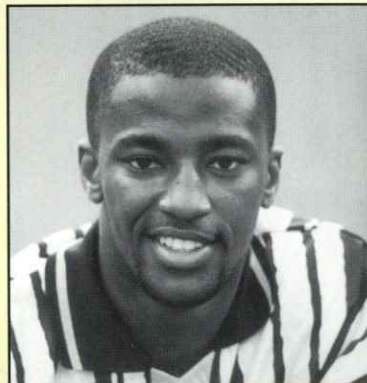
PROUD RECORD

IT was a new experience last week for Michael Johnson when he was sent off in the early stages of our Cup clash with Sutton United - and one he never wants to repeat.

As he explained: "I've never been sent off before at any level of the game, nor have I been suspended. In fact, I've never been close to it.

"That's a good record for a central defender and I was proud of it. But now I've got a black mark against me and I'm very upset about it."

He added: "I honestly feel that

I didn't deserve to be sent off but the video cameras didn't capture my part in the incident so I have no alternative but to accept my punishment."

That is an automatic three-match ban, which will cause Michael to miss the League game at Bristol City, The Anglo-Italian Cup trip to Southend and the FA Cup tie against West Ham.

For the record, Michael was booked on just two occasions last season and has also been cautioned twice this term - the last one coming against Derby

County on August 31st."

NOT ALL-TICKET

OUR fourth round FA Cup tie against West Ham will take place at Meadow Lane on Saturday January 29 and it has been decided not to make it an all-ticket affair.

You will, of course, still be able to reserve your place in advance and tickets went on sale today. Season-ticket holders have until next Friday to claim their regular seats.

It's an "All Pay" match and while adult seat prices will increase to £12, all other prices - juvenile and senior citizen seats and standing - remain as normal.

ON OUR TRAVELS

OUR run of four successive home games comes to an end today and next on the schedule are trips to Bristol City next Saturday and to Southend the following Wednesday (7.45pm).

In both cases, there is ample standing room available and it is not necessary to purchase tickets in advance.

There are no seats for visiting supporters at Ashton Gate and standing admission costs £6.50, with no reductions.

At roots Hall, admission to the East Stand seats costs £10 and to the terraces £7.50, with no reductions.

THE youth team will be looking to make further progress along the cup trail on Wednesday when they take on Leicester City at Grove Farm (11am).

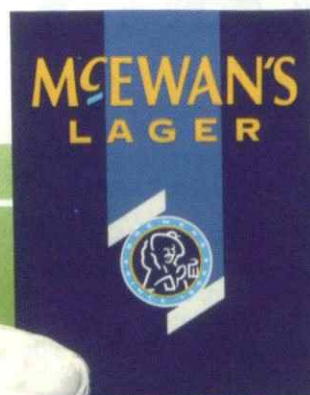

And I just hope that it's the first of many I reach at Meadow Lane because despite what some people seem to think, I've got a lot of ambitions still to fulfil.

I've been concerned recently at the way articles have been presented in the local press and it seems I have cause to because I've been told that I stand accused of negative thinking in the eyes of some supporters.

I can understand why you are feeling that way but I would point out that you shouldn't always believe what you read in newspapers - especially the headlines.

Certain articles have been very misleading and I would just like to make it abundantly clear that I have my heart set on taking Notts County into the Premier League.

But I happen to think that we have done well to overcome adversity this season and over the past few weeks in particular, the players deserve enormous credit for the hard work they have put in.

I said a couple of weeks ago, at the start of our run of four successive home games, that it would have a major influence on our season if we could win the lot.

