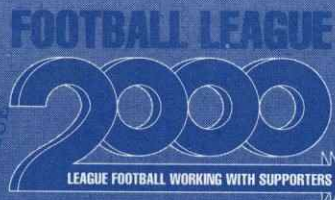
Supporters' Challenge



ENDSLEIGH OFFER YOU A CHANCE TO PLAY AT WEMBLEY

Yes this really is your chance to play at Wembley! Sounds incredible? Well, The Football League and the major supporters' organisations have joined forces, and with the backing of Endsleigh Insurance, have come up with a unique opportunity - the dream of playing on the hallowed turf of Wembley Stadium becoming a reality for supporters of Endsleigh Insurance League clubs!

Earlier this season The Football League, the Football Supporters' Association and the National Federation of Football Supporters' Clubs launched 'Football League 2000' - a new initiative aimed at bringing the clubs and supporters closer together. The Endsleigh Insurance League Supporters' Challenge is an important element in that campaign.



Applications are invited from all male* supporters over the age of seventeen (as at 1/1/94) to participate in the biggest and most ambitious competition of its kind ever staged in this country. The Endsleigh Insurance League Supporters' Challenge will be a six-a-side competition with supporters' teams representing all seventy Endsleigh Insurance League clubs. To select each squad, a completely random draw supervised by the supporters' organisations will be made from the applications received in respect of each club. Squad members will then be invited for trials, with the final selection likely to be made by each club's Community Officer.

Each club's representative team will then participate in Divisional Heats against neighbouring sides to decide who progresses to the Wembley Qualifying Stage. The Wembley Qualifiers will be held at a central venue with the two most successful supporters' teams from each division securing their appearance at the world's most famous football stadium.

The Wembley Finals themselves will be played on a divisional basis immediately prior to the Endsleigh Insurance League Play-Offs during Spring Bank Holiday Weekend - the 28th, 29th & 30th May 1994.

Can you rise to the Challenge? If so, complete the application form now and join in the Endsleigh Insurance League Supporters' Challenge.

WELCOME TO THE HAWTHORNS
HOME OF THE BAGGIES

Finally, in today's column I would like to take this opportunity of wishing you all a very happy New Year. We enjoy tremendous support at West Bromwich Albion and I look forward to that continuing in 1994. I hope that it is as good a New Year as possible for all of our followers."

As we start a new year Albion boss Keith Burkinshaw is looking forward to a little more consistency from referees:

"The question of refereeing inconsistencies seems to be getting to everybody at the moment. But I don't think it's just a matter of inconsistencies between referees in one league, there are inconsistencies between the Premier League and the lower divisions, and differences in interpretation between different countries.

"If you watch Italian football, as I do, then you will know that their referees have a different outlook to ours. For example, if a player lifts his foot six inches off the ground for

a challenge in Italy he'll be penalised for dangerous play. In England he might have his foot a yard in the air and get away with it.

"In contrast, players over here, as we saw with the Les Ferdinand incident at Liverpool, are regularly booked for kicking the ball away. But in Italy they rarely even get spoken to for the same offence.

"Such inconsistencies are frustrating when you work as a professional in football. However, I don't really blame the referees. The problem is that they receive lots of directives from the governing bodies, and aren't allowed to referee in the way they see fit, or to apply simple common sense.

"I know there are a lot of people who would like to see professional referees, but I'm not convinced that will solve the problem. Perhaps they could train with the clubs, which would make them fitter and give them more of an insight into the workings of a professional club and the other side of footballers, which might lead to better communications on the pitch.

"We need to work on that from the other end as well by making players more aware of the laws of the game, and already part of the training for our YT youngsters is about the laws of football."

Do you think that referees are inconsistent? Have the characters all disappeared? Is it now an impossible task and should there be video officials? How about professional refs?

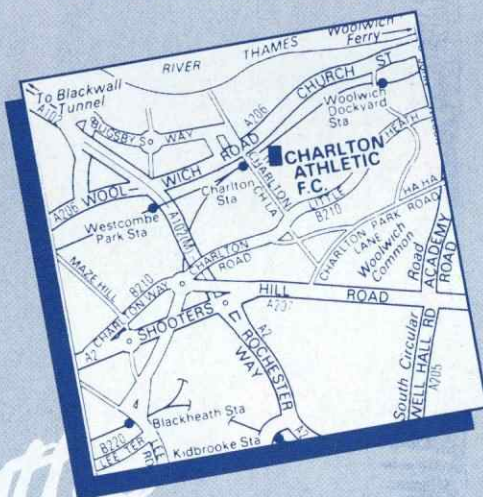

DID YOU KNOW?

