# REFLECTIONS

I was very disappointed with both the performance and the entertainment value of our game against Southampton in the last home match. It is always difficult to overcome good and determined teams and Southampton deserve credit. They are a very good side and showed that a few days later when they beat Norwich City 4-1. It is also another example of the familiar old story of 10 men being more difficult to beat than 11. They stopped us and did well. I only wish Julian James' shot had been a couple of inches lower. What a difference that would have made.

Since that day, of course, we have been unlucky to lose the services again of Lars Elstrup. He had only just made his recovery from a knee injury and a cartilage operation and now he has had to go back to hospital for more surgery after a similar problem. This time he had a slightly torn cartilage. He faces another four weeks of frustration during his recovery period and we all feel for him during what is clearly a very difficult time for him. Mick Kennedy also suffered an injury when he damaged his shoulder and shook up the ligaments during the match against Southampton. He would have been missing tonight anyway through suspension. Darron McDonough has also been unlucky. He damaged knee ligaments in training, but we are hopeful, at the time of writing, that he will recover enough to be in consideration for a place in the team tonight.

The injuries we have had have stretched us to the limit of our resources and given opportunities to some of our very talented younger players. Julian James and Kurt Nogan are both 19 and they have done exceptionally well. I am pleased with their response. One of our resources, of course, is our crowd and I hope you can give the team the backing it deserves tonight when we extend a warm welcome to Coventry City. Thank you.

## Behaviour at Villa Park

Dear Supporter

I am grateful to your Club for allowing this to be printed in your programme. I am responsible for policing all matches at Aston Villa Football Ground and your team will shortly be playing away at Aston Villa. I welcome all genuine football supporters to Birmingham and to Aston Villa. I hope all supporters enjoy their visit to our local ground. To ensure that you enjoy your visit, Aston Villa F.C. Management, Players, Officials and the Police all subscribe to an initiative known as "Football Watch". It is an agreement on what is unacceptable behaviour in and around the Football Ground.

I and my officers adopt a consistent policy of enforcement aimed at eliminating unacceptable behaviour. The majority of fans attending football grounds do so to support their team and watch a game of football. It is the minority hooligan element which cause the trouble, and it is this minority hooligan element who should be aware that the following conduct is unacceptable at Aston Villa Football Ground, and my Officers will take action to enforce this:-

Obscene chanting and gestures  
Racist remarks and chants  
Throwing missiles, threatening or violent behaviour  
Any criminal act  
Drunkenness

I hope the majority of law abiding supporters would co-operate with us in trying to eradicate this type of behaviour by the minority of so called football supporters.

I accept that, in the spirit of excitement which is generated at football matches, there will be people jumping up and down in support of their

teams. There is no intention whatsoever to stop or interfere with this activity, providing it does not become unacceptable behaviour as described above.

I hope all of you enjoy your visit to Aston Villa Football Club and thank you for your co-operation in making the day trouble free for everyone.

### Something in Common

Town manager Jim Ryan was given a reminder of old memories when he met Rony Rosenthal and his personal agent for discussions after the Israeli international had completed one week's trial.

For Rony's agent was former central defender Etienne Wilssens, a bulky number five who once marked Andy Gray while playing for Antwerp in a European fixture and who also played in the same team in Belgium as Peter Anderson.

Etienne, who said the Andy Gray experience was the worst of his playing career, recalled Peter Anderson with great affection. "He was a very good player and we became great friends," he said.

## FIXTURE MUDDLES ARE RESOLVED AT LAST

Good evening and welcome to Coventry City whose appearance here tonight is the proof that our spell of disrupted fixtures has been overcome and we can return, at last, to a diet of regular Barclays League Division One football. The postponement last week of the Oldham Athletic v Everton FA Cup replay has meant also that we shall be playing Aston Villa, as originally scheduled on, Saturday, March 10.

As a club we are delighted to have regular Saturday football again. I do not think our manager or players wanted to have any more free Saturdays and we all hope this will signify a change in luck for us as we move into the last phase of the season.

There has been much speculation surrounding our talks with Rony Rosenthal. The fact Rony is an Israeli international has attracted media attention and the attention of some other clubs.

The truth is that Rony wants to play for Luton Town and, at the time of writing, we are hopeful of finalising a deal with Standard Liege, his Belgian club. One obstacle, however, is the issue of a work permit for him.

It is clearly in our favour that Ronny already has an EC permit through playing in Belgium. We do not believe the red tape will be a serious problem, but the level of applications for foreign workers at this time of the

year – mostly cricketers from a sporting point of view – may delay things a little.

