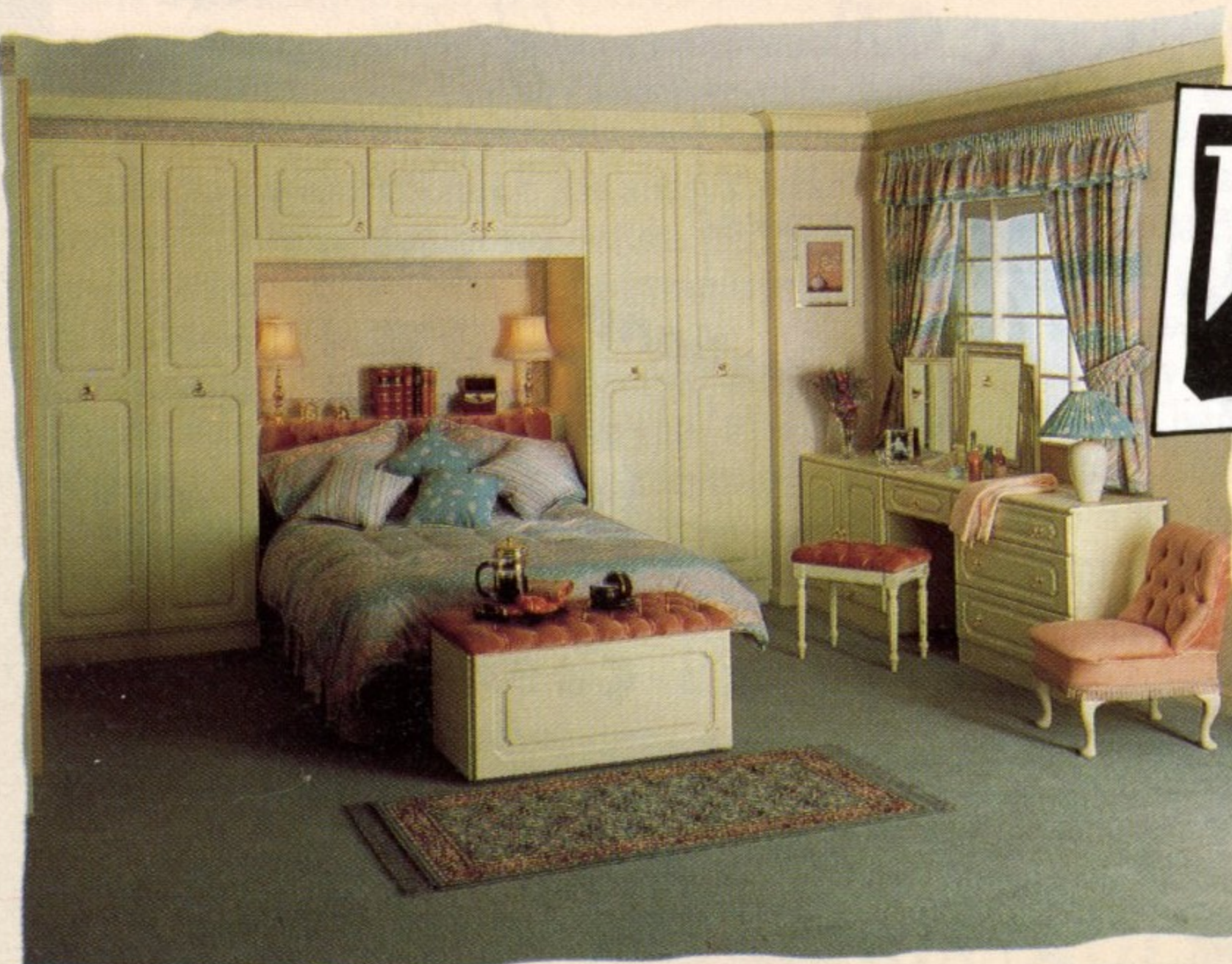

Until very recently, representative football teams involved with professional clubs have not been allowed to play matches, said our Youth Development Officer Paul Lowe.

