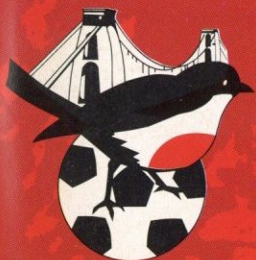

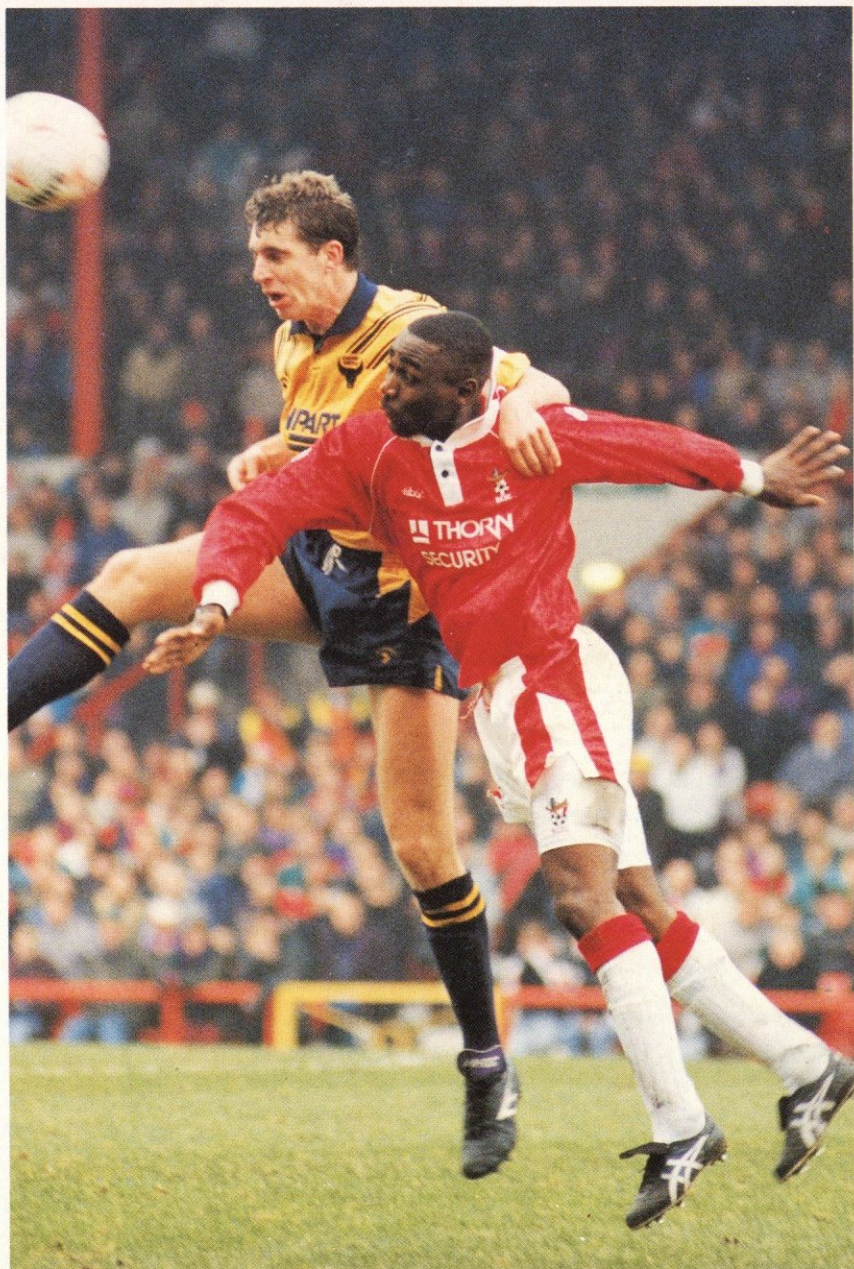

Despite this being the fourth meeting of the two sides this season, this afternoon's game is the first at Ashton Gate.

Certainly the two sides have got to know each other pretty well after meeting in the League, the Anglo-Italian Cup and most recently the FA Cup. So far, honours are even as regards the results with City winning the League encounter 3 - 0, drawing 1 - 1 in the Anglo-Italian Cup with Luton delivering a 2 - 0 Third Round FA Cup knock-out blow eleven days ago.

