




I'm especially pleased to welcome Luton Town because it couldn't be more appropriate that they should pay us a visit in a week when Junior Magpies celebrate their 10th birthday.

These days, of course, they have developed into Family Magpies and if you trace the organisation back to its roots, Luton played a part in starting the ball rolling.

One of my first duties after I joined the Meadow Lane staff was to travel to Kenilworth Road with representatives of the Evening Post and find out about the scheme Luton operated in conjunction with their local paper.

Although we had plenty of ideas of our own, the Luton scheme formed the basis of what we did when Junior Magpies was launched later that year - initially as a "club" exclusively for the under-16s.

At its peak, we had more than 1,000 members and although Watford used to get most of the accolades for their work in creating the "family atmosphere" in football grounds, the likes of Luton and Notts County also did a lot of good work.

Maybe that is now being recognised because we were one of four clubs recently awarded a £20,000 Jewson's Family Football Grant and that was a welcome contribution towards the £100,000 we have paid to kit-out the new Family Magpies room.

It has given me enormous satisfaction to know that Family Magpies have facilities as good as any around and it was fitting that they moved back to the Meadow Lane end during the summer.

I've always thought of that as "their" area - ever since the early days of the scheme when a dedicated group of parents worked so hard to raise the cash which enabled us to create some terracing for the Juniors.

We've come a long way since then, of course, and although the switch to Family Magpies took a while to become accepted a couple of years ago, it is now proving to be an excellent decision.

At the time of writing, we have 700 junior members - well in front of the figure at this stage last season - and our

highest ever membership of more than 200 adults.


And although the Family stand has not been reserved exclusively for Family Magpies, it's more than coincidence that it has been one of the most densely populated areas at matches so far this season.

That's great to see and no doubt the move during the summer to offer free admission to League matches for children aged 10 and under has had an affect because we currently have about 350 members in that category.


The object of the exercise is to introduce them to life at Meadow Lane at an early age and I'm pleased to say that what seems to be happening is that they are bringing their parents with them.

me towards the end of last season, what with getting in the side, scoring a few goals and of course earning myself a contract. I suppose something had to go wrong somewhere along the line.

"I've never really had a serious injury before - the worst I'd had was a twisted ankle when I was 13 - so in many ways it's been a new experience for me.

"And like nearly all players, I'm not the best at watching games from the stands. It makes it doubly frustrating when the team are struggling as well.

"But I'm really looking forward to playing again. I was able to start running again this week and hopefully I should be back to full fitness in two weeks time, if the knee holds up all right."

Matthews is expecting to have to battle to force his way back into the first-team limelight, though. "Just because I scored a few goals last season doesn't mean I'll walk straight back into the side," he says.

"But I'm really looking forward to the challenge and hopefully it won't be too long before I'm helping us mount a concerted bid for promotion.

"We may not have made the best of starts but there are still plenty of points to play for and I'm sure we'll be there or thereabouts come the end of the season."

COLIN SLATER REMEMBERS...

I am delighted that so many former Notts players, over the period of my 33 seasons (to date!) in the Press box here, remain good friends; it's a pleasure to keep in touch from time to time. But in this feature, new to the club programme this season, I shall not write about any ex-player with whom I enjoy closer personal ties than David Coates.

He is the subject of this piece because Luton Town are another of his former clubs - not as a player but on the management side, during David Pleat's first spell as manager there.

Coates is one of the relatively few players from these past three decades who has remained in the game once his playing days were over. Reflect, for example, on the fact that only two former Notts players are still on the Meadow Lane payroll: Les Bradd and Alan Young.

It was on 1st July, 1964 that Coates became one of the comparatively few post-war players to join Notts from Mansfield Town. The previous season he had made 29 League and Cup appearances for the Stags, scoring four goals.

Three of those came in a Field Mill match against Bristol City on Easter Monday - 30th March, 1964 - when Mansfield won by 4-0. It was the only hat-trick of his first-class career.

Those were the days when we hadn't invented words like mid-field players and strikers to describe players' positions. In old-fashioned language, David was a wing half-back or inside forward and, both for Mansfield and Notts, played in both roles.

He was signed for Notts by manager Eddie Lowe in the summer after the unexpected and disastrous relegation to the Fourth Division and his seasons here were all spent in the Football League

basement during probably the worst period in the club's history.

