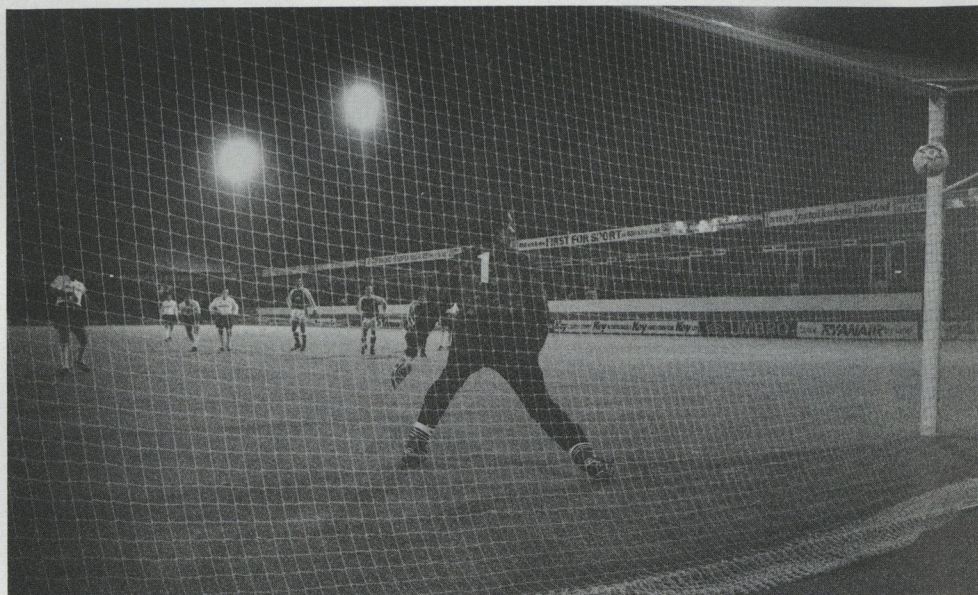

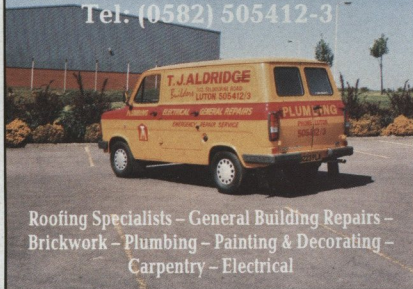

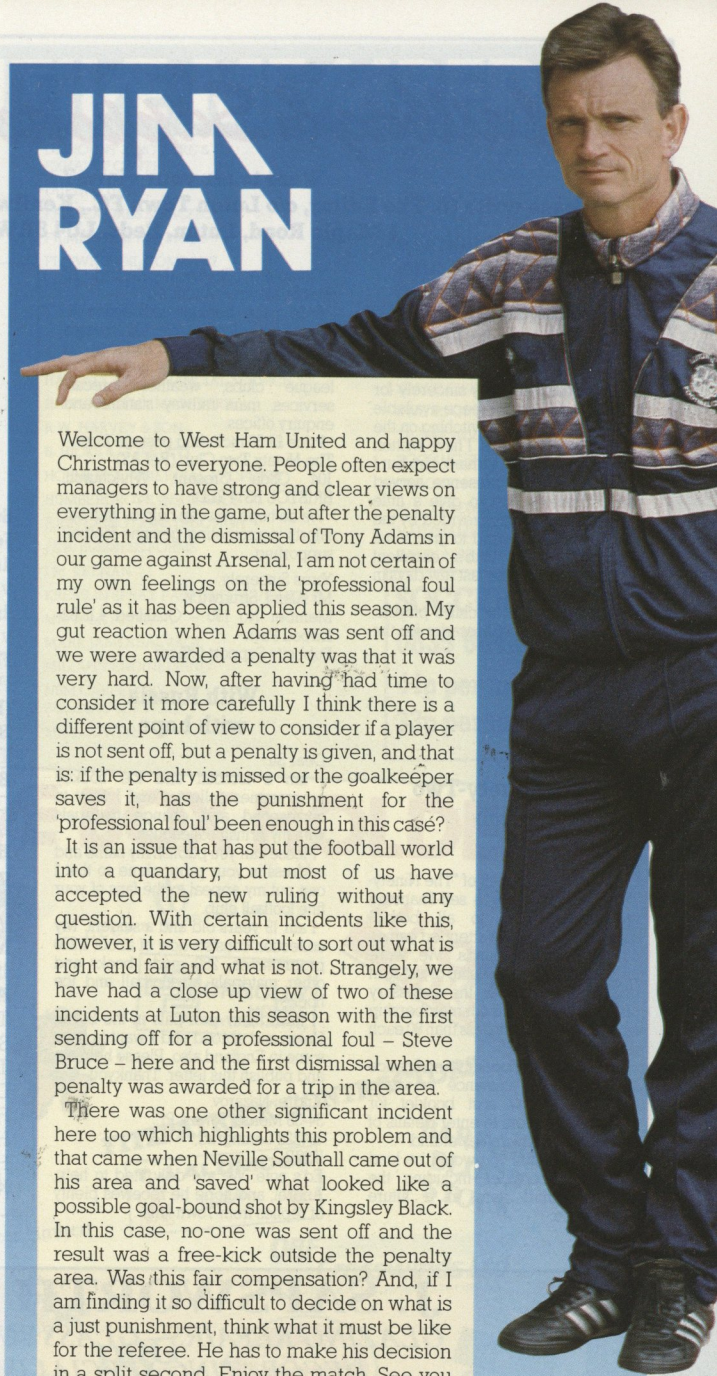

# JIM RYAN



Welcome to West Ham United and happy Christmas to everyone. People often expect managers to have strong and clear views on everything in the game, but after the penalty incident and the dismissal of Tony Adams in our game against Arsenal, I am not certain of my own feelings on the 'professional foul rule' as it has been applied this season. My gut reaction when Adams was sent off and we were awarded a penalty was that it was very hard. Now, after having had time to consider it more carefully I think there is a different point of view to consider if a player is not sent off, but a penalty is given, and that is: if the penalty is missed or the goalkeeper saves it, has the punishment for the 'professional foul' been enough in this case?

It is an issue that has put the football world into a quandary, but most of us have accepted the new ruling without any question. With certain incidents like this, however, it is very difficult to sort out what is right and fair and what is not. Strangely, we have had a close up view of two of these incidents at Luton this season with the first sending off for a professional foul - Steve Bruce - here and the first dismissal when a penalty was awarded for a trip in the area.

There was one other significant incident here too which highlights this problem and that came when Neville Southall came out of his area and 'saved' what looked like a possible goal-bound shot by Kingsley Black. In this case, no-one was sent off and the result was a free-kick outside the penalty area. Was this fair compensation? And, if I am finding it so difficult to decide on what is a just punishment, think what it must be like for the referee. He has to make his decision in a split second. Enjoy the match. See you again on Boxing Day.

## GUESTING POLICY IS IN OUR OWN HANDS

## MEETING UP WITH DJ BEAR

Tonight we warmly welcome West Ham to Kenilworth Road and with them Tim Breacker who gave more than nine years of loyal service here before moving to the Upton Park club earlier this season. We shall all be pleased to see Tim doing well with the Hammers, but not tonight, of course, when we shall be trying to knock them out of this tournament.

The prize for tonight's victors will be a place in the Zenith Data Cup's southern area quarter-finals which are due to take place on Wednesday January 23, 1991.

As a club, we are well aware of the numbers of visiting guests who are in our ground for all our home matches. For our last fixture, at home to Arsenal, for example there were some 2,000, a large number of whom were in the Kenilworth Stand as members' guests.

One of the most frequently voiced misconceptions about our membership system is that we have a ban on visiting supporters. This is not true. It is quite incredible really that after so long there are still many who do not understand the guesting policy and regulations which are part of the membership scheme.

This is understandable with sections of the media, but not among our own members. Surely, all members of the

club know by now that the guesting policy is in the hands of the members and operated by the members. Any abuse of the system is also down to members and the whole thing stands or falls on its members' responsible behaviour.