Last week, I attended a Football League group four area meeting at which there were lengthy talks about the final Taylor report. I have discussed this at some length in our News Bulletin.

However, I would like to take this opportunity to thank our Kenilworth Stand supporters for their co-operation in the exercise we carried out in keeping gangways clear at the Southampton match. The club and the police feel there are still some difficulties to be overcome, but hope to continue to keep the gangways clear with your support tonight.

After two years of high profile life with regular television appearances, we are hopeful of returning to the screens next month when we entertain Arsenal. Our fixture is one of three being considered for the live match that weekend (April 21). The others are Aston Villa v Millwall and Liverpool v Chelsea.

Finally, I hear a Luton Town fanzine is about to hit the market. Contrary to general opinion, I, for my part, welcome criticism from them if they are produced professionally and include a combination of humour, serious material and match reports. They provide a chance for us to learn from the fans and I hope vice versa.

## MERSEY MAGNIFICENCE

Liverpool 2 Luton Town 2

Jim Ryan made his managerial debut for the Town by helping to inspire a magnificent whole-hearted performance full of skill and spirit at Anfield on January 18 where goals by Kingsley Black and Kurt Nogan, on his debut, secured a well-deserved point.

In front of a big Merseyside crowd expecting to see a continuation of the Liverpool form which had seen Swansea beaten 8-0 three days earlier, the Town went close to snatching a famous victory after John Barnes had opened the scoring with a virtuosic free-kick after 32 minutes.

John Dreyer was in excellent form alongside Mal Donaghy at the heart of the Luton defence as the Town stood firm until the 72nd minute when Black grabbed the equaliser with a crisp volley from the edge of the penalty area.

Black set up the second Town goal two minutes later when he escaped on the left and crossed low for Nogan to clip the ball wide of Bruce Grobbelaar. Liverpool, in desperate straits, came back almost immediately with a face-saving leveller of their own after 76 minutes through Steve Nicol who headed in a Barnes cross.

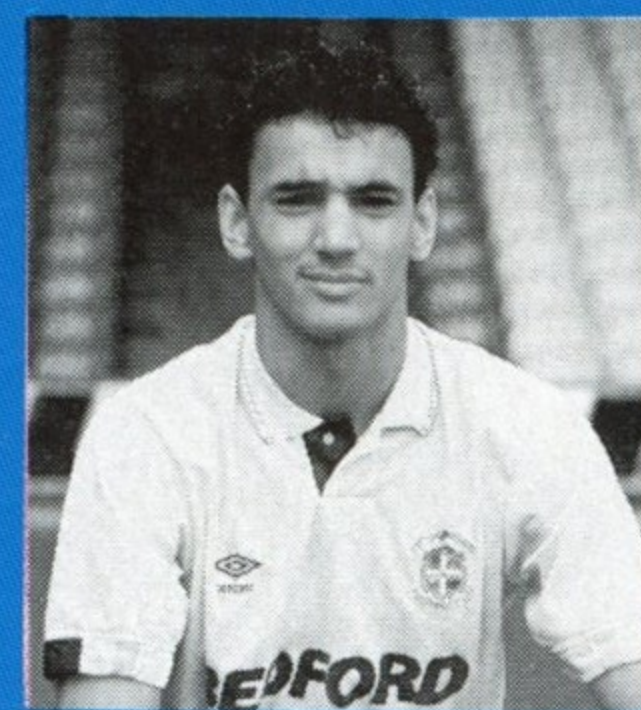

interested me," he said. "And I don't care how they go on either. I just like scoring goals. If I have admired any other player I suppose it is Ian Rush because he scores goals too."

Kurt is not the first Nogan to make it into a league side. His older brother Lee is also a striker and has played at centre-forward for Oxford United alongside former Town forward Mark Stein this season. Lee, at 20, is 16 months older than Kurt.

Kurt admitted that he found the Liverpool match a bit tough going in the last 15-20 minutes and added that he was working to build up his physical strength for the demands of the First Division.

"I need to get stronger, get more experience and improve my first touch which is so important in the First Division. The players close you down so quickly in the First Division. It is very quick and you have to react very quickly all the time."

Kurt is determined to make a success of his football career and has no outside interests or hobbies to distract him. He said he had wanted to do athletics at school - he was a promising middle-distance runner - but pursued football instead.

The biggest influence on his career so far has been Jim Ryan and John Faulkner's coaching at Kenilworth Road. "I've learned through training and working with them," he said in his matter-of-fact voice with a strong trace of Wales. "I did what I was told and I learned from it."

