

It is so long since our last home match in the First Division that this afternoon's fixture against Everton feels like the start of a new season. In fact, a lot has happened since we played Coventry City here on September 22, including the transfer of Tim Breacker to West Ham and our excellent bridge-building trip to Northern Ireland. Tim was a great favourite with all the fans and everyone who works at Kenilworth Road. West Ham's offer of £600,000, however, was a very good one and one which the club could not really refuse. We also took into account the fact that we had in Julian James, an England under-21 defender, a very accomplished replacement for Tim at right-back. Although the club are ambitious, and no-one moreso than me, the real equation that controls everything we do is the one involving our gates and our running costs. This suggests that we shall often be faced with the situation where we have to accept the right offer for a player, if and when the offer and time is right.

Having agreed to sell Tim, it was ill luck of course, that in the next match Julian should be injured. Julian fractured his cheekbone in the charity friendly match in Northern Ireland against Crewe United. Marvin Johnson, who was a substitute in the match, did well and wore the number two shirt last weekend at Roker Park where, despite the scoreline. I thought he did well again.

As to our league form so far, I have to say I think the team have played some very good football at times. The problem has been consistency. There has not been enough of it, but I believe that will come with time and patience. We have played well away which is encouraging as I remember from the 1974 promotion team here how confident we felt about playing to win home or away each week. It was a successful season and we enjoyed it and I hope we do this one too.



BRIDGES BUILT IN

BACK ON SONG



• Lars Elstrup has recovered his place in the Denmark team this season after hitting six goals for The Town.

Good afternoon and welcome back to Kenilworth Road. This afternoon's Barclays League Division One fixture against Everton is being televised for broadcast tomorrow afternoon on Anglia Television and we welcome Gerry Harrison and his colleagues here today.

Much has happened since my last notes. Tim Breacker has joined West Ham with all our good wishes (I know our team manager Jim Ryan has written concerning this transfer on page five) and we have been to play a charity friendly in Northern Ireland whilst here at Kenilworth Road, the club has provided the venue for the Daily Telegraph international hockey classic.

The trip to Northern Ireland, to play Crewe Athletic, near Lisburn, was a tremendous success, a great bridge-building exercise and something which was worthwhile to everyone involved, I know the players and management felt as strongly as I did about this after the warm welcome we received there.

Many of our supporters may have read comments by Billy Bingham in the national press in which he criticised the inclusion of both Iain Downie and Kingsley Black in our team for such a friendly exhibition

match so close to his Northern Ireland team's important European Championship meeting with Denmark.

While I recognise Billy had a very good point (the rest of the First Division, after all, were taking the weekend off to help international preparations), it should also be reported that Iain and Kingsley did not play full games, having only brief runs, and that the match did not represent much more than a strenuous training workout for our lads.

The two players both wanted to play as well and it was clear from the reception they and the team were given that their presence in our team was not only one of the major attractions of Luton Town in Ulster but also much appreciated.

For me, visiting Northern Ireland for the first time, it was an eye-opening and very interesting experience. One expects the situation there and the high-security in force to make subjects like the army presence and the political situation taboo, but that was not the case. They were discussed openly.

Regretably, there was a shooting in the city on the Saturday morning as we left and that, together with the

dreadful news of the further killings this week, left us feeling saddened by the events. However, I felt strongly that our visit and the spirit it engendered both at Crewe and in Luton made the trip more than worthwhile.

Crewe may be only a non-league club, but their reputation for charity work through football is second to none and our visit there created enormous interest and publicity with support from all sections of the community, all walks of life and both protestants and catholics.

Britannia also played their part, I must say, in providing the sponsored air travel and arrangements which made the trip go off very smoothly. We had a great reception at both Luton Airport and Belfast and talks about a reciprocal visit by Crewe to Luton, with Britannia sponsoring the visit, have already taken place.

It was strange, so soon after Tim Breacker's move to Upton Park, that we were drawn to meet West Ham in the second round of the Zenith Data Cup. That match will be here at Kenilworth Road on December 19 when visiting supporters from West Ham will be allowed in. We shall stick to our usual guesting policy and

all guest tickets must be claimed by 4pm on the 19th without exception.

Earlier in December, we shall be playing in the annual Guinness Soccer Six tournament at the G-Mex in Manchester from Sunday, December 2 to Wednesday December 5. We have been drawn in group C together with Tottenham and Coventry for Monday evening and, obviously, hope to make progress.

Earlier this month, we provided the venue for the Daily Telegraph hockey classic which was again a success and, incidentally, the reason for the complications in our fixture programme. The income from this tournament for the club was in excess of £20,000. It had good television coverage this year, but I understand the organisers were slightly disappointed with the attendances.

It was very nice last weekend to go up to Roker Park and play Sunderland there for the first time since 1984. The result was not the one we had hoped for, of course, but we enjoyed the trip to one of football's greatest hotbeds in the north-east.



