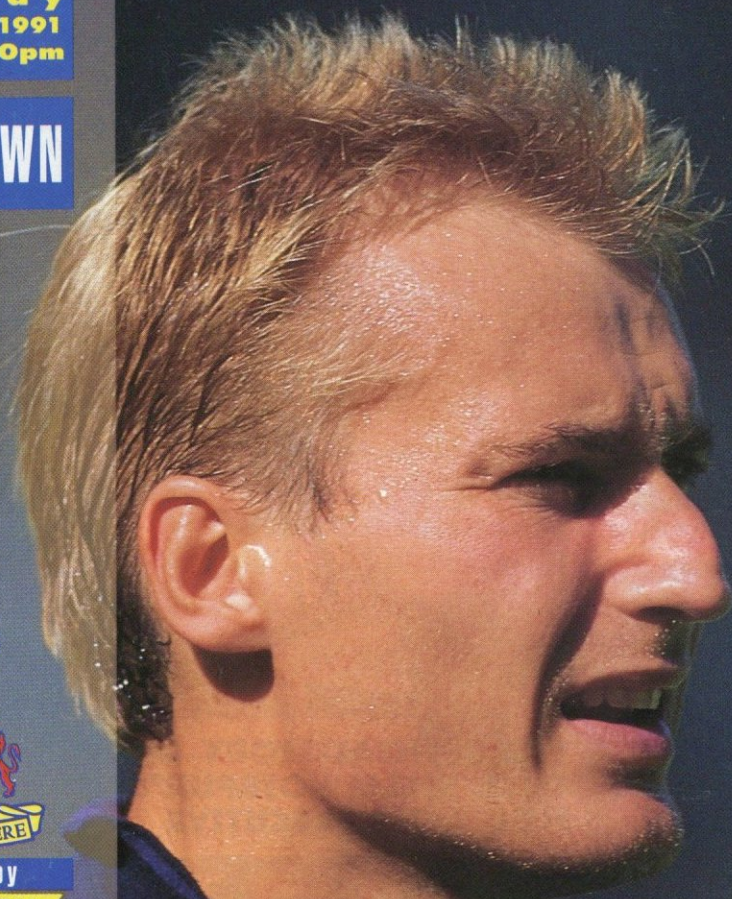

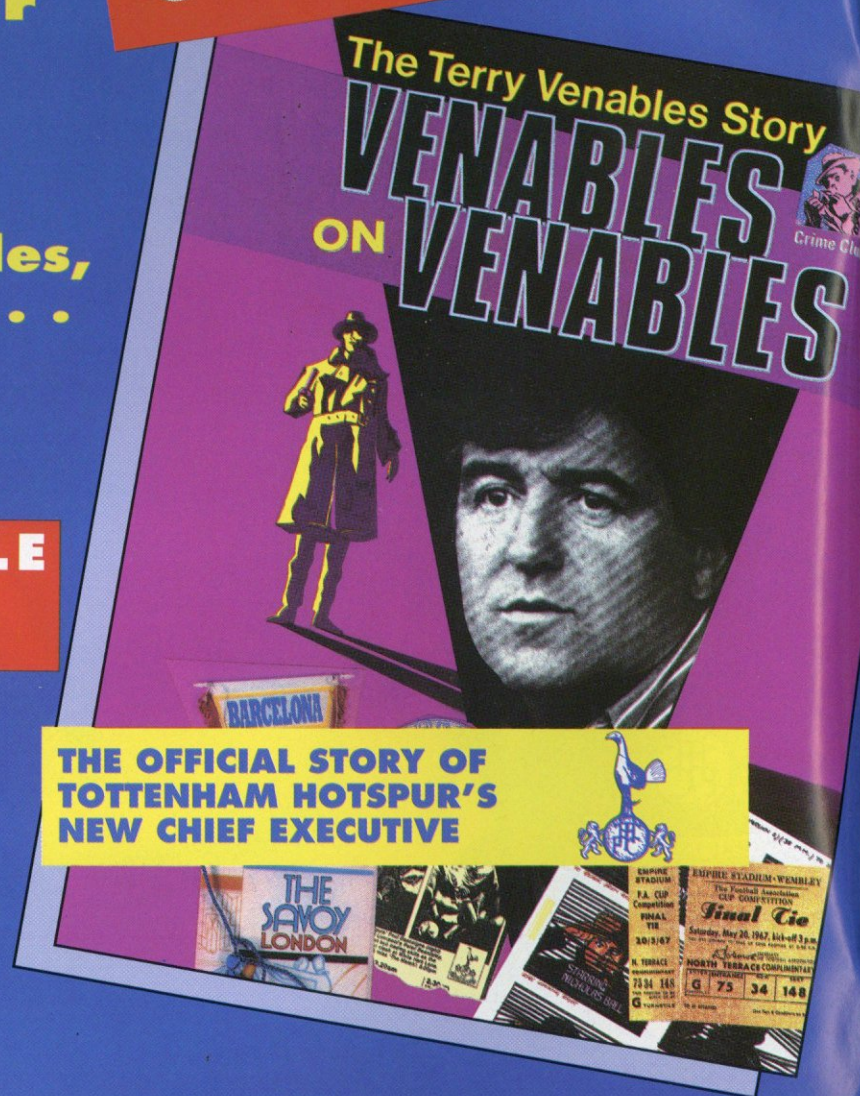

EVACUATION PROCEDURE

In the event of any emergency at Tottenham Hotspur Football Club, spectators should remain in their positions and listen carefully to the loud speaker announcements that will be made.

The announcements may direct spectators in a specified area of the ground, to evacuation points which may be exit gates or emergency exits leading on to the pitch.

Our PA system operates on a 'zoned' basis so do not worry if you cannot hear certain broadcasts too clearly. In such cases, the information will not appertain to your section of the stadium.

Stewards, officials and police officers will direct spectators to the relevant points.

If spectators are requested to vacate a specified area, they are asked to do so calmly and quickly to assist with a safe evacuation.

All supporters should then make their way towards the east side of the stadium using Park Lane, Paxton Road and Worcester Avenue, into Northumberland Park, avoiding the High Road and the front of the stadium.

A POLICE INFORMATION CENTRE WOULD BE SET UP AT 143 NORTHUMBERLAND PARK AND ALL ENQUIRIES SHOULD BE MADE TO THAT ADDRESS.

Tottenham Police request that spectators travelling to the stadium by car must not park in those areas designated as 'no parking' areas, as these roads form the EMERGENCY CORRIDOR. Nor should they park in front of any entrance or exit gates.

This is to ensure safe passage and to assist the emergency services in the event of any major incident at the ground.

Your assistance in this matter is greatly appreciated.

CYRIL *remembered*

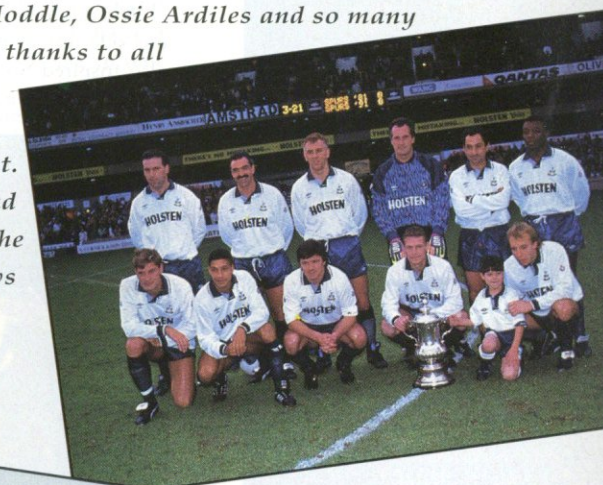
Many familiar faces were again in action as White Hart Lane turned back the clock for the Cyril Knowles Memorial Match on Sunday.

