TONIGHT we are pleased to welcome to Turf Moor our distinguished First Division visitors and current holders of the Littlewoods Cup, Luton Town.

And first of all I would like to thank, on behalf of all the officials of Burnley Football Club who were at Kenilworth Road a fortnight ago, and not least our players, the chairman, Mr. David Evans MP, his fellow directors and everyone at Luton for making us so welcome.

We thoroughly enjoyed our return to the First Division scene even if it was only for one night and, of course, we were delighted with the result which means that we are both starting the tie all over again.

I said after the game at Luton that I felt we had got the result we deserved and now we have to do the hard bit and win the tie.

That's still my view and I believe we are in for a great tussle tonight before it is decided which one of us goes into Thursday's third round draw.

I don't believe that Luton underestimated us in any way a fortnight ago. In fact, I believe their manager, Ray Harford, who spoke to the Press just after the game and before I did, said that Luton had watched us before the Cup tie and we had played exactly as they thought we would.

He was generous in his praise of our players so there is no way he or his players are coming here tonight believing that we can't reach that standard again.

In fact, I would not be surprised to see his players performing as well, if not better on grass than on their own artificial surface at Kenilworth Road.


Any side that goes to Goodison Park and beats Everton 2-0 as Luton did the Saturday before they met us can play — on any surface.

I am sure we can again give an excellent account of ourselves in front of what will be a big crowd and we welcome their supporters to Turf Moor.

Two very special spectators at our recent home games against Rotherham and Exeter City were the right wing pair who brought glory to this club just after the war.

Jack Chew and Billy Morris were back together again, and while both had left this club before I joined it as a player back in 1954, it's always a pleasure to have anyone back at the club who, in the past, has done his best for it.

LUTON TOWN

Tonight we take on the Littlewoods Cup holders Luton Town in our second round, second leg match and in doing so we welcome their players, officials and supporters to Turf Moor.

Manager Ray Harford led his side to Wembley in three competitions last season winning the Littlewoods Cup Final 3-2 against Arsenal, Brian Stein 2 and Danny Wilson scoring, in the Simod Cup Final they were beaten 4-1 by Reading, Mick Harford scoring, and they also took part in the Centenary Festival. In the First Division they came ninth with Mark Stein finishing leading league scorer with eleven goals.

During the summer several players left Kenilworth Road, Eneke Nwajobi, Brian Stein, Colin Barker and Richard McVoy on free transfers, whilst Mark Stein was transferred to Queens Park Rangers, his brother Brian moved to French Club Caen. New signings included John Dreyer from Oxford United, Roy Wegerle from Chelsea and Arsenal's Steve Williams.

Luton have had a shaky start to the new season but recently won 2-0 at Everton, thanks to goals from David Oldfield and Kingsley Black and drew 0-0 at Nottingham Forest. Burnley will have to keep a close eye on Oldfield and Black, two highly talented young players.

RAY HARFORD (Team Manager) — After a successful year as First Team Coach, Halifax born Harford's talent and belief in attractive play made him the natural successor to John Moore in the summer of 1987 and in his first season as manager steered the Club to Littlewoods Cup triumph. A former half-back he learnt his trade at Charlton making his league debut in 1965. Following a transfer to Exeter in January 1966 he made over 350 league appearances for several clubs in the lower divisions before finishing his playing career at Colchester who offered him his first coaching post. He came to Luton in the summer of 1986 following a spell as Manager of Fulham.

STEVE FOSTER (PLAYER/COACH) — Harford's first move as Manager was to appoint Club Captain Foster as Player/Coach — a recognition of his exceptional qualities of leadership. Portsmouth born Foster joined his local club as an apprentice breaking into the first team as a forward in 1975/76 — his home debut was actually against Luton. He moved to centre-back during the following season and after 135 League and Cup appearances was transferred to Brighton for £150,000 in 1979 following the Seagulls promotion to Division One. During his spell at the Goldstone Ground he earned three England caps, played in the 1982 World Cup as well as appearing in the 1983 F.A. Cup Final. He moved to Aston Villa for £200,000 after Brighton's relegation and from there joined Luton in December 1984 for a bargain £70,000. Total League and Cup appearances for Luton to end 1987/88 164 — Goals 11.