FIRST TEAM ACTION

The Football Trust 1990 has been created to help the game at all levels and to assist clubs meet the requirements of Lord Justice Taylor's Final Report.

Safety and comfort for all spectators is the primary objective and substantial funds have been made available for the provision of seating at Football League grounds. At the same time the Trust's commitment to family and community initiatives will continue with the provision of more family enclosures, better toilet facilities, covered accommodation, artificial pitches for local use and the development of women's and junior football particularly through community programmes, plus a wide range of policing and crowd control measures.

Each year The Trust expects to receive £20 million from the reduction in Pool Betting Duty plus the £10 million continuing contribution from the Spotting-the-Ball competition organised by Littlewoods, Vernons and Zetters. This money will be invested in projects which benefit football throughout the United Kingdom.

• This afternoon we welcome Everton to Kenilworth Road. As one of the most famous and respected clubs in the English game, they need little introduction to regular football fans accustomed to seeing them in the scrap for honours every year.

• This season, however, has been nothing short of disappointing by Everton's high standards, winning only one of their opening eight league games. This poor form saw them placed third from bottom of Division One in the early-season tables.

• The only newcomer to Everton's line-up this season is Andy Hinchcliffe, a summer arrival from Manchester City. It has not been an easy opening spell for Andy.

• Everton were founded in 1878 under the name of St Domingo F.C. They played all their home games at nearby Stanley Park and later at Priory Road. In 1885, Everton turned professional as one of the founder members of the Football League, playing their home matches at Anfield! They moved to Goodison Park in 1892.

• Everton have been league champions an

impressive nine times the latest being in 1987. They have also won the FA Cup four times and were the last English club to win European honours when they won the European Cup Winner's Cup in 1985, in the same year as they won the league championship.

• Since taking over as manager former Everton midfielder star Colin Harvey has seen his team battle through a transitional period which has seen many Everton players of the successful mid-eighties leave the club. It has been difficult for Mr Harvey to create a settled team.

• Mr Harvey is the ninth post-war manager at Goodison Park in a list which includes names such as John Carey, Billy Bingham, Gordon Lee and current Manchester City manager Howard Kendall.

• Last weekend, Everton were held to a 0-0 home draw by Crystal Palace in front of 24,504 at Goodison Park. The Everton team was: Southall, Attveld, Hinchcliffe (Keown 60), Ratcliffe (Newell 72), Watson, McDonald, Nevin, McCall, Sharp, Cottee, Ebbrell.

OFF THE RECORD

LOOKING BACK WITH KEITH BARBER

Although born in Luton, Keith Barber embarked on rather a roundabout trip before eventually signing for his home town club, writes club statistician Roger Wash.

After being spotted playing in local league football in London Keith had trials at Luton in the late 1960's before being "loaned" out to Dunstable. He was recalled by Alec Stock, signing professional forms in April 1971 just as the Town's promotion aspirations were reaching a climax.

"After each of the first two games over Easter 1971 I was told by Harry Haslam that Alec Stock would play me in the next match. As all three games over that period were pressure matches which were all lost I was probably grateful that I did not make by debut until the Saturday after Easter when we drew 2-2 at home to Sheffield Wednesday," he said.

During the following season Keith shared the goalkeeping duties with Tony Read before making the position his own in 1972/73. It was at this time that the famous Barber bravery showed through as he was rushed back after a cartilage operation in what seemed like a matter of days to take his place in the side that played at Sunderland in the F.A. Cup quarter-finals.

As the Town fought their way to promotion in 1973/74, competition for the goalkeeping slot was seen in the shape of Graham Horn but this threat was finally seen off midway through the following season as immediate relegation was so nearly avoided.

"That period saw my most memorable game during

my time at Luton - the 2-1 win over Leeds at Kenilworth Road although Paul Futcher and I gifted Leeds their goal in the closing minutes," he said.

The traumatic season of 1975/76 saw Keith ever present but a bad injury sustained at Notts County early in the following campaign effectively ended his Luton career as by the time he was fit Milija Alecsic had established himself in the Luton goal.

"I thoroughly enjoyed my time at Luton turning out with such great players as Chris Nichol, Paul Futcher and Alan Slough and I count myself lucky to have played First and Second Division football."

Keith left Luton in the summer of 1977 and made 42 appearances for Swansea helping them out of Division Four in the process before falling out with John Toshack - "I was not from Liverpool!" and spending a short period at Cardiff on loan for whom his final appearance was ironically at Luton when the Hatters went goal mad winning 7-1.

Keith then ran the "Rose and Crown" in Harpenden before moving to Newmarket seven years ago where he looked after two further pubs before taking up his present job working on the starting stalls at Newmarket racecourse.

Peter and Paul Barber now following in their fathers footsteps turning out in goal for the local Racing Colts side and both showing a Barber characteristic in being extremely bad losers!