"Usually, they return to their regular club or schools teams and cannot do that because the matches they play in are not at that level. This one will be.

"We have got some very good youngsters coming through so this team is really a reflection of the future of the club. Hopefully, when they are old enough, our young boys will come along and sign as associated schoolboys and go on to become our apprentices and full professionals of the future.

"We already have one very promising boy, Matthew Fleet of St Josephs, signed on associate schoolboy forms."

SAFETY IS IN OUR OWN HANDS

Good afternoon and welcome to Millwall, one of the clubs for whom the police considered dropping our guesting facility, but, because of their current reputation, we chose not to.

Last weekend, we experienced our first unsavoury league incident inside our ground since the introduction of our membership scheme four years ago and I felt it was necessary for several points to be made.

One of the common misconceptions about our club and our membership scheme is that we operate a system which bans visitors. This is not true since what we do operate is a 100 per cent members-only scheme.

This scheme places great emphasis upon its members. It is not a sophisticated high-tech electronic scheme, but one which depends upon our own members to make it work.

We have 23,000 members and it would be impossible of course to say that we have 23,000 members who are all perfect. What we have is a cross-section of the community taken from within our catch-

ment area like all clubs.

Each member has signed a form which said he would accept and abide by the rules of the club. This permits him, as we have shown below, to bring in three guests.

Clearly, this system can be abused. How are we to know if a member is actually a supporter of another club but lives within our catchment area and applies for membership without informing us? At the end of the day, we have no way of knowing, but if they come to Kenilworth Road and behave then no harm is done.

But, if the membership policy is abused, there can be very serious repercussions as we saw last Saturday when we played Manchester City. When we have unscrupulous members acting as touts selling tickets on for a profit around the ground, all our members are put at risk.

We are a club with integrated spectator facilities. Not segregated. And this has been very successful. But last weekend, for the first time in four years, we had an incident in which a member was injured.

We have a proviso that we can always remove the guesting facility as desired for any match on the advice of our police. This, when it has happened, has always aroused complaints.

But it now has to be considered carefully after this serious incident. It may be that guesting has to be removed and everyone in the ground should be a member.

At every home match, the police, our stewards and myself spend a great deal of time being extremely vigilant about our membership scheme. Only the most unscrupulous break the rules and risk all the members.

I can tell you that when the scheme has been abused those involved have had serious action taken against them and have, in some cases, been excluded from the club and via the F.A., all other football for life.

Overall, however, the last four years have proved that our system works and for no other reason than our members have made it work. Complaints there have been of course.

For example, a lot of our season

ticket holders and other members have complained at the growing number of visitors. But unless everyone is vetted on entry very carefully, there is no alternative but to stop the guesting procedure. And this is something I do not wish to see.

I would like to see our supporters, take note of people touting tickets and to report them to the police. These people should be stopped and it is within the power of our members to keep our club safe and secure.

Our only allocation of tickets to visitors is the 50 we give to the visiting club on a reciprocal basis for each club involved. Some supporters have said that they are always placed in the same section but this is inevitable as they are the seats which remain unsold to season ticket holders.

As to last Saturday's incident, I know the member personally and feel personally aggrieved. But, I have to take the overall picture into account over the last four years.

And this shows there have been no previous incidents inside the

ground at any league matches. Clearly, there are very important matters to be discussed regarding the future policy of the club by both directors and supporters.

Our scheme is not designed to ban visitors, as I have said earlier and as literally hundreds of students, official visitors and the rest have learned in recent years. But it is designed to ban casual and uncontrolled visitors.

Its success is such that it has spread far and wide. Indeed, Liverpool, I understand, were considering introducing a membership scheme of their own after Hillsborough in readiness for turning Anfield into an all-seater.

In the particular incident which took place last weekend, a member brought a guest ticket, but did not abide by the rules. His so-called guest sold it on to a Lancashire lad and a Luton member was the victim of a brutal attack.

