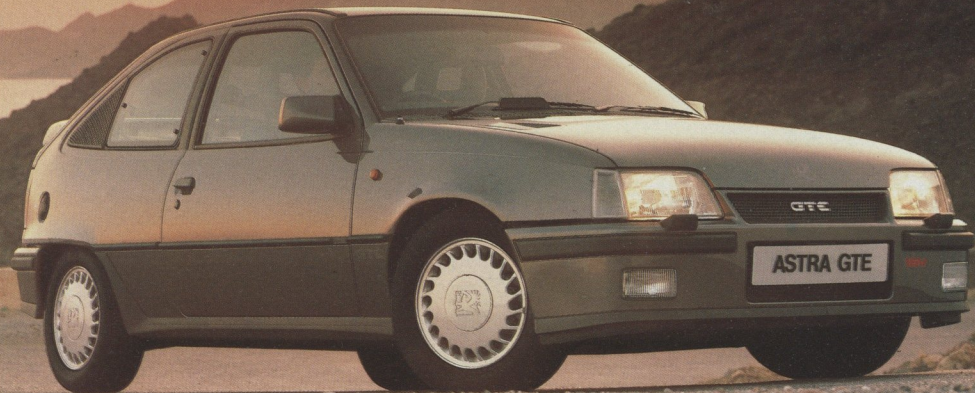

Welcome to Leeds United, back in the First Division after a long absence, and playing some good football, as I saw when I watched them play Manchester United last week. They have some good players and I think a very entertaining match is in prospect today as we continue to settle into a pattern which will bring us more consistency.

Our young players have made a bright start to the new season and I do not think we could have asked any more from the team than they gave against Manchester United on Tuesday. Of course, we were disappointed not to win. It is high time Luton Town beat my old club and I admit I am a bad loser - especially against them. But there were some promising things in our play and, after four games, I can see some evidence that the sort of pattern and system I want is beginning to emerge. If we can get into a settled pattern of play, then I am sure we will find more consistency and with it more consistent results. We want to win points regularly - not in fits and starts - and that is the main ambition at the moment.

As many of our supporters will know, we have had Israeli international Shalom Tikva with us on trial recently. I expect to take a close look at him myself on Tuesday when the reserves play at Chelsea. He is a very talented attacking midfield player, but I have to be certain he will fit into our pattern. We have also had two other almost 'new' faces with us again in training this last week - Graham Rodger and Sean Farrell. Both have recovered from long-term injuries and it is good to have them back. They are now working for match fitness. Mick O'Brien is now the only long-term man left on the injured list and we wish him well as he continues his recovery. He only has to look at the examples of Rodger and Farrell for encouragement. Sean's last full game was on the opening day of last season.

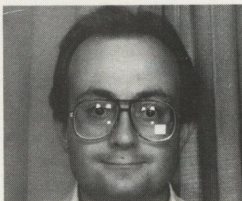
A long-serving supporter

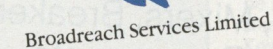
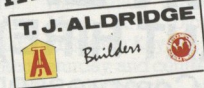

Luton Town's latest F.A. Centre of Excellence for young players will open in Stevenage at the John Henry Newman Leisure Centre next Thursday, September 13, 1990, at 6pm. That is when the first session at the centre, ideally located close to the A1 (M), is due to open.

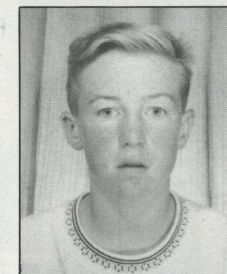
Both will be joining into a well-established scheme which gives boys an opportunity to come to train at Kenilworth Road once they are 14 years old.