Exactly 60 years ago — on New Year's Day 1934 — Albion recorded one of their finest away victories when they beat Manchester City 7-2 at Maine Road. A crowd of almost 21,000 attended the game which was a personal triumph — in a way — for 'W.C.' Richardson, Albion's star centre-forward, who scored a hat-trick against big Frank Swift, who was one of the finest goalkeepers in the land at the time. City, however, soon got over this shock defeat, and went on to win the F.A. Cup that season, beating Portsmouth 2-1 in the final — this, after they had lost in the final the previous year to Everton.

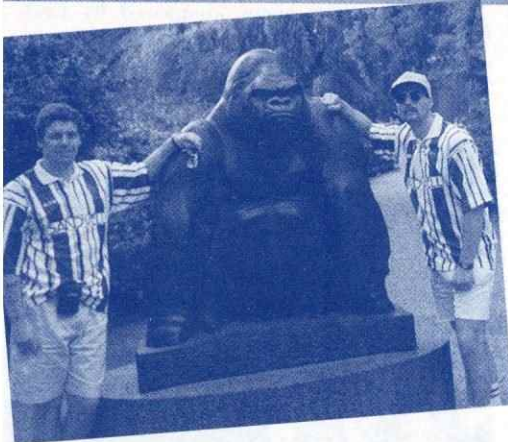

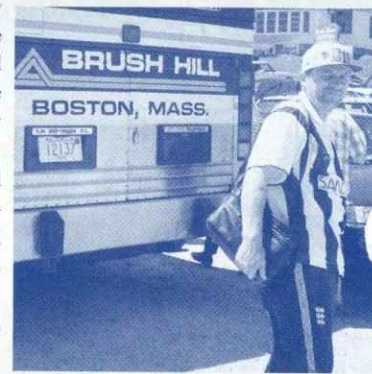

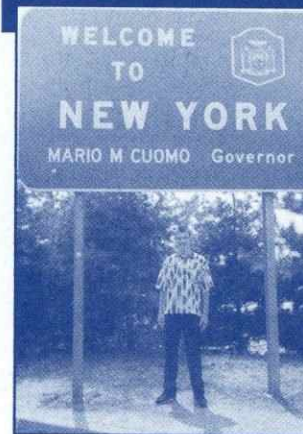
Forever a Baggie

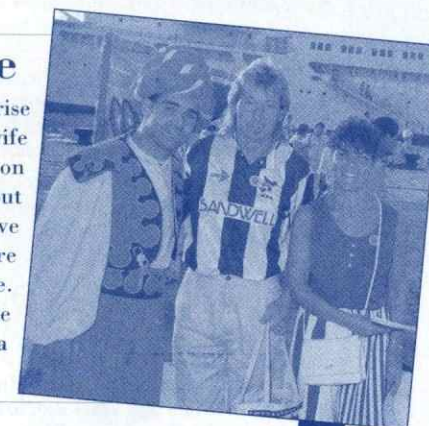

THE *Album* CHANGING • ROOM • WELCOMES

W

hen Kerry Dixon rammed in a hat-trick in a 6-2 win over Stoke at the end of November, it marked one of the lengthier transitions for a product of Luton's youth team establishing himself in the first team.

Dixon was one of eight Luton players in that particular game who were reared at Kenilworth Road as manager David Pleat, bringing the former England striker back to his home-town club, continues to run the club on a shoestring and a successful youth policy.

At a club where funds for transfers are seldom available, young players with talent can find that the opportunity for League football soon comes their way. But in Pleat's first spell as manager from 1978, former England striker Dixon was, ironically, one of the few that slipped through the net at Luton. He joined non-League Dunstable before making his League debut with Reading and progressing to Chelsea and England.

Returning home on a free transfer from Southampton last year, Dixon, now 32, has helped provide experience up front among Luton's home-grown stock. He continues the spine of older players in the side: at the back is ex-Coventry stalwart Trevor Peake, 37 next month, and Alan Harper, 33, the former Everton utility player is in midfield. Former Walsall player David Preece, 30, has recently returned to the side.