We do find it unacceptable, however, that there are a number of members who are out touting tickets for financial gain before matches and even selling their membership cards. This sort of thing puts a major question mark over the future of our guesting policy which has been a major source of revenue to the club particularly for the 'big home matches.'

Unfortunately, it all leaves the club in a catch 22 situation: even if we had more than 1,800 guests against Arsenal, the final attendance still fell 1,000 short of capacity. The weather, we think, may have played a part in keeping the gate down to only 12,506, but if we are to stop accepting guests, this could cause a fall in these attendances.

On this subject, I was questioned recently by a journalist from the Sun who asked why we admitted guests for these big matches when we have 25,000 members. He pointed out that it was possible a member could be locked out of the ground if guests, with tickets taken up early, filled the

stadium.

This is, of course, a theoretical question and our gate against Arsenal supplies its own answer. Furthermore, Liverpool, for example, have about 100,000 supporters altogether and, clearly, if they all turned up at once, they could not get in. In our case, as we have said many times, the answers lie with our own members and their behaviour and attendance patterns.

I know some of our fans are concerned at the number of visiting supporters, ie guests of members, who are standing or sitting near them. I can report that against Arsenal we rejected 73 'guests' who arrived at the ground without an escort and without any knowledge of our system. But we cannot remove any bona fide guests of members because they might see wearing red and white scarves.

If the situation remains a difficult one and causes any problems, it may cause a situation in which the guests have to

be segregated from their host members. This would in effect mean the club was operating a visitors scheme.

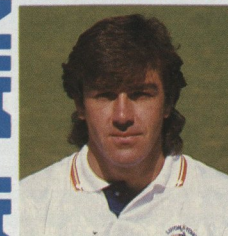
On a different subject, I received a letter referring to youngsters being placed on the front barrier at the Kenilworth Road end of the ground. Unfortunately, the writer did not include his name or address and so I cannot reply personally, but he did raise some interesting points and, as a result, I would like to point out that youngsters are only permitted to sit there when the police and stewards agree it is safe for them to do so.

That means only at selected matches and I am sure it was noticed by my correspondent that at the Arsenal match when we had a lot more than 2,000 to 3,000 in there that the stewards made sure there were no children sitting on the fence. Clearly, however, this is a serious matter and one which I am sure our police have under review.

Since the promotion of Billy Bonds to first team manager, a re-vitalised West Ham side has climbed the Second Division this season in a spell which has seen them break the club's unbeaten run of 19 league matches. They now head the division with more than 40 points and are enjoying crowds not seen at Upton Park since the early 1980's when they constantly finished in the top half of the First Division, *writes Luke Nicoli.*

Comparisons can already be made with the triumphant Leeds United team of last season heading the Second Division table for so long, playing good football and with an abundance of talent, waiting to excel themselves in the top flight. But you can be sure that manager Bonds will have no talk of promotion with only a third of the league season completed, although it will be interesting to see where they finish come May.

The Hammers success this term has been built on a three-man central defence of Colin Foster, Republic of Ireland international Chris Hughton and West Ham stalwart Alvin Martin. This partnership, along with the inventiveness and hard working displays of captain Ian Bishop, and the goalscoring exploits of Frank

McAvennie and Stuart Slater has meant that West Ham leaked just 12 League goals and scored a total of 32 in their opening 19 games.

This Zenith Data Systems first round tie gives the Hammers a yardstick to measure their form against a Division One side; their first of the season. They have shown that recently they have a good cup pedigree and one's mind goes back to their 4-1 demolition of Liverpool in the League Cup after beating Derby County in the previous round in 1988. Only twice in the last six years have the Hammers been eliminated from the FA Cup before the fifth round and memories of their 1980 giant-killing, FA Cup winning act against Arsenal are still fresh in many fans' memories.

That cup victory, as a Second Division side, was their third success after previously winning in 1964 and 1975. They have also won the Division Two Championship in 1958 and 1981 and became European Cup Winners Cup winners in 1965. Mr Bonds, as only the sixth post-war manager at Upton Park, will be aiming this season to put West Ham back in the First Division and to achieve former glories enjoyed by managers such as Ted Fenton, Ron Greenwood and John Lyall. Only time will tell.