Manager David Pleat, now in his second spell in charge at the club,

had to make many changes last season, experienced players having to be sold to raise capital as financial pressures mounted.

As a result, this campaign began with seven of the starting line-up being players of 22 years of age and under. With any young side, it takes time to forge relationships and team understanding. The experience of David Preece and Trevor Peake has helped to bring on the youngsters and until last Saturday when they were thrashed 5 - 1 at home by Derby County in the FA Cup, recent results suggested that there is more belief in the young team.

That belief is going to be important

in the weeks ahead if Luton are to avoid a second successive relegation. In addition, survival could also depend on an improvement in their home form.

The Hatters have won only one of their first eleven home League games and have managed only twelve goals at Kenilworth Road in those games.

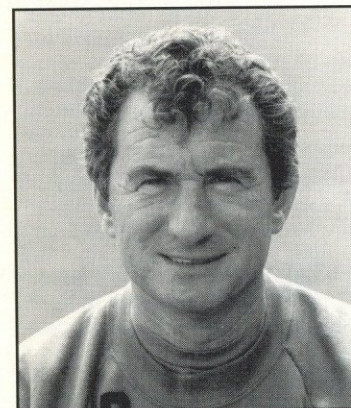
Today's game is of vital importance to both clubs in their bid for First Division survival. Following their 3 - 0 win at Kenilworth Road in August, City will be looking for their first 'League Double' of the season but they know that the visitors will make it difficult for them this afternoon.

Let us take a look at the Luton squad:

The goalkeeping duties have been shared this season. Twenty year old **Andy Petterson** started the campaign as first choice. Andy originally came to the club on trial from the Australian Institute of Sport, and was offered a contract four seasons ago. An Australian Youth international, he has now lost out to the more experienced **Alec Chamberlain**.

He spent the early part of this season on loan at Chelsea but until that time had been first choice at Kenilworth Road since his transfer from Everton for a fee of £150,000 in July 1988.

At full-back, **Julian James** has played on the left side. He joined the club as a trainee and was introduced to First Division football four years ago. An England Under 21 international, he lost his place at the start of the season and was loaned to Preston. He soon re-established himself on his return and has captained the side when **Trevor Peake** has been absent.

Peake started his career at Lincoln in 1979 before moving to Coventry four years later. He had eight full seasons at Highfield Road and won an FA Cup Winners' medal in 1987. He was signed by Luton in August 1991 for £100,000 and has been the kingpin of the defence.

He had worked up an understanding with young **Darren Salton** at the

heart of the defence but sadly the 20 year old Scott who was capped by his country at Under 21 level was badly injured in a car accident.

Former Oxford defender **John Dreyer** has been a regular at Luton since his £140,000 transfer from the Manor Ground in 1988. John can play at the heart of the defence or at full-back and has been an ever-present for the past three seasons.

Like Dreyer, **Marvin Johnson** is another player who can play anywhere across the back line. He made his League debut almost five years ago and established himself as a regular until last season when he ruptured an achilles tendon. Happily he is now back in the squad.

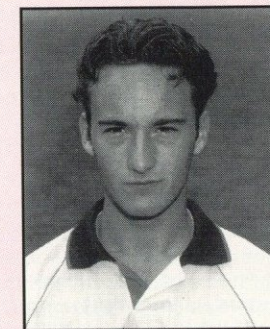
Former England Youth international **Richard Harvey** was a regular at left-back last season but was unable to force himself into the side this term, having a spell on loan at Blackpool in November.

In midfield, the experienced **David Preece** is a most important player. He's been at Kenilworth Road for eight years and played in both League Cup Finals for the Hatters. An England 'B' international, he is likely to be joined in midfield by youngsters **Jason Rees** and **Ceri Hughes**.

Both Welshmen, they have both represented their country at Under 21 level and Hughes has also won a full cap. Ex-trainee Jason has been a regular this season while Ceri has had to battle against injury. Indeed, he saw last season and the early part of this wrecked by a series of long injuries. Tipped as having a very bright future in the game, Ceri will be hoping to steer clear of any more bad luck.

