REFLECTIONS

David Beaumont also returned to the side and did well. Darron McDonough came back the previous week and is settling in again. There are good signs and we hope we can turn our optimism into performances and results. Keep up the good vocal work too. Thanks.

MEMBERSHIP SCHEMES ARE STILL A CONSIDERATION

Good afternoon and welcome to Everton. After my last programme notes concerning our Membership Scheme, it was interesting to discover at Norwich City two weeks ago that a number of our supporters could not get into their seats at Carrow Road because they were not carrying membership cards.

There had been a breakdown in Norwich's communications which I, in the company of their Secretary Andrew Neville, was able to sort out quickly, but it highlighted some points and drew attention to the fact that the Canaries, like Liverpool and Millwall, are among a group of clubs considering introducing a Membership Scheme.

Talking to Norwich chairman Robert Chase, it was clear he was interested in a full membership scheme for their seated areas at both home and away matches.

Its success – if introduced – will depend upon the members themselves.

I was pleased to be able to assist the 45 Luton Town supporters who had tickets but were briefly frustrated at the gates.

It also shows that there are, fewer seats being made available to

visitors. At Chelsea last weekend, there were none at all on the recommendation of the Metropolitan Police.

On a different note, it was satisfying to retain the Bedfordshire Premier Cup with a 5-4 aggregate victory over Arlesey. This competition has been a good opportunity to develop our relationship with the Bedfordshire F.A. and our local football community. We permit our opponents to keep all the home gate receipts, it is a gesture which I am sure is always appreciated.

We have been among the clubs recently expressing concern to the Football League about the way fixtures have been arranged. We now have three at home on successive Saturdays and have previously had several away matches together. This is not satisfactory for the team our supporters or the club.

We were also concerned that we were asked to travel to Everton on Boxing Day soon after having played at home to Chelsea. These sort of arrangements need to be studied closely and improved, giving priority to home and away matches on alternate Saturdays.

Luton Town 2 Millwall 1

Kingsley Black struck a marvellous goal and Mick McCarthy headed in an own goal as the Town took all three points from Millwall in what was a crucial meeting between the two sides here at Kenilworth Road on March 24. On a day when the points were more important to both teams than the entertainment value, the Town stuck firmly to their task and came away well rewarded for their efforts.

McCarthy, making his debut for Millwall after a move back to English football from France, opened the scoring after 42 minutes when David Preece took an inswinging corner from the right. Millwall goalkeeper Keith Branagan missed the ball in the air and McCarthy unwittingly headed in.

The second goal came midway through the second half after Jason Rees had gone on for Paul Gray. The Town forced two successive corners during a spell of concerted pressure and from the second, taken short by Preece, Black dribbled in and unleashed a tremendous shot into the corner of the net.

Millwall replied almost immediately. Substitute Les Briley came on and with his first touch became a scorer after Malcolm Allen had escaped on the left. The defence failed to clear his cross and Briley struck the ball well past Chamberlain.

This goal was followed by a spell of nervous reaction as the Town sought to regain a comfortable lead and further chances were made and missed before the final whistle ended the agony.

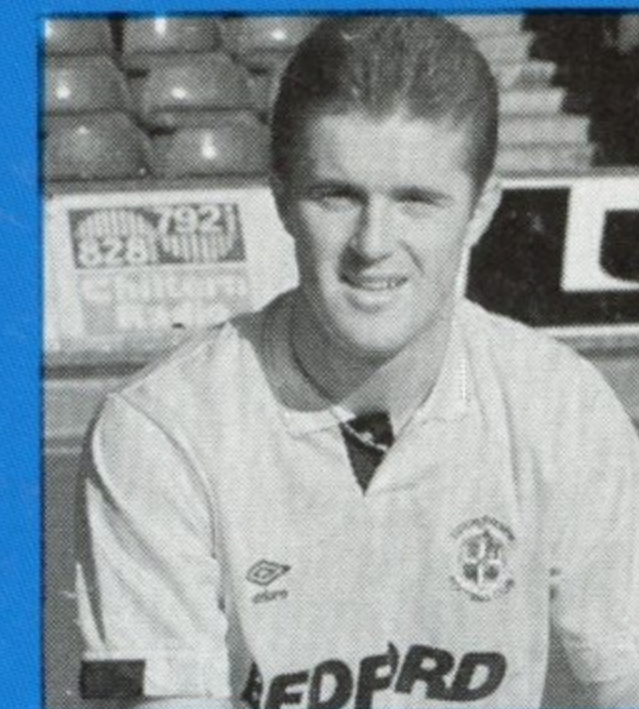

go and play in the reserves. It can be a bit difficult sometimes. But that's it. I am lucky to have played so many times for Jim Ryan that I know what he likes and he knows what I am capable of doing."

