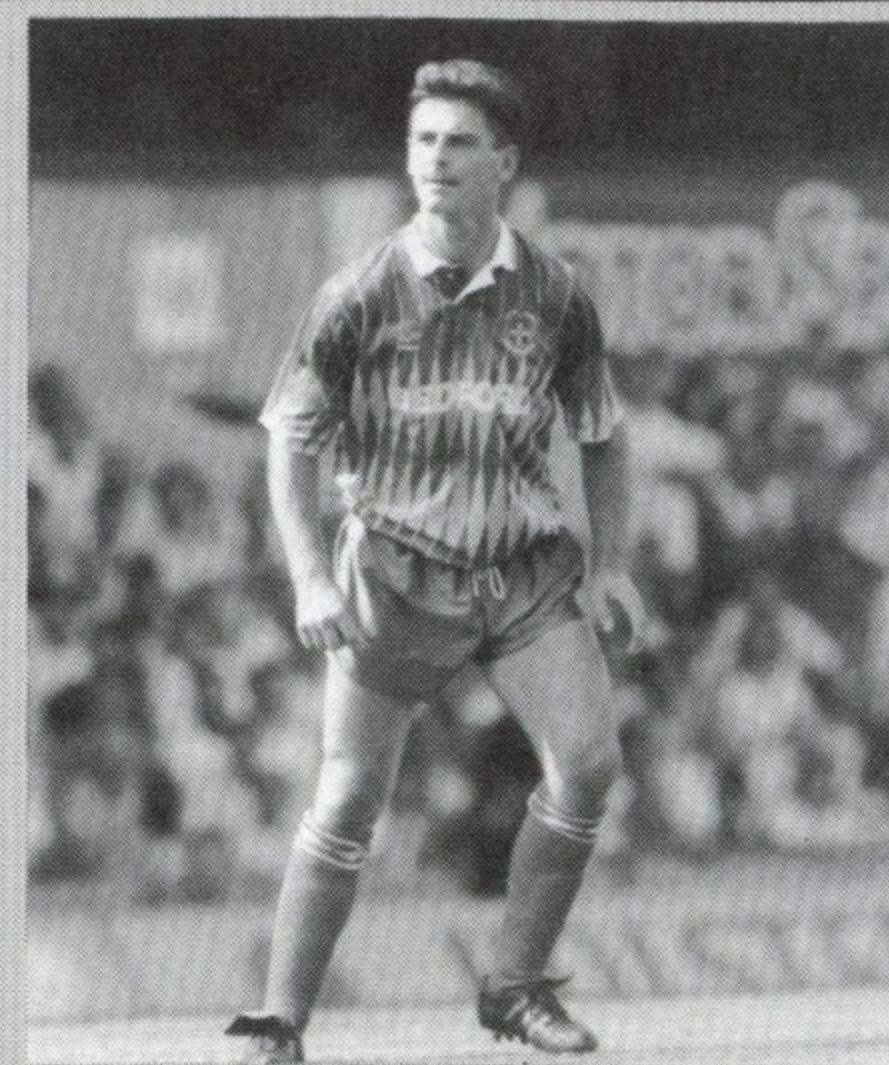

## DRESSING ROOM SPIRIT REMAINS GOOD DESPITE FRUSTRATIONS

Welcome to Manchester City. I know all our supporters, like myself and our team manager Jim Ryan, had been hoping to confirm the possible purchase of Rony Rosenthal this week as a boost to the club as we go into the very important last quarter of the season.

This has not happened however and, with the present injury situation, we have to give great credit to Jim and our young players for their spirited and excellent performances. Jim's belief in their potential has clearly been proven alongside the example of their senior team-mates.

Indeed, talking about young players is not really accurate. They are our first team players and have proved that and deserve to enjoy that status whatever other labels are put on them.

Having spoken to other clubs about work permit applications, it seems they can take up to or more than six weeks to be processed and ratified. I know West Ham had one application rejected last year and not finally approved until February for their goalkeeper.

