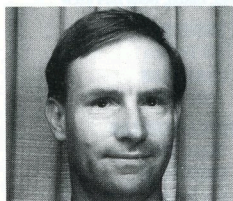

ORIGINAL LEAGUE CUP BACK ON DUTY

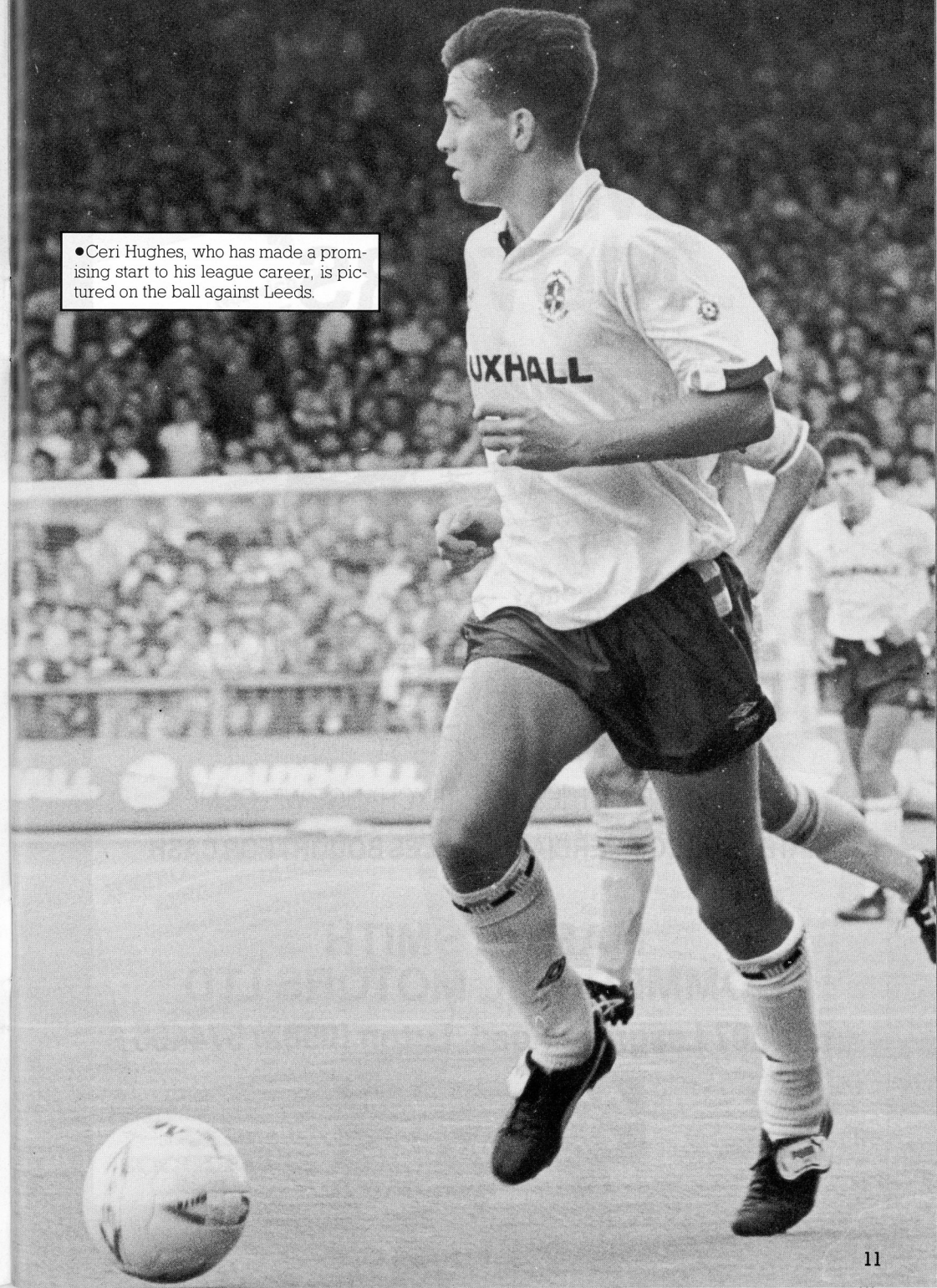

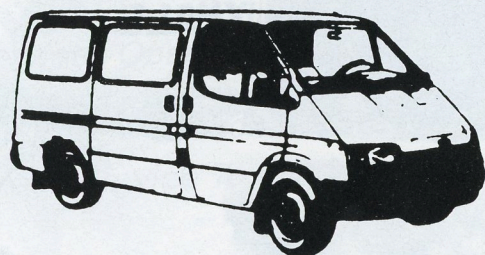

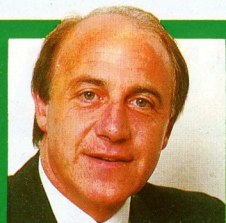

OLD FRIENDS MEET

WELCOME BACK



• Training again: Graham Rodger returned to full training last week after his long absence. Good luck to Graham and also to Sean Farrell who is back on duty too.

Good evening and a warm welcome to Bradford City, visiting Kenilworth Road for the first time since we met in the quarter-finals of this same tournament three seasons ago when it was known as the Littlewoods Cup.

Tonight, however, we are playing in the Rumbelows Cup and we welcome the representatives of Rumbelows who are here for this cup-tie. We welcome also visiting supporters, other than through our guesting policy, for the first time since we played Mansfield Town at the same stage of last season's tournament a year ago.

Original cup

Rumbelows have taken over the sponsorship of the Football League Cup from Littlewoods and they have signed a four-year £5 million deal to support the successful competition. Last year, more than 1.8 million people attended games throughout the competition – the fourth successive year in which spectator levels have risen.

Rumbelows participation in sponsoring the tournament has also brought with it a welcome return to tradition with confirmation that this season we shall be playing to win the original Football League Cup trophy, first awarded in the inaugural

season of the tournament in 1961.

I am sure tonight's visitors Bradford City, managed by our old friend John Docherty, will be just as keen to get their hands on this trophy as we are and an exciting cup-tie is obviously in prospect. John is a manager we know from his previous days with Cambridge and Millwall and he is, like me, not unknown to enjoy a little happiness with a cigar called Hamlet.

City's secretary Terry Newman is another old friend who began his administrative career in football as assistant here at Kenilworth Road to John Wilkinson. Our paths often cross at meetings up and down the country and it will be good to see him here again tonight.

