We created plenty of chances and scored two more excellent goals, but in the end we paid the penalty for a couple of unfortunate and uncharacteristic defensive errors.

You tend to get punished for your mistakes in the First Division, but overall it was another encouraging performance and we could easily have come away with the points.

I'm sure everyone who was there must have enjoyed the match – and a special vote of thanks was in order to those **Millwall** fans who made the marathon trip to Ayresome Park.

Your support, as usual, was greatly appreciated and I hope the journey home wasn't too miserable.

These notes had to be written before our mid-week Littlewoods Cup game at **Aston Villa**, so unfortunately I can't comment on that match.

But despite our defeat at **Middlesbrough** I am delighted with the start we have made, and confident that we can bounce straight back against **Luton** this afternoon.

Ray Harford's side are struggling to find their best form, but they showed what they are capable of last season when they won the Littlewoods Cup, were beaten in the Final of the Simod Cup and reached the semi-finals of the F.A. Cup.

Our last home game against **Nottingham Forest** was a real thriller with **Neil Ruddock** doing his supersub act and rescuing a point with an excellent late header.

At 2-0 down we looked dead and buried, but the players showed tremendous character and if the game had gone on for another five minutes we might have nicked it.

If we can show the same sort of character and determination today I'm sure we'll get the right result – but hopefully we won't leave it quite so late.

Those sort of last gasp heroics may make for great entertainment, but they are not too good for my heart!

Saturday November 12th 1988



INTO-THE LIONS-DEN

RAY HARFORD (Team Manager)

After a successful year as First Team Coach, Halifax born Harford's talent and belief in attractive play made him the natural successor to **John Moore** in the summer of 1987 and in his first season as manager steered the Club to Littlewoods Cup triumph.

A former half-back he learnt his trade at **Charlton** making his League debut in 1965. Following a transfer to **Exeter** in January 1966 he made over 350 League appearances for several clubs in the lower divisions before finishing his playing career at **Colchester** who offered him his first coaching post.

He came to **Luton** in the summer of 1986 following a spell as Manager of **Fulham**.



STEVE FOSTER (Player/Coach)

Harford's first move as Manager was to appoint Club Captain **Foster** as Player/Coach - a recognition of his exceptional qualities of leadership.

Portsmouth born **Foster** joined his local club as an apprentice breaking into the first team as a forward in 1975/76 - his home debut was actually against **Luton**. He moved to centre-back during the following season and after 135 League and Cup appearances was transferred to **Brighton** for £150,000 in 1979 following the Seagulls' promotion to Division One.

During his spell at the Goldstone Ground he earned three **England** caps, played in the 1982 World Cup as well as appearing in the 1983 F.A. Cup Final.

He moved to **Aston Villa** for £200,000 after **Brighton's** relegation and from there joined **Luton** in December 1984 for a bargain £70,000. TOTAL LEAGUE AND CUP APPEARANCES FOR LUTON TO END 1987/88: 164 - GOALS 11.

IAN ALLINSON

Although born in Hitchin, **Allinson** made his League bow for **Colchester** against **Preston** in April 1975 in the same side as **Ray Harford**.

Made 308 League appearances for the "Us" before a contractual slip up made him a free agent and he signed for his boyhood favourites **Arsenal** in 1983.

After four years in and out of the "Gunners" side he joined Second Division **Stoke** in the summer of 1987 but was grateful to accept his old friend **Harford's** offer to come to **Luton** only a few months later. TOTAL LEAGUE AND CUP APPEARANCES FOR LUTON TO END 1987/88: 52 - GOALS 4.

PAUL GRAY

Promising Portsmouth born youngster who is expected to press for a first place this season.

Made his debut in a Simod Cup tie at **Everton** in February 1988.

JULIAN JAMES

Locally born James is another from the Town's youth scheme hoping to make a name for himself.

Came on as substitute three times towards the end of last season including the 1-1 draw at **Anfield**. TOTAL LEAGUE AND CUP APPEARANCES FOR LUTON TO END 1987/88: 3 - GOALS 0.

ALEC CHAMBERLAIN

Made his League debut for **Colchester** in January 1983 and after many fine displays **Everton** were prompted to pay £80,000 for his services in the summer of 1987.