MAL DONAGHY — Luton's most capped international, with over 50 to his credit, he has now played in two World Cup campaigns for Northern Ireland. Within months of making his debut for Larne he was being chased by many English First Division sides and it was regarded as an astute piece of business by former Manager David Pleat when Donaghy was "stolen" for £20,000 in June 1978. Solid dependable he forms, with Steve Foster, arguably the best central defensive partnership in the country. Surprisingly missed eight league games last season through injury which means he has "only" been ever present for six out of the last ten seasons. Total League and Cup appearances for Luton to end 1987/88 472 — Goals 21.

IAN ALLINSON — Although born in Hitchin, Allinson made his league bow for Colchester against Preston in April 1975 in the same side as Ray Harford. Made 308 league appearances for the "U's" before a contractual slip up made him a free agent and he signed for his boyhood favourites Arsenal in 1983. After four years in and out of the "Gunners" side he joined second division Stoke in the summer of 1987 but was grateful to accept his old friend Harford's offer to come to Luton only a few months later. Total League and Cup appearances for Luton to end 1987/88 32 — Goals 4.

PAUL GRAY — Promising Portsmouth born youngster who is expected to press for a first place this season. Made his debut in a Simod Cup tie at Everton in February 1988.

JULIAN JAMES — Locally born James is another from the Town's youth scheme hoping to make a name for himself. Came on as substitute three times towards the end of last season including the 1-1 draw at Anfield. Total League and Cup appearances for Luton to end 1987/88 3 — Goals 0.

ALEC CHAMBERLAIN — Made his league debut for Colchester in January 1983 and after many fine displays Everton were prompted to pay £80,000 for his services in the summer of 1987. Unfortunately due to the form of Welsh international Neville Southall, he did not manage a league appearance at Goodison Park but instead had a spell on loan at Tranmere. Signed for Luton last close season.

ROY WEGERLE — South African born Wegerle was signed by Chelsea from Tampa Bay Rowdies for £100,000 two years ago. A £75,000 signing by the Town last close season to add proper strength to the first team squad.

MICK HARFORD — At the time Luton town's record cash signing, at £250,000, from Birmingham in December 1984. Sunderland born, Harford commenced his league career with Lincoln where 46 goals in 126 appearances encouraged Newcastle to pay £180,000 for his services in December 1980. He never really settled at St. James Park and the following close season Bristol City took him to Ashton Gate. City were in a parlous financial state and were unable to fully pay the fee so six months later he was re-signed by Newcastle and promptly transferred to Birmingham. He was therefore on the books of three clubs on the same day! He enjoyed some success with Birmingham in a struggling side but was prised away by Luton where he has played the best football of his career fully deserving his England call up in 1987/88. Total League and Cup appearances for Luton to end 1987/88 136 — Goals 66.

RICKY HILL — He joined Luton straight from school and is currently enjoying his 13th full season. He made his league debut at home to Bristol Rovers over Easter 1976 coming on as substitute for current Town coach John Faulkner. Laid on a goal with his first touch and scored with his second. Was included in Bobby Robson's first squad in 1982 and made his England debut against Denmark. Still in Robson's thoughts as proved by his call-up against Egypt two seasons ago. Broke his ankle on Boxing Day 1987 but made a swift recovery to star in the Littlewoods Cup Final win. An ambassador for the game who enjoyed a successful testimonial in 1986. Total League and Cup appearances for Luton to end 1987/88 463 — Goals 59.

DARRON McDONOUGH — Belgium born McDonough scored on his League debut for Oldham against Notts County in December 1980 thereby joining an exclusive club. He signed for Luton in exchange for £87,000 to become a versatile and valuable member of the squad. Was unfortunate to be injured just before the Town's Littlewoods Cup Final win. Total League and Cup appearances for Luton to end 1987/88 58 — Goals 7.

GARY COBB — Local lad Cobb made his debut in the win at Charlton towards the end of 1986/87 where he set up the only goal of the game. He earned his elevation after several fine performances in the Football Combination side. Total League and Cup appearances for Luton to end 1987/88 9 — Goals 0.

BRIAN STEIN — South African born striker who was signed from Edgware in October 1977 and within weeks was appearing for Luton at Old Trafford in a twice replayed Football League Cup tie against Manchester City. He scored twice in his first full League home game and has not looked back since, netting freely in all subsequent seasons. Deceptively fast and difficult to knock off the ball Stein has been extremely unlucky not to have added to his solitary England cap won against France in 1983/84. Was the Town's matchwinner in the Littlewoods Cup Final scoring twice with the second slammed home in injury time. Total League and Cup appearances for Luton to end 1987/88 451 — Goals 148.

