



Our last four matches have not given a fair picture of our recent performances, with only one point gained from the 12 available so we shall be looking to make amends this afternoon as we welcome Manchester City to Kenilworth Road. The fixtures computer did us no favours when it supplied us with three away matches out of four and included a trip to Liverpool. But our performances have not been had and I felt we were especially unlucky not to gain any reward at Derby. The Liverpool fixture has to be treated as a special case as their record this season shows, but I was pleased at least to see we continued to play good football and created several chances in the second half.

On the injury front things are generally looking up. We have seen Sean Farrell make a return to action - he came on for a brief run at Anfield - and I think he is now physically over his injuries. It is just a matter for him of showing he has fully recovered mentally. Graham Rodger was due back in real action this week in a friendly. Our only worries have been the niggling injuries to John Dreyer and Kingsley Black.

This week has been a big one in international football and we have been delighted to have three players involved with Lars Elstrup with Denmark and Kingsley Black and Iain Dowie with Northern Ireland. These weeks give the game a real edge of excitement and anticipation and I hope that Lars in particular was given a chance to show his consistently improved form for us this season in a Denmark shirt again.

Another man who has been in good form this season has been Alec Chamberlain. This may be partly due to the coaching he has been having in specialist sessions from Peter Bonetti who has been coming in regularly on Thursdays since last season.

Peter was a top-class goalkeeper as I remember from playing against him in my own playing days. Incidentally, if you want to compare the speed of the modern game with that of yesteryear there is the ideal chance tomorrow when I am turning out in a Luton Town Staff team against the TV Commentators for the Children in Need charity. It will not be quick, I can tell you...but it will be in a good cause.





Good afternoon and welcome to Manchester City. Today's match is the first of two at home at the start of a busy run-in towards the end of the year and we have plenty of matches to look forward to at all levels of the club in the coming weeks.

After next week's Barclays League Division One clash here against Aston Villa, for example, our youth team are scheduled to play away to Waford in the F.A. Youth Cup second round proper at Vicarage Road on Tuesday, November 27, kick-off 7.30pm.

The reserves, as holders of the Bedfordshire Premier Cup, also have a cup fixture to look forward to as they are due to visit Creasey Park to meet Dunstable on December 4, kick-off 7.30pm.

At about the same time, we shall also have a squad of 10 senior players away in action at the Guinness Soccer-Six tournament in Manchester. So, all in all, it is going to be a busy period for everyone at Kenilworth Road.

This week, of course, we have had several players away on international duty again and it is always an honour for the club to have men called up by their countries. Lars Elstrup has been with Denmark for their match against Yugoslavia, Kingsley Black and Iain Dowie have been with Northern Ireland in Austria and Jason Rees was

on stand-by for Wales full international squad in their match in Luxembourg.

Our congratulations go to all of them, but particularly to Jason who has obviously made an impression on the Welsh and their national manager Terry Yorath. Well done, Jason.

With today's fixture followed quickly by another home match next week it is an appropriate time to note how often this season we have had our matches clustered together in twos - two at home and then two away.

I am assured by the Football League that it is not a deliberate new policy on their part and I know how costly and difficult it can be for our travelling fans. The real programmes for football should always revolve around one match at home and then one away on successive Saturdays.

Next week's fixture against Aston Villa, incidentally, will be broadcast live on television into Scandinavia and all the Nordic countries. It is the first time we have been selected for a live game like this for two years now and of course we are delighted.

On the commercial side, it has given our Commercial Manager Wendy Grzybowska an opportunity for increased activity with ground perimeter advertising and I am sure you will be suprised to read some of the names around the pitch next weekend.

The whole operation, however, will bring in an additional guaranteed £75,000 to the club from perimeter advertising.

An entirely different sort of income will be raised for charity tomorrow when a quite different sort of match takes place here - the Luton Town Staff against the TV Commentators. This is a regular fixture now and one that we all enjoy, but this year it will have a more serious aim as we are linking up with BBC Radio Bedfordshire to raise funds for the Children In Need appeal.

