

We have been paying real attention this week to that old adage about taking strength from adversity following last weekend's heavy defeat at QPR. It was a strange match and from our point of view it was not all bad. There were some good points in our play and we always looked like scoring goals. But of course we have to learn from it and that means retaining our good points and eliminating the bad ones.

The most important thing is to learn. Look at Crystal Palace. A year or so ago, they were beaten 9-0 at Liverpool. They learned from it and they have grown in strength ever since. We must learn and improve as a team. The players are professionals and it is one of the necessary qualities of professional sport to bounce straight back. For all of us it is the same. Our pride has been hurt and we must recover quickly.

Two weeks ago, we beat Leeds United. They are a good strong team and they had us under some pressure, but we showed we could defend a lead and that too is a lesson learned. I have said often enough that the First Division is a hard school and our young players are learning quickly in it. As most of our fans will know, we did not sign Shalom Tikva after his trial period. I could not see him fitting into our system and making an impact.

We have all been thinking of Mick O'Brien this week. Last week, the pin was taken off his leg and it was discovered that it was still cracked. He has gone back to Ireland to recuperate. It is a tough blow for a youngster who has already been out a year and we all send him our sympathy. More encouragingly, it was good to see Darron McDonough back for 20 minutes or so at QPR. Enjoy the match today.

The supporters club football team played a team from Leeds United last home game. We lost, but Phil, our football manager, said it had been an enjoyable game.


With the help of Les Shannon and Kim Dipper we are in the process of getting together a Ladies Football Team. If you are interested please drop me a line, c/o L.T.C.



SAFETY EXERCISE

Good afternoon and welcome to Coventry City. Among our guests today are 27 members of the Bedford Boys Club and the Limbury Boys Club together with their leaders. In addition to watching what we hope will be another entertaining Barclays League match, the lads are here to receive Barclays Performance of the Week Awards - new sets of kit and cheques for £300.

Our excellent 2-1 victory at Southampton three weeks ago was voted by Graham Taylor and his panel as the outstanding league result of that particular week. It was the second time the award has come our way because at the end of last season the 3-2 win at Derby was similarly endorsed by Bobby Robson and his panel.

On the recommendation of the National Association of Boys Clubs, we are delighted to pass them on to the Bedford and Limbury Clubs. Half of the cash element of today's awards must be spent on projects beneficial to the local community. All the projects are assessed at the end of the season and the outstanding three then win further awards from Barclays totalling £1,500.

The presentations will be made

before today's kick-off by Mr. J. Pearce, director of the Barclays Bank branch in George Street. I know Terry is delighted for Barclays to be associated with these awards and I am, of course, equally pleased that our own team has played such a part in winning them.

Evacuation

Today everyone in the ground will have been given a leaflet which contains an urgent message about an evacuation exercise we plan for the end of this afternoon's match. The important thing for us, our stewards, police and emergency services is that this test will lead to improved safety for everyone.

It is in all our interests for the future safety of all supporters at Luton Town and for that reason I hope everyone will co-operate by remaining in their places for just a few minutes at the end of the match.

We need to create an atmosphere akin to a real game situation and have fire and emergency appliances arriving at the ground to help in this exercise. It will not be a full evacuation, but a test of certain parts of our procedure which will highlight certain things we want to look at and learn from.

Please remember it is in your own

interest, even if you do end up using an exit that is not the one you would usually use.

Early next month, during the period when we are without any first team matches, we will be hosting The Hockey Association's Four Nations International Tournament, sponsored by The Daily Telegraph.

The event, The Daily Telegraph Classic, brings together Olympic gold medallists Great Britain, South Korea, France and Belgium as the long-range build-up to the 1992 Olympics begins.

The tournament takes place over the weekend of October 6-7 with Great Britain playing Belgium on Friday, South Korea and Saturday and France on Sunday. France open the competition on Friday when they play South Korea at 12.20pm.

Our senior players will be without a fixture that weekend, of course, but will be back in action the following Friday when they fly to Northern Ireland to meet Crewe United, a leading amateur club, in a charity match at the ground near Lisburn in County Antrim.

The match, on October 12, is being sponsored by Britannia Airways which operates a scheduled service between Luton and Belfast. Crewe United is a cross-community club with players from all religions and all walks of life and it has raised thousands of pounds for Northern Ireland charities in the last 20 years.

