BOXING DAY CROWDS BOOM

Attendances at Barclays League matches on Boxing Day proved the theory that the game is recovering its mass popularity and steadily attracting more and more spectators. A total of more than 566,000 spectators watched the 46 games - more than 4,000 up on last season's figure for the same day and the best for six years.

Over the first half of the league season it is only in the Third Division that attendances have fallen. In the other three divisions, they have risen, according to figures published in the Sunday Telegraph in Jack Rollin's regular round-up.

Gates in the First Division are up by 0.9 per cent from an average of 20,720 to an average of 20,903. In the Second Division they are up by 19.3 per cent, from 10,186 to 12,149 and in the Fourth Division they are up from 3,008 to 3,252, an increase of 8.1 per cent.

The Third Division shows a fall of 4.5 per cent from 5,201 to 4,966. Overall, the average figures are up from 9,053 last year to 9,839.







memorable match of his career to date alongside a big European night for Tottenham when he played at White Hart Lane against Bayern Munich during the season when Spurs went on to win the UEFA Cup.

"Being a winger is not easy. It is of course much easier when you are getting a lot of the ball and the team is on the attack, but when you are without the ball for long spells it can be difficult."

Richard said his decision to leave Bournemouth where he was very successful and helped the club on an F.A. Cup run which was ended at Manchester United after a replay was a straightforward one.

"Coming to Luton was a chance to go back to my roots in this area and to join a First Division club again. I only played about 14 games for Spurs so it was nice to get the chance to go back to the First Division.

"Obviously, a lot has happened at Luton in the last few weeks. But we are professionals and our job is to go out and play well on the pitch. That is what matters to us.

"We are going to miss Mick Harford of course as he was a great player, but Iain Dowie was very unlucky not to keep his place in the side and has done brilliantly this year. He is one of a lot of players at the club with plenty to prove really and I am sure the club has enough quality to keep out of any serious trouble this season."

Married to Jackie with an 18-month old daughter Jacie, Richard enjoys a game of snooker when he is not working at Kenilworth Road. Now, he is hoping to enjoy a few clean sweeps and regain his place in the Town team too.

"I am a winger and always have been. I never think of myself as anything else, but these days it is more difficult to get into the team as a winger on a regular basis," said Richard this week after treatment at the club for an ankle ligament injury which makes him doubtful for this afternoon's clash with Queen's Park Rangers.

"It is never easy to claim a regular first team place at a First Division club but it is more difficult if you are a winger. But I am happy at being a winger. It is my ambition to win a regular place in the side and I suppose the recent change of manager and so on means that I have a chance to do that.

"We were all delighted that Jim got the job because he knows us all. Now we all have to prove we are worth a place in the team. I was quite pleased with my performance in the game against Nottingham Forest on Boxing Day when I scored, but the result against Chelsea and the change to a five-man defence really meant I had to be left out again."

Looking back, Richard picked out his league debut here for Spurs as the most

DALLY DUNCAN – A WIZARD OF THE WING

Dally Duncan, one of the most famous Scottish wingers of his generation and a great favourite as player, coach and manager at Kenilworth Road, died in hospital in Brighton on January 2. He was aged 80.

Mr Duncan, who played for Luton Town between 1946 and 1948 when he made 23 league appearances and scored four goals, was a reknown player when he joined the club from Derby County in October 1946.

He had won nine Scottish caps during his spell with the Midlands club and had also collected an FA Cup winners' medal in 1946. He was reknown for his skill in beating opponents and crossing accurately and he passed on these skills when he became manager in succession to fellow-Scot George Martin in the summer of 1947.

He went on to become the club's longest-serving manager with a period of service of more than 11 years after hanging up his boots.

He won a total of 14 Scottish caps between 1933 and 1938 when competition for places in the Scotland forward line was fierce with so

many skilful players available that they became known as the 'Blue Devils'.

Born in Aberdeen on October 14, 1909, he never played for any Scottish clubs, having begun his career with Hull City at 18 before moving on to join Derby County where he truly established his reputation as a player.

At Luton, his most famous hour as a player was on Saturday, November 30, 1946, when 25,410 fans saw him inspire a second-half recovery of epic proportions against then league leaders Newcastle United. Trailing 0-3 at the interval, when manager George Martin kicked over a pail of water in the dressing room, the Town fought back to win 4-3.


As manager he helped guide the club from the Second Division to the First and on towards a first Wembley appearance in the 1959 F.A. Cup final.

By then, however, Mr Duncan had left to join Blackburn Rovers, leaving the club late in 1958 after a career on and off the pitch which will always be recalled with pleasure and gratitude by all who knew him.



•Dally Duncan in action for Luton Town.



CCTV is the most effective anti-hooligan measure inside football grounds and the programme has been extended to include portable systems.

CCTV is only one of The Football Trust's many initiatives. Each year it receives over £9.5 million from the Spotting-the-Ball competition run by Littlewoods, Vernons and Zettors and spends it on projects that benefit all levels of the game throughout the United Kingdom.