Last Saturday, as everyone who attended the game against Coventry will know, we carried out an evacuation exercise. I would like to take this opportunity of thanking everyone for their co-operation in this valuable operation.

The results have not been fully analysed by the observers from the safety committee, but I will report back on them in a future issue of this match-day programme. We expected some hiccoughs and it will be interesting to see what the final

verdict is.

This is particularly so in the light of a report on safety and facilities in a recent issue of the Sunday Mirror newspaper. This featured the facilities on offer in all the First Division grounds and scarcely gave an impression of being a scientific study as it did not publish any of the criteria used in research.

It is, however, the sort of feature we must welcome as it throws the spotlight onto the facilities and safety for spectators in our football grounds and we shall be doing our best to review all our facilities.

In particular, we are looking at the catering and refreshments and the cleanliness of the toilets, though it is hard to judge from the newspaper report whether these facilities were researched before, during or after a big match at Kenilworth Road.

You can be sure, however, that we

are always striving to improve facilities for spectators here and any constructive comments on the subject are welcome.

Youth

Finally, our youth team had no luck at all in the two cup competition they played in recently, losing to Birmingham, in the Southern Junior Floodlit Cup, and to Oxford, in the South East Counties League Cup, when it was nice to meet up again with David Moss for a chat after the game.

The youngsters gained some satisfaction, however, when they beat Northern Ireland under-17's 3-1 in a friendly last week. Two goals from David Cornley, who is ironically from the Republic, and one from John Lawford sealed their victory in an enjoyable match.

This season has started equally as disappointingly for Colin Harvey's men. Only two points from their first five league games leaves them equal last in Division One.

