





## WATFORD DEFEAT RUINED MY WEEKEND

The best laid plans of mice and men go straight out the window when you concede a goal after 12 seconds as we did at Watford on Saturday. It took us a long time to recover and we didn't really settle down and start playing until ten minutes before half-time. We should have equalised then, when Alex hit the bar and Dave Mitchell's effort from the rebound went straight at the keeper, and I feel sure that had we done so we would have gone on to win the game. But that's all pure speculation, it didn't happen and although we were by far the better side in the second-half we didn't get the breaks. We had a good claim for a penalty turned down and in the end got caught out again when we were all pushing forward looking for that equaliser.

I didn't put the two new lads on from the start on Saturday for a couple of reasons. Firstly, with the exception of 45 minutes against Peterborough we had done well in the last half a dozen games and the lads in the side had earned

the right to continue. Secondly, I wanted Clive and Greg to have a look at the way we play which is very different from anything they had been used to. When they did come on I thought both of them did well and barring accident or injury they'll be in the starting line-up tonight. Clive might just be perfectly suited to that position behind the front two strikers. Malcolm Allen scored something like twelve goals in the first half of last season so you can get in the box and get on the end of things from there. As I said, Clive hasn't played there a great deal before, but I think it could be made for him.

The defeat at Watford wasn't a disaster - a disaster is when a boat sinks at sea or there's a plane crash - but it certainly made my weekend pretty miserable. I'm a winner, the players are winners, we want to win every game, we want to win the League, although it's looking less likely now with Palace winning at Stoke. But everybody else around us lost and

so we've got to forget Watford, put in a good performance tonight and beat Luton.

It won't be an easy game by any means, Luton have had a great run in the Cup and I think the only reason they are struggling in the League is because the club and the team were very unsettled at the start of the season. David Pleat has done very well since then, he's got some good young players playing some excellent football and I'm sure they'll prove a tough nut to crack. We certainly can't rely on them being distracted by a Cup Semi-Final. It's up to us to impose ourselves on them and show them what a good side we are. We're without Alex as well as Pat and Terry of course, but we've strengthened the squad with these sort of problems in mind, and it's up to the players out there tonight to prove that they are worthy of hanging onto their places when those three lads are available again for Saturday's game at Portsmouth.



## Riding the luck of the Irish

KENNY Cunningham admits Millwall have enjoyed the luck of the Irish during their last two home games.

But after scraping priceless wins over Charlton and Peterborough, the Republic of Ireland defender is convinced that Millwall can land one of the two automatic promotion places.

"We didn't play particularly well against Charlton or Peterborough, but we got a couple of lucky breaks and managed to come away from those two games with six points.

"With Palace losing to Middlesbrough and Leicester slipping up against Barnsley recently, the situation at the top of the table is getting tighter and tighter.

"We've still got to go to Palace and Forest have got to come here, so I think the whole thing is wide open at the moment."

Cunningham demonstrated his versatility again against Peterborough when he switched from right-back to take over from the suspended Pat Van Den Hauwe at the centre of the Lions defence.

After missing two months through injury, Cunningham has settled back into his right-back slot so well that Lions boss Mick McCarthy was reluctant to move him for the Peterborough game.

But Mick's best laid plans were ruined when Ben Thatcher went down with tonsilitis on the day of the game.

"I do regard myself as a right-back, but I've played in the middle at various times throughout my career and I'm quite happy doing that job," explains Kenny.

"It certainly helps playing alongside someone like Rhino who knows the job inside out."

Kenny has now made over 100 appearances for The Lions since being thrown in at the deep end by former boss Bob Pearson as Millwall fought a futile battle against relegation from the old First Division.

"I made my debut up at Norwich and I remember feeling really sick when Bob told me I was playing," he recalls. "Once I got out on the pitch I was fine, and although we lost I felt I did reasonably well."

Cunningham was in and out of the side during Bruce Rioch's two years in charge, but under McCarthy he's emerged as the club's first choice right-back and won international honours at Under-21 and B level.

Unfortunately for Kenny, his chances of being called up for this summer's World Cup look remote, because Jack Charlton has an embarrassment of riches when it comes to the right-back slot.

"There's Dennis Irwin from Manchester United and Leeds' Gary Kelly ahead of me at the moment, so it looks as though I'm going to have to wait my turn," he admitted.

"I'm resigned to watching the boys from the sofa. I'm too old for the Under-21's so my international career is in limbo at the moment.

"Of course I'd love to go to the States, but time is on my side, and right now all I'm interested in is getting my head down and playing as well as I can for Millwall."