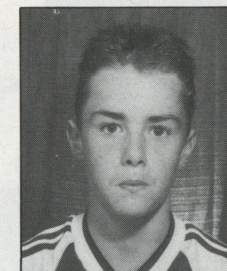

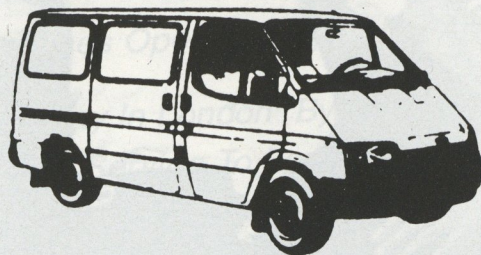

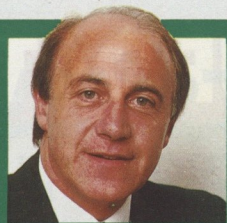

LEEDS RETURN AFTER

PACKING THE SKIP

This afternoon we welcome Leeds United back to Kenilworth Road 15 years after they last played here in a First Division fixture. That was in March 1975 and, if my recollections are accurate, it was a thrilling match in which we triumphed 2-1 with early goals from John Aston and Peter Anderson, two of current team manager Jim Ryan's team-mates.

Leeds' returned to the top flight, of course, by winning the Second Division championship last season, a feat for which we congratulate them. It ended their eight-year absence from the First Division which has coincided with our own promotion and consolidation since 1982.

Leeds are a club which has had a very high profile in recent years caused partly by a small element of the club's followers who have done nothing to enhance their name. I know Leeds are making every human effort possible, as a club, to solve this particular problem and overcome the trouble caused by a minority of fans whose behaviour can damage a great club.

Today, we expect a lot of attention to be focussed on this afternoon's fixture and I certainly hope the

media find themselves concentrating on events on the field and not off it during what should be a very entertaining match.

As all our members will know, a decision was taken to revise the guesting rules for this match and to operate a restriction on them. This was done with everyone's safety in mind as we continue to closely monitor our membership scheme with a view to making a full review of it in the future.

I am sure Jim Ryan and the team will be doing their best to provide plenty of excitement and we hope to continue the form which brought victory at Southampton last Saturday. It was a performance which earned the 'Barclays Performance of the Week' award for Luton Town.

Credit for that is fully due to Jim, his coaches and the team for achieving a great result. It was the second time, in fact, in three away matches that we have won this award as the dramatic victory at Derby on the last day of last season also earned the team the Barclays' then.

Each award earns a full set of playing kit to be presented to a local Boys' Club, a cheque for £300 and an

engraved silver salver. Both the kits will be presented on September 22 when we entertain Coventry City and the two fortunate Boys' Clubs will be the Limbury Boys Club, for the Derby win, and the Bedford Boys Club, for the Southampton win.

The award-winning performances are selected, incidentally, by a panel of our leading managers including the England manager. This means we have earned a nomination from both Bobby Robson and Graham Taylor already this year.

Further recognition of the club's playing prowess has come at international level this week with Iain Dowie and Kingsley Black both earning selection for Northern Ireland's full squad to meet Yugoslavia next week and Julian James gaining a call to the England under-21 squad for their match against Hungary.

This sort of international notice of the players has only added to the buzz which was created by last Saturday's fine results when we were victorious at all three levels of the club with the first team and the reserves performing a double over

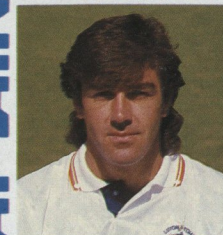
the Saints and the youth team beating Maidstone 5-0.

With such long-term injured men as Graham Rodger and Sean Farrell also back this week in full training, together with Richard Cooke, there has been a positive feel around Kenilworth Road which I am sure will rub off on Mick O'Brien as he begins his own comeback trail.

Mick, who has had a very difficult time since breaking his leg last season, will soon have the plate removed and the bone has healed well. He will not be back in full training, however, for another four weeks or more and it is at times like this that the support of the rest of the lads is so important to him as they maintain his motivation.