We have strong links with both Northern Ireland and the Republic with many youngsters coming over to join our training scheme and we were delighted to cement our relationship with them and accept Crewe's invitation. Crewe are expecting their 3,000-capacity stadium outside Lisburn to be filled to capacity for the game and proceeds will go to support Park View Special School in Lisburn.

In all respects, it is the sort of worthy cause the club is pleased to support and the trip to Belfast will also give the first team squad valuable match practice at a time when it is most needed.



Guest Spot with Bobby Robson

"I know what is expected of me – the championship this season and the European Cup next," says the former England boss, now with PSV Eindhoven.

Bobby Robson, the man who guided England to the World Cup semi-finals in Italy in July, is back in club football – with Dutch giants PSV Eindhoven. And his task is to lead them back to the top of their domestic league and then win the European Cup.

"I love it here," he said. "And I want that success as much as they do. Look at my career and what's missing. The European Cup. I've been involved in everything else with Ipswich and England so the thought of going for the big one excites me. And I know I can only do that if I lead PSV to the Dutch title this season.

"I couldn't ask for better working conditions and the club know they have taken on someone itching to do well. The return to club football after eight years in the international scene is just what I needed. I love the day-to-day involvement with the players as much as I missed it with England. And I have inherited some of the finest players in Europe at PSV.

"I admit that if I felt the need to strengthen the squad I would look to England. But why should that surprise anyone? I know the transfer market over there. I know what people are worth and I would know if I was getting good value."

Looking back on the World Cup finals, he said: "We were up there alongside West Germany and Italy as the best teams in the tournament. We were just a penalty kick away from the final and we'd have fancied our chances going through to meet Argentina. But we came back with our heads held high and there were plenty of good points about our participation in the competition.

"Paul Gascoigne, for example, was a revelation. I'm a Gascoigne fan, but I hope the lad realises that he is going to have to repeat his World Cup form and build on it. He'll have to be reminded that world-class players don't just do it in six games. The greats do it over several years and keep producing."

And coming here next...

BRADFORD CITY



Our first senior cup-tie this season brings Third Division Bradford City to play under the floodlights at Kenilworth Road in a Rumbelows Football League Cup second round first leg tie next Tuesday. Now managed by former Brentford, Cambridge and Millwall boss John Docherty, who took over from the dismissed Terry Yorath last season, City are hunting a quick return to the Second Division after relegation last term.

Indeed, last season was a vastly disappointing one altogether for Bradford. It began with very high hopes and a spending spree – our own former player Mark Aizlewood was among Yorath's signings – but ended sadly with the sale of top scorer Jimmy Quinn to West Ham and a boardroom struggle which saw local man David Simpson take over from Jack Tordoff as chairman.

The removal of Yorath followed the upheaval and Docherty's installation came too late to save the club from its slide down to the Third. However, there was some optimism raised towards the end by the form shown by several youngsters in the side and the revival of the youth policy under Docherty has raised hopes once again that this sleeping giant of a club can be roused from its slumbers.

The fixture will, of course, revive old and happy Town memories of the 1987-86 Littlewoods Cup campaign when the clubs met in the quarter-finals. Of the players on duty that night in January, when the Town won 2-0 with goals from Steve Foster and Mick Harford, City's goalkeeper Paul Tomlinson is one of the best-known along with defenders Brian Mitchell and Lee Sinnott, the former Watford player.

Each year The Trust expects to receive £20 million from the reduction in Pool Betting Duty plus the £10 million continuing contribution from the Spotting-the-Ball competition organised by Littlewoods, Vernons and Zetters. - This afternoon we welcome Coventry City to Kenilworth Road. The Sky Blues are still regarded as one of the top clubs in the First Division, having remained in the top flight since 1967 – a long and praise worthy run of 23 years.

- Charismatic manager John Sillett has this season kept faith in the squad which served him so well for much of last season. Coventry achieved a semi-final meeting with Nottingham Forest in the Littlewoods Cup and were on course for their highest-ever placing in Division One until their form slipped. They managed only five points from their remaining nine matches in the closing weeks.

- Coventry made a bright start to the new season, remaining unbeaten until Saturday, September 8, when they lost 2-1 at Aston Villa. Brian Borrow was the scorer of City's goal. Last weekend, they drew 0-0 at home to Wimbledon.