## Hats off to Hatters boss

DAVID Pleat is one of the First Division's most experienced managers, and his passion for the game remains as strong as ever.

"It's a passionate game and you've got to be passionate about it or you might as well give up," he explained after Luton's thrilling FA Cup quarter final victory over West Ham a week ago.

A back injury meant Pleat was more subdued than usual as his talented young side clinched a Wembley semi-final clash with Chelsea.

But his immense pride and satisfaction was obvious as Luton's youngsters fought back from behind to send West Ham the same way as Kevin Keegan's Newcastle United.

Now Pleat is determined to make sure that his youngsters enjoy their trip to Wembley.

"We've got to make sure of that," he stressed. "Success in this game is so fleeting, that when it comes along you have got to savour and enjoy it as much as you can. It's difficult, but that's what we'll be trying to do."

Pleat has experienced just about every emotion going during a managerial career which has taken him from Luton to Spurs to Leicester and now back to Kenilworth Road.

During his first eight year spell with Luton he led them into the old First Division, an achievement which helped land him the job of revitalising Spurs in 1986.

Pleat led them to Wembley for the 1986-87 Cup final, but Spurs lost to Coventry and Pleat's reign ended when revelations in the tabloid press about his private life forced him to resign.

Leicester handed him the chance to resurrect his managerial career, but didn't give him the time he felt he needed to rebuild the side and in June 1991 he moved back to Luton.

How long his second spell in charge at Kenilworth Road will last is the subject of some speculation.

Pleat, widely respected as one of the game's best coaches and an excellent judge of players, has pieced together a talented young squad which he believes - given that precious commodity, time - will be good enough to get Luton into the Premiership.

The crunch will come if Luton's board of directors decide they need to sell off too many of Pleat's rough diamonds.

"I'm realistic," stressed the Luton boss. "I say to the players if they do well here they may attract one of the top clubs. It's an extra bit of motivation for them, but we have got to be ambitious as well."

Pleat is currently trying to negotiate a new contract with the club - the rumour is he's been asked to take a pay cut.

In a recent Sunday paper interview Pleat preferred not to talk about his contractual situation but admitted there's a strange sort of chemistry between him and Luton.

"Maybe we suit each other," he explained. "We aggravate each other. We annoy each other, the club and me. Somehow that is the chemistry that keeps us going."

What keeps Pleat going is his determination to play the game the right way, his sides always play bright, attractive, enter-

taining passing football and he's confident Luton's youngsters will stay clear of the relegation zone.

"We're an emerging side," he said. "We need eight or nine points to be sure of being safe, but we feel that when we get our strongest side together we can cope with any team."

West Ham and Newcastle will certainly bear testimony to that.

# Bright future for Pleat's youngsters

SCOTT Oakes' stunning hat-trick during Luton's FA Cup quarter-final triumph over West Ham, underlined his emergence as one of the country's most exciting youngsters.

Oakes' match winning performance also illustrated why David Pleat is renowned as one of the best judges of players in the game.

Booted out by Leicester three years ago, Pleat went back to Filbert Street to sign Oakes and his youth team pal Des Linton.

Pleat set about converting Oakes from an out and out striker into an attacking midfielder - and this season's 13 goal haul is proof of how well he's made the transition.


"Scott's frighteningly good," admitted Pleat after last week's quarter-final triumph. "He had a bit of a torrid time when he first came here because he was asked to play in a new position.

"But he's listened and learned and he has got an exceptionally bright future."

The same applies to quite a few of Pleat's Luton youngsters who now face an FA Cup semi-final clash with Chelsea at Wembley.

Paul Telfer, Julian James, Ceri Hughes, John Hartson and Des Linton have all attracted envious glances from other clubs and Pleat knows that holding on to them will be increasingly difficult.

Telfer, outstanding during that win over West Ham, has fought his way back into the side after

an horrific car crash which threatened his career.

James has made nearly 150 appearances for the club and Hughes, another product of Luton's youth development policy, looks like becoming a regular in the Welsh squad.

Hartson, one of the heroes of Luton's fifth round win over Newcastle, had to be content with a place on the substitutes bench against West Ham, but Pleat is confident he'll develop into one of the club's most valuable assets.

With so many youngsters learning their trade, Pleat knew he needed a few experienced heads and they don't come much more experienced than Kerry Dixon, David Preece and Trevor Peake.

No one will be looking forward to that semi-final more than Dixon who scored 147 League goals in 335 appearances for the Stamford Bridge club.

"I've never played in an FA

Cup semi-final before, so what could possibly be better than playing against Chelsea at Wembley?" stressed the former England striker who joined Luton on a free transfer from Southampton during the summer.