Obviously, we understand the protection of our own national and EEC players is necessary but in the case of Rony we have been

talking of a £500,000 transfer being badly affected as he could be available finally for only a bare handful of games.

The directors, having agreed terms with Liege and the player, now believe the viability of the transfer deal is doubtful in the long-term. At the time of writing, however, Jim Ryan and I have been continuing to press the Department of Employment for a permit.

At the end of the day, it has to be in the interests of the team for the situation to be resolved quickly as the longer it continues the more distracting it becomes to everyone.

This was evident last Wednesday when some of our supporters showed their early disappointment and gave vent to it during the match with Coventry. I know, and so do the players deep down, that this is pure frustration, but it is much better if the crowd can get behind the team and help to earn the points.

Backing the players is important, particularly with a young team, and can be of real assistance to them at this time as they give their utmost to help us preserve our First Division status.

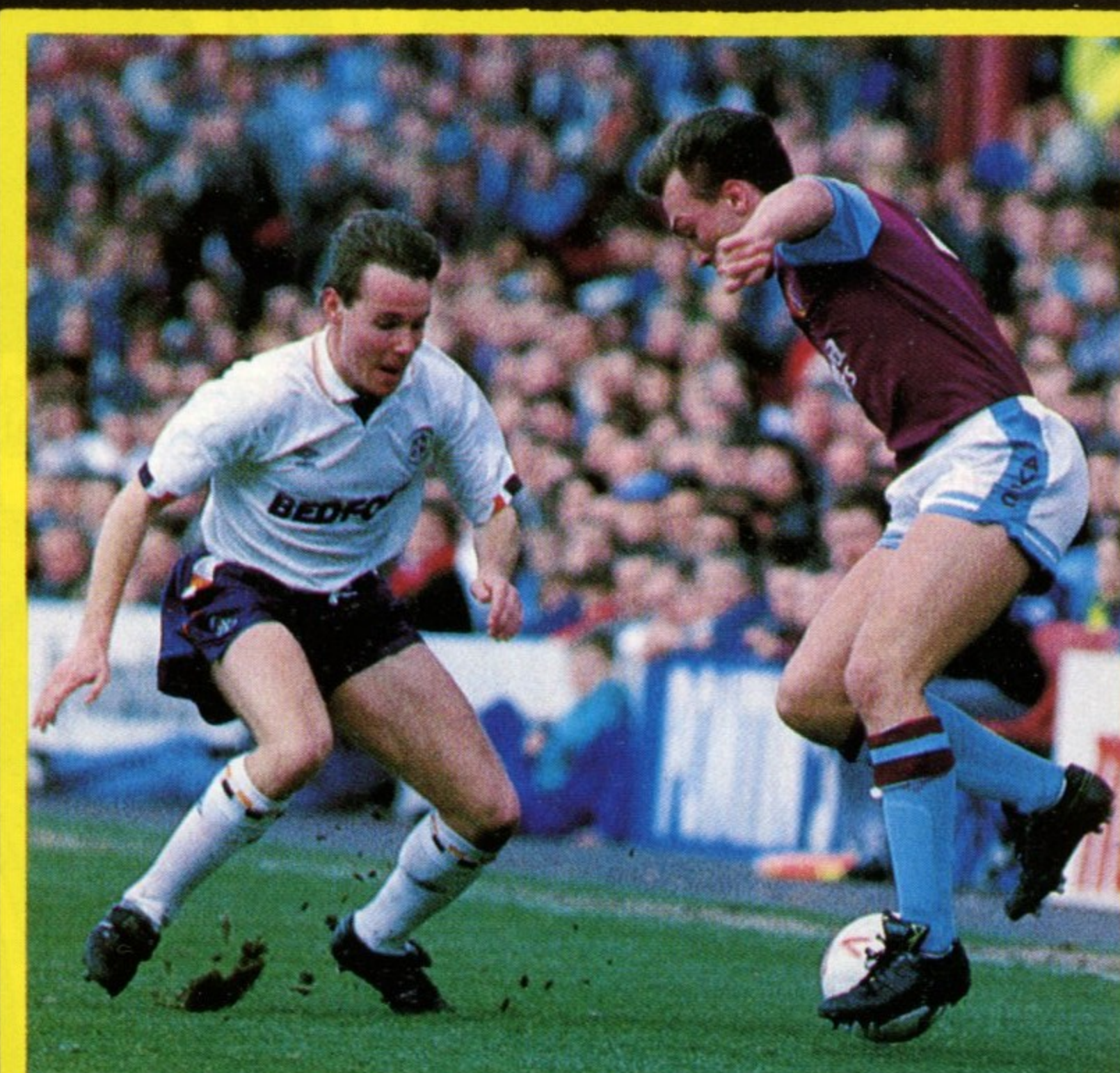

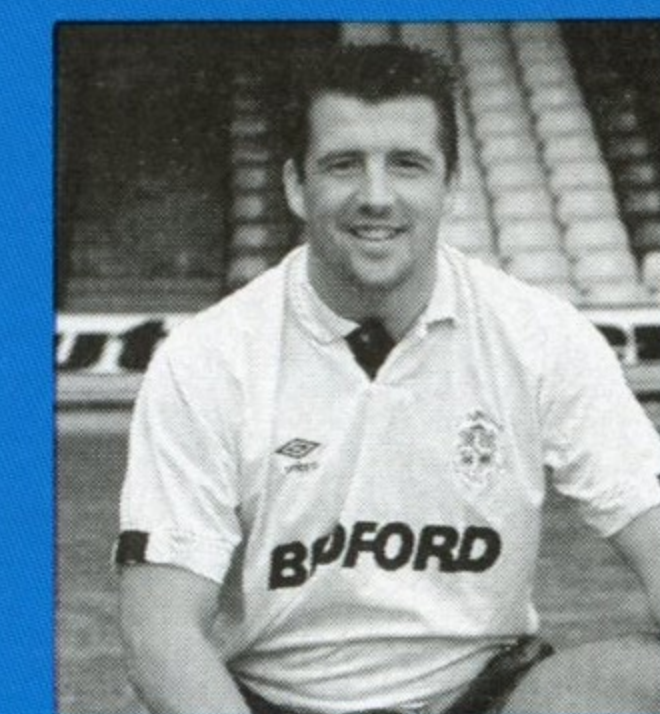

conceding goals and we were in the top 10 in the First Division. Everyone was enjoying it and we were really playing well as a team.

"Since then it has all changed of course. We have had a terrible run of injuries and it has never been possible to get a settled side. The kids who have come in have all done well and proved the club has a great future, but it is very difficult when they all come in together.