At 20, Paul is on the verge of a promising career. Last week, he travelled to Belfast with Kingsley Black and Iain Dowie to join up with the Northern Ireland under-21 squad. In the match against Israel he came on as a substitute and scored.

"It came from a free-kick. Iain managed to get in a header and I was able to reach his header and dived to score. Iain had scored the other goal earlier on when he headed in a rebound after the goalkeeper had saved a powerful shot.

"I suppose it is a significant feat for me because it was my first appearance at that level. Now I just want to settle down and hold my place in Billy Bingham's plans."

Paul made his first senior league appearance at Arsenal before Christmas and his full league debut at Goodison Park, against today's visitors Everton. He also made his first senior appearance against Everton two years ago as an 18-year-old when he and David Oldfield twinned up in attack for a Simod Cup tie.

"I've been very happy at Luton. Mal Donaghy made me welcome and helped me a lot when I first arrived and I have now taken up golf. Darron McDonough has given me some of his old clubs to use, but I'm pretty useless. Just a beginner. I like playing a bit of snooker too.

"People sometimes wonder about me being born in Portsmouth and being Irish, but that is because my dad was in the navy. Our family home is really in Belfast and it just happened that my mum was there when I was born during one of his shore leaves."

"So much faster"

"It is a lot quicker in the First Division. Much quicker than in the reserves. I think that is the first thing you really notice," said Paul Gray as he reflected on his progress in recent weeks. "It was always quick in the youth team because everyone was so keen and pumped up, but not so fast in the reserves."

Twelve months ago, Paul was fighting to overcome a knee ligaments injury which put him out of the game for a long period. Now he is delighted to have claimed a regular place in the first team squad and to have enjoyed a few senior appearances. But he is taking nothing for granted.

"There is no point in getting ever-confident or anything like that. When you are a squad player, you have to know that and do your best. Being a good squad player is part of the job and part of my football education. That's what it is about.

"Sometimes I am training all week with the first team squad and then on the Saturday I

JOE PAYNE AND DIXIE DEAN - STARS OF THE PAST

The Town take the field today 54 years and one day after centre-forward Joe Payne made a laughing stock of a lowly Bristol Rovers defence by scoring ten goals as we held onto the slenderest of leads at the top of Division Three (South).

The Town recorded an amazing 12-0 victory, a Third Division record, that day. Joe's massive goal haul remains a record for an individual in a Football League match, one goal better than Robert Bell of Tranmere Rovers who netted nine times against Oldham Athletic earlier in the same season - luckily for Joe the Merseyside striker managed to miss a penalty!

Joe's 10-goal Easter Monday bonanza came in his first game as a centre-forward. Not surprisingly, he continued to lead the Luton attack. In the three remaining matches that season, he added one more goal, against Coventry City. However, the home draw with Coventry proved to be a crucial lost opportunity for the Hatters, and the Midlands club sneaked above us to take the Division Three

(South) title by a solitary point. In doing so, Coventry also secured the only promotion place into Division Two.

But the following season, 1936/37, the Town demonstrated their strength of character. They bounced back immediately, turning disappointment into success, by gaining the promotion they had so nearly earned 12 months previously. And, as if to prove that his goal-scoring flourish was no fluke, Joe Payne became the chief architect of the success, amassing a huge season's total of 55 goals, another Third Division record.