W h i t e H a r t L a n e U P D A T E

This afternoon we are delighted to welcome Luton Town to White Hart Lane. We welcome, in particular, our former manager David Pleat and ex-Spur Philip Gray who left us for Kenilworth Road just before the start of the season.

Last season's corresponding game was played in December when two goals by Paul Stewart gave us a 2-1 win. But that game will long be remembered for the extraordinary events surrounding the play.

Iain Dowie had given Town a 12th minute lead before Nayim was sent off on the half-hour and Pat Van den Hauwe followed just before the interval. Luton's Ceri Hughes was also dismissed midway through the second half.

It was a remarkable result against the odds and one that seemed to lift our side just in time for our ultimately successful F.A. Cup campaign. It also inspired Stewart whose enforced switch to midfield that afternoon proved such a success that it lifted him to full England international status.

The return, at Kenilworth Road in April, saw us take a point from a 0-0 draw with a fine defensive display after we came under a good deal of pressure in an entertaining game.

We have certainly been on our travels since our last game here - the 3-1 win over F.C. Porto in the second round of the European Cup Winners' Cup. We hit top form that night with two goals by Gary Lineker and one

from Gordon Durie setting us up for the recent return when we showed great resilience and character to keep Porto at bay.

In between, we travelled to West Ham United, Grimsby Town and Sheffield Wednesday with mixed fortunes.

We lost 1-2 at Upton Park but what an all-action encounter it was. Lineker gave us a fifth minute lead but Mike Small equalised within seven minutes before our former player Mitchell Thomas hit what proved to be the winner in the 29th minute. Durie was dismissed for a foul and is, therefore, suspended from today's game.

Next came a tough test at Grimsby in the third round of the Rumbelows Cup - and one that we passed 3-0 with quality goals by David Howells, Lineker and Durie. Once again, it was a victory built on a solid and disciplined defensive display and we subsequently maintained that mean streak at Hillsborough in a lively contest that saw chances at both ends yet ended without goals.

Sunday proved to be a nostalgic affair here as we all remembered Cyril Knowles and enjoyed some excellent football that brought back wonderful memories. The afternoon consisted of two games with Spurs '71 drawing 0-0 with the Arsenal "Double" side of the same year and a young current side drawing 2-2 with Spurs '81-82.

A full report and picture spread will appear in next Saturday's programme, so don't miss that. And a video of the games - highlights of the action plus interviews with players from the past - is available exclusively from the Spurs Shop. Entitled 'Nice One Cyril,' it represents a wonderful tribute and costs just £11.99. It is also available on mail order.

Our proposed League game here with Crystal Palace - due to be played on Tuesday, November 26, has been postponed due to Palace's continuing involvement in the Zenith Data Systems Cup.

We visit Coventry City for our Rumbelows Cup fourth round tie on December 4.

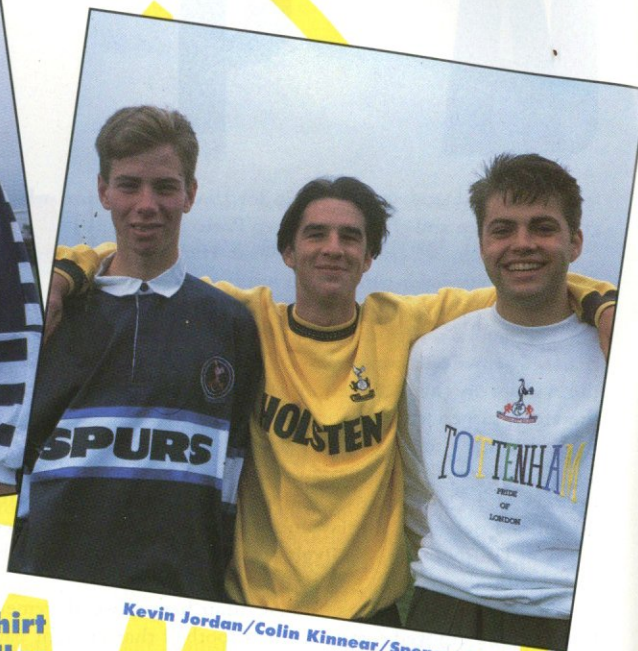

SECOND

Ian Hendon

A change of position has boosted first team opportunities for the versatile Ian Hendon. The former England Youth captain has always specialised in defensive roles, preferring to play at centre-half but willing and able to fill in at right-back.

Now Peter Shreeves has pushed the 19-year-old into midfield - and Ian looks just as comfortable as his senior opportunities improve.

The Ilford-born Hendon played just two games last season, going on as substitute in both. His involvement is already far greater this time around and he played for the whole game at Swansea City in our September Rumbelows Cup second round clash.

"Oddly enough I played at right-back in that one but Peter Shreeves seems to prefer me in midfield and that suits me," says Ian. "I'm now playing there in the Reserves and getting more used to the role.

"I've had a good run lately and have been helped by Peter's policy of having a look at the younger players and UEFA's restrictions on overseas players.

"I must be doing something right and it's not a case of me improving with experience - I hardly managed 50 minutes in total from my two appearances last season!

"Obviously, I would love a regular place and to stay in one position because that would allow me to settle in more. But I'm happy with

the chances coming my way now and my versatility seems to suit the team.

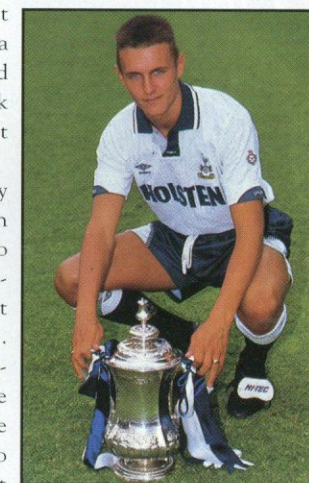
"Any central role - either in defence or midfield - will do me because I like to be continually involved in the play and that's not always the case on the flanks.

"My midfield role at the moment is basically a defensive one. I can go forward if the opportunity arises but I'm also there as added insurance when others push up."

Now too old for England at Youth level, Ian's next target is to follow Ian Walker into the Under-21 squad. But he accepts that the gap he must bridge is quite a wide one - and it all comes back to progress at club level.

"You really have to be in the first team to get noticed - there is no short cut," he says. "But I feel comfortable in the squad here - I've been made to feel a part of it all by the other lads from the start - and that's helped me on the field.

"My best opportunities, squad-wise, have come in our European games and I find that style of play easier than the 100mph requirements of First Division football. I'm more used to that slow, measured build-up because of my England experience but it's no easier for that. You can't lose concentration for a second."

Justin Edinburgh

Having experienced the euphoria of winning the F.A. Cup last season, young full-back Justin Edinburgh was certainly brought down to earth this time around.

Struggling to find the form, that saw him play 26 League and Cup matches last term, the Basildon-born defender is the first to admit that his pre-season performances were below the high standards he sets himself.

"I was obviously disappointed not to start the season, but the coaching staff didn't think I continued this campaign where I left off last year," he explains.

"I knew myself that was the case and had to knuckle down to some hard work. Then when I felt I was getting back to form I picked up an injury in training.

"It was a bruised cartilage and at first they were not sure if I would need an operation. Thankfully an injection worked and, touch wood, I haven't had any problems since.

"It happened when I fell awkwardly in training, and it kept me out for five weeks. At the time I felt I was getting back to my old self and knocking on the first team door.