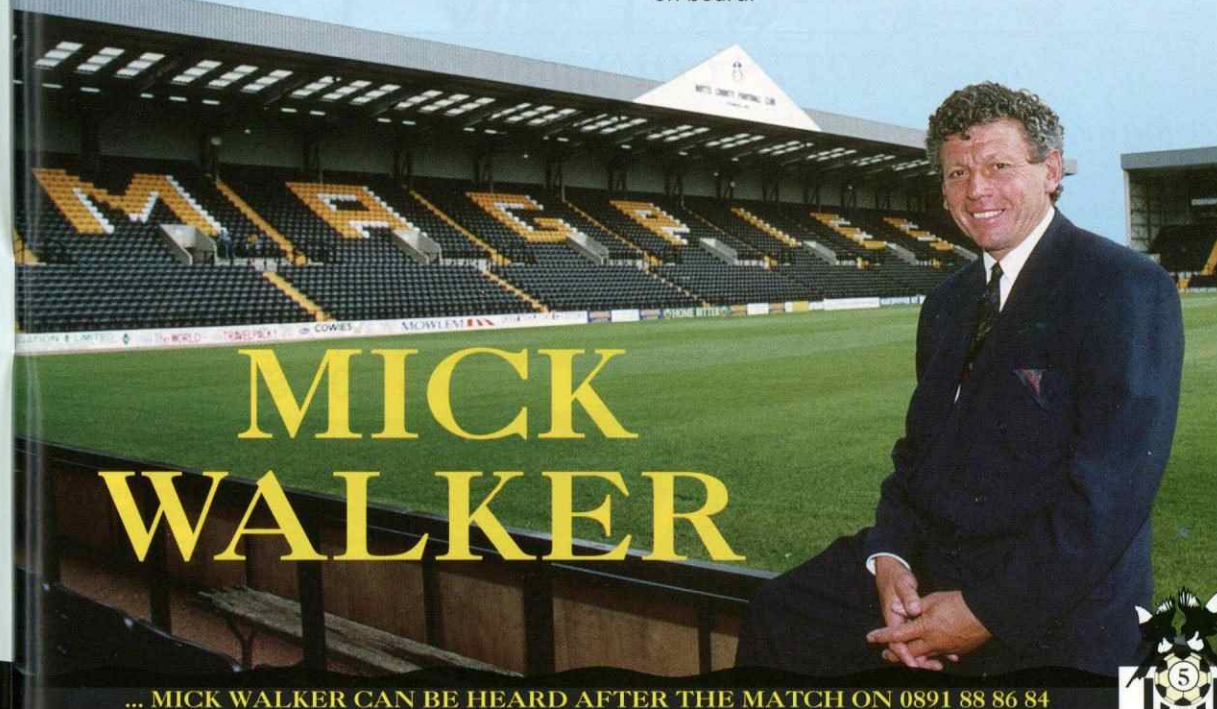
Well, we have managed to clear three hurdles and if we can also come out on top against Luton this afternoon, it will leave us in an interesting situation.

From the League point of view, we will be poised to break into the top ten and with the Anglo-Italian Cup semi-finals to come, plus an attractive FA Cup tie with West Ham, there's plenty more excitement on the way.

All I'm really bothered about at the moment, though, is maintaining our good run against Luton and I'll be disappointed if I don't have cause to celebrate my anniversary in style.

In closing, I would just like to belatedly welcome Colin Foster to Meadow Lane and as you will be aware, he has wasted no time in making his presence felt.

I thought he was outstanding against Birmingham on Tuesday. His commanding display served to underline how much we have missed Dean Yates and Dave Robinson this season and I'm sure you agree with me that it's good to have him on board.