MARK STEIN — Brian's younger brother who signed professional forms for Luton in January 1984 making his debut three months later in a 3-0 home defeat by Everton. He had to wait nearly 18 months for his next league game but has gradually forced his way into the side with last season being his most successful to date as 11 goals in 25 league appearances proves. Total League and Cup appearances for Luton end 1987/88 68 — Goals 22.

DANNY WILSON — Ray Harford's first major signing, from Brighton, in the summer of 1987. Born in Wigan on January 1st 1960 he made his league debut for Bury in season 1977/78 before being transferred to Chesterfield three years later. His performances for the "Spirites" inspired Brian Clough to take him to Nottingham Forest in January 1983 but things did not work out at the City Ground and he moved to Brighton only ten months later. Qualifies for Northern Ireland through parentage and is now a regular in the International side. Total League and Cup appearances for Luton to end 1987/88 52 — Goals 10.

LUTON TOWN

ASHLEY GRIMES — Dublin born Grimes played the early part of his career with Manchester United where he had 90 league games and appeared regularly for Fire. Transferred to Coventry in August 1983 he joined Luton a year later in a straight swap for Kirk Stephens but was then plagued with injuries during his first two seasons at Kenilworth Road. Now back to his best form he fully deserved his recall to the Fire team in 1987/88. Total League and Cup appearances for Luton to end 1987/88 94 — Goals 4.

TIM BREAKER — Bicester born Breaker has been a regular member of the first team since his debut at Ipswich in 1984. This England Under-21 International can perform in midfield but his normal position is right back where his surging runs on the overlap have become a strong feature of his play. The Town's only "ever present" during 1987/88 making 58 competitive appearances. Total League and Cup appearances for Luton to end 1987/88 175 — Goals 2.

ROB JOHNSON — Born in Bedford and turning professional for the Town in August 1979 his career was almost over before it started. He suffered two extremely serious knee injuries which would have put most players out of the game but he fought back to make his debut against Birmingham in November 1983. Total League and Cup appearances for Luton to end 1987/88 98 — Goals 0.

RICHARD HARVEY — Born at Letchworth in April 1969 Harvey, following a number of fine performances for the Combination side as well as captaining the successful Youth Team, made his deserved full league debut at home to Queens Park Rangers in November 1986. Made four further appearances towards the end of 1986/87, showing maturity beyond his years and is now recognised as a First team squad member. He has toured South America with the England Under-19 squad. Total League and Cup appearances for Luton to end 1987/88 7 — Goals 0.

EMEKA NWAJIOBI — Unpredictable Nigerian International who burst on the scene with a scoring debut against Nottingham Forest on 2nd January 1984 only weeks after transferring from Dulwich Hamlet. On his day a matchwinner who makes goalscoring look easy. Total League and Cup appearances for Luton to end 1987/88 85 — Goals 19.

DAVID PREECE — Bridgnorth born Preece signed professional forms for Walsall in July 1980 and made 134 appearances for the "Saddlers" before Luton paid £150,000 for his services in December 1984. He made a scoring debut that same month at home to Aston Villa and has since become a firm crowd favourite because of his busy style of play. Has appeared in only 30 League and Cup games in the last two seasons through injury. Total League and Cup appearances for Luton to end 1987/88 101 — Goals 6.

LES SEALEY — Although born and raised in the East End of London Sealey made his League bow with Coventry for whom he signed in March 1976. Played 178 times for the "Sky Blues" before transferring to Luton in August 1983 for £100,000. Has found himself out of favour on more than one occasion but has fought back with many superlative displays to become the acknowledged number one. Total League and Cup appearances for Luton to end 1987/88 214 — Goals 0.

KINGSLEY BLACK — Hit the headlines with his performance in the Littlewoods Cup Final which prompted both Billy Bingham and Bobby Robson to fight for his international services. Although Luton born he chose Northern Ireland which made his father a happy man. Only made his League debut in October last year in the game at QPR. Pacey, skilful outside-left who is set to tease many a defender. Total League and Cup appearances for Luton to end 1987/88 18 — Goals 0.