"The unfortunate incident with Terry Fenwick also left the full-back position up for grabs and I felt it might have been a break for me until the injury.

"But now I've got all that out of the way and I'm pleased to be back in the side. I feel I am doing well so, if I keep playing as I am, hopefully I won't get dropped."

Justin is one of many players in the side tasting European action for the first time, the match at home to FC Porto being his introduction to the Cup-Winners' Cup campaign.

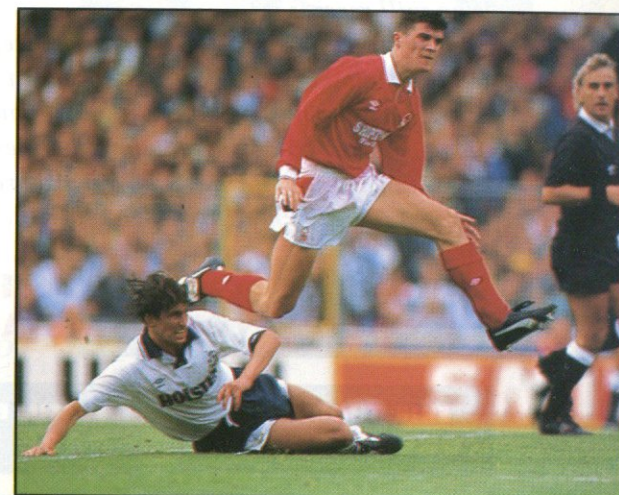
"I had been on the substitutes' bench before that one, and not got on. After that I played in

the return match in Portugal and I was certainly nervous on that occasion.

"The F. A. Cup semi-final and Final were big matches, but that one was on a par with them in terms of pressure with a place in the last eight at stake.

"With 50-60,000 fanatical supporters in that stadium the atmosphere was incredible, but they got on to their own team a bit in the second half and that worked well for us.

"We had to defend for 90 per cent of the game, and everyone was outstanding from Erik



Thorstvedt through to Gordon Durie. They had some quality players and I can't see us coming up against anything better."

That was certainly a tremendous performance and one that prompted team manager Peter Shreeves to describe it as 'one of the bravest I have ever seen from a Spurs team.'

Justin adds: "The defence appears to have settled down in recent games, and things have started to gel at the back. We have kept clean sheets in the last three matches and everything seems to be going well at the moment.

"I just hope I can keep my place and maybe pick up a couple of medals at the end of the year."

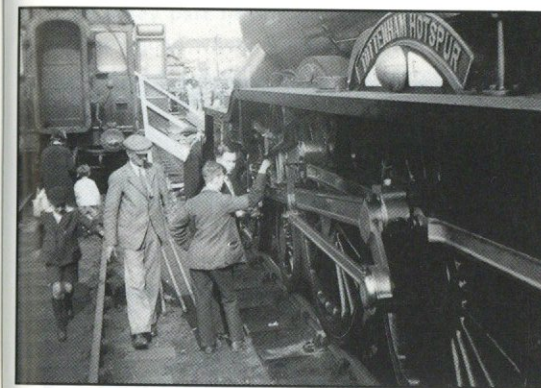
ON loan

Our recent feature on the history of the train and the nameplates now hanging in our West Stand reception, has caused a good deal of interest amongst supporters.

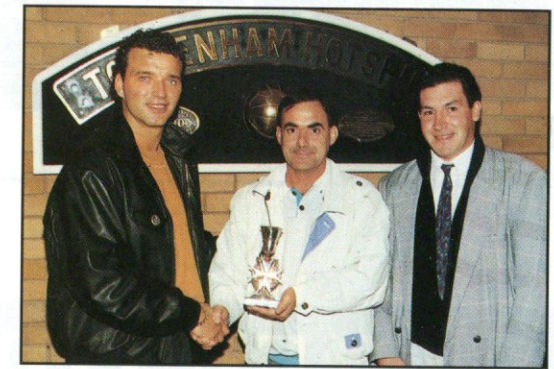

Congratulations to Spurs supporter Ron Mouldie, from Chingford, who celebrated his 80th birthday on Thursday.

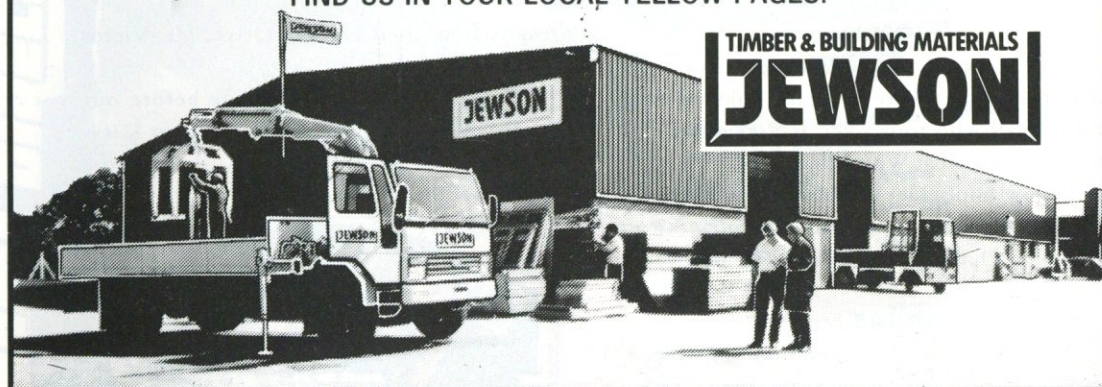
Mr. Mouldie has been a Spurs fan since 1925 when he cycled to every home match and he has been an East Stand season ticket holder for the past 25 years.

ON *the* FRINGE

Kevin Dearden



Goalkeeper Kevin Dearden is very much a realist. And realistic enough to know that he's got a

fight on his talented hands.

The 21-year-old accepts that when Erik Thorstvedt and Ian Walker are fit and available, then he is third choice for the first team crown. Yet that's a pecking order that he is determined to change.

Kevin has stayed in the picture this season as a key part of our European Cup-Winners' Cup squad where his English nationality has allowed manager Peter Shreeves greater options in his starting line-ups.

The four-player ceiling on 'foreign' nationals, worked against Erik when Ian made his solid bid for his place earlier this season. And Kevin kept his seat on the bench when Ian subsequently suffered from tonsillitis and the big Norwegian returned.

Such crumbs are encouraging but can also be understandably frustrating for a player of Kevin's ability and experience. Yet he remains firm friends with his fellow 'keepers - and sure that his own chance will come.

"We all get on very well," says Kevin. "They say that there is a goalkeeper's 'union' in professional football and that's certainly true here.

"Although we are vying together for that one position, we are still good friends and tend to stick together. It's friendly but fierce competition - it has to be that way.

"I accept that I'm number three - I would be fooling myself if I didn't. But things can change and I'm working to make that happen.

"Naturally, it's encouraging to be in the first team squad and great for me to be involved in

England's return to Europe. It's all experience and that's a useful commodity in itself.

"I also enjoy travelling away with the lads - it's good fun as much as anything else - and I room with Ian when we are together in the same squad."

Kevin, from Luton, has certainly travelled in recent seasons. He has only made one senior appearance in our colours - at Hartlepool United in last season's Rumbelows Cup - but he's made 35 League appearances on loan to Cambridge United, Hartlepool, Swindon Town, Peterborough United and Hull City.

"I may have to go on loan again and I have no objection to that," he continues. "As much as I like playing for the Reserves here, you can't beat Football League experience - even if it's at Rochdale, for instance, in front of 2,000 people.

