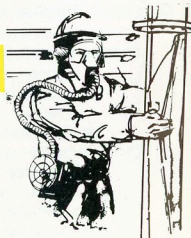

HELPING THE GAME



A fine new stand - one of the many initiatives supported by Trust funds.

The Football Trust 1990 has been created to help the game at all levels and to assist clubs meet the requirements of Lord Justice Taylor's Final Report.

Safety and comfort for all spectators is the primary objective and substantial funds have been made available for the provision of seating at Football League grounds. At the same time the Trust's commitment to family and community initiatives will continue with the provision of more family enclosures, better toilet facilities, covered accommodation, artificial pitches for local use and the development of women's and junior football particularly through community programmes, plus a wide range of policing and crowd control measures.

Each year The Trust expects to receive £20 million from the reduction in Pool Betting Duty plus the £10 million continuing contribution from the Spotting-the-Ball competition organised by Littlewoods, Vernons and Zettlers. This money will be invested in projects which benefit football throughout the United Kingdom.

There is nothing like a good cup run to boost morale at a club that has fallen on bad times in the league.

Bradford City could hardly go into tonight's Rumbelows Cup second round, second leg in a more unpromising situation having lost four of their last five league matches.

Cup form, though, often bears no relation to league results and, despite the disappointment of recent matches, City go into tonight's match with a fair degree of confidence.

The disciplined performance that earned them a 1-1 draw in the first leg at Kenilworth Road a fortnight ago will be needed again tonight if City are to progress.

The task is not beyond them, though, for they have a good record against First Division teams at Valley Parade.

Tottenham, Everton, Oxford, Newcastle and Southampton have all suffered defeat at Valley Parade in cup matches and players still at the club will be encouraged by the fact that City reached the league

cup quarter finals twice in successive seasons — 1987-8 and 1988-9.

They were defeated in the 1987-8 quarter final by Luton at Kenilworth Road which means they have a score to settle in tonight's match.

A replay looked on the cards that night in January 1988 until second half goals by Steve Foster and Danny Wilson gave Luton a 2-0 win.

City were also beaten in the quarter final the following year — 1-0 at home to Bristol City, then a Third Division club, and last season they lost over two legs in the second round against West Brom.

They thought they had done the hard work by beating West Brom 3-1 in the away leg, but were beaten 5-3 at home in a bizarre match to go out on the away goals rule after the aggregate score had finished level at 6-6.

It was the lesson that nothing can be taken for granted in a two legged cup tie.

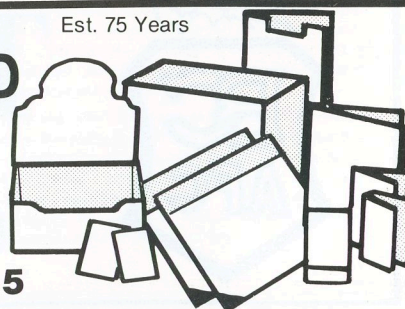

10 Years Ago — On the 27th August 1980 Bradford City entertained LIVERPOOL in the 2nd round 1st leg of the Football League Cup at Valley Parade and in front of a crowd of 16,232 (record crowd for a League Cup match at Valley Parade) won by the only goal of the match scored after 77 minutes by **Bobby Campbell** after Ray Clemence could not hold a Terry Dolan free kick from just outside the penalty area.

In the 2nd leg at Anfield on the 2nd September Liverpool showed what a force they are in front of their own spectators and won by 4 goals to nil. Liverpool going through to the 3rd round on a 4-1 aggregate. Liverpool's scorers at Anfield were Dalglish (2), Johnson, Kennedy (R) and the attendance was 21,107.

City's team for both legs was as follows:-
Smith, Podd, Wood, Robertson, Jackson, Cooper, Dolan, Staniforth, Campbell, McNiven, Chapman.
Luton Town played READING at the same stage of the competition and they progressed through to the 3rd round with a 3-1 aggregate win.

20 Years Ago — Bradford City failed this season to reach the 2nd round of the competition but Luton Town entertained WORKINGTON at Kenilworth Road and in front of 11,072 spectators they advanced to the 3rd round with a 3-0 victory, the goals being scored by Givens (2) and Macdonald.