FOR THE RECORD

Continuing our 'football diary' to keep you up to date with the domestic and global game:

Sept 15: The Town crash 6-1 at Q.P.R. Ceri Hughes scores the consolation goal. A minute's silence is witnessed at every Football League ground in memory of David Longhurst who died the previous week playing for York City.

Sept 16: Liverpool make it five wins from five with a crushing 4-0 victory against Manchester United. Peter Beardsley scores a hat-trick.

Sept 18: Brian Clough signs a £600,000 three year contract with Nottingham Forest.

Sept 19: The return of English clubs to Europe sees Manchester United beat Pecs Munkas of Hungary 2-0, in the home leg of the European Cup Winner's Cup (first round). In the UEFA Cup, Aston Villa win 3-1 v Banik Ostrava of Czechoslovakia at Villa Park.

Joe Jordan leaves Bristol City to become new manager of Hearts. Brian Marwood joins Sheffield United from Arsenal in a £350,000 deal.

Sept 22: The Town make amends for the disastrous result against QPR with a 1-0 win against Coventry City. Favourites Liverpool win the Merseyside Derby 3-2 to stay top of Division One.

Sept 25: The Town entertain Bradford City in the Rumbelows League Cup, 2nd Round, 1st Leg. Richard Harvey scores his first goal for the club in a 1-1 draw.

Other results include a 5-0 victory for Liverpool against Crewe; Southampton winning 5-0 at Rochdale; Spurs beating Hartlepool 5-0 (Gascoigne 4) and a League Cup record for the round as Crystal Palace beat Southend 8-0.

FOCUS ON EVERTON

Neville Southall (goalkeeper): Neville has been Wales' goalkeeper for the past decade and has more than 40 caps for his country. He was discovered playing for non-league Winsford United and Bury signed him for £6,000 in 1980. A year later, he was playing First Division football for Everton following a £150,000 move.

Andy Hinchcliffe (defender): England Under-21 international, Andy made his Football League debut only three seasons ago for his home club Manchester City. He quickly established himself in the First Division, prompting Everton to sign him last summer.

Kevin Ratcliffe (defender): Club captain, Kevin (pictured below) now won more Caps than any player in Everton's history. Kevin developed in the junior teams at Goodison Park, making his debut v Manchester United in 1980.

Dave Watson (defender): Dave started his career with Liverpool but did not play in their league team. Soon after moving to Norwich, for £100,000 in 1980, he became a regular in the first team, and quickly gained recognition in the England squad. Everton signed Dave for £1 million in 1986.

John Ebbrell (defender): John is a graduate of the FA 'School of Excellence'. He joined Everton soon after the two year course in 1986. He made his league debut for Everton in 1989 v Wimbledon at Goodison Park.

Martin Keown (defender): Martin signed for Everton in the summer of 1989 from Aston Villa. He served his apprenticeship with Arsenal but made his League debut on loan to Brighton in 1985. He remained at Brighton for the start of 1985/6, then returned to gain a regular place in the Arsenal side. He joined Villa in 1986.

Stuart McCall (midfield): Stuart began his career for Bradford City, making his League debut v Reading in 1982. He went on to win a Third Division championship medal at Valley Parade and gained international honours at Under-21 level with Scotland. He signed for Everton in 1988 for £825,000, and played for Scotland in the Italy.

Pat Nevin (midfield): Pat was signed from Chelsea for £925,000 during the 1988 close-season. He started his career with Clyde and, after two seasons in their Scottish League side, he joined Chelsea in 1983. Pat is a Scottish international.


Raymond Atteveld (midfield): Raymond signed for Everton in 1989 from Dutch First Division side Haarlem for a fee of £250,000. He made his League debut for Everton in a 1-0 defeat at Nottingham Forest last season. He is a Dutch 'B' and Under 21 international.

Kevin Sheedy (midfield/forward): Kevin played for Northern Ireland at youth level but made his full debut for the Republic v Holland in 1984. He made his League debut for Hereford in 1976 and moved on to Liverpool for £80,000, two years later. After four seasons, he moved across to Stanley Park for £100,000.

Tony Cottee (forward): After five very consistent seasons with West Ham, Tony took up the challenge of playing for Everton following a £2 million move in 1988. Last season was a poor one for Tony; lack of form and injury kept him out of the first team. His problems seem to be behind him now as he is Everton's top scorer.

Graeme Sharp (forward): Graeme has been Everton's leading scorer four times since joining the club from Dumbarton for £125,000 in 1980. Graeme has 11 Scotland caps.

Mike Newell (forward): Former Town favourite Mike was signed from Leicester City for £1 million in 1989. Born in Liverpool, Mike made his League debut playing for Crewe in 1983. After only a few weeks at Gresty Road, he was transferred to Wigan. Luton signed him for £85,000 in 1986, but after three seasons at Kenilworth Road he moved on to Leicester City for £350,000.
