

Luton Town were formed in 1885 by amalgamating Luton Excelsior and Luton Wanderers as an amateur organisation. Both these parent clubs had gained some repute, for the Wanderers had already entered the F.A. Cup competition, and drawn a match against the famous Old Etonians.

After a few years they became the first club in the South of England to pay its players and later joined the Southern League. Competition in this league was found to be too limited and in 1896 the club applied for admission to the Football League. They were unsuccessful, but two years later a further request met with success and they were elected to Division 2. They remained members of the league for three seasons before returning to Division One of the Southern League.

In 1920 when the Football League decided to form an extra division and they along with other members of the Southern League were invited to form Division 3. After a promising start, and overcoming several crisis including the loss of their grandstand by fire, the club made steady progress up the league table, and in 1937 won the Division 3 (S) championship. Their career in Division 2 was without any special note until 1955 when they finished in second position, and secured promotion to the 1st Division.

In 1959 they appeared for the first, and only time, in a F.A. Cup Final at Wembley, playing against Nottingham Forest. An early injury to Roy Dwight, who suffered a broken leg, saw the ten men put up a brave fight before losing by 2-1.

The following season saw the club go into decline with relegation to Division 2, followed during the next five seasons with relegation to Division 4.

Their climb back up the divisional ladder began in 1968 and six seasons later they regained their position in the top flight. Relegation and promotion were to follow during the next eight seasons and in 1988 the club appeared once again in a final at Wembley, defeating Arsenal in a thrilling encounter 3-2 to win the Littlewoods Cup.

The following season they were back at Wembley to defend the trophy but were defeated by Nottingham Forest. Last season saw the club relegated to the new First Division, and the departure of some top class players could make their task of a quick return a little harder to accomplish.

During season 1936 in a fixture against Bristol Rovers the clubs centre forward, Joe Payne scored ten goals in a 12-0 victory, establishing a club and national record never likely to be equalled.


DAVID PLEAT

Manager. Born Nottingham. January 15th 1945. Had a long playing career with Nottingham Forest, Luton Town, Shrewsbury Town, Exeter City and Peterborough United. Began his managerial career at Nuneaton Borough, later moving to Luton Town as their coach. Became manager at Kenilworth Road winning the Division 2 championship in 1982. Left to join Tottenham Hotspur whom he steered to the Cup Final in 1987, but was relieved of his post earlier the following season. Replaced Bryan Hamilton at Filbert Street Leicester in December 1987, where he remained for three seasons before returning to Luton, for the third time, in June 1991.




TREVOR PEAKE

Defender. Born Nuneaton. February 10th, 1957. Ht. 6'. Joined Lincoln City from non-league Nuneaton Borough. After completing over 150 league appearances for Lincoln he joined Coventry City in 1983. He enjoyed eight full seasons at Highfield Road, and played in their successful F.A. Cup winning team when they defeated Tottenham Hotspur by 3-2. Joined Luton during the close season of 1991 for £100,000 and is now the club captain.



PHILLIP GRAY

Forward. Born Belfast. October 2nd, 1968. Ht 5' 10". Developed in the junior and reserve sides at Tottenham before making his debut as a substitute in the final league game against Luton in 1988.




He was unable to establish a regular first team place at White Hart Lane and had loan spells with Barnsley and Fulham. Moved to Kenilworth Road in August 1991 for a £275,000 fee, but unfortunately missed most of last season through injury.

DAVID PREECE

Midfield. Born Bridgnorth. May 28th 1963. Ht 5' 5". David made his league debut for Walsall in 1981 and became a regular first team choice two seasons later - completing over 100 league appearances. Joined Luton in 1984 and has played in two league cup finals for the Hatters. Capped three times for England 'B', this stockily built player is very skillful with good ball control.

FRED LEE



ANDY PETTERSON (Goalkeeper). Born Freemantle, Australia. September 26th, 1969. Ht 6' 1". Came to Luton Town on trial from the Australian Institute of Sports and made such a good impression he was offered a contract at the beginning of 1988/9 season. Failed to make any immediate headway at Luton and went on loan to Swindon and Ipswich. The start of the present season saw him make his league debut playing against Leicester City and he has kept hold of the first team goalkeeping spot. An Australia Youth International.