All money raised will go to the appeal and for that reason there will be an admission charge of 1 for adults and 50 pence for Senior Citizens and Juniors for the match which kicks off at 12 noon. The two teams are donating £5 per player to the appeal and there is also going to be a raffle which will be drawn at half-time.

The prizes will include an autographed first team shirt and a day at Henlow Grange. Raffle tickets can be bought from the Ticket Office today and, for those unable to attend the match, prize-winners will be traced

through their membership numbers.

Kingsley Black has agreed to be the referee and their team will include John Motson, Jim Rosenthal and Alan Parry. For the Town, Jim Ryan, John Faulkner, John Moore and George Ley, together with various other members of staff and some of our board of directors.

It is a light-hearted 90 minutes and I am sure many of our first team squad will be on hand to cheer and jeer from the touchlines. Tina, from our club offices, has agreed to be Physio which is one good reason why many of us old 'uns are likely to go down and stay down when we are injured!

Finally, on a more sombre note, I am pleased to be able to report that Jim Shorey, who has been our coach driver on many of the long trips to away games, is recovering well after suffering a heart attack last weekend.

Jim was taken into intensive care in hospital in Liverpool on Friday evening. He was out of intensive care this week thankfully and we all send him our very best wishes for a swift and full recovery.



Luton Town 1 Everton 1
Lars Elstrup headed the Town in front after 24 minutes when he met a well-flighted cross by Richard Harvey with an accurate downward shot past Neville Southall, but Everton bounced back to level in the second half of an even and entertaining game here on October 27. Pat Nevin grabbed the Merseyside equaliser after 50 minutes from a narrow angle.

Elstrup's goal was his first at home and his seventh of a successful season to date for the Town, the Danish international showing pace and finishing power after recovering from last season's injury problems. His performance however was not sustained against Everton because an ankle injury enforced his withdrawal in the second half when the Town created good openings for Iain Dowie.

“Already, CCTV has had a major impact on the hooligan problem inside football grounds as well as proving extremely useful to monitor safety measures. If any trouble appears on the screen or is reported from any quarter of the ground, the CCTV can zoom in on the incident. The police can then record what occurs on colour video and on hard copy prints. Individuals can be picked out by facial appearance and the colour of their clothing. The evidential effect of such a video recording has proved formidable. It has persuaded hooligans, who would previously have sought to challenge oral evidence of identification, to plead guilty. Hooligans know cameras are keeping a roving watch and their activities in the ground are inhibited by that knowledge.”

- We extend a warm welcome to the players and officials of Manchester City who come to Kenilworth Road today with just one League defeat suffered in 11 games before last weekend's home loss to Leeds. The shock departure of manager Howard Kendall has overshadowed the team's fine start to the season which saw them lying in fifth place in Division One before their televised defeat last Sunday.
- Peter Reid is temporarily in charge of the side as player-manager. Since World War II, the Maine Road club has been managed by no more than 16 managers including such names as the late Joe Mercer, Malcolm Allison, John Bond and Billy McNeill, Mr Kendall's move to Everton as manager was City's seventh departure in nine years.
- Manchester City were formed in 1887 as Ardwick F.C. and were founder members of Division Two. In 1894 they were elected to take the name Manchester City and played at Hyde Road.
- Mr Kenall has left a team at Maine Road capable of enjoying a fine season. They will be trying to recapture former glories which included League

Championship honours in 1937 and 1968; FA Cup Wins in 1904, 1934, 1956 and 1969 and European Cup Wins in 1970.

- The only transfer move during the summer was the £1 million signing of Watford goalkeeper Tony Coton, money which was recaptured with the sale of Andy Hinchcliffe to Everton.
- Recently City lost a Rumbelows Cup third round tie 2-1 against Arsenal at Maine Road. They aimed to make amends with a win at Sunderland, but could only manager a draw. David White scored City's only goal.
- Last season, City were among the Telegation strugglers for a long spell before escaping with a polished late season run under Mr. Kendall's control. They finally finished 14th.
- City's Maine Road stadium has been the scene of many big matches with vast crowds and their own record home gate proves the point: 84,569 packing in to watch an FA Cup clash with Stoke in 1934.