Unfortunately, due to the form of **Welsh** International **Neville Southall**, he did not manage a League appearance at **Goodison Park** but instead had a spell on loan at **Tranmere**.

Signed for **Luton** last close season.

ROY WEGERLE

South African born **Wegerle** was signed by **Chelsea** from **Tampa Bay Rowdies** for £100,000 two years ago.

A £75,000 signing by the Town last close season to add proper strength to the first team squad.

MICK HARFORD

At the time **Luton Town's** record cash signing, at £250,000, from **Birmingham** in December 1984.

Sunderland born, **Harford** commenced his League career with **Lincoln** where 46 goals in 126 appearances encouraged **Newcastle** to pay £180,000 for his services in December 1980.

He never really settled at **St James Park** and the following close season **Bristol City** took him to **Ashton Gate**. City were in a perilous financial state and were unable to fully pay the fee so six months later he was re-signed by **Newcastle** and promptly transferred to **Birmingham**.

He was therefore on the books of three clubs on the same day!

He enjoyed some success with **Birmingham** in a struggling side but was prised away by **Luton** where he has played the best football of his career fully deserving his **England** call up in 1987/88.

TOTAL LEAGUE AND CUP APPEARANCES FOR LUTON TO END 1987/88: 136 - GOALS 66.

RICKY HILL

He joined **Luton** straight from school and is currently enjoying his 13th full season.

He made his League debut at home to **Bristol Rovers** over Easter 1976 coming on as substitute for current Town coach **John Faulkner**. Layed on a goal with his first touch and scored with his second.

Was included in **Bobby Robson's** first squad in 1982 and made his **England** debut against **Denmark**. Still in **Robson's** thoughts as proved by his call-up against **Egypt** two seasons ago.

Broke his ankle on **Boxing Day** 1987 but made a swift recovery to star in the Littlewoods Cup Final win.

An ambassador for the game who enjoyed a successful testimonial in 1986.

TOTAL LEAGUE AND CUP APPEARANCES FOR LUTON TO END 1987/88: 463 GOALS - 59.

DARRON McDONOUGH

Belgium born **McDonough** scored on his League debut for **Oldham** against **Notts County** in December 1980 thereby joining an exclusive club.

He signed for **Luton** in 1986 in exchange for £87,000 to become a versatile and valuable member of the squad.

Was unfortunate to be injured just before the Town's Littlewoods Cup Final win.

TOTAL LEAGUE AND CUP APPEARANCES FOR LUTON TO END 1987/88: 58 - GOALS 7.

GARY COBB

Local lad **Cobb** made his debut in the win at **Charlton** towards the end of 1986/87 where he set up the only goal of the game.

He earned his elevation after several fine performances in the Football Combination side.

TOTAL LEAGUE AND CUP APPEARANCES FOR LUTON TO END 1987/88: 9 - GOALS 0.

BRIAN STEIN

South African born striker who was signed from **Edgware** in October 1977 and within weeks was appearing for **Luton** at **Old Trafford** in a twice replayed Football League Cup tie against **Manchester City**.

He scored twice in his first full League home game and has not looked back since, netting freely in all subsequent seasons.

Deceptively fast and difficult to knock off the ball **Stein** has been extremely unlucky not to have added to his solitary **England** cap against **France** in 1983/84.

Was the Town's matchwinner in the Littlewoods Cup Final scoring twice with the second slammed home in injury time.

TOTAL LEAGUE AND CUP APPEARANCES FOR LUTON TO END 1987/88: 451 - GOALS 148.

MARK STEIN

Brian's younger brother who signed professional forms for **Luton** in January 1984 making his debut three months later in a 3-0 home defeat by **Everton**.

He had to wait nearly 18 months for his next League game but has gradually forced his way into the side with last season being his most successful to date as 11 goals in 25 League appearances proves.

TOTAL LEAGUE AND CUP APPEARANCES FOR LUTON TO END 1987/88: 68 - GOALS 22.

DANNY WILSON

Ray Harford's first major signing, from **Brighton**, in the summer of 1987.

Born in **Wigan** on January 1st 1960 he made his League debut for **Bury** in season 1977/78 before being transferred to **Chesterfield** three years later.

