MANAGER'S VIEWPOINT BY DAVID PLEAT

Welcome to our visitors Bristol Rovers. They have had a more than fascinating last few seasons, coping remarkably well with their switching to Bath. The management changes this season have only given further ammunition for those who suggest that stability is the most important requirement at a football club.

If John Ward has succeeded in accepting the invitation to manage Rovers we wish him well. At Watford he was a strong rival but a polite and thinking coach, qualities which Graham Taylor appreciated.

No-one can under-estimate the importance of this afternoon's game. Three points in our favour will go a long way to help us achieve a target that at one time looked terribly difficult. By the same token Rovers' season will be kept more than alive if they can be successful.

The crunch time of congestion of games is now upon us. Hard grounds only hinder the chances of players being able to shield minor knocks. Last Saturday at Grimsby I felt we looked and played one degree under. Trevor Peake was missing and his influence was missed. David Greene has a vital game under his belt but some of the younger element failed to maintain recent performances.

It is very difficult for young players to be consistently good and it is more difficult to give them a rest if we

haven't the depth of squad to cope. It is for this reason that we were trying earlier this week to retain the loan of Kerry Dixon. I believe his partnership with Gray has some potential and it has been important because Ian Benjamin has had recent niggly neck

and groin injuries. Because of this situation, a possible loan of John Hartson to Hartlepool United is likely to be withheld.

Our youth team continue to show good signs. In recent weeks Matthew Woolgar, Paul McLaren, Aaron Skelton and Neil Butler have all played representative football for the Football Association XI's against the Combined Services and the Public Schools XI's.

A win would be a tremendous boost as last week Millwall knocked Nottingham Forest out of the F.A. Youth Cup 3-2 in a replay, reaching the semi finals.

After the win against Oxford our supporters will be delighted to know that David Moss and Brian Horton were complimentary about our younger players... Raddy Antic took up the manager's job at Oviedo last week in Spain... Our ex-centre-back Stacey North has sadly had to retire from the game... "Overseas visitors join in the community spirit"


William Austin Junior School, our latest guests in the community scheme, are joined by French students from Bussy.



YOUTH TEAM UPDATE WITH TERRY WESTLEY

Since our last interview with coach Terry Westley in December, our youth team have made positive strides, rapidly climbing the South East Counties League table and reaching the semi-final of the Southern Junior Floodlit Cup. We found out from Terry the reasons behind this upturn in fortunes.

"Our results simply revolve around who is available," stated Terry. "If I play schoolboys and first year apprentices it makes the games more difficult to win because you find yourselves in situations where you have 18-year-old boys playing against 15-year-olds."

"Recently, we have been able to play some schoolboys alongside second-year apprentices and that is why our results have improved. The older lads have more experience and can carry the schoolboys if need be. They know what to expect and give the younger players around them encouragement."

Recent results include impressive victories against champions Wimbledon 3-2, and a 1-0 win at Bristol City, who are currently third. Reaching the Southern Junior Floodlit Cup semi-final is also a major achievement for Westley's side, a side which boasts three players who have already been offered professional forms.

"John Hartson, Aaron Skelton and Richard Philp are three players so far who have been offered professional contracts, which is a very good return," he continued. "Our results have also proved that we have some very good players at the club. If I had my strongest team out every week, we would be very close to the top."

For Terry, however, producing Luton players of the future is of paramount importance. "Being successful is nice but producing players is my main aim," he continued. "It is my job to try and improve and develop players so they are good enough to progress to professional level."

Town fans have a chance to see the possible Luton stars of the future on Monday (March 22), when the youth side entertain Millwall in that Southern Junior Floodlit Cup semi-final at Kenilworth Road, kick-off 7.00 pm. It is a game which Terry is looking forward to and he hopes the local public will turn out in force to support the lads.

He said: "We have had impressive results against Tottenham, Coventry and Chelsea in previous rounds and we hope to continue the run and get into the final."

"Millwall are a very good side though and are currently top of the South East Counties League Division One table and have also reached the semi-final of the FA Youth Cup, so we know we are in for a tough match."


"Supporters will get the chance to see our strongest side in action - names they will have heard of, such as Hartson and Skelton, but maybe never seen play. It gives them a chance to judge for themselves the good young players we have at the club."

As this season draws to a conclusion for Terry, how does he view next season, considering that he will have a very different side from the one that has served him so well in 1993?