Finally, a brief word on the new rules as we have seen them – or not seen them – this season. I do not know if many fans would agree with me, but until Tuesday night I had not seen the revised offside rule or the new professional foul law enforced very strongly by the referees so far. The new laws were introduced to improve the attacking quality of the game, as Alex Ferguson said. Let's hope he is proved right.

**"The first result I'll look for"
says Syd Owen**

Former Town captain and England centre-half Syd Owen now lives in Leeds, the city in which he enjoyed a long and successful coaching career with today's visitors Leeds United. We asked Syd for his thoughts on Leeds' return to the top and how he felt about today's clash at Kenilworth Road.

"I spent most of my career with Luton Town except for one year with Birmingham City, so I shall always have special feelings for the club," said Syd. "It will be just the same this season and the Luton-Leeds match will be the first result I look for on Saturday night."

"I left Birmingham for Luton after only one year, after joining them straight from the Air Force in 1945, because the manager at the time, Harry Storer, did not think I was physically strong enough to succeed in football. I was transfer listed for £1,500."

"I preferred to play my football with my brain than throw my weight about and he was a big man, a cricketer with Derbyshire, and he thought differently. So, I went to Luton. And I thoroughly enjoyed all my years at Kenilworth Road."

"My connections with Leeds were all through coaching their youth teams and there is a strong similarity you know between the situation now and the one in the early 1960's, when I was at Elland Road, and the team reached the First Division."

"Then it was Liverpool at the top and Leeds behind them, just as it is now (after three matches). Nowadays, I rarely go to professional games unless I am asked to by old colleagues or men I once coached. Terry Cooper, for example, often asks me to take a look at a player for him and make a report."

"So I have a lot of friends and feelings with both clubs from the past and it will be something when the teams meet again. Luton have done extremely well to stabilise and stay in the First Division for so long. Leeds, as I know from living here, have stimulated great excitement in the city this season and everyone is really looking forward to the season at Elland Road. I hope it is a great match."

COVENTRY CITY



Winners of the FA Cup only three years ago and still among the top clubs in the First Division, the Sky Blues from the Midlands will be Kenilworth Road's next top flight visitors in two weeks time. Always an entertaining team with plenty of attacking players, Coventry made an unbeaten start to the new campaign in their opening three games and they will be hoping to do better than last year when they finished 12th in the First Division and reached the semi-finals of the Littlewoods Cup.

At one stage last season, the Sky Blues held high hopes of finishing in the top six and producing their best league position in 23 successive years in the First Division but they managed only five points from their last nine matches and slipped down the table.

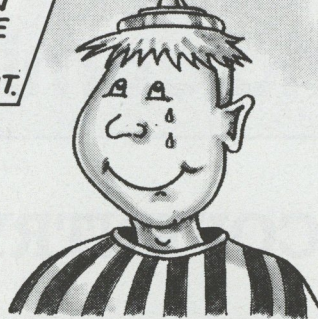

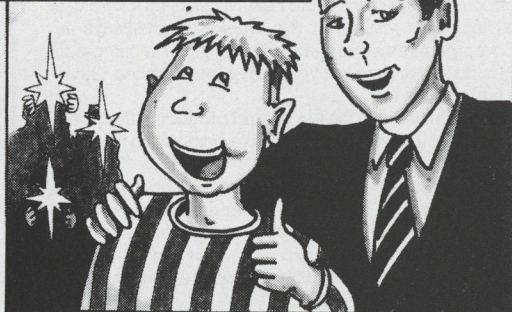

HELPING THE GAME

The Football Trust 1990 has been created to help the game at all levels and to assist clubs meet the requirements of Lord Justice Taylor's Final Report.

Safety and comfort for all spectators is the primary objective and substantial funds have been made available for the provision of seating at Football League grounds. At the same time the Trust's commitment to family and community initiatives will continue with the provision of more family enclosures, better toilet facilities, covered accommodation, artificial pitches for local use and the development of women's and junior football particularly through community programmes, plus a wide range of policing and crowd control measures.

