



A PERSONAL VIEW

I was delighted to receive a letter recently from the West Midlands Police Force congratulating our supporters for their impeccable behaviour at our game against Aston Villa at Villa Park.

The letter is reproduced in today's "City Ground Scene" and I'm sure you will agree it reflects nothing but good on our fans.

But the Villa match again threw up an interesting — and not always satisfactory — state of affairs for our supporters travelling to an away match.

In common with our games at Anfield and the Baseball Ground last Saturday, visiting spectators had no other option than to sit and watch the game.

Obviously, this is in line with the Taylor Report recommendations but it can cause problems — in more ways than one.

Something of a re-education process is needed among supporters — and indeed to some extent among the clubs themselves — to come into line with the all-seater syndrome.

Not least is the fact that supporters not used to sitting down — and who object to having to do so — can be something of an irritation to spectators who have been regulars in the stands.

Football generally is aware of the problem but I would be interested to hear the views of the 43 Police Authorities in the country as to whether they are totally happy at having to police all-seater grounds. I suspect they have some reservations.

It's an interesting talking point and there's nothing more certain than it will capture our attention more and more as the months and years go by.

- We have had some comments from supporters about our pricing of tickets for the Zenith Data Systems Cup tie against Newcastle United.

I would like to point out that the views that have been expressed have been taken on board and I stress that every match is taken on its merits.

We did, for example, reduce prices for our Rumbelows League Cup tie against Fourth Division Burnley earlier in the season but we viewed the visit of Newcastle differently.

We don't regard the Zenith Data Systems Cup as an inferior competition either. It's only 18 months ago that we took 30,000 people to Wembley for the final of the Simod Cup — as it was then — having attracted more than 23,000 for a home semi-final against Crystal Palace.

But the points made about the pricing of tickets have been noted and will be taken into consideration in the future.





I started writing these notes on Monday after we had been outfought at Derby and before being knocked out of the Rumbelows Cup at Coventry.

I've conceded seven goals in two matches, not surprisingly lost them both because of it and we've now got to close ranks and get on with the job of trying to win a match.

But I'll tell you this — nothing has changed from last Saturday, last Wednesday or any other day you care to mention in terms of the way we will try and play the game.

We will have matches like the one at Derby but it will never stop me sending a team out to play football. That's what I've been doing for 25 years and I'm too old to change now.

I remember in my Middlesbrough days having a conversation with a very talented centre forward called Micky Fenton. "Brian", he told me, "There's no substitute for skill."

It's something I've remembered all down the years and he's smack on.

I know we would like to achieve a little bit better balance between skill and competitiveness (or whatever word you want to call it) but we will never stray from the main objective of trying to play football as it should be played.

The game has changed but skill is still the prime factor. You can't sing if you haven't got a voice, you can't jump if you haven't got legs and you can't play football if you haven't got skill.

So we'll carry on with our beliefs despite the disappointments of the last week. It's the right way . . . I promise you.


"Against Sunderland and Derby, Nigel Clough laid the ball up for me to have a crack at goal and luckily, I found the target . . . it's just one of those things.

"A lot of the credit must go to Nigel. He gets a lot of knock downs, especially from set-pieces, and always puts in a good ball so you can have a clear strike at goal."



RESERVE AND YOUTH REPORT

We had the disappointment of having our reserve game against Newcastle United postponed last week because Jim Smith's side could not raise a team.

It would have been good for us to have got the game played and hopefully collected another three points as we bid to regain the Pontins League title.

With the season coming up to the half way point at Christmas time, we're delighted to be involved in the race — even though we are not complaining that contenders like Sheffield Wednesday have been dropping points in recent matches.

Last season we got so far adrift of Liverpool it was impossible to catch them despite having a good run towards the end of the season.

So we just want to maintain our form as long as possible — both as a team and individually.

One player certainly producing a consistent run of late is Ian Woan, who has underlined his value to us by maintaining an excellent striking rate.

With Gary Charles out injured, we've switched Brett Williams to right back

and had Woan at left back in recent weeks but it hasn't prevented him getting forward, joining in on our attacks and scoring goals.

The defensive role has been good for his all-round game, too, because he's been forced to tackle and head the ball more often.

We went ahead after five minutes against Bury with a fine individual goal by Craig Boardman, who picked the ball up about 35 yards from goal and just kept going before tucking the ball past the keeper.

Numerous chances came our way to add a second but we had to wait until the second half when Woan broke from left back, played a one-two with Scot Gemmill and then exchanged passes with Neil Lyne before scoring.

Bury scored directly from the kick off and although Andrew Marriott had to pull off a brilliant save in the last couple

of minutes, we were full value for the points.