Two other youngsters **Scott Oakes** and **Paul Telfer** are also in contention for places. Oakes, Our 'One to Watch' came from Leicester City and operates down the right. He, too, has had injury problems which have restricted his appearances while Telfer, a Scot, is a former trainee who made his debut two seasons ago. Another right sided player he is also fit again after

Leicester-born, Scott began his career with his home town club. He developed in the junior teams at Filbert Street and made his debut for The Foxes in 1990.

It was in October 1991 that he joined Luton along with Des Linton and quickly got an opportunity in the Hatters' first team.

Twenty year old, Scott has a lot of pace and his good control makes him a threat to most First Division defences.

Last season, despite Luton's struggles in the top flight, he made an impressive impact on the right wing and his exciting wing play made him a firm favourite with the fans.

Injury ruled him out of the final stages of last season, and on occasions this season, he has been on the bench.

A provider rather than a goalscorer, Scott could have an important part to play for the remainder of this season as Luton fight for First Division survival.

the Luton injury jinx ruled him out at the end of last season.

Eighteen year old **Aaron Skelton** has made tremendous strides in the past year and has been drafted into the first team squad on several occasions this season, making his debut in November after only two reserve team outings.

Goals have not been exactly plentiful but **Philip Gray** has hit a goalscoring purple patch which brought him a recall to the Northern Ireland team last November. A former Tottenham junior, he joined Luton for £275,000 in August 1991.

Latest signing, **Ian Benjamin** has served nine clubs. He came to the club in November from Southend United for a fee set by tribunal. In recent weeks he's been on the substitute's bench.

Another product of the club's successful youth set-up, **Martin Williams** has showed that he can score goals at reserve team level and is pressing for inclusion, while another former trainee **Jamie Campbell** has made his mark this season, scoring his first senior goal the opening day of the season.

10 YEARS ON ...

Disappointment

"Five dramatic, tense matches in the 16 most gripping days I can recall over 30 years watching Bristol football" - that was how I described the Third Division play-offs in 1988. But before they started Joe Jordan was rewarded by being granted a two-year contract by a grateful and relieved Bristol City board. He earned his first crack of management because the team won seven and drew two of the eleven matches he was in charge he was in charge of after the departure of Terry Cooper. Gracious Cooper, who became Exeter City's manager, said: "City wouldn't have done it had I remained in charge. Joe gave the players a lift and thoroughly deserves the job on a full-time basis, whatever happens in the play-offs."

City, as the team that scraped in as fifth team, were paired with Sheffield United, who finished third from bottom in the Second Division, for the semi-final.

The first match was at Ashton Gate on Sunday May 15th - and the fans rallied round. When the game started at 6pm, the attendance was 25,335. Alan Walsh, who finished the regular season as leading scorer with 12, netted the only goal of the game in the 43rd minute to give City an ideal start for the second leg at Bramall Lane the following Wednesday. Peter Withe, United's veteran former England striker, spent several days in hospital in Bristol after suffering a fractured cheekbone in a collision with Glenn Humphries.

Jordan took the City players to watch AC Milan beat Manchester United 3 - 2 in an exhibition match at Old Trafford the night before the game. City were forced to make a change as Steve Neville's hamstring injury finally let him down. Carl Shutt, formerly at Sheffield Wednesday, was drafted in - and shattered his home-town club by giving City the lead in the 17th minute.

His first goal since New Year's Day meant United had to score three times. They managed one with a looping header by Colin Morris over former United 'keeper Keith Waugh's head in the 47th minute. But City held out well.

"I've been excommunicated in my home town," said Shutt whose goal sentenced United to relegation. Walsall striker David Kelly scored twice in a 3 - 1 win at Notts County and a 1 - 1 draw at Fellows Park saw the Midlanders through to the final against City.

The first match was at Ashton Gate on May 25th when 25,128 supporters made it a festive occasion. But there had been a major row in the days leading up to the game.

Colin Gordon, whose four goals in 10 games had helped City reach the play-offs, had come to the end of his two-month loan from Reading, who were unwilling to extend his loan, demanding a £70,000 fee for his transfer.