Each year The Trust expects to receive £20 million from the reduction in Pool Betting Duty plus the £10 million continuing contribution from the Spotting-the-Ball competition organised by Littlewoods, Vernons and Zettlers. This money will be invested in projects which benefit football throughout the United Kingdom.

Good afternoon and a warm welcome to Kenilworth Road to Leeds United who visit us today for the first time in the league for more than 15 years. Leeds were promoted to Division One this year as Second Division champions and we congratulate them on this feat.

● Manager Howard Wilkinson will be trying this season to end once and for all the constant comparisons he and his predecessors have faced with the great Leeds team which dominated English football in the early 1970s. The Leeds team of that era contained the likes of, Terry Cooper, Billy Bremner, Jack Charlton, Allan Clarke and Johnny Giles and they were constantly challenging for cups and championships. Their success during that period under the late Don Revie has made it very difficult for every subsequent incumbent of the boss's office at Elland Road.

● Wilkinson, however, formerly with Sheffield Wednesday, knew all about that when he took the job on and he has proved that he means serious business this season with several big money signings for Leeds return to the big time.

● Leeds United were formed in 1919 after the disbandment of Leeds City following allegations of illegal payments to players. They joined the Midland

League playing their first game in November of that year. It was in the same month that talks for an amalgamation with Huddersfield Town fell through and the club has flourished since.

● Leeds' greatest achievements have been winning the League Championship in 1969 and 1974, winning the FA Cup in 1972 and the European Fairs Cup twice in 1968 and 1971. Leeds' biggest achievements in recent years have been in reaching the FA Cup semi-final in 1987 and, of course, gaining promotion last season.

● Howard Wilkinson is the 14th post-war manager at Elland Road in a list which includes such names as Revie, Brian Clough, Jock Stein, Clarke, Jimmy Armfield, Eddie Gray and Bremner. Wilkinson has assembled a team capable of producing a very promising season and his new signings have joined a squad bristling with experience and determination.

● Last weekend, Leeds maintained their unbeaten start to the season and moved into second place in the First Division with a convincing 3-0 home victory over Norwich City. Chapman scored twice and Varadi once in front of a 25,684 crowd at Elland Road. This result followed a 3-2 victory over Everton at Goodison Park and a 0-0 draw at home to Manchester United.

LOOKING BACK WITH JOHN FAULKNER

Although playing as a youth for Charlton Athletic John Faulkner decided to forsake the professional game and instead qualify as a Quantity Surveyor whilst turning out for non-league Sutton United, writes Roger Wash.

During his time there Sutton were drawn at home in the F.A. Cup to the mighty Leeds United and despite losing 6-0 John Faulkner stared and was approached by Leeds to see if he would like to join the professional ranks.

"I decided to take the gamble as Leeds were amongst the top sides in the country at that time and it was not long before it made my first team debut at home to Burnley in a game where one of the goals scored by Eddie Gray is still repeated on television.

"In my next game, against Manchester City, disaster struck as I broke my knee cap with only ten minutes remaining and did not play again for a year. When I was fully fit again I could only manage two UEFA appearances for Leeds in my last six months there".

When Harry Haslam came in for John in March 1972 he jumped at the chance of regular first team football and enjoyed six seasons with the Town which included promotion to Division One in 1973/

Continuing our 'football diary' to keep you up to date with the domestic and global game:

July 9: British Prime Minister Mrs Margaret Thatcher backs a recommendation that English clubs should return to European Competition. In Italy, Luigi Agnolin, one of the world's greatest referees, announces his retirement at 47. In Frankfurt, the city is brought to a halt by the return of West Germany's conquering World Cup heroes.

July 10: UEFA announce they are ending their five-year ban on English clubs competing in Europe. Manchester United are entered for the Cup Winners' Cup and Aston Villa for the UEFA Cup. Liverpool have to serve a further ban.