His performances for the "Spirites" inspired **Brian Clough** to take him to **Nottingham Forest** in January 1983 but things did not work out at the City Ground and he moved to **Brighton** only ten months later.

Qualifies for **Northern Ireland** through parentage and is now a regular in the International side.

TOTAL LEAGUE AND CUP APPEARANCES FOR LUTON TO END 1987/88: 52 - GOALS 10.

ASHLEY GRIMES

Dublin born **Grimes** played the early part of his career with **Manchester United** where he had 90 League games and appeared regularly for **Eire**.

Transferred to **Coventry** in August 1983, he joined **Luton** a year later in a straight swap for **Kirk Stephens** but was then plagued with injuries during his first two seasons at **Kenilworth Road**.

Now back to his best form he fully deserved his recall to the **Eire** team in 1987/88.

TOTAL LEAGUE AND CUP APPEARANCES FOR LUTON TO END 1987/88: 94 - GOALS 4.

TIM BREAKER

Bicester born **Breaker** has been a regular member of the first team since his debut at **Ipswich** in 1984.

This **England Under-21** International can perform in midfield but his normal position is right back where his surging runs on the overlap have become a strong feature of his play.

The Town only "ever present" during 1987/88 making 58 competitive appearances.

TOTAL LEAGUE AND CUP APPEARANCES FOR LUTON TO END 1987/88: 175 - GOALS 2.

ROB JOHNSON

Born in **Bedford** and turning professional for the Town in August 1979 his career was almost over before it started.

He suffered two extremely serious knee injuries which would have put most players out of the game but he fought back to make his debut against **Birmingham** in

November 1983. TOTAL LEAGUE AND CUP APPEARANCES FOR LUTON TO END 1987/88: 98 - GOALS 0.

RICHARD HARVEY

Born at **Letchworth** in April 1969, **Harvey**, following a number of fine performances for the Combination side as well as captaining the successful Youth Team, made his deserved full League debut at home to **Queens Park Rangers** in November 1986.

Made four further appearances towards the end of 1986/87, showing maturity beyond his years and is now recognised as a First team squad member.

He has toured South America with the **England Under-19** squad.

TOTAL LEAGUE AND CUP APPEARANCES FOR LUTON TO END 1987/88: 7 - GOALS 0.

EMEKA NWAJIOBI

Unpredictable **Nigerian** International who burst on the scene with a scoring debut against **Nottingham Forest** on 2nd January 1984 only weeks after transferring from **Dulwich Hamlet**.

On his day a matchwinner who makes goalscoring look easy.

TOTAL LEAGUE AND CUP APPEARANCES FOR LUTON TO END 1987/88: 85 - GOALS 19.

DAVID PREECE

Bridgnorth born **Preece** signed professional forms for **Walsall** in July 1980 and made 134 appearances for the "Saddlers" before **Luton** paid £150,000 for his services in December 1984.

He made a scoring debut that same month at home to **Aston Villa** and has since become a firm crowd favourite because of his busy style of play.

Has appeared in only 30 League and Cup games in the last two seasons through injury.

TOTAL LEAGUE AND CUP APPEARANCES FOR LUTON TO END 1987/88: 101 - GOALS 6.

LES SEALEY

Although born and raised in the East End of **London** **Sealey** made his League bow with **Coventry** for whom he signed in March 1976.

Played 178 times for the "Sky Blues" before transferring to **Luton** in August 1983 for £100,000.

Has found himself out of favour on more than one occasion but has fought back with many superlative displays to become the acknowledged number one.

TOTAL LEAGUE AND CUP APPEARANCES FOR LUTON TO END 1987/88: 214 - GOALS 0.

KINGSLEY BLACK

Hit the headlines with his performance in the Littlewoods Cup Final which prompted both **Billy Bingham** and **Bobby Robson** to fight for his International services.

Although **Luton** born he chose **Northern Ireland** which made his father a happy man.

Only made his League debut in October last year in the game at **Q.P.R.**

Pacey, skilful outside-left who is set to tease many a defender.

TOTAL LEAGUE AND CUP APPEARANCES FOR LUTON TO END 1987/88: 18 - GOALS 0.

MARVIN JOHNSON

Another former member of the talented Youth side. **Wembley** born **Johnson** signed professional forms last season and is knocking on the first team door for a regular place.