"We are taking on seven schoolboys next season along with seven first year apprentices," he stated. "We are expecting good things in particular from Paul McLaren, who has played 20 times for us this season, even though he is only a schoolboy. He will need to show us that he is improving all the time."

"I am optimistic for next season, but first I would like to see us finish this term in a positive way."

New appointment is made to revive Pirates' flagging season



BRISTOL ROVERS F.C 1992-93

■ Bristol Rovers visit Kenilworth Road this afternoon firmly rooted to the foot of the First Division after a season which, at the time of writing, has seen the side leak 66 league goals. This one fact, above all others has attributed to their current lowly position and they will be looking for a replay of their 2-0 victory against the Hatters at Twerton Park last December.

■ Goals from Carl Saunders and Justin Channing secured victory that afternoon, one of eight triumphs for the Pirates this season. Other wins have come at home against Brentford (2-1), Millwall (1-0), Bristol City (4-0) and Tranmere (1-0) and away at Leicester (1-0), Cambridge (1-0) and Brentford (3-0).

■ The bulk of these victories came immediately after the appointment of Malcolm Allison to first-team coach in November. His vast experience paid immediate dividends to the west country club and they found themselves in 19th position in December, their best position of the season so far. However, the slump returned after their FA Cup third round exploits against Aston Villa when they lost

after a replay, and they have found it difficult to pick up points while all around them appear to be doing so.

■ Mr Allison was finally relieved of his services last Friday, with John Ward appointed to take over this week. Ward, 41, has left Third Division promotion chasers York City to help steer Rovers clear of relegation, but he admits his task will be a very difficult one. "I am an ambitious man," he said. "and I've no illusions that it will be very difficult to stave off relegation, but I've been promised the same managerial freedom I've had at York, a club which I enjoyed managing."

■ Bristol Rovers were formed at a meeting in Stapleton Road, Eastville, in 1883. However, they first went under the name of the Black Arabs (wearing black shirts). Changing their name to Eastville Rovers in their second season, they won the Gloucestershire Cup in 1889, and became a professional outfit in 1897. Honours have been limited, with the club winning the Division Three (S) title in 1952-53 and the Division Three crown in 1989-90.

PIRATES ON PARADE

BRIAN PARKIN (goalkeeper) - Last season's Player of the Year, Brian arrived at Rovers in November 1989 in the transfer deal which involved England goalkeeper Nigel Martyn moving to Crystal Palace. He has won Third Division Championship honours with Rovers and appeared in the Leyland-DAF Cup Final in 1990.

ANDY TILLSON (defender) - Andy became Rovers record transfer signing when joining the club in November for a fee of £370,000. His early career was spent with Peterborough United and Kettering before he came to the attention of Grimsby whom he joined in July 1988. Andy left Grimsby to join QPR two and a half years later for a transfer fee of £500,000.

IAN ALEXANDER (defender) - Ian is one of Rovers senior professionals who is highly-regarded as an effective attacking full back. He joined the club in August 1986 as a winger but has spent the majority of his career at Twerton Park as a full-back. During the summer he signed a long term contract to remain at the club.

STEVE YATES (defender) - Steve has been associated with Rovers and the club's junior teams from the age of 11. A speedy, quick tackling defender, he has been a regular choice in Rovers first team for four seasons.

GEOFF TWENTYMAN (defender) - Geoff provides vital experience at the heart of Rovers' defence. He joined the club from Preston in 1986 where he made almost 100 appearances, and has also served non-league Chorley Town.

PAUL HARDYMAN (midfield) - Paul joined Rovers from Sunderland in July 1992 for a then club record fee of £160,000 which was set by a tribunal. A former England Under 21 defender, Paul was a member of the Portsmouth team who were Second Division runners-up in 1987. He assisted Sunderland in reaching last season's FA Cup Final.

ANDY REECE (midfield) - Andy has provided the Rovers midfield with much needed stability throughout his five seasons with the club. Despite being a late entrant to league football, Andy has made over 200 league appearances for The Pirates and holds a Third Division Championship medal.

DAVID MEHEW (midfield) - David is now one of the club's longest serving professionals, following his arrival from Leeds United in July 1985. He has been top goalscorer on two occasions including 19 goals in the Third Division Championship season in 1990.

MARCUS STEWART (forward) - Marcus scored on his league debut for Rovers against divisional champions Ipswich Town last season. An exciting talent who is a former England Schoolboy International, Marcus has remarkable potential and already this season has been in the England Under 21 squad and represented the Barclays Football League against their Italian counterparts.