- Coventry City were formed in 1883 but were known as Singers FC. Fifteen years later they changed their name to Coventry City FC and moved from Binley Road to their present ground at Highfield Road.

- The greatest achievement in the club's history was their FA Cup final success in 1987. Goals from Keith Houchen, Dave Bennett and an own goal from Gary Mabbutt ensured a 3-2 victory over Spurs in extra-time.

The club's only other honours to date have been in becoming Division Two champions in 1967 and Division Three champions in 1964.

- Since the War, Coventry have appointed 18 managers including such names as Jimmy Hill, Noel Cantwell, Dave Sexton, Bobby Gould and Don MacKay. Present manager Mr. Sillett started his managerial career at Hereford before being appointed as Coventry's youth coach in 1979-80.

- When George Curtis became general manager in 1986, Mr. Sillett was appointed as first-team coach. The FA Cup success a year later, resulted in his promotion to manager.

- Coventry hold the distinction of being the only club in the Football League to have played in six divisions. (Division One, Two, Three, Four, Division Three North and Division Three South).

- Coventry's team for last week's clash with Wimbledon was: Ogrizovic, Borrow, Edwards, Perdomo, Kildine, Peake, Gallacher, Gynn, Speedie, Drinkel, Smith.

- Uruguayan World Cup star Jose Perdomo is currently on loan to Coventry from Italian club Genoa.

- Last season March 7, 1990 Luton Town 3 (Dowie, Black, Gray) Coventry City 2 (Drinkel, Regis) 8,244. Lets hope for a repeat of that entertainment today.

OFF THE RECORD

LOOKING BACK WITH KIRK STEPHENS

Kirk Stephens spent four years on the books of his local side Coventry City as a schoolboy but when apprentice contracts were being handed out he was told that he was not good enough, writes Roger Wash.

"From that moment I was determined to prove Coventry wrong and perhaps be transferred to them for a fee one day".

"I had a trial with Bristol City and was offered terms by both Northampton and Peterborough but decided to go non-league with David Pleat at Nuneaton."

When David Pleat moved to Luton and was eventually appointed manager one of the first players he signed was Kirk Stephens. He made his debut in the first game of the 1978/79 season when the Town fielded six new signings against Oldham at Kenilworth Road - were 1-0 down at half-time but went on to win 6-1.

"Obviously the best side I played in during my time at Kenilworth Road was the 1981/82 promotion team but it must be remembered that the nucleus of that side had been built up over the previous two or three years and in fact remained during the whole of my stay at Luton. Players like David Moss, Ricky Hill, Brian Stein and Mal Donaghy would have made any team a good one".

"If I have to name a most memorable game then the one that springs to mind is the relegation decider at Maine Road in 1983. I do not know what it was like to a spectator but the last five minutes after Raddy Antic scored the only goal seemed like five hours".

TWENTY YEARS AGO (26/9/70) Despite the scoreline of 0-0 the Town and Swindon put on an entertaining show for a crowd of 18,698 at the Coventry Ground. Jim Ryan had the ball in the net in the last minute but the effort was disallowed - some say for offside and some for an unfair call.

Kirk Stephens finally realised his ambition to prove Coventry City wrong when a player-exchange involving Ashley Grimes and a cash adjustment was made in 1984 "I did not really want to leave Luton but the chance to join my home town club was too good to miss.

"Unfortunately, a bad injury forced me to pack up playing at 32 when I felt I could have carried on for a further two years at the top".

After a gap of eighteen months Barnet's Barry Fry enticed another season out of him as the North London club narrowly failed to gain promotion to the Football League pipped at the last by Lincoln City.

Kirk still finds time to be involved in football coaching the juniors at Leicester City for David Pleat. He also hopes to be here this afternoon in his capacity as a commentator for Local Radio in Coventry.

As a parting shot we are warned that another Stephens is on the production line - 13 year old Quinton is on the books of Leicester where he is being encouraged to be a forward as "there is no glory in being a defender".

With fond memories of "basher" Stephens all action style of play we are not quite so sure!





FOR THE RECORD

Continuing our 'football diary' to keep you up to date with the domestic and global game:

July 20: Talks with National Power involving a £4 million sponsorship deal for the League Cup are frozen. Steve Sutton turns down a new contract with Nottingham Forest.