City were reluctant to negotiate with Reading manager Ian Branfoot at that stage so a recovered Neville returned. Everything was going according to plan when a free kick by Walsh gave City a 38th minute lead. But the equaliser came in the 63rd minute when an Andy Llewellyn clearance struck Waugh and rebounded for an own goal.

In the 79th and 89th minutes Kelly, the Eire international being trailed by the big clubs, scored twice to make it 3 - 1 and leave Ashton Gate in a state of depression. But Jordan refused to give up and, as a last resort, picked himself for the second leg - his first full game for five months.

He was inspirational and gave a man of the match display. Rob Newman headed in a Walsh corner after 30 minutes and Shutt scored the second in the 66th minute after approach play by Steve Galliers and Steve

McClaren. The aggregate scores were level.

This meant a third match decider. A penalty shoot-out was held to decide whether City would return to Fellows Park on Monday, the May Bank Holiday, or host the game at Ashton Gate. Walsall won.

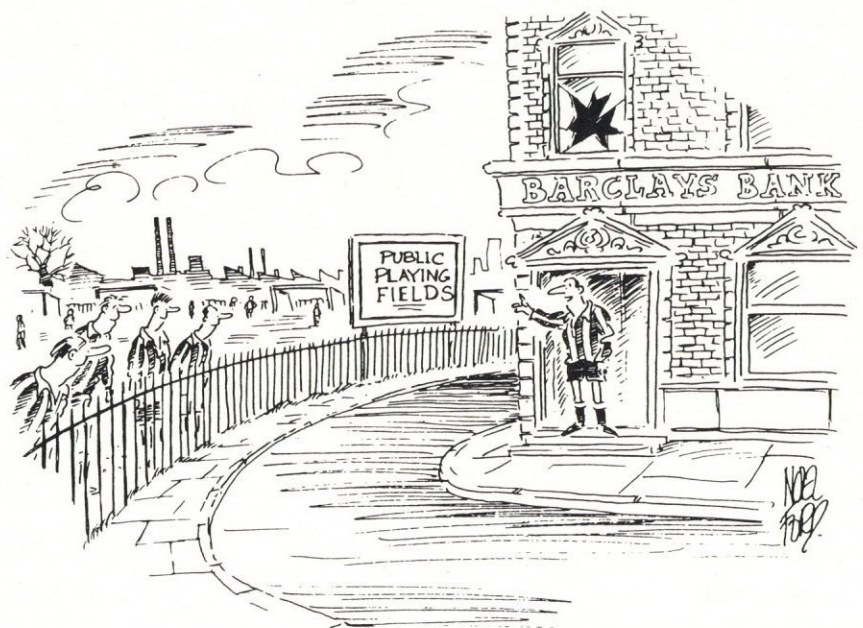
City's 4,000 ticket allocation was snapped up in minutes when they went on sale at Ashton Gate. There was tremendous optimism that City had finally got the measure of the Midlanders.

But City were handed their biggest shock of the season. Walsall's star man Kelly seized on a defensive misunderstanding to score in the 11th minute. He then struck again six minutes later.


When Phil Hawker headed in the third, City were vanquished after 19 sorry minutes. The rest of the game was academic and Kelly completed his hat-trick in the 63rd minute.

To make matters worse Shutt was sent off two minutes from time after fouling goalkeeper Fred Barber. It was City's heaviest defeat for almost three years.

"We paid for poor defending," said dejected Jordan. "It was a sickening way to end the season."