Attention must be drawn to all the rules of membership, as printed here, but most of all to the responsibility of members to their club. It is up to our own members to make it work.

PENALTY CLAUSE PAYS DOUBLE

Luton Town 1 Manchester City 1

Two goals from penalties in the final 18 minutes ended up producing a draw from a match the Town could have won if their former goalkeeper Andy Dibble has not chosen to be in such excellent form.

The former Lutonian and Welsh international made a series of brilliant saves with notable efforts thwarting David Preece, twice, and Iain Dowie on a day when three points appeared to be there for the taking. Julian James was also unlucky to see a thunderous volley strike Colin Hendry on the line in the second half.

In the end, City escaped thanks to Dibble's heroics and the accuracy of the recalled Clive Allen from the penalty spot. Allen benefitted after 80 minutes when Richard Harvey, back after injury, pulled back David White as he ran on to an Allen pass.

At that time, the Town led 1-0 thanks to Danny Wilson's well-struck short from a 72nd minute penalty awarded when Dibble pulled down substitute Paul Gray whose pace and urgency had injected life into the attack in the second half.

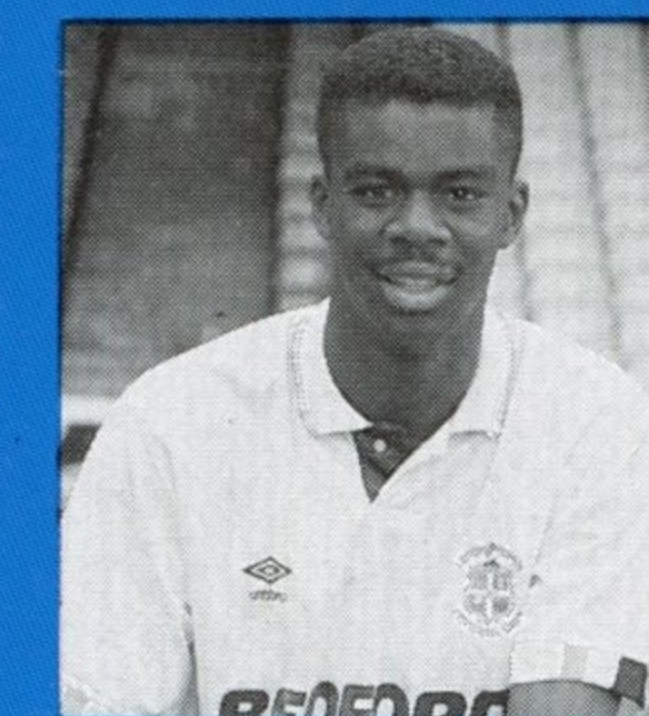

"When I went into hospital they said they would wire the jaw up and I would be out for at least six weeks, but in the end they decided after they had seen me and talked to me that it would be alright to have just a splint. That means I am probably out for only three or four weeks and I have a chance of playing again this season.

"I would certainly like to because I was just getting back into the first team picture again when it happened. I had a bit of a run last season and this year had been a bit disappointing for me from the point of view of appearances.

"The number five shirt has been really hit by injuries and I thought this meant I would have a chance of breaking through again, but it was not to be. Julian James has done a great job though and so have all the other young lads in the first team.

"Morale in the team is much higher now than it was and everyone is pleased with the way we are playing under Jim Ryan now that he is manager. It is good that we all feel we are playing the real Luton way again.

"Like everyone, I like to get forward as much as I can and playing under Jim Ryan makes you feel you can. I have scored a few goals in the reserves and I would love to score in the first team.

"Now though I am just concentrating on keeping up my level of general fitness work. I have to aim at getting back in the first team squad later on altogether – maybe next season. But I am sure we will still be in the First Division.

"I saw last Saturday's match against Manchester City and thought Andy Dibble played brilliantly. He saved them and kept them in the game really. He made three or four brilliant saves. If we keep on playing that way we are sure to get the results and keep out of trouble."