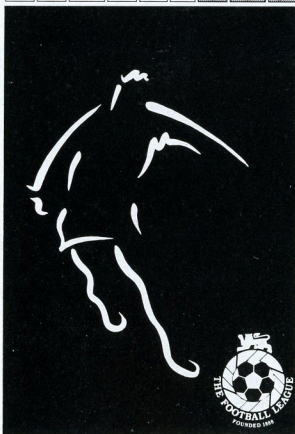

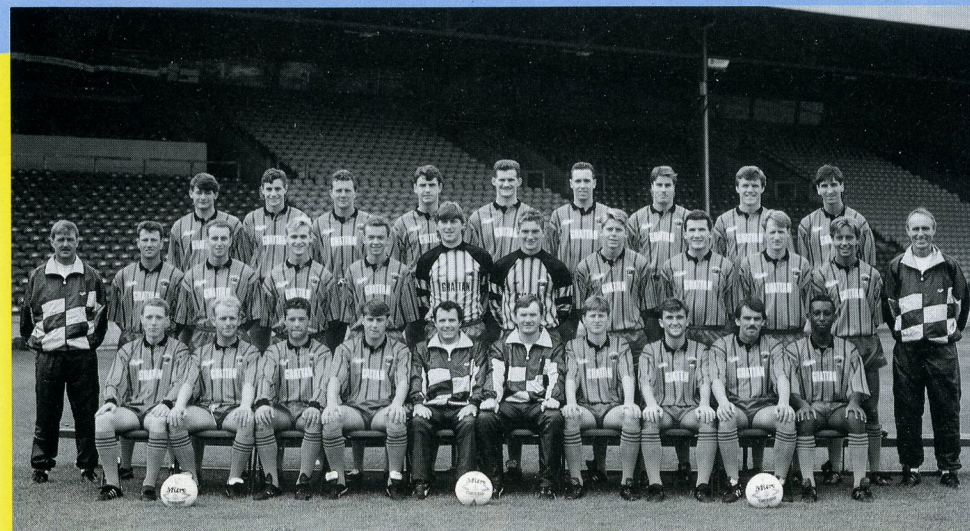

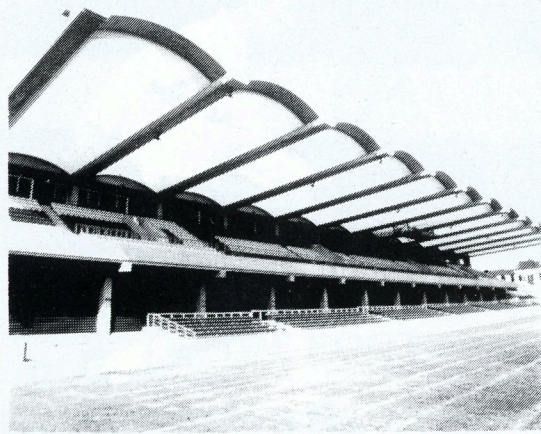


HELPING THE GAME

The Football Trust 1990 has been created to help the game at all levels and to assist clubs meet the requirements of Lord Justice Taylor's Final Report.

Safety and comfort for all spectators is the primary objective and substantial funds have been made available for the provision of seating at Football League grounds. At the same time the Trust's commitment to family and community initiatives will continue with the provision of more family enclosures, better toilet facilities, covered accommodation, artificial pitches for local use and the development of women's and junior football particularly through community programmes, plus a wide range of policing and crowd control measures.

Each year The Trust expects to receive £20 million from the reduction in Pool Betting Duty plus the £10 million continuing contribution from the Spotting-the-Ball competition organised by Littlewoods, Vernons and Zettlers. This money will be invested in projects which benefit football throughout the United Kingdom.

- Good evening and a warm welcome to Kenilworth Road to Bradford City, returning in the Rumbelows League Cup three seasons after last visiting us in the quarter-finals of the Littlewoods Cup in 1987-88. City were then in the Second Division, of course, but have slipped down to the Third since then and, after a reasonable start to the season, have been hovering just above mid-table.

- Last season was something of a tumultuous one for the Yorkshire club. It began full of hope, with Terry Yorath at the helm and dreams of promotion, but ended with a board-room upheaval, relegation to the Third Division and the replacement of Mr Yorath with current boss John Docherty.

- An almost new board took control of the club too, with local man David Simpson replacing Jack Tordoff as chairman and by the time Mr Docherty was installed it was too late to prevent the loss of Second Division status.