OFF THE RECORD

LOOKING BACK WITH BUD AHERNE

Although born in Limerick Thomas "Bud" Aherne moved to the North in 1946 after leaving the Army to turn out for Belfast Celtic, writes club statistician Roger Wash.

The Windsor Park side of the time boasted players of the calibre of Jack Vernon and Charlie Tully and Bud was thoroughly enjoying his football when one afternoon in 1949 a riot erupted with players being attacked by supporters with the result that Belfast Celtic were thrown out of the Irish League and the club eventually folded.

"I decided to try for less dangerous duty in England and the first person to offer me terms was Luton chairman Charles Jeyes who convinced me that Kenilworth Road would be the place for me", he said.

For a fee of £8,000 Luton Town picked up an established Irish International full back - Bud was one of a few players at the time who qualified to play for both Eire and Northern Ireland - who gave ten years valuable service to the Hatters with many cultured and reliable displays at full-back.

"I thoroughly enjoyed my time at Luton and although we did not earn the money today's players get we were always a happy club and laughs were plentiful. I do not think we were unprofessional but there seemed to be more humour in the game in those days", he said.

Bud made his Luton debut on 19th March 1949 at White Hart Lane in a 2-1 defeat by Tottenham and from then until 1957 he remained virtually ever present making 266 League appearances but surprisingly never scoring a goal.

IT HAPPENED.....

FIVE YEARS AGO (16/11/85) After a fine win at Tottenham the previous week the Town were brought back to earth with a 1-0 home defeat by Coventry.

TEN YEARS AGO (15/11/80) In a classic game the Town beat runaway League leaders West Ham at Kenilworth Road before a crowd of 17,031. Brian Stein with two and David Moss were the Luton scorers.

FIFTEEN YEARS AGO (15/11/75) Goals from Jim Husband and Brian Chambers were not enough to prevent a 3-2 home defeat at the hands of Oldham.

TWENTY YEARS AGO (14/11/70) With the Town 3-0 down at home to Carlisle and the game entering the final quarter a fantastic fightback saw a point saved. Jim Ryan, Alan Slough and Malcolm Macdonald were the Luton scorers before a rainsoaked crowd of 14,837.

"During my time at Luton I would rate Bob Morton as the best player I played alongside and I think he was desperately unlucky not to get the International recognition he deserved.

"The one game that sticks in the memory was the 5-4 defeat at Wolves early in the 1956/57 season. We had started off the season with three straight wins and then travelled to Molineux to play a team that could be regarded as the Liverpool of the day. The game had everything with end to end football and a hat-trick from Gordon Turner and it was unfortunate that there had to be a loser.

"On the International side of things I can well remember turning out for the South against England at Goodison Park in 1950 and being delighted in beating the so called "masters" 2-1".

Bud was fortunate in avoiding major injuries during his career and reckoned that he received more cuts and bruises from team-mate Wally Shanks than with the opposition. It was ironic therefore that an injury should effectively end his career when he suffered a hairline fracture of the ankle.

"I was coming to the end of my playing days and I was slowing up, hence the injury. By the time I got back I was too old and with the shake up after the Cup Final defeat I stepped down to look after the Youth Team", he said.

The playing did not stop however, as Bud turned out for three or four years with Luton Celtic before hanging up his boots well into his forties!

FOR THE RECORD

Continuing our 'football diary' to keep you up to date with the domestic and global game:

Oct 17: Eire open their European Championship campaign with a 5-0 victory v Turkey in Dublin. John Aldridge grabs a hat-trick. England win 2-0 v Poland at Wembley. Lineker and Beardsley are the scorers. Scotland beat Switzerland 2-1, Northern Ireland draw 1-1 with Denmark and Wales beat Belgium 3-1.

