


The two players, both married to Swindon girls, were at the County Ground together. Paul was Glenn's apprentice and cleaned his boots!


Another Saint, goalkeeper Tim Flowers, had a spell on loan with Swindon last season.

Saints' promotions department are holding a bumper, free weekly draw from now until Christmas.


Weekly prizes include three hampers, three turkeys, three bottles each of whisky and gin and 12 boxes of crackers.


But I was laughing and it was one of those lighthearted moments. It's good if you can take time out like that.

TODAY'S VISITORS AT THE DELL LUTON TOWN

Luton have been holding a place in the middle of the First Division largely due to their home performances. The Hatters have not won away from home in the League since last December, since when they have completed 16 away First Division matches without a win.

This season they have collected away points from drawn games at Q.P.R. (0-0), Millwall (1-1) and Crystal Palace (1-1) but they were beaten at Tottenham (1-2), Coventry (0-1) and Manchester City (1-3).

They did win away to Third Division Mansfield (4-3) in the second round of the Littlewoods Cup and, by later winning the return by 7-2 at Kenilworth Road, they had a comfortable passage into the third round.

But they were then well beaten at Everton (0-3).

That result came as a bitter disappointment as Luton have reached the final of the past two seasons. In 1988 they pulled off a fine 3-2 victory over Arsenal at Wembley to win the club's first major trophy.

Last season — after ousting the Saints in round five — they were beaten 1-3 by Nottingham Forest at Wembley.

Manager Ray Harford is expected to select his team from:

ALEC CHAMBERLAIN

(Goalkeeper) Alec was signed from Everton for £150,000 last season and took over in the Luton goal towards the end of the campaign. He was a reserve player at Ipswich but soon stepped into League soccer with Colchester after a transfer in 1982. Everton signed him for £75,000 in 1987 as cover but, after a loan spell with Tranmere last season, he moved on to Kenilworth Road.

TIM BREACKER


(Defender) Tim is a former Luton apprentice who got his League chance in 1984. Within a couple of years, he was in the England under-21 side, winning two caps. Tim won a Littlewoods Cup winners' tankard in 1988 and a runners-up award in the same final last season.

DARREN McDONOUGH

(Defender) Darren completed his apprenticeship with Oldham and played over 200 first-team games for the Latics prior to his £85,000 transfer to Luton in 1986. He was recalled to the Hatters' side last season and played in the Littlewoods Cup final as substitute.

JOHN DREYER

(Defender) John was an apprentice with Oxford but played League soccer for both Torquay and Fulham, whilst on loan, during the 1985/86 season before getting his chance in the Oxford side the following season. Luton signed him for £140,000 in 1988.

DAVE BEAUMONT

(Defender) Dave was signed from Dundee United for £150,000 last January. He joined the Dundee club from school and worked his way into their first-team in 1984.

GRAHAM RODGER

(Defender) Graham made only one League appearance for Wolves before linking with Coventry in 1985. Though injuries hindered his first-team chances at Highfield Road, Graham did star as substitute at Wembley when Coventry won the F.A. Cup in 1987 and he also gained four England under-21 caps. Luton signed him this summer for £150,000 with a further £100,000 to be paid if he plays 60 first-team games.

MARVIN JOHNSON

(Defender) Marvin is a former Luton apprentice who broke into the first-team for a few games in 1987/88. Last season he enjoyed a lengthy run at centre-back.

DANNY WILSON

(Midfield) Danny played League football for Bury and Chesterfield before joining Nottingham Forest in a £100,000 deal in 1983. He spent a loan period with Scunthorpe, then made a full transfer to Brighton in 1984. Whilst with the Seagulls, Danny was introduced to the N. Ireland side. He is now a regular for his country, with 16 caps. Luton signed him in 1987 and he scored at Wembley in their victory over Arsenal in the 1988 Littlewoods Cup final.

STEVE WILLIAMS


(Midfield) Steve needs no introduction to Saints' fans for he made his name here at The Dell and he played for England on six occasions during his eight seasons as a first-teamer here. Arsenal signed him for £550,000 in 1984 and he moved on to Luton for £300,000 in 1988. In addition to his full caps, Steve also played for England at under-21 and "B" levels.