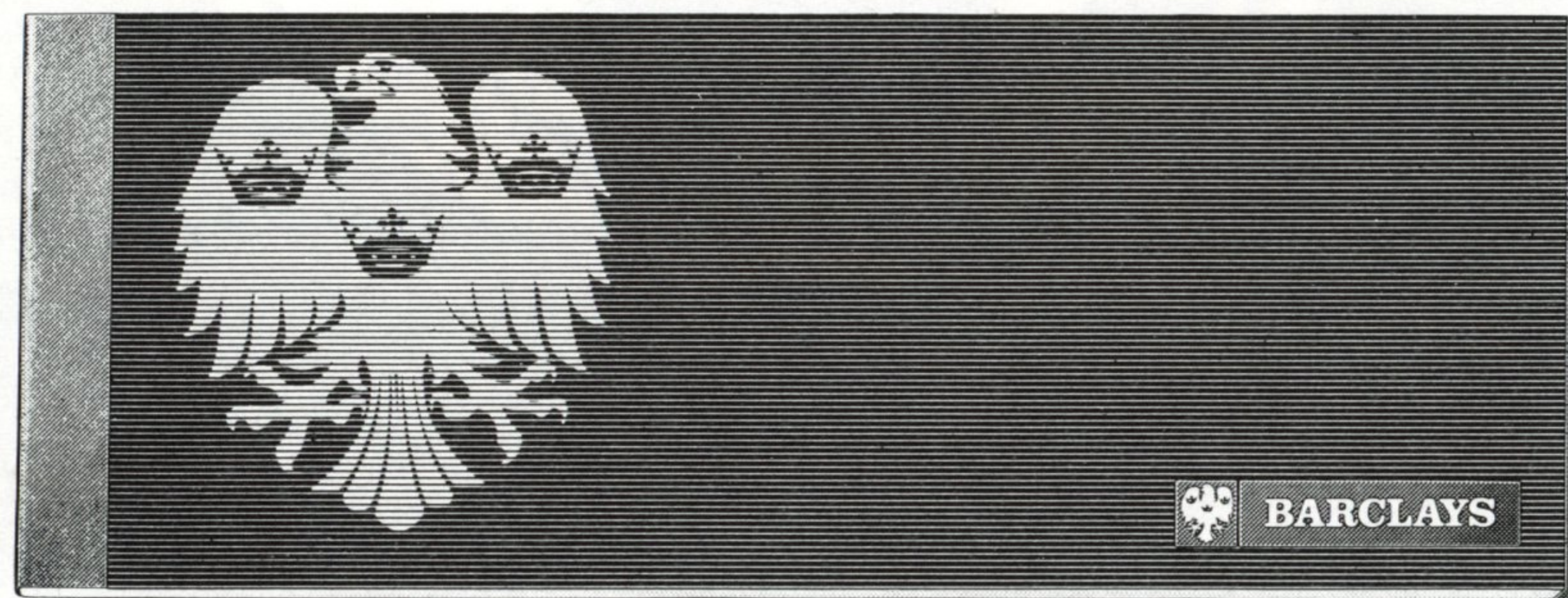
In fact, Joe's 55 goals ranks as third best in the overall list of highest individual scorers in the history of the Football League.

Of course, today's visiting Evertonians will remind their Luton counterparts that their legendary striking ace Dixie Dean heads that list, having collected 60 first Division goals during the 1927-28 season. But, despite his brilliance, Dixie could never match Joe's very special 10-goal haul.



●Wall of bodies: John Dreyer, Kingsley Black and Richard Cooke try to break up the Chelsea defence during our home clash earlier this season.

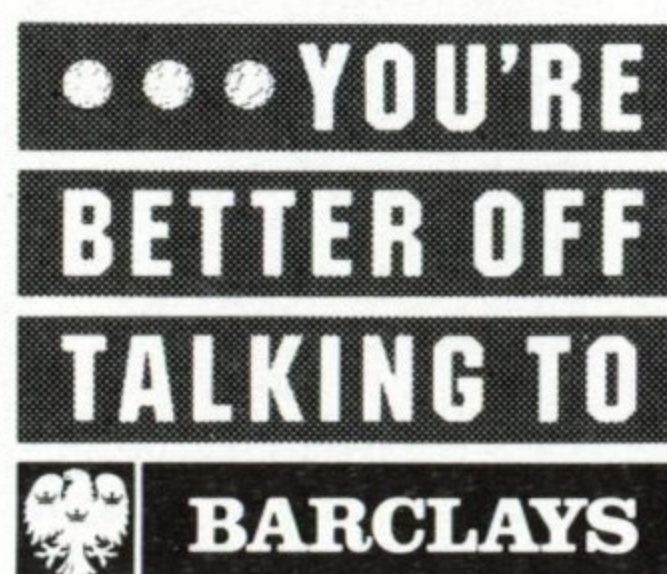

Now every Football League ground is equipped with television cameras.

