

We are now entering our second year and our committee felt that Hatters fans in general might find our brief history interesting. The idea of a club was born one evening in 1987 at one of the regular meetings held by our former chairman David Evans MP. Mr Evans said the board felt the time was right for a supporters club to be formed after lobbying from many fans. Mr Evans asked for volunteers and a number of people left their names. Bill Tomlins had also supported the formation of a club and said it would fill a need in the structure of the Football Club.

During the following summer, the club was formed when the interested people were contacted by the football club. A meeting was held, the club was formed and Mr Tomlins offered to act as a liaison man between the FC and the Luton Town Supporters Club. It was quickly decided that regular meetings were needed. A series of 'guest speaker' evenings were planned. These included Town manager Ray Harford, Luton News sports editor Brian Swain and ITV's Nick Owen as speakers. Mr Owen was appointed as president of the Supporters Club and Mr Owen as vice-president.

Several other events have been arranged. These included a pre-Wembley disco, a well-attended presentation evening (when Mick Harford won two awards as the players' player and the supporters' player of the year), a tour of Wembley for junior supporters and the launch of our newsletter Hatters News.

We believe the Supporters Club can be a link between the fan on the terrace and the administration and management at Kenilworth Road. The future looks exciting. Committee representatives will be present in the stewards' room at the back of the main stand after each game for 30 minutes to talk to present and future members. Other plans are being discussed - football games against other clubs, quiz evenings and, hopefully, our own permanent premises.

Our membership in the 1988-89 close season was nearly 500 and we hope it will continue to grow. Sincere thanks to all who have supported the committee. We wish them and Luton Town a happy and successful season.

That would be a particular pleasure for us as the Valley was the first ground on which we played in the First Division following our promotion in 1955.

New plans

Our own relocation plans have been occupying the board very much and they are directing much attention to them. This explains why we are reviewing plans for a proposed new ticket office.

The current temporary accommodation could become a permanent feature and will be moved back to the original site of the ticket office in Kenilworth Road. Our ticket office staff would not be unhappy at this as they like the new environment. I hope all our supporters find it is working satisfactorily.

We had some problems with our gatemen for the fixture against Liverpool when 10 did not turn up. Four 'reserves' helped us fill some of the positions, but there were some brief delays on Maple Road, in the drizzle, shortly before the kick-off.

Looking ahead, we will be facing Mansfield Town in the second round of the Littlewoods Cup with a visit to Field Mill - where we clinched promotion to the Second Division in 1970 - on September 19 and the return leg here on October 3.

Once again we are asking our own supporters to assist in the accommodation of visitors who will be given the K1 section of the Kenilworth terrace for our home leg. Supporters in F and G blocks in the main stand will not have to give up their positions and, as is our policy, prices will be reduced for the early rounds of the cup.

For the away leg, we urge as many of our supporters to travel as possible. We have a tradition to look after in the competition. Finally, a mention of the Football Association, who helped me greatly recently by staying on late to assist in the international clearance of Lars Elstrup to play for us. It was truly appreciated by us all and shows the spirit of the game.

LORD HILL - A GOOD FRIEND


Like Many Other people and organisations in our community, we are mourning the loss of a good friend with the passing of Lord Hill of Luton.


As MP for Luton for 13 years he was a real servant of the people, and we were delighted when he accepted a vice presidency of Luton Town FC after his distinguished career in politics.

Cup holders on August 26, but had to settle for just one after a tight and intriguing match. Chances were relatively few and far between with Liverpool perhaps edging ahead on opportunities in the closing minutes when Alec Chamberlain confirmed his high promise in goal.

John Barnes was particularly frustrated by Chamberlain's agility and anticipation with one well-flighted effort producing a wonderful diving save from the goalkeeper. It was an effort he was to repeat in almost carbon-copy style four days later at Loftus Road when the Town won a well-deserved point from Queen's Park Rangers.




very hard for each other. That's how I like my football - all for one and one for all. So, I'm happy.

"I know for example that if you are not producing the goods you are out. On the bench or up in the stands. But that is fair and right. And that is why we have such good spirit. Everyone knows there is someone else just waiting for a chance to get into the team in your place."

Some critics have accused Mick of being a physical player. But he says: "I know I can play and anyone who has seen me a bit knows I can play. You don't get into the First Division and play in a skilful team like this one if all you can do is kick. I am sure everyone knows that and it doesn't really bother me at all. It is my job to get the midfield going and to hold it together."

Instant promotion

"It was a bit like getting instant promotion," said Mick last week as he reflected on the eve-of-the season move which suddenly lifted him back into the First Division and our opening day clash with Spurs at White Hart Lane.

"The first I knew about it was at about nine in the morning on the Thursday before the match and I was a Luton Town player by a quarter to five. It was that quick - but I have had no regrets at all. The club is great and I have settled in well. And - the most important thing of all to me - I am really enjoying my football."

Mick's move to Kenilworth Road has given him his chance of a second spell in the First Division. His first came with Portsmouth when they were in the top flight in 1987-88. "I love it," he said. "There is more quality in the play and in this team everyone is working

Experienced man

Up to the end of last season Mick had made 408 league appearances for his six clubs. He is an experienced professional and has won two caps for the Republic of Ireland. Now he hopes to win some more. "I think I have a chance now with being back in the First Division. I just hope Jack Charlton takes notice of us. The team have played well so far and that must help me too."

Mick believes the current Town team is well capable of having a good season. he said: "We should have come away with some reward at Spurs and were unlucky not to win at QPR so I think we have proved we can do things away from home. The spirit and the skill level is excellent. All the experts and their predictions do not count for anything and we shall prove them all wrong."