"Painful blow"

"It was very painful, especially at night when it was so difficult to get to sleep. I hardly slept for three or four nights afterwards," said Marvin this week as reflected on the broken jaw he sustained against Coventry City here two weeks ago.

"I had a tooth knocked out and had the remains removed properly three or four days later. That was painful too. I just couldn't lie comfortably on my side in bed. It's a lot better now, but still sore."

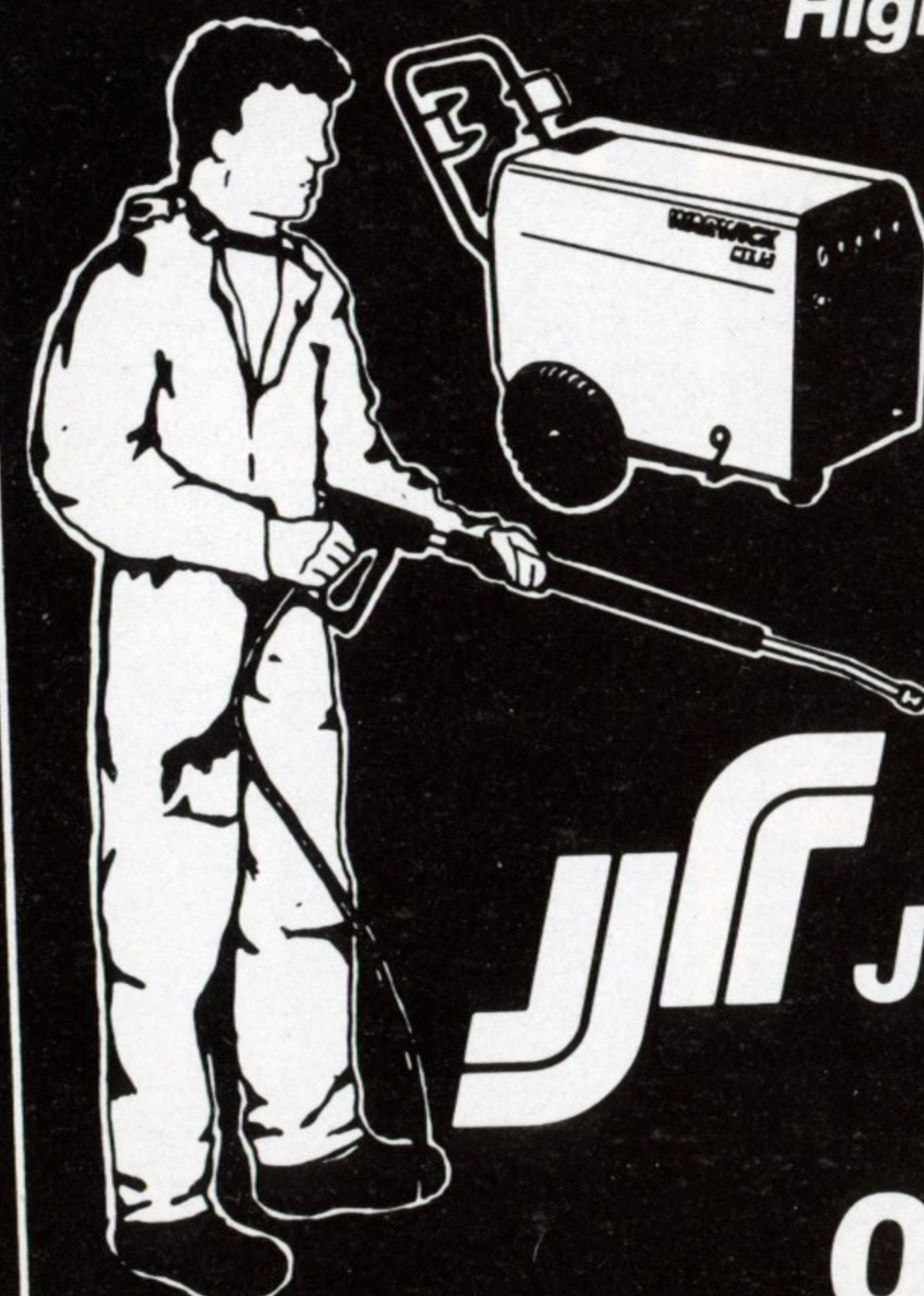
A collision with Coventry's winger Kevin Gallagher caused Marvin's injury during the second half of our 3-2 win. Marvin had come on as a half-time substitute for Richard Harvey, but finished the match with his mouth pouring blood.