"It is a different thing if they can be brought in one or two at a time with plenty of experienced players around them. But to bring in five or six at a time is another matter altogether.

For Darron personally, the 1989-90 season will be one to forget as he is now currently struggling to overcome a hamstring injury below his knee. He said the dislocated shoulder he suffered against Wimbledon last September is now much better.

"That's okay," he said. "Now I've got another niggling injury to get over. It is just one thing after another. It can really get you down when it goes on and on.

"You need to ask my wife what I'm like really. I don't think I've been too bad, but I do get a bit fed up. When I am at work at the club with the lads it is different. But sometimes I do feel a bit quiet for the odd day".

### Frustration

"It has been a frustrating season all the way for me. The worst of my career from the injuries point of view because it has gone on for so long," said Darron McDonough this week as he battled once again for the fitness he needs to reclaim his place in the Town defence.

"I started the season in the number five shirt and to be honest that was what I was aiming to do. I had wanted to take over at centre-half when I had the chance and I was glad to get into the side. And we were doing pretty well when I got injured after only eight games.

"It was just one of those things, but it was a real blow. We were going quite well in the league, we were not

## EUROPEAN SUPER LEAGUE .... A CASE OF PARALLEL LINES DIVERGING

The recent talk of the formation of a European Super League to include all of the Continent's biggest and richest clubs – eg AC Milan, Real Madrid, Barcelona, Bayern Munich, Juventus, Internazionale, PSV Eindhoven and Marseilles – has sparked off enormous debate within the game.