Pleat has also hired the Luton-bred talents of West Ham's full-back Mitchell Thomas. It's one of the club's tasks to capitalise on the experience of seasoned professionals becoming available at other clubs. Youth team coach Terry Westley explains the other facets in building a Luton team: "I'm trying to bring chaps through from the youth squad while we're also looking for lads with potential who haven't quite made it at other clubs, such as West Ham, Arsenal or Spurs."

Westley, youth-team coach at Ipswich Town before teaming up with Pleat two and a half years ago, has already seen his labours bear fruit as the latest in an impressive list of Welsh youngsters has become a regular in the first-team squad. "John Hartson can go all the way. He's already scored twice in two appearances for the Wales under-21 team, and he's only 18, a first-year pro. He spent his full two years with me, scoring around 50-goals in youth football last season.

"Cyrille Beach, our scout in Wales, unearthed him, as he has in recent years found Kurt Nogan, now with Brighton, Mark Pembroke, Ceri Hughes, Jason Rees, Hartson and now Andrew Jukes, who's in my youth team at the moment. He's got a back injury, but will be a first-year pro next season."

Both midfielders Hughes and Rees have won international honours with Wales, while Pembroke, a regular in Terry Yorath's squad and now one of Derby County's star men, is one of the million-pound sales which have helped Luton stay in existence. "There's always scouts coming to our games," says 34-year-old Westley, himself formerly an Ipswich Town schoolboy. "They know we're going to be producing good young players. It's frustrating for the first team to have great young players come through and then to lose them. If we'd kept everyone — Phil Gray, Kingsley Black, Pembroke — we'd probably be in the Premier ourselves."

John Moore, now Pleat's right-hand man at Luton, was youth team coach with him at Leicester City, and this has brought Luton further

dividends. Skilful wide man Scott Oakes, with over 70 League appearances for Luton at only 21 years of age, is one of four former Leicester youngsters now in Pleat's first-team squad. Right-back Des Linton, striker Martin Williams and now Tony Thorpe have all benefited from rejoining Pleat.

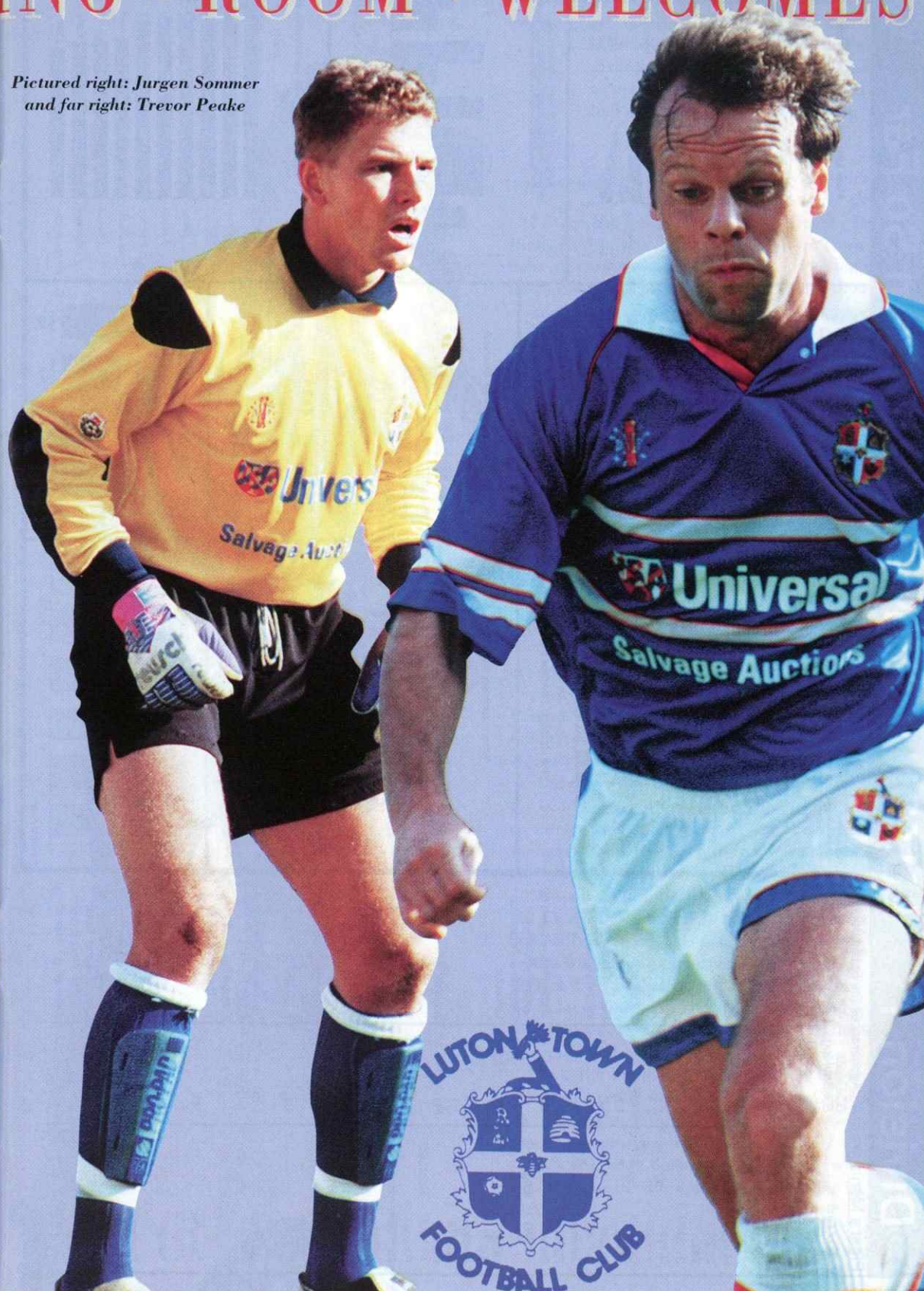
Other young Luton players to look out for in the coming year are midfielder Aaron Skelton, on his way back from a ruptured thigh muscle; left-back Greg Rioch, son of Bruce, who has made his League debut on loan with Barnet; striker Jamie Woodford, and youth team captain Paul McLaren. "He's been in the first-team squad this season," says Westley. "He could be awesome."