"I've still got a lot of friends at Chelsea and it promises to be one of the highlights of my career."

Midfielder Preece, another of those players who always seems to do well against Millwall, has made nearly 300 appearances for the club since moving to Kenilworth Road from Walsall for £150,000 in December 1983.

Pleat demonstrated his team building shrewdness yet again when he persuaded Premiership Everton to let him have Alan Harper on a free transfer.

Harper, who started his career at Liverpool, enjoyed considerable success after moving to Merseyside rivals Everton in

the mid 1980s.

He made 127 appearances for Everton and then had spells with Sheffield Wednesday and Manchester City before moving back to Goodison 18 months ago.

"I told Alan that I couldn't guarantee him first team football," explains Pleat. "But his attitude has been fantastic and his influence on the youngsters has been very important to us."

At the back Luton's defence is marshalled by Trevor Peake, an FA Cup winner with Coventry and John Dreyer who joined the Hatters from Oxford and has emerged as one of the First Division's most dependable defenders.

Jurgen Sommer, one of Kasey's rivals for a place in the United States' World Cup squad, has established himself as Luton's first choice keeper after signing a new 12 month contract during the summer.

#### South London Spoils

When Charlton travelled to Selhurst Park a week ago last Sunday there was a lot more at stake than South London pride. Palace had lost their previous game at Sunderland, and had Forest breathing down their necks, whilst Charlton had seen their League and Cup hopes dive with four consecutive defeats. Despite the fact the match was televised live, over 14,000 attended, and Palace overcame their TV jinx and won convincingly. Chris Armstrong added to his growing reputation with a fine headed goal, and Paul Stewart, on loan from Liverpool, sealed the points for the leaders.

#### Promotion ranks thinning out

This win put a margin of 13 points between the Eagles and the Valiants, and Charlton are starting to see their promotion hopes subside. So too are Tranmere, who have had a dreadful 1994. A 0-1 defeat at relegation-threatened Oxford (the fifth meeting between the clubs this season) was the latest in a run of poor form which has seen Rovers drop from second to eighth, and lose controversially in the Coca Cola Cup semi-final. As if that were not enough, chairman Peter Johnson, who with John King was the architect of the club's rise from the Fourth Division basement, has moved across to Liverpool to take control of Everton.

Managerless Wolves look less and less likely contenders. A disappointing goalless draw at home to Grimsby was their 14th draw in 34 League games, and although they have only lost nine matches this season, they are now in the bottom half of the table. Southend and Stoke, both with play-off aspirations a month ago, look now to be consigned to mid-table. They also fought out a goalless draw, at the Victoria Ground. After a dreadful run in the autumn and winter, Middlesbrough, the lowest placed of the clubs relegated from the Premiership last May, have started to recapture their early season form. A convincing 3-0 home win over West Brom has lifted them into the top half of the table, but they probably have left it too late to make a serious challenge. The one new name to emerge in the play-off frame is Notts County, anxious to prove that there is more than one club on the Trent. Last season was spent largely in the relegation area, which is where this season started. New manager Mick Walker, however, signed striker Gary McSwegan from Rangers, and results started to improve. Almost unnoticed they have climbed to seventh place, and got to the first Wembley final of 1993/94. In front of just 17,188, County went down 0-1 to Brescia in the final of the Anglo-Italian Cup.

#### In-form Forest

Like a thoroughbred racehorse, Forest have timed their run for an automatic promotion place to perfection. A shaky start left them in the wrong half of the table, but since Christmas they have been grinding out results and gathering points. A 3-2 home win over Bolton gave them second place to

themselves, and the match attracted the division's biggest gate of the day, 23,846. Like the Forest of old, they can score from any angle, with defenders Chettle and Pearce getting the first two and Collymore marking his return with the third. The former Palace and Southend striker, however, blotted his copybook when he was sent off for violent conduct, and will now miss three vital games. Manager Frank Clark was honest enough to support the referee's decision, which is a lesson to some of his colleagues in the Premiership, whose silence or criticism of officials seems to condone foul play.

Forest were helped by an unexpected slip-up by neighbours Leicester, beaten 0-1 at home by Barnsley. In each of the last two seasons, Brian Little's men have been the play-off bridesmaids and they are running the risk of getting an unwanted hat-trick.

#### Perm three from four

Barnsley's win at Filbert Street opened a five point gap between themselves and the four clubs below them. Of the relegation candidates, the most out-of-form are Birmingham and Watford. Barry Fry's side snatched a surprise draw at Luton but are still three points adrift of Watford. The Hornets' miserable run continued with a 0-2 beating at Sunderland, whilst Oxford's win over Tranmere took them above Peterborough. Only one point divides Oxford, Peterborough and Watford, and the fight to avoid the drop will probably go on to the last day.