If his career continues to blossom and he has the chance to choose an international football career, he has no doubt that he would elect to play for Wales. "I feel Welsh and would want to be a Welsh international. I might be eligible for Scotland and one of the other countries, I think, but if I had the chance I would play for Wales."

### Dream Start

"I was very nervous before the game in the dressing room. The other players were great and helped me. There was a few jokes as you would expect. And as soon as I got out on the pitch and kicked a ball I felt more confident and much better. But I never dreamed I would score on my debut."

Kurt Nogan recalls his first Barclays League Division one appearance for the Town, a goalscoring entrance in the 2-2 draw at Anfield in January, with evident pleasure. He had known he was likely to play for a day or two beforehand, but that did nothing to stop him trembling with nerves as he waited to go down the famous tunnel.

"It was great for me of course and I was delighted to score. My mum and dad were there too so it was good for all the family," he said. "Now it is my ambition to play regularly in the First Division and to hold down my place in the team."

For Kurt, the Anfield occasion was the start of a run of first team outings under Jim Ryan which produced two goals in his first three games - a good return by anyone at the top level.

"I only ever wanted to be a goalscorer in football. Nothing else mattered or

## SPECTACLE IN PROSPECT AT ITALIA '90

Only three months remain before the kick-off in Milan of the 1990 World Cup finals, a tournament likely to provide some of the most spectacular football ever seen, and speculation over the outcome is mounting.

Hosts Italy, holders Argentina, three-times former winners Brazil and European champions Holland will be the pre-tournament favourites and each can claim to possess in their team at least one truly world-class star.

The Italians have brilliant defender and captain Franco Baresi and much-heralded striker Gianluca Vialli. Baresi helped AC Milan win the European Cup last season.

Argentina have captain Diego Maradona, still playing well and scoring regularly as Napoli fight it out with Milan for the Italian league title.

Brazil have Bebeto, a goalscoring forward who has been dubbed the "new Zico" for his skills and pace.

Holland have Marco van Basten, the European Footballer of the Year, and a supreme goalscorer whose striking power carried the Dutchmen to victory in West Germany two summers ago and also helped Milan to their glories last year.

The Dutch also possess in Ruud Gullit, if he is fit, the man most likely to outshine all the others. The dreadlocked superstar has it all - skill, power, aerial ability, pace, strength, a subtle touch and the vision to control a game. And it is all allied to a tremendous physique. His only weakness is the knee which has undergone a series of operations since last April.

Against such stars, England, Scotland and Ireland

will provide the supporting cast in what promises to be the most spectacular World Cup finals tournament since the competition began in 1930.

England face the Dutch, Irish and Egypt in group F of the opening round in Sardinia. A tough group reminiscent of their opening group in the European championship finals.

Scotland have an even harder task. In group C they will face Brazil, now back to their best with a squad blending Samba skills and European discipline and tactics, Sweden and Costa Rica.

The Scots have been qualifiers for every World Cup finals since 1974 and have yet to go beyond the opening round. This time manager Andy Roxburgh had done his paperwork, prepared his squad and checked every detail in Italy in advance. But will it make any difference?

The outcome of the finals will no doubt rest upon the explosive individual skills of the players who hit form at the right moment. That could mean Toni Polster of Austria, a dangerous striker based in Spain with Seville, or Gheorghe Hagi of Romania, the Steaua Bucharest striker already lined up by Milan as a possible replacement for the injured Gullit next season.