MICK KENNEDY

(Midfield) Mick joined the Hatters a few days before the start of this season in an exchange deal. He broke into League soccer with Halifax in 1978, moving on to Huddersfield two years later. Middlesbrough signed him for £200,000 in 1982 but, two years later, he became a Portsmouth player. Bradford City signed him for £250,000 in 1987 but last season he moved on to Leicester, where he remained until his latest move. Mick has played for the Republic of Ireland on two occasions.

DAVID PREECE

(Midfield) David made his League debut for Walsall in 1981, winning a regular place two years later. Luton invested £150,000 when signing him in 1984 and he later played in two

Littlewoods Cup finals for the Hatters. Last season he was capped three times by England "B".

RICHARD COOKE

(Midfield) Though he played only occasionally in Tottenham's first-team, Richard played for England at youth and under-21 levels. He really made his name, though, after moving to Bournemouth in 1986 and it was after he had starred in the Cherries' exciting F.A. Cup run last season that Luton secured his transfer for £140,000.

ROY WEGERLE

(Forward) Roy was signed from Chelsea for £75,000 in 1988 and last season he was the Hatters top scorer with 12 goals. Roy had scored six times this season before the weekend. He was playing for Tampa Bay Rowdies when he was recommended to Chelsea but, at Stamford Bridge, he was limited to about a couple of dozen League appearances over two years.

LARS ELSTRUP

(Forward) Lars was signed from Odense for £650,000, with striker Raphael Meade also going as part of the deal, in August. He scored five times in his first two Littlewoods Cup

games for the Hatters but he didn't get off the mark in the First Division until scoring in the recent 1-1 draw at Millwall. Lars has been capped by Denmark on 12 occasions.

KINGSLEY BLACK

(Forward) Kingsley made a remarkable impact after being introduced to the Luton side



two seasons ago. He starred in their Littlewoods Cup win at Wembley and, within weeks, was in the N. Ireland side. He now has seven full international caps.

IAN DOWIE (Forward)

Iain was happy playing in non-League soccer with St Albans, Hertford, Cheshunt and Hendon until Luton invited him to join them for £30,000 in December 1988. He had scored 80 goals in 2½ seasons with Hendon.

On-loan goalkeeper Mel Rees made his debut for Saints Reserves in their 1-1 Football Combination draw with Millwall at The Den on Wednesday.

The impressive Kevin Moore headed Saints in front on 44 minutes. But Millwall salvaged a point when Rees, on loan from Watford, was beaten just before the end.

Saints Reserves' revival, which brought four points from two matches, was halted by a 1-0 home defeat by Brighton in last Saturday's fixture.

Centre-half Mark Blake and goalkeeper Gary French played well in a Saints side which did not deserve to lose. And Neil Maddison worked hard in an unaccustomed forward role.

Ex-Saints trainee Lee Cormack played up front for Brighton, while former Southampton Schools striker Martin Lambert switched to the Brighton defence in an early reshuffle. Jack Dineen scored the 83rd-minute winner.

Centre-half Kevin Moore was outstanding for Saints Reserves when they drew 0-0 at Charlton in

their previous match.

Before that, midfielder Barry Horne, back after injury, helped Saints to their first win of the season, 3-0 at home to Chelsea.

Corner-kicks from Lee Luscombe led to the first two goals, by Maddison and Banger, and then Luscombe scored himself. It was 3-0 after 15 minutes.

Ray Graydon, 42-year-old Saints Reserves coach, came out of retirement in the team's 3-0 defeat at Tottenham. Graydon was at right-back in his first match for five years. Norwegian trialist Ola By Rise was in goal and two of Spurs' goals were penalties.

Saints Reserves have no match today, but they played at Portsmouth on Wednesday (7 pm).

Saints were knocked out of the FA Youth Cup on Tuesday night when Crystal Palace beat them 2-0 in their second round tie at The Dell.