Here is one example of the feelings from within football as written in a recent issue of the Barclays League Bulletin:

"Last weekend's rather presumptuous speculation that the formation of a European Super League was imminent certainly received a less than enthusiastic reaction from many within football. Moreover, the proposals outlined in press reports on Sunday broke no ice with the football authorities either in Scotland, where the speculation seemed to emanate from, nor south of the border.

Much of the scepticism is borne out of the belief that the concept of a European Super League running in parallel with the domestic league championship is fundamentally flawed. And it is naive to believe that the clubs who are excluded would tolerate being used as a stepping stone to the ultimate formation of an autonomous European competition.

How, for instance, could a parallel operation be

contemplated when the financial rewards for participating in a European League would be so immense. Indeed, they would be on such a scale, and estimates of between £12 million and £15 million per annum for each participating club have been mooted, that the privileged few would have an unmitigated advantage over their domestic counterparts.

In effect, the fundamental ingredients necessary for any domestic competition to retain its credibility as a meritocracy would become too imbalanced. Even today, can Hamilton Academicals be realistically expected to compete on an equal footing with Glasgow Rangers?

Because professional football in particular is ultimately dependent upon the spectators' willingness to pay for the unpredictability of its theatre, the game has an overriding obligation to ensure that free enterprise is always balanced against fair competition. And whilst sport must always strive to reach new heights, this should be driven by genuine ambition and not unabated avarice. By his own admission, Silvio Berlusconi sees the formation of a European Super League quite simply as a means to an end!"