MARVIN JOHNSON — Another former member of the talented youth side. Wembley born Johnson signed professional forms last season and is knocking on the first team door for a regular place. He has exceptional pace for a big man and has proved his worth with fine displays as deputy for both Foster and Donaghy. Total League and Cup appearances for Luton to end 1987/88 9 — Goals 0.

DAVID OLDFIELD — A promising future is predicted for this quick, skilful player who was born in Perth, Australia and who burst on the scene scoring twice at Goodison Park in a Simod Cup tie last season. Turned down a £500,000 move to Norwich in the close season preferring to stay at Luton in order to fight for a regular place. Total League and Cup appearances for Luton to end 1987/88 9 — Goals 3.

JOHN DREYER — Close season signing at a cost of £140,000 from Oxford United. Joined United from Wallingford Town and appeared on loan for Torquay and Fulham before making his Oxford debut at home to Coventry in October 1986.

STEVE WILLIAMS — The Town's record signing at £300,000 Williams brings with him to Kenilworth Road a wealth of experience gained playing for Southampton, Arsenal and England. Made his league debut for the Saints in 1975/76 and signed for Arsenal for £550,000 in 1984.

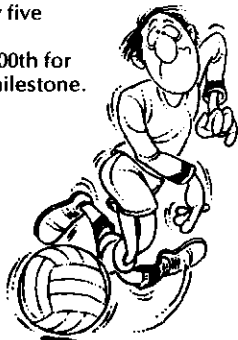
1927-28

Turf Moor's biggest crowd of the season, 38,000, gathered on August 27, 1927, the opening day, for the derby game with Blackburn Rovers. Rovers' 2-1 win was a foretaste of things to come; Burnley went on to lose their first five games, conceding 16 goals in the process. In the closest finish ever seen in the First Division, relegation was avoided by only one point, yet Burnley were only five points behind Derby, who finished fourth.

George Beel's first goal in the 3-5 defeat by Everton on 28th April was his 100th for the club (in his 177th game); only Bert Freeman had previously achieved this milestone. His second goal in the match beat Freeman's record of 33 goals in a season, set in 1911/12. Beel's 35 stands as the club record to this day.

Billy Down was signed from Doncaster on 16th September 1927, and replaced George Sommerville in goal two months later. Despite the fact that Andy McCluggage and George Waterfield, two Burnley stalwarts and internationals, were the regular full-backs, the team ended with the worst defensive record in the First Division.

On Monday, 28th November 1927, Turf Moor staged its only full international in which Wales beat England 2-1. Jack Hill, winning his 8th cap, and Louis Page, winning his 7th, were in the England team.

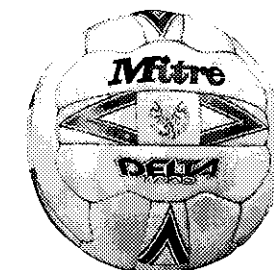

Luton Town have visited Turf Moor eighteen times since our first meeting back in 1897-98 and have only won twice, once in 1957-58 2-1 and in 1976-77 again 2-1. In cup games we defeated Town 3-1 at Turf Moor in a F.A. Cup fourth round tie back in 1935 and in 1947 on our way to Wembley we drew 0-0 at Kenilworth Road. Burnley won the replay 3-0 thanks to a Ray Harrison hat-trick.

The match we look at took place at Kenilworth Road on November 30th, 1974. Luton had been promoted to Division One, after finishing as runners-up in Division Two but had made a dreadful start to their first season in Division One since 1960. At the time they were bottom of Division One having only one victory and nine points. Burnley on the other hand were in a mid-table position and in their last game had beaten Newcastle United 4-1 with Peter Noble scoring a hat-trick, so it was no surprise when manager Jimmy Adamson named an unchanged side. Luton had recently sold full-back Don Shanks to Queens Park Rangers for £35,000.

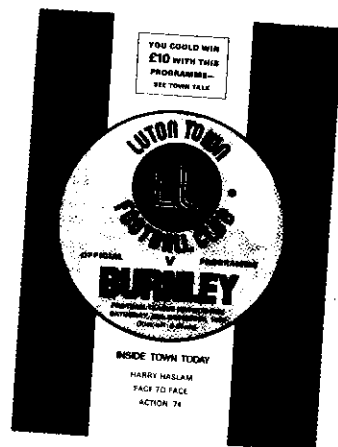
Heavy rain meant the match was played on a muddy pitch but with Alan Stevenson, Peter Noble and Leighton James in fine form, the Clarets took the lead when James found Ian Brennan on the left wing and his cross was met by Ray Hankin who headed past Luton Town goalkeeper Keith Barber, to score his 50th league goal. Burnley continued to outplay Town but Luton got back into the match when Keith Newton misheaded John Aston's corner and John Faulkner equalised with a header. The sides went in level at half time.