Palace took a shock second-minute lead when a long cross dropped in over goalkeeper Gary French.

Saints, facing an uphill fight after that, rarely looked like equalising. But Lee Powell wasted an opening brilliantly created by Christian White before Palace clinched victory with a close-range second goal from Carl Roberts with 14 minutes left.

Saints Youth came from behind to win 2-1 away to Bristol Rovers in last Saturday's South-East Counties League Division 2 match.

David Lampert drove in a superb equaliser and Welsh forward Lee Powell grabbed the winner. Gareth Taylor should have added a third goal, missing a sitter superbly created by Powell.

"It was a good result because Rovers are a difficult side to play against," says Youth coach Dave Merrington. "Kevin Phillips was

outstanding at right-back. He kept it nice and simple.

"Jason Peters and Matthew Bound lacked understanding in the middle of defence, but the team's shape, passing and forward movement was good."

A week earlier, Saints Youth drew 1-1 at Swindon. Powell, sharp and tricky up front, gave Saints a 25th-minute lead.

YOUTH ROUND-UP

CHARLIE WAYMAN

Where are they now?

Although almost forty years have passed since Charlie Wayman left The Dell, the man's predatory goalscoring skill remains a topic of conversation to this day.

The centre-forward, pint-sized at 5ft 6in, is part of Saints' folklore. He rattled in 77 goals in 107 appearances for the club and his five-goal spree in a 6-0 home win over Leicester in October 1948 still stands as a Saints individual League record.

"At the final whistle they were still shouting for more," laughs Charlie, now 68 and living in retirement in his native North-East.

"I had just on three seasons with Southampton and enjoyed every minute. I loved the crowd and, yes, I was well liked, too!

"I was very quick, had a good left foot and followed up everything in the penalty box. I got to like scoring goals!"

Charlie Wayman's career started with Newcastle in the first post-war season. He was soon scoring consistently, including four goals in a 13-0 demolition of Newport when the legendary Len Shackleton hit six, and a hat-trick against Saints in an FA Cup-tie.

But in the 1946-47 season, having scored 30 goals, he was dropped for the 3-0 FA Cup semi-final defeat by Charlton — and Second Division Saints soon stepped in.


"I reckoned Newcastle had given me a rotten deal and it was time to move on," he recalls. "The Southampton manager Bill Dodgin came up to the North-East with his directors and I signed without discussing it with my wife Emma.

"We'd only moved house six weeks beforehand and when I got home I said: 'Sorry, luv, but we're moving again.' 'Where to?' she asked. 'Southampton!' I told her."

Wayman's £10,000 transfer in October 1947 triggered off a glut of goals. But, agonisingly, Saints narrowly missed out on promotion each time, finishing third, third and fourth.

In 1948-49 Saints were eight points clear with seven matches left after Wayman, a limping passenger on the wing, scored late on to snatch a 1-0 win over Tottenham in front of a 69,265 crowd at White Hart Lane.

But with their star striker injured, Saints collapsed dramatically on the run-in and missed promotion by a point. Twelve months later they were denied by goal-average!

Charlie Wayman and his wife Sheila. Preston promptly won promotion to Division 1 — Wayman scoring 28 goals — and later he played for Middlesbrough and Darlington. He finished with a dazzling League record of 254 goals in 382 matches.

"I played my football before the days of big money and agents and never earned more than £19 a week, but it was a great life," recalls Charlie. "As one of ten children, I'd had a tough upbringing. I left school at 14 and was down the mine on the Monday morning!"

A grandfather with six children of his own, he


lost his wife nearly 20 years ago. He was a brewery rep for 24 years before retiring at 60 and now lives at Bishop Auckland with his second wife Sheila.

"A lot of the football nowadays bores me, though I did enjoy the highlights on television when Saints beat Liverpool the other week," he says. "They played the game the way it should be played."

"You know, even now people come up and say: 'Aren't you Charlie Wayman? I remember watching you play.' It's always nice to know you're not forgotten!"