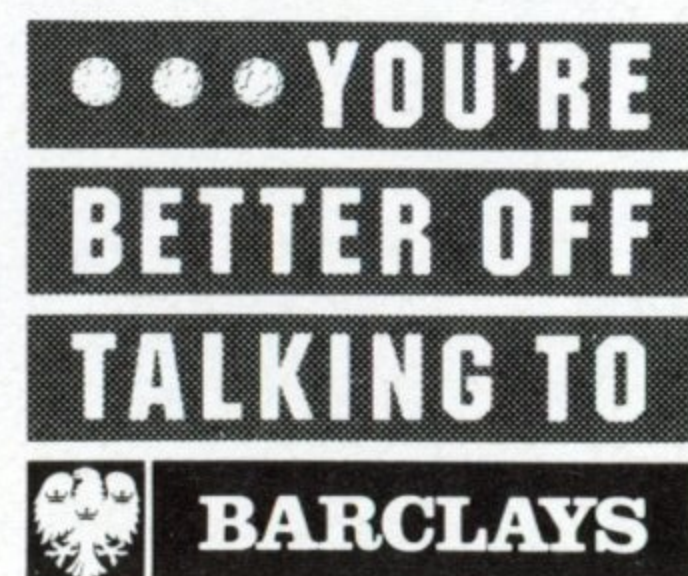

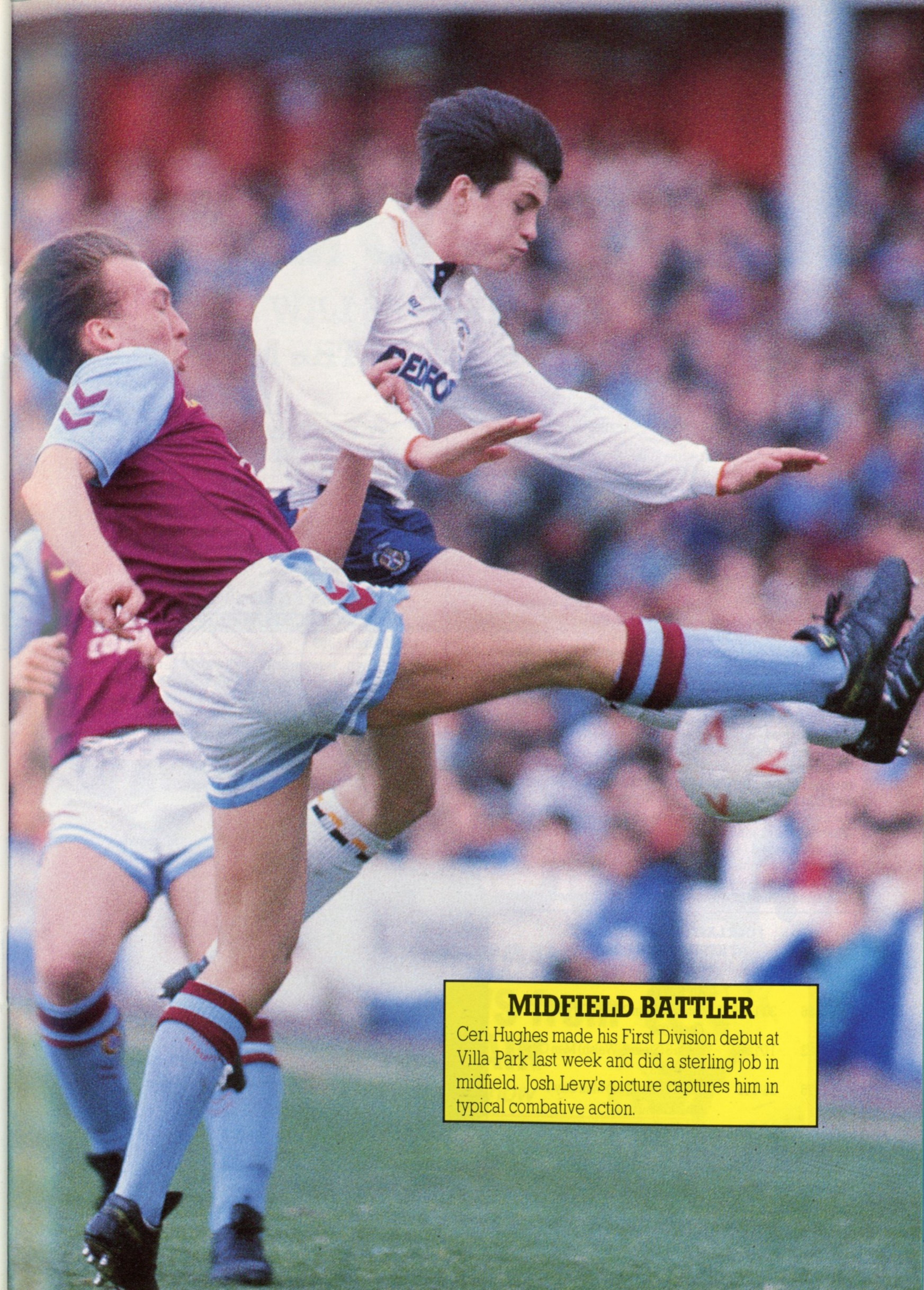


The first televised football match, 1937

Now every Football League ground is equipped with television cameras.

The Football Trust has installed Closed Circuit Television systems at more than 110 British grounds. The cameras have a range of 150 metres and immediate close-up prints can be produced. Within minutes of an incident offenders can be identified and arrested with film made available as evidence in court. CCTV is the most effective anti-hooligan measure inside football grounds and the programme has been extended to include portable systems.

CCTV is only one of The Football Trust's many initiatives. Each year it receives over £9.5 million from the Spotting-the-Ball competition run by Littlewoods, Vernons and Zettlers and spends it on projects that benefit all levels of the game throughout the United Kingdom.

# OFF THE RECORD

## A DAY TO REMEMBER AS LAW ENJOY'S SIX-GOAL FROLIC IN THE MUD

With the Town newly relegated to Division Two, 1960/61 proved to be another mediocre season and by Christmas it was obvious that a quick return to the top flight was beyond the bounds of possibility, writes club statistician Roger Wash.

In order to stimulate enthusiasm another FA Cup run similar to that of two years previous was desperately required and to this end the Town were drawn to meet Northampton at Kenilworth Road in the Third Round - the first competitive meeting between the two near neighbours for 23 years.

As it turned out a crowd of 26,220 saw a fairly easy Luton victory to the tune of 4-0 and with the reward of another home tie - this time against First Division Manchester City - Cup fever and a renewed interest in Luton Town became apparent.