Burnley started the second half by scoring in the 49th minute when James played a one-two with Billy Ingham. The Welsh international then hit a low shot from eight yards past Barber. Luton refused to lie down and again equalised when Jim Ryan's far post cross was met by Peter Spiring who headed past Stevenson.

In the 53rd minute Burnley regained the lead as James, in brilliant form, beat two defenders and his pass found Hankin who scored from ten yards out with a right foot shot, to make it 3-0. Luton brought on substitute Adrian Alston for the last fifteen minutes and the Australian had an effort cleared off the line by Noble, whilst Alan Stevenson made excellent saves from Spiring, Jim Ryan and in particular from ex-Claret Alan West's twenty yard rocket shot. 11,816 saw the Clarets victory and the two teams lined up: Luton Town — Barber, John Ryan, Faulkner, Garner, Thomson, John Ryan, Anderson, West, Husband, Spiring, Aston. Sub: Alston (replaced Husband — 75 minutes).

Burnley — Stevenson, Newton, Waldron, Rodaway, Brennan, Ingham, Noble, Collins, Hankin, Fletcher, James. Sub — Flynn (not used).

Luton's programmes had a bright orange, blue and white cover, contained 16 pages and was priced at 10p. The content included a two page feature on Alan West, two pages on Burnley and two pages of statistics.

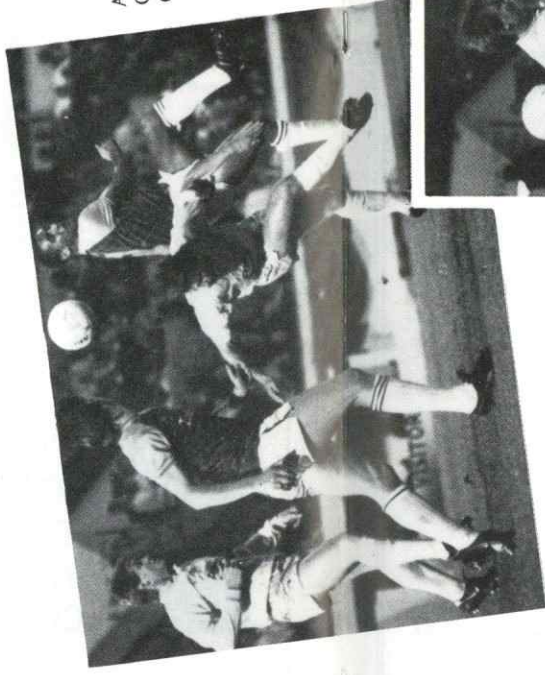

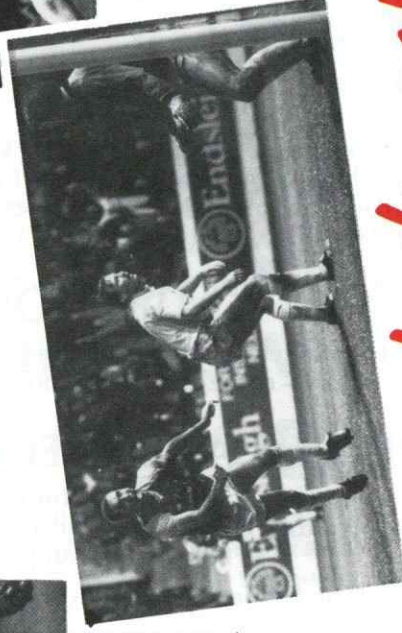

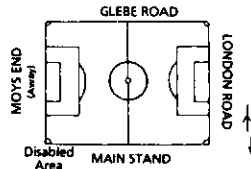

A TO Z OF THE CLARETS

MILLER, DAVID — Born Burnley, January 8th, 1964. Son, of course, of our manager Brian Miller. David came to Turf Moor as an apprentice in July 1980 and made his full league debut on October 18th, 1983 in a 3-0 win over Southend United at Turf Moor, Miller scoring the Clarets second goal. Spent 3 games on loan to Crewe during the 1982-83 season. He left Burnley in May 1985 on a free transfer and joined Tranmere Rovers. Made 25 appearances and scored 1 goal but was released in May 1986 and moved into non-league football with Colne Dynamos.