July 12: Tony Coton joins the £1 million goalkeeper club when he joins Manchester City from Watford. Celtic sign John Collins from Hibs and Rangers sign Cleg Kuznetsov, the Soviet Union star.

July 13: Arsenal move to sign Swedish international forward Anders Limpar for £1 million from Italian First Division club Cremonese. Danish international striker Fleming Povlsen leaves Bobby Robson's PSV Eindhoven and signs a three-year deal with Borussia Moenchengladbach.

July 16: Aston Villa move for Dr Jozef Venglos as their new manager in succession to Graham Taylor. Venglos was in charge of the Czechoslovakia team which reached the quarter-finals of the World Cup.

FOCUS ON LEEDS UNITED

John Lukic (goalkeeper): This is John's second spell at Elland Road after completing a £1 million transfer from Arsenal last May. He spent five seasons at Leeds before signing for Arsenal in 1983.

Mel Sterland (right-back): Sheffield-born Mel made his league debut for Sheffield Wednesday in 1979 and made more than 250 league appearances for the Owls. He signed for Glasgow Rangers in 1988 before joining Leeds for £600,000 in 1989.

Glynn Snodin (defender): Glynn made his league debut for Doncaster Rovers where he spent nine seasons before joining Sheffield Wednesday in 1985. After only two seasons at Hillsborough, he joined Leeds.

David Batty (midfield): Known for his relentless workrate, David, 22, joined United from YTS and made his debut for United in a 4-2 win v Swindon at Elland Road in 1987.

Chris Fairclough (defender): Chris learned his trade as an apprentice under Brian Clough at Nottingham Forest and graduated to the first team in 1982. He made more than 100 league appearances for Forest before signing for Tottenham in 1987. After spending two seasons at White Hart Lane, Chris signed for Leeds for £500,000 in March 1989.

Chris Whyte (defender): A summer signing from West Bromwich Albion, Chris made his league debut for Arsenal in 1981. After a spell in the American Indoor Soccer League, Chris returned to WBA and moved to Leeds in June for £450,000.

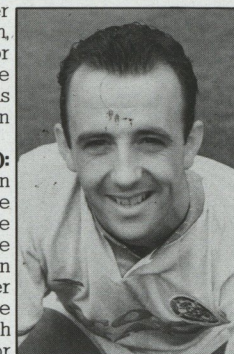
Gordon Strachan (midfield): Playmaker Gordon can look back on nearly 450 Football League appearances spanning 16 years. He spent three seasons at Dundee before winning domestic and European honours for Aberdeen. Manchester United signed him in 1984 and he established himself as a Scottish international. Gordon joined Leeds for £200,000 in 1989.

Imre Varadi (forward): Much-travelled Imre made his league debut for Sheffield United against Crystal Palace in 1978 and has since played for Everton, Newcastle Utd, where he scored 39 league goals in two seasons, Sheffield Wednesday, WBA and Manchester City. He joined Leeds this year.

Lee Chapman (forward): Prolific scorer Lee made his league debut while on loan at Plymouth Argyle in 1978. After spells with Stoke, Arsenal and Sunderland, he spent four seasons at Sheffield Wednesday scoring over 60 league goals before moving to Nottingham Forest. He moved to Leeds in January this year.

Gary McAllister (midfield): Scottish World Cup star Gary joined his local club Motherwell in 1981 and after three seasons he signed for Leicestershire City. After some impressive performances in the last couple of seasons, he joined Leeds this summer, having rejected a move to Nottingham Forest earlier. (Pictured)

Gary Speed (forward): Youth product Gary made his debut in May 1989. He was a frequent substitute last season. Wales under-21 cap. Chris Kamara (midfield): Middlesbrough-born Chris made his league debut in 1976 for Portsmouth against the Town. He spent much of his career with Swindon, Portsmouth and Brentford. Joined Leeds last January.