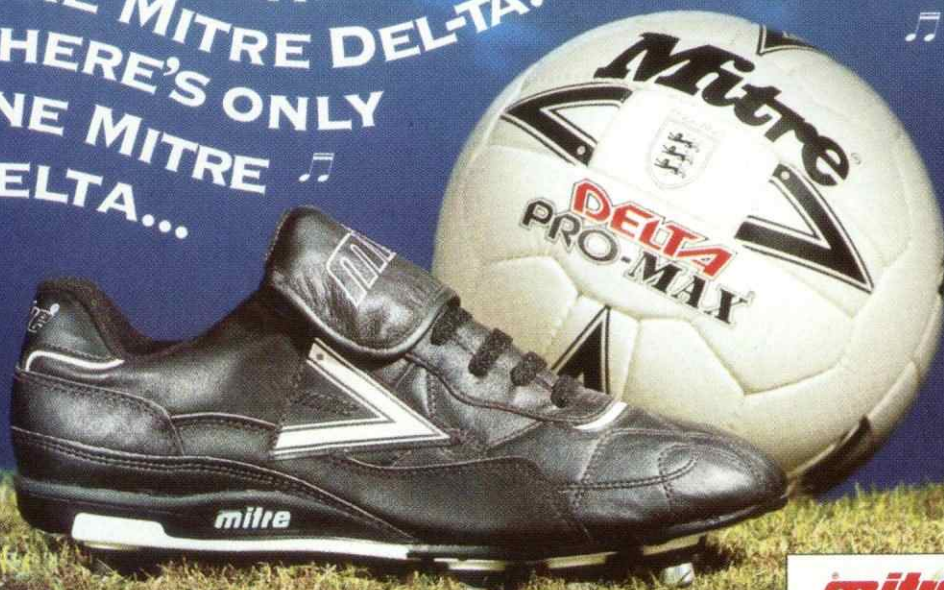

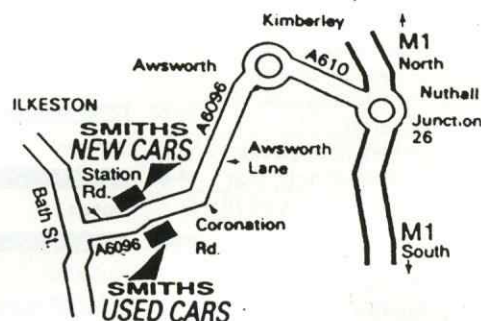

FROM THE BOOTROOM

I DID suggest in last Saturday's column that I had the feeling we would all be glad to get the Cup tie against Sutton out of the way and that was certainly the case.

Like Birmingham, Stoke and Barnsley, the other clubs paired with non-league opposition, we didn't find it easy.

And although it was always likely that non-leaguers would raise their game for what really amounted to their Cup Final, I wonder why it is that all four League sides didn't really do themselves justice.

We were determined not to be complacent about things and that was reflected in the start we made with two goals in the opening 10 minutes.

But you don't need me to tell you that it wasn't maintained and although losing Michael Johnson was a considerable blow, we didn't ought to have caused you so much anxiety.

Incidentally, it's not my place to comment on the sending off but having recently watched the Panthers take on Sheffield Steelers... the incident wouldn't even have got a mention had it been at the ice Stadium!

Unfortunately, "Johnno" will now have to miss our fourth round tie against West Ham while he serves his suspension and that will probably mean we will be without both central defenders.

At the time of writing, it's still not clear whether West Ham will allow Colin Foster to play but as he said, he can't imagine they will want to run

the risk of him scoring the goal which knocks them out of the Cup.

One way or another, it will be very strange for him during the build-up to the match and although his knowledge of the West Ham players will be very useful, he will presumably be open to offers as a double-agent!

Away from the Cup, Colin has an important job to do for us over the next month and I'm sure his experience and aerial ability will be a big asset.

Dave Robinson showed in his two appearances against Stoke and Oxford how important it is to have a commanding figure at the centre of your defence and with so many defenders currently on the injured list, we were pleased to discover that help was on the way.

We have to be delighted with the Cup draw - not least because we are at home again - and it will give us chance to revert to filling the "Sutton United" role, which is the one we prefer.

It hasn't very often happened in my time at Meadow Lane that we have gone into a match as red hot favourites to win, as we were against Sutton, but we will be the underdogs again when we meet West Ham.

That's something to look forward to but before then, we have a

THERE'S an old saying that you cannot please all of the people all of the time - and I can vouch for the fact that it's absolutely true.

No matter how hard you try, it seems you just cannot win although I still find it hard to believe that we actually managed to make an enemy last week entirely as a result of being generous.

It has always been the case with all football clubs that season-tickets apply to League matches only. When it comes to cup ties, everyone has to pay.

That means everyone - including Family Magpie members aged 10-and-under - who have been admitted free of charge to League games this season, simply because the chairman is anxious to encourage our young supporters.

Having said that, we did make an exception to the rule earlier in the season when the Italian sides came to Meadow Lane in the Anglo-Italian Cup.

We knew there wouldn't be big crowds and under the circumstances, announced that we wouldn't charge the young Family Magpies.

It worked very well and as we received numerous letters of thanks the following week, I suggested to the chairman that maybe we should follow the same line for the FA Cup tie against Sutton.

There was no pressure on us to do so and had we announced that admission charges would be as per normal for cup ties, I doubt very much whether anyone would have complained.

Nevertheless, I felt it would be a nice gesture and the chairman readily agreed with my proposal. As a result, around 400 young members of the Family Magpies were admitted free last Saturday.

O.K., so it cost the club a few bob in lost revenue but it was a nice little public relations exercise and everyone was happy.

Not so, unfortunately, it was a decision which did not please

Mr Ludwig from Bingham, who decided he would go to the evening Post and complain because his daughter, who is a juvenile season-ticket holder, didn't qualify for free admission.