# OFF THE RECORD

## FEATURING....JOHN MOORE

Current Luton Town coach John Moore has been connected with the Hatters since he came to Kenilworth Road as a player in May 1965 just as the club had sunk into Division Four for the first time in its history, writes Club Statistician Roger Wash.

"I was playing for Motherwell when Luton scout David Hutchinson, who was a Town player in the 1930's, recommended me to his old friend George Martin who came and signed me without having seen me play," said John.

John joined a club in the doldrums but soon settled down making 43 League appearances and scoring five goals in his first season as the Town narrowly failed to gain promotion at the first attempt.

"I only scored 13 goals in all my career at Luton but in my early days at the club I used to go up for set pieces hence the reasonable record in my first season. In later years I realised that players such as Terry Branston and Chris Nicholl were rather better in such positions so I dropped back and the goal tally dried up," he said.

The first success for John was, of course, the Fourth Division championship season of 1967/68 when he missed only one game and scored four goals including the opener in the 4-0 thrashing of Crewe which clinched the title.

"That was a tremendous night, with nearly 19,000 people at Kenilworth Road to see a Fourth Division game, and a fitting end to a great season. Players such as Terry Branston, who was a marvellous leader, and Bruce Rioch spring readily to mind and if

### IT HAPPENED.....

**FIVE YEARS AGO (21/12/85)** A crowd of 14,599 watched a 0-0 home draw with West Ham. The match was rather better than the scoreline suggested.

**TEN YEARS AGO (19/12/80)** A lone goal from Godfrey Ingram was enough to secure the points in a Division Two encounter at Shrewsbury.

**FIFTEEN YEARS AGO (20/12/75)** Goals from Jim Husband and Andy King paved the way to a 2-1 win at Hull to give the Town their first "double" of the season.

**TWENTY YEARS AGO (19/12/70)** The Town were cruising to victory at Norwich courtesy of a first half goal from Malcolm MacDonald when in the second minute of injury time the Canaries scored from the penalty spot after Jack Bannister had handled. Nevertheless the draw kept Luton in second place in Division Two.

John went on to become a rock at the heart of the Luton defence for another five seasons as the Town were promoted from Division Three and then took the Second Division by storm before consolidating under Harry Haslam.

"I was lucky to be in the same team as such players as Mike Keen, who thought so much more quickly than most of the others on the pitch, Don Givens, another vastly underrated player, and of course, Malcolm Macdonald and John Aston".

When asked about other memorable games John recalled the famous 2-0 win at Newcastle in the F.A. Cup in 1973 which set up a run to the quarter finals.

"The press were full of what Malcolm Macdonald and John Tudor were going to do to us and the majority of the 42,000 crowd at St James's Park were convinced that we were in for a thrashing.

Despite all this we took the game to Newcastle and John Aston scored twice to give us an interval lead which we held until the end. I had one of those games where even if I was lying on the ground the ball kept on hitting me and I was throwing myself all over the place blocking everything Newcastle could hurl at us. Jim Ryan still uses this as a role model for what defending is all about!".

# FOR THE RECORD

Continuing our 'football diary' to keep you up to date with the domestic and global game:

**Nov 28:** Manchester United thrash Arsenal 6-2 at Highbury in a Rumbelows Cup fourth round tie. Other notable scores are Coventry's 5-4 defeat of Nottingham Forest and Aston Villa's 3-2 victory over Middlesborough.

**Dec 1:** Lars Elstrup's fine scoring run continues as he scores two goals in the Town's 2-2 draw at Nottingham Forest. Both are "gems" says Jim Ryan.

In Scotland, Rangers defeat Hearts 4-0 to go top of the Premier League for the first time this season.

**Dec 2:** The gap at the top of Division One is reduced to three points as Arsenal defeat Liverpool 3-0 at Highbury in a televised game.