Winning more than a third of games in the past three months has lifted Luton a fair distance from the relegation zone they have frequented for much of the last two seasons — relegated from the top flight in 1992, they were also 20th in last season's First Division. While poor results can affect youngsters' progress, there's seldom a lack of new talent knocking on the Kenilworth Road door. Good young players with the potential to play League football know they have a better than usual chance of realising it with Luton.

"We make a rule that if we've got a good local boy, we try not to lose him. We show him, through our track record, that they will get the opportunity, and we do tend to keep them."

It may have taken 15 years to get Kerry Dixon back in the fold, but the current line-up proves the cream keeps coming to the top at Luton.

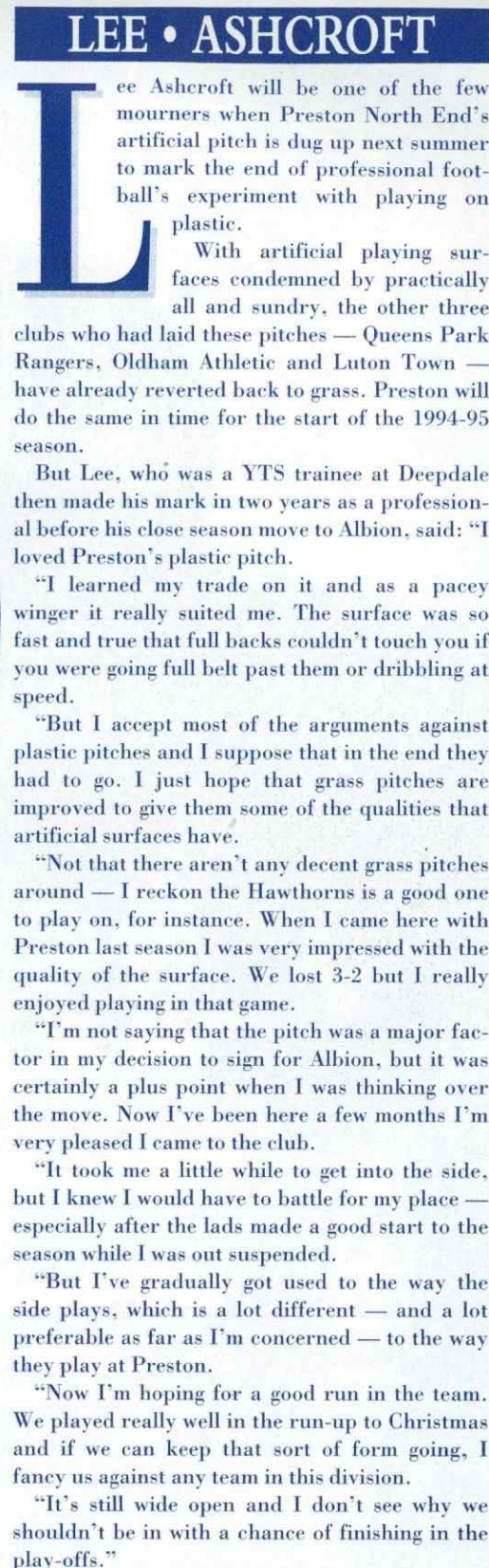

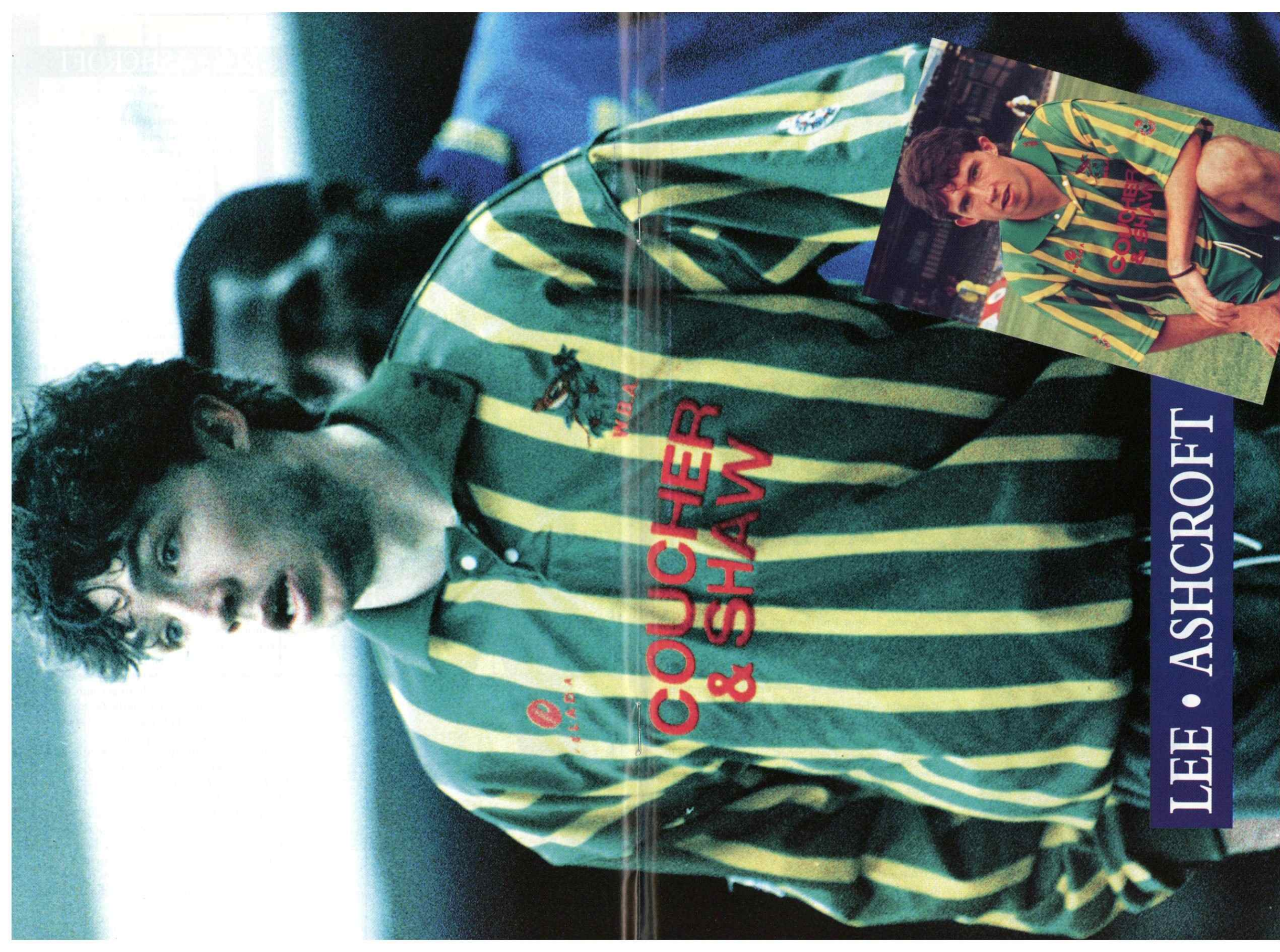

Changing the Face of The Hawthorns

As we look forward to the New Year today, you can be sure that 1994 is going to be a season of great change here at The Hawthorns.