"It's still League football every week and that can only help you to improve.

"I accept that I haven't got much chance as things stand at the moment and all credit to Ian for going in when Erik was not available and doing so marvellously well.

"Now it's down to me to do the same. I've got to work hard and try to prove that I'm good enough to displace at least one of them. I've also got to keep at it.

"There are times when you can't help thinking that things are not working out, but you must get through those phases and stay positive. I've got enough confidence in my own ability to feel that it's going to happen."

Keir Radnedge on Atletico Madrid's Jesus Gil

Atletico's star name is not a player, nor the coach. Instead, it is the volatile, larger-than-life president, Jesus Gil.

That Atletico proved such awkward Cup-winners' Cup rivals for Manchester United and that they are scrapping for the League leadership, is all down to the controversial 'Raging Bull' of Spanish soccer.

Gil is a millionaire builder. He builds luxury homes in Marbella and owns a large stake in the resort's so-called 'golden mile'. He is mayor of another southern town, and has owned Atletico Madrid for the past four years and has gone through eight managers in his impatience to oust Real Madrid as the capital's top team.

That ambition is not new for an Atletico president. It was the driving force behind the club in the late 1950s and early 1960s under a previous president, Vicente Calderon. But somehow, although Atletico won the occasional domestic championship and cup and even the European Cup-winners' Cup once, they never stayed the pace for long.

Always, there were too many problems. It appeared part of the club's destiny. In the late 1930s, after the Spanish civil war, it had taken a merger with the air force club to keep Atletico in business. In the early 1960s they had to borrow the use of Real's Estadio Bernabeu because Atletico's Metropolitano had been sold to developers before the club's new stadium could be completed.

And so it went on.

In 1966, Atletico toppled Real on a

thrilling run-in to pip their neighbours to the Championship. Yet even now their moment of glory was to be overshadowed. Real, quite improbably, won the Champions' Cup against all expectation, beating holders Internazionale in the semi-final and then Partizan of Belgrade in the final.

Thus the celebration images which dominated the end of the season were of Real in triumph with Atletico once again taking a back seat.

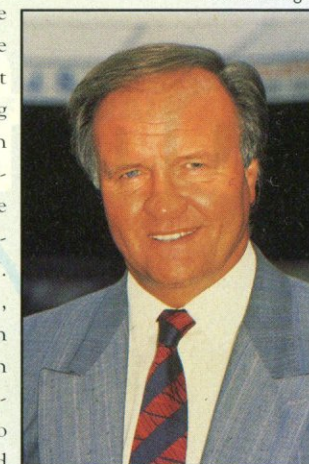
Over the next decade Atletico spent heavily trying to compete with Real and Barcelona in the domestic transfer market. When, in 1973, the federation eased a ban on import restrictions, so Atletico picked

up a string of fine players such as the Argentines Ruben Hugo Ayala, Ramon Heredia and 'Panadero' Diaz.

Their reward was a place in the 1974 Champions' Cup Final. But, facing Bayern Munich, Atletico were pushed to the brink of glory, then slapped in the face.

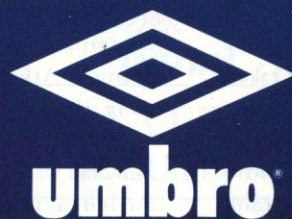
Goalless at 90 minutes, it seemed the outcome was resolved when inside forward Luis curled a textbook free-kick around the defensive wall and beyond Sepp Maier. Then, with seconds remaining, Bayern centre back Hans-Georg Schwarzenbeck tried a low,

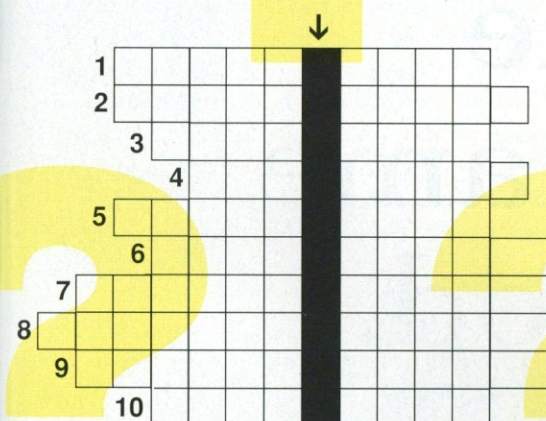

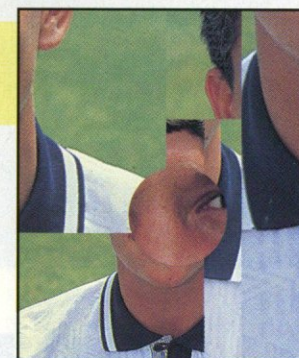

TAKING A GLANCE BACK

We have faced Luton Town seven times

in the Football League during the month of November, including one fixture on this date back in 1946.

The first peacetime campaign after the War was an average season for both clubs; we finished sixth in Division Two with 48 points Luton 13th with 39. A 26,362 crowd saw the home side defeat us 3-2, our goals coming from Les Bennett and George Foreman.

The end of the 1950s saw the two clubs paired together in November for three consecutive seasons.

In 1957 we went 3-0 up within 21 minutes through Johnny Brooks and Terry Medwin (2), George Cummins replying for the visitors in the last minute.

A year later at Luton, Medwin was again on the scoresheet netting our winner five minutes from time in a 2-1 win. Dave Dunmore had given us a 10th minute lead which Billy Bingham equalised on 77 minutes.

Luton's Republic of Ireland forward Cummins scored the only goal in 1959 after 15 minutes to topple us from top spot in Division One.

More recently the two clubs met three times in the 1980s. At Kenilworth Road in 1983 a young Spurs side triumphed 4-2, Steve Archibald (2), Richard Cooke and Ally Dick netting our goals. Brian Stein — who played

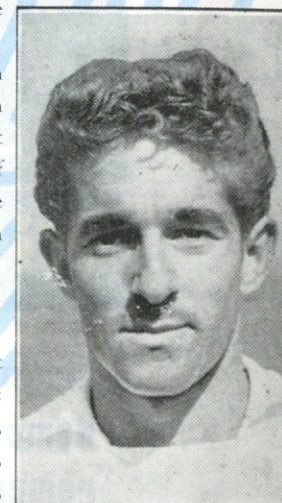
here in last month's Football Combination fixture — and Paul Walsh scored for Luton.

Stein again featured among the scorers here in 1985 as Luton won 3-1. Mick Harford and Ricky Hill also scored, Cooke replying for Tottenham.

Ian Allinson supplied both goals that beat us 2-0 at Luton in 1987, our most recent defeat by the Bedfordshire club. Of the seven meetings since we have won four and drawn three, all goalless.

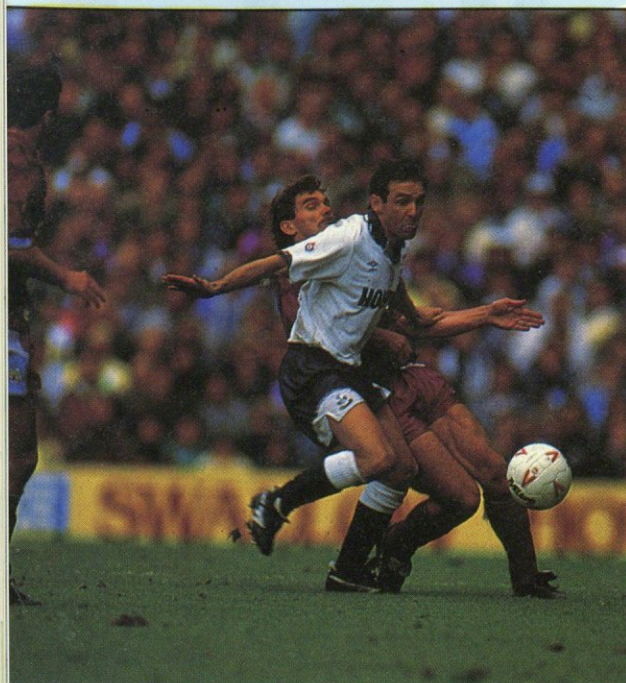

LUTON TOWN

Luton Town, who have escaped relegation in each of the past three seasons only by winning their final game, are once again deeply involved in the battle for First Division survival. Former Spurs' manager David Pleat, who returned for his second spell in charge at Kenilworth Road this summer, is under no illusions as to the size of the task before him.