OFF THE RECORD

A DAY TO REMEMBER WHEN WE SHOOK OFF THE SUMMER LETHARGY

Luton Town started 1977/78 with a dull 1-0 home win over Orient followed by a deadly 1-0 defeat at Oldham with the only sign of passion coming from Paul Futcher who was sent off for his troubles, writes club statistician Roger Wash.

We then travelled to First Division Wolves for a Second Round League Cup tie expecting the worst but were shocked when the Town shook off their early season lethargy by winning 3-1 in a sparkling performance.

Ever optimistic we turned up at Kenilworth Road the next Saturday to see if the tide had turned and came away at the end swearing that we had witnessed the potential champions.

Charlton, the visitors that day, had started the season unbeaten and with the Town missing John Aston - transferred to Mansfield and Phil Boersma - pulled hamstring - they obviously fancied their chances especially as their record at Kenilworth Road at the time was fairly good.

The Town opened like world beaters and encamped in the Charlton half before opening the scoring after 19 minutes when Jim Husband, taking advantage of a short free-kick, cracked and unstoppable shot past Jeff Wood.

It was no surprise when the scoreline was doubled ten minutes later with a Steve Buckley "special" but it was amazing that there was no further scoring before half-time.

The Town thrashed Swansea 5-0 at Kenilworth Road to go top of the Second Division table for the first time since 1971. The goalscorers, before a crowd of 10,004, were David Moss (2), Bob Hatton, Alan West and Ricky Hill.

IT HAPPENED 30 YEARS AGO THIS WEEK ...

9th September 1959

The home defeat by Manchester City was the third in four starts signalling a disastrous season which saw the Town relegated from Division One.

Allan Brown was the Luton scorer in the 2-1 reversal watched by a crowd of 13,122.

The Town made up for this in the second half however with Ricky Hill making it 3-0 on the hour with a shot from outside the box that appeared to be going over the bar but dipped at the last second to leave Wood floundering.

Soon after, the Town were four up when Husband walked through the static Charlton defence to leave poor Wood helpless but the biggest cheer of the afternoon came five minutes later when Gary Heale, making his league debut as replacement for Boerama nodded home a perfect cross from current Luton coach John Faulkner.

In the 75th minute the Town were awarded a penalty for handball and with Husband on for a hat-trick he was handed the ball. His apology for a spot-kick limped over the line past a wrong-footed Wood but he was not finished as twelve minutes from the end he headed his fourth and the Towns seventh from another cross from Faulkner.

That Charlton scored a consolation from the penalty spot just before the end mattered not for the win was still the biggest for twenty years.

CHARLTON

- Charlton manager Lennie Lawrence was the first Barclays Manager of the Month for the new season. He guided the Valiants to third in the table on August 30 when they beat Chelsea 3-0.
- Brighton-born Lawrence played for Croydon, Carshalton and Sutton, but began his coaching career as assistant manager at Plymouth under Malcolm Allison. After working for Lincoln he moved to Charlton and became manager 1982.
- Lawrence is a former schoolmaster and one of the two most successful managers in Charlton's history. Jimmy Seed is the other – he took Charlton up to the First Division in 1936 and to Wembley four times. Lawrence led them up in 1986.
- Charlton opened the season with one win and three draws. England under-21 striker Paul Williams scored three of their six goals to become the First Division's top scorer after four games.
- Charlton's team for the 3-0 win over Chelsea was: Bolder, Humphrey, Reid, Peake, McLaughlin, Pates, R. Lee, Williams, Jones (Watson 69), Walsh (Mcckenzie 70), Mortimer.
- In 1984, Charlton faced up to and overcame a crisis: court actions, closure threats, voluntary liquidation, players locked out of their famous Valley stadium and then the move to Selhurst Park. Two years later they won promotion under Lawrence.

- Charlton announced on March 23, 1989, that they will return to the Valley. Chairman Roger Alwen asked for volunteers to help and on April 2, in torrential rain, 2,000 fans turned out.
- A family atmosphere pervades Charlton. Former players like Mike Flanagan and Colin Powell remain as chief coach and groundsman.
- Lawrence is Charlton's 11th post-war manager. The club was founded in 1905 and turned professional in 1920. Charlton's record attendance is 75,031 at the Valley to see an F.A. Cup fifth round match against Aston Villa on February 12, 1938.
- Sam Bartram, who was a manager at Kenilworth Road in the early 1960's, holds the record as Charlton's longest-serving player. He made a record total of 583 appearances between 1934 and 1956.
- Charlton were runners-up in Division One in 1936-37, just 12 months after winning promotion as runners-up in Division Two. They won Division Three (South) in 1928-29 in 1934-45 and won the F.A. Cup in 1947 when they beat Burnley 1-0 after extra time. The previous year they lost 4-1 to Derby after extra time.
- Current Luton Town boss Ray Harford began his career with Charlton in May 1965. He made three league appearances before leaving for Exeter.

CLOSED CIRCUIT TELEVISION



The first televised football match, 1937

Now every Football League ground is equipped with television cameras.

The Football Trust has installed Closed Circuit Television systems at more than 110 British grounds. The cameras have a range of 150 metres and immediate close-up prints can be produced. Within minutes of an incident offenders can be identified and arrested with film made available as evidence in court. CCTV is the most effective anti-hooligan measure inside football grounds and the programme has been extended to include portable systems.

CCTV is only one of The Football Trust's many initiatives. Each year it receives over £9.5 million from the Spotting-the-Ball competition run by Littlewoods, Vernons and Zetters and spends it on projects that benefit all levels of the game throughout the United Kingdom.