He has exceptional pace for a big man and has proved his worth with fine displays as deputy for both **Foster** and **Donaghy**.

TOTAL LEAGUE AND CUP APPEARANCES FOR LUTON TO END 1987/88: 9 - GOALS 0.

JOHN DREYER

Close season signing at a cost of £140,000 from **Oxford United**. Joined **United** from **Wallingford Town** and appeared on loan for **Torquay** and **Fulham** before making his **Oxford** debut at home to **Coventry** in October 1986.

STEVE WILLIAMS

The Town's record signing at £300,000 **Williams** brings with him to **Kenilworth Road** a wealth of experience gained playing for **Southampton**, **Arsenal** and **England**.

Made his League debut for the Saints in 1975/76 and signed for **Arsenal** for £550,000 in 1984.


YES, AT THE DEN

Due to our ticket allocation for our match at **Liverpool** being sold within one day, the demand by our supporters for **Liverpool** tickets has been such that it has been decided that, with the co-operation of **Liverpool Football Club**, to arrange for our supporters to see the match live on close circuit television screens similar to the arrangements we did for our match v **Bournemouth** last season, except that we hope to improve the standard by increasing the cover to five large screens. The placing of the screens is shown on the diagram below. The cost to the Club for this venture will be an estimated **£40,000**. Unfortunately to cover the high cost involved admission charges will be as follows:-

Terrace: **£5.00** (no reductions)
 Seats: **£7.00** or **£8.00** for reserved seats
 (no reductions) in Blocks B to F inclusive

This match will be all pay, season tickets and membership cards will not be valid. Stand season ticket holders will have up to **Monday 7th November** to purchase their seats. 

United were beaten 1-2 at home by **Aston Villa**. **Peter Withe** got both the **Villa** goals, **Bryan Robinson** replying for United.


So there was great incentive for **Liverpool** in their live televised Sunday game against **Everton** at Anfield. **Ian Rush**, **Michael Robinson** and **Steve Nicol** all scored in a 3-0 **Liverpool** win which drew them level on points with United.

10 YEARS AGO:

Oldham's Ian Wood conceded an own-goal in the opening minute of our Second Division game at The Den. **Graham Bell** equalised 12 minutes afterwards but, within a further minute, **Bryan Hamilton** had restored our lead. Season by Season by Ted Wilding 1944-45

This particular season was certainly one of mixed fortunes for the Club.

Having had their worst season during Wartime football, the Club were to reach the FINAL of the League South Cup, which was staged at Wembley.

MILLWALL lost their first match of the season 3-6 at **Aldershot** after gaining a point at **Luton** (0-0) The Lions lost their next five

matches: **Southampton** (H) 1-4, **Charlton** (H) 1-3, **Brentford** (A) 1-4, **Arsenal** (H) 1-4 and **Q.P.R.** (A) 1-4.

A goalless draw at home to **Portsmouth** was followed by four more defeats: **Chelsea** (A) 0-7, **West Ham** (H) 0-3, **Crystal Palace** (H) 1-2 and **Tottenham** (H) 3-4. A further six matches yielded just three points.

The Lions record by December 23rd 1944 read:

P18 W0 D5 L13 F26 A59 Pts5
MILLWALL secured their first win when defeating local rivals **Charlton** 4-1 at The Valley on December 28th.

The remaining eleven matches produced four wins and two draws which enabled The Lions to avoid the bottom rung of the League table, by goal average.

In the League South Cup Competition **Millwall** won their Group 2 table and met **Arsenal** (winners of Group 1) in the Semi-Final at Stamford Bridge. A crowd of over 49,000 saw The Lions gain a 1-0 victory over The Gunners, thanks to a **Jimmy Jinks** goal. Lady luck smiled on **Millwall** that day for The **Arsenal** missed two penalties.

On April 7th 1945 in front of a 90,000 crowd **Millwall** lost the Final tie to **Chelsea** by two goals to nil.

Team: Bartram (Charlton), Dudley, Fisher (G.), Ludford (Spurs), Smith (E.), Tyler, Rawlings, Brown (R.) (Charlton), Jinks, Brown (T.) and Williams (Aberdeen).