PLENTY OF GOALS BEING SPREAD AROUND AND SAINTS ARE THE AWAY DAY SPECIALISTS!

Sometimes controversial and amusing TONY PULLEIN takes a look at the football scene, both at home and abroad

There was a time — not so long ago — when the Saints' away performances left a great deal to be desired. But the situation has changed dramatically this season and now Southampton are one of the country's most successful sides when playing away from home.

Liverpool are the only other First Division side to have scored as many (14) away goals as The Saints and we are the only club in the top section to have scored four times on two occasions in away games.

Southampton are now the most attractive away team in terms of giving goals value for money. Our away games have produced 28 goals — more than any other club.

Rod Wallace is now the most feared striker in the First Division when playing away from home. Four of his six goals this season have been recorded away from The Dell.

The only First Division player who can hold a candle to Rod is Liverpool and England super star John Barnes, who notched his sixth away goal in last Sunday's televised game at Millwall.

But two of Barnes' away goals have come from penalties. So that leaves the Saints' Rod level with Barnes as the best away strikers from open play in the country.

Only five clubs have won away games by a three-goal margin. The Saints' 4-1 success at Q.P.R. was matched by Chelsea's win by a similar score at Tottenham. Manchester United also achieved a 4-1 victory — at Coventry — whilst Nottingham Forest last Saturday ran up a 3-0 win at Manchester City. Back in September, Liverpool won 3-0 at Derby.

The Saints' other four-goal hit was at Norwich in September, a thriller of a match ending 4-4.


Even the League Champions Arsenal have managed to win only

The Football League has reported that attendances are showing another encouraging rise for the third season in succession. This has been achieved by all clubs making a concerted effort to provide entertaining games.

The top performance of the season so far must go to Liverpool for their amazing 9-0 triumph over newly-promoted Crystal Palace. Several records went up in smoke on that magical September night at Anfield.

It was the first time in League history that eight different players have scored for the same side in any First Division match. Steve Nicol scored twice, with John Barnes, Peter Beardsley, Ian Rush, Steve McMahon, Gary Gillespie, John Aldridge and Glenn Hysen all contributing singles.

That was a club record defeat for Palace and the best-ever win for Liverpool in First Division football.

PLENTY OF GOALS BEING SPREAD AROUND AND SAINTS ARE THE AWAY DAY SPECIALISTS!

The amazing thing, for such a high-scoring match, was that no Liverpool player managed to complete a hat-trick. Indeed, though there have been plenty of goals in First Division football this season, they have been well spread out.

So far only three players have registered a hat-trick. Manchester United's Mark Hughes hit three towards the Reds' 5-1 home win over Millwall, then Gary Lineker found his old scoring touch with three goals in Spurs' 3-2 win over Q.P.R.

Q.P.R.'s player-manager Trevor Francis was the only other First Division hat-trickster, getting all the goals in their 3-1 win at Aston Villa — Rangers' only away win to date.

Another indication as to how well the goals have been spread around this season can be gleaned from a study of each club's list of scorers. When Danny Wallace popped in his first League goal for Manchester United last Saturday, he became the 11th player to score for the club in the First Division this season.

Players from nine different positions have scored for United, right-back being the only outfield spot devoid of a goal so far. Left-back Lee Sharpe and centre-backs Steve Bruce and Gary Pallister have all netted at least once.

All three strikers — Mark Hughes, Brian McClair and Danny Wallace — have been on the mark, together with midfield players Clayton Blackmore, Russell Beardmore, Neil Webb, Bryan Robson and Mike Phelan.

Arsenal are the only other club with 11 players on their First Division scorers' chart, Iceland international Siggi Jonnson, who came on as substitute, making up the number with a goal in last Saturday's 3-0 win over Q.P.R.

With Arsenal, left-back Nigel Winterburn and midfielder Kevin Richardson are the only regulars not to have scored so far.

Both central defenders — Tony Adams and David O'Leary — plus right-back Lee Dixon have their names on the list.

Midfielders David Rocastle, Michael Thomas and Jonnson are among the scorers, as are strikers Alan Smith, Paul Merson, Brian Marwood, Perry Groves and Niall Quinn.