There was no doubt about our right to victory at Chesterfield, where we led 1-0 at half-time and went on to complete a 5-0 win.

Toddi Orlygsson put us ahead in the first half and two splendid strikes by Woan made it three. The Chesterfield keeper parried a shot to deny Woan his hat-trick but Gemmill put in the rebound and a cross shot by Brian Rice completed the scoring.

In the Midland Purity Youth League we've had a couple of draws with Northampton and Stoke.

Our performance in a 1-1 draw at Northampton was matched by the weather conditions and when I tell you it was an atrocious day, you'll know what I mean.

We had to come from behind but earned a point with an effort by Pete Allum (pictured).

Against Stoke we also found ourselves coming from behind to draw 2-2.

Stoke led 2-0 at one stage but they had a player sent off for persistent dissent

and although sometimes it can be difficult to play against ten men, it worked to our advantage on this occasion.

With an hour gone we pulled a goal back when Martin Fancutt ended a surging run by drawing the keeper and leaving Ian Kilford with the chance to score.

And 20 minutes from time Dale Pierce played a good ball in for Stephen Bell to have a shot that the goalkeeper got his hands to but couldn't keep out. After that we could easily have gone on to win but Stoke, to their credit, battled it out to earn a draw.

Then last Monday we defeated Shrewsbury 3-1 away in the Midland Purity League Cup second round in a match that turned out to be a personal triumph for young striker Jason Kaminski.

In his first full game for us at this level he helped himself to a splendid hat-trick, scoring with a 25 yarder in the first half, scoring twice more in the second and being denied a fourth by the woodwork.

So an excellent start for him in what was a good all-round display.

In order to continue giving expert help, plans are afoot to give coaches special training for giving guidance to those with disabilities.


We gave Aston Villa a difficult return to English football after their European sojourn ended in Milan recently.





WELCOME TO LUTON



LARS ELSTRUP

LUTON TOWN are quite understandably relieved that First Division life appears to be ticking over at a far more tranquil rate this season after the dramatic events of last term.

The Hatters, having taken a leaf from Charlton Athletic's book with their Houdini-style escape from relegation, have made a satisfactory start this season, settling in mid-table.

And that has removed initial doubts cast over their First Division future by the so-called experts, who were predicting from the outset that Luton's desperately late reprieve on the final day of last season was merely a stay of execution.

Certainly, one thing in their favour now is that life on and off the field has settled down again after a year of considerable upheaval, especially in the club's corridors of power.

In a 12-month period, they had three chairmen, two managers, one caretaker boss and 16 serious injuries.

So it was hardly surprising that the club was still fighting a battle for survival when the climax to last season unfolded — a remarkable day in which we also played a key role.

The combination of Luton's nail-biting 3-2 victory at Derby County and our emphatic 3-0 triumph at Sheffield Wednesday on May 5th sent Ron Atkinson's side down to the Second Division by the narrowest of margins — just two goals in fact.

Jim Ryan was responsible for masterminding an incredible transformation in the club's fortunes which culminated in that win at the Baseball Ground, after they had also beaten Arsenal and Crystal Palace in their previous two games.

Ryan injected new spirit into the club, pinned his faith in many of the younger

players and gambled on an attacking formation to bring them success after he had been promoted from reserve team coach to succeed Ray Harford.

A former player and coach at Kenilworth Road, Ryan has continued that encouraging work in the hot seat this season, with varying degrees of fortune in League action.

On the one hand, they have enjoyed notable victories on their travels at Southampton (2-1) and Norwich (3-1), but in sharp contrast they crashed 6-1 at Queen's Park Rangers, and that is a fair reflection of how their form has fluctuated.

The player chiefly responsible for those successes at the Dell and Carrow Road was their Danish international striker Lars Elstrup, who scored all five of the goals.

Elstrup, who burst on to the international scene with six goals in his first 12 appearances for his country, became Luton's record signing in August 1989 when they paid £650,000 to Odense to introduce him to English football.

But he headed a crippling list of long term casualties as two cartilage operations restricted him to 13 games.

Up to now though, Elstrup hasn't encountered such problems this season and his partnership with Iain Dowie in attack provides Luton with a source of great optimism — a fact which was evident last week when they caused Aston Villa all sorts of problems in a 2-0 victory at Kenilworth Road.

Dowie, formerly a British Aerospace engineer who cost £30,000 from non-league Hendon, was thrown his big chance following the big-money departures of Roy Wegerle (£1m) to Q.P.R. and Mick Harford (£500,000) to Derby County.

