


There is an attractive colour sleeve currently being produced for these videos and hopefully they will be ready in time for issue number two.

IT LOOKS as though it is going to be another tough season for Luton Town.

In recent seasons they have finished strongly to avoid relegation from the First Division.

During the summer there was a change of management at Kenilworth Road with **David Pleat** returning to take charge.

But with no more money to spend Pleat will have to pull out all the stops if Luton are to avoid returning to the

Second Division.

It was at Luton where Pleat first made a name for himself as player and manager. He first joined Luton in 1964 after playing half a dozen matches for Nottingham Forest and then following spells at Shrewsbury, Exeter and Peterborough he was forced to pack up in 1971.

Three years later he returned to Luton as reserve team coach before being promoted to first team duties in '77. A year later he became manager and guided the club into the First Division four years later.


After 12 years in charge at Kenilworth Road, Pleat left to take over at Tottenham and led them to an FA Cup Final. In December 1987 he joined Leicester City where he remained until last January.

Pleat's assistant is **Colin Murphy**, the former Lincoln and Derby manager. They have been friends for many years.

Soon after Pleat had been appointed at Luton he persuaded former Ipswich coach **Brian Owen** to join him. Brian had had nine years at Portman Road before moving to Colchester United where he doubled up as coach and physiotherapist.

The other Ipswich connection at Luton is goalkeeper **Alec**

**Chamberlain** who was last season voted player-of-the-year.

A former Ipswich youth team player, he made his break into league football at Colchester where he was ever present for more than three seasons following the retirement of Mike Walker, now the reserve team coach at Norwich.

In 1987 Chamberlain joined Everton for £75,000 as cover to Neville Southall but in the summer of '88 Luton paid £150,000 for his services.

Right-back **Matthew Jackson** joined the club as a schoolboy and signed professional terms last year. Got his big break when he came on as substitute against Arsenal and has kept his place in the side since.

On the other side of the defence is **Richard Harvey**, a former England youth international, who made his debut as a 17-year-old in 1986. He has been a fairly regular member of the side for the past three seasons.

**Trevor Peake** is a vastly experienced defender who was signed from Coventry in August for £100,000 and was immediately made club captain.

He started his career with Nuneaton Borough before stepping into league football with Lincoln City in 1979. Moved to Coventry four years later and was a member of their FA Cup winning side in '87.

**Graham Rodger** is another former Coventry player who was signed in the summer of 1989. A former England Under-21 international he started his career at Wolves but made only one senior appearance at Molineux.

**David Beaumont** did not have the happiest of starts to his Luton career after being signed from Dundee United for £150,000 in January, 1989.

He spent most of his time on the injured list, but won his place back last season.

There is no doubt that Luton do lack experience in terms of the First Division. Paul Telfer, 19, is another player who has come through the ranks to earn an extended run in the side this season.

**Mark Pembridge** can be put in the same bracket, but since making his debut on New Year's Day against Wimbledon he has gone on to win international honours for Wales.


Soon after gaining a regular first team place with Luton he was capped by his country at Under-21 and B level and last month won his first full cap in the friendly international against Brazil.

**David Preece** has served Luton well since being signed back in 1984 for £150,000 from Walsall for

whom he had made his league debut three years earlier.

Played in two Littlewoods Cup finals at Wembley for the club and has been capped three times by England at B level.

Luton are hoping that the return of big, powerful striker **Mick Harford** will pay dividends come the end of the season.

Mick was re-signed from Derby County last month for £325,000 after being sold three years earlier for £480,000.

Started his career at Lincoln before joining Newcastle. After a brief spell at Bristol City, he made his name at Birmingham which prompted Luton to first sign him in 1986.

Harford's striking partner is **Philip Gray** who cost a £275,000 fee when he moved from Tottenham just before the start of the season.

After making his Spurs debut in 1987, he was never able to establish himself and went on loan to Barnsley.

**Sean Farrell** completed his apprenticeship with Luton, but made his league debut on loan to Colchester United during the 1987-88 season. Has recently returned from a loan spell with Northampton Town.

**Kurt Nogan**, a prolific goalscorer in the reserves, made his first team debut in January of last year.

Now a valuable member of the first team squad, he will be looking to make the breakthrough in the near future.

**Darron McDonough**, signed from Oldham in 1986 for £85,000, is equally at home either in defence or midfield. After making over 200 appearances at Oldham, he has been a regular at Kenilworth Road during the past five seasons.

Defender **Paul Holsgrave** was signed from Wokingham for £25,000 last January and immediately made his debut against OPR.

**Steve Thompson**, a midfield player, was signed from Bolton for £180,000 last September after making over 350 senior appearances for the Lancashire club.

Former striker Brian Stein returned to the club on a free transfer during the summer following three seasons in French Football.

# PORTMAN DIARY

SEPTEMBER 1991

**24** Ipswich have been invited to Holland on 12th November to play in a testimonial game for Frans Thijssen against his present club Vitesse Arnhem.

Ipswich will take a three-day break on the Isle of Wight following their match at Brighton on 12th October. They will play a match against a select eleven during their stay.

Stockwell suffered a groin strain at Grimsby and is also doubtful.