The Saints could soon match Arsenal and United with 11 First Division scorers. Neil Ruddock, Danny and Rod Wallace, Glenn Cockerill, Jimmy Case, Paul Rideout, Barry Horne, Matthew Le Tissier and Alan Shearer are the nine players who have netted for us in First Division games.

Everton's Mike Newell claims the best individual scoring sequence in



the First Division this season. The £1.1-million striker, signed from Leicester last summer, scored in four successive games for the Toffees.

Matthew Le Tissier became joint-top penalty scorer in the First Division when he converted his 44th minute spot-kick at Stamford Bridge last weekend. It was his third successful conversion of the season,

equalling John Barnes (Liverpool) and Dean Saunders (Derby).

With goals being more spread around this season, no one player is dominating the First Division scoring chart at the moment. The leading First Division scorers in all matches after last weekend's games were:

The only non-international among the top eight is Newell but it is possible that, if he maintains his early form, he could be capped by England during the run-up to the European Championship finals. Gary Lineker and Peter Beardsley have started all three England games this season but all three ended goalless.

The only other striker used by manager Bobby Robson this season was Villa's David Platt who came on as substitute in the recent friendly with Italy at Wembley.

With so many goals being scored by so many players in the First Division, it must be frustrating for Bobby Robson that no one is getting any for England. Barnes and Lineker may be among the First Division's most successful marksmen, but neither has been doing the business for England.

Bobby Robson's major priority now is to find a couple of strikers capable of scoring goals at international level. So there is an exciting prospect, for any striker who hits form between now and the end of the season, of winning a place in the squad to go to Italy next summer.

If the Saints continue to produce the goods, then there is no reason why one — or more — Southampton players should not be entrusted with the task of ending England's goals famine.





SITTING COMFORTABLY?

Environment Minister Chris Patten recently visited Tottenham's White Hart Lane to inspect and congratulate the club on their extensive Executive Box building programme.

But this same Minister was instrumental in thwarting little Southend United's plans to build a new ground and improve comfort and safety for the fans.

In the wake of Hillsborough, plans are springing up everywhere, or rather plans that have been in progress for a long time are receiving publicity!

Liverpool have announced moves to make Anfield an all-seater ground by the early 1990s and to fit executive boxes into a proposed new stand.

Kop end fans will find seats difficult to adjust to after years of standing amid the swaying, chanting masses. But as Liverpool appreciate all too well, safety is now the overriding consideration!

But being one of the so-called "Big Five" Liverpool are unlikely to come up against planning problems posed by vindictive, uninformed local authorities and Environment Ministers.

Newly-promoted Maidstone United planned to have a new ground after selling their old one for redevelopment. But one problem after another has been encountered by their chairman Jim Thompson.

In the late-'70s and early-'80s, plans were laid down for Saints to move to a new ground. But again widespread problems were encountered. Even improvements to The Dell have met with unfair local authority protests and red tape.

It seems that local authorities are only too happy when clubs support their activities, but the situation changes somewhat when the boot is on the other foot.

Even the chairman of the "old enemy" down the road, Pompey, unveiled super-stadium plans last season. But the rollcall of those that have laid down plans without subsequent action goes on and on, from Newcastle to Charlton. To me, it strikes of raising supporters' hopes unfairly, allowing for a cruel letdown!

F.I.F.A. now demand that any country proposing to stage the World Cup Finals must have all-seater stadiums. Sadly, the thought of England staging this prestigious event is laughable, given our facilities.

Next summer's finals in Italy are being staged at 12 stadiums across the country. These grounds are under-

going fantastic redevelopments at prices which are extravagant dreams to their poor English counterparts.

But to be fair, the Italian Government is injecting massive investment into the event, recognising that the publicity generated is enormous.

For example, Naples are spending £300 million on improvements to the city and stadium. But what should be remembered is that seat tickets run at £57 per match during the Finals.