When we investigated further, it transpired that Mr Ludwig had, in fact, not purchased a juvenile season-ticket but a Family season-ticket which cost, with his Lifeline discount, £308.75 for two adults and one child.

That represents a saving over the season of £243.50, compared to paying at the turnstiles to attend every League game.

If you take it a stage further and divide the cost of the season-ticket by 23 (home matches), it works out at £13.42 per match for three people.

If Mr Ludwig had two adult season-tickets, with Lifeline discount, it would average out at £12.38 per match - which means his child is admitted to each League game for £1.04.

The irony is that what Mr Ludwig has succeeded in doing is exposing a bit of a loophole in our pricing arrangements because the chairman - understandably - now wants to know how we can afford to give such a substantial saving on that type of Family Ticket!

Mr Ludwig, who says he is a dedicated fan and Lifeline member for many years also, apparently, says he will not be coming to Meadow Lane in the future.

That's sad, and I hope he changes his mind, but we can't help but think that if we had announced that all Family Magpies aged 10 and under would be charged at the juvenile rate to watch last week's Cup tie, then none of this would have happened.

I was less than happy with the way the article was handled in the Nottingham Evening Post - especially about the fact that having spent a considerable length of time explaining our side of the story to their reporter, that simply didn't come across.

What did amuse me, though, is that in the article it simply referred to Family Magpies. Yet, whenever the scheme is winning awards or there is something pleasant to say, it's always called by its full title...

the Evening Post Family Magpies! Now, I'm not knocking our friends at the "Post" who fully back the scheme, I'm just illustrating how little the "reporter" knew, or wanted to know of the background to the Evening Post Family Magpies.

COLIN FOSTER readily admits that he still has big regrets about allowing an invitation to come back to Nottingham slip through his grasp 14 months ago.

As he says, he "dilly-dallied" about whether or not to return to Nottingham Forest - and learned a hard lesson from that.

So, when word got through that we wanted to bring him to Meadow Lane to help us through our injury-crisis, this time the big defender didn't need a second invitation to move north.

"I should have signed for Forest," he said. "I made a mistake which I've regretted ever since and although the circumstances are different now, I'm really pleased to be back in Nottingham."

The 29-year-old former Orient player had three successful years as Des Walker's partner at the City Ground - "the best period of my Career" - and inevitably, the memories came flooding back when he arrived in Nottingham on Sunday Evening.

"I've been away for four years but it didn't feel like it," he said. "I travelled up on the train and as soon as I came out of the Midland Station... it was if I had never been away."

"To be honest, I would have been a bit dubious had the offer to go on loan been somewhere different. But as soon as Billy Bonds told me it was Notts County, I had no hesitation in agreeing to come."

Although Colin played for the Hammers in their opening six games of the season, a heel injury kept him out for five weeks and by the time he was fit to return, Bonds had re-built his team.

He added: "since David Burrows, Mike Marsh and Lee Chapman arrived, they haven't looked back and although I'm not happy about being stuck in the Reserves, I don't have any room for complaint."

"The prospect of being able to play first-team football again was very appealing and I'm relishing the challenge."

"Mick Walker has told me he needs someone to win the ball in the air and I can do that. I'm aware of all the injury problems and at this stage, it's purely a temporary arrangement which suits everyone concerned."

"But you never know what tomorrow might bring in this business and if things go well throughout the month, I might be around for longer. I would certainly consider it if the chance arose."

Colin made an outstanding start to his County career in Tuesday's win against Birmingham and he added: "Although I haven't played much first-team football, there's nothing wrong with my fitness because they really work you hard at Upton Park when you're not in the team."

"They make the Reserves do a lot of running - and I mean really heavy running - every Friday and Saturday morning and that's one good reason why I'm glad to be away from the place!"

"In fact, I had a lay-in last Saturday morning after the manager organised my move to Notts County and I cannot tell you how much I enjoyed it."

Before travelling north on Sunday, Colin watched the Cup draw on television - and he predicted that we would be paired with the Hammers.

He explained: "football's full of incredible coincidences and I just had a feeling it would work out that way. I'd love to play in that game but somehow, I can't imagine they'll want to run the risk of me scoring the goal that knocks them out of the Cup!"

BY RADIO NOTTINGHAM'S COLIN SLATER

THERE'S GOOD REASON today for raking over the ashes of what happened at the end of that hugely significant 1958-59 season.

Notts, for whom it was a season of shame, were relegated for a second successive year... this time to the basement of the Fourth Division.