MEET THE MANAGER



JIM RYAN quickly made an impression as Luton's manager by plotting their escape from what appeared an inevitable drop into Division Two last season.

The Hatters were deep in relegation trouble when Ryan succeeded Ray Harford in mid-January, but he led a revival that enabled them to finish with three successive wins and jump to safety at the final attempt.

A former Luton and Manchester United player, he won a European Cup winners medal when he was a substitute for United's famous 3-2 win over Benfica.

After playing in the United States for Dallas Tornado and Wichita Wings, he returned to England and, having gained his English FA Coaching Licence, joined the Kenilworth Road, backroom staff in 1986.

And the promise he has shown has been recognised with him winning international recognition in Billy Bingham's Northern Ireland side for the European Championship qualifiers.

A team-mate of Dowie's at that level is winger Kingsley Black who provides Luton with other attacking options.

The 22-year-old shot to prominence in the Hatters' 1988 Littlewoods Cup Final victory over Arsenal, prompting Bingham and Bobby Robson to compete for his international services, but the player elected to play for Northern Ireland.

Black, who scored two of the goals in that dramatic 3-2 win at Derby back in May, has also attracted the attention of several clubs and was linked with us before last season's transfer deadline. So far though Luton have hung on to him.

Another popular figure at Kenilworth Road is Alec Chamberlain, the former Colchester and Everton goalkeeper who performed consistently well as an ever-

Bought from Dundee United, where he had been understudy to Scottish international pair David Narey and Paul Hegarty, Beaumont has developed into a solid performer alongside former Oxford player John Dreyer in the centre of defence.

Former England international Steve Williams provides Luton with a wealth of experience in midfield where extra responsibility has fallen on his shoulders since Danny Wilson left for Sheffield Wednesday in the summer.

But around Beaumont, Dreyer and Williams, Luton are relying on talented youngsters like Marvin Johnson, Cerl Hughes, Kurt Nogan, Richard Harvey and Paul Gray to make an impact.

Gager was as strong and reliable a centre half as any club could wish for. A fine clubman he was the foundation of Forest's defence for many seasons, flanked by Burkitt and Morley.

Horace began his football with Vauxhall Motors before being signed by Luton Town where he immediately established himself. Signed by Forest in February 1948 he slotted straight into defence and over the next six seasons missed only a handful of games and was ever present during Forest's Division Three (South) championship in 1950-51.

Gager played on to the age of 37 before moving aside for another great pivot who was to take over Horace's

mantle over the following years, Bob McKinlay.

JOHN GALLEY (Centre forward)

Moving to the City Ground in December, 1972, he scored on his debut but struggled to make a lasting impression, spent a short period on loan with Peterborough before transferring to Hereford in December, 1974.

John is still connected with the club, helping his wife Elizabeth look after our young players' accommodation.

TOMMY GAYNOR (Forward)

An outstanding goal against Huddersfield in the League Cup in 1989 would rate among some of Forest's best ever.

TOMMY GEMMELL (Full back)

Debut v. Arsenal (h) 1-1, 27.12.71.
FL 39 (6), FAC 1, FLC 1, CC 1.

Tommy Gemmell was one of the most influential Scottish players of the late sixties. He won everything the Scottish game had to offer during his days with Glasgow Celtic. Possessed a thunderbolt shot which brought him goals in two European cup finals against Inter Milan and Feyenoord.

Gemmell joined Forest in December, 1971 in the twilight of his career. The move south proved unsuccessful and at the end of the 1972-73 season he was granted a free transfer and returned north to join Dundee. Capped 18 times by Scotland, he also represented the Scottish football league eight times.

Won a League Cup winners medal v. Southampton in 1979 but injury forced him to miss the European Cup final v. Malmoe.



TOMMY GEMMILL

The Archie Gemmill story began with Scottish junior club Drumchapel, prior to joining St. Mirren. His first football league club was Preston, where he spent three seasons, before joining Derby, where he won two championship winning medals, the second in 1975 as captain.

Capped 43 times by Scotland, it came as something of a shock when he moved to Birmingham City in August, 1979.

After Birmingham he spent a short period with Wigan Athletic before returning to the Baseball Ground where he finished his playing career. Also played in the USA with Jacksonville. Now a valued member of the coaching staff at the City Ground.

CHARLIE GEORGE (Inside forward)


Spent two months here on loan from Southampton, during which time he played in both games against Barcelona in the 1980 Super Cup.

The evidential effect of such a video recording has proved formidable. It has persuaded hooligans, who would previously have sought to challenge or evade evidence of identification, to plead guilty. Hooligans know cameras are keeping a roving watch and their activities in the ground are inhibited by that knowledge."