#### Managerial new boys

Although it is difficult to separate cause and effect, a common link between the bottom four is that they all have managers in their first season at the club. Barry Fry (Birmingham), Chris Turner (Peterborough) and Denis Smith (Oxford), although experienced managers, only took over when the season was underway, whilst Glenn Roeder (Watford) is in his first full season at Vicarage Road. The same is true of the two clubs above them, Keith Burkinshaw at West Brom and Viv Anderson at Barnsley.

It would be very unfair to blame these individuals for their clubs' plights, but they are obviously having a baptism of fire. The rate of managerial turnover, moreover, seems to be accelerating, for only nine clubs in Division One (Leicester, Millwall, Charlton, Tranmere, Middlesbrough, Grimsby, Bolton, Portsmouth and Luton) have had the same manager for the last 18 months. How many will still be in charge come next August?



says Richard Huxford



When you're on a losing streak as they are, there's almost an expectancy that they're going to lose, whereas here we expect to win every game. In all honesty, it's good to be back.



I must admit that my pride was little bit hurt when I was allowed to go out on loan, but you have to take it in your stride, and at least I was playing first team football. I think in a way I will have gained something from the experience of playing in a struggling side, although it's not something I'm hoping to repeat here. It does affect your own confidence when you're playing for a team who are down at the bottom of the League, and I was glad to get straight back into the side against Peterborough and get a win even if we didn't play all that well on the night.

I suppose I could best describe my time up at Birmingham as 'character building'. They are a good bunch of lads and I wish them well, but it was like a breath of fresh air to be back at Millwall. I really like it here, I didn't particularly want to go there in the first place, and I can honestly say that my month at St Andrews only served to emphasise what a good club this is.

Naturally I want to be playing first team football, and the fact that we've got a lot of very good players here makes it difficult to hold down a regular place in the side. It's a tough job for Mick to keep everybody happy and we all know that, so all I can do is my best when I do get the chance. You have to approach the job in a professional manner and accept the manager's decision. I'm as ambitious as anyone else, but I'm part of a happy and successful squad at a good club and that counts for a lot too.

Having played for a struggling side I knew that Peterborough who are in a similar position would be difficult to beat last week. They're fighting for their lives so they tend to battle with everything they've got. In that respect it's often easier playing a mid-table team at this stage of the season. We didn't do ourselves justice particularly in the first-half, but as they began to tire the quality we have became apparent, and despite the fact that we won with an own goal it turned out to be more comfortable than the scoreline suggested in the end. It may not always be pretty to watch from now on, but Palace and Forest will also be facing teams who make life difficult for them, and if they can't grind results out when things are not going well then we'll definitely catch them because we have proved our ability to do that.



### ON THE TREATMENT TABLE




His opportunities at Selhurst Park were limited to just 7 appearances and 1 goal, so he had little hesitation in accepting Mick's offer.



## FROM THE ARCHIVES

By Ted Wilding

### MILLWALL v LUTON TOWN

Like Millwall, Luton Town were formed in 1885, and were also to become founder members of the Southern League in 1894. Millwall's association with Luton first began in 1888 when the clubs met in a friendly at Luton on December 1st 1888. Luton were the winners by three to nil. The second meeting in January 1889 was won by Millwall 4-2 at their ground situated behind the 'Lord Nelson' public house on the Isle of Dogs.

The following season (1889/90) Millwall were beaten at home 1-2 by Luton. The clubs met regularly up until the formation of the Southern League, the results were as follows: (Millwall score first) 2-5 (A), 5-1 (H), 3-2 (A), 1-0 (H), 2-0 (H) and 2-3 (A).

### STORMED BACK

The first meeting between the clubs in the Southern League was played at Dallow Lane. Losing one nil at half-time the 'Dockers' stormed back to take both points in a 4-3 victory. The return fixture at East Ferry Road ended 2-2.

Between 1894-1897 and 1900-1920 Millwall's record against the Bedfordshire side in the Southern League reads: P32, W14, D9, L9, F49, A43, Pts37.

### SEVEN UP

In 1920-21 both clubs entered the Football League by way of the newly formed Third Division. The first two encounters ended goalless.

It wasn't until the eleventh meeting that the "Lions" recorded their first League victory over the "Hatters" and they did it in style, winning 7-0 at The Den on December 19th 1925.

Landells (2), Amos (2) (both penalties), Gore, Moule and Dillimore were the scorers.

## IN THE WINGS