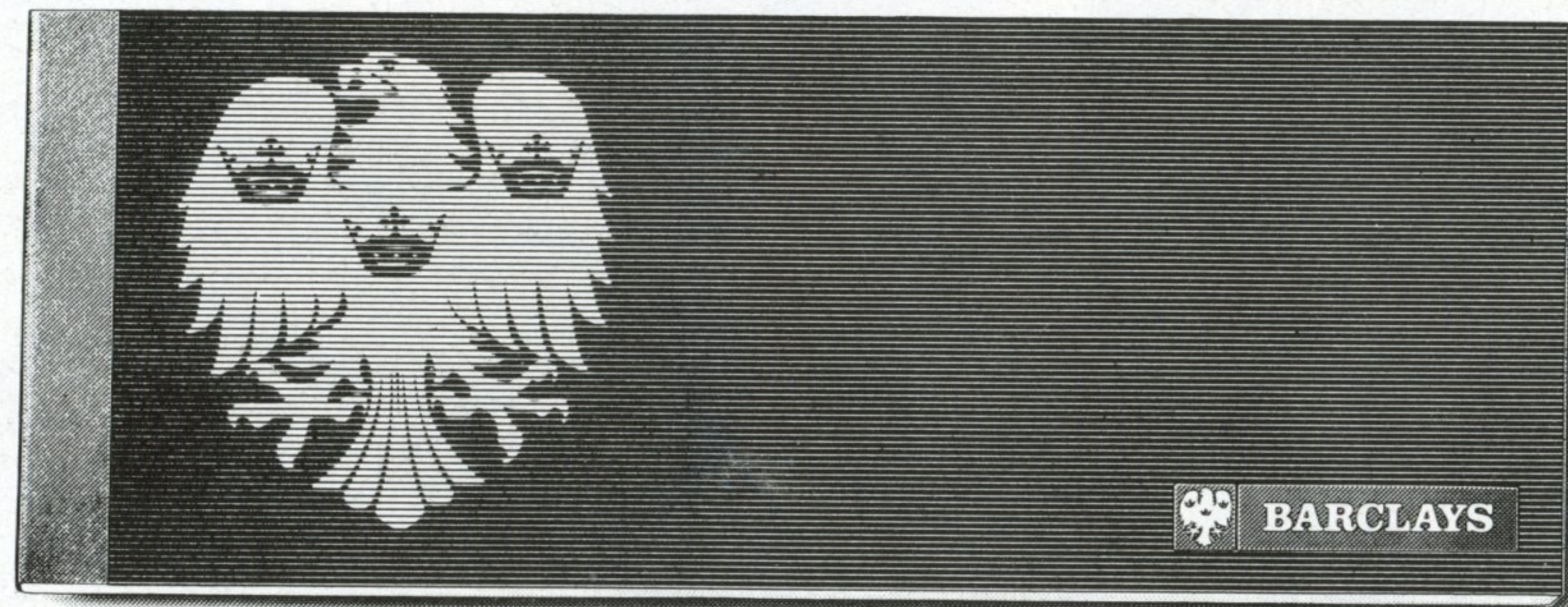

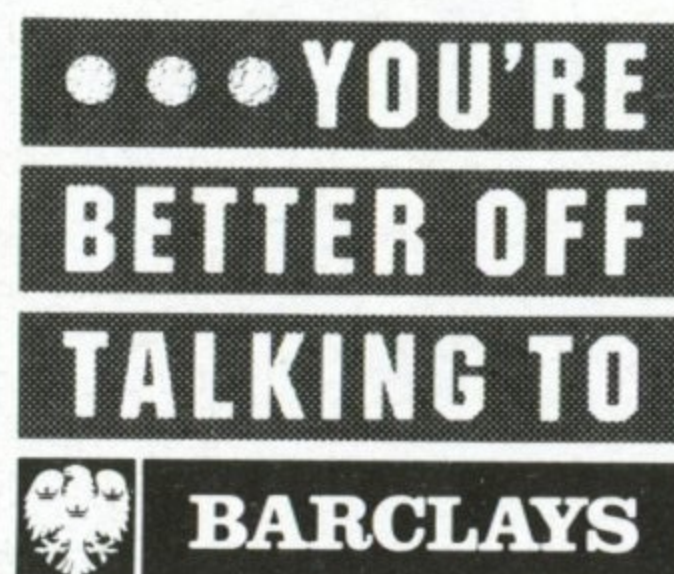

With only two wins at Highfield Road from 28 starts and only two victories at Kenilworth Road since 1952 we offer a tentative welcome to Coventry City tonight, writes club statistician Roger Wash.

Our first ever home meeting, on 2nd April 1927, gave us false hope for the future with a 4-1 victory delighting the crowd of 6,900 and it was not until 1933/34 that we suffered our first defeat at Kenilworth Road.

A consistent thorn in the side of Coventry City at that time was the prolific Luton marksman Andy Rennie who scored in both games against the "Bantams", as they were then known, in 1928/29 on his way to a then record 43 goals in a season. He also scored both goals in our solitary pre-war victory at Highfield road in 1930/31.

Surprisingly enough games with Coventry City were regarded as local derbies on a par with Watford in these days and in case you thought that football hooliganism is a more modern phenomenon it is sadly reported that the police has to clear the Kenilworth Road pitch of fighting supporters after a Coventry win in 1938/39.

After the war the edge went out of the games and in 1951/52 shortly before Coventry's relegation from Division Two the Luton programme notes stated "Great and glorious battles have we had in the old Third Division days but somehow that same keenness has been missing since we were both promoted".

Despite this three players, in particular, have good

reason to be grateful to Coventry City during this period. Gordon Turner, our all time record goalscorer, made his debut at Coventry in 1950/51 while Dave Sexton scored his one and only goal for the club against Coventry at Kenilworth Road the season after.

