone two games without defeat but these two draws only keep the Maine Road side off the bottom on goal difference over Newcastle who also have 9 points. Manchester United and Chelsea are both in the bottom four (19th and 20th) with 13 points — both having had to settle for a home point last weekend. 


