





Wales of Mark Pembridge to be on stand-by for Terry Yorath's full international squad. Mark's promotion shows the great progress which can be made by our younger players.


I hope that by the time this afternoon's fixture kicks off we shall have agreed a new three-year contract with Mark and, just as important, a new two-year deal with Alec Chamberlain. In addition, we are also in discussions with our skipper John Dreyer on a new deal.

As a club, we are well aware of our league position. Easter is always an important landmark in the season for league positions and we are, at least, in a better position this year than last as we enter the final run-in with six matches to go.

At the AGM, discussion took place surrounding ground development and visitors for next season. These are clearly important subjects to all concerned with the club and progress on both issues will depend greatly on the amount of Grant Aid there is available from the Football Trust. These decisions will determine the future direction of the club and will be one of the major subjects to be discussed in future home programmes.







Wimbledon have once again surprised a few people by moving into the top eight of the First Division table. The Dons, who come to Kenilworth Road on April 13, have achieved that position mainly due to some outstanding away performances. At the time of writing they have only lost four League games, bettered only by League leaders Arsenal.

Wimbledon recieved a huge blow last summer with the resignation of manager Bobby Gould but they swiftly found a replacement in former Town boss Ray Harford. Two key players also left Plough Lane during the summer, midfielder Dennis Wise moved to Chelsea, while centre back Eric Young joined neighbouring Crystal Palace.

The only incoming transfer saw the arrival of midfielder Warren Barton, a £300,000 purchase from Maidstone. Barton along with other such influential players as leading scorer John Fashanu, Keith Curle and Paul McGee will be helping to push Wimbledon towards a European place next season with another three League points.

Come to Kenilworth Road on April 13 to see the Town return to winning ways and hopefully avoid a relegation fight as the season comes to a close.




Already, CCTV has had a major impact on the hooligan problem inside football grounds as well as proving extremely useful to monitor safety measures. If any trouble appears on the screen or is reported from any quarter of the ground, the CCTV can zoom in on the incident. The police can then record what occurs on colour video and on hard copy prints. Individuals can be picked out by facial appearance and the colour of their clothing. The evidential effect of such a video recording has proved formidable. It has persuaded hooligans, who would previously have sought to challenge oral evidence of identification, to plead guilty. Hooligans know cameras are keeping a roving watch and their activities in the ground are inhibited by that knowledge."

This afternoon we welcome the players and officials of Tottenham Hotspur to Kenilworth Road for today's Barclays League Division One match writes *Luke Nicoll*.

Tottenham have proved they have the quality to win the game's top prizes. On their day they have outplayed many of the country's top teams and have done it with style. What Tottenham have suffered from this season, is a lack of consistency. After a fine start to the season, Spurs began to lose their way over the Christmas period, managing to win only once in six League attempts. This inevitably dented their championship hopes, and they are currently placed ninth in the First Division table.

The remainder of Tottenham's season rests in the FA Cup. They meet arch rivals and cup favourites Arsenal in the semi-final at Wembley in two weeks time. This game has proved to be a race against time for midfield maestro Paul Gascoigne, who has starred in all of Tottenham's FA Cup games so far this season. A hernia operation after the tie against Notts County means he could miss the game. They will be looking to the excellent goalscoring form of Gary Lineker and the consistent goalkeeping displays of Erik Thorstvedt to hopefully give Tottenham their

eighth FA Cup win.

Tottenham Hotspur were formed in 1882 by a group of cricketers. They formed Hotspur F.C. and played on public pitches at Tottenham marshes until 1887. The club chose Hotspur as their name after Shakespeare's Harry Hotspur, a character based on an ancestor of the Northumberland family, landowners in the Tottenham area at the time. As the team turned professional they moved ground to Northumberland Park, but this ground was closed down when Spurs fans invaded the pitch and assaulted three Luton Town players! They soon moved to White Hart Lane, where they have remained ever since.

Tottenham are one of the most successful teams in the Football League. They won the First Division title in 1951 and 1961, the Division Two championship in 1920 and 1950, the League Cup in 1971 and 1973, the European Cup Winners Cup in 1963 and the UEFA Cup in 1984. They have also won the FA Cup on seven occasions, a record held jointly with Aston Villa, the latest victory coming in 1982.

