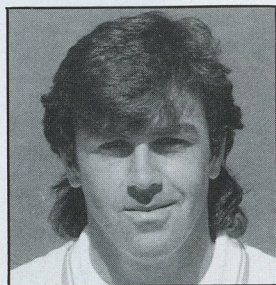

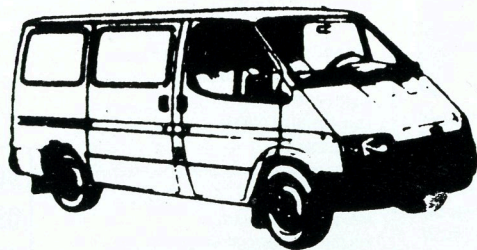

BARCLAYS LEAGUE TO INVITE ITALIAN LEAGUE BACK FOR RETURN FIXTURE

Barclays Football League president William Fox has formally extended an invitation to the Italian League to play a return match in England next season, following the success of the fixture between the two sides in the San Paolo stadium in Naples earlier this month. The Italian League won the match 3-0.

Despite the disappointing scoreline from the Barclays League's point of view, the game launched a new era in Anglo-Italian relations and proved to be an excellent bridge-building exercise. The Barclays League side was accompanied by a number of the game's most prominent figures, demonstrating the league's determination that the official party should play an ambassadorial role in Italy.

The legendary Tom Finney, Tom Pendry MP, chairman of the parliamentary all-party football committee, PFA chief executive Gordon Taylor and former World Cup referee Jack Taylor were all included in the party.

The Barclays Football League are now working towards finding a protected date for the game and this will be built into the fixture programme for next season.

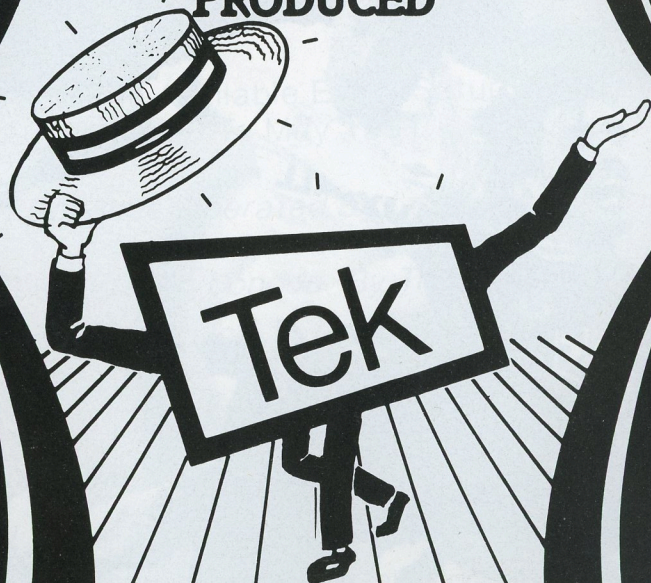

CUP-TIE ARRANGEMENTS ARE GREAT SUCCESS

IAIN HEADS FOR A CAP!

Welcome to Queen's Park Rangers and our second successive Saturday home match following last weekend's FA Cup tie against West Ham. At the time of writing, the outcome of our replay at Upton Park on Wednesday night is unknown as the teams met again for the right to entertain Crewe Alexandra.

I was pleased with the arrangements, if not the result, of last Saturday's all-ticket tie against West Ham. We had 12,087 for the match and if it was disappointing not to have a complete compacity sellout it was good to know that the afternoon was a peaceful and happy one without any incidents.

All-ticket arrangements always have some effect on the attendance and it is also worth recording that there were 4,123 people at Upton Park to watch the tie on a giant diamond screen thanks to our 'beam-back' organised for the day. That made a total attendance of more than 16,000 which is well above the capacity for Kenilworth Road.

The whole day was an excellent exercise in terms of safety and I do not think either club involved was over disappointed to learn that the Upton Park attendance was narrowly beneath the break-even level, leaving us to share a deficit of £1,500 between us.

Finally, while on the subject of last week's cup-tie, it is interesting to note that we made the toss for a potential second replay venue last Saturday night and came out winners. This is a big change from arrangements a few years ago when such decisions were made on the night of the first replay.

As a result of the replay, much thought has had to be given to fixture arrangements over the next few weeks and in particular the Zenith Data Systems Cup tie at Chelsea. This is now virtually certain to go ahead on February 18 at Stamford Bridge.