July 24: Mo Johnston's career at Glasgow Rangers is in doubt after being sent home in disgrace from a pre-season tour in Italy. He is alleged to have been involved in a late-night brawl. Blackburn sign Watford's Lee Richardson for £250,000. England's U-19 side are knocked out of the European Youth Championship at the semi-final stage by Russia.

July 28: Juventus claim they have signed Des Walker from Nottingham Forest for £4 million. Forest chairman Maurice Roworth orders UEFA to investigate.

July 30: John Barnes is given a £1,500 pay rise to keep him at Anfield. After their impressive performance in the World Cup, England are invited to play in a 'Mini World Cup' in Brazil next year. Other teams involved are Brazil, West Germany and Cameroon.

August 1: Spanish First Division club Real Sociedad splash out £1.5 million for Sheffield Wednesday's England under-21 striker Dalian Atkinson. The Owls then use part of that fee to fund a bid for Hatters former captain Danny Wilson who agrees to the move.

August 3: Coventry City take Uruguayan defender Jose Perdomo on trial and also agree to a trial for Hungarian Joltan Csuscanszky. A friendly between Hungary and England is switched from Budapest to Wembley because the famous Nep stadium is not available.

August 4: West Germany champions Bayern Munich are beaten 1-0 in the first round of the cup by Third Division part-timers and amateurs Weinheim.

FOCUS ON COVENTRY CITY

Steve Ogrizovic (goalkeeper): A keen cricketer, Steve started his career at Chesterfield, making his debut in 1977. He has since played for Liverpool and Shrewsbury. Coventry signed him for £72,500 in 1984. He has made more than 300 league appearances.

Brian Borrows (defender): Liverpool-born right back who started his career with Everton where he made 27 league appearances. He moved to Bolton for £25,000 in 1983 and has worn the No.2 shirt regularly since his £80,000 transfer in June 1985.

Paul Edwards (defender): Paul made his league debut playing for Crewe Alexandra in 1988. After only two seasons in the first team he signed for Coventry last year.

Lloyd McGrath (midfield): England under-21 player, Lloyd has been with Coventry since a junior and made his debut v Southampton in an 8-2 defeat in 1984. Versatile Lloyd is equally as comfortable in defence.

Brian Kilcline (defender): 6ft 2ins, captain and central defender, 'Killer' has proved to be one of Coventry's all-time transfer bargains. He was signed from Notts County for £60,000 in June 1984. Brian (pictured right) was a product of County's juniors, where he topped 150 league appearances on his way to Coventry.

Trevor Peake (defender): Played under David Pleat's management at Nuneaton Borough before establishing himself as a league player at Lincoln City. He made more than 160 league appearances for The Imps before signing for Coventry in 1983.

Kevin Gallacher (forward): Scotland 'B' international, Kevin made a name for himself playing for Dundee United as a regular for four seasons. Needing a supplier for the big centre-forwards, Mr Sillett signed Kevin last season.

Michael Gynn (midfield): 5ft 5ins Michael started his career in his home town of Peterborough. He scored 33 league goals in five seasons from midfield, and it was this form which persuaded Coventry to sign him for £60,000 in 1983.


David Speedie (forward): Coventry paid a club record £750,000 fee to sign David from Chelsea in 1987. He played his early football at Barnsley but it was with Darlington that he started to score goals. Chelsea signed him for £70,000 in 1982. David is a Scottish international.

Kevin Drinkel (forward): Norwich signed Kevin from Grimsby for £105,000 in 1986 and he was top scorer in all his three seasons at Carrow Road, scoring 50 league goals. His prolific scoring record caught the attention of Glasgow Rangers who signed him in 1989. Coventry signed Kevin earlier this year.

Cyrille Regis (forward): England international, Cyrille has been relegated to the sub's bench lately. He established himself as a powerful forward at West Brom scoring over 80 league goals. Coventry signed him for £300,000 in October 1984.

Tony Dobson (defender): Tony has been at Coventry since a junior and made his debut in 1987 v Aston Villa. Last season Tony became a regular in the side due to the injury to Brian Kilcline.

Jose Perdomo (defender/midfield): Uruguayan international, Jose is on loan at Highfield Road from Italian side Genoa. Perdomo impressed in his first game at Villa Park and is currently rated at £400,000.