The last away game Tottenham played was at Aston Villa. They lost 3-2 with the consolation goals coming from Vinny Samways and Paul Allen.

OFF THE RECORD

TURNERS LATE WINNER

After 70 years of trying Luton Town finally made it into Division One by finishing as runners up to Birmingham City at the end of 1954/55 writes club statistician Roger Wash.

The towns first game in the top flight was at the Valley against Charlton and on a stifling hot day watched by a crowd of 28,800 a tense struggle developed. Charlton had not won since mid-February and were obviously anxious to get off on the right foot while the Town were out to prove that they were not in their rightful place.

Goalkeeper Ron Baynham was injured when bravely throwing himself at the feet of Stuart Leary in order to prevent a certain goal and had to leave the field for a short time. Soon after his return ace marksman Gordon Turner scored the Towns first Division One goal when he turned in a centre from full back Bud Aherne.

Leary obtained the equaliser in the time added on at the end of the first half for Baynham's injury with Jimmy Gauld putting the home side ahead in the 55th minute.

Luton plugged away and eventually got the draw their play deserved when Peter MacEwan beat future Town manager Sam Bartram with a "fine drive" with 18 minutes left.

The next assignment was a mid-week away trip to Preston where the Town were desperately unlucky to come away with a 2-1 defeat after leading by a MacEwan goal at half-time. Chiltern in the "Luton News" wrote "As a sample of the bad luck in finishing there is evidence of the woodwork being struck on three separate occasions.

IT HAPPENED.....

FIVE YEARS AGO (1/4/86) Goals from Mike Newell, Mick Harford and Ricky Hill secured an easy 3-0 home win over West Bromwich Albion.

TEN YEARS AGO (4/4/81) A 3-1 defeat at Sheffield Wednesday virtually killed the Towns hopes of promotion from Division Two. Godfrey Ingram scored the solitary Luton goal.

FIFTEEN YEARS AGO (3/4/76) The Towns fourth consecutive 3-0 away defeat - this time at Blackburn.

TWENTY YEARS AGO (3/4/71) A classic game at Kenilworth Road against promotion rivals Birmingham saw the visitors take an early 2-0 lead before the Town fought back to eventually win 3-2.

Two goals from Viv Busby and one from Alan Slough secured the win before a crowd of 25,172.

At last came the great day - the first home game in Division One and what better opponents than near neighbours Tottenham against whom we had enjoyed so many titanic struggles in the past.

Mike Cullen who had been refused a transfer request the previous week was preferred to Arthur Taylor while Reg Pearce making only his second Football League appearance found himself in the side in place of the injured Roy Davies.

Luton had all the early play and it came as a great surprise when John Cavin headed home a centre from Tony Marchi to put the visitors ahead in the 17th minute. The goal inspired Tottenham and from a free-kick taken with power by Alf Stokes the ball rebounded into play some thirty yards after hitting a post.

Despite all the scares the score remained unchanged at half-time and in the second period the Town took the game to Tottenham and were finally rewarded when George Cummins equalised after 54 minutes taking a pass from MacEwan and leaving Ted Ditchburn helpless with a low cross shot.

From then on the game was end to end with both sides missing reasonable chances. With the minutes ticking away Cullen, spotting Turner in space in front of goal, played a perfect pass and the inside forward wasted no time in blasting a shot into the roof of the net.

Pandemonium broke out with the players as excited as the crowd and the noise was doubled when the final whistle sounded soon after to bring a perfect end to a perfect day.

Continuing our 'football diary' to keep you up to date with the domestic and global game:

Mar 11: West Ham reach the semi-finals of the FA Cup, beating Everton 2-1 at Upton Park. They now face Nottingham Forest at Villa Park in the semi-finals.

Mar 13: The Town lose 2-1 at Coventry. Graham Rodger scores against his old club.

Frank Burrows quits as manager of Second Division Portsmouth.

Mar 14: Carlisle sack manager Clive Middlemass following a 4-0 home defeat by Gillingham.

Mo Johnston announces his return to international football for Scotland.

