

Losing the traditional atmosphere

Dear Sir

I am writing to express my agreement with Clifford Saunders' letter in the Aston Villa programme concerning the Taylor Report and in particular his recommendations for all-seater stadia.

Once again the ordinary supporter has not been consulted as to whether he or she favours an all-seater stadium. At present supporters vote with their feet' in that around 50 still prefer to stand and this is surely no insignificant minority.

One argument frequently advanced is that many stadia abroad are all-seater but this is simply not correct. Apart from Italy where the World Cup stadia were rebuilt at an extravagant cost, very few grounds abroad are all-seater. In Germany for example, only the Olympic Stadium in Berlin qualifies and many of the seats are benches.

I fear that the traditional atmosphere will be lost in our football grounds in favour of a sanitised so-called family atmosphere unless some sort of opposition is carried out to the Taylor Report. After all, we do live in a supposed era of consumer choice but it seems that this will be denied to football supporters.

Incidentally, I myself normally prefer to set at matches but I do recognise the case for those who wish to stand.

GUINNESS TRIUMPH SWEEPS CLICHES ASIDE

IAIN IN TRIM FORM

A warm welcome to Kenilworth Road this afternoon to Arsenal. I am sure we are in for a good match. Many of our team have been away in Manchester twice this week to take part in the annual Guinness Soccer-Six tournament at where they performed quite brilliantly to reach Wednesday's final in which they clinched the trophy and a cheque for £52,500 with a great 4-0 win over Liverpool.

The players' success was a little tainted for many of us, however, by the continuing and predictable suggestions that our synthetic surface here gave us an advantage. We have heard all the cliches before about "plastic experts" and so on and I felt David Preece was absolutely right on Monday night when he was interviewed after our play-off victory over Derby.

David was asked all the usual questions about the plastic pitch advantage and replied by saying that he did not think the surface at the G-Mex was anything like our synthetic surface, but rather more like the car park at Kenilworth Road!

Some of the commentators should have known better too - particularly as they played here recently - and it was, frankly, tiresome to hear the same old inaccuracies. We won the tournament

fair and square with superior football over two highly competitive nights.

The truth is, of course, that if you can play football, you can play on any surface. No-one would ever suggest that Pele's ability was affected by playing on different surfaces, including the sandy pitches of the Copacabana, and likewise the skilful modern player can play just as well on all the surfaces and conditions which face him.

David, of course, showed exemplary skill and conduct on Monday night when they beat Coventry 2-0, with both goals from Iain Dowie, drew 1-1 with Tottenham, with a goal from Lars Elstrup, and then beat Derby 1-0 with a goal from David. On Wednesday, we beat Charlton, the holders 3-1, Manchester United 4-3 and then Liverpool in the final with Sean Farrell supplying four goals, David three, Lars two and one each from Iain and Julian James.

David ended up being voted as player of the night and thoroughly deserved it. It was very satisfying for everyone, particularly as the tournament was without Paul Gascoigne and Gary Lineker, two of the players whose image was used most heavily in the advertising and marketing of Soccer-Six.

Their absence through injury struck

me particularly as we had been called by the organisers the previous week to be told that the schedule for Monday night's games was being changed to ensure Tottenham fitted in with the broadcast television package.

Our own 10-man squad was a strong one, and included a majority of first team players as requested. For the record, our players were: Andy Petterson, David Preece, Iain Dowie, Lars Elstrup, Julian James, Kingsley Black, Richard Harvey, John Dreyer, Sean Farrell and David Beaumont.

We were unable to take any of our trio of Welsh under-21 players, Ceri Hughes, Jason Rees and Kurt Nogan, with us because they were away on international duty this week. It says much for the Welsh management that they appreciated Jim Ryan's decision to support their unscheduled friendly fixture and, in turn, sent Ceri home immediately on Tuesday when he pulled a groin in training.

Clearly Terry Yorath believed in

repaying one generous gesture with another by giving Ceri every chance of making a recovery in time to play today. Ceri, of course, wanted to represent his country, but Terry pulled him out in consideration to his club.

Youth

We have also had three other younger boys away recently at Lilleshall for an England youth get-together. Lee Rogers, Matthew Holtham and Paul Hancock will all have learned from the experience which of course reflected well on the club.

Our young players are vital to our future as everyone knows and it is always a happy duty to congratulate a young player when he has been selected to win representative honours by his country. We have several young players who now fall into this category as well as some senior men who have played at full international level and this is a sure sign that the club is in good health out on the pitch where it all matters.






The police can then record what occurs on colour video and on hard copy prints. Individuals can be picked out by facial appearance and the colour of their clothing. The evidential effect of such a video recording has proved formidable. It has persuaded hooligans, who would previously have sought to challenge oral evidence of identification, to plead guilty. Hooligans know cameras are keeping a roving watch and their activities in the ground are inhibited by that knowledge."



This afternoon we welcome the players and officials of Arsenal to Kenilworth Road. As one of the oldest and most respected of clubs in Britain, they need little introduction to regular followers of football, writes Luke Nicoli.