Forest, reaching a pinnacle under veteran manager Billy Walker, carried off the FA Cup at Wembley by beating Luton Town 2-1.

It's arguable, but I believe that the gap in the fortunes of the two Nottingham clubs swung decisively Forest's way at that time - and I don't simply recall a moment of history painful to all County fans because Luton are today's Meadow Lane visitors.

The reason is the more worthy one that today's special guest is Gerry Carver, who played for Notts at that period in a position we used to call left half-back - and whose commitment, polish and determination meant that he carries little responsibility for the decline at that time.

A native of Worcestershire, he was spotted by a Notts scout while playing for Aston Boys in the Birmingham District League. Tempted to Meadow Lane he made his debut, at inside right, against Oldham Athletic in September, 1953 - when County were well established in the Second Division (we now call it the First).

It wasn't long before he had switched positions, claiming the number six jersey. His tackling was

fierce and his shrewd use of the ball, with his favoured left foot, little short of brilliant.

Notts were, happily, destined to spend only one season in the Fourth Division (though returned to it later) and Carver would surely have played in more than 31 of 46 League matches but for a run of injuries.

The 1961-62 season was the proud occasion of County's Centenary. The oldest Football League club was, of course, the first to reach this landmark. It found County re-established in the Third Division and, with club captain Bob Forrest fading from the scene, Carver took over as skipper.

Perhaps the proudest moment came on 2 May, 1962 when he led out Notts at Meadow Lane against a representative FA eleven in a match specially organised to celebrate the Centenary. Despite a goal from the still-developing Tony Hateley, Notts lost 3-1 to the classier team.

But, as I remember, Carver looked comfortable playing against current internationals. He had poise on the ball and that vital quality in a midfield player, vision.

Carver followed up his 40 appearances in 1960-61 with another 41 in the Centenary season - Mr Consistency himself.

Then came another season of gloom. At the end of 1962-63 Notts were again relegated to the Fourth Division and the loss of Gerry's services, because of injury, in all but 13 matches was a big reason for the slump. Notts needed him at a peak of form and fitness in order to mount another promotion drive to the Third Division in 1963-64 but an abdominal problem, which necessitated an operation, sidelined him for half the season.

Gerry married a Nottingham girl, ran a hairdressing business in Radford and he also worked at a young offender's institution. I saw him fairly recently, looking as dapper as ever, but today's chat on Radio Nottingham will be the first time we've talked football together for a long time and will stir a lot of good memories.

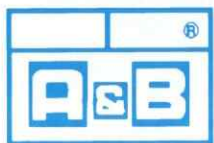

The amiable Geordie spearheads non-league Hucknall Town's pursuit of honours these days, making them the seventh club for which he has performed in the East Midlands throughout a most productive playing career.

The first five were, of course, all at professional level as Trevor enjoyed his most successful spell at Meadow Lane and also 'did the rounds' with Leicester City, Nottingham Forest, Derby County and Mansfield Town.

Since finishing at Mansfield, the 34-year-old striker has chosen to bow out of the game "gracefully", playing for Kettering Town and now Hucknall.

"It is quite a collection, but I don't think there will be too many more now," said Trevor, who is enjoying his new life away from the professional game.

"Of the local professional clubs, Gary Mills is pretty close to completing the full set as well. He's just got Mansfield to go, although I don't think he'll be worrying about that the way things are going for him at Leicester.

"Someone mentioned to me sometime ago that it was probably unique, and I can't imagine that there can have been too many others who have played for all the local

clubs. I'm just making sure I am out on my own now by topping up that collection with a few non-league clubs."

Trevor, who combines his non-league commitments with working in the electrical wholesale business, can now devote more time to his family as a result.

"I've just had my most enjoyable Christmas for almost 20 years, because I've not been away playing football most of the time, and I've not had to worry too much about what I eat or drink at certain times," he explained.

"Having a normal family life was a major reason why I decided not to stay in football in some capacity. I wanted to make a break and find work that meant I could spend far more time at home with the wife and kids.

"Indeed, I didn't play for six months after I left Kettering because I couldn't really commit myself to anything while I was selling advertising for the Mansfield Recorder, despite having an offer from Hucknall.

"But once I changed my job, that opened the way for me to play again and I'm glad that I've had the opportunity just to gracefully scale down my playing career."

Trevor lines up alongside another of our former players, Paul Smalley in the Hucknall side, as well as Mark Smalley, who began his career at Nottingham Forest.