In a bid to halt the Hatters' slide, Mr. Pleat has used no fewer than 30 players in his first-team.

In August he shored up his defence with the signing of centre-back **Trevor Peake** from Coventry for £100,000. The following month he signed England striker **Mick Harford** from Derby for £300,000 and more recently he has added midfielder **Chris Kamara** — signed from Leeds for £150,000 — to his squad.

Other new arrivals last month were defender **Des Linton** and midfielder **Scott Oakes**, who both came from Leicester in exchange for Steve Thompson.

During his days with non-League Nuneaton, Peake played for the England semi-professional XI. He made his League debut for Lincoln in 1979, moving on to Coventry four years later.

Harford is now in his second spell at Kenilworth Road. He was introduced to League soccer by Lincoln in 1977 and commanded a then record fee for a Fourth Division player when Newcastle signed him for £200,000 in 1981. He was soon on the move again, to Bristol City and to Birmingham before initially going to Luton in 1984. His scoring feats at Kenilworth Road earned him two England

caps. Derby signed him for £480,000 in 1990.

Kamara, who provides the bite that was missing in midfield, was launched into the League game by Portsmouth in 1975. Swindon signed him two years later but he returned to Portsmouth in 1981. Within a few weeks he was on the move again — to Brentford. He later returned to Swindon, then had a spell with Stoke City before joining Leeds for £150,000 in 1990.

Linton and Oakes both developed in the junior teams at Leicester and both were blooded in their League eleven briefly during 1989/90.

Because the Luton team has been undergoing constant change, it is difficult to anticipate how they may line up today but it seems likely that former Spurs' man **Phil Gray** will partner Harford in attack.

Brian Stein and **Kurt Nogan** are other contenders for places in attack.

Phil has been one of the few successes in the Luton side so far and is now top scorer with six goals. He was signed from us for £275,000 shortly before the start of the season. He developed in the junior teams here and made his First Division debut in 1987. Two seasons ago he went to Barnsley on loan.

Stein returned to Luton this summer after spending the past three seasons in France. A Luton discovery, he was introduced to the Hatters' League side in 1977 and was their leading scorer on two occasions, form that won him an England cap. Brian scored two of the Wembley goals when Luton beat Arsenal in the League Cup Final of 1988 and that proved to be his last game for the club for the time being. He was transferred to SM Caen, then played for Annecy before returning to Kenilworth Road.

Nogan is a former trainee who turned professional in July 1989. He was a prolific scorer in the reserves and was elevated to the first team in January 1990. He won his first Wales Under-21 cap last season.

Just recently the midfield has been lining up with **Paul Telfer**, **Kamara**, **Ceri Hughes** and **Oakes**.

David Preece and **Jason Rees** could also come into contention for places in midfield.

Telfer is a former Luton trainee who had made only one appearance in their First Division side, as substitute, prior to the start of the season. He

has been holding his place for the past few weeks.

Hughes is another former trainee. He made his League debut at Aston Villa in March, 1990, and made a big impact after winning a regular place during the early weeks of last season. He then sustained an injury which kept him out of the game for several months.

Preece made his League debut for Walsall in 1981, winning a regular place two years later. Luton invested £150,000 when signing him in 1984 and he later played in two League Cup finals for the Hatters. David has been capped three times for England "B".

Rees is yet another player produced from the Luton youth team. He made his First Division debut two seasons ago and last season played for Wales at "B" and Under-21 levels.

Newcomer Peake could be playing alongside **John Dreyer** in the middle of the defence but **Graham Rodger** has also appeared regularly in this position. **Julian James** and **Mark Pembridge** have recently been filling the full-back positions. **Marvin Johnson** and **Richard Harvey** have also played at full-back.

Dreyer was an apprentice with Oxford but played League soccer for both Torquay and Fulham, whilst on loan, during the 1985/86 season, before getting his chance in the Oxford side the following season. Luton signed him for £140,000 in 1988.

Rodger completed his apprenticeship with Wolves but got only one outing in their League eleven. After moving to Coventry in 1985 he played four times for the England Under-21s. Luton signed him during the summer of 1989.

James joined the club as a trainee and he was introduced to First Division football four seasons ago. He is now an England Under-21 international.

Pembridge, who normally plays in midfield, is

another former Luton trainee. He made his senior debut against West Ham in the Zenith Cup last December. He later won a regular place and played for Wales at "B" and Under-21 levels.

Johnson is a former Luton apprentice who broke into the first-team for a few games in 1987/88. Last season he played in both full-back positions.

Harvey is one-time England youth international. He made his League debut in 1986 and for the past two seasons he has been a fairly regular member of the side.

Goalkeeper **Alec Chamberlain** was signed from Everton for £150,000 in July, 1988, and took over in the Luton goal towards the end of the following season. He was a reserve player at Ipswich but soon stepped into League soccer with Colchester after a transfer in 1982. Everton signed him for £75,000 in 1987 as cover but, after a loan spell with Tranmere, he moved on to Kenilworth Road.

Luton have conceded more away goals (24) than any other club in the whole of the Football League and, so far, they have scored only one League goal away from home. That was credited to former Spur **Phil Gray** who scored in their 1-4 defeat at Chelsea in August.

Luton's only away point came for a goalless draw at West Ham on the opening day of the season. All their other away League games ended in defeat at Coventry (0-5), Arsenal (0-2), Chelsea (1-4), Wimbledon (0-3), Manchester United (0-5), Aston Villa (0-4) and Norwich (0-1).

Luton were also beaten away to Third Division Birmingham (2-3) in the Rumbelows League Cup, losing the tie 4-5 on aggregate.

The Hatters drew at Ipswich (1-1) in the Zenith Data Systems Cup only to lose that tie 1-2 in the penalty shoot-out.

Unlike a lot of the first year boys Chris, whose brother Andrew was on our Schoolboy

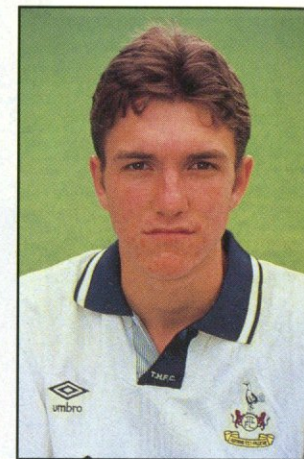
books two years ago, did not know anyone when he arrived.

"My aim is to get a place in the Division One side, so I must continue working hard and keep it up."