30 Years Ago — On the 2nd November 1960 Bradford City entertained MANCHESTER UNITED in a 2nd round match in the Football League Cup (this being their first ever match in the competition, as they received a bye in the 1st round) at Valley Parade and on a cold and wet Wednesday afternoon in front of a small crowd of 4,670 they triumphed by 2 goals to 1. City's scorers being **Smith** and **Webb**, this after **Violett** had given Manchester United the lead in the first half.

City's team being:-
Downie, Flockett, Barnes, Jackson (P), Lawlor, Roberts, Webb, Jackson (D), Duncan, Reid, Smith.

At the same stage of the competition Luton Town were drawn against LIVERPOOL and after gaining a 1-1 draw at Anfield, they went out in the replay by 5-2. Brogan scored the goal in the first match and Brogan and Turner scored in the replay.

LUTON TOWN

Luton Town have never been one of soccer's 'big guns' but they managed to shoot a few from their perch over the years and are currently enjoying one of their best ever starts in Division One.

They began life 105 years ago and on moving from their original ground to Dunstable Road in 1897 they gained admittance to the Second Division of the Football League.

Unfortunately their stay was brief for they failed to win re-election in 1900 and they dropped into the Southern League and moved to Kenilworth Road soon after.

However back they came in 1920 when a Third Division was formed and having finished runners-up in the Third Division (South) in 1936, the year Joe Payne hit his record breaking 10 goals against Bristol Rovers, they won it the following year and went back into Division Two.

In a tremendous three way battle with Birmingham and Rotherham United they pipped the Millers to the runners-up spot in the 1954-55 season to move into the First Division for the first time.

Within four years they were at Wembley where they eventually lost the FA Cup Final to Nottingham Forest with a side which included Sid Owen, destined to work closely with our current chief scout Maurice Lindley in the Leeds United successes of the early 70's, and current Northern Ireland team-manager Billy Bingham. Unfortunately the 'Hatters' fortunes took a turn for the worst and relegation to Division Two came in 1960 followed by a drop to Division Three (1963) and to Division Four (1965).

In fact it was not until that 1965-66 season that City met Luton for the first time in the League.

For the record Bradford City had by far the best of the exchanges in those days despite Luton finishing Fourth Division champions in 1968 and runners-up in Division Three two years later to complete a remarkable revival.

They did spend one season in the top flight (1974-75) before dropping straight back down but since moving back up to the First Division in 1982 they have remained there.

Significantly they also have a fine record in the League Cup in recent years having won the trophy in 1988 and finished runners-up the following year.

It was David Pleat and then Ray Harford who guided Luton to those successes but alongside them since 1986 as coach was the current manager **Jim Ryan**.

The 45 year old former Manchester United winger joined the staff in 1986 but was left in charge of a struggling side when he took over as boss in January this year and they only avoided relegation with a last day victory at Derby.

In view of those problems last term Ryan has perhaps surprisingly kept faith with those players already at the

club instead of rushing into the transfer market and it looks to be paying off.

Luton ended September with a resounding 3-1 win at Norwich City, to go sixth in the First Division table, with a side made up completely of players already on the clubs books when Ryan took over.

In goal was **Alec Chamberlain** (26) who was at Colchester and Everton before joining Luton in the summer of 1988.

His first team opportunities were limited initially, but has been virtually ever present since making his debut in April 1989.

At right back **Tim Breaker** (25) already has over 200 first team appearances behind him while 21 year old **Richard Harvey** is in contention with former Oxford United man **John Dreyer** (27) for the left back spot.

Dreyer also plays in the centre of defence however and in the Norwich match he partnered **Dave Beaumont** (26), the former Dundee United man now in his third season at Kenilworth Road, while another left back, local boy **Julian James** (20), was substitute.

In mid-field was their most experienced player, **Steve Williams** (32) who has clocked up more than 400 appearances with Southampton, Arsenal and Luton — whom he joined in the summer of 1988.

Also involved in mid-field were former Walsall player **David Preece** (27), an England B

international and 19 year old Welsh under 21 international **Ceri Hughes** while **Kurt Nogan** (20), another Welsh under 21 man, was substitute.