Oct 20: Luton play their first League game for three weeks and go down 2-0 at Sunderland. Liverpool drop their first points of the season, drawing 1-1 v Norwich at Carrow Road. The F.A. are to enquire into a 21-man brawl at Old Trafford during Arsenal's 1-0 win v Manchester United.

Oct 22: Arsenal manager George Graham is fined £10,000 for not controlling his players in the Old Trafford brawl. Five other Arsenal players and three United players are also fined. Manchester United beat Wrexham 3-0 in the European Cup Winner's Cup.

24 Oct: Aston Villa beat Inter Milan 2-0 at Villa Park in the 2nd round of the UEFA Cup. Glasgow Rangers crash 3-0 v Red Star Belgrade.

USA Football Federation have their bid to buy Oxford United and play in the Football League turned down.

Oct 27: Lars Elstrup scores his seventh League goal of the season as the Town draw with Everton at Kenilworth Road. Arsenal, Spurs and Crystal Palace all win to keep the pressure on Liverpool, who win 2-0 v Chelsea.

Oct 28: Fresh rumours build in the press that John Toshack, manager of Real Madrid and Bobby Robson, manager of PSV Eindhoven are to lose their jobs. PSV go down 3-1 to rivals Ajax while Real loose 3-1 to bottom-placed Legrones.

FOCUS ON MANCHESTER CITY

Tony Coton (goalkeeper): Tony joined the growing band of £1 million goalkeepers when he signed for City last summer. Tony made his League debut for Birmingham City in 1980 and spent five seasons at St Andrews before signing for Watford in 1984.

Alan Harper (defender): Liverpool born, Alan spent six seasons at Anfield without making an appearance in the first team, so in 1983 he made the short trip across Stanley Park and became a regular in the Everton line-up. He spent one season at Sheffield Wednesday before signing for City last season.

Neil Pointon (defender): Neil is another ex-Everton player who followed Mr Kendall to Maine Road. He made his debut for Scunthorpe Utd in 1982 where he established himself as a regular, making over 160 appearances. Everton signed Neil in 1985 before joining City last year.

Steve Redmond (defender): Steve made his League debut for City in 1986 and has become a regular fixture in the heart of their defence ever since. He has made over 170 League appearances for the club and is an England U-21 international.

Colin Hendry (defender): Colin was introduced to First Division football last season after previously playing for Blackburn Rovers and Dundee. He made his League debut in Scottish football in 1984 and joined Blackburn two years later. He established himself as a top class defender at Ewood Park, making over 180 League appearances for the club.

Peter Reid (midfield): An influence in the City side, Peter has become player manager since the sudden departure of Howard Kendall. Bolton introduced him to League soccer in 1974 and he was transferred to Everton for £60,000 in 1982. After a successful spell at Goodison, he joined QPR for a brief spell before signing for City last season.

David White (midfield): David made his League debut for City in a 1-0 defeat by the Town here at Kenilworth Road in 1986. He has since become a regular in the side and his consistent performances have resulted in England U-21 caps.

Gary Megson (midfield): Gary was signed from Sheffield Wednesday in 1989. He began his League career with Plymouth Argyle in 1977, moving to Everton for £250,000 two years later. He first joined Sheffield Wednesday in 1981 but moved to Forest in 1984.

Ian Brightwell (midfield): England U-21 international, Ian is a product of the successful youth scheme at Maine Road. He has made over 100 appearance for the club.

Adrian Heath (forward): Yet another ex-Evertonian who followed Mr Kendall to Maine Road. 'Inchy' started his career with his local club Stoke City before signing for Everton for £700,000 in 1982. He joined City last season after a brief spell in Spain.

Niall Quinn (forward): Dublin born, Niall scored on his Football League debut for Arsenal v Liverpool in 1985. He made over 60 League appearances for the Gunners in four seasons. City stepped in to sign him for £750,000 last season. Niall is an Eire international.

Mark Ward (forward): Mark served as an apprentice at Everton but went into Non-League football with Northwich Victoria. Oldham signed him in 1983 and after two outstanding seasons at Boundary Park joined West Ham for £250,000 in 1985. He signed for City last season.