Supporters woke up on the day of the game to be confronted by heavy rain which persisted all morning and into the afternoon. Despite the obvious threat to the game 23,727 turned up to see the Kenilworth Road pitch swimming in water.

The referee, obviously hoping for a let up in the rain decided to start the game and the Luton supporters were very glad he did as Alec Ashworth put the ball in the Manchester net twice in the first 18 minutes.

Then a young man by the name of Denis Law took over and proceeded to give an exhibition in the art of goalscoring notching a hat trick before half-time to put the visitors ahead.

The second half started as the first had finished with Law

unstoppable on the slippery surface and scoring another three before the heavens opened in the 69th minute leaving the referee no option but to take both teams off.

Legend has it that the referee's intention was to keep the players in their respective dressing rooms for a few minutes until the downpour eased before restarting the game but, showing admirable gamesmanship, the Town players jumped out the bath!

When the referee decided to try again a visit to the Luton dressing room soon made him change his mind and the match was abandoned leaving a shocked Law bemoaning the unfairness of it all to the Press.

The game was replayed the following Wednesday with an afternoon kick-off because City's goalkeeper Bert Trautmann did not think the Kenilworth Road floodlights were up to scratch.

City's line up remained unchanged but the Town made major changes to their defence in an attempt to close the game down. With a far more solid look the Town again took a two goal lead through Ashworth and Jim Fleming but despite a goal from Law on the stroke of half time the Luton players were in no mood for defeat and a second goal from Ashworth after 64 minutes sealed an unlikely victory.

If anything the conditions were worse for the second game with a waterlogged, but even, pitch giving way to thick, cloying mud. As Denis Law said afterwards "At least the ball ran clean and true in the first game".

For the record the Town lost 1-0 at Barnsley in the next round.

# WELCOME TO...

## MANCHESTER CITY

- We give a warm welcome this afternoon to Manchester City who have like ourselves not been enjoying the best of fortunes in the First Division this season. Indeed, they also underwent a change of management midway through the campaign when Mel Machin was replaced by former Everton and Athletic Bilbao manager Howard Kendall.
- Mr Kendall follows a long line of well-known football personalities to have been in charge of the Maine Road club. These include Joe Mercer, Malcolm Allison, Ron Saunders, John Bond and Billy McNeill. In all, there have been 24 managers at Manchester City since 1894 and 17 since the Second World War.
- City were formed as a Limited Company in 1894 after their predecessors Ardwick had been forced into bankruptcy. However, many historians like to trace the club's lineage as far back as 1880 when St Marks Church, West Gorton, added a football section to their cricket club. They amalgamated with Gorton Athletic in 1884 as Gorton FC, becoming Ardwick in 1887 when they moved grounds.
- City have been one of the number of teams in recent years who have travelled to-and-fro between the First and Second Divisions. Last season, they regained their place in the top flight with promotion under Mel Machin.
- It was hoped by their large following that the success

would spark off a sustained run of good form and a revival of the club's great years of the late 1960's and 1970's under Mercer and Allison when they were frequent entrants to European football and often challenging for the big honours in the English game.

● Their honours reflect their successes of the past. They were winners of the First Division title in 1937 and again in 1968 and runners-up in 1904, 1921 and 1977. They were Division Two champions in 1899, 1903, 1910, 1928, 1947 and 1966 and have been runners-up on another three occasions.

● In cup competitions, City also have a fine record having won the European Cup Winners Cup in 1970, the Football League Cup in 1970 and 1976 and the F.A. Cup in 1904, 1934, 1956 and 1969.

● In addition to their honours, City can also boast the British record attendance for any game outside London or Glasgow. On March 3, 1943, their stadium housed 84,569 people for the FA Cup sixth round tie against Stoke City.

● City's record for the player with the largest number of league appearances for the club is held by Alan Oakes who made 565 appearances for the club between 1959 and 1976. Colin Bell is City's most capped player, having played 48 times for England. Their squad today includes Andy Dibble our former goalkeeper, Welcome back, Andy.