Up front at Norwich was hat-trick hero **Lars Elstrup**, a 27 year old Danish international, the former Hendon striker **Iain Dowie** (25), who has rapidly risen to international level with Northern Ireland in less than two seasons in League football, and another Northern Ireland international **Kingsley Black** (22).

Black made such an impact when he came on to the scene in 1988 he was immediately approached by both England and Northern Ireland for his international services.

Being born in England of Irish ancestry he had a dual qualification but he opted for Northern Ireland and has since won a number of caps.

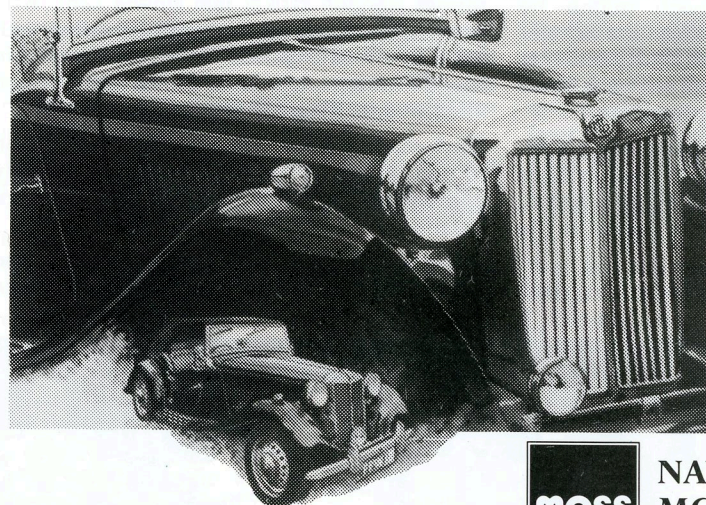

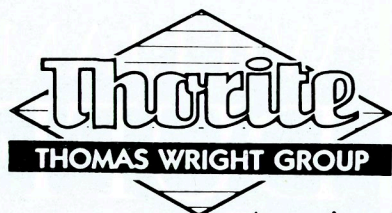

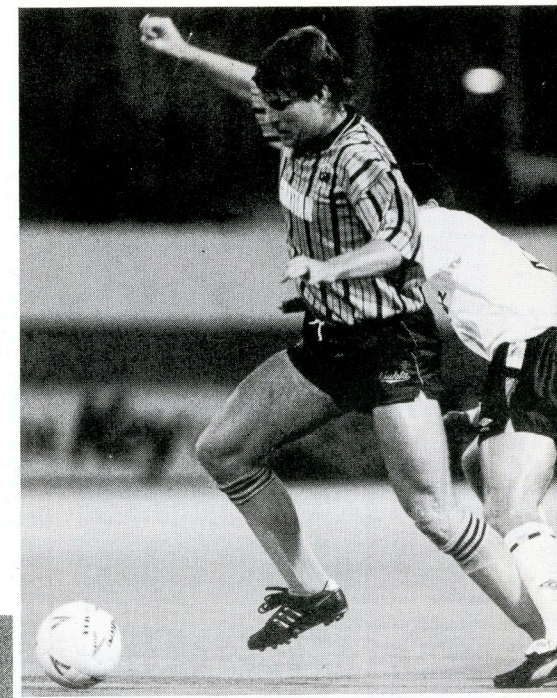

MICK DICKINSON'S COLUMN

Once upon a time there was no life to speak of outside the Football League. Certainly, clubs who failed to be re-elected to the League in the days before automatic promotion and relegation had really nowhere to go.

The pyramid system of leagues has changed all that. Now, theoretically, a club could graduate from a Sunday League to the Football League. The most startling rise in status that I'm aware of occurred to Welling United, a club based in South-East London — on the Kentish border. I worked in Welling for four years. When I went there they played in the Kent Ardenian League. When I left, they'd already progressed to the Southern League. They have eclipsed local rivals Gravesend and Dartford, who were always much bigger clubs, and at the time of writing they're relying fourth in the GM Vauxhall Conference, behind Kettering, Barnet and Colchester. If they achieve league status this season, they'll have gone from being a Sunday League side in less than 25 years — an incredible performance.