"I remember seeing he had the ball and I made a run to try and get in tight on him and it was just one of those things which sometimes happen as you go in to challenge. I think he put his arms up to protect himself.

SURVEY REVEALS THE SOUND OF FOOTBALL'S MISSING VOICE

There is ample evidence to confirm that league football remains, as ever, Britain's favourite spectator sport. And about three out of every four customers believe the game gives tremendous value for money – but only too rarely have their views been properly aired, researched and analysed.

The Football league, in its recent report 'The Missing Voice' sponsored by Rothmans Publications, has made some effort to rectify this omission and has discovered some interesting facts in the process.

For example, among those researched by MORI for the Football League, 39 per cent felt playing standards have improved in recent years while marginally more, 42 per cent, disputed this. Younger fans generally felt the technical standards of the game were rising in Britain. Older fans disagreed.

"Strong Support for better catering"

When it came to reasons for non-attendance at games, as shown below, a clear 32 per cent said it was due to hooliganism and the threat of violence while only 12 per cent blamed the cost of admission. Even fewer, just five per cent, said it was because the game was too defensive and unexciting.

The survey showed there would be strong support for improved catering facilities at most grounds with 56 per cent of those consulted saying that there were too few restaurant facilities.

Similarly, 54 per cent said there were too few drinks facilities and 53 said toilet facilities were inadequate. Altogether, this suggests a good revenue earning opportunity for clubs.

Membership schemes were also studied in the report and several interesting results came out. For example, the report showed a high level of positive reaction to schemes which offered supplementary to benefits to members – 73 per cent were interested in free or reduced admission to sports or leisure facilities within their membership and 67 per cent in discounts at clothes shops.

On the cost of membership, 37 per cent of those surveyed said that they would not be prepared to pay anything to join a scheme and the average suggested amount of those who expressed a view was £7.40.

Various other football topics were also aired including questions about the number of clubs in the English First Division and participation by English clubs in a European Superleague.

Most supporters (77 per cent) felt the current size of the First Division is about right. On the Superleague question most supporters (87 per cent) felt participation in it should not prevent continuing participation in the Football League.

Overall, the survey gives a familiar picture, with most supporters expressing generally accepted views: better facilities and more facilities needed, a luke-warm reception for membership schemes, satisfaction with the league structure and no opposition to a European Superleague.

On the vexed subject of all-seater stadia, as proposed in the Taylor report, the reaction was mixed. Some 25 per cent strongly supported. 22 per cent tended to support and a total of 44 per cent were in opposition.