The disappointment felt at Highbury last summer at Arsenal's failure to mount a serious Championship challenge at the end of season 1989-90, prompted manager George Graham to make three major signings to bolster his squad. David Seaman was signed from Q.P.R., Anders Limpar was signed from Italian club Cremonese, and Andy Linighan was signed from Norwich.

Arsenal are the only team to remain unbeaten in Division One this season. Away from home, Arsenal have put together some impressive results beating Wimbledon, Nottingham Forest, Manchester United and Q.P.R. They have also picked up draws at Everton, Leeds and Crystal Palace. These results gave the Gunners their best start to a season for 43 years.

Arsenal were formed in 1886 by the workers at the Royal Arsenal, Woolwich, playing under the name of Dial Square. Playing their home games at Plumstead Common, they were given their first set of strip by

Nottingham Forest. It was coloured red, and the club became known as Woolwich Arsenal Reds. In 1913 they moved to Highbury and became Arsenal F.C.

George Graham, the current manager of Arsenal, is the club's ninth post-war manager in a list which includes such names as Tom Whittaker, Billy Wright, Bertie Mee and Don Howe. The Gunners' Championship triumph in 1989 was their ninth. They had previously won the trophy in 1931, 1933, 1934, 1935, 1938, 1948, 1953 and 1971. They have also finished runners-up three times and won the FA Cup five times and been beaten finalists six times.

Two weeks ago, the Gunners were in action in a London derby match at Loftus Road against Q.P.R. Three goals in the final twelve minutes by Paul Merson, Alan Smith and Kevin Campbell gave Arsenal a 3-1 victory and kept them in touch with Division One pacesetters Liverpool. The Arsenal team for that match, their last away from home was: Seaman, Dixon, Winterburn, Thomas, Bould, Adams (O'Leary), Groves (Campbell), Davis, Smith, Merson, Limpar. A few days later, of course, Manchester United beat them 6-2 in the in the Littlewoods Cup, a setback they overcame in style by beating Liverpool 3-0 last Sunday.

OFF THE RECORD

FEATURING...DAVID MOSS

At the age of 16 David Moss had the choice of joining either Swindon or Oxford but despite having played for Oxfordshire Youth and having been born in the county he decided to "go over the border" and opted for his childhood favourites Swindon Town, writes club statistician Roger Wash.

After working his way through the ranks he made his league debut at home to Hull in January 1972 before becoming a regular in 1973/74 just in time to see Swindon relegated to Division Three.

During the next four seasons he regularly finished as top goalscorer for Swindon from his position on the wing and with several clubs beginning to take notice David Pleat nipped in ahead of Stoke City to bring Moss to Kenilworth Road during the close season of 1978.

"I well remember making my Luton debut at home to Oldham in August 1978 as I was one of seven players making their first appearance that day. I also recall scoring twice in the 6-1 win," said David.

"That first season was a bit of a struggle for Luton and after the turn of the year I was never fully fit due to a pelvic problem. As I was regarded as having the ability to turn games, I played on when I probably should not have done but I do remember coming on as substitute in a crucial game at Preston towards the end of the season with Luton being 2-0 down, laying on the Town's first goal and then scoring probably my best ever goal for the equaliser."

After the traumas of David's first season things began to look up as David Pleat's team started to take shape and after two narrow failures promotion to Division One was achieved at the end of 1981/82.

IT HAPPENED.....

FIVE YEARS AGO (7/12/85) Goals from Mick Harford and Mark North with his first league goal for the club secured a 2-0 home win over Newcastle which pushed the Town up to seventh.

TEN YEARS AGO (13/12/80) In a memorable game, goals from David Moss with two, Lil Fuccillo and Codfrey Ingram gave the Town a 4-2 home victory against Preston. This was Fuccillo's first game back after two years out through injury.

FIFTEEN YEARS AGO (3/12/75) With the threat of the club about to fold uppermost on the minds of most supporters the players ignored the pressure and won 5-1 at Charlton!

TWENTY YEARS AGO (12/12/70) A solitary Mike Keen goal was sufficient to gain victory at Watford and maintain the Town's promotion push from Division Two. The game was watched by a crowd of 24,456.

"We had a great squad around that time. I fondly remember such players as Ricky Hill who was a joy to watch and work with, Bob Hatton who helped turn Brian Stein into the player he became, Brian Horton for his leadership qualities and Kirk Stephens who made the transition from non-league football to Division One look easy.

"The promotion season and the one that followed were definitely highlights of my career with the game at Liverpool early in 1982/83 probably the best I appeared in as we played them off the park and were unlucky to come away with only one point in a 3-3 draw."

After seven seasons with the Town during which time he had become a true crowd favourite with his mesmerising wing play and the many memorable goals scored, he rejoined Swindon where he made a further four League appearances before retiring.

"I opened up a clothes shop in Swindon but I was always itching to get back into football and when the then Oxford manager Mark Lawrenson asked me to become part time youth coach I jumped at the chance.