- Bradford City was formed in 1903. Bradford was a rugby stronghold at the turn of the century but after Manningham RFC held an archery contest to help them

out of financial difficulties, they were persuaded to give up the handling code and turned to soccer.

- City was thus formed and continued at Valley Parade, their present home. The Football League immediately accepted the new club's first application for membership of the Second Division and their league career began with a fixture away to Grimsby, on September 1, 1903, which they lost 2-0.

- Since then City have sampled life in all four divisions of the league, enjoying top flight status between 1908 and 1922 when their best season was 1910-11 when they finished fifth. They won the Second Division title in 1908 and Division Three in 1985.

- City have also a proud record in cup competitions. They won the FA Cup in 1911 to become first holders of the present trophy and have reached the Football League Cup quarter-finals twice, in 1965 and in 1988.

- Current boss John Docherty follows a long line of men to have taken on the job at Valley Parade. These have included in recent years Roy McFarland, Trevor Cherry, Terry Dolan and Mr Yorath.

OFF THE RECORD

LOOKING BACK WITH DAVE PACEY

Luton born Dave Pacey can certainly be included within the term "local boy makes good" and it is fitting that he was the Towns goalscorer in the clubs only F.A. Cup Final appearance at Wembley in 1959, writes club statistician Roger Wash.

After playing for Luton schoolboys Dave was developed by Hitchin Town where he made their Athenian League side as a wing-half but he was also on the books of the Town as an amateur.

"I then had to do Army service and in fact had a trial at Arsenal as I was stationed with a chap on Arsenals books who recommended me to Jack Crayston. Luton found out about this and Town director Tom Hodgson actually came to see me at Newton Abbott, where I was stationed, to make sure I signed professional forms for my home town team on leaving the Army".

Dave duly signed for Luton and made his League debut in a 3-0 defeat at Old Trafford on Christmas Day 1957. He held his place in the return at Kenilworth Road the following day and by the middle of February 1958 such was the Towns belief that a diamond had been unearthed, Reg Pearce the regular number 6, was allowed to go to Sunderland for a big fee.

"When I look back to those times players like Syd Owen, George Cummins, Bob Morton and Ron Baynham always stand out. We had a fair old side at that time and the atmosphere was always great at Kenilworth Road.

Obviously the highlight of my career was the F.A.

IT HAPPENED.....

FIVE YEARS AGO (24/9/85) After being 1-0 down at the interval the Town stormed back to win 2-1 in a Littlewoods Cup tie at Sheffield United. The goals were scored by Brian Stein and Emeka Nwajiobi.

TEN YEARS AGO (23/9/80) Despite a wonder free kick from Raddy Antic the Town went down 2-1 at home to First Division Manchester City in a Third round League Cup tie at Kenilworth Road.

FIFTEEN YEARS AGO (9/9/75) The Town crashed out of the League Cup at Fourth Division Darlington to cause one of the upsets of the round. John Faulkner and Jim Ryan were in the Luton side that evening.

TWENTY YEARS AGO (8/10/70) In front of the largest crowd in modern times at Kenilworth Road (27,023) the Town were narrowly beaten 1-0 by Arsenal in a Third Round tie. The Gunners goal was scored, against the run of play, by current Arsenal Manager George Graham.

Cup final appearance in 1959 but as has been written many times before the team failed to find anything like its normal form on the day although scoring the Towns only goal was a small consolation".

During the summer of 1959 Dave was picked to play for England 'B' in Germany but during the game was badly injured as he was on his next two outings for Luton which cut back his appearances as the Town dropped out of Division One in 1960.

The Luton players had all aged together and the team plummeted through the Divisions to reach the Fourth by 1965. During this time Dave Pacey, who was still, by comparison, a youngster remained a mainstay in the side which must have been a less than heartening experience.

"When Luton dropped into the Fourth Division I called it a day and had three seasons at Kettering followed by a regular game for a time with Electrolux for whom I have worked over 20 years".

Dave does not get to Luton games all that often nowadays preferring to perfect his golf swing but he will always take an interest in the happenings at Kenilworth Road with memories stretching back to the 1940's when he stood on the terraces as a schoolboy.