Wimbledon have shown that small clubs can be successful once they get into the league, but with all the restrictions nowadays I'm sure many clubs are happier being on the outside. Living in Skelmanthorpe, Huddersfield, my local non-league side is Emley. I don't get to see them as often as I'd like, but I'm always impressed with the set-up there. Emley personify all that is best in non-league. Good football, a cosy little ground — (although often very windy) a new stand and a good club house — It's good to be able to have a drink and see a game, and the atmosphere is humorous. Emley play in the 1st Division of the HFS Loans League, and in theory are only a couple of divisions away from the Football League.

The word 'theory' is an important one, though. Emley were in fact denied their place in the HFS Loans League because their ground was unsuitable, despite winning the Northern Counties East title, and they had to win it again the following season, by which time they had improved their ground. In the Weekly Wynners League (as the NCE has become) many promoted sides have this season been relegated because of their grounds, whilst other sides have moved from Division Two to Premier also because of grounds, thus making the football something of a farce. Dover Athletic and Colne Dynamo were also refused promotion to the higher sphere of football despite proving themselves on the field, and the latter has since given up.

There is obviously a big problem for the non-league sides who have ambitions to eventually compete in the Football League, and this lies in the form of the Justice Taylor Report. This report will eventually force all league clubs to become all-seater, and so it follows that any club gaining admittance to the League will have to have an all-seater ground, or the money to create one. So in a sense, the idea of the pyramid will be subverted. In the meantime, get along to your local non-league ground next time City haven't a game. You'll enjoy it.

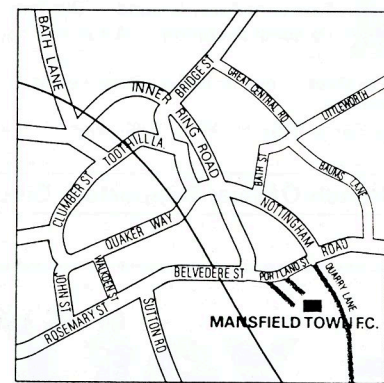

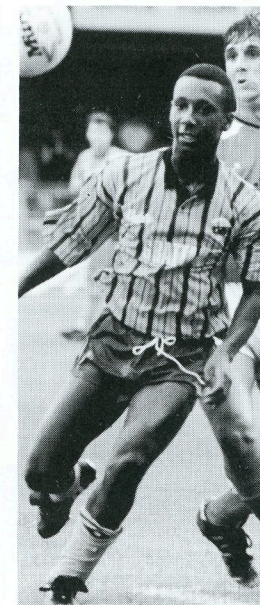
It was 17 year old Australian Marcus Stergiopoulos who finally got the better of the Hull defence when he beat the offside trap and raced clear to coolly fire home.

Local football fan Andrew Medley has a proud football heritage for his late uncle Lindon was once a City player.

You have to go back a long way to find the name of Lindon Medley however for it was 60 years ago exactly that he signed on at Valley Parade having made his name in Yorkshire League soccer with Yorkshire Amateurs.

Medley was 21 when he decided to try his luck as a professional footballer and, with City struggling to find a goalscoring centre forward, the world looked at his feet.

Bert Whitehurst has failed to recapture the tremendous form that brought 24 goals in only 15 games at the end of the 1928-29 Third Division (North) promotion campaign and City came close to going straight back down the following year so the familiar search for a striker began.

Unfortunately along with Medley came another former non-league player at the start of the 1930-31 season by the name of Jack Hallows and it was he who first established himself in the side.

that season and rattled up 19 goals while the following season he hit another 21 in only 34 outings.

Medley did get his chance and, after failing to score on his debut against Wolves at Valley Parade, promptly hit two in the 3-3 draw at Plymouth the following game.

In the event Lindon Medley was to play just SEVEN times for City for despite scoring six times in his first four games — including a hat-trick against Spurs at White Hart Lane he never found regular favour with manager Jack Peart.

At the end of the season he moved on to Southport however and did manage to carve out a career in the game as a player and later as a coach but sadly he died in his late '70s.

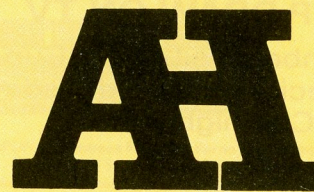

I hope you enjoy these half time competitions. I am trying to arrange for the teams names and goal by goal information to be broadcast over the tannoy.