The traditional terraced areas of The Smethwick End and The Brummie Road, will soon be gone to make way for modern stands that meet the requirements of the Taylor Report, and prepare Albion for the next century.

The first phase of the redevelopment of The Hawthorns begins in just nine days time on January 10th and, if everything goes according to schedule, the new stand will be ready for the start of the new season in August.

Development of this phase will take in the Smethwick End and the Halfords Lane/Smethwick End corner of the ground, providing an all seater stand with capacity for approximately 5,600 away supporters and, in the corner, 500 places for home fans.

The structure of the new Smethwick End will incorporate a wide range of new facilities including: a new stadium control unit, new turnstiles, much improved catering facilities, better toilets, additional executive box facilities, a new bar and a new sponsors lounge, as well as a new ticket office.

In addition there will be a vast improvement in facilities for the disabled, providing a separate entrance and exit and a further 60 places. In the new stand there will also be a new police detention block as well as a new first aid unit.

This ambitious new development will completely transform the Smethwick End of the ground and, as you can see from the architects drawings, will vastly improve the look of The Hawthorns, both from inside and outside the ground.

One point of interest is that, unlike many new ground developments, The Hawthorns will retain the distinctive profile of floodlight pylons, though not the current ones. New floodlights will be erected as part of the portal frames of the new stands at each end, but traditionalists, and visiting fans navigating to The Hawthorns, will be delighted that the floodlights will not be moving to the sides of the stands.

Birmingham Road End

During April work will start at the other end of the ground re-developing The Birmingham Road End, which will again join with the Halfords Lane Stand, filling in the corner and providing new executive boxes. This major stand will provide seating for approaching 8,400 people.

Many of the facilities will be similar to those in the new Smethwick End, with the refreshment bars being on a mezzanine level. The fabulous new stand will be completed by the end of October and will take the new capacity of The Hawthorns to around 26,000 — all seated of course.

Ground Director Clive Stapleton, believes that the £4.2 million contract for the two new stands, which has been awarded to Walsall based company Kendrick Construction, represents excellent value for money.

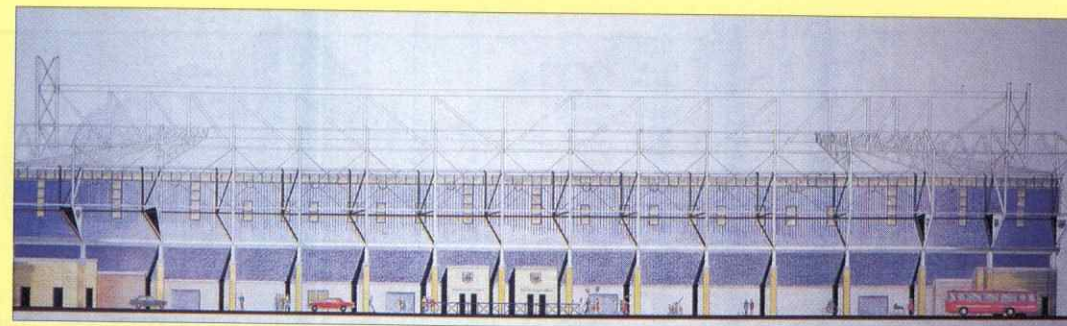
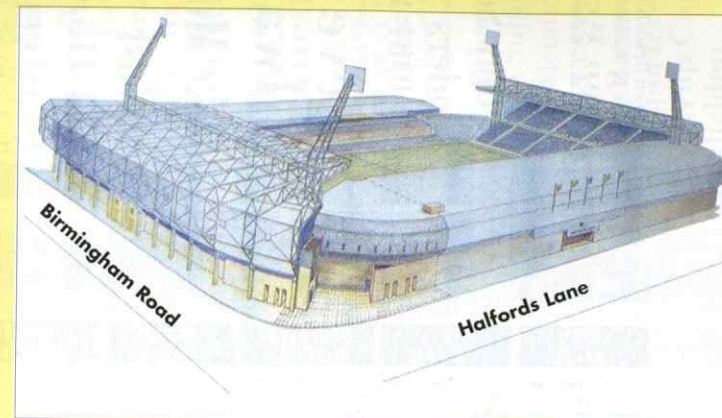
"The design team is being headed by Tim Ralphs Design Group on behalf of the club, with structural engineers Keith Palmer Associates and quantity surveyors Cotter Walker, with Norder Design working on behalf of Kendrick Construction," explains Clive. "That gives us a very professional, quality building team."

