

The decision by the football authorities to instruct that no artificial surfaces may be retained in the First and Second Divisions after two years, does I'm afraid sadly reflect the deplorable state which the game is in these days owing to an 18th century attitude which is adopted by the people who have been given the responsibility for controlling the sport.

I think anyone who has watched English Internationals ploughing through ankle-deep mud in the middle of January and then wonder why, in the middle of June, they cannot match the skills of Holland, Russia etc must support the introduction of more artificial surfaces.

The considerable additional uses which these surfaces offer also is far reaching and advantageous and I am amazed that the controlling bodies cannot accept these facts.

DOUBLE TRIUMPH SETS UP CUP SPECIAL FOR THE YOUNGSTERS

Good afternoon and welcome to Wimbledon. We have had a busy cup week with the first team away on Tuesday in the Littlewoods Cup, winning 4-3 at Mansfield Town and the youth team going one better by winning in two different competitions, as reported on page 23 of this programme.

Our youngsters have obviously caught the eye in recent times and both Alan O'Sullivan and Ken Gillard were selected for Ireland who played in France this week.

The youth team's efforts saw them overcome Aston Villa and Reading respectively in the Southern Junior Floodlit Cup and the South East Counties League Cup. The reward for the Reading win is a home clash with Norwich in the second round on October 21.

Finally, at our match next week at Manchester City there will be no standing room made available for visiting supporters. Seats will be on sale on the day for £6.

1st Team ACTION

HARD-EARNED TRIUMPH Luton Town 1 Charlton 0

A hard-earned but thoroughly deserved victory over Charlton at Kenilworth Road on September 9 lifted the Town to their highest league position in more than two years.

Danny Wilson's successful 59th minute spot kick, after Mark Reid had fouled Roy Wegerle, ended the Londoners unbeaten record and hoisted the Town to seventh place after a run of four games without conceding a goal.

But it was not always a pretty sight and at the end of a tight and combative afternoon the result was a source of greater pleasure to most fans than the entertainment on a day when our new Danish international striker Lars Elstrup made his full league debut for Luton Town.

Elstrup had a quiet first 45 minutes but showed much more of the skill and pace which had attracted Town manager Ray Harford's attention in the second half. He came into the team as Steve Williams went out following a cartilage operation.

There were few clear-cut chances and the game was won by the finest piece of skill on a tight afternoon. A long ball from the impressive David Beaumont found Roy Wegerle and it was after his quick exchange of passes with Elstrup that Reid bundled him over. Wilson scored his second penalty of the season with his usual elan.



he is happy and if a defender is keeping clean sheets he will be too.

"I think we are more well-drilled now than at any time I have been at the club. We are more compact and a better unit and it may be because we play as an eight-man unit sometimes that we are so strong at the back and not so adventurous going forward.

"But you are always going to get chances in a game and as soon as we get some luck we shall start scoring. We could have won at Coventry for example with a bit of luck. Maybe with the penalty."

Favourite Position

In his first year at Kenilworth Road, John has been used as both a centre-half and as a left-back. he prefers the lateral position. He said: "I suppose it is my favourite of the two but if I had a regular place in the side at centre-back and we did well I would not be complaining.

"We are a much-improved side and I am sure we will do better this year than last. I shall be happy with a good top half of the table finish, but we could do even better. We have a lot of new faces in the team.

"Alec is still in his first real season, so are Mick Kennedy and Lars Elstrup and it is much the same for Darron McDonough who has done brilliantly in Steve Foster's boots and centre-half. I have seen nothing this season to frighten us and hope we can keep the team together now".

John's comments were made before Tuesday night's trip to Field Mill were, contrary to most expectations, the team came home with a thrilling 4-3 win on a night when many First Division clubs had their formbook torn apart.

Clean sheets count

"It has been quite a good start for the team and we are playing together like a team which is good," enthused John Dreyer earlier this week as he prepared for Tuesday night's Littlewoods Cup second round first leg visit to Mansfield.

"We are more compact and better disciplined especially in defence and as long as we are defending well and getting results I am happy. At this time of the season, it is important to lay down a sound base.

"We have conceded only three goals in our first six league outings which is a very good defensive record in the First Division and second only to Liverpool. And we have had four clean sheets so that is good too for the defence.

"When you are a defender you are judged by the goals against column and it is the same as if a forward has been scoring goals regularly. Clean sheets count like goals count at the other end. If a striker is scoring





OFF THE RECORD

SUPERMAC STRIKES AS THE TOWN ANNOUNCE THEIR ARRIVAL

Optimism was high amongst Luton supporters as the special train trundled towards Bolton for the first game of the 1970/71 season, writes club statistician Roger Wash.

Newly promoted from the Third Division and boasting new signings Don Givens, Jim Ryan and Roger Hoy to complement ace goalscorer Malcolm Macdonald we saw no reason why our upward climb from the bottom of the Fourth should not continue.