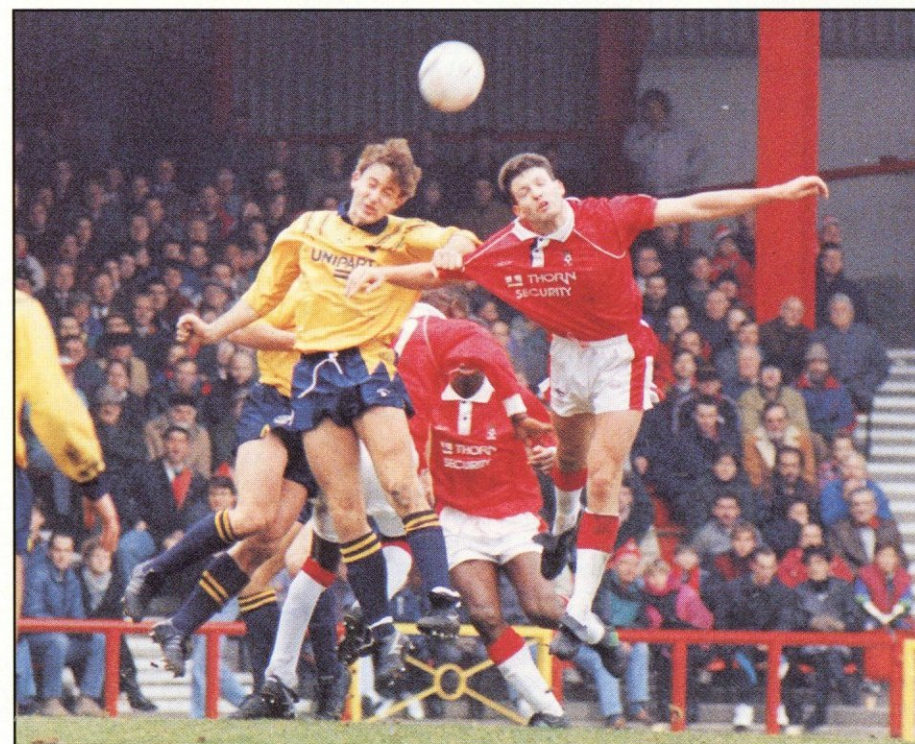

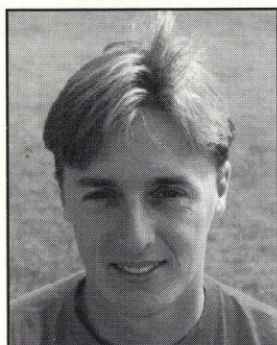

I look for everyone's support and most of all ask you to get behind the team and continue the marvellous support you always give to the club.

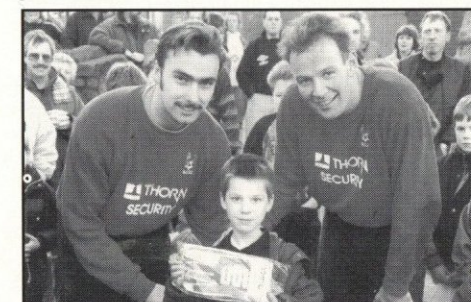

LERROY ROSENIOR

Leroy Rosenior became the club's latest international when he made his debut for Sierra Leone against Togo in an African Nations Cup game in West Africa earlier this month.

The 28 year old striker, who had been Andrew Cole's regular striking partner, played well in a goal-less draw, watched by a crowd 45,000. The match was switched to Guinea because Sierra Leone's national stadium was being refurbished.

Leroy was surprisingly called up because his parents come from Sierra Leone although he was born in Clapham, London.

Further international opportunities may come his way as there are three more qualifying games, all away. The top two sides in each group qualify for the finals in Tunisia in 1994.

"Whether I play will depend on Bristol City's requirements," he said. "The next internationals are over the Easter period so I don't think I will be released."

Leroy's career started as a 17 year old at Fulham where he scored 16 goals in 54 games before being transferred to Queen's Park Rangers for £100,000.

But two years later he was on his way back to Craven Cottage for a similar fee. He enjoyed a remarkable scoring spell, 20 goals in 34 outings, to make QPR wonder whether they had made a mistake to let him go.

That proved to be Fulham's good fortune for, eight months after returning, he was sold to West Ham United for £275,000. He remained at Upton Park for four years, although he did go back to Fulham for a spell on loan.

His career was seriously disrupted by knee trouble. He had four operations on his right knee, starting three years ago, and he was told he should give the game up.

But Leroy had other ideas. He was forced to change the way he ran. He went to a Rehabilitation Centre and, with the aid of a treadmill and video, worked at his running.

"I lost speed naturally, but I have a lot more power in my running now," he said. "It saved my career. I love the game."

"If I had been forced to pack in, I would have tried to do something else within football."