After Eddie Lowe had left County, and Andy Beattie was part of the management team, he had the inspiration of using Coates in a sweeper role, not then much in favour in the game, and it was his best time with Notts.

David was one of many players to emerge from that hotbed of soccer, the North East. His family home was at Washington, where his father was a member of the local council and one year its Chairman. David inherits his father's passionate interest in politics and current affairs and love of a keen argument.

His first club was Hull City, whom he joined in 1955 and helped to promotion to the Second Division in 1959 and it was while playing there that he met his wife, Sheila.

When he left Notts he was offered his first job on the coaching-scouting side of the game by Aston Villa manager Tommy Cummings, with whom he had played at Mansfield.

It's a sign of the uncertainty of football management that he has since been associated with several clubs. After Villa it was Leicester City (the family home has been in Leicester for many years), then Luton and, after a variety of other appointments, he is now chief scout for Peter Shilton at Plymouth Argyle. In this and other jobs he's remained a regular visitor to Meadow Lane over the years.

He's also a key organiser behind the reunion evenings held from time to time for former Notts and Mansfield players. (Memo to David Coates: It seems too long since the last one was held...!).

He is also mad on cricket, enjoying visits to Test and International matches at Trent Bridge and Lord's, in particular, each summer.

David and Sheila have two daughters, one married, living in Lancashire and qualified as a doctor. And it must be one of his greatest personal hopes that their son Stephen, still in his early teens, will follow him into professional sport... be it football or cricket!







RECORD LEAGUE VICTORY

It's 56 years since Luton chalked up their biggest League victory - a 12-0 win over Bristol Rovers in Division Three South during the 1935-36 campaign.

Joe Payne scored an incredible 10 times that day and the following season a record 55 League goals.

In fact, Luton scored 103 times in the League that season... which in itself is a club record.

Incidentally, the record for the most number of League goals scored by a Luton player in total is held by Gordon Turner, who scored 243 times from 1949 to 1963.

RECORD CUP VICTORY

Luton's record Cup victory came in the F.A. Cup in 1927 when they beat Clapton 9-0 in a first-round tie that was replayed after the initial match had been abandoned.

But perhaps the club's most memorable moment in Cup football came four years ago when they won the Littlewoods Cup, upsetting the form book to beat Arsenal in the final.

MAL'S MILESTONE

Mal Donaghy, who recently joined Chelsea from Manchester United, became Luton's most capped player during his spell with Luton earlier in his career.

He's now played more than 75 times for Northern Ireland and won 58 of his caps while at Kenilworth Road.

BOB'S 16-YEAR SERVICE

Bob Morton holds the Bedfordshire Club's record for the most number of League appearances. He turned out no less than 494 times for 'The Hatters' between 1948 and 1964.

division and re-group.

And although - like us - they seem to have been suffering from relegation blues in the early weeks of the season, there's more than enough talent at Kenilworth Road to steer them away from trouble.

They only managed one point - and one goal - in their first four matches but in recent weeks, they seem to have found their rhythm and new signing Steve Claridge will have been relieved to collect his first goal in the 3-3 draw with Tranmere.

The £175,000 striker scored 12 times last season to help Cambridge win promotion for the second successive year and Pleat will be looking to him to fill Mick Harford's boots in the months ahead.

Harford and Welsh international midfielder Mark Pembroke were Luton's two main-stays last season and it was inevitably going to make a difference when they switched to Chelsea and Derby respectively.

But with more than £1.5million banked from the sale of those two, Luton's financial situation is now far more healthy and it's a case of being patient while the youngsters develop.

Julian James and former Tottenham striker Phil Gray, a £275,000 signing in the summer of 1991, secured Luton's first win of the season at Brentford 13 days ago.

They're just two of the talented band of youngsters Pleat has at his disposal while the likes of Chris Kamara, Trevor Peake and David Preece have important roles to play this season because they are expected to set the example.

DIRECTING THE PLAY

It was at Kenilworth Road that David Pleat first made a name for himself... as a player and manager!

He began his playing career just across the River Trent at the City Ground but made only a handful of appearances before moving to Luton where he made more of a mark.

After retiring as a player, he returned to the Bedfordshire club in 1974 to take over as reserve team coach. Four years later he was made manager and in 1982 guided the club into the First Division.