"We won promotion to the Northern Counties and so we have done well to adjust to that step up this term and after a bad start we're in mid-table now," he said.

"We've reached the quarter finals of the cup competitions that we're in, so things are going pretty well and the goals are still going in for me."

Trevor has been lined up as a special guest when another of his former clubs Leicester City are the visitors to Meadow Lane at the backend of March.

But he has admitted: "I'd probably be best accommodated in the visitors enclosure if the truth be known. I took my eldest son Jon to a Leicester City match when we were down there visiting my wife's family recently, and he's become a big fan of their ever since."

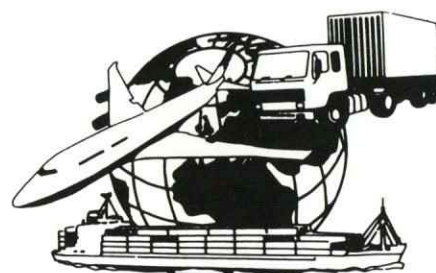

COMING NEXT

ONE REMARKABLE day of transfer activity has shaped the season for our next visitors to Meadow Lane as West Ham United look to build upon their Premier League progress with a good run in the FA Cup.

What may have seemed a bold gamble by Billy Bonds at the time, has turned out to be a masterstroke that has revived the Hammers' fortunes.

West Ham have not looked back since Bonds sacrificed crowd favourite Julian Dicks for three new players in a 24-hour shake-up at Upton Park.

Dicks moved to Liverpool in a £2.5 million swap deal which opened the door for versatile pair Mike Marsh and David Burrows to move south.

And before the ink had dried on those transfers, Bonds had resurrected his interest in Lee Chapman after Portsmouth had pipped him for the vastly-experienced striker's signature during the summer.

The whole thing could have backfired on the Hammers boss, but instead it had a stunning effect as Chapman scored on his debut in a highly creditable 2-0 victory at big spenders Blackburn Rovers.

After winning only one of their first five matches, Bonds was anxious to safeguard the club's future in the top flight in giving them the necessary stability to climb into a mid-table position.

The bubble burst when West Ham went out of the Coca Cola

Cup across the river at Nottingham Forest, but they soon bounced back from that setback and have continued to hold their own in the Premier League.

Just as we found the going tough against non-league Sutton United though, they were made to work hard for their place in the fourth round of the FA Cup when they met our First Division rivals Watford.

Indeed, Glenn Roeder's side were unlucky not to earn at least a replay, but Martin Allen cancelled out an early goal from Gary Porter, before Marsh struck his first goal for the Hammers to clinch a 2-1 victory at Upton Park.

The omens are certainly good for us though, because we have won four of our last five matches against West ham, the one exception being a 2-0 defeat in London early last season, although Richard Walker's solitary goal gave us a vital success in our relegation fight in the home game.

One of the few bright statistics of our 1991-92 campaign in the top flight was that we did the double over the Hammers, with Kevin Bartlett scoring both the goals at Upton Park, while Tony Agana netted his first goal for the club in a 3-0 triumph at Meadow Lane.

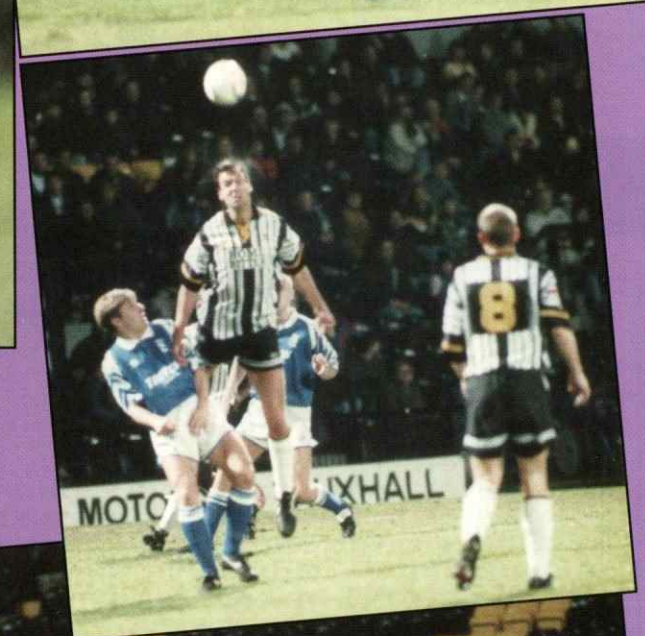

LUTON TOWN

YOU WOULD hardly describe our recent encounters with Luton Town as classics... and yet they have been notable for some interesting landmarks in our history.