**Dec 3:** Nottingham Forest have a £1.2 million bid for Barnsley defender Carl Tiler turned down. Tony Meola, Watford's US World Cup goalkeeper, is released from his contract.

**Dec 4:** Bryan Robson is named captain of the England B squad to face Algeria in a friendly.

**Dec 5:** The Town win the Guinness Soccer Six tournament in Manchester, defeating Liverpool 4-0 in the final. David Preece, Julian James, Lars Elstrup and Sean Farrell score the goals. It is a convincing victory for the players' skilful attacking football.

England U-21's draw 0-0 in a friendly with Wales. Kurt Nogan has a goal disallowed for Wales who also included Jason Rees in their line-up for the match played at Tranmere.

**Dec 8:** Tony Adams is sent off as Arsenal hold the Town to a 1-1 draw at Kenilworth Road. The England defender is dismissed for a foul on Iain Dowie which led to penalty. John Dreyer scored from the spot to equalise Arsenal's opening goal headed in by Alan Smith.

# FOCUS ON WEST HAM UNITED

**Ludek Miklosko (goalkeeper):** Czechoslovakian international, Ludek joined West Ham last season as a replacement for Allen McKnight. A member of his country's squad at Italia '90, he has grown in confidence and has been an ever-present this season.

**Tim Breacker (defender):** Bicester-born, Tim needs no introduction. He made his debut for Luton in a 3-0 defeat at Ipswich in 1984. From that point onwards, he established himself as a first team regular at Kenilworth Road and can look back on more than 200 league appearances for the Town. West Ham signed him for £600,000 earlier this season.

**George Parris (defender):** An attacking defender, George joined West Ham as an apprentice and made his league debut in a 3-0 defeat v Liverpool in 1985. Since 1986, George has become a regular fixture in the Hammer' line-up.

**Colin Foster (defender):** Colin started his career at Leyton Orient where he made over 170 League appearances before signing for Nottingham Forest in 1986. After three seasons at Forest, he signed for West Ham in a £250,000 deal.

**Alvin Martin (defender):** Alvin has been with the Hammers since a youth and first appeared in their league eleven during 1977/8. A former England youth international, he later played for England 'B' and the Under-21s and has 17 full caps.

**Chris Hughton (defender):** West Ham-born, Chris was a regular member of the Spurs side which was so successful during the early 1980's. He joined Tottenham as a trainee and made his debut v Man City in 1979. After the signing of Pat Van Den Hauwe, Chris made only occasional appearances for Spurs but has since flourished in the colours of West Ham.

**Ian Bishop (midfield):** Club captain, Ian has emerged as West Ham's outstanding player so far this season. He turned professional with Everton and first played league soccer on loan to Crewe in 1984. His career took off at Bournemouth after a spell at Carlisle. Man City signed Ian for £750,000 in 1988, but a year later he joined West Ham.

**Kevin Keen (midfield):** Kevin made his league debut in 1986 v Liverpool, and quickly impressed as an attacking midfielder player. He became a first-team regular the following season and has now made more than 80 League appearance for the club.

**Frank McAvennie (forward):** Frank led St Mirren's scoring list in his first season (1981/2) and maintained such an impressive record that West Ham paid £300,000 for him in 1985. He enjoyed further success in his first season at Upton Park, scoring 28 goals. After two seasons with Celtic he joined West Ham for £700,000 in 1989.

**Stuart Slater (forward):** Now forging an impressive partnership with McAvennie, Stuart made his debut as an 18-year old in 1987 in the Hammers 1-1 draw at Derby County. This season Stuart has been a regular in the West Ham line-up.

**Trevor Morley (forward):** Trevor began his career at Corby Town, then became a reserve team player at Derby before returning to non-league soccer with Nuneaton. He finally made his league debut for Northampton in 1985 and became a prolific scorer for the Cobblers. He signed for Man City in 1987, but signed for the Hammers two years later.

**Jimmy Quinn (forward):** Much-travelled, Jimmy made his league debut for Swindon Town in 1982 and has since played for Blackburn Rovers, Leicester, a second spell at Swindon and Bradford City. He has made more than 250 League appearances and scored more than 80 League goals.