And Clive is confident that the right decisions have been made over the plans for modernising Albion's home: "It's been an eighteen month decision making process, and at each stage we've gone back to the board. Some of the things we didn't think of originally, other people have thought of. We've also gone out to public meetings with the supporters and that's given us further ideas, and I think we've got the best we possibly could."

The wide variety of business talents on the Albion board have been utilised in finalising the development plans. All the commercial aspects have been looked into by Commercial Director Tony Hale and Barry Hurst, with Terry Guy and Joe

Brandrick being involved in the financial side. Chairman Trevor Summers' has also been able to bring his previous experience as Ground Director to good use when considering the needs of the fans, and the requirements of the police.

The remarkable speed with which this metamorphosis of The Hawthorns is planned to take place will astound Albion fans as the construction gets underway, and it certainly makes for an exciting outlook in 1994.

**'THE FIRST
PLAYER TO
APPEAR IN 500
LEAGUE AND CUP
GAMES FOR
ALBION'**

When Len Millard proudly walked up the 39 steps to the Royal Box at Wembley 40 years ago — on his way to collect the F.A. Cup after Albion had beaten Preston North End 3-2 — he was certainly a hero amongst the Baggie fans inside the stadium and also back in the Midlands, where thousands were glued to the TV sets or had their ears to their radios.

A great day indeed and there are quite a few supporters around today who will remember — and relive — that memorable occasion on 1st May 1954 when Albion carried off the coveted trophy for the fourth time.

Len had a superb game that afternoon, completely blotting out the threat of England's wing wizard, Tom Finney.



Len and Tom, in fact, were the respective skippers, and before the game started they chatted together in the centre circle.

Len recalls: "I wished Tom all the best, but as we walked away from the ball, I reminded him that I would be sticking close to him all afternoon — and I did!"

Earlier in the season Albion had done the League double over Preston, winning 2-0 away and 3-2 at home when thick fog swirling round The Hawthorns, almost causing the game to be abandoned.

"We played very well in those two matches" said Len, "and I was confident we could pull it off at Wembley. We were all bitterly disappointed at missing out on the League championship and myself and the rest of the players were determined to bring that silver Cup home to West Bromwich."

"Our manager Vic Buckingham insisted before the Final that we should play our normal game. We did, but Preston seemed to change their tactics slightly, aiming to mark Johnny Nicholls and Ronnie Allen a lot more closely than in the previous games. Ron, though, dropped back a few yards and caused them all sorts of problems with his passing.....yet he still scored two goals — although along with our goalkeeper Jimmy Sanders, I turned away when he struck home his penalty.

Len was 35 years of age when he held aloft the coveted trophy — one of the oldest-ever skippers of an F.A. Cup winning team.

He will, therefore, be 75 in March, and although his health isn't too good these days — he is currently in a Nursing Home, having had a leg amputated a couple of years ago — he still follows the fortunes of his beloved Albion via the newspapers and TV.

I say his beloved Albion, because Len actually spent 21 years as a player at The Hawthorns, serving the Baggies from May 1937 when he joined the club as a lad from Sunbeam FC, having previously assisted Coseley FC, Wallbrook FC, Colesley Town and Bilston Town, right up until June 1958, when, at the age of 39, he became manager of Stafford Rangers.

Owing to World War Two, it was late before Len turned professional — doing so in September 1942, aged 23. He made his debut for Albion in a wartime game v. Northampton in August of that same year — this being

the first of 625 appearances for the club (436 in the League, 40 in the F.A. Cup and 149 during the period 1939-46). Indeed, Len was the first player to appear in 500 senior games for the Baggies. He also scored a total of 18 goals — including two hat-tricks (from the centre-forward position) against Leicester City and Wolves, both at home, early in the 1942-43 season.

But it was as a left-back and not a goalscorer where Len excelled and it was very rare that he was 'roasted' by a winger. He always gave Stanley Matthews a hard time, as well as Finney and a lot of other internationals.

Coseley born and bred, Len retired from football in 1961, having spent three seasons with Stafford Rangers. He then went to work in a factory, before

taking a life of leisure in 1980.