TRIBUTE TO TED HINTON

Millwall supporters will be sorry, as we were, to hear of the recent death in Belfast of goal-keeper **Ted Hinton**, who made 91 League appearances for us between 1949 and 1952. He was 66.

Ted joined us from **Fulham**, whom he had helped win the Second Division Championship in 1949.

He was one of the outstanding Irish goal-keepers of the early post-war years and, having played Wartime football for **Glentoran** and **Distillery**, he came into the Football League with **Fulham**.

He was capped seven times by **Northern Ireland**, and was their hero in the famous 2-2 draw against **England** at Goodison Park on November 5th, 1947 – the climax of his display that day being a penalty save from **Wilf Mannion**.

After leaving The Den, Ted returned home across the Irish Sea, and played out his career with **Bangor** and, finally, **Ballymena United**.



"MILLWALL HAVE ALWAYS BEEN MY TEAM"

LIONS marksman **Dean Horrix's** first team opportunities have been few and very far between since he moved back to The Den six months ago.

But you won't find the popular **Millwall** striker hammering on the manager's door and demanding a transfer!

'I've got no regrets whatsoever,' he stressed. 'I came back to The Den because I thought **Millwall** were capable of getting promotion to the First Division and things worked out perfectly last season.'

'**Millwall** have always been my team. I supported the club as a boy, I started my career at The Den and I was delighted when I got the chance to return.'

Horrix kicked off his career as an apprentice at The Den and made over 70 First Team performances before moving on, first for a brief spell with **Gillingham** and then to **Reading**.

The Taplow born striker built up a good relationship with the fans during his first spell at The Den and that made his decision to return even easier.

'It meant missing out on a trip to Wembley because **Reading** had reached the Final of the Simod Cup,' he recalled. 'But that only played on my mind for a minute or two.'

'I am **Millwall** through and through and when **John Docherty** came in for me last season I couldn't quite believe my luck, it really was a dream move.'

'The fans at **Millwall** are in a different class, and in a funny sort of way I've noticed the atmosphere more since I've been sitting in the stand.'

'I've never heard anything like the noise they made when the lads pulled back to 2-1 during the **Nottingham Forest** game a couple of weeks ago.'





'They were willing the team to get that second goal and I am sure it must have made a big difference to the lads. It certainly got me going up in the stand!'

COMING NEXT NEWCASTLE UNITED

Unless we are involved in a Littlewoods Cup replay with **Aston Villa**, our next game at The Den will be against **Barnsley** in the Simod Cup next Wednesday. Whilst there were doubts about our next Cup opposition, we do know for certain that our next visitors in the First Division will be **Newcastle United** in a fortnight's time.

The Magpies have been going through a pretty miserable period, and after they had been beaten 0-3 at home by **Coventry** early in October, manager **Willie McFaul** was relieved of his duties.

Newcastle have since extended their search for a successor throughout Europe and some of the game's leading managers have rejected their approach. But the directors expect to make an

appointment - if one has not already been made over the past few days - before they come to The Den.

Ironically, **Newcastle's** only win in their opening eight First Division games was over reigning Champions **Liverpool** (2-1) at Anfield. Their only other away point was collected from **Charlton** (2-2) and they lost at **Everton** (0-4), **Derby** (0-2), and **West Ham** (0-2) in the League, at **Sheffield United** (0-3) in the Littlewoods Cup and at **Manchester United** (0-2) in the Mercantile Credit Centenary Trophy.

Though **Newcastle** won the home leg of their Littlewoods Cup tie by 2-0 against **Sheffield United**, they lost on aggregate to the Third Division side.

Newcastle's plight is difficult to

define as they have some highly talented players in their side, none more so than the **Brazilian** international striker **Mirandinha** who has scored four times so far.

Wimbledon goalkeeper **Dave Beasant** and centre-back **Andy Thorn** both moved to **Newcastle** in the summer when the Georgies also signed forward **John Hendrie**, from **Bradford City**.

Northern Ireland international **Michael O'Neill**, who scored 13 times last season, has not yet got off the mark this term.

There seems little doubt that **Newcastle** are currently in a false position close to the bottom of the table and that, when they have the stabilising influence of a new manager, we can expect to see them rise to a healthy position in the table.