JULIAN JAMES (Defender). Born Tring. March 22nd 1970. Ht 5' 10". Progressed through the junior ranks at Kenilworth Road and made his debut in the First Division four seasons ago. Made steady progress but was allowed to join Preston North End at the beginning of last season on loan. Since his return he has established himself as a first team regular at right-back.

RICHARD HARVEY (Defender). Born Letchworth. April 17th 1969. Ht 5' 9". Joined the club as an apprentice and made his debut as a 17-year-old in 1986. Failed to make a first team appearance the following season but has since become a regular member of the first team, commanding the left-back spot for the whole of last season.

SCOTT OAKES (Midfield). Born Leicester. August 5th 1972. Ht 5' 10". This young player completed his early training with his home town club - Leicester City - making three first team appearances. Joined the Hatters in a double transfer with Des Linton that saw Luton defender Steve Thompson move to Filbert Street. Has given some impressive performances on the right wing but was ruled out of the final stages of last season with injury.

PAUL TELFER (Midfield). Born Edinburgh. October 21st, 1971. Ht 5' 9". Another product to emerge from the club's junior ranks, making his debut as a substitute at Goodison Park, Everton towards the end of season 1990/1. Established himself in the midfield last season, but the club's injury jinx ruled him out of the game for the last four months of the season.

KURT NOGAN (Forward). Born Cardiff. September 9th, 1970. Ht 5' 10". A Welsh Under-21 International who is the brother of Lee, who plays for Watford. Made his league debut in 1989/90 and has proved to be a prolific goalscorer in the club's reserve side. Has yet to establish himself as a first team regular, but form shows his opportunity will shortly come.

STEVE CLARIDGE (Forward). Born Portsmouth. April 10th 1966. Ht 5' 11". Began his career at Fratton Park, Portsmouth but was released after sustaining a serious leg break. He began his come-back with Fareham Town, later playing for Bournemouth, Weymouth, Crystal Palace,

Aldershot and Cambridge United. Scoring 33 goals in three seasons while at Cambridge he helped the club in their rise to Division 2. Joined the Hatters during the close season for a tribunal fixed fee of £160,000.

JOHN DREYER (Defender). Born Alnwick. June 13th, 1963. Ht 6'. An apprentice with Oxford United. Played his first league soccer with Torquay United and Fulham whilst on loan in 1985/6. Received his first opportunity at Oxford the following season. Moved to Luton in 1985 and has been an ever-present over the last three seasons.

DES LINTON (Defender). Born Birmingham. September 5th, 1971. Ht 6' 1". Signed by Luton Town from Leicester City in October 1991 along with Scott Oakes. Had the misfortune to pick up an injury in his debut game against Manchester City which consequently caused him to miss the remainder of the season.

DARREN SALTON (Forward). Born Edinburgh. March 16th, 1972. Ht 6' 1". This well built young player progressed through the clubs junior and reserve ranks, making his debut as a substitute at Elland Road, Leeds. Made a further two appearances during last season's campaign and is now pressing hard for a regular first team place.

JASON REES (Midfield). Born Pontypridd. December 22nd 1969. Ht 5' 5". An ex-trainee who made his league debut on New Year's Day as a substitute against Everton. Later in the season represented Wales at Under-21 level playing against England. Has since been capped by Wales B and has made 40 league appearances for the club at the start of the present season.

CERI HUGHES (Midfield). Born Rhondda Valley. February 26th, 1971. Ht 5' 9". Made his club debut last season against Aston Villa. A series of injuries wrecked the remainder of last season, but has been tipped as having a bright future in the game.

JAMIE CAMPBELL (Forward). Born Birmingham. October 21st, 1972. Ht 6' 1". Another product of the clubs youth programme who signed professional forms in July 1990. Played his first senior game at Ipswich last season in a Zenith Data cup tie. Scored his first goal for the club in the opening game this season at Leicester.

CHRIS KAMARA (Midfield). Born Middlesbrough. December 25th, 1957. Ht 6' 1". An experienced player who joined the club from Leeds United in October, 1991. He began his career at Portmouth before moving to Swindon Town. He later re-joined Portmouth for a season before moving to Brentford. He returned to Swindon for a second spell spending three seasons at the County Ground, later joining Stoke City and Leeds United.