He took over at Tottenham in 1986 and led them to an F.A. Cup final appearance before moving on to Leicester in December 1987. He left Filbert Street in January 1991 and within five months was back at the helm at Luton, succeeding Jim Ryan.

DES LINTON

The 21 year old defender joined Luton 11 months ago from Leicester with Scott Oakes - as part of the deal that took Steve Thompson to Filbert Street - but was injured on his debut against Manchester City and missed the rest of the season.

SCOTT OAKES

Another player who was ruled out of the closing stages of last season through injury, the 20 year old winger joined Luton from Leicester last October. Made his Football League bow in 1990 and is now regarded as one of the brightest young talents in the First Division.



ANDY PETERSON

Originally joined Luton on trial from the Australian Institute of Sport and was offered a contract at the start of the 1988-89 season. Had loan spells with Swindon and Ipswich before making his League debut for 'The Hatters' at Leicester on the opening day of this term.

JULIAN JAMES

The former England Under-21 international spent the early part of last season on loan at Preston but on his return to Kenilworth Road re-established himself at right-back. Scored on Luton's last visit to Meadow Lane... their 2-1 defeat on the final day of last season.

DARREN SALTON

Made his League debut for Luton against Leeds at Elland Road last season and is now established as a regular member of the first-team. Born in Edinburgh, he has represented Scotland at schoolboy, youth and Under-21 levels.

CHRIS KAMARA

The tough-tackling midfielder is now with his sixth club having had two spells with both Portsmouth and Swindon and having also played for Brentford, Stoke and Leeds. Moved to Kenilworth Road in October 1991 and has become a key figure in David Pleat's plans.

TREVOR PEAKE

Luton's club captain, he started his career with Lincoln before moving to Coventry where he enjoyed eight full seasons and picked up an F.A. Cup winners' medal along the way. Joined Luton for £100,000 in August 1991.

MARVIN JOHNSON

Didn't figure in Luton's first-team at all last season after rupturing an Achilles tendon but is now back in the limelight. Born in Wembley, he served his apprenticeship at Kenilworth Road and has now made more than 60 League appearances for 'The Hatters.'

JOHN DREYER

Cost Luton £140,000 from Oxford in 1988 and has represented excellent value for money. In fact, the 29 year old defender - who had loan spells with Torquay and Fulham earlier in his career - has been an ever-present for the past three seasons!

STEVE CLARIDGE

Moved to Luton from Cambridge during the summer for a tribunal set fee of £175,000. Scored 33 goals in three seasons at the Abbey Stadium and has also served Portsmouth (where he suffered a badly broken leg), Bournemouth, Crystal Palace and Aldershot.

PHIL GRAY

Signed for Luton in August 1991 for £275,000 from Tottenham but missed most of last season through injury. Never really got the chance to establish himself

at Spurs but got valuable League experience during loan spells with Barnsley and Fulham.

DAVID PREECE

Has been on Luton's books since 1984 when he moved from Walsall for £150,000. Since then he's played in two League Cup finals, made more than 220 League appearances and won three England 'B' caps. Now 29, he's made a fine start to the season.

JAMIE CAMPBELL

Only 19, the former Kenilworth Road trainee scored his first goal

for Luton on the opening day of the season against Leicester. Turned professional in the summer of 1990 but had to wait until last season before making his debut in a ZDS Cup tie.

JASON REES

Another testament to the success of Luton's youth policy, the ex-trainee made his League debut on New Year's Day in 1990 as a substitute against Everton. That same season he won his first Under-21 cap with Wales and has since represented his country at 'B' level as well.

FIFTEEN YEARS AGO

There were wholesale changes for the visit of Blackpool to Meadow Lane as Tristan Benjamin, Ian Scanlon and Alan Birchenall were all recalled to the starting line-up.

Having slipped into the Second Division relegation zone after the 5-1 defeat at Fulham, we were desperate for our first win of the season and the signs were promising when Brian Stubbs scored with a spectacular header.

But Tony Finnigan grabbed the goal which gave Blackpool a 1-1 draw and confidence could hardly have been lower.

Luton had an appointment at White Hart Lane that day and David Pleat's team were beaten 2-0 - Chris Jones and Keith Osgood getting the goals for Tottenham.