He last attended The Hawthorns — as a guest — soon after the new Halfords Lane stand was completed and although looking frail he thoroughly enjoyed chatting about old times, reliving the good old days and admiring the vast transformation of The Hawthorns ground.

Remember — when Len first came to Albion back in 1937, the capacity of the ground was around 65,000. How times have changed!

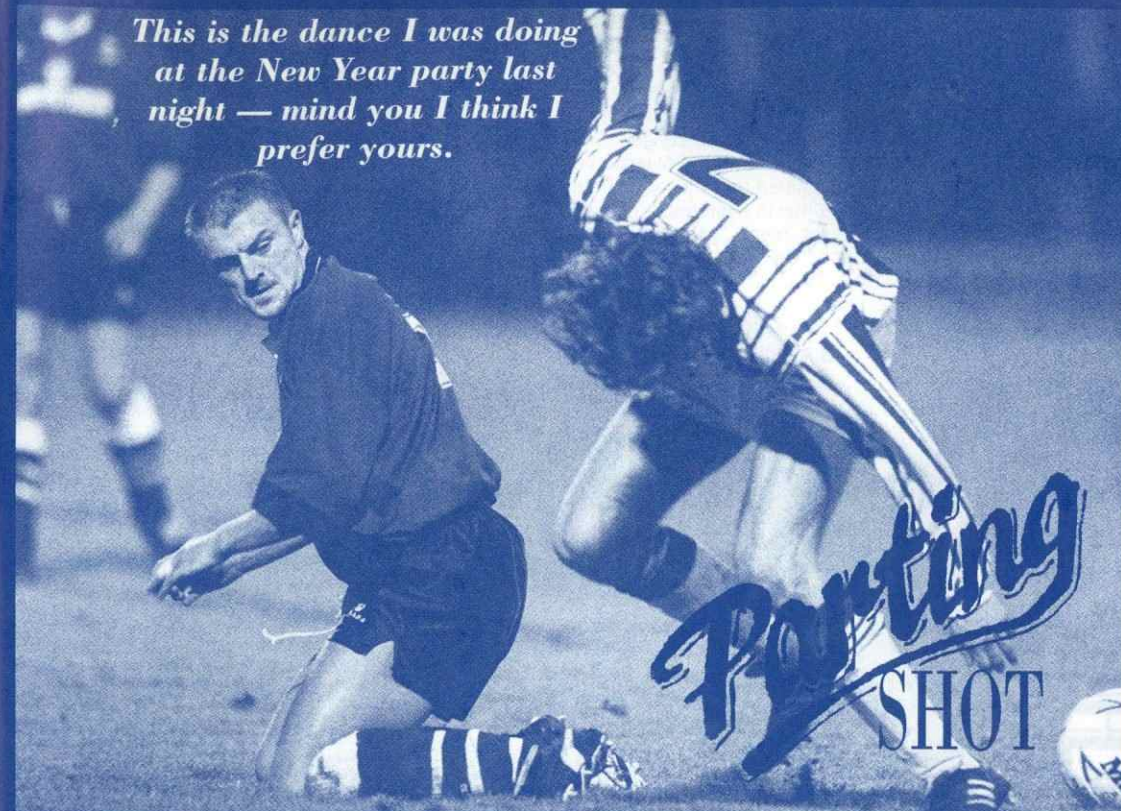

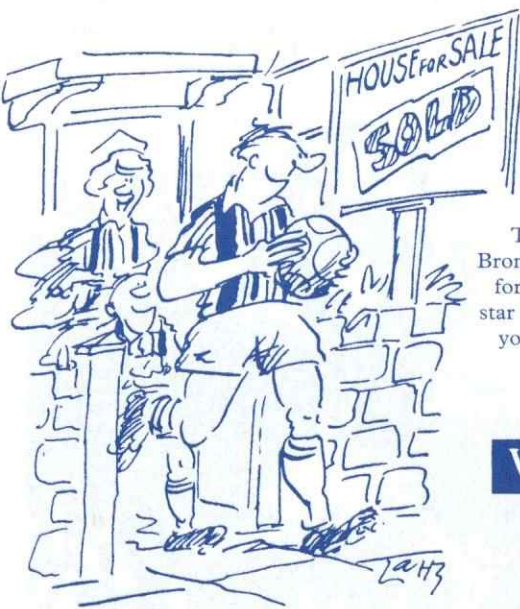