On the playing side, it was very good to be notified this week of the selection of four of our current first team squad for their national squads: Kingsley Black and Ian Dowie having been picked for Northern Ireland's meeting with Poland; and Jason Rees and Mark Pembroke for Wales matches against England at B level and the Republic of Ireland at senior level.

The early recognition for Mark is obviously a great encouragement to him and all the other promising young players we have at Kenilworth Road. Further good news is that Richard Harvey has signed a new two and a half years contract with the club.

The Town responded with a spirited second-half performance but no luck in front of goal except when, after 71 minutes, Kingsley Black converted a deep free-kick by Steve Williams.

This afternoon we welcome the players and officials of Queens Park Rangers to Kenilworth Road. After a high league placing and a good FA Cup run last season, Rangers are currently struggling in the lower reaches of the First Division this term.

Long term injuries to key defenders such as England's Paul Parker and Northern Ireland's Alan McDonald has taken the backbone of Rangers defence away. This has inevitably been reflected in their poor defensive record. They have leaked a total of 42 league goals, and are currently placed 19th with just 18 league points. To stem Rangers' ominous slide down the table, head coach Don Howe has recently introduced two new defenders to the squad. Andy Tillson was signed from Grimsby and Darren Peacock was bought from Hereford Utd for a combined fee of £650,000.

Rangers can gain some consolation from the continuing fine goalscoring form of former Town favourite Roy Wegerle. At the time of writing, Roy has scored 14 league goals, which makes him Division One's top scorer. The introduction of former Wimbledon boss Bobby Gould as assistant coach means the successful Howe/Gould partnership at

Plough Lane has been re-established. Formed in 1885, Rangers have had more grounds than any other league club-12 altogether - and have played individual home matches at two further venues. They were formed as a result of a merger between two west London clubs, namely St Jude's and Christchurch Rangers. Queen's Park was the district most of the players inhabited, and they became known as Queens Park Rangers. Currently head coach at Loftus Road, Don Howe has had 14 predecessors since the war, including such names as Alec Stock, Tommy Docherty, Dave Sexton and Terry Venables. Rangers have won the Football League Cup on one occasion in 1967. They have also won the Division Two championship in 1983 and the Division Three title in 1967.

Two weeks ago, Rangers were in action at Loftus Road v Manchester United. A goal by Mark Falco seemingly put Ranger's on course for their first home victory of the year until Mike Phelan equalised with just eight minutes remaining. The Rangers side for that game was: Stejskal, Bardsley, Sansom, Tillson, Peacock, Maddix, Wilkins, Barker, Falco, Ferdinand, Sinton. Subs: Wilson, Meaker.

OFF THE RECORD

FEATURING....BOB HATTON

Generally regarded as one of footballs "nomads" Bob Hatton turned out for no less than ten clubs in his career including two seasons with Luton as David Pleat's young team came of age *writes club statistician Roger Wash*.

Bob Hatton started out with Wolves and scored seven goals in only ten appearances as the Wanderers fought their way out of Division two in 1966/67. Now, readily admitting to being impatient and headstrong he felt he warranted a regular first team place with the upshot that a move to Bolton in March 1967 saw him get his wish.

His next transfer came a year later when he went to Northampton and crossed paths with Luton Town for the first time. "I well remember the game against Luton on Boxing Day 1968 played on a rock-hard pitch and settled by two great goals from Bruce Rioch one of which must have been a contender for "goal of the season" when he volleyed home from outside the box."

Bob only lasted one season at Northampton before he moved up a division to play for Carlisle scoring a creditable thirty eight goals in ninety-three appearances and playing a large part in what was then a very good and entertaining side as borne out by a 3-3 draw at a rainsoaked Kenilworth Road in 1970.

By now a proven and sought after goalscorer Bob was seen as the final piece in the Birmingham City jigsaw in the club's attempt to get back into Division One. A big fee took him to St Andrews in October 1971.

"We had a good side at Birmingham at the time and during the period I was there (1971-1976) the

average home crowd was around 36,000. I can recall scoring the winner for "Blues" in the last minute against Luton at St Andrews during our promotion season in front of a crowd of 34,000". So can I Bob.

Another move came in 1976, this time to Blackpool, and after their unfortunate relegation two years later David Pleat, just about to embark on his first full season as Luton manager came sniffing around.

"David was looking for a tried and tested product to score goals and I appeared to fit the bill. He agreed that I could commute from Birmingham and although the travelling was sometimes hard my time at Luton was highly enjoyable."