JOHN TAYLOR (forward) - John arrived at Rovers in the transfer which involved Devon White moving to Cambridge United in March 1992. His close skill and goal scoring record in his opening spell with the club, 8 goals in 8 games, was an impressive introduction and underlines what an asset John is to the club.

CARL SAUNDERS (forward) - Carl joined Rovers from Stoke City in February 1990 for £70,000. His arrival culminated in the club reaching a Wembley Final in the DAF Cup, together with Rovers clinching the Third Division Championship in his first season at Twerton Park. He has been the club's top goalscorer for the last two seasons.

TONY POUNDER (forward) - Tony is in his third season for Rovers since joining the club for a bargain fee of £10,000 from Weymouth. He has been a regular member of the first team and has missed just a handful of games. Tony's father John, was also a professional footballer with the Town, Coventry and Crewe.

MARCUS BROWNING (forward) - Marcus has spent ten years with Rovers since joining the club as a schoolboy. He has had spells with Trowbridge, Gloucester, Weymouth and Hereford but has now established himself in the first-team squad.

MEET THE BOSS




John Ward started his league career with Lincoln City in March 1971 and enjoyed eight prosperous years at Sincil Bank. He scored 91 goals in 223 appearances before moving on to Watford in July 1979, where he scored six goals in 29 appearances.


In 1982 he moved into coaching at Vicarage Road and was appointed assistant manager to Graham Taylor in 1985. He also followed Mr Taylor to Aston Villa in 1987 and helped the club to the First Division runner's-up spot in 1990.

Following Mr Taylor's appointment as England manager, Mr Ward spent one more season at Villa Park before becoming the England under-21 manager.

In November 1991, he was appointed York City manager and guided them to the top of the Third Division table earlier this season.


What has been the highlight of your career so far in football: Being involved with the first team this season.





Welcome return of long standing rivals



BACK TRACKING BY ROGER WASH

Today marks the 32nd time that we have met Bristol Rovers in League competition at Kenilworth Road, a record only beaten by Q.P.R. amongst our opponents

Although the sides have not competed for points since 1981 our first clashes were 60 years prior to this in the inaugural season of Division Three when Rovers completed an early double in winning 2-1 at Kenilworth Road and 5-0 at Eastville both before crowds of 6,000.

The same thing happened the following season before a Sid Reid goal on 3rd February 1923 finally broke the duck in a 1-0 win at Kenilworth Road. We actually then went eight seasons unbeaten at Eastville before being on the end of a 5-1 thrashing in

1930/32. During this same period, and indeed up to our eventual promotion in 1937, we remained unbeaten at Kenilworth Road recording ten wins along the way.

By far the most famous victory in this time came on 13th April 1936 when we recorded an amazing 12-0 win over Rovers with Joe Payne scoring ten with head, boot, knee and various other parts of his anatomy.

Unfortunately no photographs exist of the game due to a heavy Easter schedule taking the 'Luton News' photographer away from

Kenilworth Road to snap weddings but as in excess of 100,000 saw the game judging by the number of people saying "I was there" perhaps someone will be honest enough to confirm that one of Payne's goals was already over the line when he put it in!

After our promotion the sides did not meet again until 1953 when two goals from Jesse Pye and one from Bert Mitchell earned a point in a 3-3 draw at Eastville, watched by a crowd of 20,021. This attendance was topped the following season when 30,623 packed Eastville to watch a promotion chasing Town side go down 3-2 despite a goal from Terry Kelly making his debut. We got our revenge however, when, in our final home game, goals from Charlie Watkins, just about to emigrate to South Africa, secured a 2-0 win and virtually confirmed promotion.

We met again in 1960 following our relegation from Division One when a 4-2 home win was followed by a

4-1 defeat at Eastville in a game marking the final outing in Luton colours of Seamus Dunne.

The sides continued to meet throughout the 1960's with the 4-0 home win in our promotion season of 1969/70 probably the pick of the bunch. Goals from John Collins, Matt Tees, Malcolm MacDonald and Keith Allen saw off a Rovers side that was generally reckoned to be our strongest challenger in the race for the title.

In more recent times, a

hat-trick from Brian Stein at Eastville in a 4-2 win in 1980/81 and a flawless first-half performance in the 3-1 home victory the previous season stand out.

The match we all remember, however, came over Easter 1976 when Ricky Hill, coming on as substitute in the home game with Rovers with the score at 1-1, set up Brian Chambers with his first touch of the ball and then scored himself. What a way to mark your league debut.