Luton's last visit to Home Park in 1976 showed them in a position very similar to the present. Relegated from Division 1 two seasons previous, the club were looking to improve on their seventh position in Division 2 the previous season. Argyle were finding the early stages of the season 1976/7 rather unprofitable with only one win to their credit prior to this game.

The early stages of the match saw both defenses well in command with the home sides main threat coming from the wings, with Brian Hall providing some fine runs. Midway through the half Argyle were awarded a penalty which was converted by Brian Johnson - a lead they held up to the interval. Luton made some concentrated attacks during the second period with Ron Futcher and Lou Fuccillo combining well, ably supported by Jimmy Husband, and only resolute defence by Delve, Sutton and Green kept the visitors from scoring the all-important equalising goal.

Sadly the season's end saw Argyle fall into Division 3 whilst Luton finished in sixth position, one place better than the previous season.



Argyle's hopes of an improvement in their away form were dashed in the 35th minute when full back Gary Poole was sent off for an innocuous foul after previously being booked for a similarly minor offense.

Until then Argyle had looked composed and appeared to have a good chance of pulling off their first away win of the season with Dave Regis showing a few encouraging touches in attack.

Teenager Marc Edworthy had another good game at central defence where he was partnered by skipper Nicky Marker, deputising for the injured Andy Morrison.

But the loss of Poole forced a re-shuffle with Steve McCall switching from midfield to take over at right back.

Argyle held out until the interval, but Fulham cashed in after the break with Gary Brazil opening the scoring with a low angled shot in the 48th minute.

Central defender Gavin Nebbeling added the second in the 65th minute and Brazil was on target again 10 minutes later. Only some good goalkeeping by Peter Shilton, who was 43 the previous day, prevented Fulham from taking an ever bigger lead.

Substitute Dwight Marshall replaced Regis at the interval and had an impressive second half with a few lively runs on the right which resulted in the opening for Argyle's late consolation goal.

Marshall turned the ball in from the right and Paul Adcock celebrated his first starting appearance of the season by forcing the ball home at close range seven minutes from the end.

Argyle set up an exciting deciding leg in the second round of the Coca-Cola League Cup with a well deserved draw in the first leg at Luton.

It looked ominous for Argyle when Luton raced into a 10th minute lead, but Argyle came back strongly thanks to the powerful finishing of the rejuvenated Dave Regis and went close to snatching an advantage to bring back to Home Park.

Steve Claridge headed Luton in front when he cashed in on some slack marking but Argyle settled well after this early setback.

Gary Poole, taking over the captaincy from Nicky Marker, linked well with Craig Skinner, who had an impressive game on his first appearance since joining Argyle permanently as part of the Marker deal. Argyle also had Keith Hill taking the eye with a composed performance at the heart of defence after being signed from Blackburn the previous day.

But it was Regis who emerged as the unlikely hero with two vital second half goals. He equalised in the 50th minute when he shot past goalkeeper Andy Petterson after running onto a through ball from attack-minded midfielder Warren Joyce.

Kevin Nugent, showing signs of striking a useful partnership with Regis, nearly scored in the 70th minute with an angled shot which Petterson was unable to hold and Regis was alert to follow up and force the ball home.

Claridge equalised five minutes later but Argyle can be pleased at finishing the away leg on level terms with a couple of away goals in the bag.





TRAVELLING BY CAR.

Born Isle of Wight, November 9th, 1943. Keith began his football with Ryde, on the Isle of Wight, and played for Hampshire and England Grammar Schools before being approached by Portsmouth.

He joined Pompey in 1962 but failed to make the first team in his 18 months at Fratton Park and eventually transferred to Grimsby. He only spent one season at Blundell Park before moving to Stockport County for whom he made 49 appearances, scoring 16 goals.

Luton Town noted his progress and a move to Kenilworth Road followed next.

Keith was to make over 100 appearances for the Hatters and was an ever-present in their promotion side of 1969/70.

In 1970 he was enticed to Home Park by Ellis Stuttard, costing Argyle a £10,000 fee.

He made his debut against Tranmere Rovers on the first day of the season and only missed one game that season. He



played a total of 78, plus 5 substitute, League and Cup appearances for the Pilgrims scoring 10 goals before he retired from the game.

Keith spent the next five years working for Gibbs, as a sales representative, selling toiletries and a further five years with Wadham Stringer and today he is the manager at A1 Carpets.