Mar 16: The Town go down 1-0 at home to Norwich City. Liverpool return to the top of the First Division following a 2-1 win over Sunderland at Anfield.

Sheffield United make it seven wins out of seven with a 1-0 victory over Chelsea.

Mar 17: Arsenal return to the top with a 2-0 victory over Leeds United at Highbury.

Mar 18: Kingsley Black and Iain Dowie are again picked for the Northern Ireland squad to face Yugoslavia in Belgrade.

Geoff Thomas and Tony Adams are the only surprise inclusions to the England squad to face Eire at Wembley.

Mar 19: Manchester United defeat Montpellier 2-0 in France to reach the semi-finals of the European Cup Winners Cup, 3-1 on aggregate.

Mar 20: Iain Dowie joins West Ham for £480,000. Olympique Marseille beat holders AC Milan 1-0 to go through to the semi-finals of the European Cup 2-1 on aggregate. Chris Waddle scores the only goal.

FOCUS ON TOTTENHAM

Erik Thorstvedt (goalkeeper): Erik is a Norwegian international who was signed from IFK Sothenburg in 1988. He began his career with junior club EIK, later moving to Viking Stavanger and Borussia Moenchengladbach. He signed for Spurs in a £400,000 deal.

Justin Edinburg (defender): Justin was Tottenham's only signing last summer when he joined the club from Southend United for £150,000. He made his debut for Spurs in a 2-1 victory at Hartlepool, and has recently enjoyed an extended run in the first team as a result of injury to Pat Van Den Hauwe.

Pat Van Den Hauwe (defender): Signed from Everton in August 1989. Pat was introduced to League soccer by Birmingham City in 1979. He established himself as a competent left-back, prompting Everton to sign him for £100,000 in 1984. It was while he was at Goodison Park he made his first appearance for Wales and is now a regular international.

Steve Sedgley (defender): Steve came through the ranks at Coventry, making his League debut in 1986 and it was not long before he was in the England Under-21 side. Tottenham paid Coventry £750,000 for him in 1989 agreeing to pay a further £100,000 if he wins an England cap.

Gary Mabbutt (defender): Club captain, Gary made his name with Bristol Rovers, winning the first of his seven England Under-21 caps at Eastville. He joined Tottenham for £125,000 in 1982 and was very soon in the full England side. Gary now has 13 caps to his name.

Mitchell Thomas (defender/midfield): Luton born, Mitchell developed in the junior sides here at Kenilworth Road and made his League debut for the Town in a 3-2 victory at West Ham in 1983. He won three England Under-21 caps here at Luton before joining Spurs for £250,000 in 1986.

Paul Allen (midfield): Paul started his career at West Ham and was the youngest player to appear in an FA Cup final in 1980 at the age of eighteen. He won a record number of 23 England youth caps during his time at Upton Park before transferring to Tottenham for £400,000 in 1985.

Vinny Samways (midfield): Vinny has been given an extended run in the Tottenham line-up due to Paul Gascoigne's hernia operation. He is a product of Spurs youth scheme.

Nayim (midfield): Nayim, whose full name is Mohamed Ali Azar, is a Spanish Under-21 international who was with Barcelona when Mr Venables was manager there. He originally joined Tottenham on loan before making the move permanent in 1989.

Paul Walsh (forward): Former Town favourite, Paul became an England youth international in his Charlton days but it was after his £350,000 move to Kenilworth Road in 1982 that he won his three full England caps. Liverpool signed him for £700,000 in 1984, but he could not command a regular place. Spurs signed him for £500,000 three seasons ago.

Paul Stewart (forward/midfield): Paul was a regular top-scorer in his Blackpool days before moving to Manchester City for £200,000 in 1987. Paul topped City's goals list with 28 in 1987/88 which promoted Spurs to sign him for £1.7 million in 1989.

Gary Lineker (forward): England captain, Gary was the club's top scorer with 26 goals last season. He started his career at Leicester City before joining Everton for £800,000 in 1985. He hit 38 goals in his only season at Goodison Park before joining Barcelona for £3 million. He joined Spurs for £1.5 million in 1989.