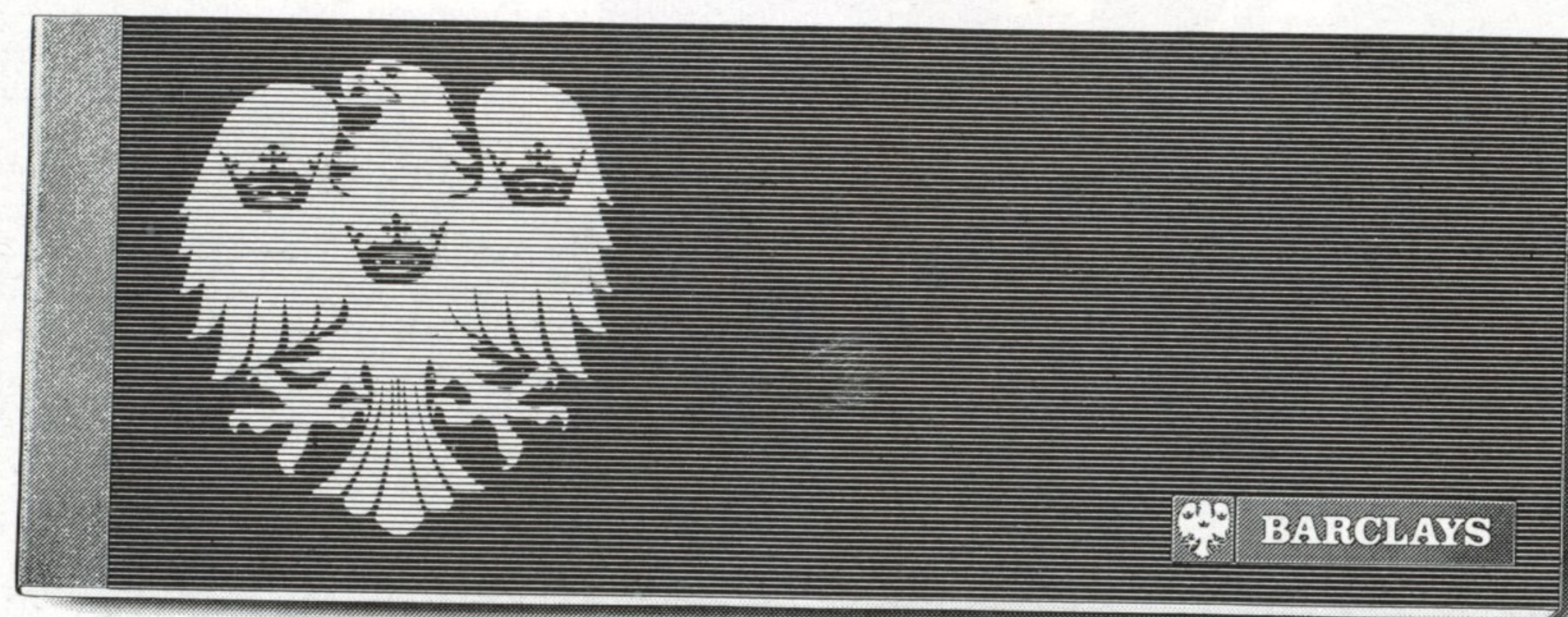

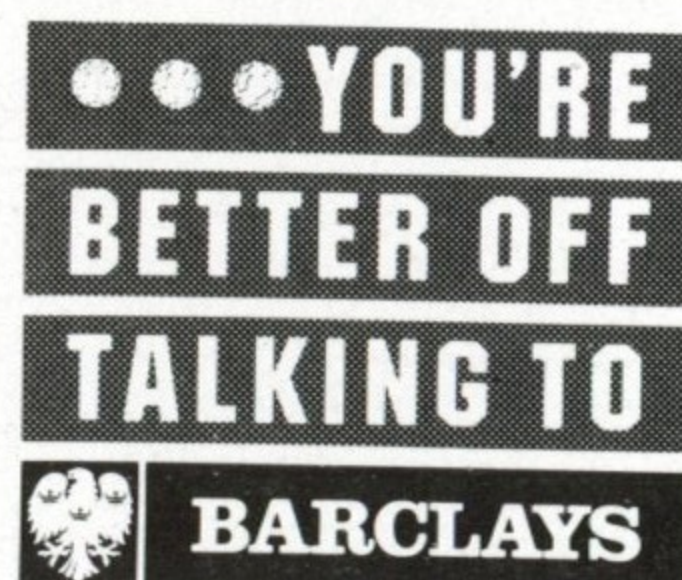

The Football Trust has installed Closed Circuit Television systems at more than 110 British grounds. The cameras have a range of 150 metres and immediate close-up prints can be produced. Within minutes of an incident offenders can be identified and arrested with film made available as evidence in court. CCTV is the most effective anti-hooligan measure inside football grounds and the programme has been extended to include portable systems.