One of them is of particular significance because our manager Mick Walker and assistant Russell Slade are currently celebrating their first anniversary in charge.

And by a remarkable coincidence, it was on a visit to Luton that the pair took control for the first time following the departures of Neil Warnock and Mick Jones.

Another recent game against the Hatters was noteworthy for two reasons, as we said goodbye to two cherished possessions... life among the big boys and Meadow Lane as we've known it for so many years.

When Rob Matthews struck twice to finish off our disappointing 1991-92 campaign on a happier note with a 2-1 victory over Luton, the bulldozers had already moved in to clear the

way for a remarkable transformation of our ground as three sides were rebuilt in the space of 17 weeks.

Our relegation fate had already been sealed by then as we dropped out of the top flight after one season, but the outcome gave our opponents a kick in the teeth.

Luton were clinging to the hope that they could perform another Houdini act, having avoided the relegation trapdoor in dramatic fashion in each of the two seasons prior to that, but on this occasion there was no escape.

DOWNWARD SPIN

With several influential players departing, Luton found themselves in a similar position to ourselves, as they wages a grim battle to halt the slide.

Indeed, had it not been for the fact that Brentford and Cambridge United were beaten on what was a nail-biting final day of last season, they could have been sucked into a second successive relegation.

The enormous sense of relief which we felt after beating Sunderland was shared by Luton then as they finished two points clear of the drop.

The comparisons with ourselves don't end there though, because David Pleat's side have found the going tough at times this season and are too close to the First Division's relegation zone for their own comfort.

The Hatters made a particularly dismal start to the season, losing seven times in nine games to plummet into trouble, while also making early exits from both the Coca-Cola and The Anglo-Italian Cup.

A remarkable 5-0 victory over fellow strugglers Barnsley stopped the rot, and set Luton on a run of three home victories in four matches. That promising sequence

included their 1-0 victory over ourselves in mid-October, while local rivals Oxford United were their other victims.

TRAVEL SICKNESS

A major reason for Luton's struggle was their grim away form as they lost nine times in 11 trips, picking up draws at Middlesbrough and Birmingham.

But they have found something of a cure for that bout of travel sickness, earning creditable draws at Watford, Peterborough and West Brom recently.

Former England B international David Preece played a significant part in that upturn in fortunes on their travels, and his experience is a vital component of what is essentially a very young side assembled by Pleat.

Preece, a £150,000 capture from Walsall, has been at Kenilworth Road for almost 10 years now and has figured in two League Cup Finals in that time.

Another Wembley winner on whom Luton rely heavily these days is defender Trevor Peake, a member of Coventry City's triumphant FA Cup side in 1987.

While former England striker Kerry Dixon is the other player

offering a vast amount of experience, having enjoyed a prolific goalscoring career which has spanned spells with Reading, Chelsea and Southampton.

Pleat is hoping that trio's influence will help his brightest young prospects to fulfil their potential, although he knows that it may take time.

The rich promise of midfielder Paul Telfer has already been recognised with Scottish Under-21 caps, while

Scott Oakes has won similar recognition with England.

Other youngsters who are being tipped for bright futures include Greg Rioch, the son of former Scottish international and Derby County midfielder Bruce, Ceri Hughes, John Hartson, Jamie Campbell and Jason Rees.

The departure of Alec Chamberlain to Sunderland last summer has opened the way for Luton's two foreign goalkeepers to battle it out for a regular first team place.

And American Juergen Sommer has seized the opportunity with some impressive displays, even though Australian Andy Petterson stepped in when Chamberlain was sidelined for a lengthy spell last season.

Sommer, who joined the Hatters straight from Indiana University in 1991, has a big incentive to create a big impression in the hope that he can force his way into the international reckoning for next summer.