Many fans, though, will find it hard to adjust to seats. At the recent Manchester United v Saints match, I sat up in the stand for a better view. But it lacked the passion generated by standing on the terraces. Unfortunately, I, along with many others, will have to adjust.

When all-seating comes, prices will naturally rise to make up for depleting capacities. To offset these rises, clubs will look toward their improving commercial departments.

Though purists dislike the commercial aspect and accuse clubs of being too financially-minded, their operations are vital to the survival of many clubs.

Attendances during the last twenty years have dropped dramatically and without the sometimes difficult marriage of football and advertisers many clubs would have gone under. The game owes a lot to committed sponsors such as Draper Tools and Barclays for their ongoing support!

To me the trump cards lie with the clubs and the Government over the issue of ground improvements and the building of new stadiums. At a time when £2 million transfers and outrageous player contracts are flying around like confetti, it is understandable that questions are being asked as to the standards of our stadiums.

It is plain economics. If a house is in need of repairs you don't buy luxuries and wait for an accident before putting things right. You put safety first and do the work required — then see if luxuries are affordable.

Our Government creams £43 million each year from the game through the pools. Like our European counterparts, they should show their commitment to the game by injecting a large part of this back.

Many changes are coming over the next decade and some, sadly, will result in clubs going to the wall. But ground improvement is an issue of overriding importance, as vital as the battle against hooliganism.

We're going to have to face these changes and adapt accordingly!

LUTON

DID YOU KNOW...

Luton have not won away in the League in 1989, results going: Charlton (0-3), Arsenal (0-2), Liverpool (0-5), Q.P.R. (1-1), Manchester United (0-2), Aston Villa (1-2), Newcastle (0-0), West Ham (0-1), Tottenham (1-2), Q.P.R. (0-0), Coventry (0-1), Manchester City (1-3), Millwall (1-1) and Crystal Palace (1-1).

The oldest player to appear in Luton's first-team was Dally Duncan who was 39 years and 11 days of age when he played his final game in 1948.

Though Luton won only two of 19 away League matches last season, they won all four away ties in the Littlewoods Cup.

Danny Wilson's tally of nine League goals last season was the lowest by any Luton leading scorer since Adrian Alston and Ron Futcher were joint top with seven in 1974/75.

The last Luton player to score a hat-trick in the League was Mark Stein, who got three of the goals in their 7-4 win over Oxford in February 1988.

The Luton record is never likely to be beaten - Joe Payne scored 10 times against Bristol Rovers in a Third Division (South) game in 1936.

Payne cornered another club record when he scored 58 goals in 1936/37 - 55 in the League, plus three in the F.A. Cup.

Luton, who have played in three Wembley Cup finals over the past two seasons, had previously been to Wembley only once during their entire history - when losing the 1959 F.A. Cup final.

The Hatters were the first club to drop all the way from the First to the Fourth Division and, later, regain their place at the top.

Mick Harford, with 80 goals in all competitions by the end of last season, is the highest scorer on the club's books at the moment.

Luton's record aggregate scorer was Gordon Turner, who scored 265 in all competitions - 243 League, 18 F.A. Cup and 4 League Cup.

Luton's appearances record is held by Bob Morton who played 495 League games, 48 F.A. Cup ties and seven League Cup ties to make a grand total of 550.

Among the current staff, the player with most appearances is goalkeeper Les Sealey, who had totted up 259 senior games by the end of last season.

Luton's most-capped player was Mal Donaghy, who won 58 caps for N. Ireland before moving on to Manchester United last season.

Kenilworth Road's record attendance was 30,069 for an F.A. Cup tie against Blackpool in 1959.

Luton's largest crowd last season was 12,117 for the visit of Liverpool in October.

The biggest crowd to watch Luton in action in the League last season was the 36,335 that turned up to see them at Manchester United in March.

Luton's record League victory was a 12-0 success over Bristol Rovers in the Third Division (South) in April 1936.

But the Hatters had done even better than that when they crushed Great Yarmouth by 15-0 in the F.A. Cup in 1914.

Luton went down 1-2 at Tottenham on the opening day of this season and it is now five years since they won their first game.