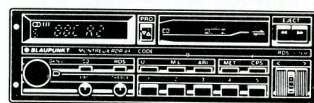

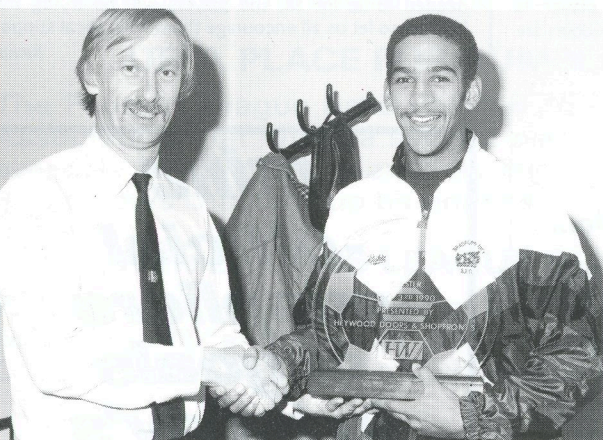

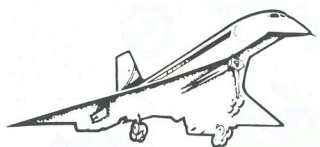


Action from Luton Town's first ever game in Division One v Charlton, August 1955.

'Into the eighties and beyond'

Although the last decade was to finish on such a disappointing note the 80's actually began with one of City's greatest performances in their history.

On August 27th, 1980 George Mulhall's Fourth Division men took on reigning League Champions

Liverpool at Valley Parade — and beat them!

What is even more remarkable is that this 1-0 victory was City's first home win of the season having previously failed to beat Rotherham United (0-0), in the League Cup, and both Stockport County (1-1) and Doncaster Rovers (0-0) in the League.

After the disappointing home form shown this season perhaps history will repeat itself tonight with the visit of First Division Luton for a Rumbelows Cup tie for the Liverpool game was at the same stage of the same competition. In any event when Steve Smith, Ces Podd, Micky Wood, Lammie Robertson, Peter Jackson, Terry Cooper, Terry Dolan, Dave Staniforth, Bobby Campbell, David McNiven and Les Chapman ran out against a side fielding no fewer than NINE internationals.

Not surprisingly Liverpool dominated with David Johnson being denied by Smith in the City goal and current Rangers boss Graeme Souness hitting the post inside the first few minutes.

At the other end England keeper Ray Clemence was a virtual spectator, along with the 16,233 fans on the terraces, and though City managed to

come more into the game in the second half Clemence was still rarely tested.

However with 13 minutes to go it was City who finally broke the deadlock when they were awarded a free kick just outside the area.

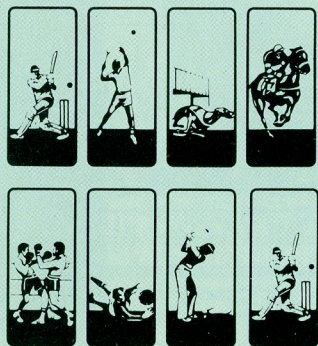
Les Chapman stepped over it, Terry Dolan hammered it hard and low through a gap in the wall, Clemence failed to hold it and goal-scoring hero Bobby Campbell buried it.

The score was suddenly Bradford City 1 Liverpool 0 and that's the way it stayed until the final whistle.

Unfortunately there was to be no ultimate giant killing for Liverpool were in total control in the second leg at Anfield the following week and ran out 4-0 winners to take the tie 4-1 on aggregate.

Having already done the hard bit in gaining a draw at Luton in this season's League cup competition let's hope we can collect a First Division scalp tonight to go with the many others we have claimed in Cup competitions in the years since that great Liverpool tie.

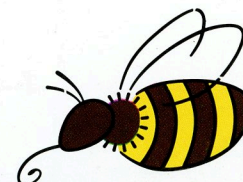

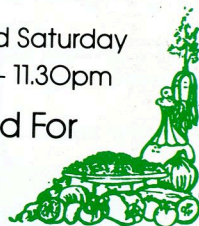