"When Brian Horton took over he asked me to go full time which I gladly accepted and I am thoroughly enjoying life at the Manor Ground."

FOR THE RECORD

Continuing our 'football diary' to keep you up to date with the domestic and global game:

Nov 14: Ireland draw 1-1 with England in a European Championship group seven game. Aston Villa's David Platt and Tony Cascariono score the goals. In group two, Scotland draw with Bulgaria in Sofia 1-1. Northern Ireland draw with Austria 0-0 in Vienna and Wales stay top of group five as they defeat Luxembourg 1-0.

Nov 15: Terry Butcher is confirmed as player manager of Coventry City after the board relieve John Sillett of his services.

Bristol Rovers and Port Vale escape punishment after a 15-man flare-up in their Second Division clash the previous weekend.

Peter Reid is confirmed as player-manager at Manchester City. Aston Villa sign Czech international Ivo Stas from Banik Ostrava for £200,000.

Nov 17: The Town stage a great comeback to draw 2-2 with Manchester City at Kenilworth Road after going 2-0 down. John Dreyer scores a controversial last-minute equaliser from the penalty spot.

Liverpool maintain an eight-point lead over Arsenal after a 1-0 victory at Coventry. Arsenal defeat Southampton 4-0.

There are three FA Cup shocks: Chorley beat Bury 2-1. Colchester defeat Reading 2-1 and Leek win at Scarborough 2-0.

Nov 18: Everton draw with Spurs 1-1 in the televised game. John Toshck's job with Real Madrid is on the line after a 2-1 defeat at Valencia. Marseille put in reported £5 million bid for Liverpool's John Barnes.

Nov 20: Bryan Robson's testimonial sees United lose 3-1 to Celtic in front of 42,000 at Old Trafford.

Arsenal and United reject the right to appeal against their points deduction imposed by the FA.

FOCUS ON ARSENAL

David Seaman (goalkeeper): Rotherham born, David joined Arsenal from Q.P.R. in May 1990 for £1.3 million. He made his League debut for Peterborough Utd in 1982 and has since played for Birmingham City and Q.P.R. David is an England international.

Lee Dixon (defender): Lee began his League career with Burnley in 1983 but didn't win a regular place at Turf Moor. After brief spells at Chester City, then at Bury, he was transferred to Stoke City for £40,000 in 1986. He signed for Arsenal in 1988 and is now an England international.

Nigel Winterburn (defender): Nigel made his League debut for Wimbledon in a 2-0 defeat by Bolton in 1983 after unsuccessful spells at Birmingham City and Oxford Utd. His potential was recognised in the Don's side, and after four full seasons at Plough Lane he signed for Arsenal, for £350,000 in 1987.

Tony Adams (defender): Club captain, Tony joined Arsenal as a trainee and worked his way into the senior side, making his debut in a 2-1 defeat by Sunderland in 1983. He has since made over 200 appearances for the Gunners and is an England international.

Steve Bould (defender): Steve made his League debut for Stoke City in 1981 but, before winning a regular place, he went on loan to Torquay United. He eventually made over 180 League appearances for the Potters before signing for Arsenal for £390,000 in 1988.

David O'Leary (defender): Veteran David, has played over 650 games for the Gunners since making his debut v Burnley in 1974. As the club's record appearance holder, his greatest moment came in winning the championship in 1989. He has played for the Republic of Ireland on 53 occasions.

Michael Thomas (midfield): Michael joined Arsenal as a trainee but made his League debut while on loan at Portsmouth in 1987. A former England youth captain, he later won 10 under-21 caps and has now made two appearances for the full England team.

Paul Davis (midfield): Now in his testimonial year at Highbury, Paul can now look back on over 280 League appearances for the Gunners. After two seasons plagued with injury, he has returned to the form which saw his gain a place in the England squad.


David Rocastle (midfield): Another product of the Gunner's youth team, David was introduced to the First Division side in 1985. Almost immediately, he became a member of the England U-21 side and went on to win 13 caps at that level. David made his full England debut v Denmark in 1988.

Anders Limpar (midfield): At present Arsenal's leading scorer, Anders was signed from Cremonese for £1 million this Summer. He started his career with Orgryte in his native country of Sweden, and moved on to the Swiss club Young Boys in 1988. He was transferred to Cremonese a year later. Anders is a Swedish international.

Alan Smith (forward): Alan was on two occasions top scorer at Leicester City before Arsenal signed him for £800,000 in 1987. He made his League debut in a 2-1 defeat by Charlton in 1982. For the past two seasons he has been the Gunners top marksman and in 1989 won the Adidas Golden Boot Award, scoring 23 League goals.

Paul Merson (forward): Paul made his League debut in a 3-0 win v Man City in 1986 and scored three times in his first five appearances for Arsenal. After a loan spell at Brentford, Paul became a first-team regular. He is now an England U-21 international.

Perry Groves (forward): Perry was introduced to League soccer with Colchester United in 1982. After three full seasons at Layer Road he became George Graham's first signing for £75,000 in 1986.