While Millwall 'keeper Kasey Keller is the American number one for the World Cup Finals on home soil, there is still some doubt as to who will act as cover for him, and Sommer could possibly come into the

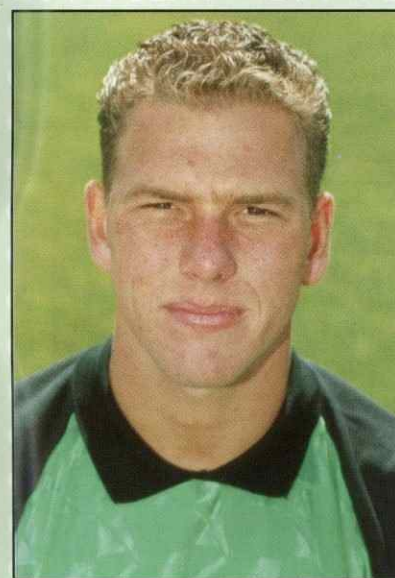

Another foreigner who has settled in well is Canadian international Geoff Auger, who joined Luton last September after a spell with Ipswich Town, and he scored on his debut against Crystal Palace two months later.

FAMILIAR FACE

Pleat is, of course, no stranger to these parts, although that has nothing to do with his name being linked with the manager's post here at

Meadow Lane in the past.

As well as being Nottingham born and bred, he began his playing days at Forest, where he made a handful of first team appearances before moving on to Luton.

Consequently, Pleat is in his third spell with Luton, and his second as manager, after lifting them into the First Division in his first stint from 1978-86.

That success led to him getting the Tottenham job and he took them to the 1987 FA Cup Final where, ironically enough, they were beaten by Stoke's Coventry.

Seven months after the disappointment of that Wembley setback, Pleat was relieved of his duties at Spurs, making way for the arrival of Terry Venables.

He was promptly given the task of reviving Leicester City's flagging fortunes after they had dropped out of the old First Division, but in little more than three years, he was unable to achieve that aim.

That paved the way for Pleat's return to Luton in the summer of 1991, although it began on a disappointing note with their relegation from the top flight.

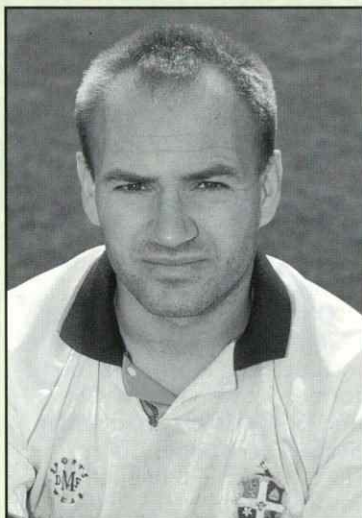
PAST MEETINGS

Goals have been a scarce commodity in our recent meetings with Luton Town. Indeed, we have failed to score a single goal in the last

three encounters with the Bedfordshire club over the past season and a half.

The first game of Mick Walker's reign produced a goalless stalemate at Kenilworth Road almost 12 months to this day, while both sides had also drawn a blank at Meadow Lane earlier in the season.

There was, however, a goal scored when we travelled down

the M1 to meet Luton last October, but we were on the receiving end as striker Paul Dickov, who was on loan from Arsenal, hit the winner.

Recollections of that encounter will provide us with an added incentive, because it was one of our most disappointing displays of the season.

DID YOU KNOW?

A 'PAYNE' FOR ROVERS

Joe Payne left poor Bristol Rovers smarting with the most remarkable goalscoring performance in the history of the Football League in 1936.

The Luton striker, who won one England cap, scored a record 10 goals in one game as Rovers were hammered 12-0 in a Division Three South fixture, and that remains the club's record win in a League outing.

It's hardly surprising then that Payne created another goalscoring record during his spell at Kenilworth Road, although the distinction of scoring the most goals in one season came in the following campaign.

He struck 55 times in that season to help Luton with promotion to the Second Division.

TIGHT FISTED

Luton Town managed to equal a notable club record last season, despite having to wage a grim battle to avoid relegation from the First Division.

The Hatters went seven matches without conceding a single goal in the early stages of 1993 to match a record which had been set 70 years earlier.

Indeed, one of those games where they gave nothing away was our goalless draw at Luton.

RECORD DEALS

David Pleat would no doubt welcome with open arms the sort of money which Luton Town frequently dealt with in the transfer market only a few years ago.

Their record incoming transfer remains the £850,000 arrival of Danish international striker Lars Elstrup from Odense at the beginning of the 1989-90 season.

Two years later, Nottingham Forest broke Luton's record for an outgoing deal.

They paid £1.5 million to acquire the services of Northern Ireland international winger Kingsley Black, exceeding the £1 million fee Luton received from Queen's Park Rangers for Roy Wegerle in 1989.