CCTV is only one of The Football Trust's many initiatives. Each year it receives over £9.5 million from the Spotting-the-Ball competition run by Littlewoods, Vernons and Zettors and spends it on projects that benefit all levels of the game throughout the United Kingdom.

OFF THE RECORD

LIONS ROAR IS A FRIENDLY SOUND IN LUTON MEMORIES

Easter has often proved to be the graveyard of Luton Town's hopes in the past and 1973/74 seemed set to test that theory, *writes club statistician Roger Wash.*

The Town were lying in second position in the Division two table as Easter 1974 approached but with a half dozen teams snapping at their heels, the three holiday games were vital to a club that hoped to be the first to slide down through all four divisions and then climb all the way back again.

Thousands of us travelled to Oxford on Good Friday to boost the attendance to a best of the season 13,464 but in a lacklustre display against struggling opposition a single point was the only reward in a 1-1 draw. The Town's goal was a rather scrappy effort scored by Jim Ryan summing up an untidy game.

The following day saw the Town pitched against another side battling for points at the wrong end of the table and the 2-2 draw secured at Sheffield Wednesday was seen as yet another point lost especially as the "Owls" had been beaten in two of their previous three home games.

The worst was still to come, however, for in the return against Oxford at Kenilworth Road on Easter Tuesday a crowd of 16,353 watched as the away side took an early lead and proceeded to sit on it.

The Town were predictable in their sole tactic of

thumping a high ball up to striker Barry Bultin and with a tall Oxford defence dominated by the blonde head of Dave Roberts soaking up everything with ease frustration set in both on the field and off it.

Three games were now left, starting with a home game against Millwall the following Saturday and in preparation manager Harry Haslam and the team spent four hours studying the Oxford game on their new £1,000 toy a video recorder.

The outcome was that Millwall caught the full backlash of the Town's poor Easter and were beaten in every department with an easy 3-0 win the just reward for a sparkling display.

John Faulkner set up the rout with a header from Jim Ryan corner after 8 minutes followed by a clever Peter Anderson lob shortly afterwards. The goalscoring was completed midway through the second half when Gordon Hindson raced through from the halfway line in a solo run before slotting the ball under Millwall keeper Bryan King.

The scoreline did not fully reflect the Town's superiority as Alan West was unlucky with efforts that could have brought him a hat-trick.

When the scores from other games affecting the top of the division were broadcast it was quickly realised that a point from the remaining away game – at West Bromwich – would secure promotion. The rest is history!

● Like ourselves, Millwall were founded in 1885. They were originally known as Millwall Rovers and were formed by employees of Morton & Co., a jam and marmalade factory in West Ferry Road, London. The founders were predominantly Scotsmen. Their first headquarters were established at The Islanders pub in Tooke Street, Millwall.

● Since those early days, of course, the club has had many managers including our own former player Peter Anderson, who was in charge from 1980 to 1982. Mr Pearson is the club's 14th manager since World War Two.

● Other well-known former Lions' bosses include Ron Gray, Benny Fenton, Gordon Jago, George Graham and John Docherty, who led them to promotion to the First Division for the first time in 1988.

● Millwall were original members of Division Three in 1920 and their league honours include championships for Division Two (1988), Division Three (South) in 1928 and 1938 and Division Four (1962). They have reached three F.A. Cup semi-finals in 1900, 1903 and 1937.

● Millwall have been based at their current ground, The Den in Cold Blow Lane, London SE14, since 1910 when they moved from North Greenwich. They had previously been based at Glengall Road, Millwall, the back of the 'Lord Nelson' and in East Ferry Road.

● The Lions' longest-serving player and a legend at the club was Barry Kitchener, a powerful defender, who made a total of 523 appearances between 1967 and 1982. Top scorer was Derek Possee who hit 79 goals between 1967 and 1973.

● The current Millwall squad contains several experienced players including former QPR full-back Ian Dawes, ex-Brentford defender Denis Salman, former Southampton and Oxford winger George Lawrence, ex-QPR, West Ham and Derby striker Paul Goddard and long-serving midfielders Les Briley and Terry Hurlock.