It was put to Bob that he was instrumental in the "making" of Brian Stein in much the same way that Jesse Pye had taken Gordon Turner under his wing a generation before but typical of his modesty he maintained that Stein would have made it to the top on his own.

"Brian had the ability to turn on a sixpence, was deceptively fast and was able to put his body between defender and ball in such a way that he was difficult to knock off the ball. We had other good players like David Moss who had such good vision, but the success of the team was really down to David Pleat who was the best manager I played under in terms of coaching ability and innovation."

Two years at Sheffield United followed by one season at Cardiff saw an end to his career but his final club came five months after retirement when he was asked to play one game for Dundalk in the Irish Cup!

Bob now works as a financial consultant in Birmingham and regularly goes to St Andrews where he holds a season ticket.

The Town draw 1-1 against West Ham with Kingsley Black equalising in the second half.

Millwall and Sheffield Wednesday draw 4-4 in a thriller at the Den, while Norwich come from behind to beat nine-man Swindon 3-1. The Robins have two players sent off.

Jan 27: Arsenal and Leeds draw 0-0 but Everton beat Woking 1-0.

FOCUS ON QUEENS PARK RANGERS

Jan Skejskal (goalkeeper): Czechoslovakian international, Jan was an ever-present for his country during last summer's World Cup finals in Italy. Although he signed for Rangers almost immediately after the finals, he had to wait until October before he could come to England, making his League debut in a 3-2 victory at Leeds.

David Bardsley (defender): Manchester born, David was an England youth international during his early years at Blackpool. He was transferred to Watford in 1983 and played for the Hornets in their 2-0 FA Cup final defeat v Everton. Oxford signed him in 1987 but he moved on to Rangers in the early weeks of the 1988/89 season.

Kenny Sansom (defender): Kenny was England's regular left back for almost a decade, winning 86 caps. He first graduated to international duty during his Crystal Palace days and he was valued at £1 million when he joined Arsenal in 1980. After making more than 300 league appearances for the Gunners, he signed for Newcastle in 1988. He returned to London just nine months later to join QPR.

Danny Maddix (defender): Danny started his career at Tottenham but did not play in their senior side. He made his league debut on loan to Southend in 1986, but moved to QPR the following season. Danny has recently returned to the side after a cartilage injury.

Andy Tillson (defender): Huntingdon born, Andy started his career playing non-league football for Conference league side Kettering Town. He signed for Grimsby in 1988, making his debut in a 4-1 defeat at Cambridge Utd. An ever present in the Mariners side for the last two seasons, Rangers signed him for £450,000 in December.

Darren Peacock (defender): Darren started his career at the now defunct Newport County, making his debut in a 2-0 defeat at Plymouth in 1985. After five seasons at Somerton Park he moved to Hereford United, but after only one season he moved to QPR for £150,000.

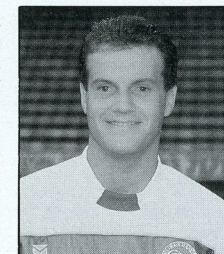
Ray Wilkins (midfield): Ray started his career at Chelsea, making his debut in 1973. After five seasons at Stamford Bridge he moved to Manchester United for £750,000. For many years he was a regular in the England set-up, winning 84 caps. AC Milan signed him for £1,350,000 in 1984, but he returned to the UK in 1987 with Glasgow Rangers. He signed for QPR in 1989.

Simon Barker (midfield): Simon earned a reputation as a goalscoring midfielder player with Blackburn, topping their scoring list with 18 league goals in 1986/7. He was capped by the England under-21's on four occasions before signing for QPR in 1988.

Andy Sinton (midfield): Newcastle born, Andy started his career at Cambridge United as a youngster and made 102 league appearances before moving to Brentford in 1985. He gained a reputation as a hard working, skilful player at Brentford before signing for Rangers for £350,000 in 1989.

Roy Wegerle (forward): Roy became Rangers' first £1 million player when he joined them from the Town in December 1989. He was playing for Tampa Bay in the USA when he was recommended to Chelsea. After only occasional appearances for the Blues he signed for the Town and was top-scorer in 1988/89.

Mark Falco (forward): Mark made his name with Tottenham, making his debut v Bolton Wanderers in 1979. After leading their scoring list for two seasons, Spurs surprisingly sold him to Watford in 1986. He was top scorer too at Vicarage Road, but after only one season he moved to Glasgow Rangers. He was at Ibrox for only a few weeks before moving to QPR for £375,000 in 1988.