Bill Hughes our then record signing and "the finest full back in the land" made his first appearance for the Town at Highfield Road in 1947 in a 4-1 defeat!

Our paths crossed again briefly in 1963/64 with the Jimmy Hill inspired "Sky Blues" on the ascendancy and the Town on the way to the football basement. The early season 3-1 defeat at Kenilworth Road flattened Coventry but we more than made amends in drawing 3-3 at Highfield Road later on to put a dent in their promotion hopes.

In more recent times all we have to shout about are two home wins and our first victory at Highfield Road since 1930/31 courtesy of a Brian Stein goal on January 1st 1987.

Also fondly remembered is last seasons 2-2 home draw which marked the League debut of Alec Chamberlain and set up the run in which we saw relegation avoided at the death.

Chamberlain is rather more fortunate than poor Sam Mayberry who waited for ages to oust Joe Coen from the Luton goal in the years leading up to the war.

He finally made his debut in the last game of 1938/39, against Coventry at Kenilworth Road, and then saw League football stopped for seven years!!

# WELCOME TO...

## COVENTRY CITY

● We welcome Coventry City to Kenilworth Road this afternoon. After their recent disappointment in the Littlewoods Cup, in which they were eliminated by Nottingham Forest 2-1 on aggregate in the semi-finals, they will be keen to return to winning ways.

● The Sky Blues, as they are popularly known, were formed in 1883 by workers at Singer's cycle factory. They won the Birmingham Junior Cup in 1891 and in 1894 were elected to the Birmingham and District League.

● In 1898, they changed their name to Coventry City and in 1908 they joined the Southern League. At this time, the Sky Blues were playing in blue and white quarters and had made their home, after two previous venues had been rejected, at Highfield Road.

● Coventry were elected to Division Two in 1919, but were back in Division Three (North) from 1925-1926 and then Division Three (South) from 1926-1936 when they regained their place in the Second Division.

● They enjoyed a long run in Division Two from 1936 to 1952 when they slipped back via six years in the Third Division (South) to Division Four where they spent 1958-59, finishing as runners-up to gain immediate promotion.

● Since then, it has been success all the way for Coventry by comparison. They won the Third Division championship in 1963-64 and the Second Division title in 1966-67 when current managing director George Curtis was the inspirational mainspring and they have remained in the top flight ever since.

● The Sky Blues best ever league season was in 1969-70 when they finished sixth in the First Division, a record they nearly matched last year when they were seventh. In cup competitions, their greatest achievement came in 1987 when they beat Tottenham Hotspur at Wembley to win the F.A. Cup.

● Their Littlewoods Cup semi-final defeat was not their first. They were also beaten at the last four stage in 1980-81 when the Football League Cup existed under another sponsors' name.

● Coventry's team manager is John Sillett. he was promoted to the job after working as coach under Curtis in the F.A. Cup-winning season in 1987 and is well-known in the game as one of football's most cheery and forthright characters.

● Sillett is the club's 16th post-war manager and has followed in the steps of some big names like Jimmy Hill, who was the architect of Coventry's great successes of the 1960's, Noel Cantwell, Dave Sexton, Bobby Gould and Curtis.

● Since last season, Sillett has made two major moves into the transfer market by adding former Glasgow Rangers and Norwich striker Kevin Drinkell and winger Kevin Gallacher, from Dundee United, to his squad.

● Both cost the club big fees, but found themselves eclipsed in the Sky Blues team by youth product Steve Livingstone who announced his striking arrival with a blaze of goals midway through the season.

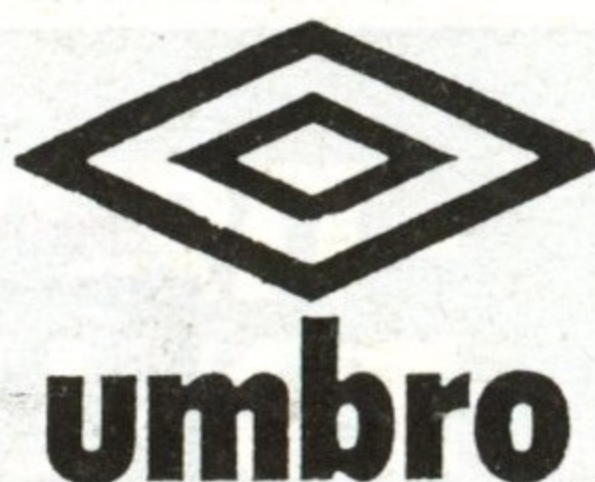