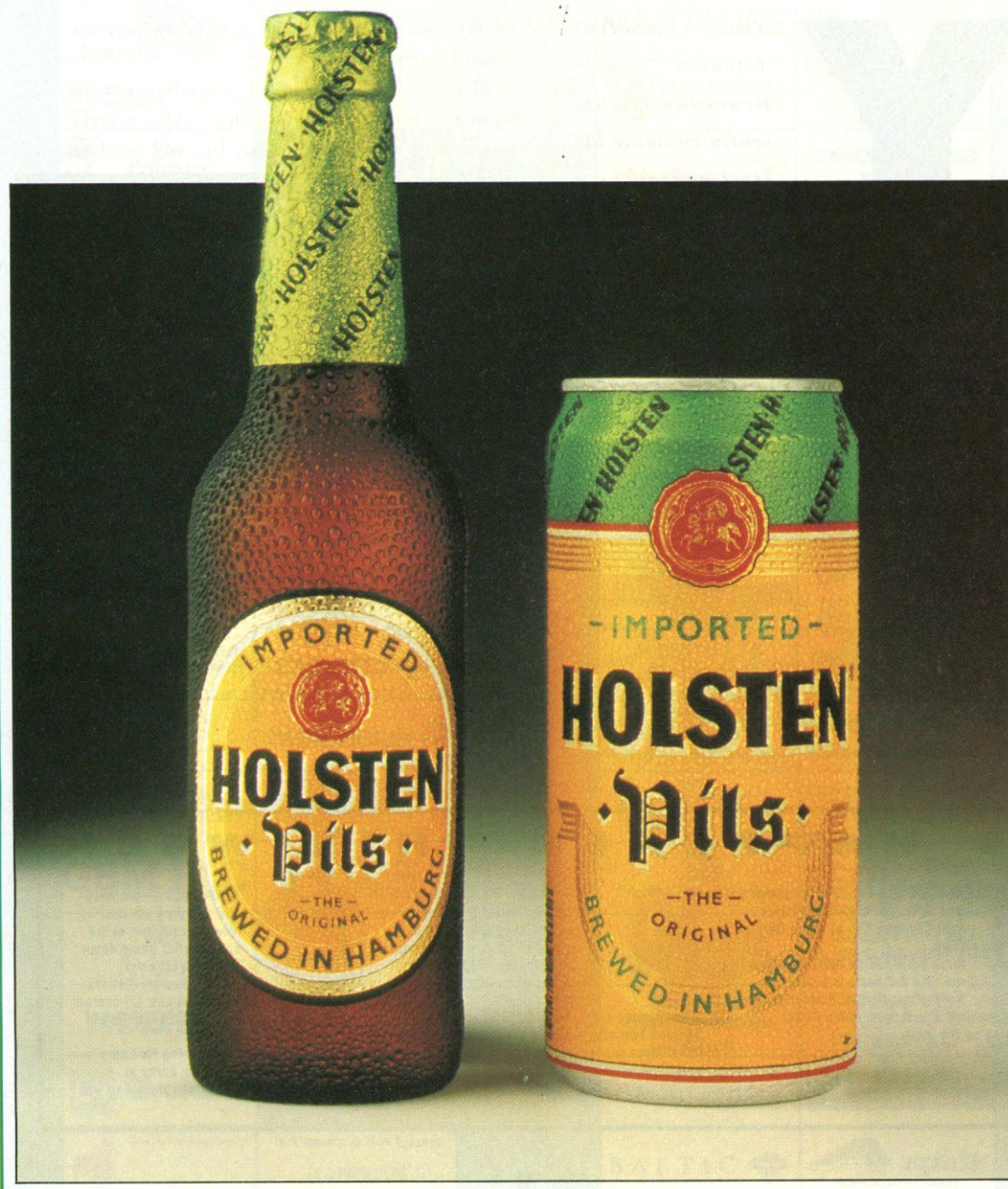
IT HAPPENED THIS WEEK

Nayim



A look back at how the current Spurs first-team squad found their early days in football as we take them back to the beginning.

It must be every young apprentice's dream to train with the world's best players at the world's biggest club. So it was with Nayim, when our talented midfielder began his footballing career at Barcelona. The Catalan club, which boasts more than 100,000 members and has facilities unrivalled in the world, had Diego Maradona and Bernd Schuster on their books when they invited the 15-year-old Nayim for a week's trial.

"I was playing for my local boy's club when a Barcelona scout invited me for a trial," he says. "I could hardly believe it, I must admit that I was a little frightened when I saw the Nou Camp stadium, but once out on the pitch the nerves went as I got on with my football."

Nayim then returned to face an anxious month before he heard that he had been successful. He joined a group of around 40 youngsters, who lived together in part of the Nou Camp's huge complex.

"We would go to school in the mornings and train in the afternoons. After a year, we would train with the first team every Wednesday, along with Maradona."

How was the great man? Arrogant, aloof perhaps? Not a bit of it. "He was great with us youngsters," said Nayim. "Always joking and keen to help. He was only happy to do his tricks if we asked him, and they were brilliant — I still cannot do most of them!"

Maradona's fellow Argentinian, Cesar Luis Menotti, was coach at the time, but our own Terry Venables soon took over. "I was still an

amateur playing for the second team when Terry arrived," said Nayim.

"After a year or so, he asked me to train full-time with the first team and I signed on as a professional. I was still living with the other trainees, so I moved into my own apartment after that."

But a cruciate ligament injury put Nayim out of action for more than six months, and when he returned to action, Johann Cruyff had replaced Terry Venables as coach.

"I was unhappy to be out of the first team picture, and I knew all about British football from Terry and team mates such as Gary Lineker, Mark Hughes and Steve Archibald.

"I just wanted to play football, so I took the chance to join Terry at Spurs. It was a loan at first, because Cruyff said that he might need me, but then the deal became permanent when Gary Lineker came to Spurs.

"The way of life was different in many ways. I did not speak any English when I first arrived, but fortunately Terry and his assistant Allan Harris spoke Spanish. Even so, I spent a lot of time in my hotel room telephoning Spain.

"The players were really good to me. Gazza, Paul Stewart, Erik Thorstvedt and Gudni Bergsson were staying at the same hotel and they took me out and about. I had a few English lessons before I decided that the best way to learn the language was by mixing with the other lads."

That may account for Nayim's unusual Cockney/Spanish accent, and he has also developed an Anglo-Spanish style of football. "I could not change my natural game, and Terry knew that, but I have learned to deal with the English style."

THE GOLDEN YEARS

Season 1920/21

Many fans considered that this was the most successful season so far in Spurs' history. We won the F.A. Cup for the second time and finished in the highest position (sixth) yet achieved in the First Division.

And this in the club's first season back in Division One following a solitary season down in the lower division.

Manager Peter McWilliam kept faith with the squad that had won the Second Division Championship the previous season but, it looked during the early weeks that the team might experience some difficulty in

acclimatising to life back at the top.

We won only one of our opening six League matches. But the situation changed after we won 1-0 at Manchester United. That was the first of four successive League victories and, after that, we shot up the table.

But it was the F.A. Cup run that dominated the campaign.

Spurs sailed comfortably through the first two rounds. Third Division Bristol Rovers could find no answer to Spurs' attacking play as Jimmy Seed, Tommy Clay, Bert Smith, Fanny Walden, Jimmy Cantrell and Bert Bliss all scored in a 6-2 Spurs' victory.

Though we faced First Division opposition in Bradford City at White Hart Lane in the next round, Spurs achieved another easy win. Jimmy Seed completed a hat-trick — scoring two within the space of as many minutes — with John Banks getting the other in a 4-0 victory.



THE GOLDEN YEARS *continued*

Things looked difficult when we went a goal down in 15 minutes away to Third Division Southend. Though Cantrell quickly equalised. Spurs had a let-off when Fairclough shot wide from the penalty spot for Southend. From that point Spurs took command and goals from Banks, Bliss and Seed made the final score 4-1.