The Football Trust has installed Closed Circuit Television systems at more than 110 British grounds. The cameras have a range of 150 metres and immediate close-up prints can be produced. Within minutes of an incident offenders can be identified and arrested with film made available as evidence in court. CCTV is the most effective anti-hooligan measure inside football grounds and the programme has been extended to include portable systems.

CCTV is only one of The Football Trust's many initiatives. Each year it receives over £9.5 million from the Spotting-the-Ball competition run by Littlewoods, Vernons and Zettors and spends it on projects that benefit all levels of the game throughout the United Kingdom.

OFF THE RECORD

Old time supporters of Luton Town will often talk of the occasions when the then Third Division side reached the 6th Round of the F.A. Cup for the first time only to be drawn away to mighty Everton writes club statistician Roger Wash.

The Cup run of 1932/33 was almost over before it had started as the Town were held at home 2-2 by non-league Kingstonian in the first round and then struggled to win 3-2 in the replay before a record Kingston crowd of 6,227.

The next round saw Luton travel to previously uncharted territory – Stockport County of the Third Division North – but goals from Fred Kean, who played for Bolton in the 1929 FA Cup final, Andy Rennie and Tom Tait saw the Town through 3-2.

The reward for this win was another away draw in the North – this time to Barnsley – where after several scares a no-score draw was the outcome with the Town easily winning the replay 2-0 courtesy of further goals from Rennie.

If all the proceeding games had been fairly humdrum the town of Luton came to life when it was announced that Tottenham were to be the visitors to Kenilworth Road in the 4th Round. Although Tottenham were then only a Second Division side they were on their way to promotion and also boasted a fine F.A. Cup pedigree.

Several thousand fans made the short trip from North London with some staging an impromptu game on the Moor at 7.30am and with cup fever at its height 17,213 filled the ground to see if the Town could reach the 5th Round for the first time.

IT HAPPENED 35 YEARS AGO THIS WEEK ...

16th April 1955

In an important promotion struggle at Ewood Park, Blackburn, the Town came away with a point in a 0-0 draw. The game was watched by a crowd of 35,912.

IT HAPPENED 25 YEARS AGO THIS WEEK ...

16th April 1965

The Town were soundly beaten at home by Walsall to the tune of 3-1 with Ted Phillips scoring the Luton goal. Amazingly Luton won the return at Fellows Park three days later!

Straw boaters were thrown into the air in the eighth minute when Tom Alderson converted a long centre from Arthur Mills to put the Town one up. Hardly had the cheering died down when Mills again, deputising for the suspended Rennie, set up Tait for the Town's second goal.

Mistakes were ripe on a bone-hard pitch but Tottenham, despite a second half comeback, could not break down the Luton defence and when the final whistle blew the delighted Town supporters invaded the pitch.

Enthusiasm waned slightly when it was learnt that Halifax away was the next hurdle but by the time of the match 2,000 Luton supporters travelled to the Shay swelling the crowd to a record 29,235.

Tait gave the Town the lead after 19 minutes but as a blizzard developed the match was suspended for half-an-hour after which Alan Nelson matched a second to pave the way to an easy victory.

League Champions Everton at Goodison Park was the reward for beating Halifax but despite the apparent hopelessness of the task Cup fever had reached such a peak that even the "Luton News" was convinced that the Town could go all the way.

Unfortunately with Alderson missing through injury and Rennie reduced to a limping passenger after 20 minutes First Division class told and the Town were on the receiving end of a 6-0 mauling.

The only consolation on what was then the biggest day in the Club's history was a shareout of the 55,431 gate and the satisfaction that Dixie Dean had been restricted to only one goal.