Joined Preston North End in December 1986 and at the start of this season had made 43 appearances, scoring 2 goals.

Burnley League Record: Appearances 27, Goals 3.

MILNER, JAMES — Born Newcastle, February 3rd, 1933. Signed for Burnley in December 1952 from Blyth Spartans. He spent five years at Turf Moor in the reserves before moving on to Darlington in December 1957. Played in 148 games, scoring 27 goals. Milner in 1961 returned to the north west to play for Accrington Stanley and Tranmere Rovers. He made 16 appearances for Rovers, scoring 3 goals.

Burnley League Record: Appearances 1.

MORGAN, WILLIE — Born Glasgow, October 2nd, 1944. Joined Burnley as a junior in October 1961 and quickly progressed through the ranks to make his league debut against Sheffield Wednesday at Hillsborough on April 23rd, 1963 in a 1-0 win. It was in the following season that he began to establish himself as a regular first team player, still only nineteen years old.

In 1968 Morgan made his debut for Scotland against Northern Ireland and it was shortly after this that he asked for a transfer, Leeds offering £75,000 but Manchester United eventually securing Morgan and paying £117,000. He spent seven years at Old Trafford, making 236 appearances and scoring 24 goals. When he was released by United in May 1975 he returned to Turf Moor and signed for Jimmy Adamson. It was a short and unsuccessful stay and in March 1976 he moved to Bolton Wanderers where he played in 154 games scoring 10 goals. He ended his league career playing 42 games for Blackpool and then had a spell in America.

Burnley League Record: Appearances 195, Goals 19.

MORLEY, TONY — Born Ormskirk, August 26th, 1954. Began his career with Preston North End in August 1970 and made 78 league appearances, scoring 15 goals. Signed for Burnley by Joe Brown in February 1976 for £80,000 and spent 2½ years at Turf Moor, winning an Anglo Scottish Cup winners medal.

Left in June 1979 to join Aston Villa for £220,000 and in 137 games and with 25 goals helped Villa to the League Championship, European Cup Winners and also won six England caps. Moved to West Brom in 1984, had 33 games and scored 4 goals plus a spell on loan to Birmingham City where he scored 3 goals in 4 games. At the start of the 1985-86 season he joined Hong Kong club Seiko, followed by a spell in Holland with Den Haag. Returned to West Brom in August 1987 and prior to the start of the season had made 28 appearances, scoring 7 goals.

Burnley League Record: Appearances 78, Goals 5.

100 YEARS ON

Our sixth football league match, was a return game with Wolverhampton Wanderers at Turf Moor on October 13th, 1888. A large crowd saw Burnley have most of the early play with Gallocher shooting narrowly wide. It was Wolves though who took the lead on 15 minutes only for Brady to score for Burnley, but this was disallowed. Tait hit the post as Burnley continued to attack and Wolves' keeper Baynton made several good saves.

Wolves took a two goal lead when they scored after Lang miskicked and just before half time they made it 3-0. The second half saw Burnley's fowards continually being thwarted by the Wolves' defence and then near the end Wolves completed a 4-0 victory.

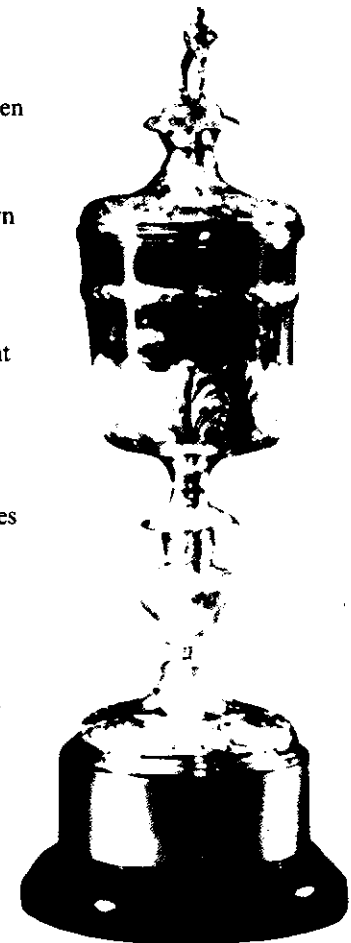