A then record crowd of 52,000 packed White Hart Lane for the quarter-final tie with First Division rivals Aston Villa. As expected, it was a tight game with a single goal settling it. Jimmy Dimmock did the groundwork, crossing for Seed who allowed the ball to run on for Banks to side-foot home from a narrow angle.

The semi-final against Preston at Hillsborough was goalless in the opening half though Spurs had two "goals" disallowed and Dimmock hit the bar. The match was won with two Bliss goals within five minutes early in the second-half. Though Clay had the misfortune to see a shot deflected off his leg for an own-goal. Spurs held on for a deserved victory.

The final, against Second Division Wolves, was staged in pouring rain before a crowd of 72,805 at Stamford Bridge. Good football was impossible and the match was no spectacle. The only goal came from a wonderful individual effort from Dimmock. He received the ball close to the half-way line, dribbled past one defender and then appeared to lose it. But, with the luck of the bounce, Jimmy re-controlled the ball and cut in to shoot left-

footed from around 15 yards.

Dimmock was unlucky not to get a second when his shot hit the bar but a late chance fell to Wolves and it was only a critical intervention by centre-half Charles Walters, who deflected a shot for a corner, that saved the situation and ensure that the F.A. Cup came back to Tottenham for the second time in club history.

Yet it was a bitter-sweet day for outside-right Fanny Walden. What should have been the greatest day of his magnificent career turned into disappointment as he was forced to miss the game through injury sustained earlier in the season. The Spurs team was:

The Cup Final was played on April 23 so we still had five more League matches to play. Yet, the Cup success did not inspire the side for a glorious grandstand finish to the First Division.

We lost 0-2 at Huddersfield two days later and managed to win only one of those remaining games — 1-0 at home to Huddersfield.

Those poor results meant we slipped to a final position of sixth — 12 points behind Champions Burnley and seven short of runners-up Manchester City.

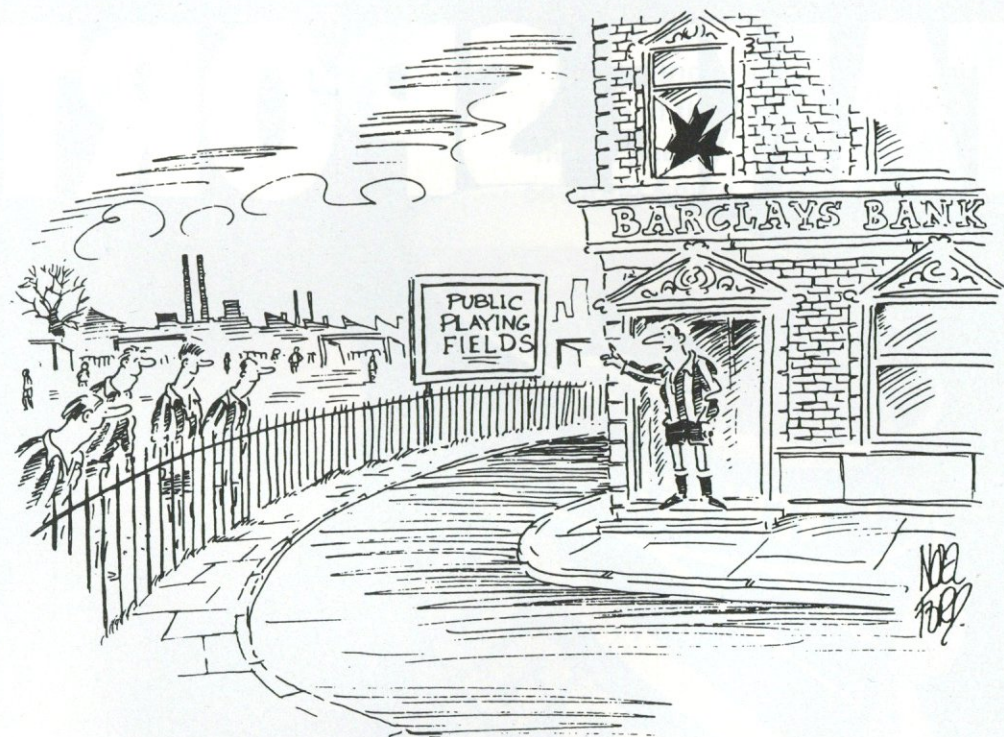

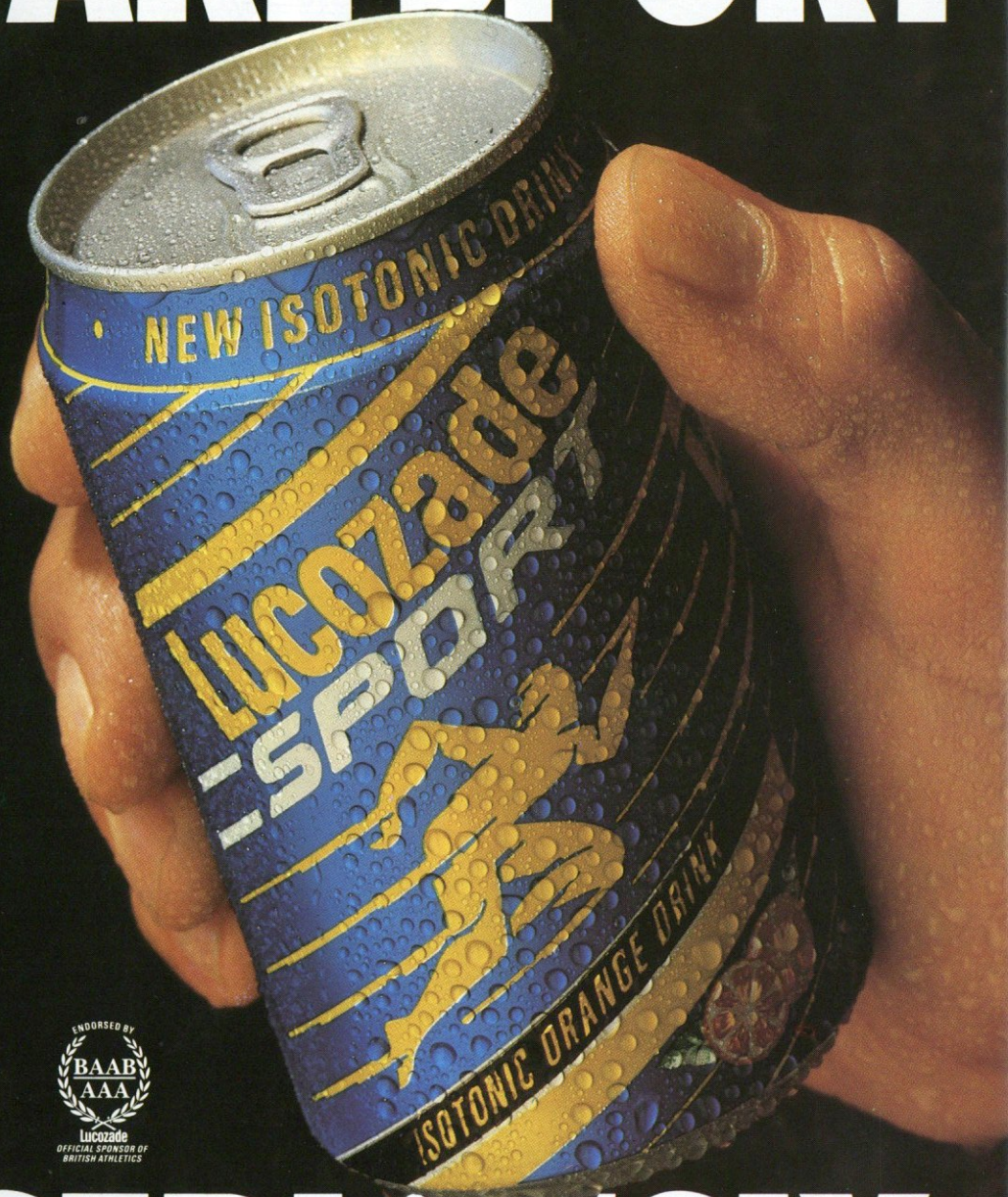

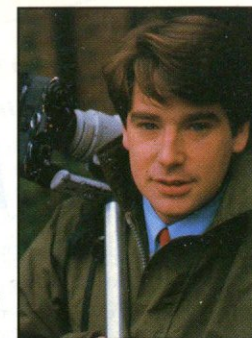

David Jacobs

Press photographers have to record events as they are, not as they would like them to be. Usually in football that presents few problems, but when tragedy strikes, like at Hillsborough, it can result in controversy and even outrage.