Keith's attentions turned to his other love - cricket - and he and Jim Furnell were often in the local news for their exploits with Roborough before Keith joined Plymstock, for whom he still plays, 18 years later.






Both these publications are on sale in the club shop priced £1.50 for Plymouth Argyle FC 1920-1992 and £2.00 for the Travel Guide.




FAREWELL NICKY

Nicky was born in Budleigh Salterton May 3rd, 1965. While completing his education at Exmouth Comprehensive School he joined Budleigh Salterton Football Club playing in the Exeter and District League. In 1978 at the age of 13 years he was invited to St James' Park, Exeter for trials and on completion was immediately signed by the club on schoolboy forms.

At 15 years of age he was playing for Exeter City reserves and the following season, whilst still an apprentice, he became a first team member. He developed as a strong centre-half with the club, but always retained his attacking tendencies, and during his stay at St James' Park he wore a number of different shirts, but always displayed his best qualities playing in defence with strength in the air and on the ground.

When brought to Home Park, by Manager Dave Smith, he was wearing the number four shirt at Exeter but since has been wearing various numbers but always performing with vigour.

This season has once again seen him display his versatility when he took over the goalkeeping responsibilities at Boothferry Park, Hull. He made his league debut for Exeter City against Burnley in October, 1981 and completed 196 league appearances and six substitute appearances, plus 19 appearances in cup competitions.

During the 1989/90 season he took over the captaincy at Home Park from Tommy Tynan and was voted Player of the Year by the club supporters.

He made his Argyle debut in a 1-1 draw at the County Ground, Swindon.

One outstanding memory for Nicky in his footballing career was marking Ian Rush in a League Cup game in 1981.

Married to Liz they have a baby daughter, Gemma, and are happily settled on the outskirts of Plymouth.

A TRIBUTE TO NICKY MARKER

Since this article was written, Nicky has figured in Plymouth Argyle's record transfer with a move to Premier Club Blackburn Rovers.

I am sure everyone would like to wish him and his family every success in their move, and that he will soon be making his mark in one of the leading clubs in the country at present.

Having played all his early football in the lower leagues since the start of his career he thoroughly deserves the opportunity to play in the top flight of the Football League.

During his years at Argyle he has proved to be a good ambassador both on and off the field of play, with his quiet approach to all situations. Good luck Nicky and take all our best wishes from the Westcountry to Ewood Park with you.





PULIS CONFIDENT

Cherries manager Tony Pulis believes that his side is not far short of being able to challenge for a promotion spot, especially when the injury list at Dean Court clears up. We can survive on these sort of gates but I am going to sell our best players in order to balance the books. Additional funds could help me to change particular situations around the club that need changing. Fulham's average gate this season is 5623.

BAGGIES SET TO CLIMB

West Brom continued their excellent start to the season with a 2-0 win over Exeter at the Hawthorns last week. Albion keeper Stuart Naylor believes that it will be increasingly difficult for the Baggies as the season progresses "For many of our rivals coming to the Hawthorns is their Cup Final, because of this we have to ensure that we become a feared side that nobody fancies playing. We have Premier League qualifications off the field and now we've got to produce the same effect on it".







5 YEARS AGO 1987-88

After two consecutive heavy defeats Argyle could have expected to get back into the groove when they visited Peterborough in the 1st Leg of the 2nd Round of the League Cup but they were comprehensively beaten 4-1 at London Road with Tommy Tynan scoring their solitary goal.

A return to Home Park and another Tynan goal brought a 1-1 draw against Birmingham City for whom a Gerry McElhinney own goal brought them a fortunate equaliser.

10 YEARS AGO 1982-83

Argyle hit a disastrous spell of four defeats in 19 days without scoring one goal. Bristol Rovers came to Home Park and won 4-0, quickly followed by defeats at Wigan (3-0) and Bradford City (0-4) before returning to Home Park where a paltry crowd of 2,921 saw Lincoln City win 2-0.

20 YEARS AGO 1972-73

Argyle's fifth successive defeat, 0-3 at Charlton, put them joint bottom of the Third Division and this disastrous run was halted three days later when Jimmy Hinch's goal at Scunthorpe gave the 'Gyles a 1-1 draw.

But the damage had been done and Ellis Stuttart agreed to revert to the position of chief scout to make way for the appointment of Tony Waiters as Argyle manager.