A rude awakening awaited, however, as a Bolton team who were to be relegated at the season's end tore into Luton from the start with wingers Terry Wharton and Gordon Taylor running riot.

Although the penalty awarded for handball against Alan Slough in the 18th minute seemed harsh the 1-0 lead after Wharton converted the spot-kick was no more than the "Trotters" deserved.

Skipper Mike Keen levelled the scores against the run of play 10 minutes later but a goal from Greaves followed by two more from Wharton meant that the Town were chasing shadows long before MacDonald gave the scoreline slightly more respectably with a penalty in the final seconds.

Manager Alec Stock was not pleased and promptly dropped goalkeeper Alan Starling, forward Viv Busby and veteran defender Terry Branston. Starling and Busby eventually returned to the team before the end of the season but Branston was transferred to Lincoln within weeks.

The new look side for the next game, at home to Norwich, included Chris Nicholl, new signing David Court and the return of goalkeeper Tony Read.

Norwich manager Ron Saunders came for a point, a fact which became apparent from the first minute and despite several fine efforts from Macdonald the deadlock could not be broken.

In the after match press conference, Saunders admitted that he had been scared at the prospect of

facing a newly promoted team in its first home game and had planned a defensive formation deliberately.

Alec Stock after expressing disappointment over the low attendance of 16,110 felt that things were beginning to come together and we tended to agree based on the more solid defensive formation and the fact that one goal against Norwich would have meant several more.

We finally knew that the Town were in for a sparkling season the following week at St Andrews, Birmingham, where the early season leaders were taken on before a partisan crowd of 30,141.

Despite an early goal from Birmingham's Geoff Vowden, the Town played, for the most part, the most delightful football some of us had ever seen.

Suddenly the slog through the lower divisions seemed a million years ago as we were suddenly awakened to football at its highest level as slick interpassing continually split the "Blues" rearguard.

It would have been injustice at its most severe if the Town had returned home pointless but the equalising goal was left perilously late as Macdonald picked himself up, after being flattened in the area, coolly stroked a penalty into the net in the 83rd minute. In the words of Alec Stock "We have arrived,!



WELCOME TO...

WIMBLEDON

- This afternoon we welcome Wimbledon. The south London club was founded in 1889 but have been members of the Football League for little more than a decade during which they have already pulled off a great achievement by winning the F.A. Cup in 1988.
- On Monday night this week, Wimbledon won 2-1 at Port Vale in their Littlewoods Cup second round first leg clash. Former Town striker Ronnie Futcher opened the scoring after four minutes but the Dons came back with goals from Charlton Fairweather and John Fashanu.
- Wimbledon's team on Monday was: Segers, Curle, Phelan, Kruszynski, Young, Scales, Fairweather, Ryan, Fashanu, Gibson, Wise.
- Dons manager Bobby Gould is their seventh since 1955. Wimbledon turned professional in 1964. Gould's predecessors were Les Henley, Mike Everitt, Dick Graham, Allen Batsford, Dario Gradi and Dave Bassett.
- Wimbledon's record win was on September 29, 1929, when they beat Polytechnic 15-2 in an FA Cup Preliminary round tie. Their record defeat was on August 29, 1978, when they were beaten 8-0 by Everton in a League Cup second round tie.
- Last season they beat Everton 2-1 at home and drew 1-1 away in the First Division, just 10 years after the

defeat.

- John Fashanu was the Dons leading goalscorer last season and went on to win an England cap. He scored 11 goals in 30 league matches.
- The record attendance at Wimbledon's Plough Lane Ground was set in 1934-35 when 18,000 spectators squeezed in to see an FA Amateur Cup third round tie against HMS Victory.
- Veteran Wimbledon striker Alan Cork is the holder of several club records. he has scored most in one match - four v Torquay United in 1979, most in one season - 32 in 1983-84 and most appearances and goals overall - 154 goals in more than 400 at the start of this season. He was born in Derby in March 1959.
- Detzi Kruszynski is one of the few Polish internationals to have appeared in the English league. Wimbledon signed him from FC Homburg of West Germany last season and he made 16 appearances.
- Former Hatters favourite Clive Goodyear is currently battling back to fitness after a broken leg caused him to miss the whole of last season. He joined the Dons from Plymouth in July 1987 after starting his career at Kenilworth Road.

CLOSED CIRCUIT TELEVISION



The first televised football match, 1937

Now every Football League ground is equipped with television cameras.

The Football Trust has installed Closed Circuit Television systems at more than 110 British grounds. The cameras have a range of 150 metres and immediate close-up prints can be produced. Within minutes of an incident offenders can be identified and arrested with film made available as evidence in court. CCTV is the most effective anti-hooligan measure inside football grounds and the programme has been extended to include portable systems.

CCTV is only one of The Football Trust's many initiatives. Each year it receives over £9.5 million from the Spotting-the-Ball competition run by Littlewoods, Vernons and Zettlers and spends it on projects that benefit all levels of the game throughout the United Kingdom.