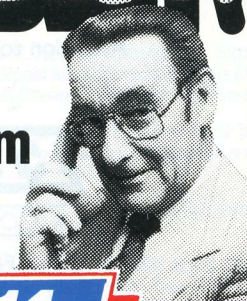

FOR THE RECORD

Continuing our 'football diary' to keep you up to date with the domestic and global game:

August 15: The Town are back from the pre-season tour of Scotland where they beat Stirling Albion 4-2 with goals from Lars Elstrup, Iain Dowie, David Preece and Kurt Nogan and lost 2-0 to Airdrie. In a warm-up friendly at Bournemouth they drew 1-1 thanks to a goal from Dowie.

August 18: In the FA Charity Shield at Wembley Liverpool and Manchester United draw 1-1. The Town were up for the opening day with a friendly at Birmingham City. In Scotland, the Scottish League beat Scotland 1-0 with a goal from Hans Gillhaus from the penalty spot.

August 25: The Football League season opens and Luton draw 1-1 with Crystal Palace, a goal from Iain Dowie levelling an earlier opener by Eric Young. Leeds, Liverpool, Spurs and Arsenal hog the headlines with three goals each.

August 29: The Town travel to Highbury for a First Division clash with the Gunners. Lars Elstrup fires Luton into an early lead, but second-half pressure pays off for the Arsenal who emerge with a 2-1 win.

September 1: Roy Wegerle scores for QPR inside the first 30 seconds against Chelsea while the Town travel to Southampton and win 2-1 with a brace of goals from Lars Elstrup. The season is now truly under way with Liverpool and Leeds heading the embryonic table.

September 4: Steve Bruce becomes the first victim of the new 'professional foul' law. He is sent off during Man United's 1-0 win against the Town here at Kenilworth Road.

DOWN MEMORY LANE

The two handsome ex Town players were of course Jake Findlay and Kirk Stephens.

FOCUS ON BRADFORD CITY

Paul Tomlinson (goalkeeper): Born Brierley Hill. Joined Bradford City in the 1987 close season from Sheffield United for £47,500. Also had a loan spell at Birmingham. Regular first-choice keeper who played here in the Littlewoods Cup quarter-final two years ago.

Greg Abbot (defender): Joined City in August 1982 after being released by Coventry City. He did not gain a regular place however until the following season. Now played more than 200 league games for the club.

Philip Babb (defender): A product of Millwall's youth policy, he joined City in the close season from the Lions, manager John Docherty's former club, on a fee transfer.

Brian Mitchell (defender): Born Stonehaven, Scotland. He cost £70,000 when Aberdeen released him in February 1987. He made more than 100 appearances for Aberdeen and has European competition experience.

Lee Sinnott (defender): Born Aldridge. Signed in the close season of 1987 from Watford for £137,000. Previously with Walsall. A first-team regular since arriving in Yorkshire.

Gavin Oliver (defender): Born Felling. Joined City from Sheffield Wednesday for £30,000 in 1985-86 after being with Wednesday from Schooldays. A first team regular for City (Pictured right).

Brian Tinnion (defender): Born Newcastle. He went to Newcastle as an apprentice and joined Bradford City in March 1989 for £150,000.

Lee Duxbury (midfield): Another City youth policy product. Born Keighley, he has played regularly in the first team since making the breakthrough last season.

Robbie James (midfield): Vastly-experienced new signing for the 1990-91 season from Swansea City. An experienced Welsh international with 47 caps, he has also played for Stoke City, Leicester and Queen's Park Rangers.

Mark Leonard (forward): Born St. Helens, Merseyside. Signed for City in 1986 for £40,000 from Stockport after scoring 23 goals for them in his last season. Previously with Crewe, Tranmere and Everton.

Mark Ellis (forward): Born Bradford, a local boy who came through the amateur ranks before turning professional. A regular now who can play on either flank.

Paul Jewell (forward): Born Liverpool. A signing in the summer of 1988 from Wigan for £80,000. Began at Liverpool.

Mark Stuart (forward): Newly-signed in 1990 from Plymouth Argyle. A former Charlton Athletic player who has First Division experience. Good crosser of the ball.

Keven Megson (forward): Bradford youth product, born Halifax, he signed as a professional after working his way through the schoolboy and youth schemes.

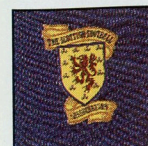