He holds the full FA coaching badge and his future could well be in this area. He has another year of his contract to run.

Although he lost his place to Wayne Allison after coming back from the international, he says he has been reasonably pleased with the way he has played this season.

"I could have done with a few more goals," he admits. "But that should come for the strikers because we are now playing with two wide men."

Missed chances have been an all too familiar story for the first team this season - and its been a similar tale for the reserves in recent Football Combination games.

On the plus side it was good to see Mike Wyatt from our successful youth team having a sound game on the right flank. Sadly, by the time another of our promising youngsters, Jason Fowler, appeared as a second half substitute Oxford were in control and he had little chance to shine.

The worst of our recent performances was definitely the 4 - 2 home defeat by Southampton in which we fielded a more experienced team than them and should have been strong enough to come out on top.

Ironically, we beat Southampton at their place with a younger side than they put out so the result at Ashton Gate balanced things up.

Rob Edwards gave us the lead, but Saints hit back with three goals before Shaun Rouse reduced the arrears. The result was settled by a late strike for the visitors and we didn't come out with much credit.

These notes were written before Wednesday night's home game with Watford so I can only express the hope that we picked up the points.

The aim in the coming weeks has to be to improve our placing in the Combination while hopefully giving more opportunities to the younger players on the staff pressing for a chance.

Do get along to see the reserves if you can. We really appreciate your support and the matches are invariably entertaining.

There is little doubt that the previous Monday's victory over Swansea in the FA Youth Cup had restored some of the lost confidence, and considering the conditions, we played some good football.

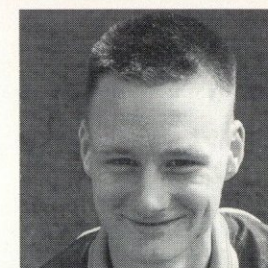
Once again the goals came from Paul Milsom and Stuart Duffin, but the outstanding player against Reading was Mike Wyatt.

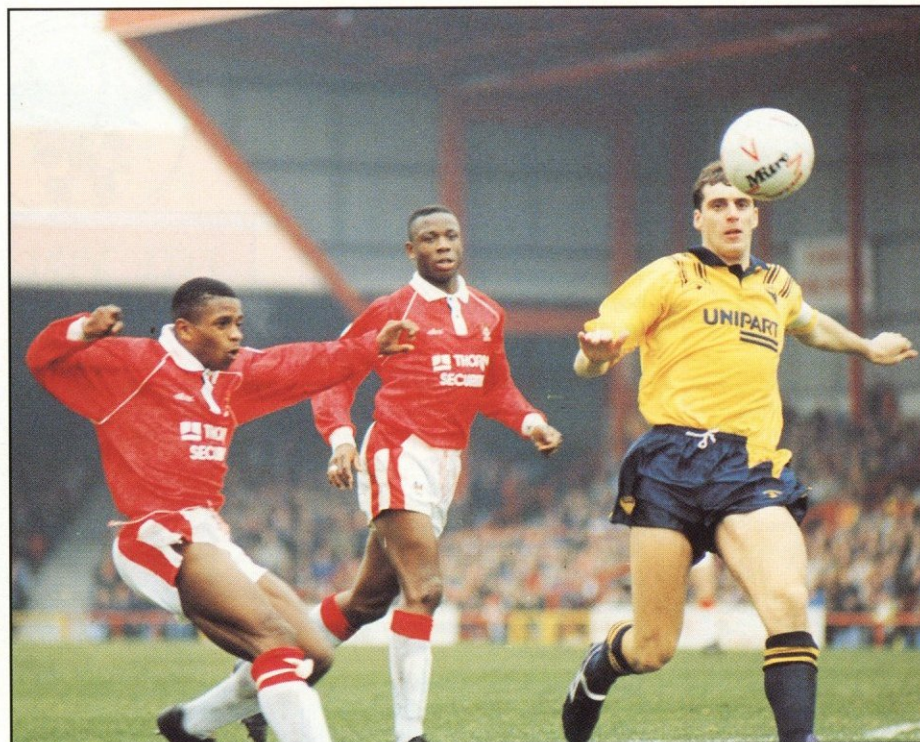