As the Managing Director of Action Images, one of Europe's largest football photographic agencies, David Jacobs had to decide which photographs to send to the world's press that Saturday evening. He did what he believes every professional would have done, and gave the editors free reign to choose what they wanted.

"Although we specialise in sport we are still first and foremost press photographers", says David. "We are there to tell a story to the reading public wherever there is a demand for it. Hillsborough was a terrible tragedy but I think it was important that those pictures appeared in the press to prevent such a disaster happening again."

Although he did not cover the game himself, David knew how each photographer had to work on at the risk of seeming dispassionate. "It is the decision of the newspaper editor whether or not the picture should actually be used."

"Obviously if someone needed help in front of you and it was not forthcoming you would help, but at Hillsborough for instance, there were a lot of people on hand. It is not an easy decision, but in those circumstances I believe 99% of photographers would continue to do their job."

Thankfully they are not decisions that have to be made very often. Usually the staff of Action Images have their cameras focused sharply on the pitch, and more often that not for David it is here at White Hart Lane. He is a lifelong Spurs supporter, and presumably as boss he gets first choice of venue!

The company is based in Tottenham too, and in addition to supplying the national newspapers, Action Images are one of the main contributors to the club programme. One of very few specialist football agencies in the country, the company are also photographers to a number of other top clubs.

According to David, there is a subtle difference in what the agency supplies the football clubs, and it goes beyond photographing the right team! "Obviously we have to be a bit more complimentary to the players", he explains. "We would not bother sending a picture of somebody being made to look a fool or pulling a horrible grimace."

Wherever the photographs are destined, there are usually tight deadlines to be met. So what is the typical procedure for a Saturday?

"If the pictures are needed for one of the early Sunday editions, a bike will usually collect the first set of film about 20 minutes after kick-off", explains David. "The photographer then takes the rest back to the office following the final whistle."

"On Saturday our photographers come back to base from anywhere in the UK, and then the real work starts. Film is processed, edited and duplicated for Monday's national papers and all the football magazines and relative programmes. Usually we do not finish that until four in the morning."

And by Tuesday of course, it is usually time to start all over again.

speculative shot which somehow skimmed into the bottom corner of the net for an equaliser. There was not even time to restart the game... and Atletico were well beaten in the replay.

Controversial coach Juan Carlos Lorenzo was living on borrowed time. A couple of disappointing results at the start of the following season and he was dismissed. As caretaker the club appointed former midfield star Luis and he led them to victory in the World Club Cup (Bayern Munich refusing to compete).

Luis is currently back as Atletico's coach, for the third time in his career and despite once having suffered a nervous breakdown. He is also the ninth coach Gil has employed since taking over the club in 1987 (others, of course, include Ron Atkinson and Colin Addison).

Gil spent around £130,000 of his private fortune in promoting his campaign to win the presidential election. Success duly unleashed Gil's ambitions in a remarkable voluble way.

He called a press conference to reveal plans for Jesus Gil formula one motor racing team; he threatened to fly to London to take on Mrs. Thatcher when the British government banned Liverpool's participation in Atletico's Villa de Madrid summer tournament; and he poured daily scorn on neighbours Real.

New signings swiftly followed. In 10 days Gil spent more than £3 million. Top signing was Portuguese star Paulo Futre, who cost £2 million plus the yellow Porsche which was Futre's personal demand; Cesar Menotti, Argentina's 1978 World Cup-winning coach was the first of a string of managers; later Gil swooped in spectacular style to sign Bernd Schuster when the controversial German veteran fell out with Real Madrid.

For all that, little has been achieved. Victory in the Spanish cup last season was Atletico's first success under Gil's leadership. That's why the current Cup-winners' Cup campaign was so important.

Referee, but I really can't see why you awarded that penalty."

Liverpool are the kings. Yes at football but also of this double standard rule that says no player can use foul or abusive language unless they play for Liverpool.

Yet more double standards. Gazza tries his heart out, trying to get the ball 100 per cent fairly and if he comes in late and it's a foul, he helps the player to his feet, shakes hands and gets on with the game. The commentator will say: "He really does have to cut his short fuse out of his game."

At the same time, Steve McMahon or Bryan Robson will, in full view, go over the top, have a foul awarded against them and will get up and moan at the referee. The commentator will say: "What a great competitor he is."

Even more misleading reports when we played at Portsmouth. It was claimed that Gazza's celebrations sparked off the fighting. Wrong. The trouble had been brewing the whole game and had nothing to do with Gazza.

In fact Paul went over to the fans after the game and signalled to the supporters not to fight. They didn't. That wasn't reported.

There are many other examples that come to mind of the adoption of double standards by commentators and referees - and all happened against Liverpool.

Why do we suffer in this way?

SHEFFIELD UNITED

Injury-hit Sheffield United are pinning their hopes of First Division survival upon a magical action replay! The Blades have been at the foot of the table for most of the season — just as they were at around the same time last year.

Then they won three out of four games. Later they strung together a remarkable sequence of seven consecutive victories and they eventually finished well clear of relegation danger.

But can they do that all over again? The situation has been made more difficult this term because of a series of injuries. Manager Dave Bassett called up 28 players during the club's first 19 games. He is particularly missing England striker Brian Deane and Wales midfielder Glyn Hodges.

Deane, top scorer for the past two seasons with 24 and 17, scored four times in his five games this season before dropping out. Even so, Sheffield United have been looking brighter in attack. They scored three times against the usually so sound Leeds defence — though they lost 3-4 — then, in their next game they became the first side to score four times against Nottingham Forest in a League match since March 1990!

"The trouble is that we are letting in too many goals", shrugged Mr. Bassett.

The Blades collected a mere one point from their opening eight away League games — at

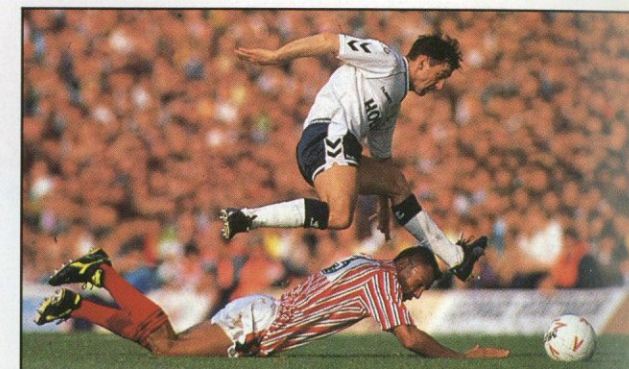