REVIEW OF THE 80's

Part three:

1984-85

During the close season the Town bowed to the inevitable and sold Paul Walsh to Liverpool for a club record £750,000. With the proceeds, Steve Elliott, Vince Hilaire and Andy Dibble were purchased and an exchange deal with Coventry brought Ashley Grimes to Kenilworth Road in place of Kirk Stephens.

Despite the infusion of new talent the Town continued as they had left off the previous season and when the first League tables were published it was clear to see why we were regarded as one of the favourite for relegation.

The problems were compounded when centre-half Paul Elliott broke his leg in the League Cup tie with Leicester at the end of October and with only three wins to their credit as Christmas approached things looked black.

At the beginning of December the new chairman David Evans made cash available to David Pleat in a bid to avoid relegation and in a period of six weeks Steve Foster, David Preece, Mick Harford and Peter Nicholas were purchased and the tide slowly began to turn.

As the Town climbed painfully out of the relegation zone the first decent FA Cup run since 1973 built up a head of steam as Stoke, Huddersfield, Watford and Millwall - after the infamous riot - were seen off on the way to a semi-final game against Everton at Villa Park.

The Blues were the most strongly fancied side to compete in a semi-final for years but the Town led 1-0 until the closing minutes before losing narrowly in extra time. Now we could concentrate on the League so the "experts" said!

The disappointment did strengthen the players resolve and six wins from the ten games after the semi-final brought about a final position of 13th but it remained a close run thing right up until the 40th game when Leicester were hammered 4-0 at Kenilworth Road.

The strengthening of the "backbone" of the side mid-season was the obvious reason for the change in fortune and one of those purchases, Mick Harford, was top scorer with 16 goals from only 22 games.

1985/86

The Towns Centenary season dawned bright on the new artificial surface at Kenilworth Road and with arguably the strongest squad in our history hopes were high of finishing above the previous highest position of 8th in 1957/58.

The Town were, however, fairly slow starters and it was not until the home draw against Manchester United on 5th October, which destroyed the Reds record winning start, that things began to happen.

A 7-0 home thrashing of Southampton and the first win at White Hart Lane since 1948 were amongst the highlights as the team pushed itself into the top ten by Christmas and had achieved a "safe" position by the beginning of March.

The FA Cup produced another good run and after Arsenal were seen off after two replays in the 5th round the Town came up against Everton again in the quarter final but lost narrowly after another replay.

The final position of 9th narrowly failed to beat the record but with a strong, settled side the team had every reason to feel pleased after producing many fine performances.

Mick Harford was again top scorer with 22 goals with Brian Stein, now back to his best, runner-up with 14.

1986/87

Before the season started a bombshell was dropped when, after much agonising, manager David Pleat decided to take the vacant managers job at Tottenham.

Coach John Moore, who had been connected with the club for over 20 years, took his place as most of the other backroom staff also departed to White Hart Lane together with highly rated full-back Mitchell Thomas.

QUEENS PARK RANGERS

● We welcome Queen's Park Rangers, including our former striker Roy Wegerle, to Kenilworth Road this afternoon. It will be Roy's first return to the club since his £1 million transfer in December last year and our first meeting with Rangers since our visit to London on August 30 when we drew 0-0.

● Former England striker Trevor Francis was the QPR team manager at that time but he has since left the club and football affairs at the Rangers Stadium have been taken over by chief coach Don Howe who is also assistant to England manager Bobby Robson.

● Howe, whose position is officially first team coach and not manager, is the 29th man to occupy the position of responsibility for team affairs at QPR since the club's foundation in 1886. Since the last war, the manager's post has been held by such well-known footballing personalities as Alec Stock, Jimmy Andrews, Tommy Docherty, Terry Venables, Alan Mullery and Jim Smith.

● There is some doubt about the exact date of Rangers' foundation. It is believed that in 1885 or 1886 the club was formed through the amalgamation of Christchurch Rangers and St Jude's Institute FC. Most of the players came from the Queen's Park district which was how the club adopted the name.


● Rangers were original members of the Division Three in 1920 and have since progressed steadily by spending much time in the Third and Second Divisions before establishing themselves in the top flight in 1983 when they won promotion for the third time.

● The club's honours include being Division One runners-up in 1976, Division Two champions in 1983, Division Three (South) champions in 1948 and Division Three champions in 1967 when they also lifted the Football League Cup at Wembley. They were losing finalists in the F.A. Cup in 1982.

● The biggest fee paid by Rangers was £1 million for Roy Wegerle. The biggest free received by the club was £1.25 million for Clive Allen from Arsenal in 1980. Apart from signing Wegerle, Rangers have also strengthened their squad this season with the arrival of former England midfielder Ray Wilkins from Glasgow Rangers.

● Last weekend, Rangers enjoyed a 2-1 home win over Norwich. Their team was: Seaman, Bardsley, Sansom, Parker, McDonald, Maddix, Wilkins, Barker, Falco (Clarke 81), Wegerle, Sinton. The goalscorers were Mark Falco and Colin Clarke.