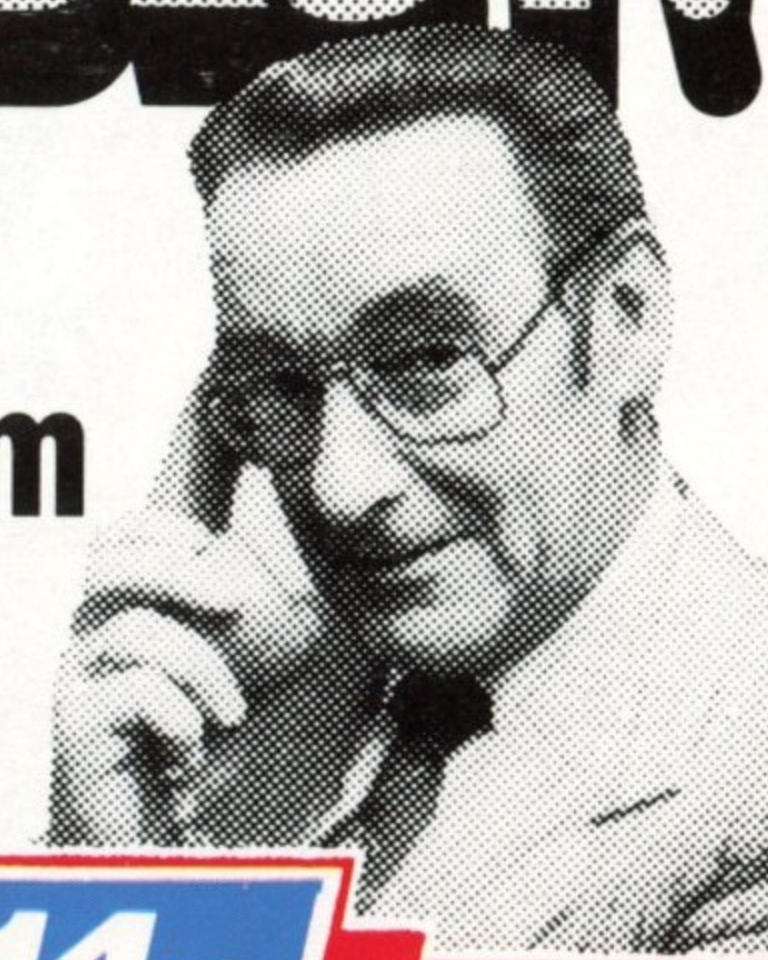

EVERTON

● This afternoon, we welcome Everton to Kenilworth Road. Many spectators here today will have seen the Toffees on television last week when they enjoyed a 4-0 victory over Nottingham Forest in a match broadcast live from Goodison Park.

● Everton's team in action that night was: Southall, Snodin (Nevin 17), Pointon (Sheedy 67), McDonald, Ratcliffe, Whiteside, Atteveld, McCall, Sharp, Cottee, Beagrie. Tony Cottee, who was transfer listed earlier this season after losing his first team place to our former striker Mike Newell, and Norman Whiteside shared the goals with two apiece in front of 17,795 fans.

● Victory that might lifted Everton up to fourth place in the First Division table and within striking distance of a place in Europe next season should the ban on English clubs be lifted this year following the World Cup finals.

● If they do succeed in playing in European competition next season, it would be a well-deserved reward as they were the first English champions to be prevented from enjoying Continental excursions after the Heysel tragedy.

● Everton were formed in 1878 when the St Domingo Church Sunday School created a club which played at Stanley Park. Enthusiasm was so great that in November 1879 they decided to expand their membership and changed their name to Everton playing in black shirts with a white

sash. They were nicknamed the 'Black Watch.' Royal blue was not adopted until 1901.

● Since the early days, the club has had comparatively few managers. The men in charge have been: W.E. Barclay (1888-89), Dick Molyneux (1889-1901), William Cuff (1901-18), W.J. Sawyer (1918-19), Thomas H. McIntosh (1919-35), Theo Kelly (1936-48), Cliff Britton (1948-56), Ian Buchan (1956-58), Johnny Carey (1958-61), Harry Catterick (1961-73), Billy Bingham (1973-77), Gordon Lee (1977-81), Howard Kendall (1981-87), Colin Harvey (1987-)

● Everton have won the championship nine times, most recently in 1987, and also finished as runners-up in the league seven times. They have won the F.A. Cup four times and won the European Cup Winners' Cup in 1985.

● They have been at their present home stadium of Goodison Park since 1892 and it has become one of the great venues in English football. On September 18, 1948, 78,299 packed in there to see an F.A. Cup semi-final replay between Liverpool and Manchester United. The modern capacity is 50,059 with 25,000 seated.

● Everton's greatest goalscorer is William Ralph 'Dixie' Dean who scored 60 goals in the 1927-28 season in the First Division and struck a career total of 349 for the Blues between 1925 and 1937. See pages 29 for full story.

● Last weekend, Everton beat QPR 1-0.
